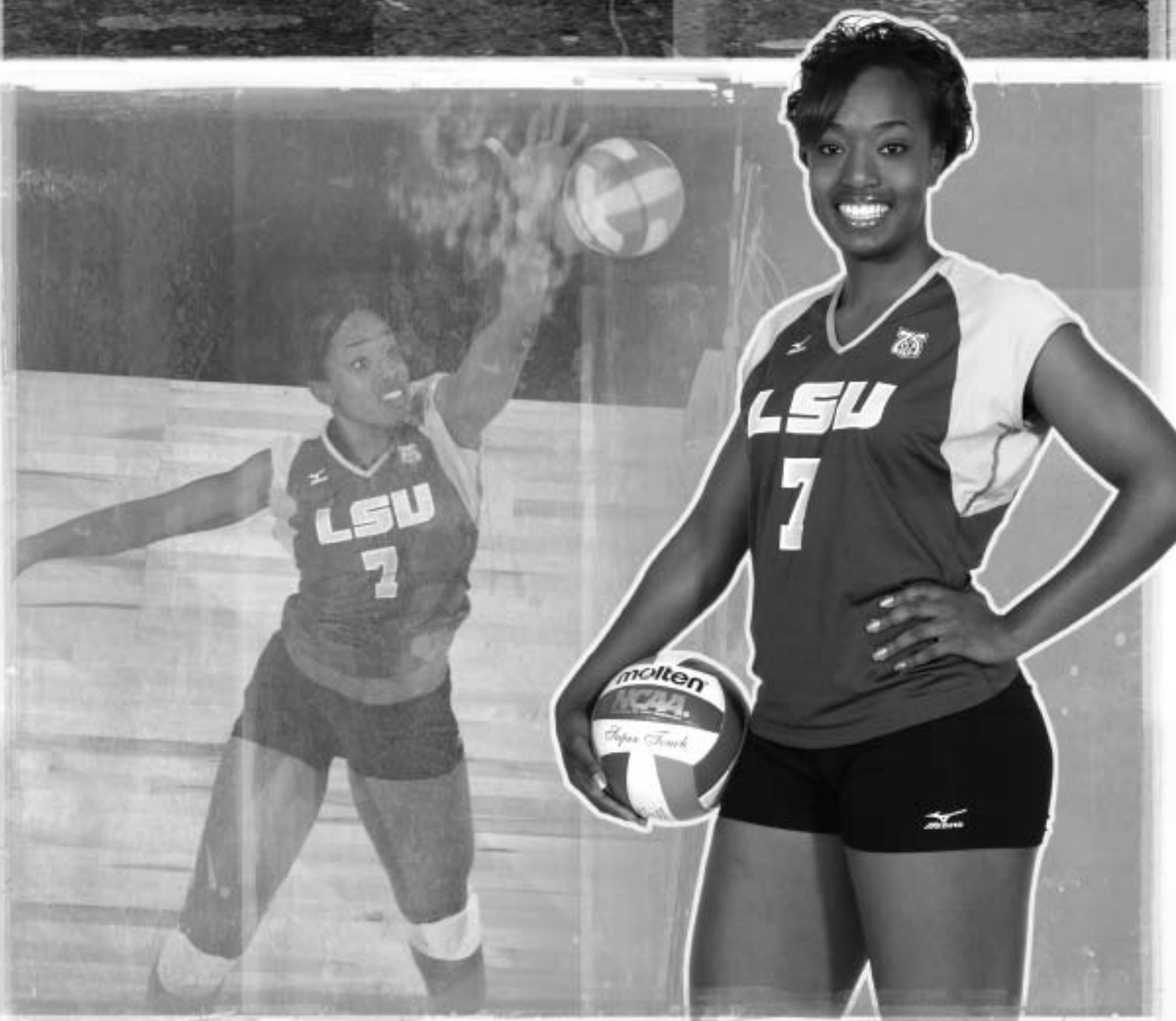

# 2011 volleyball



**E**ntering her 11th year at the helm of the Tigers, head coach Fran Flory continues to raise the level of success, returning LSU to the national rankings as the Tigers compete for a place near the top of the SEC each season.

For the third-straight year, the Tigers recorded one of their best seasons in school history. LSU posted a 25-8 record, but most importantly, finally broke through with an NCAA Tournament victory in its third-straight year in the postseason. A five-game win over New Mexico State in the first round was the first tournament win for the Tigers since 1992. LSU also won the SEC Western Division title outright with a 15-5 mark, the third-straight West title.

In addition, LSU spent nine weeks in the AVCA/CSTV Coaches poll, rising as high as No. 18 before closing out the season receiving votes.

Under Flory's guidance, LSU had two All-Americans for the first time in 15 years as junior Elena Martinez and sophomore Lauren DeGirolamo both earned honorable mention AVCA honors.

In her first season as starting libero, Martinez was also selected the SEC Defensive Player of the Year and made the All-SEC second team, while DeGirolamo and Kyna Washington took home first-team All-SEC honors. Angela Bensed also earned SEC All-Freshman team honors.

Flory has now guided players to 18 All-SEC honors, including eight first-team selections. In addition, she has led her players to 28 All-Louisiana awards, including 16 first-team selections, and every individual state award, including player, defensive player, freshman and newcomer of the year.

Flory's success, however, has not been solely on the court. LSU has had the second-most players named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll of any school in the league during her tenure, leading the league four times in the last eight seasons. The LSU volleyball program has also been recognized nationally for its academic success, picking up an American Volleyball Coaches Association Academic Award three times.

The 2006 season was an outstanding one as the Tigers posted a 26-6 record, the most wins since 1992 and the best winning percentage since 1991. LSU also won the SEC West title outright with a 16-4 mark, the most league wins in school history. The Tigers also earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament for the second-straight year. In addition, LSU spent 15 consecutive weeks in the AVCA/CSTV Coaches poll, rising as high as No. 10 on two occasions before closing out the season at No. 19, the first final ranking for the Tigers since 1992.

For her efforts, Flory earned LSWA Louisiana Coach of the Year honors for the second-straight year. In addition, Daniela Romero was named an honorable mention AVCA selection after being named the Louisiana Player of the Year and a first-team All-SEC selection. Along with Romero, Marina Skender was a first-team All-SEC selection and

became the first Tiger player to earn back-to-back league honors since Meagan Davis in 2000-2001, while freshman Lauren DeGirolamo earned SEC All-Freshman team honors.

Despite traveling over 14,000 miles, Flory guided the Tigers to one of their most successful seasons in two decades in 2005. LSU won its first SEC Western Division championship, advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1992 and vaulted into the top 25 poll for the first time since 1993. After Hurricane Katrina turned the Maravich Center into the largest field hospital in the United States, the volleyball team played its first 17 matches on the road. LSU went on to finish the season at 21-8 overall and 11-5 in the SEC.

For her efforts, Flory was named the Louisiana Coach of the Year. In addition, Ivana Kuzmic became LSU's first All-American since 1992, earning honorable mention AVCA honors after being named the Louisiana Player of the Year and a first-team All-SEC selection.

Skender was named the SEC Freshman of the Year, the fourth conference rookie of the year honor in LSU history, but the first since 1990. Skender was also a second-team All-SEC selection along with Jelena Mijatovic, marking the first time since 2001 the Tigers had three players earn all-conference honors.

Four years ago, Flory led the Tigers to a third place finish in the SEC West, marking the seventh consecutive season LSU finished at least third in the West, including every year in her tenure. With a 17-12 mark, she recorded three wins over teams in the NCAA Tournament field. In addition, Kuzmic was named the Louisiana Newcomer of

the Year, while both Kuzmic and Regan Hood earned first-team All-Louisiana honors.

In 2003, Flory guided a youthful Tiger team, one with eight freshmen and no seniors, to a third place finish in the SEC West. For the first time since she became head coach, the Tigers defeated South Carolina in Columbia, S.C., knocking off the Gamecocks, 3-1, to mark the first win in Columbia since 1995. Hood earned her first All-SEC honor under Flory's tutelage, being named to the second team, while Lauren Leaumont was an All-Freshman selection in the award's inaugural year.

In 2002, Flory's Tiger team recorded the most wins by any LSU team since 1999. The Tigers also picked up back-to-back winning SEC records for the first time since 1992-93. With that came back-to-back runner-up finishes in the SEC Western Division. In addition, LSU became the first team in 19 regular-season SEC matches to take a game from nationally ranked Florida. Prior to the game one loss, the Gators last lost a game on Sept. 21, 2001, when they fell behind 2-0 in an eventual 3-2 win over South Carolina. Florida had not lost a regular-season SEC game at home since dropping the third game to the Gamecocks in a 3-1 win on Oct. 8, 2000, a string of 12 consecutive matches.

In 2001, the Tigers recorded the fourth most conference wins in school history and picked up their first winning conference record since 1995, finishing second in the SEC West. LSU owned the best intra-division record among Western Division teams at 9-1, while finishing fourth overall.

Flory guided her 2000 squad to the SEC Tournament Championship match against perennial-powerhouse Florida.

Despite the loss in the final, LSU made a breakthrough, as it had not been to the championship match since 1992 and had not won a tournament match since 1993.

Flory's 2000 team also became the first LSU team to beat Arkansas when it did so in three games on the Lady Backs' home floor. She led the Tigers to their first win at Auburn in 10 years en route to a third place finish in the SEC West.

In 1999, Flory led her injury-riddled squad to a 17-15 overall record, the best for an LSU team since the Tigers won 20 matches in 1995. Of the 17 wins, seven came in conference play, also a Tiger best since the 1995 season.

She made an immediate impact at LSU in 1998 as she led the Tigers to a 15-16 record, six matches better than the 9-21 mark the team had the year before. More impressive was the five-match improvement in SEC play. After a winless 1997 in conference action under the former head coach, LSU notched five SEC victories in 1998 to finish third in the West.

This is Flory's second stint at LSU as the Baton Rouge native was an assistant for four years under LSU's winningest coach, Scott Luster. She served as a graduate assistant in 1988, before being named a full-time assistant in 1989. During her four seasons with the Tigers, Flory helped LSU to unprecedented success with three SEC championships, three SEC Tournament championships and two Final Four appearances, the first school in SEC history to advance to the NCAA Final Four.

In 1992, Flory left LSU to assume the head coaching duties at Southeastern Louisiana. In her first season as a Division I head coach, she led the Lions to a 21-13 record.

In March 1993, Flory returned to the SEC as she became an assistant coach at Kentucky. Five months later, she was named the Wildcats head coach as then-Kentucky coach Kathy DeBoer, who is currently the Executive Director of the American Volleyball Coaches Association, was named an Associate Athletic Director.

In her first season at Kentucky, Flory led the Wildcats to a 29-4 record, while advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. For her efforts in the 1993 season, she was named the Tachikara/AVCA Region IV Coach of the Year.

A 1984 graduate of Texas, Flory has also experienced much success as a player. In 1981, she was a member of Texas' AIAW National Championship squad. She received All-Southwest Conference and All-South Region honors during three seasons with the Longhorns.

Following her playing career, Flory was named the head coach at Wittenberg University, where she coached for one season before being named an assistant at Texas A&M.

A member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association, Flory has also assisted in coordinating both the Louisiana Senior Olympic Games and the Special Olympics, and hosting the Senior Olympic Games in 2001. She is also a member of the United States Volleyball Association coaching accreditation program.

She is married to Ken Flory. The two have a daughter, Lindsay (11), and a son, Nicholas (9).

Former Southern California setter Steve Loeswick, who spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Oklahoma, is entering his second season as an assistant coach for the Tiger volleyball staff.

A former setter himself, Loeswick guided the development of a pair of first-year setters in his first year at LSU, after the graduation of four-year starter and former All-American Daniela Romero. The Tigers ranked sixth in the SEC in assists per game, kills per game and hitting percentage, while Lauren DeGirolamo ranked in the top 10 in the league in hitting percentage and Kyna Washington was in the top five in kills per game.

Prior to coming to Baton Rouge, Loeswick spent three seasons with the Sooners, where he helped the Oklahoma program to a record turnaround, while leading the Sooners to the 2006 NCAA Sweet 16.

As part of Sooner head coach and 2006 AVCA Central Region Coach of the Year Santiago Restrepo's staff, Loeswick guided Oklahoma to a 28-6 overall record and 17-3 mark in the Big 12, good enough for a second place finish. The Sooners recorded school records for wins and winning percentage, and recorded the best one-year turnaround in Big 12 history with 15 more league victories than 2005.

Oklahoma advanced to the NCAA Tournament for just the fourth time in school history and knocked off Oral Roberts and Missouri State before falling to UCLA in only the Sooner's second appearance in the NCAA Sweet 16. Earning its first national ranking in 18 years, Oklahoma finished the season ranked No. 12 in the AVCA poll, the Sooners' highest ranking in school history.

In addition, he coached Elaine Santos and Joanna Schmitt to All-America honors in 2006 as Santos was named the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and Anna Monsen was the Big 12 Libero of the Year. Oklahoma setter Rachel Jackson also earned honorable mention All-Big 12 honors.

Loeswick helped the Sooner setters improve each season on the Oklahoma staff. Most of the assist marks in the rally scoring system were held by setters under his tutelage. In addition, the Sooners ranked third in the Big 12 in assists per game and third in hitting percentage, as Jackson ranked second in the conference in individual assists per game.

Prior to joining the Oklahoma staff, Loeswick served as an assistant coach at Cornell for six seasons from 1998-2003, restoring the Big Red program to prominence with a career record of 93-38. His final year in Ithaca, he led Cornell to a second-place finish in the Ivy League with a record of 21-4. During his tenure, he helped develop 2000 Ivy League Player of the Year Robin Moore and 16 All-Ivy League selections.

Loeswick began his coaching career in Holland in 1997 where he was an assistant coach for the Martinus Club, a professional women's club, for one season. He began his coaching career after a year playing in Germany's top professional volleyball league.

The former four-year starting setter for the University of Southern California, he was just the third Trojan player to start in a single position for all four years. As a freshman, he ranked 10th nationally with 15.86 assists per game before earning 1993 Volleyball Monthly All-Freshman team honors and being named to the 1996 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation All-Academic Team.

In 1993 and 1994, Loeswick participated in the U.S. Olympic Festival, serving as the captain of the squad that captured the silver medal. A Volleyball Monthly Fabulous 50 Prep as a senior in high school in 1992, he also won a gold medal at the 1991 Empire State Games. In addition, he was a member of the U.S. Junior Elite team twice and played for the Rochester Pace Bootlegger club team, where he earned AAU All-America honors.

In 1996, Loeswick earned his bachelor's degree in exercise science from USC. A native of North Tonawanda, N.Y., he married the former Jennifer Arbuckle on June 17, 2006. Jennifer, a standout outside hitter at Virginia Tech from 1992-1995, served as Oklahoma director of volleyball operations for several years. Steve and Jennifer welcomed their first child, Isabella Rose, in April 2007.

Former Tiger volleyball standout Jill Lytle Wilson, who came to LSU from Wake Forest, enters her second season as an assistant coach for the Tiger volleyball program.

In her first season, Wilson continued the development of two of the best LSU hitters in school history in her first season. Kyna Washington became just the 14th player in school history to record 1,000 career kills and ranked in the top five in the SEC in kills per game on her way to first-team All-SEC honors. Marina Skender joined Washington as only the 15th player to reach 1,000 career kills. The pair were also the fifth and sixth juniors to reach the milestone and the first pair of juniors to do so in the same season since 1990. True freshman right side Angela Benseid was also named to the SEC All-Freshman team.

Lytle Wilson spent one season as an assistant with the Demon Deacons, leading them to a tie for their most wins in the Atlantic Coast Conference in school history. On the court, she was in charge of training the outside hitters and right side hitters, while off the court, she coordinated team travel and assisted in recruiting. She also served as assistant camp director.

From 2002-2004, Lytle Wilson was an assistant coach at the University of North Carolina. In three seasons in Chapel Hill, she helped lead the Tar Heels to their first NCAA Sweet 16 appearance and the 2002 Atlantic Coast Conference regular season championship with a 32-4 overall record and a final national ranking of No. 11.

In 2003, she helped guide North Carolina to a 20-win season, despite losing four starters. In addition, she coached Laura Greene and Molly Pyles to All-America honors in 2002 and 2004 respectively as Green took home ACC Player of the Year honors in 2002.

Prior to joining the Tar Heel staff, Lytle Wilson served as a graduate assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin in 2001. She helped lead the Skyhawks to the regular season Ohio Valley Conference Championship with a 24-7 overall record.

Lytle Wilson also has experience as an assistant coach for the Triangle Volleyball Club

from 2002-2006, serving as assistant club director in 2006.

A four-year starter at outside hitter for LSU from 1997-2000, Lytle Wilson stayed on as a student assistant coach in 2001 before earning her bachelor of science degree in business administration in 2001.

One of the hardest workers on her team and considered one of the most determined players Flory has ever coached, Lytle played in 98 matches in her career, limited only by a torn anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee suffered 11 matches into her junior season.

As a senior, she ranked sixth in the SEC with 23 service aces as she helped lead the Tigers to a berth in the SEC Tournament championship game.

A three-time member of the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll, she was also the Tigers' representative on the women's at-large SEC Good Works Team in 1999-2000. Her good works did not go unnoticed at the University as Lytle Wilson was named the LSU Student-Athlete Volunteer of the Year in 2000. She served on the CHAMPS Student-Athlete Advisory Board for four years, the last year serving as president of the organization. She was also a member of the LSU tennis team in 2001.

Lytle Wilson, originally from Richmond, Texas, was a member of the Texas Elite Volleyball Club during her prep playing days. She earned first-team all-district and second-team All-Greater Houston honors as a senior at Lamar Consolidated High School.

As a junior, she was the District 23-4A Most Valuable Player as Lamar Consolidated earned the 1995 district title. A nominee for the Wendy's High School Heisman Award, she was a member of the National Honor Society and graduated in the top five percent of her class.

The daughter of Mike and Kim Lytle, Jill is married to Jared Wilson. She was born on May 6, 1979.

Caroline Domecq is in her first year as Associate Sports Information Director at LSU, where she works primarily with the gymnastics program and the women's volleyball team.

Domecq has spent the last two years as a graduate assistant at the University of Georgia, where she served as the sports information contact for the four-time defending NCAA Champion Gym Dogs and the SEC Champion

women's tennis team. While at Georgia she also served as the Media Director of the 2008 NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championships and the Assistant Media Director for the 2007 NCAA Men's and Women's Tennis Championships.

She graduated with a master's degree in Sport Management in May 2008 from the University of Georgia.

Domecq also spent three years as a student assistant in the LSU sports information office as an undergraduate, acting as the primary contact for the women's tennis team and also working closely with gymnastics and men's tennis. 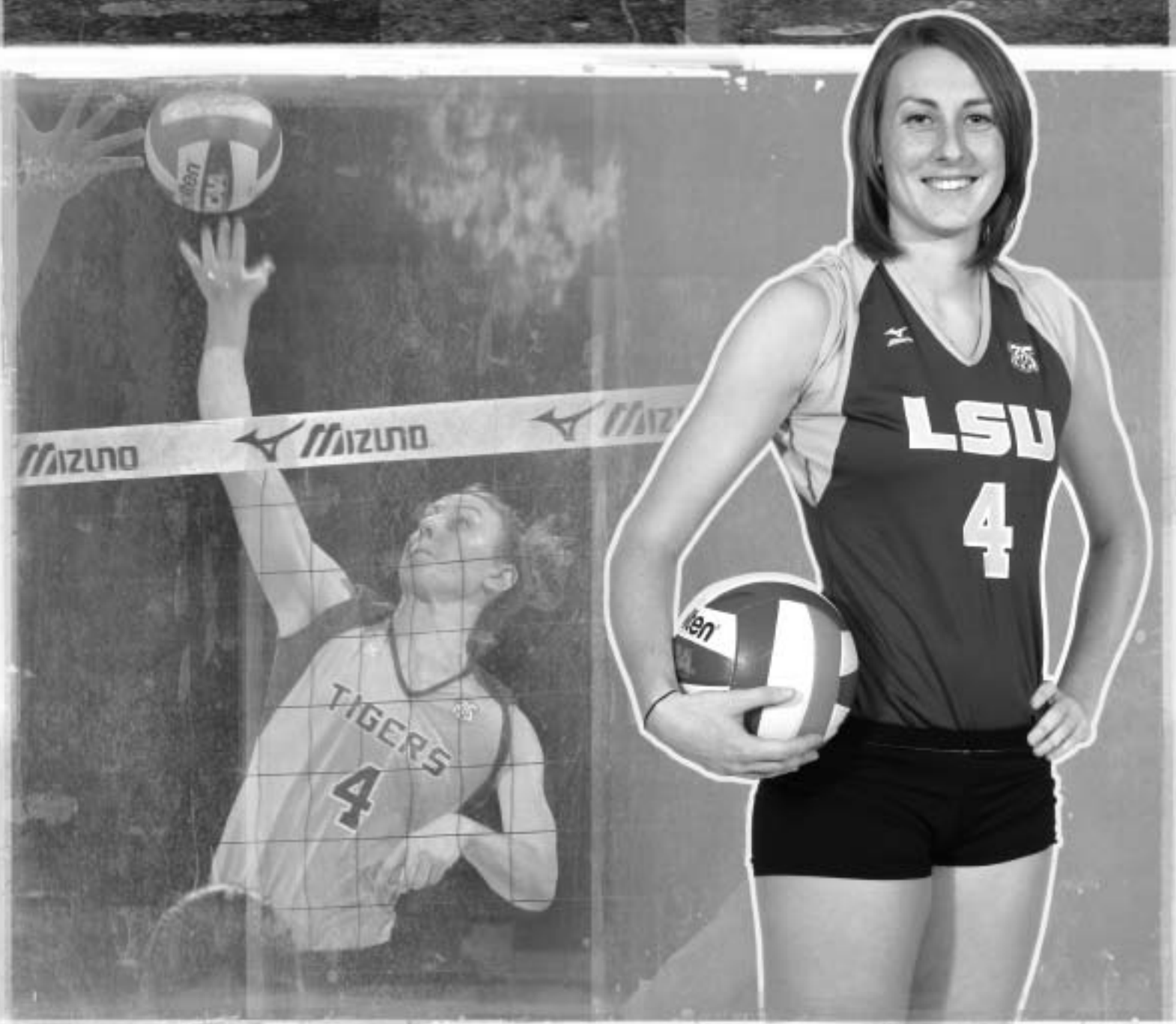

### THREE-STRAIGHT SEC WEST TITLES

For the third-straight season, the Tigers claimed the SEC Western Division title. In 2005, LSU tied with Arkansas to share its first West championship before winning the title outright in 2006. In 2007, LSU finished with a 15-5 mark in SEC play, finishing one game ahead of Ole Miss in the West and four games behind Florida in the overall race. The Tigers now join Arkansas and Florida as the only two teams in the conference to win three-straight divisional titles. The Gators have won all 13 Eastern Division titles since the league went to divisions in 1995, sharing the title with Tennessee in 2004. Arkansas won five-straight Western Division titles from 1995-1999, sharing the title with Auburn in 1996; and four-straight from 2001-2004, sharing the title with Alabama in 2004.

### THREE-STRAIGHT NCAA TOURNAMENT BERTHS

The Tigers made their third-straight trip to the NCAA Tournament, marking the first back-to-back-to-back berths since making four consecutive appearances from 1989-1992. Overall, LSU made its ninth appearance in the NCAA Tournament and has posted an 11-9 record. The Tigers are one of only three teams in the SEC to advance to the NCAA Final Four, making appearances in both 1990 and 1991. In addition to LSU, four other SEC teams earned bids to the NCAA Tournament. Alabama, Florida, Kentucky and Ole Miss were also chosen to participate in the postseason tournament.

### 16-YEAR DROUGHT COMES TO AN END

With a five-game win over New Mexico State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Austin, Texas, LSU recorded its first NCAA Tournament victory since 1992 when the Tigers knocked off Texas Tech in three games in Lubbock. It also marked the first victory for LSU in any postseason match since advancing to the SEC Tournament championship game in 2000. The Tigers rallied back from a 2-1 deficit against the Aggies to win games four and five by a combined five points after falling in games two and three by a total of 18 points. Freshman Tania Schatow came on for Lauren DeGirolamo, who was limited by a foot injury, and provided the spark LSU needed down the stretch to come away with the win.

### IN THE CSTV/AVCA POLL

The Tigers finished 2007 receiving votes in the AVCA/CSTV Coaches poll. The Tigers began the preseason ranked No. 23 in the poll and were ranked as high as No. 18 on Oct. 8. LSU fell out of the poll on Oct. 22, snapping a streak of 23 consecutive weeks among the top 25 which dated back to the first poll of the 2006 season.

### GOING TO FIVE...

LSU played an astounding 13 five-game matches in 2007. The Tigers were 9-4 (.692) in the five-framers, with three of the four losses coming on the road in SEC play as a string of four-straight losses on the road in the SEC in October. The nine five-game wins broke the school record of eight set in 1986, while 12 five-game matches marked the most in a single season since playing 13 in 1985.

### GOLD STANDARD

In a promotion dubbed the "Gold Game", the LSU volleyball team broke the single-match volleyball attendance record against South Carolina on Sept. 21. The Tiger faithful, clad all in gold, topped 2,300 as LSU shattered the previous record of an estimated 2,250 against Kentucky in 1992. With an attendance of 2,308, LSU marked its third 2,000-plus attendance in school history and the first since the 1992 record. Along with the 1,294 that attended the match against Kentucky on Nov. 2, the 10th largest attendance in school history, the Tigers averaged 798 for the year, the largest average attendance in Fran Flory's 10-year tenure.

### HOW MAY I SERVE YOU...

Kyna Washington and Marina Skender both ranked in the top five in the SEC in service aces per game, the only two players from the same team ranked in the top five. Washington was second in the SEC and 28th in the NCAA with 70 aces for an average of 0.53 aces per game. Skender was fifth in the conference and 106th in the country with 56 aces and averaged 0.42 aces per game.

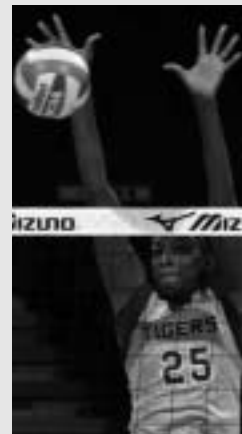


### DOUBLE TROUBLE

The Tigers boasted a pair of dominant players up the middle last season. Lauren DeGirolamo ranked second in the SEC and 19th in the NCAA with 1.51 blocks per game, followed closely by Brittnee Cooper in fourth in the league and 32nd nationally with 1.42 blocks per game, the only two players from the same team to even be ranked in the top eight.

### RIGHT BACK AT YOU

With a career high 13 blocks against Notre Dame on Oct. 23, 11 blocks against Ole Miss, 10 blocks against Tennessee and 11 blocks against Florida, Brittnee Cooper posted four double-figure blocking matches. She became the first player at LSU to post four double-figure blocking matches in a season since Ivana Kuzmic in 2005.



## MARTINEZ BREAKS SEC/LSU DIGS RECORD

With her 20th dig against Georgia on Nov. 16, Elena Martinez broke the 21-year-old SEC single-season digs record with her 656th. Martinez had previously broken the LSU single-season mark with her 536th against Kentucky on Nov. 2. She finished the season with 740 for the year, the first player in SEC history to record 700 digs in a season, topping the SEC record set by Shelly Gross of Georgia in 1986 and the LSU record set by Kassi Mikulik in 2006.

## MARTINEZ LEADS SEC, RANKS 35TH IN NCAA

Elena Martinez recorded double-digit digs in every match, led the SEC and ranked 35th in the nation with 5.61 digs per game. Lara Newberry of Chattanooga led the nation with 7.19 digs per game. Martinez's mark shattered the school record of 4.69 digs per game recorded by Kassi Mikulik in 2006. Martinez also recorded 20 or more digs in 21 of the Tigers' 33 matches.



## MARTINEZ BREAKS LSU DIGS RECORDS

Against Alabama on Nov. 11, Elena Martinez recorded 43 digs, shattering her overall LSU record for digs in any match by nine. With her third 30-dig match of the season, Martinez also broke the school record for 30-dig matches in a season and for a career, finishing the season with six 30-dig matches. Daniela Reis had been the only previous Tiger with a 30-dig match in school history and she posted two during the 1993 season. Martinez's 43 digs match was the most by any player in the SEC during the season and a school record for digs in a five-game match. For the year, Martinez recorded the top five dig performances in a five-game match in LSU history.

Against Arkansas on Sept. 16, Elena Martinez recorded 33 digs, breaking the LSU record for digs in a four-game match. She finished the season with three of the top four dig marks in a four-game match in school history.

## COOPER/DEGIROLAMO IN THE RECORD BOOKS

Against Notre Dame, Brittnee Cooper tied for the seventh most total blocks in a five-game match with 13 and the eighth most block assists with 11. The last time a Tiger posted 13 blocks in a five-game match was Ivana Kuzmic, also against Notre Dame (9/18/05), and the last LSU player to post 11 block assists in a five-game match was Kuzmic against Ole Miss (10/3/04). Against No. 6 Florida on Sept. 23, Cooper recorded 11 blocks, tying her for the seventh most total blocks in a four-game match. Along with nine block assists, she tied for the sixth most block assists in a four-game match.

Against Georgia on Nov. 16, Lauren DeGirolamo tied for the fourth most block assists in a three-game match with eight and the eighth most total block with nine. The last time a Tiger posted nine total blocks and at least eight block assists in a three-game match was DeGirolamo against Marquette (11/25/06). Against Rice, DeGirolamo tied for the fourth most total blocks in a four-game match with 12 and the sixth most block assists with nine. The last time a Tiger posted 12 blocks in a four-game match was Julie Stempel against Southern California (11/16/89), and the last LSU player to post nine block assists in a four-game match was DeGirolamo last season against Kentucky on Sept. 17.

## WASHINGTON RECORDS SECOND MOST KILLS

Against Ole Miss on Sept. 12, Kyna Washington recorded 24 kills, the second most kills in a three-game match in LSU history. Washington was only two behind the school record of 26 set by Monique Adams in 1991.

## DEGIROLAMO, COOPER IN BLOCKING RECORDS

With 158 block assists, Lauren DeGirolamo finished in fourth in single season block assists in LSU history, while Brittnee Cooper's 152 block assists tied her for fifth in single-season history with DeGirolamo's performance from 2006. In addition, DeGirolamo finished the season ranked sixth in single-season blocks per game in LSU history, finishing with 1.51 per game.

## DEGIROLAMO ENTERS CAREER RECORDS

After just two seasons, Lauren DeGirolamo has entered the LSU record books for career block assists, total blocks and blocks per game. After her sophomore season, DeGirolamo ranks eighth in career block assists with 310, 185 behind Lisa Smith's 20-year-old record of 495. She is also ranked 10th in career blocks with 378, 307 behind Smith's record of 685. DeGirolamo's 1.56 blocks per game average is third in career history, close behind the record of 1.65 by Ivana Kuzmic from 2004-2006.

## SENIOR FIRSTS

The 2007 Tigers accomplished something no LSU team had done since 2000 when the Tigers knocked off Alabama in the CAVE. LSU had to rally from a 2-1 deficit to win the final two games of the five-game match to knock off the Crimson Tide. The Tigers had been 0-6 in the CAVE since 2000 before the crucial Nov. 11 victory. Senior Michelle Hensgens completed her career having won in every opposing venue with the exception of Florida's O'Connell Center, a feat no other Tiger could lay claim to in almost 15 years.

## WASHINGTON/SKENDER TOP 1,000-KILL MARK

With 14 kills against Notre Dame, Kyna Washington became the 14th player and only the fifth junior in LSU history to record 1,000 career kills. Marina Skender joined Washington in reaching the 1,000 kill mark with her 14th kill against Tennessee to become the 15th Tiger and sixth junior to reach the millennium mark. The pair were the first to accomplish the feat in the same season since 2005 when Ivana Kuzmic and Jelena Mijatovic each posted their 1,000th career kill, although both were transfers. Washington and Skender were also the first juniors to reach the milestone in the same season since Nyla Shepherd and Julie Stempel reached the 1,000-kill mark during the 1990 season.

## SKENDER NEARS 1,000 CAREER DIGS

Marina Skender became just the 12th player in LSU history to record 900 career digs, finished the year just 46 digs away from becoming the ninth Tiger to reach 1,000 digs for her career. She would also become just the fifth LSU player to ever record both 1,000 career kills and 1,000 career digs.

However, Texas ended LSU's run as the Longhorns used the home court advantage to sweep the Tigers out of the tournament.

Making its second straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament, LSU did not last long as Florida ousted the Tigers from the tournament in a five-game thriller in Gainesville, Fla. The match was the third of the year for the two teams. They had split the first two with LSU winning the regular season match and Florida winning in the SEC Tournament.

The Tigers returned to the NCAA Tournament after a one year absence from the event in 1988. Playing on its home court, LSU survived a five-game scare from Houston to advance to the South Regional in Austin, Texas. There, Texas-Arlington exacted revenge for a tournament loss from 1986 by rallying from two games down to win the last three and advance.



## 1990

**SEC Champions**  
**SEC Tournament Champions**  
**NCAA Final Four**

Coming off the second conference championship in as many years, LSU cruised into the South Regional with a sweep of Louisville in the first round of the tournament. In Austin, Texas, the Tigers ousted Texas Tech and knocked off Texas on the Longhorns home court with a 17-15 game five win to advance to the Final Four for the first time in school history. In College Park, Md., LSU fell to eventual national champion UCLA, 3-0, in the national semifinals.



## 1991

**Overall Record: 35-2**  
**SEC Champions**  
**SEC Tournament Champions**  
**NCAA Final Four**

With only one loss, LSU entered the NCAA Tournament as a favorite to return to the Final Four and the Tigers did not disappoint. LSU beat Houston in the first round for the second time in three years to advance to the South Regional, which the Tigers hosted. After sweeping Texas Tech, LSU ran into a Florida team that had handed the Tigers their only loss. A tough four-game victory later and LSU was back in the Final Four. This year in Los Angeles, Calif., the Tigers fell in four games to Long Beach State. Until Florida in 2002, the 1991 LSU team was the only team from the SEC to win a game in the NCAA Final Four.

## 1992

**Overall Record: 26-9**  
**SEC Runner-Up**  
**SEC Tournament Runner-Up**

LSU had to travel for its first round match for the first time since 1987, this time to Lubbock, Texas, where the Tigers ousted Texas Tech from the tournament in just three games for the third consecutive year. At the South Regional in Gainesville, Fla., Texas knocked LSU out of the tournament in four games, ending hopes of a third straight Final Four appearance by the Tigers.

## 1993

**Overall Record: 21-16**  
**NIVC Champions**

For the first time since 1988 and only the second since 1985, LSU was left out of the NCAA Tournament. Despite not making the tournament, the Tigers showed why they deserved a bid by coasting to the NIVC Championship in Kansas City, Mo., by dropping only three games in the team's six tournament victories. LSU swept Baylor in the tournament final.

## 2005

**Overall Record: 25-11**  
**SEC Western Division Co-Champion**

Making their first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 1992, the Tigers had to travel to Austin, Texas, for their first round match against seventh-ranked Texas. LSU put up a gutsy performance against the Longhorns, but could not pull off the upset victory, falling in three games to end its best season in over a decade despite having to play on the road for the majority of the season due to Hurricanes Katrina and Rita.



## 2006

**Overall Record: 26-6**  
**SEC Western Division Champion**

LSU made its second-straight NCAA appearance after claiming back-to-back SEC Western Division titles. Despite a top 15 national ranking, the Tigers went unseeded and were forced to travel to San Luis Obispo, Calif., for their first round match against California, another ranked team that failed to garner a national seed. LSU came out hot to win game one, but could not complete the upset of the Golden Bears as the powerful Cal front line took charge in the final three games. The Tigers completed their best season since 1992 while setting a school record for conference wins in a season.

## 2007

**Overall Record: 25-8**  
**SEC Western Division Champion**

LSU made its third-straight NCAA appearance after claiming a third-straight SEC Western Division title. Traveling to Austin, Texas, for the NCAA sub-regional, the Tigers were able to accomplish something no other LSU team had done since 1992 in winning an NCAA Tournament game. The Tigers won the first game of their first round contest against 15th-ranked New Mexico State. After dropping the next two games, LSU rallied back to win the final two, including a 15-13 win in game five. The Tigers then ran into the fourth-ranked Longhorns at home for the second time in three years. Once again, LSU saw its season come to an end in a hard fought match against Texas.

Over the past three seasons, the LSU volleyball program has averaged more than 750 fans per match, nearly doubling the average attendance from 2000-2004.



# Maravich CENTER

In 2008, the LSU volleyball program will begin its 27th season in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, the largest volleyball venue in the SEC. The structure, which was renamed in honor of the all-time LSU and NCAA men's basketball scoring leader on July 22, 1988, seats 13,373 and ranks as one of the finest college athletic arenas in the nation.

On July 1, 2004, the management of the Maravich Center came under the direction of the LSU Athletics Department and underwent a multi-year refurbishment. The renovation began three years ago with new television lighting and continued two years ago with a new roof surface. In 2006, the inside of the Maravich Center saw an upgrade as the seats were replaced and the interior was given a complete makeover. Prior to the 2007 season, the main arena got a new subfloor and a new playing floor. In the summer of 2008, the auxiliary practice gym also received a new floor.

The outside windows of the building now feature the Tiger mascot running around the arena. Volleyball fans can also see a redesigned concourse with video and graphic displays, renovated concession stands and video kiosks showcasing the best of the sports that play in the building.

The Tiger volleyball team enjoys the comforts of a spacious locker room. The two-tiered fully carpeted facility features individual cubicles for each athlete, a meeting room and storage area.

Between 1985 and 1992, the Maravich Center was one of the top home courts in the nation, as LSU ran up a 110-10 (.917) record. During that time, LSU recorded a 37-match home-court win streak, which is the second-longest streak in SEC history. In 1991, the Tigers enjoyed possibly their finest season in the arena as LSU recorded a perfect 16-0 record and advanced to the Final Four through the NCAA South Regional in Baton Rouge.

The Tigers have now posted 10 consecutive seasons without a losing record in the Maravich Center, making it once again a tough place for visiting teams to play. Over that span, LSU has a record of 82-37 (.689), including an undefeated 6-0 mark in 2005. Since beginning play in the arena in 1982, the Tigers have notched an 276-112 (.711) record, recording only three losing seasons at home.

The Maravich Center has also played host to SEC and NCAA Tournaments for volleyball, basketball and gymnastics. The 1982, 1987 and 1995 SEC Volleyball Championships were all held in the arena. The Maravich Center has also been the site of three NCAA Championship first-round matches as well as the NCAA South Regional in 1991.

Along with the main court area, an auxiliary gym with a recently refinished court is located underground in the north section of the arena. Nearly all Tiger volleyball practices take place in the auxiliary gym.
