LSU CLAIMS BACK-TO-BACK SEC WEST TITLES

For the second-straight season, the Tigers claimed the SEC Western Division title. In 2005, LSU tied with Arkansas to share its first West championship before winning the title outright in 2006. With a 16-4 SEC mark, LSU finished four games ahead of Alabama in the West and three games behind Florida overall. Since the SEC went to the divisional format in 1995, LSU had finished as high as second on three occasions, but never won before last season. The last time LSU won an SEC overall championship was when the Tigers won three straight overall titles from 1989-1991.

LSU MAKES BACK-TO-BACK NCAA TOURNAMENT BERTHS

The Tigers made their second-straight trip to the NCAA Tournament, marking the first back-to-back berths since making four consecutive appearances from 1989-1992. Overall, LSU made its eighth appearance in the NCAA Tournament and has posted a 10-8 record. The Tigers are one of only three teams in the SEC to advance to the NCAA Final Four, making appearances in both 1990 and 1991. In addition to LSU, six other SEC teams earned bids to the NCAA Tournament. Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Kentucky, Ole Miss and Tennessee were also chosen to participate in the postseason tournament. The seven teams selected from the SEC are a record for the conference, breaking the previous high of six teams set in 2005.

LSU POSTS RECORD WINS

With a 26-6 overall record and a 16-4 mark in SEC play, LSU recorded the most wins by a Tiger team since the 1992 team went 26-9, and broke the school record for most conference wins in school history. In 1991, the Tigers set the previous conference win record with a 13-1 mark in SEC play to win their last SEC Championship.

LSU HAS NINTH BEST TURNAROUND

In the four seasons from 2003-2006, the LSU seniors saw their share of ups and downs. As freshmen, Clark, Leaumont, Mikulik and Romero finished 11-19 while seeing considerable action on the court. After a 17-12 mark the following year, LSU posted back-to-back 20-win seasons to close out their careers. The turnaround from their first veasons to their final two seasons marked the ninth best turnaround in the nation over that period of time. The Tigers saw a total improvement of 18 wins, sitting behind only Tennessee State (29.5), Cal Poly (26), East Tennessee State (25), UAB (23.5), Middle Tennessee State (22.5), Florida International (20.5), Siena (20) and Duke (20).

LSU IN THE CSTV/AVCA POLL

The Tigers finished 2006 ranked No. 19 in the AVCA/CSTV Coaches poll. LSU was in the top 10 twice during the season, coming in at No. 10 each time, the highest ranking for the Tigers since coming in at No. 8 on Sept. 7, 1992. The Tigers began the preseason poll receiving votes and moved into the Top 25 during the first week of play and have been ranked for 15 straight weeks.

MIKULIK, ROMERO POST 1,000 CAREER DIGS

Against South Carolina on Sept. 22, Kassi Mikulik recorded her 1,000th career dig, becoming just the seventh player in LSU history to record 1,000 digs. She finished her career with 1,357 career digs, moving her into third on the all-time LSU digs list. Against Marquette on Nov. 25, Daniela Romero also recorded her 1,000th career dig, becoming the eighth player to record 1,000 digs. She finished with 1,009 digs to put her in eighth place in career digs. It marked the second time in school history that two players have hit the 1,000-dig mark in the same season. In 1986, Wendy Stammer and Detra Brown reached the milestone, remaining the only other pair to accomplish the feat.

ROMERO BREAKS INTO THE TOP 10 IN SEASON ASSISTS

With 1,531 assists in 2006, Daniela Romero posted the most assists in a single-season in her career, while breaking the school record and ranking 13th in the NCAA in assists per game at 13.43. In addition, she recorded the most assists in a single season at LSU since Daniela Reis recorded 1,608 in 1991. With her 36th assist against Alabama on Nov. 10, Romero passed Kim Osterhoff in 1985 to break into the Top 10 in LSU single-season history before finishing the season ranked fourth behind three of Reis' seasons.

CLARK BLOCKS HER WAY INTO RECORD BOOKS

In her final season, Melody Clark broke into the Top 10 in career blocks and block assists in LSU history. Clark finished ranked eighth in career block assists and ninth in total blocks. Having reached 250 blocks for her career, she also moved into the top 10 in career block assists in school history, finishing ranked ninth.

DEGIROLAMO MOVES INTO FOURTH IN BLOCK ASSISTS

With 152 block assists, Lauren DeGirolamo finished in fourth in single season block assists in LSU history. In addition, the redshirt freshman ranked third in the SEC and ninth in the NCAA in blocks per game.

2006 Season Review

SKENDER AMONG TOP IN SEC AND NCAA

Marina Skender led the SEC and ranked sixth in the NCAA in service aces per game at .675, which also ranked third in LSU single season history. In addition, she averaged 3.81 kills per game, which ranked ninth in the SEC. Her 1,203 total attempts ranked fifth in school history, while her 10.55 attempts per game average broke the school record.

MIKULIK DIGS THREE AND FOUR GAME MATCHES

Kassi Mikulik recorded four top-10 marks in digs in school history, two coming in threegame matches and two more in four-game matches. The first top-10 performance came against Ole Miss on Sept. 2 when the libero recorded 26 digs, the second most digs in a three-game match in LSU history. The mark was four behind the school record of 30 recorded by Luciana Reis against Arkansas State in 1993. Less than a month later against No. 25 Tennessee on Oct. 22, she recorded 22 digs, which tied for sixth. Against Alabama on Oct. 8, Mikulik recorded 26 digs, the fifth most digs in a four-game match. Once again, less than a month later on Nov. 3 against Florida, Mikulik recorded a careerbest 28 digs, which tied for third. The mark was three behind the school record of 31 digs recorded by Luciana Reis against Kansas in 1993.

DEGIROLAMO BLOCKS 'EM BACK

Against Marquette on Nov. 25, Lauren DeGirolamo recorded nine blocks, all assists, which was the second most block assists and tied for the eighth most total blocks in a three-game match in LSU history. The block assist mark was one behind the school record of 10 recorded by Julie Stempel against Tulane in 1988. The total block mark was three behind the school record of 12 set by Monique Adams in 1990 against William & Mary and tied by Kelly Thompson in 1997 against Ball State.

TIGERS POST 10TH MOST DIGS IN A THREE-GAME MATCH

Against Ole Miss on Sept. 29, LSU recorded 70 team digs, the 10th most digs in a threegame match in school history. The mark was 25 behind the school record of 95 digs, which was recorded against Mississippi State on Oct. 13, 2000.

IN THE RECORD BOOK AGAINST FLORIDA

Against No. 7 Florida on Nov. 3, LSU broke a pair of school records. The Tigers broke the school record for total attempts in a four-game match. Recording 236 attempts, the Tigers bested the previous school record of 232 against New Orleans on Sept. 4, 1998. In addition, LSU broke the school record for digs in a four-game match. Posting 119 digs



ROMERO FINISHES SECOND IN CAREER ASSISTS

Setter Daniela Romero completed her career ranked second in career assists in LSU history with 4,486. She was only the second LSU player to record 4,000 career assists, finishing behind only Daniela Reis, who also holds the SEC career assists record with 6,379. In addition, Romero finished third in career assists per game in LSU history.



MIKULIK BREAKS LSU SEASON DIGS RECORD

Against Marquette on Nov. 25, 2006, Kassi Mikulik broke the LSU single-season digs record, passing the 518 digs recorded by Luciana Reis in 1993. The senior finished the season with 535 digs. With the addition of her mark of 384 in 2005, she finished in the Top 10 in single-season digs twice.

against the Gators, the Tigers topped the previous record of 116 against Alabama on Nov. 11, 1994. It also marked the first 100-dig match for LSU since coming in with 105 against Kentucky on Nov. 11, 2005.

DEGIROLAMO GOES BACK-TO-BACK

With back-to-back double-figure block performances against No. 13 Tennessee and Kentucky, Lauren DeGirolamo became the first player at LSU to post back-to-back double-figure blocking matches since All-American Ivana Kuzmic did so against No. 8 Notre Dame and South Carolina on Sept. 18 and 23, 2005.

OPPONENTS CAN'T FIND RHYTHM AGAINST TIGERS

LSU ranked second in the SEC in opponents hitting percentage, holding foes to a .158 mark. In addition, LSU held eight of its opponents to under a .100 hitting percentage. The best hitting percentage against the Tigers was by No. 14 California at .336, one of only eight teams to hit over .200. Conversely, Nicholls State failed to get into positive figures, posting the lowest opponents hitting percentage against the Tigers under Flory and overall since 1991. In addition, Ole Miss hit .000 on Sept. 29, the fourth lowest mark against LSU under Flory in her tenure.

SENIORS ACCOMPLISH FIRSTS

The 2006 Tiger seniors accomplished something they had never done in their careers as LSU knocked off No. 13 Tennessee and Kentucky on the road to open SEC play. The Tigers had not defeated the Lady Vols in Knoxville since 2001, when the current senior class was still in high school. It had been longer since LSU had knocked off the Wildcats in Lexington, dating back to 1999, when the seniors were freshmen in high school. In both wins, the Tigers had to come from behind as LSU fell behind by two games against Tennessee, and dropped the first game to Kentucky. There were only two SEC venues the seniors did not win in - the CAVE at Alabama and the O'Connell Center at Florida.

TIGERS TIED BEST START IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Starting the season at 15-1, LSU tied the 1978 and 1991 teams for the best start in school history. The Tigers won 13 straight matches after dropping a five-game decision to No. 2 Penn State on Aug. 26 in the Tiger Invitational, which was tied for the third longest winning streak in LSU volleyball history, before losing to Alabama on Oct. 8.

Played in all 114 games in all 32 matches ... Named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 2, Sept. 23 and Nov. 27, which tied for the most SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors by any player in the league ... Named to the Dayton Marriott Invitational and Tiger Invitational all-tournament teams ... selected the LSU Female Student-Athlete of the Week on Aug. 28 ... Broke the LSU record for digs in a season with 535 and digs per game in a season with 4.69 ... Became just the seventh player in LSU history to record 1,000 career digs, finishing her four years ranked third with 1,357 digs ... Also finished her career ranked second with 3.22 digs per game ... Against Ole Miss on Sept. 29, she recorded the second most digs in a three-game match in school history with 26 and later tied for the sixth most digs in a three-game match with 22 against Tennessee on Oct. 22 ... In a four-game match, tied for the third-most digs with 28 against Florida on Nov. 3 after tying for the sixth most with 26 against Alabama on Oct. 8 ... Ranked second in the SEC and 103rd in the NCAA with 4.69 digs per game ... Recorded double-figure digs in every match for the season.



NCAA Quarterfinalist

LSU made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1986 after winning its first Southeastern Conference championship. The Tigers made a run at the Final Four in their first trip to the tournament by beating Arizona at home in round one and Texas-Arlington at the South Regional in Austin, Texas. However, Texas ended LSU's run as the Longhorns used the home court advantage to sweep the Tigers out of the tournament.



Overall Record: 25-11 **SEC Runner-Up**

Making its second straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament, LSU did not last long as Florida ousted the Tigers from the tournament in a five-game thriller in Gainesville, Fla. The match was the third of the year for the two teams. They had split the first two with LSU winning the regular season match and Florida winning in the SEC

The Tigers returned to the NCAA Tournament after a one year absence from the event in 1988. Playing on its home court, LSU survived a five-game scare from Houston to advance to the South Regional in Austin, Texas. There, Texas-Arlington exacted revenge for a tournament loss from 1986 by rallying from two games down to win the last three and advance

1990

Overall Record: 34-7 SEC Champions SEC Tournament Champions NCAA Final Four

Coming off the second conference championship in as many years, LSU cruised into the South Regional with a sweep of Louisville in the first round of the tournament. In Austin, Texas, the Tigers ousted Texas Tech and knocked off Texas on the Longhorns home court with a 17-15 game five win to advance to the Final Four for the first time in school history. In College Park, Md., LSU fell to eventual national champion UCLA, 3-0, in the national semifinals.



1991

Overall Record: 35-2 SEC Champions SEC Tournament Champions NCAA Final Four

With only one loss, LSU entered the NCAA Tournament as a favorite to return to the Final Four and the Tigers did not disappoint. LSU beat Houston in the first round for the second time in three years to advance to the South Regional, which the Tigers hosted. After sweeping Texas Tech, LSU ran into a Florida team that had handed the Tigers their only loss. A tough four-game victory later and LSU was back in the Final Four. This year in Los Angeles, Calif., the Tigers fell in four games to Long Beach State. Until Florida in 2002, the 1991 LSU team was the only team from the SEC to win a game in the NCAA Final Four.

1992

Overall Record: 26-9 SEC Runner-Up SEC Tournament Runner-Up

LSU had to travel for its first round match for the first time since 1987, this time to Lubbock, Texas, where the Tigers ousted Texas Tech from the tournament in just three games for the third consecutive year. At the South Regional in Gainesville, Fla., Texas knocked LSU out of the tournament in four games, ending hopes of a third straight Final Four appearance by the Tigers.

1993

Overall Record: 21-16
NIVC Champions

For the first time since 1988 and only the second since 1985, LSU was left out of the NCAA Tournament. Despite not making the tournament, the Tigers showed why they deserved a bid by coasting to the NIVC Championship in Kansas City, Mo., by dropping only three games in the team's six tournament victories. LSU swept Baylor in the tournament final.



2005

Overall Record: 25-11 SEC Western Division Co-Champion

Making their first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 1992, the Tigers had to travel to Austin, Texas, for their first round match against seventh-ranked Texas. LSU put up a gutsy performance against the Longhorns, but could not pull off the upset victory, falling in three games to end its best season in over a decade despite having to play on the road for the majority of the season due to the aftermath of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita.



2006

Overall Record: 26-6 SEC Western Division

LSU made its second-straight NCAA appearance after claiming back-to-back SEC Western Division titles. Despite a top 15 national ranking, the Tigers went unseeded and were forced to travel to San Luis Obispo, Calif., for their first round match against California, another ranked team that failed to garner a national seed. LSU came out hot to win game won, but could not complete the upset of the Golden Bears as the powerful Cal front line took charge in the final three games. The Tigers completed their best season since 1992 while setting a school record for conference wins in a season.

Maravich CENTER -

In 2007, the LSU volleyball program will begin its 26th season in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, the largest volleyball venue in the SEC. The structure, which was renamed in honor of the all-time LSU and NCAA men's basketball scoring leader on July 22, 1988, seats 13,373 and ranks as one of the finest college athletic arenas in the nation.

On July 1, 2004, the management of the Maravich Center came under the direction of the LSU Athletics Department and underwent a multi-year refurbishment. The renovation began three years ago with new television lighting and continued two years ago with a new roof surface. Last season, the inside of the Maravich Center saw an upgrade as the seats were replaced and the interior was given a complete makeover.

The outside windows of the building now feature the Tiger mascot running around the arena. Volleyball fans can also see a redesigned concourse with video and graphic displays, renovated concession stands and video kiosks showcasing the best of the sports that play in the building.

The Tiger volleyball team enjoys the comforts of a spacious locker room. The two-tiered fully carpeted facility features individual cubicles for each athlete, a meeting room and storage area.

Between 1985 and 1992, the Maravich Center was one of the top home courts in the nation, as LSU ran up a 110-10 (.917) record. During that time, LSU recorded a 37-match home-court win streak, which is the second-longest streak in SEC history. In 1991, the Tigers enjoyed possibly their finest season in the arena as LSU recorded a perfect 16-0 record and advanced to the Final Four through the NCAA South Regional in Baton Rouge.

The Tigers have now posted nine consecutive seasons without a losing record in the Maravich Center, making it once again a tough place for visiting teams to play. Over that span, LSU has a record of 69-35 (.663), including an undefeated 6-0 mark in 2005. Since beginning play in the arena in 1982, the Tigers have notched an 263-110 (.705) record, recording only three losing seasons at home.

The Maravich Center has also played host to SEC and NCAA Tournaments for volleyball, basketball and gymnastics. The 1982, 1987 and 1995 SEC Volleyball Championships were all held in the arena. The Maravich Center has also been the site of three NCAA Championship first round matches as well as the NCAA South Regional in 1991.

Along with the main court area, an auxiliary gym with a recently refinished court is located underground in the north section of the arena. Nearly all Tiger volleyball practices take place in the auxiliary gym.
