TIGERS EARN SECOND TRIP TO SUPER REGIONALS

After sweeping through the NCAA Palo Alto Regional, the Tigers earned their second-straight trip to the NCAA Super Regionals. LSU, the top seed in its region and 10th overall national seed, faced seventh-seeded Arizona State in Tempe, Ariz. In the first game, the pair played to a scoreless tie through nine innings. In the bottom of the 10th, the Sun Devils put together two of their only five hits in the game to score the lone run of the contest for the walk-off win. While facing elimination and despite a valiant comeback attempt, the Tigers saw their season come to an end with a 7-4 loss to Arizona State in the second game. LSU was put in a hole early after a grand slam by the Sun Devils. The Tigers used three home runs to edge back into the game, but could not overcome outstanding pitching by Katie Burkhart.

LSU IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

For the ninth time in 11 years, the Tigers earned a bid to the NCAA Tournament. LSU has advanced through the NCAA Regionals to the Women's College World Series on two occasions (2001 & 2004). The Tigers swept through the 2007 NCAA Regionals in Palo Alto, Calif., to earn a bid in the NCAA Super Regionals at Tempe, Ariz., against Arizona State. LSU is 31-18 all-time in the NCAA Tournament, the fifth best all-time winning percentage in tournament play in NCAA Division I history.

LSU WINS FIFTH SEC TOURNAMENT TITLE

For the fifth time in the last nine seasons, the Tigers advanced through the SEC Tournament to claim the tournament championship. LSU knocked off Florida, I-O, in nine innings to earn the title. Back-to-back doubles by Rachel Mitchell and Leslie Klein scored the only run of the game to give the Tigers the victory. In the single-elimination format, the Tigers used wins over South Carolina, 2-1 in 10 innings, and No. 2 Alabama, 4-1, to advance to the title game.

Having qualified for all 11 SEC Tournaments, LSU is 33-11 all-time, with the best winning percentage of any school in the league. No other team has won the tournament title or appeared in the championship game more than three times, while LSU has won five times (1999, 2001, 2002, 2004, 2007) and made eight appearances in the title game (1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2007).

LSU POSTS SECOND-MOST WINS; THIRD-BEST PCT.

In just its 11th year since reinstatement in 1997, the LSU softball program has proven to be among the elite in the nation. The Tigers have averaged 52.5 wins per year in its previous 11 years, which is also the best in the SEC in that span (Alabama - 49.0). In the nation, LSU is second to only Arizona, which has averaged 55.53 wins a season over the past 11 years. The Tigers also are third with a .789 winning percentage behind only Arizona at .867 and UCLA at .804.

LSU DOMINATES SEC SERIES

Dating back to 1997, LSU has competed in 108 series against conference foes and has only lost 15. The Tigers have swept 30 three-game series since the SEC adopted the three-game format in 2001 and taken 21 more series wins in that time period. In 2007, LSU is 2-0 in mid-week doubleheader series since the SEC changed to a 28-game schedule. Prior to 2001, the league played four game series against divisional opponents and doubleheaders against cross divisional rivals. LSU swept nine four-game series and 15 doubleheaders while taking six series, 3-1. LSU now has an SEC series record of 83-15-10 (.815).

LSU VS. RANKED TEAMS

LSU played 17 games against seven nationally ranked teams, including seven games against two teams ranked No. 1 and No. 2. The Tigers finished 11-6 against ranked teams, including a pair of wins over No. 1 Tennessee and a trio of wins over No. 2 Alabama.

LSU AMONG THE ELITE IN THE POLLS

LSU finished the season at NO. 10 in the NFCA/USA Today coaches poll, the fifth final top 10 ranking in the program's history. The Tigers have now been ranked for 31 straight weeks after having been ranked for 103 straight weeks from Feb. 28, 1998 until March 30, 2005. In all, LSU has been ranked in 134 of the 155 polls (.865) that have been released since the program was reinstated in 1997. The Tigers have been ranked in the top 10 for 88 total weeks, including all 15 weeks of the 2007 season.

Since ESPN/USA Softball began its softball poll on Feb. 25, 2003, LSU has been ranked in 70 of the 79 polls (.886). The final ranking of No. 10 last season was the third top 10 finish for the Tigers. LSU has also been ranked in the top 10 for 39 total weeks.

...THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

The Tigers opened the 2007 home schedule with a 20-0 mark before falling to No. 2 Alabama on March 24, the second best home start in school history and five shy of the school record of 25-straight that began the 1997 season. Factoring in the 10 wins that completed the 2006 home schedule, LSU won a school record 30 consecutive home games dating back to April 12, 2006.

HENDERSON BREAKS STOLEN BASE RECORD

Against Texas-San Antonio on March 13, Dee Dee Henderson broke the LSU single-game record for stolen bases with four. The designated player stole second in the bottom of the first after reaching on a single. Her second stolen base came with a swipe of second in the third inning after also reaching on a single. After reaching on an infield single in the fifth, she stole second and third, giving her the school record. Henderson broke the previous record of three, which was accomplished 10 times, including once by Henderson.

WALK IT OUT!

Against Missouri State on Feb. 16, Rachel Mitchell broke the LSU single-game record for walks with four. She recorded her first walk on six pitches, taking a full count walk in the first inning. Her second walk came courtesy of a four-pitch at-bat in the second. Her third at-bat was the longest with nine pitches. The record walk came in the fifth as Mitchell again took a full count for a walk, using six pitches to reach for the fourth time. The four walks broke the previous record of three, done 19 times, including once by Mitchell.

ROESSNER POSTS NCAA-RANKED FEAT

Recording hits in 10 consecutive at-bats, Killian Roessner tied for the third most consecutive hits in NCAA history. Over the course of five games, beginning with LSU's final game of the Easton Purple & Gold Challenge against Louisiana Tech on Feb. 25, Roessner recorded hits in 10 consecutive at-bats before having the streak stopped in her first at-bat against No. 14 Washington on March 3. During her streak, she recorded five singles, four doubles, a home run, a walk, a sacrifice bunt and was hit by a pitch. The record of 12 consecutive hits was set this year by Brooke Marnitz of Kentucky. Lindsey Cameron of Florida recorded 11 consecutive hits in 2005, while Dominique Lastrapes of Washington had 10 consecutive hits in 2004.

ROESSNER BREAKS SINGLE-SEASON RECORD

Throwing out Tennessee's Liane Horiuchi in the second game of the doubleheader on April 28, Killian Roessner broke the LSU single-season caught stealing record for a catcher with her 17th. Roessner broke her own record of 16, done in 2006, and by Jennie Reeves in 2002. Roessner led the SEC with 19 runners caught stealing and tied for first in the SEC and for the LSU single-season record with four runners picked off. Roessner allowed just 28 stolen bases, including six with runners on the corners and second base conceded, for a .596 mark. For her career, she has caught a school record 42 runners with the best stolen base pct. against in school history at .596.

STREAKING...

Against Florida on March 18, Dee Dee Henderson tied the LSU record for the longest hitting streak in school history at 15 games. Henderson's streak began against Louisiana Tech on Feb. 23 and continued for 19 total games until an 0-for-5 performance against Centenary on March 21. On April 21, Tayli Hollis matched the feat with a 15-game hitting streak of her own. Hollis' streak began at McNeese State on March 28 before ending on April 22 with an 0-for-3 performance at Arkansas. Leslie Klein and Stephanie Hill also both posted 15-game hitting streaks during the 2004 season.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

The 2007 Tigers became the third LSU team and seventh SEC team to hit 100 doubles in a season. The Tigers led the league with 102 doubles, tied for the second most in LSU history. Averaging 1.52 doubles per game, the Tigers ranked eighth in the NCAA in doubles per game. The 1998 Tigers set the school record with 133 doubles in 72 games, while 2006's team also hit 102 doubles. Twelve players recorded at least one double, including 10 or more by five players, led by the 22 by Leslie Klein and 15 from Killian Roessner.

TIGERS TIE NCAA RECORD FOR HOME RUNS

With five home runs against Stanford in the NCAA Palo Alto Regional Championship game on May 19, LSU tied the NCAA Tournament single-game team record for home runs. The record the Tigers tied was their own, set by the 2003 LSU team against Hawai'i in the Austin Regional. The five home runs also tied the LSU single-game record for home runs, matching the performances against Hawai'i, Auburn and Cal Poly.



KLEIN INKS NAME IN LSU RECORD BOOK

Leslie Klein made her mark in the LSU record books with five offensive career records, the most of any player in Tiger history. She ranks in the top 10 in almost every hitting category, and finished with the school records for slugging percentage, doubles, home runs, RBIs and total bases. In addition, Klein finished third in batting average, tied for second in sacrifice flies, third in runs scored and tied for third in hits.

In addition to her career feats, she added to her legacy in the single-season record book. With a double against Florida on May 12, the game-winning RBI shot in the ninth to win the SEC Tournament, she broke the LSU single season record for doubles. She recorded 22 doubles on the year, pushing her past former Tiger All-American Ashlee Ducote, who had 20 in 1999. In addition, Klein finished tied for second in single season doubles in SEC history, one shy of tying the record.

With a two-RBI home run against Stanford in the NCAA Regional Championship on May 19, Klein broke the LSU single-season record for multiple-RBI games. For the year, she had 17 multiple-RBI games, including seven games with three or more RBIs. She broke the previous record of 16 multiple-RBI games by Ducote in 2000.

With two RBIs against Portland State on March 2, Klein broke the LSU career record for multiple-RBI games. She finished her career with 52 multiple-RBI games, including 22 games with three or more RBIs. She broke the previous record of 42 multiple-RBI games by Tara Asbill from 1997-2000.

TIGERS TIE SCHOOL RECORD FOR STOLEN BASES

With eight stolen bases in their first game against Alcorn State on Feb. 27, LSU recorded the second most stolen bases in a single game in school history. Dee Dee Henderson and Jazz Jackson also tied the then-individual school record with three stolen bases each. In all, four players stole bases against the Lady Braves. The last time LSU recorded eight stolen bases was against Virginia on March 9, 1998. The school record of nine was set against Bucknell on March 21, 1998.

TURNER RECORDS FIRST CAREER NO-HITTER

In her final season, Emily Turner recorded her first collegiate no-hitter. Turner tossed the no-no against Arkansas on April 21. She allowed just three walks and hit one batter to spoil the perfect game bid, but allowed just one base runner to reach second against her in the contest. Her no-hitter was also the 30th no-hitter in the program's history.

HOFFER RECORDS TWO NO-HITTERS

In her seventh appearance of the season, against Southern Miss on Feb. 24 in the Easton Purple & Gold Challenge, Dani Hofer hurled her third career no-hitter, and her second of the season. She faced only two over the minimum and did not allow a single base runner to get into scoring position. Against Missouri State on Feb. 16 in the Houston Crowne Plaza Invitational, Hofer threw her first no-hitter of the season and her second overall. She faced only two over the minimum and allowed only two base runners in the third inning for the entire game. In 2006, Hofer threw her first no-hitter in her first collegiate outing against Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

GARCIA RECORDS THIRD CAREER NO-HITTER

In her first appearance of the season, against Centenary on Feb. 10 in the Easton Tiger Classic, Tiffany Garcia hurled her third career no-hitter. She faced only three over the minimum and did not allow a single base runner after the second inning. In 2006, Garcia threw back-to-back no-hitters, including just the third perfect game in LSU history. Her third no-hitter was also the 27th no-hitter in the program's history.
