A Program on the Rise

After competing with one of the youngest starting lineups in the country last season, the LSU men's golf team is more confident and more experienced heading into the 2008-09 season as the Tigers are poised to take the next step under fourth-year head coach Chuck Winstead and earn a berth into the NCAA Men's Golf Championships for the first time in 12 seasons.

Back to lead the way are the top five performers from a team that earned a spot in NCAA regional play for the first time since 2005 with an appearance in the NCAA West Regional in 2008.

Sophomore standout Andrew Loupe made an immediate impact in his rookie season after finishing the year with a team-leading two Top 10 and five Top 20 finishes to go along with a team-leading 74.1 stroke average. Senior Jarrod Barsamian and fellow sophomore John Peterson also finished the season with a 74.1 stroke average to lead the way.

Like Loupe, sophomore Clayton Rotz also burst onto the collegiate scene while matching his team-leading two Top 10 and five Top 20 finishes en route to being named a member of the inaugural eight-man SEC All-Freshman Team. Both Loupe and Peterson also earned a spot on the team as they established themselves among the top classes of newcomers in the conference.

Junior Bryant Lach was without a doubt the most improved player on the team as he had a 74.2 stroke average a season ago, which is a three-stroke improvement from his scoring average as a freshman in 2006.

LSU carried its momentum into the off-season as more Tigers earned the right to compete in the United States Amateur Championship than ever before. The purple and gold was on display at the Pinehurst Resort in North Carolina in August as Barsamian, Lach and Rotz were each a part of the 312-man field in the most prestigious amateur championship in the world.

Not only do the Tigers return one of the more talented young teams in all of college golf, but they also welcome one of the nation's top classes of incoming freshmen as Austin Gutsell of Mandeville, La., Josh Jones of The Colony, Texas, and Sang Yi of Carrollton, Texas, will don the purple and gold for the first time this season. The trio was the No. 4 recruiting class in the nation for the Class of 2008 according to the final Golfweek recruiting rankings.

Each is sure to battle for a coveted spot in the starting lineup as the Tigers compete with what is surely their most talented roster in more than a decade.

Yi was the 12th-ranked junior golfer in the country and the 10th-ranked prospect for the Class of 2008 when he signed with the Tigers, while Jones was the nation's 19th-ranked junior golfer and the 16th-ranked player in his classification according to the Golfweek Junior Rankings. Gutsell was also one of the nation's Top 100 recruits for the Class of 2008 as he was ranked No. 89 in the country when he elected to sign a national letter of intent with the Tigers.

The Tigers will kick off their season Sept. 13-14 with a trip to Wayzata, Minn., for the first time to compete against many of the elite teams from the Midwest in the Gopher Invitational at Spring Hill Golf Club. The Tigers will return to the Southeast a week later with their fourth straight appearance in the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate slated for Sept. 22-23 at Shoal Creek Country Club following a 10th-place finish last season.

LSU earned its first and only tournament victory of the Chuck Winstead era at the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate in 2005 in the first year of its inception.

The Tigers earned a runner-up finish in their first ever appearance at the Squire Creek Invitational last fall and are looking for more this fall as they return to Squire Creek Country Club in Choudrant, La., to tee it up Oct. 13-14. They will then wrap up the fall season with a trip to the prestigious Isleworth-UCF Collegiate Invitational scheduled for Oct. 27-29 at Isleworth Golf and Country Club in Windermere, Fla.

Following a three-month layoff, the squad will open play in the spring season with their annual trip to Gainesville, Fla., on Feb. 14-15 to compete against one of the strongest fields it will face in the regular season at the Gator Invitational at the Mark Bostick Golf Course. The Tigers were tied for sixth in the event a year ago and will be looking for their first team title since 2002. They will then return to the state of Florida a week later for an appearance in the John Hayt Invitational scheduled for Feb. 22-23 at historic Sawgrass Country Club in Ponte Vedra Beach.

LSU closes out the month of March with a pair of familiar trips as they return to Statesboro, Ga., to compete in the Schenkel/E-Z-Go Invitational at Forest Heights Country Club from March 20-22 before traveling to Awendaw, S.C., to tee it up in the fifth-annual Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate at picturesque Bulls Bay Golf Club from March 29-31.

Following its appearance in the Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate, the squad will have one last opportunity to prepare for the postseason as it joins a strong regional field in the second-annual Bank of America Intercollegiate. Conference rival Ole Miss will play host to the event as it will be held April 7-8 at Reunion Golf and Country Club in Jackson, Miss. The Tigers matched their best performance a year ago with a runner-up finish in the inaugural event.

The SEC Men's Golf Championships return to St. Simons Island, Ga., for the ninth straight season with Frederica Golf Club playing host to the event for the second year in a row from April 17-19. After moving to Frederica Golf Club a year ago, the nation's most competitive conference championship called the Seaside Course at nearby Sea Island Golf Club its home for the previous seven seasons. LSU finished in a tie for eighth place in the 12-team field in 2008.

In July 2008, the NCAA's Division I Men's Golf Committee met in Colorado Springs to discuss a proposal that would alter the format by which the NCAA Men's Golf Championships is conducted. The proposal was accepted and is set to take effect this season.

Instead of cutting the field to 15 teams after 54 holes and crowning both an individual champion and team champion after 72 holes of stroke play as has been the case in recent years, the NCAA individual champion will be determined following the conclusion of 54 holes of stroke play with the top eight teams advancing to a single-elimination match play tournament.

The team with the lowest score after three rounds of competition will play the team with the eighth-lowest score, the second-place team will play the seventh-place team and so on until a team champion is crowned. The idea is that the newly established format will make the NCAA Division I Men's Golf Championships an attractive option for television coverage.

Regional play will also change dramatically during this year's championship season with three regions expanding to six to create more postseason opportunities for programs nationwide. According to the old format, 81 teams competing in three fields of 27 were required to earn a Top 10 finish in regional

play to earn one of 30 spots in the NCAA Championships. This year, a total of 84 teams will qualify for regional play with the top six teams from each region advancing into the 36-team field at the national championships.

The 2009 NCAA Division I Men's Golf Championships will be held at historic Inverness Club in Toledo, Ohio, from May 27-30. The UCLA Bruins enter the season as the defending national champions after earning a narrow one-stroke victory over Stanford a year ago.

Fourth Season

Golf Magazine Top 100 Teacher Golf Digest's No. 1 Teacher in Louisiana

Chuck Winstead enters his fourth season as the head coach of his alma mater and is well on his way to leading the LSU men's golf program back to the pinnacle of college golf.

Winstead inherited a program with four NCAA and 15 SEC championships in its storied history, and he is determined to transform the Tigers into a perennial postseason contender once again. LSU is poised to return to the NCAA Men's Golf Championships for the first time in 12 seasons as the Tigers will open the 2008-09 campaign with its most talented squad in more than a decade.

The team is fresh off its most successful season under Winstead after qualifying for the NCAA West Regional a year ago following an eighth-place finish at the SEC Championships, marking the first time since 2005 that LSU qualified for NCAA postseason play.

"LSU Golf has a great and storied history," Winstead said. "Although it's been many years since we've enjoyed that level of success, it is clear that the foundation has been laid for future success and we are well on our way to bringing LSU Golf back to the forefront of college golf. It's a very exciting time to be a part of this program and to be an LSU Tiger."

Winstead, a Ruston native who played at LSU from 1989-91, believes that the foundation of any successful program is built on recruiting the best high school athletes the sport has to offer.

In just three short seasons, Winstead has not only proven himself as one of the premier coaches in the game, but he has also established a reputation as being one of the nation's top recruiters after attracting many of the best junior golfers in the country to Baton Rouge since 2005.

In November 2006, Winstead signed one of the nation's elite recruiting classes as prep standouts Andrew Loupe of Baton Rouge, La., John Peterson of Fort Worth, Texas, and Clayton Rotz of Chambersburg, Pa., decided to continue their careers in the purple and gold.

Each was the top recruit in his home state for the Class of 2007 and they have already put their potential on display after finishing the 2007-08 season as the fourth-ranked freshman class in the country in the Golfstat Top 25 Freshman Class Impact Ranking. The trio also proved to be among the best class of newcomers in the Southeastern Conference as each was named to the inaugural eight-man SEC All-Freshman Team in a

vote of the league's 12 head coaches.

In addition, the trio helped lead the Tigers back into the national rankings last fall as the squad was ranked as high as No. 23 in the country in the Golfweek/Sagarin Performance Index, marking the first time that LSU has cracked the national rankings since 2004.

Winstead continued to build a foundation on the recruiting trail in November 2007 as he inked a class ranked No. 4 in the nation for the Class of 2008 according to Golfweek. Blue chippers Sang Yi of Carrollton, Texas, Josh Jones of The Colony, Texas, and Austin Gutsell of Mandeville, La., signed with LSU and will be eligible to compete for the Tigers as freshmen this fall.

Yi was the 12th-ranked junior golfer in the country and the 10th-ranked prospect in the Class of 2008 when he signed, while Jones was the nation's 19th-ranked junior golfer and the 16th-ranked player in his classification according to the Golfweek Junior Rankings. Gutsell was also one of nation's Top 100 recruits for the Class of 2008 as he was ranked No. 89 in the country.

"LSU Golf will be a nationally competitive program again as we attract elite high school golfers to Baton Rouge and provide an environment for improvement that is second to none," Winstead said. "We will provide our players with the opportunity to be the best they can be both on and off the course. There will be no other program in the country where a young man can go and have the resources he will find at LSU. We're on the cutting-edge in all areas, and as a result, our players will achieve great things in the future."

In just his first season as LSU's head coach, Winstead guided the Tigers to their best finish at the SEC Championships in four years as the squad placed sixth in 2006. They followed by finishing ninth at the nation's most competitive conference tournament in 2007.

The Tigers have also enjoyed much individual success under Winstead's tutelage as former LSU standout Chris Wells was named a Second-Team All-SEC selection and a PING All-Southeast Region performer following the 2007 season. In addition, LSU's student-athletes have earned 21 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections in his three seasons as head coach.

"We've had a great run in our first three years here," Winstead said. "Our players have improved and, as a result, their scoring averages are continuing to drop. It's exciting given the talented young men heading to Baton Rouge to join our program. We are positioned in the short run to see quite a change in the culture of LSU Golf."

Winstead is considered one of the top teaching professionals in the country and has been a Golf Magazine Top 100 Teacher since 2005, joining the likes of Butch Harmon, Peter Kostis, Jim Flick and Tiger standout and recent LSU Hall of Fame inductee Eddie Merrins. In addition, Golf Digest has recognized Winstead as Louisiana's Top Teacher since 2006.

He has been featured on The Golf Channel and frequently appears in such publications as Golf Magazine and Golf Tips Magazine for which he serves as Senior Instruction Editor.

Winstead's credentials include a five-year association with Jack Nicklaus' Golden Bear Golf, Inc., in North Palm Beach, Fla., where he served as Director of Instruction for Golden Bear Golf among other things. In this role, Winstead served as part of the senior management team responsible for developing, managing and initiating the launch of Jack Nicklaus Golf Academies throughout the world.

Prior to moving to the University Club in 2000 where he served as Director of Instruction and owner of the Chuck Winstead Golf Academy for five years prior to being named the Tigers' head coach, Winstead served as Director of Instruction at English Turn Golf and Country Club in New Orleans from 1998-2000. In addition, he also served as the head instructor for the Bob Toski Golf Learning Center in Sunrise, Fla., from 1993-95.

Winstead graduated from LSU in 1991. He and wife, Jennifer, are the proud parents of two sons – Trey, 9, and David, 6 – and are active members of First United Methodist Church in Baton Rouge.

Assistant Coach Shane Warren Fourth Season

Shane Warren enters his fourth season as an assistant coach with the LSU men's golf program as he is responsible for assisting head coach Chuck Winstead in LSU's recruiting efforts, coordinating practice sessions, providing assistance at tournaments and handling all day-to-day responsibilities with the team.

With Warren's assistance, the Tigers advanced to NCAA postseason play for the first time since 2005 with a berth into the NCAA West Regional last spring, and they are poised to advance to the NCAA Men's Golf Championships for the first time in 12 seasons as they will open the 2008-09 campaign with their most talented squad in more than a decade.

"Working with Chuck and this program has been a fantastic opportunity these last three years," Warren said. "I'm one of the fortunate few to wake up every day and do something that I love and am passionate about. The opportunity to work alongside Chuck in this capacity and continue to learn from him has been everything I was hoping it would be. There is no place like LSU. It's truly a special place, and I'm excited about what lies ahead for LSU men's golf."

Warren demonstrated his recruiting prowess this past year as he helped LSU ink its best signing class in more than a decade and the nation's fourth-ranked recruiting class for 2008 according to Golfweek. The Tigers welcome standouts Sang Yi (Carrollton, Texas), Josh Jones (The Colony, Texas) and Austin Gutsell (Mandeville, La.) to the team this fall.



Yi was the 12th-ranked junior golfer in the country and the 10th-ranked prospect in the Class of 2008 when he signed, while Jones was the nation's 19th-ranked junior golfer and the 16th-ranked player in his classification according to the Golfweek Junior Rankings. Gutsell was also one of nation's Top 100 recruits for the Class of 2008 as he was ranked No. 89 in the country.

This comes just one season after Warren helped sign one of the nation's top classes in 2007 with the addition of Andrew Loupe (Baton Rouge, La.), John Peterson (Fort Worth, Texas) and Clayton Rotz (Chambersburg, Pa.) to the roster. Widely considered the top high school recruits in their respective states, each showed their potential as freshmen a year ago as they were named to the inaugural eight-man SEC All-Freshman Team.

Warren served in the same capacity with head coach Karen Bahnsen and the nationally-ranked LSU women's golf program from 2003 through the end of the 2006 season. He is considered one of the top assistant coaches in Division I college golf, and the National Golf Coaches Association Board of Directors named Warren the 2004-05 NGCA Assistant Coach of the Year in July 2005.

A native of Tuscaloosa, Ala., Warren came to LSU in 2003 after serving as an assistant coach for the Alabama women's golf program from 1999-2002 and as an instructor for the Chuck Winstead Golf Academy at the University Club in 2003. Under his guidance, the Lady Tigers went from a program that was ranked 55th nationally when he joined the staff to one that was ranked in the top 10 in his last two seasons with the team.

Prior to his stints at Alabama and LSU, Warren served two years as the assistant golf professional at Hidden Meadows Golf Club in Northport, Ala., and one year as the head golf instructor at the Golden Bear Golf Center in Fort Lauderdale, Fla. He also served as an associate golf professional at Lago Mar Country Club in Plantation, Fla., and as an instructor for the Mark Wood Golf Learning Center in Fort Lauderdale.

The 38-year-old Warren graduated from the University of Alabama with a degree in sports and fitness management in 1994. He married the former Lauren Burger of New Orleans on March 10, 2007, and has two daughters - Caroline, 4, and Ellagrace, 6 months.

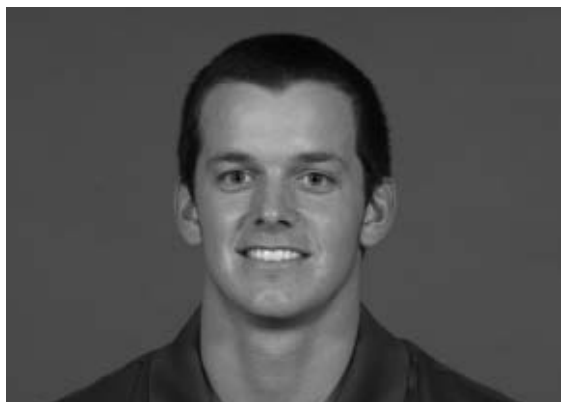

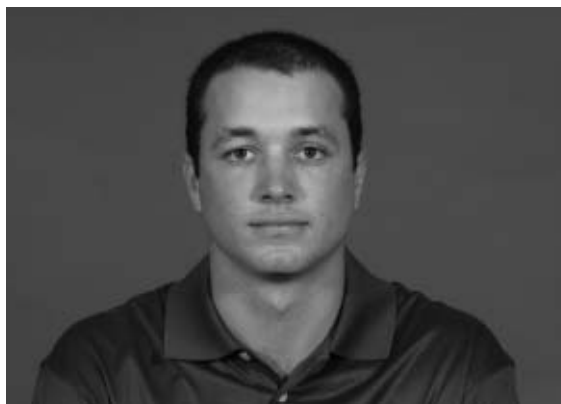

Season Review

In just three short seasons with head coach Chuck Winstead leading the way, the LSU men's golf program has positioned itself among the nation's elite once again. That was never more evident than in 2007-08 as the Tigers opened the season with a new sense of expectation armed with one of the premier freshman classes in all of college golf, and the team delivered by earning an NCAA Regional berth for the first time since 2005.

The Tigers, who competed with one of the more talented young starting lineups in the country, made the trip to Bremerton, Wash., to compete in the 2008 NCAA West Regional at the Olympic Course at Gold Mountain Golf Club where they wrapped up the season in 22nd place in the 27-team field. It marked the end of a season that certainly showed the Tigers are well on their way to achieving great things under Winstead's guidance.

Winstead has committed himself to attracting only the nation's best to Baton Rouge, and that was proven to be true in 2007-08 as the trio of Andrew Loupe, John Peterson and Clayton Rotz finished the season as the fourth-ranked freshman class according to the final Golfstat Top 25 Freshman Class Impact Ranking. In addition, each proved to be among the top rookies in the Southeastern Conference with a selection to the inaugural eight-man SEC All-Freshman Team announced by the league office following the season.

Loupe finished his freshman season as the team's leading scorer with a 74.06 scoring average in 33 rounds, including a team-leading two Top 10 and five Top 20 finishes, while Peterson followed closely behind with the second-lowest average on the team at 74.11 in 36 competitive rounds. In fact, Peterson, a native of Fort Worth, Texas, was the only Tiger to crack the starting lineup in all 12 tournaments during the 2007-08 season.

Rotz was not far back with a 74.72 average in his first season at the collegiate level while also matching Loupe's effort with two Top 10 and five Top 20 finishes of his own.

While the Tigers were led by freshmen for much of the season, the LSU veterans showed remarkable improvement in their game with four

players lowering their scoring average from the 2006-07 season, and no Tiger showed as much improvement a year ago as Bryant Lach, who cut more than three strokes off his average from his freshman to his sophomore season. After posting a 77.3 scoring average as a freshman two years ago, Lach dropped to a 74.2 during his sophomore season to help lead the Tigers to their most successful season in four years.

Thanks to Winstead's expert instruction, Jarrod Barsamian also experienced a dramatic improvement in his game by cutting two strokes off his average score after making a career best nine tournament appearances last year. Barsamian finished his junior season with a 74.14 scoring average compared to the 76.1 average he recorded as a sophomore two seasons ago.

Despite his team's success in 2007-08, Winstead knew he needed to hit the recruiting trail once again to firmly establish the Tigers' foundation as one of the more talented teams in the nation for years to come. And he did just that by signing the nation's No. 4 recruiting class for the Class of 2008 according to Golfweek. National blue-chippers Sang Yi of Carrollton, Texas, Josh Jones of The Colony, Texas, and Austin Gutsell of Mandeville, La., signed with LSU and will be eligible to compete for the Tigers as freshmen this fall.

Yi was the 12th-ranked junior golfer in the country and the 10th-ranked prospect in the Class of 2008 when he signed, while Jones was the nation's 19th-ranked junior golfer and the 16th-ranked player in his classification according to the Golfweek Junior Rankings. Gutsell was also one of nation's Top 100 recruits for the Class of 2008 as he was ranked No. 89 in the country.

The Tigers opened the 2007-08 season with a trip to Chattanooga, Tenn., on Sept. 10-11 to compete in the Scenic City Invitational where they finished with a solid fourth-place finish in the 17-team field. The squad posted a score of 2-over par 854 for 54 holes with senior Brian Noonan leading the way, posting an even-par 213 to tie for 16th place.

The team followed with a 10th place finish at the third-annual Shoal Creek Intercollegiate from Sept. 24-25 before heading to Squire Creek Country Club in Choudrant, La., to compete in the Squire Creek

Invitational for the first time in team history. The Tigers fired a 2-under 862 for the tournament, including an impressive 7-under 281 in the final round, to finish alone in second place in the team standings. Their final-round score marked the lowest single-round total for an LSU team since firing a 10-under 278 at the University Club Intercollegiate in 2004.

Rotz led the Tigers' effort in both events by earning back-to-back Top 10 finishes to put himself in the hunt for SEC Freshman of the Year honors early in the season. After finishing in a tie for fourth place at the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate, Rotz fired a season best 2-under par 214 to tie for eighth place at the Squire Creek Invitational.

The Tigers wrapped up the fall season with a pair of sixth-place finishes in the 12-team field at the ClubGlove Intercollegiate in Somis, Calif., from Oct. 22-23 and the 15-team field at the Bridgestone Collegiate Championship in Greensboro, N.C., from Oct. 29-30.

If the fall season showed the potential of LSU's talented freshman class, the start of the spring season was a coming out party of sorts for Loupe, who teed it up alongside many of the nation's top collegiate golfers and earned his best finish of the season at the Gator Invitational on Feb. 10. Loupe actually grabbed a share of the lead after the first day of competition following a pair of impressive rounds of 2-under 68 and 5-under 65 before wrapping up the tournament with a 2-over 72 in the final round for a season-low 54-hole score of 5-under 205. His 65 in the second round was also a season best for the freshman from Baton Rouge.

The Tigers also enjoyed a solid performance at the Gator Invitational as they posted their third straight sixth-place finish in the 14-team field.

The team returned to the state of Florida three weeks later to participate in the Seminole Intercollegiate where they finished in ninth place. After finishing in seventh place at the Schenkel E-Z-Go Invitational and 10th place at the Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate, the Tigers put the

finishing touches on their preparation for the SEC Men's Golf Championships with a trip north to Jackson, Miss., to tee it up in the Bank of America Intercollegiate at Reunion Golf and Country Club.

LSU matched its best performance as a team during the 2007-08 season with a runner-up finish, firing an 8-under 856 for 54 holes and a season-best 9-under 279 in the second round. It also marked the first time on the season that a pair of Tigers finished in the Top 10 of the leaderboard with Peterson finishing in a tie for fifth place and Loupe finishing one stroke back in a tie for eighth place. Barsamian nearly cracked the Top 10 for the first time in his career and was tied for 11th place with a career best 1-under 215 for the championship.

With the regular season in the books, the Tigers made their annual journey to St. Simons Island, Ga., to compete in perhaps the most competitive conference tournament in all of college golf with an appearance in the 2008 SEC Men's Golf Championships from April 18-20. Frederica Golf Club played host to the event after the Seaside Course at Sea Island Golf Club had been the host site the previous seven years.

With Barsamian leading the way, the Tigers finished the championship in a tie for eighth place and put themselves in a solid position to receive an NCAA Regional bid from the NCAA Selection Committee. Barsamian was the team's top finisher as he tied for 12th place with a three-round total of 1-over 217. Lach, Loupe, Peterson and Rotz also cracked LSU's starting lineup for the conference championship.

As expected, the Tigers earned an NCAA Regional berth as they were tabbed the No. 13 seed in the NCAA West Regional hosted by the University of Washington at the Olympic Course at Gold Mountain Golf Club in Bremerton, Wash. LSU wrapped up its season with a 22nd-place finish in their first regional appearance since 2005.

SEC Golfers are Leaders on the Links

Throughout the rich history of the Southeastern Conference the league has provided a strong tradition of excellence on the links with its men's golf programs, and the 2007-08 season was no different.

Three teams finished among the Top 15 at the 2008 NCAA Men's Golf Championships with Georgia leading the way by tying for eighth place. Florida was just outside the Top 10 in 11th place, while SEC champion Alabama finished 13th. Two golfers also finished among the Top 10 performers in the championship, led by Florida All-American Billy Horschel, who finished alone in sixth place. Georgia's Hudson Swafford was three spots back in a tie for ninth.

The conference has captured 10 NCAA team titles in its history with four belonging to both LSU and Florida, while Georgia has added a pair of its own. A total of 42 SEC teams have finished in the Top 10 at the NCAA Championships since 1985.

Individually, the SEC has witnessed six national champions with Florida's Nick Gilliam winning the latest title in 2001. In addition, 41 individuals have finished among the Top 10 in the NCAA Championships since 1985.

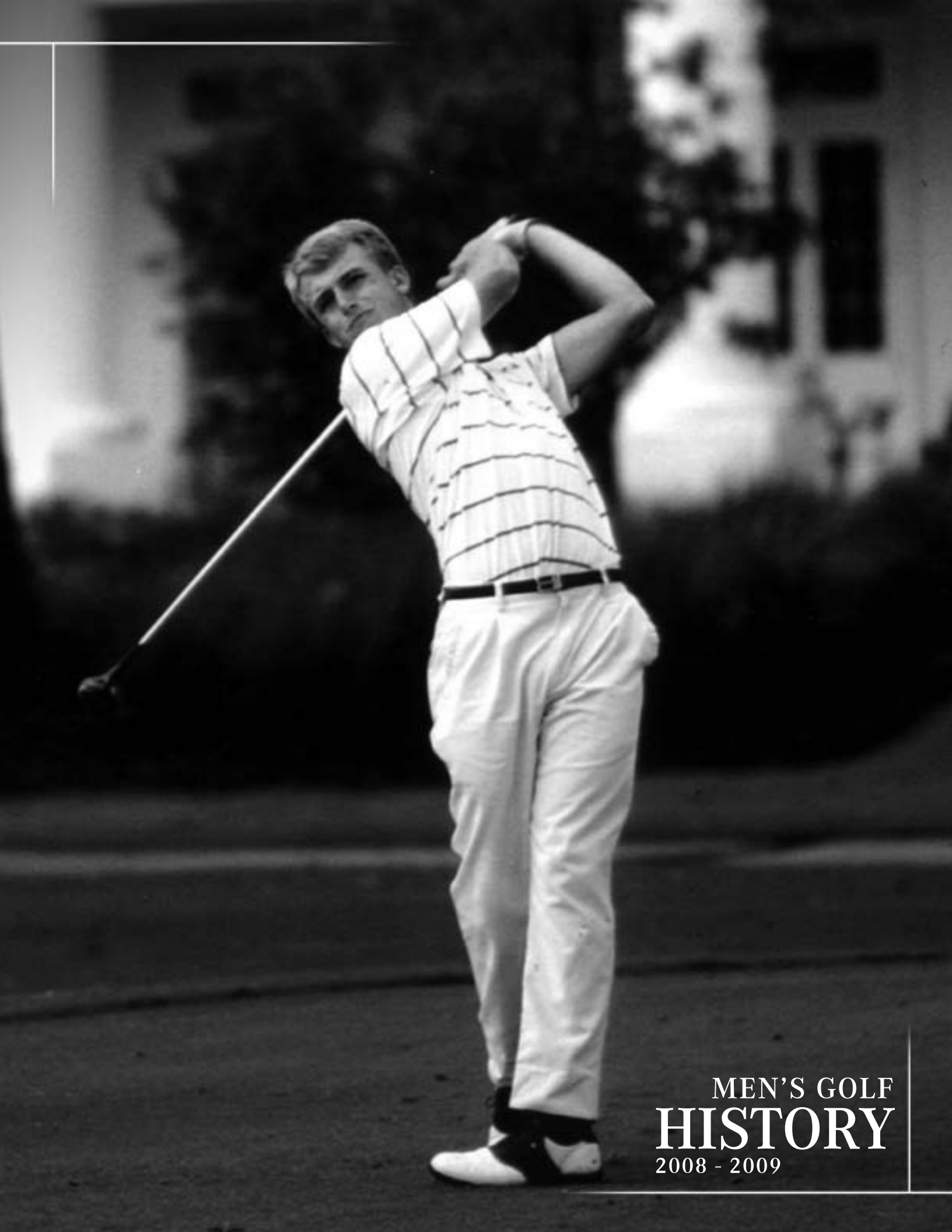
