The LSU 2005-06 Men's Golf Team

The Chuck Winstead era begins at LSU with a relatively young group of Tigers that will compete in the 2005-06 season. The squad returns seven letterwinners from last season and consists of just two seniors, along with two juniors, four sophomores and three freshmen. Winstead is counting on the leadership of seniors Andrew Lanahan and Aaron Smith, as well as junior All-SEC standout Chris Wells, to guide the Tigers back to the top of the Southeastern Conference this season.

"Those guys have all had a lot of success on the golf course, and they will be counted on to show the younger guys what it takes to succeed," Winstead said. "Leadership is certainly important for the success of any team, especially for a team as young as ours. They are going to have to show the way on what it takes to compete at this level."

Wells returns as the top performer from last season. He participated in all 12 tournaments for LSU with a team-leading 72.83 stroke average and six top-10 finishes en route to earning Second-Team All-SEC honors in his first season with the Tigers. He was also named First-Team All-Louisiana by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association and one of 15 members of the PING All-Southeast Region Team.

"Chris is definitely the best returning player that we have as far as success last season," Winstead said. "He's just a steady player. He's not going to wow you with what he does on the golf course, but he just gets the job done."

Lanahan is eager to return to action after sitting out all of 2004-05 with a torn rotator cuff. The Jacksonville, Fla., native and junior college transfer was a pleasant surprise for the Tigers two seasons ago as he played in 11 tournaments, finish-

ing the season with a 73.5 stroke average and four top-20 finishes. For his efforts, Lanahan was named Louisiana Newcomer of the Year by the LSWA.

Smith participated in just three tournaments a year ago, but looks to make a greater impact this season after claiming the 2005 Louisiana Amateur Championship in June. Junior Garrett Runion is another player who Winstead believes must contribute for his team to be successful. Runion brings a lot of experience to the squad with 15 career tournament appearances, including NCAA Regional appearances in 2004 and 2005.

Winstead will be counting on several freshmen and sophomores to provide the Tigers with quality depth for the upcoming season. Beck Troutman is one sophomore who displayed his potential after coming to LSU from Fernwood, Miss., as one of the top 30 junior players in the country. Troutman finished his freshman season with a 74.13 stroke average in 10 tournaments and claimed medalist honors in the 2005 LSU Spring Invitational. Troutman carried that momentum into the summer months as he won the Mississippi Match Play Championship in July.

"Beck's potential as a player is tremendous," Winstead said. "He came to LSU as a highly recruited and nationally ranked junior, and he displayed that talent last year. My hope is that he carries that success into this season and is one of the guys we are able to count on to lead this team on the course."

Brian Noonan and Brent Struthers are a pair of sophomores who will play vital roles in LSU's success in 2005-06. Noonan redshirted last season after transferring to LSU from St. Edward's University of Division II, where he earned

Heartland Conference Freshman of the Year and Honorable Mention All-America honors as a freshman. Struthers earned valuable experience last season as a freshman by playing in six tournaments, including appearances in the SEC Championships in Sea Island, Ga., and the NCAA West Regional in Palo Alto, Calif.

"Three of the top four spots in our first qualifying rounds were by sophomores," Winstead said. "Two of those sophomores have already played in an SEC Championship and NCAA Regional. That is huge as far as experience goes, but they are still young. These guys are going to play a lot of golf this year, and they need to keep improving and be motivated to take their game to the next level."

The Tigers welcome a trio of newcomers to the squad this season, led by sophomore Chris Walling of Lake Charles, La. Walling is looking to play his way into the lineup after finishing in third place in the 2005 Louisiana Amateur Championship, just two strokes behind Smith. Walling's family has LSU ties as his grandfather is none other than former LSU baseball great and Major League all-star Alvin Dark.

Freshman Jarrod Barsamian joins the Tigers this season after prepping at Episcopal High School in Ponte Vedra Beach, Fla., where he guided his team to district and regional championships in 2002 and 2003 and earned First-Team All-First Coast honors the last two years. Brian Leveille comes to LSU



from Ridge High School in Basking Ridge, N.J. Among his many achievements is winning the New Jersey Junior Amateur Championship in 2004.

"I'm getting to know these guys better and better every day and what kind of game they have," Winstead said. "Jarrod Barsamian played very well in the first qualifier, while Brian Leveille has a great golf swing and is someone who may contribute in the future. Chris is a newcomer to college golf and there will be a learning curve with him. He's very talented. My hope for him is that he can be patient with himself and allow himself to grow as a player so his talent will shine."



The Tigers open the season, Sept. 12-13, with the Coca-Cola Tournament of Champions at Holston Hills Country Club in Knoxville, Tenn. LSU then travels to Birmingham, Ala., to compete in the inaugural Shoal Creek Intercollegiate, Sept. 26-27.

The final three tournaments of the fall are ones in which LSU participated last season. The Tigers will play in the Gary Koch/Cleveland Golf Invitational at Old Memorial Golf Club for the sixth year in a row after finishing in 12th a season ago. The team will then travel to the Bank of Tennessee Intercollegiate at the Ridges Golf and Country Club in Jonesborough, Tenn., before hosting the second-annual University Club Intercollegiate in Baton Rouge, Oct. 31-Nov. 1.

The spring season begins with a trip to the prestigious Mercedes-Benz Collegiate Championship at famous Sawgrass Country Club, Feb. 5-7, in which the Tigers finished in eighth place last season. LSU returns to the state of Florida for its next tournament, the Gator Invitational at the University of Florida Golf Course in Gainesville.

LSU's next destination is Statesboro, Ga., where the Tigers will compete in the Schenkel/E-Z-Go Invitational at Forest Heights Country Club, March 18-19. The team will then travel to the state of South Carolina to compete in the Hootie at Bull's Bay Intercollegiate, March 27-28, in Awendaw, S.C. LSU earned a fifth-place finish at the Hootie in 2005. The Tigers travel again to Georgia to finish the regular season at the Augusta State Invitational at Forest Hills Golf Club, April 1-2.

The 2006 SEC Championships will be held from April 21-23 in Sea Island, Ga., where it has been for the last five years. LSU looks to improve on a tie for sixth last season and attempt to make an NCAA Regional appearance for the fifth time in seven years.

"My expectation is for this team to get better every single day," Winstead said. "The players need to spend their time being sure they improve as players and as people. My expectations for this team don't go past tomorrow. If we are able to focus on what each day brings, we will be successful not only on the course, but off as well." "has grown up a little bit and been able to focus more. That's just maturity."

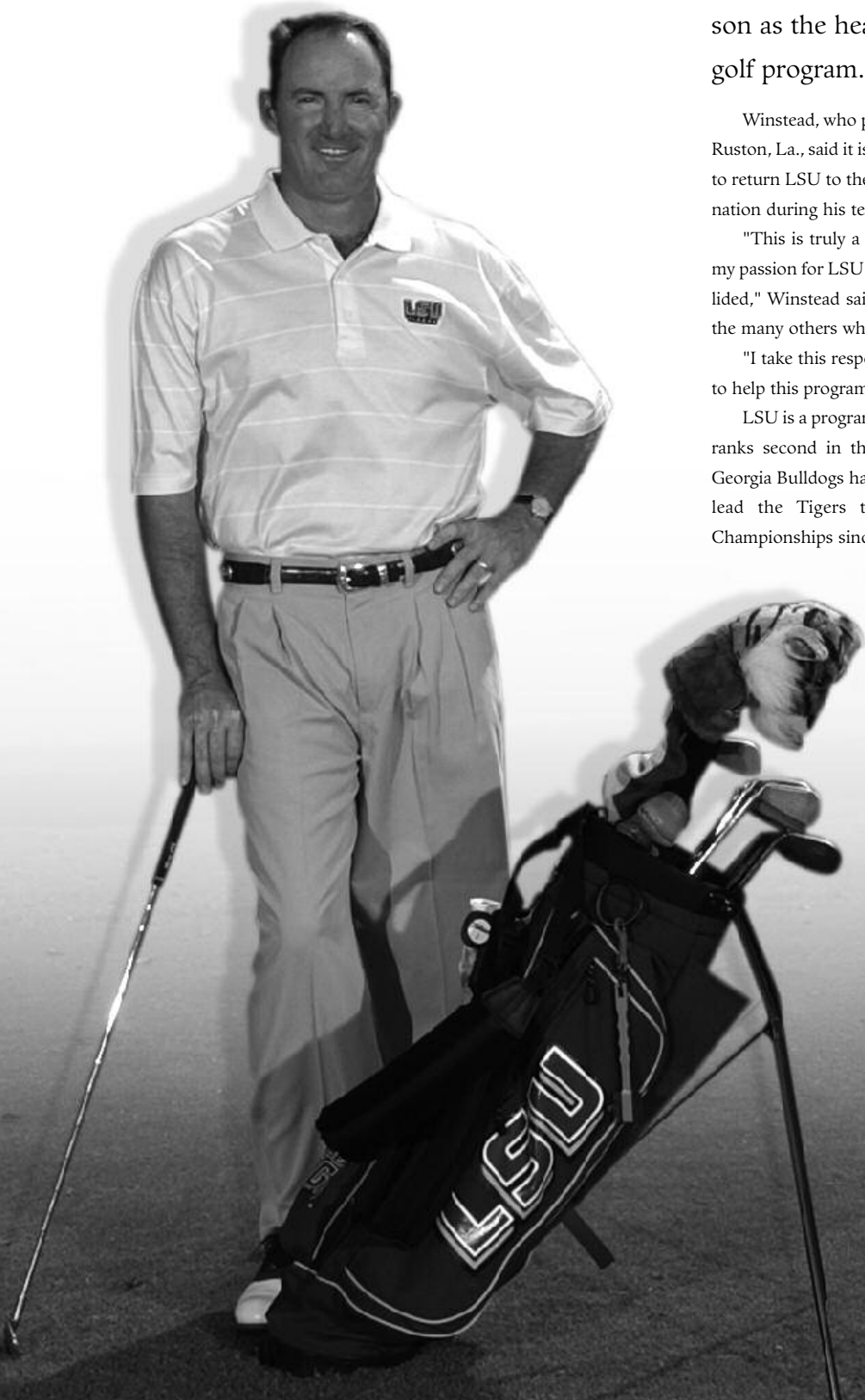

After serving the last five years as the Director of Instruction and owner of the Chuck Winstead Golf Academy at the University Club in Baton Rouge, Chuck Winstead enters his first season as the head coach of the LSU men's golf program.

Winstead, who played at LSU from 1989-91 and is a native of Ruston, La., said it is a privilege to coach his alma mater and plans to return LSU to the top of the Southeastern Conference and the nation during his tenure.

"This is truly a dream come true for me. As I've said before, my passion for LSU and my passion for the game of golf have collided," Winstead said. "LSU is a very special place to me and to the many others who have had the good fortune to play here.

"I take this responsibility very seriously, and I will do my best to help this program return to the success it has had in the past."

LSU is a program that owns four national championships and ranks second in the SEC with 15 conference titles. Only the Georgia Bulldogs have won more with 23. Winstead is looking to lead the Tigers to their first appearance in the NCAA Championships since 1997.

Winstead knows that will not be an easy task, but he believes LSU has the potential and the resources to be one of the elite programs in the nation.

"I want to create the best environment for our student-athletes to achieve their individual goals," Winstead said. "The players that come through here will aspire to play on the PGA Tour. We'll create an environment that will allow them to reach that goal."

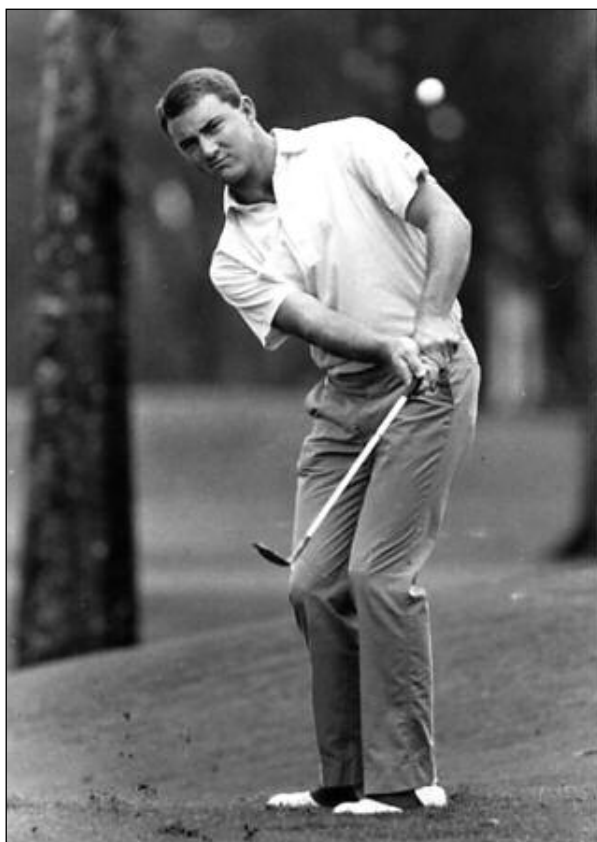
The foundation of any successful program is built on recruiting the best high school athletes the sport has to offer. Winstead believes that through the vast network of contacts he has built in the last 13 years of teaching the game, he will be able to attract some of the top players in the nation to attend LSU.

"We'll recruit players through the network of our past players, our LSU supporters and through my personal network built in the field of teaching golf over the past 13 years or so," Winstead said. "We certainly want to attract the best players we can to take this program where it should be."

Widely considered one of the top teaching professionals in the country, Winstead was named by Golf Magazine as a Top 100 Teacher for 2005-06. Golf Magazine's Top 100 also includes the likes of Butch Harmon, Peter Kostis, Jim Flick and former LSU standout and recent LSU Hall of Fame inductee Eddie Merrins. Winstead was also named Louisiana's Top Teacher by Golf Digest.

In addition, Winstead has been featured on The Golf Channel and appears frequently in such publications as Golf Magazine and Golf Tips Magazine, in which he serves as Senior Instruction Editor.

Winstead's credentials include a five-year stint as part of Jack Nicklaus' Golden Bear Golf Centers in North Palm Beach, Fla., where he served as Director of Instruction for Golden Bear Golf. Winstead also served as part of the senior management team responsible for developing, managing and initiating the start-up of Jack Nicklaus Golf Academies throughout the world.

The Tigers capture their first team title of the season at the fifth-annual LSU Spring Invitational.

The 2004-05 season was one of much promise for the LSU men's golf team. Five seniors and eight letter-winners returned to lead a roster that included one junior, four sophomores and five talented freshmen through the rigors of the always difficult Southeastern Conference.

However, LSU was without the services of three of its players before the season even started. Freshmen Chad Bailey and Jared Mayfield each suffered broken wrists during the offseason, while senior Andrew Lanahan was forced to sit out the entire season after undergoing surgery to repair a torn rotator cuff suffered in July. Lanahan was named Second-Team All-Louisiana and Louisiana Newcomer of the Year in 2004 and was LSU's No. 2 player prior to his injury.

With the season approaching, the team needed someone to step up and fill that void left by Lanahan's injury and complement the play of two-time All-SEC performer Heath West. Sophomore Chris Wells did just that.

Wells transferred to LSU from Pacific during the summer months and led the team with a 72.83 stroke average in 33 rounds, including 14 rounds of par or better, and six top-10 finishes. West chipped in with a 72.9 stroke average and three top-10 finishes in 10 tournament appearances, while freshman Beck Troutman emerged as a solid No. 3 player and one of the SEC's best freshmen with a 74.13 stroke average in 10 tournaments.

The Tigers opened the season Sept. 11 at the Bank of Tennessee Intercollegiate at The Ridges Golf and Country Club in Johnson City, Tenn. Wells recorded the first of his six top-10 finishes by tying for 10th in his debut and leading LSU to a sixth-place finish in the 15-team field. The Tigers shot a 9-over par 873 for the tournament, finishing 19 strokes behind team champion Tennessee.

LSU returned to the state of Tennessee two weeks later

to compete in the Mason Rudolph Intercollegiate hosted by Vanderbilt at the Vanderbilt Legends Club. Although the team finished in 13th place, the event was not without excitement. Sophomore Garrett Runion was the low Tiger as he tied for 25th with a 1-over 214, including a team season-low 6-under 65 in the second round. This marked the lowest round fired by a Tiger since Jeremy Wilkinson shot a 7-under 65 in the Tennessee Tournament of Champions in 1997.



The team began the month of October by travelling to Lake Forest, Ill., to participate in the Windon Memorial Classic, Oct. 4-5, at Conway Farms Golf Club. Competing against its largest field of the regular season, the Tigers finished the tournament in seventh place out of 18 teams with a 32-over 884. Leading the way for LSU was Wells, who tied for seventh for his second top-10 finish. The Tigers earned

a key victory in the event by defeating defending national champion California, who finished in 13th.

From Illinois, the Tigers travelled to Tampa, Fla., the following week to compete in the prestigious Gary Koch/Cleveland Golf Invitational, which featured seven SEC teams and five teams ranked in the final *Golfweek* Top 25. LSU finished the tournament in 12th place in the 15-team field with a 40-over 904, 32 shots behind team champion Kentucky.

The Tigers were glad to return home for their final tournament of the fall season in the University Club Intercollegiate, Oct. 25-26. LSU moved its annual fall intercollegiate from the Country Club of Louisiana, where it had been for 11 years, to the University Club in what proved to be a record setting event. SMU captured the team title with an incredible 39-under par 825, and Jeremy Alcorn of Baylor claimed medalist honors with a 13-under 203. Both scores are 54-hole records for LSU's fall intercollegiate. The Tigers finished in sixth place with a 16-under 848, its lowest tournament score since 1985. Wells also finished in sixth with a 10-under 206, including a season-best 6-under 66 in the second round.

The spring season began much like the fall with LSU losing a key member of the team due to injury. Senior Brandon Aydtlett suffered a broken collar bone during the Christmas holidays and was out of action for approximately two months. Aydtlett competed in three tournaments for the Tigers in the fall season with his best finish coming in the Bank of Tennessee Intercollegiate in which he tied for 42nd.

LSU returned to the state of Florida for its first spring event in the prestigious SunTrust Gator Invitational in Gainesville, Fla., Feb. 5-6. The Tigers finished eighth in the 15-team field that included seven teams ranked in the top 25, earning victories over Georgia Southern, Tennessee and eventual SEC champion Kentucky. West tied the best finish of his career by tying for second place with a 1-over 211, while Wells was the only other Tiger in the top 20 in a tie for 14th.

The Tigers next travelled to famous Sawgrass Country Club in Ponte Vedra Beach, Fla., to compete in the 17-team Mercedes-Benz Collegiate Championship hosted by North Florida. Nine teams ranked in the top 25 greeted the Tigers, including Florida, Alabama, UCLA, Augusta State, Tennessee, South Carolina, Kentucky, Duke and Georgia State, with LSU finishing in seventh place. Wells once again led the team by tying for sixth with a 3-over 219, and the Tigers earned important victories over Kentucky, Duke and Georgia State.

After taking a month off, LSU returned to action in the Schenkel/E-Z-Go Invitational in Statesboro, Ga., but the Tigers could only manage an 11th-place finish in the field of 15 teams. Troutman earned the first top-20 finish of his career by tying for 19th, while Wells finished in a tie for 32nd.

LSU rebounded with its best performance to date in the inaugural Hootie at Bull's Bay Intercollegiate in Awendaw, S.C. With winds gusting to 35 mph and a 15-team field that included eight teams ranked in the top 25, the Tigers put together three solid rounds to finish in fifth place with a 24-over 876. LSU earned victories over such teams as No. 3 Georgia Tech, No. 14 Wake Forest, No. 19 South Carolina and No. 24 Alabama as West and Wells each finished in the top 10 in ninth place and a tie for 10th, respectively. Troutman earned his second top-20 finish in as many tournaments by tying for 15th, while Aydtlett tied for 45th in his first tournament since returning from his injury.

The Tigers returned home to host their second tournament and captured their first team title of the season in the

fifth-annual LSU Spring Invitational at the University Club. LSU defeated Lamar by six shots with a 1-over par 865, including a 5-under 283 in the final round. Troutman continued to demonstrate his potential by claiming medalist honors with a 5-under 211, becoming the first Tiger to win a tournament since All-American John Humphries won the same tournament in 2003. Wells finished in fifth place for his sixth top-10 finish of the season.

The SEC Championships returned to Sea Island, Ga., for the fifth consecutive year, April 15-17, and the Tigers rode the wave of momentum to a tie for sixth place with South Carolina with a 54-hole score of 59-over 899. This marked LSU's best finish in the tournament since tying for fourth in 2002. Aydtlett was the low Tiger as he tied for 25th. After recording a 14-over 84 in the first round, Aydtlett combined for only 2-over par over the final two rounds to finish the tournament with a 16-over 226. The Kentucky Wildcats captured their first SEC title in school history by finishing two strokes ahead of Auburn with a 35-over 875.

LSU concluded the season in the NCAA West Regional at Stanford Golf Course in Palo Alto, Calif., May 19-21. The Tigers finished in 24th place in the field of 27, and Wells led the squad with a tie for 61st.

The Tigers were able to accomplish many things in the 2004-05 season. Not only did they capture one tournament title, but also made an appearance in NCAA Regional play for the fourth time in five seasons. An LSU golfer was also named to the All-SEC team for the 24th year in a row as Wells earned Second-Team All-SEC honors for the first time in his career. Wells was also named First-Team All-Louisiana by the Louisiana Sportswriters Association and one of 15 members of the PING All-Southeast Region Team. LSU excelled off the course as well as five Tigers were named to the 2005 SEC Academic Honor Roll and Garrett Runion was named a member of the 2005 SEC Good Works Team.

SEC GOLFERS ARE LEADERS ON THE LINKS

Throughout the history of men's golf in the Southeastern Conference the league has provided a strong tradition of excellence on the links, and 2005 was no different.

The Georgia Bulldogs captured their second national championship in dominating fashion, finishing an astounding 11 strokes ahead of arch-rival Georgia Tech for the title. Four of the five Bulldogs competing in the tournament finished in the top 20 led by All-American Brendon Todd, who finished in a tie for seventh.

The conference has captured 10 NCAA team titles in its history with four belonging to both LSU and Florida, while Georgia also won the title in 1999. Thirty-four SEC teams have finished in the top 10 in the NCAA championships since 1985, including 23 since 1990.

Individually, the SEC has witnessed six national champions, with Florida's Nick Gilliam winning the latest title in 2001. In addition, 33 individuals finished among the top 10 in the NCAA's since 1985.

Seven SEC men's golf teams were ranked in the final Sagarin/Golfweek.com's Top 25 and 21 individuals were also ranked in the top 100, making the SEC the most competitive conference in college golf.
