

There is no doubt that what happened in the final round of the NCAA Division I Women's Golf Championship had plenty of symbolism for the LSU Women's Golf Team's future.

Call it a starting point to the future as LSU made its way further back into the national spotlight.

LSU shook off wind, rain and cold that seemed to be at its worst when they were on the course in Albuquerque, N. M., to play one of their best rounds of the season to move up five spots to 15th at the close of the event in their second appearance in three years in the championships.

But that final round helped move LSU to 17th in the Golfstat rankings, and while LSU lost two seniors off its starting lineup, it puts together a squad ready to take that ranking and move it further up the national spotlight in 2009.

Coach Karen Bahnsen's 25th year as head coach at LSU features a squad of players with experience in some of the game's biggest events and two newcomers who have all the experience necessary to handle the pressure of Division I women's college golf from the moment they arrive on campus.

Returnees

The 2008-09 team will have one senior on its roster – Caroline Martens – who has been in the lineup for two NCAA Division I Women's Championships.

Martens has not been able to equal her

freshman average of 76.1, but she lowered her average back down a stroke to 77.0 this past season. She had some important rounds for the Lady Tigers at needed times, including a tie for I7th finish at the SEC Championships, shooting rounds of 77-76-75. She has three career top I0 finishes, including one of the most important, a fifth place finish in the 2006 NCAA East

Sophomore Megan McChrystal earned second team All-SEC honors for the Lady Tigers last season and was the Louisiana Sports Writers Association's Player of the Year. Her team best-stroke average of 74.6 was the fourth best for a single season in LSU history. As a freshman, the Stuart, Fla., native earned three top IO finishes – a tie for IOth at the Mercedes-Benz (72-73-71 –216); fourth place at the Lady Puerto Rico Classic (75-69-71 – 215); and a seventh place finish at the LSU/Cleveland Golf Classic (76-74-71 – 221).

McChrystal finished her collegiate season ranked in the top 60 in the country, 55th, LSU's best end-of-season ranking in the Sagarin Performance Rankings in several seasons by an LSU golfer.

McChrystal justified that ranking in the summer, qualifying for the United States Women's Amateur. She posted rounds of 73-74 in qualifying to easily make the match play group of 64 and won two matches to advance to the final 16 of the competition.

Norwegian sophomore **Amalie Valle** moved into the lineup in a big way, playing 34 rounds as a freshman, tying McChrystal

for most rounds by an LSU player in 2007-08. She finished third in stroke average at 75.6. Valle did not have a top IO finish but recorded top I5 finishes at the UA-Ann Rhodes Intercollegiate (74-72-78 – 224, t13) and at the Crimson Tide Classic (79-74-76 – 229, t15) ... She also had strong rounds in the SEC Championship (a 74 in the final round) and at the NCAA Central Regionals (73 in the first and third rounds).

This sophomore class includes a player who has also advanced her standing with her summer performances, **Lindy LaBauve** of Scottsdale, Ariz. LaBauve has followed her father's footsteps to the golf program at LSU and played 18 rounds, averaging 76.6. LaBauve had a top 10 at the Crimson Tide Classic, tying for ninth (78-74-73 – 225). But it was during the summer that LaBauve really excelled, advancing to the finals of two important amateur events, the Women's Southern Amateur and the Women's Trans National Golf Association championship.

Sophomores Nicole Crochet and Abby **Oberthier** also got needed experience during their first years of playing for the LSU team. Crochet, who is in her third season at LSU after redshirting her first year on campus, played in three events and twice had even par rounds of 72 in the season opening Cougar Classic and the LSU/Cleveland Golf Classic. She also had a good second place finish this summer in a Collegiate Players Tour event in San Antonio. Oberthier appeared in two tournaments and in the summer finished sixth at the CPT event at nearby Pelican Point and qualified for match play at the Women's Trans National Amateur championship. Mary-Michael Burns, a local University High product, redshirted last season and posted this summer a couple of top IO finishes on the CPT.


Newcomers

LSU's two newcomers come in with credentials that certainly will give them a good chance to tee it up early in their collegiate careers.

Tessa Teachman, a native of Rochester, N.Y., who prepped at University High in Baton Rouge, has also made her mark nationally, playing in the LPGA Corning Classic in her home state and she displayed her talents at an early age, capturing the 2003 New York State Amateur at age 13. She was selected to the 2004 Junior Ryder Cup team. She won the Louisiana High School Athletic Association Class AAA golf championship in 2007 and at the time of her signing was the 15th ranked junior golfer in the

The LSU team will also add a member of the Swedish Junior National Team in Jacqueline Hedwall. Hedwall has experience on all levels, including having played against many of the collegiate teams she will face this season when the Swedish team annually appeared at Tennessee's Mercedes-Benz Championships. She has represented Sweden in the European Ladies Team Championship and finished third this summer in the 2008 Ladies British Amateur. She also finished second in the Scottish Ladies Open this year and has twice played in the Scandinavian Open hosted by Annika Sorenstam.

The Schedule

Coach Bahnsen has always worked to have her team peak at the right time prior to post-season play and again this year, the schedule is set to allow her relatively young, but experienced team to do that.

In the fall, the Lady Tigers will open with the Cougar Classic hosted by the College of Charleston, a tournament LSU has used in recent years to get off to a good start. This will be followed by two of the major events of the fall, the Mercedes-Benz at Knoxville and a return to the Auburn "Derby" Classic. Those two events will give the coaching staff a good opportunity to see how the players react to some of the nation's toughest competition.

Then in the spring, LSU will play a schedule that builds to the post-season, highlighted by the newly renamed home event, the LSU Invitational, scheduled for mid-March at the University Club. This event, that will be played for the IOth time at the team's official home course, draws fields that rank with many of the major tournaments in the country and this year is no exception with a full field of 18 taking part in the three-day event.

The Numbers

The numbers all fall in line for the 2008-09 season: the 30th year of the women's program, the 25th year for Karen Bahnsen at LSU, the l0th time the LSU spring tournament has been played at the University Club. So why not the most important number for this LSU team: IO, as in qualifying for the NCAA Division I Women's Championships for the I0th time in school history. It's not a long shot dream for this program. It's a goal that can be a reality for this group of Lady Tigers.

Drive. Determination.

A willingness to do whatever is necessary to succeed.

Those were some of the words used to describe Karen (Mayson) Bahnsen when she was a player at LSU in the early 1980s.

Someone putting together a small three-fold media information sheet wrote those comments about the player when she became the first signee for the new LSU women's golf program prior to the inaugural 1979-80 season.

Now those same points made all those years ago are very much still in play in the way Coach Karen Bahnsen coaches her Lady Tigers. Suffice it to say, the drive, the determination and the willingness to do whatever is necessary to succeed are all still there as she enters her 25th season as the head coach of the Tigers.

One can also say that those who have succeeded in this program are those that understand that same drive, that determination and a willingness to do whatever is necessary that Bahnsen preaches.

Bahnsen knows what it takes to get to the pinnacle of women's collegiate golf – the NCAA Division I Women's Championship Tournament. She will ask her team to work hard and respond to the challenge, but it will be nothing less than she ever asked of herself as a player.

If the players accept and understand, success usually follows.

Bahnsen has come up with a simple philosophy that she followed as a player. It's so simple, but so amazingly effective when put into play. She wants her team to play each shot as a separate event. It something bad happens, forget it and move on. Don't let it carry on for four or five holes. Most of all, she wants her players to have fun.

When her players believe in it as much as Bahnsen does, they usually a) play strong team rounds or b) grind out a potentially disastrous round and turn it into a score the team can use. Both are important ingredients in a successful golf season.

Bahnsen's love and desire for a program she has devoted over half her life to is what also gives her the smiling satisfaction about a program she has virtually helped design from scratch.

Plus, 25 years of coaching has done nothing to slow her down. In fact, she is more energized than ever to make the program a continuing















player in the national spotlight.

Just think about it for a minute. How many programs are there in any sport in Division I intercollegiate athletics where the program's first recruit goes on to become the head coach of the program and stays long enough to not only be the dean of league coaches in the sport, but also one of the longest tenured coaches in school history?

Seems impossible, but when it comes to LSU women's golf there is one special lady who can recite the history of the program from day one. Suffice it to say, in college golf circles, she is one of the most respected individuals in the game today.

Dean of SEC women's golf coaches. One of the longest tenured coaches in LSU history. How about one of the longest tenured golf coaches in the game today.

From first recruit, to four-year player, to student assistant to head coach, it was a rapid but very successful transition from signing in 1979 to taking over as head coach prior to the 1984-85 season.

She has also done a fabulous job of changing as women's college golf changed. Since her arrival at LSU in 1979, the sport of women's golf has risen in talent and stature to the point that SEC championships and national championships are decided by mere strokes instead of one or two teams dominating a field. The list of stars from the SEC who have gone on to success in the sport continues to grow each year. Bahnsen and assistant Golda Johansson Borst, a former SEC star golfer, have combined to tenaciously recruit to find the best around for the LSU program and the results are showing with great success.

Bahnsen has contributed her share of names to that list over her years as head coach. There was the nation's No. I player, Jenny Lidback, in the mid-I980s, who led LSU to the NCAA Championship Tournament and then went on to become a major tournament winner on the LPGA

Tour. Also, from the 1980s, came Jackie Gallagher, a steady player who continues a long, successful career on the women's tour.

The "Three Amigas" signaled a new era in LSU women's golf in the mid-1990s when the highly recruited trio of Ashley Winn, Michelle Louviere and Laura Moore led LSU to succession of NCAA appearances (including a program best fifth place finish in 1998), a No. I ranking and nine tournament titles.

Katy Wilkinson Harris ended the 1990s with bookend All-American performances in her freshman and senior year. The 2000s opened with Shreveport's Meredith Duncan bringing LSU more national recognition by winning the U.S. Women's Amateur title and helping her country keep the Curtis Cup in matches with Great Britain and Ireland.

In 2005, senior Brooke Shelton became the fourth LSU golfer to finish in the top IO at the NCAA Championships, finishing a strong eighth

in the individual competition.

Seniors Rebecca Kuhn and Alexis Rather, along with junior Caroline Martens helped LSU to two NCAA Championships in both 2006 and 2008 with freshman Megan McChrystal leading the team in stroke average for the season on the drive to the 2008 tournament appearance in which LSU strongly rallied on the final day to finish 15th.

The Lady Tigers are again roaring on the national scene as a team. A team that was struggling to hang in the top 50 is back in the top 20 after its latest appearance in the NCAA Championships this past May and with one of the top recruiting classes in the country coming to Baton Rouge for the 2008-09 season, this is a program that is doing nothing but looking forward.

So Bahnsen takes the LSU program into its 30th season with the same dogged determination she has shown throughout her days as a player and through her years as head coach. The numbers show her success: I5 All-Americans, 33 All-SEC, 28 tournament titles, 28 individual titles, I0 top three finishes in the SEC championships, I4 appearances in the NCAA regionals, eight appearances in the NCAA Division I Championships and five top-I0 finishes in those eight events.

She has coached two winners of the prestigious LPGA Diana Shore Award (Lisette Lee in 2000 and Meredith Duncan in 2002) and the 1986 College Player of the Year (Jenny Lidback). But let's talk off

the course as well. There have been 68 Academic All-SEC honorees, 2I National Golf Coaches Association Academic Scholars, and for many years, the women's golf team has had one of the highest GPAs for an athletic team at the school.

Throughout her years as coach and player, Bahnsen has looked at the big picture of her involvement in women's collegiate golf and life as well.

She knows nothing on the LPGA or Futures tour is guaranteed for any golfer. She knows what it is like to have a husband, a family and the need to divide time between the coaching job and the family job. Her values on balancing both are what makes her a special person and a coach players want to play for.

Every year has brought new challenges and each time Bahnsen has answered that call. Every year the desire to succeed is that much greater and that is what seems to continue to light the fire of the lady who knows LSU golf inside and outside, backwards and forwards.

Bahnsen's teams learn a lot about golf during their LSU days, but they also learn a lot about the ups and downs of sports. She doesn't just go through the motions of being a coach. Bahnsen knows what the girls are going through with each shot they take and she feels their excitement and disappointments. She is there to congratulate, offer a tip when necessary and provide the

consoling hands of sympathy when things done go the right way.

It's that style which has earned her the respect of her peers throughout the league and country.

Bahnsen came to LSU with credentials that were excellent, letting in golf at McGill Toolen High School in Mobile, Ala. She led McGill Toolen High School to two state titles and in 1979 won the state individual championship and the National High School Tournament.

It seems obvious this lady was meant to be a top golfer and later a great golf coach. Bahnsen's mother was an LPGA teaching professional, a four-time Alabama state women's champion, and a Mobile Sports Hall of Fame inductee.

These days Bahnsen is doing what needs to be done to keep her program in the forefront of women's college golf. She hosts one of the spring's top collegiate golf tournaments and while the program has a very recognized and successful past, she is working hard to add new memories to the history of the program.

Bahnsen is married to LSU Senior Associate
Athletic Director David "Bo" Bahnsen. They have
two children, son, Darren, I9 (a sophomore at LSU,
a former member of state championship basketball
and golf teams at University High in Baton Rouge
and a manager for the LSU men's basketball team)
and daughter Devin, I7, a member of the volleyball
team at U-High.









Former star Tennessee Lady Vol golfer Golda Johansson Borst joined the LSU women's golf program in the summer of 2007 to assist Coach Karen Bahnsen.

The matching of veteran coach and former SEC star proved to be a perfect pairing as Borst has joined Bahnsen in her quest that is keeping LSU in the national spotlight. Her knowledge of the sport, her ability to relate to what the student-athletes are going through and her recruiting ability has made her an important addition to the LSU women's golf program.

Johansson Borst came to LSU from the Ritz-Carlton Golf Club in Sarasota, Fla.,

where she served as an outside service professional.

Johansson Borst graduated from
Tennessee in December 2006 with a
Bachelor of Arts in Communication and a
Bachelor of Science in Political Science. She
was a four-year letter winner at UT, earning
second-team All-SEC honors in 2006 and
she was a three-time member of the SEC
Academic Honor Roll.

Johansson Borst was a member of the Swedish National Golf Team for seven years and won first place in the 2002 Girls Team European Championship in Stockholm, Sweden. She was part of the Swedish team that won silver in the Girls European Championship in 2003 in Porto, Portugal and bronze in the Ladies European Championship in 2004 in Moscow, Russia.

"Golda has been a wonderful addition to our golf family and the program here at LSU," said LSU Bahnsen. "She is a big help to us in all aspects of the program and has the skills and the recent success in the sport to relate to our players what must be done to be successful."






