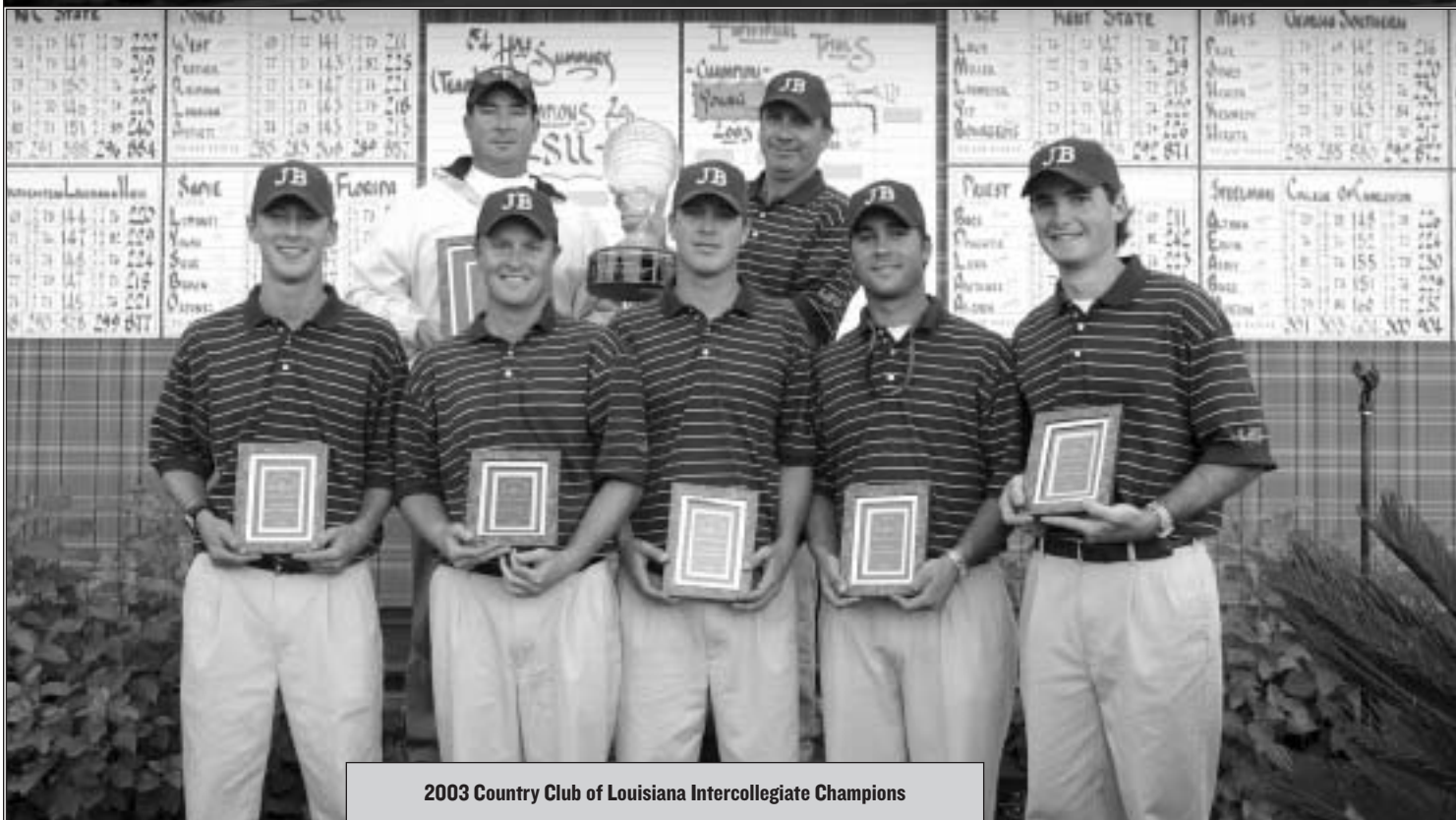

**2003 Country Club of Louisiana Intercollegiate Champions**

The 2003-04 season was one of much promise for the LSU men's golf team. Despite losing the services of All-American John Humphries from the previous season, the Tigers were an experienced group with two seniors and seven juniors to compete in the always difficult Southeastern Conference.

LSU head coach Greg Jones knew he would have to count heavily on junior All-SEC performer Heath West and senior co-captain Garrett Prather to lead the Tiger squad into the season, and they did just that. Both played in all 12 tournaments for the Tigers, and West finished with a team-best 72.8 stroke average. Prather finished with a stroke average of 73.6, which was third best on the team. West also led the team with seven top-20 and four top-10 finishes.

The Tigers opened the season Sept. 22 at the Mason Rudolph Intercollegiate in Nashville, Tenn. With the tournament shortened because of rain, LSU finished in a tie for seventh place out of 18 teams with a 22-over par 590. Junior Jeff Riemann was the only Tiger to finish in the top 20, as he tied for 12th with a 3-over 145. Junior college transfer Andrew Lanahan made his LSU debut by finishing in a tie for 31st.

LSU won its first tournament of the season a week later at the Baylor Invitational in Waco, Texas, by shooting a 4-over par 868 and finishing two shots ahead of Southeastern Louisiana. Three Tigers finished the tournament in the top 10, as Riemann, Lanahan and West each tied for ninth by shooting a 1-over par 217. This finish was a career-best for both Riemann and Lanahan, and West's first-round 67 was the lowest round of his

career. Prather also finished in a tie for 20th place with a 4-over 220.

The Tigers then traveled to Glenview, Ill., to compete in the Wendon Memorial Classic Oct. 6-7, finishing the 17-team tournament in sole possession of sixth place. West recorded the 10th top-10 finish of his LSU career, finishing in a tie for fifth with a 3-under par 213. Riemann was the only other Tiger to finish the tournament in the top 30, as he tied for 28th with a 7-over 223.



West recorded his third-consecutive top-10 finish in LSU's next tournament, the prestigious Gary Koch/Cleveland Golf Intercollegiate in Tampa, Fla., Oct. 20-21. He finished in a tie for ninth with the same score as two weeks before, a 3-under par 213. This paced the Tigers to a seventh place finish with a 13-over 877.



Prather finished tied for 23rd, and junior transfer Jake Shaw made his LSU debut by finishing in a tie for 46th with a 10-over 226.

LSU completed its fall schedule by hosting the Country Club of Louisiana Intercollegiate Oct. 27-28. The Tigers led after two rounds and fired a final round 289 to win the tournament by one shot over Arkansas. Two Tigers recorded the best finish of their collegiate career as West tied for second place with a 5-under par 211 and junior Brandon Aydlett tied for fifth with a 3-under 213. Junior Jason Horrell, playing as an individual, had his best finish of the season with a tie for 14th.

With spring approaching, LSU traveled to Gainesville, Fla., to compete in the SunTrust Gator Invitational Jan. 31-Feb. 1. The Tigers recorded their lowest finish to date by finishing ninth in the 15-team field with a 40-over par 880. Prather was the low Tiger as he shot a 6-over par 216 to finish tied for 13th. Lanahan recorded his second top-20 finish of the season by tying for 20th with an 8-over 218. Freshman Ivan Brannan finished in a tie for 55th in his only tournament appearance of the season.

LSU returned to the state of Florida a week later by competing in the Mercedes-Benz Collegiate Championship in Ponte Vedra Feb. 8-10. The Tigers played a solid tournament and finished in seventh place in the 18-team field. Lanahan paced the Tigers by finishing in a tie for 18th with a 6-over par 222, and Riemann was just one shot back in a tie for 23rd.

After taking a month off, the Tigers didn't have to travel far to compete in their eighth tournament of the season, as they entered the Louisiana Classics Intercollegiate in Lafayette, La., March 8-9. LSU shot a 19-over par 883 to finish in sixth place, 18 shots behind tournament champion SMU. Riemann, West and Prather all finished in a tie for 24th by shooting a 7-over par 223. Lanahan and freshman Garrett Runion both finished tied for 33rd.

LSU traveled to Statesboro, Ga., to play in the 15-team Schenkel/E-Z-Go Invitational March 20-21. The Tigers finished the tournament in seventh place. West led

all Tigers by finishing in a tie for 14th with a 1-over par 217, and Lanahan was one shot back in a tie for 17th. Lanahan's first-round 66 was the lowest round shot by any Tiger all season.

Everything came together for LSU in its next tournament as the Tigers welcomed 16 teams to Baton Rouge for the fourth-annual LSU Spring Invitational April 2-4 at the University Club. The Tigers fired a tournament-record 13-under par 851 to finish one stroke ahead of Furman University and win its fourth-straight Spring Invitational title. West recorded his sixth top-20 finish of the season by shooting a 4-under par 212 to finish in 12th. Lanahan and Prather shot a 2-under par 214 and finished in a tie for 16th. The win gave Jones his ninth tournament victory in his five seasons in Baton Rouge. West was subsequently named SEC Golfer of the Week for his performance.

After a two-week layoff, LSU traveled to the SEC Championships in Sea Island, Ga., where it finished in eighth place. West led the Tigers once again with a tie for 15th after shooting a 5-over 215, and Prather finished one shot back in a tie for 20th. This finish earned LSU a spot in NCAA Regional play for the third time in the Jones era.

The Tigers concluded the season in the NCAA East Regional at the Yale Club in New Haven, Conn., May 20-22. LSU finished the tournament in a tie for 12th place with a 43-over par 883, just one shot from qualifying for a spot in the NCAA Championships. Prather recorded the lowest score for LSU in his final collegiate tournament with a tie for 41st.

The Tigers were able to accomplish many things in the 2003-04 season. Not only did they win three tournament titles, but an LSU golfer was also named to the All-SEC team for the 23rd-straight year as West earned Second-Team All-SEC honors for the second time in his career. With his four top-20 and one top-10 finish, Lanahan was named Louisiana Newcomer of the Year by the LSWA. LSU also excelled off the course as six Tigers were named to the 2004 SEC Academic Honor Roll.
