## THE VISION

LSU is the sleeping giant of college soccer. My vision for LSU is to build a program that annually contends to win the SEC, qualifies for the NCAA College Cup and competes to win a National Championship. The foundation that we've built these last four years has given us that opportunity.

## THE PHILOSOPHY

I believe in a commitment to excellence from our players, coaches and staff in all facets of the program. We will provide an environment in which our student-athletes can maximize their potential as students, athletes and people.



When Brian Lee took the reigns of the LSU soccer program in December 2004, he envisioned a program with the potential to be both a perennial contender for the Southeastern Conference championship and an annual participant in the NCAA Tournament. His bold vision to transform LSU soccer into a nationally-respected program produced unprecedented results in 2007 as the Tigers earned a new level of respect with the most successful season in their history.

Under Lee's direction, the Tigers were crowned champions of the SEC Western Division and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 13 seasons after posting a 12-5-7 overall record against one of the nation's toughest schedules that included seven opponents ranked among the Top 25 teams in the country.

In just three short seasons, Lee and his dedicated coaching staff have built a program with the ability to compete with anyone in women's college soccer. That was never more evident than a year ago when the Tigers battled No. 4 Texas to a 2-2 draw and blanked No. 6 Tennessee by a 3-0 margin for their first ever victory against an opponent ranked among the nation's Top 10.

The Tigers were rewarded for their performance against the Lady Volunteers with a No. 19 national ranking by Soccer America for their highest in program history. In fact, the club spent a total of four weeks in the national rankings during the 2007 season.

But it was their performance over the course of the conference season that established the Tigers as a true threat in the race for the SEC championship. LSU finished the season with its best mark in league play at 5-2-4 and its best finish in the final conference standings in fourth place. The Tigers' 1-0 overtime victory over the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks on Nov. 2, 2007, is sure to go down as one of the most important triumphs in team history as it clinched their first SEC West crown by a single point over Auburn in the league table.

On the strength of their performance in the regular season, the Tigers earned a berth into the NCAA Tournament for the first time as they traveled to Tallahassee, Fla., to take on Samford in the first round. Perhaps drawing inspiration from their thrilling victory over Arkansas, the Tigers posted a 1-0 double overtime win over the Bulldogs for their first ever postseason victory.

Despite seeing its season end in the NCAA Second Round, the team was honored for its outstanding play throughout the 2007 campaign as

Michelle Makasini, Malorie Rutledge and Rachel Yopez were each named honorable mention All-Americans by Top Drawer Soccer, while Taryne Boudreau received Freshman All-America honors by Soccer Buzz Magazine. Lee has coached his student-athletes to a total of six All-America honors during his three-year tenure as the Tigers' head coach as both Makasini and Chelsea Potts were named Freshman All-Americans by Soccer Buzz Magazine following the 2006 season.

Lee has also coached six of his athletes to II All-SEC selections in three seasons as both Makasini and Rutledge earned first-team honors and Potts received second-team recognition in 2007. Potts also earned a second-team selection in 2006 along with Roslyn Jones, while Melissa Clarke was a member of the second team in 2005. In addition, Boudreau, Clarke, Makasini, Potts and Rutledge have each been named to the SEC All-Freshman Team since 2005.

Lee's impact has not only been felt with unprecedented results on the field, but also at the box office as record crowds have packed the LSU Soccer Complex to see the Tigers week in and week out since his arrival in Baton Rouge.

The 2007 season proved to be unlike any other in the history of the LSU Soccer Complex as the Tigers were unbeaten for the first time with a 5-0-3 record while drawing an average of 1,294 fans per match. That number ranked LSU among the Top 10 teams in the nation in average attendance for the first time as the team finished the season ranked No. 7 in the NCAA in average paid attendance. The Tigers also set three single-game attendance records a year ago while setting the bar with a record crowd of 2,402 for its historic 3-0 victory over No. 6 Tennessee on Oct. 5.

Winning conference titles and leading a nationally prominent program are nothing new for the native of Cheltenham, England, who led the Furman Lady Paladins to six Southern Conference Championships and four NCAA Tournament appearances during his 11-year tenure after starting the program from scratch in 1994.

In 11 seasons, Lee's teams amassed a 144-80-10 overall record, including an impressive 76-16-3 mark in conference play. The Lady Paladins went undefeated in conference play three times (1999, 2000, 2002) and were just shy of perfection in 2003 after finishing the season with a 10-0-1 record in Southern Conference play.

Also a proven recruiter, Lee produced four Top 50 recruiting classes in his last five seasons at Furman, including the nation's 12th-ranked

signing class in 2002. That tradition continued with his arrival at LSU as he landed the program's first ever Top 50 recruiting class in the spring of 2005. Lee followed that effort by signing the top-ranked class in the SEC and the seventh-ranked class in the NCAA in 2006, as well as the No. 1 class among SEC West teams for the second straight season.

Individually, Lee has coached five All-Americans, five Freshman All-Americans, 24 All-Southeast Region performers, 13 All-Central Region selections, four SoCon Players of the Year, five SoCon Freshmen of the Year and a total of 63 all-conference selections in 14 seasons.

Lee's athletes have proven to be just as successful in the classroom where he owns a 100 percent graduation rate and his teams have earned five NSCAA Team Academic Awards. A total of 122 student-athletes were selected to the Southern Conference Academic Honor Roll in his 11 years at Furman, while 30 Tigers have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll over the last three years.

For his many accomplishments, Lee was named the Southern Conference Coach of the Year five times and was named the NSCAA and Soccer Buzz Southeast Region Coach of the Year in 1999, the same year in which he was selected as a finalist for the NSCAA National Coach of the Year Award.

In addition to his experience coaching at the collegiate level, Lee has served on the Region III Olympic Development Program staff since the 1999 season and was recently promoted to the rank of assistant coach in the spring of 2006.

A successful athlete in his own right, Lee earned four letters with the Furman men's soccer team from 1989-92 where he was an integral part of three SoCon titles and was voted team captain and selected as the team's Most Valuable Player as a senior. He also led his team to its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance and a berth in the Sweet 16 in 1991.

Lee, 37, graduated from Furman in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in political science. He and his wife, the former Nancy Repsher of Westboro, Mass., and also a 1993 graduate of Furman, have two children – Aidan, 4, and Abby, 3.

Debbie Hensley enters her fourth season as a member of the LSU coaching staff after serving as head coach of the women's soccer program at Western Carolina for six seasons. She has built the reputation of being one of the premier assistant coaches in all of women's college soccer and was recently promoted to the rank of associate head coach with the Tigers.

Adding Hensley to his staff was an easy decision for head coach Brian Lee when he took the reigns of the program in 2004 as the two coached together at Furman for three years.

"Debbie is not only one of the top coaches in soccer, but she is one of the best people that I know," Lee said. "She is a tremendous recruiter, an outstanding coach and an even better leader of young women, and she has been instrumental in the success of the LSU soccer program these last few years. Her passion for the sport is unmatched by anyone I've ever worked with."

That passion has certainly paid dividends on the recruiting trail as Hensley has also built a reputation of being one of the nation's top recruiters. She was the driving force in signing the first ever Top 25 and Top 10 recruiting classes in the history of the LSU soccer program. Hensley helped sign the nation's 25th-ranked class in 2005 and the nation's seventh-ranked class in 2006, and the Tigers will compete with one of the more talented rosters in the SEC this season.

"There's no doubt that recruiting is the lifeblood of any program at this level, and we're certainly fortunate to have someone like Debbie leading the way in our recruiting efforts," Lee said. "She has an innate ability to evaluate talent and target the players we feel can thrive in our program both on and off the field. That's been a key in building the foundation we have now."

Hensley compiled a 60-52-9 record in six years at Western Carolina after starting the program from scratch prior to the 1999 season. She led the Catamounts to a 10-9-1 record and a Southern Conference Tournament appearance in her inaugural season and was named the SoCon Coach of the Year in 2001 after guiding the team to the Southern Conference regular season title with a 16-6 overall record and 8-2 league mark.

Hensley coached seven players to II All-Southern Conference honors in her time at Western Carolina, a total that includes three first-team selections. In addition to her duties as head coach of the program, Hensley also served as university's Assistant Athletics Director/Senior Woman Administrator.

Prior to her stint at WCU, Hensley spent three seasons as an assistant coach under Lee at Furman where she recruited eight players who earned all-conference accolades in their careers.

Along with her coaching achievements, Hensley garnered recognition during her athletic career as a soccer and softball standout at Georgia Southern where she was a three-time first-team All-SoCon selection and led the conference in scoring as both a junior and a senior.

Hensley was selected to play in the Umbro Select College All-Star Classic after being named an NSCAA Regional All-American and All-Region honoree in 1995, and she was named the Georgia Female College Athlete of the Year by the Georgia Hall of Fame the same year.

The two-sport standout was also a first-team all-conference selection in softball as she set the Georgia Southern career record for stolen bases and runs scored. She graduated with a bachelor's degree in education from Georgia Southern in 1996 and a master's degree in health and exercise science from Furman in 1998.

Daniel Brizard enters his fourth season as an assistant coach at LSU after spending eight years in the same capacity at various universities across the country. His primary responsibility at LSU is coaching the team's goalkeepers, while also assisting head coach Brian Lee with all other aspects of the program, including recruiting and coordinating practice sessions.

Considered one of the top goalkeeper coaches in the country, Brizard was recently named head goalkeepers coach for the Region III Olympic Developmental Program Team and has served on the Florida State ODP staff and Region III ODP staff for nine years.

Former Tiger standout Valerie Vogler flourished under Brizard's tutelage in 2007 as she set a new school record for shutouts in a season with nine and wins in a season with 12, while she also established new career bests with 96 saves and a sparkling 1.02 goals against average for her senior season. She also helped lead the Tigers to their first ever SEC Western Division title with a school record four shutouts in conference play.

Brizard has also proven to be an outstanding recruiter in his four years on Lee's staff as his efforts landed one of the top goalkeeper recruits in the country for the Class of 2008 when Mo Isom of Marietta, Ga., signed a national letter of intent with the Tigers in February. Isom is sure to provide the foundation of LSU's defense for years to come after being ranked as one of the top six goalkeeper recruits in the country and one of the nation's Top 75 recruits overall by Soccer Buzz Magazine in the spring of 2008.

Prior to his stint at LSU, Brizard spent four seasons as an assistant to head coach Everton Edwards at Florida International. He also spent two seasons at South Alabama and two seasons at the University of Missouri-St. Louis while also serving as coach of the girl's soccer team at Parkway West High School in St. Louis.

Brizard's instructional background is extensive as he is a former goalkeeping instructor for the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and has received an NSCAA advanced national diploma. In addition, he has received the United States Soccer Federation "A" Coaching license as well as a USSF Goalkeeping license.

Prior to the start of his coaching career, Brizard was a four-year starter and team captain on the men's soccer team at Berry College in Rome, Georgia from 1991-95. He earned his bachelor's degree in sports performance/exercise science from Berry in 1995 and spent two years in the Navy before beginning his coaching career in 1997.

Brizard is married to the former Julie Schneider of St. Louis. They welcomed their first child, Izabella Corinne, on Aug. 4, 2007.

Enjoyed a highly successful junior season as one of the top strikers in the Southeastern Conference ... Cracked the starting lineup in all 24 matches for the Tigers in 2007 ... Finished the season tied as the team's second leading scorer with seven goals, seven assists and 21 points on the year ... Was a key contributor in the Tigers' run to the second round of the NCAA Tournament ... Scored the game-winning goal in the second overtime period in LSU's 1-0 shutout of Samford in the NCAA First Round on Nov. 16 ... Got off to a fast start by scoring six goals in the first month of the season ... Scored in four straight games against Louisiana Tech (Sept. 2), Memphis (Sept. 6), Miami (Sept. 8) and McNeese State (Sept. 14) ... Added game-tying goals against Texas (Sept. 18) and Ole Miss (Sept. 30) ... Recorded a pair of assists in LSU's 2-0 win over Vanderbilt on Oct. 19 ... 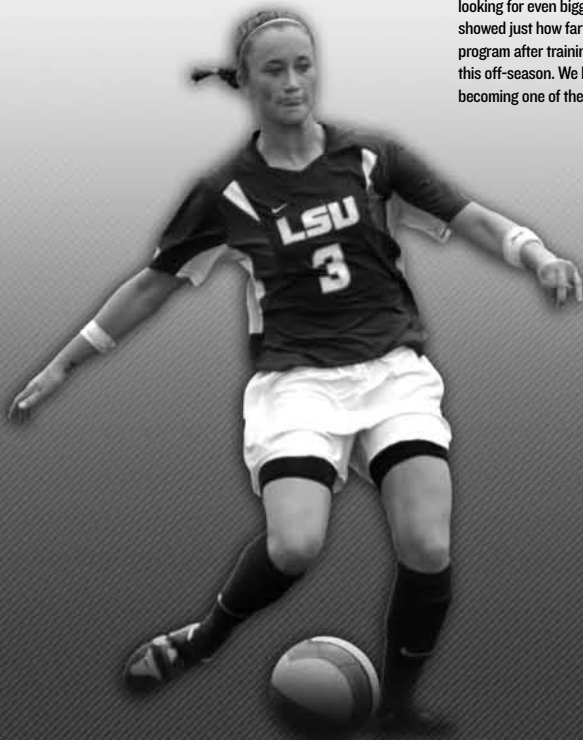
