



Second-team all-conference choice last season who is projected as the Tigers' No. 1 weekend starter in 2004 ... worked primarily as LSU's Game 3 starter in 2003 weekend series ... pitched exceptionally well in the Tigers' 2003 fall workouts, posting a 0.64 ERA in 28 innings while allowing two runs on 11 hits with six walks and 19 strikeouts.

2003 Season

Emerged as one of the top pitchers in the Southeastern Conference, recording an 11-4 mark and a 4.42 ERA (19 games/15 starts) in 110 innings with 28 walks and 88 strikeouts ... worked at least seven innings in 12 of his 15 starting assignments ... won seven straight SEC decisions from March 23-May 4; finished with an 8-1 mark in SEC regular-season games with a 3.55 ERA in 63.1 innings ... finished No. 2 in the SEC in wins, No. 6 in innings pitched and No. 9 in strikeouts ... charged with the loss in the Tigers' College World Series opener (June 13) versus Cal State Fullerton, allowing eight runs on nine hits in 5.2 innings with two walks and three strikeouts ... pitched well versus Baylor in Game 1 of the NCAA Super Regional (June 6), allowing just four runs in eight innings in a 4-1 LSU loss ... named to the



NCAA Regional all-tournament team after defeating Tulane (May 31), allowing four runs on nine hits in 7.2 innings with two walks and five strikeouts . . . defeated Mississippi State with a complete game in the SEC Tournament (May 23), allowing just two runs in nine innings while scattering 11 hits . . . defeated Arkansas (May 16) to clinch the 2003 SEC title for the Tigers; pitched eight innings, limiting the Razorbacks to one earned run on five hits with three walks and seven strikeouts . . . recorded career-high 10 Ks in win versus Ole Miss (April 13), limiting the Rebels to two runs on three hits in eight innings with two walks . . . posted complete-game victory over South Carolina (April 6), limiting the Gamecocks to four runs on 10 hits with one walk and seven strikeouts . . . was impressive in his LSU debut, defeating Northwestern State (Feb. 9) by pitching seven innings and limiting the Demons to two runs on five hits with one walk and four Ks.

JUNIOR COLLEGE

Played two seasons at the College of Southern Idaho in Twin Falls . . . recorded a 13-2 mark in 2002 at CSI with a 2.06 ERA and a .182 opponents' batting average . . . recorded 104 strikeouts in 96 innings on the mound . . . led the Scenic West Conference in wins and finished No. 2 in strikeouts.

HIGH SCHOOL

Product of Durango High School in Las Vegas . . . helped lead his team to the 1999 state championship . . . named a second-team all-conference designated hitter in 1999.



Outstanding southpaw who pitched very effectively in 2003 as a long reliever and part-time starter ... returned to the mound in '03 after suffering an elbow injury early in the '02 campaign that forced him to undergo Tommy John surgery ... was granted a medical redshirt in '02 ... worked 25.2 innings in LSU's 2003 fall intra-squad games, posting a 3.57 ERA with five walks and 17 strikeouts.

2003 SEASON

Appeared in 20 games (four starts), posting a 7-0 record and a 2.94 ERA in 67.1 innings with 11 walks and 51 strikeouts ... allowed just a .230 opponent batting average against left-handed hitters ... 2-0 record in LSU's NCAA Tournament games, recording a 3.60 ERA in 15 innings (four appearances) with four walks and 10 strikeouts ... for the entire post-season, he was 3-0 with a 4.03 ERA in 22.1 innings (five appearances) with five walks and 14 strikeouts ... pitched effectively in relief versus South Carolina in the College World Series (June 15 - no decision), limiting the Gamecocks to four runs on five hits in 6.2 innings ... worked three brilliant relief innings in Game 2 of the NCAA Super Regional versus Baylor (June 7), allowing no runs on four hits with no walks and one strikeout -- he earned the 6-5 victory, forcing a Game 3 showdown that LSU won to advance to the CWS ... recorded a relief win in the final game of the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional versus UNC-Wilmington (June 1), allowing one run on two hits in four innings with no walks and five strikeouts ... earned the win as a starter in LSU's SEC Tournament opener versus Arkansas (May 22), limiting the Razorbacks to four runs on eight hits in 7.1 innings with one walk and four strikeouts ... defeated New Orleans (April 30) in the longest outing of his career, working eight innings and surrendering just one earned run on eight hits with no walks and six Ks.

2002 SEASON (MEDICAL REDSHIRT)

Injured his left elbow Feb. 20 in a starting role at Centenary and missed the rest of the season after undergoing surgery ... was very effective in his outings prior to the injury, as he made two appearances - including the one start at Centenary - posting a 1-0 mark with a 1.29 ERA in seven innings ... allowed four hits and one earned run with one walk and three strikeouts ... earned his first career LSU win February 9 versus Birmingham-Southern,



surrendering one run on two hits in four relief innings ... in his first career start February 20 at Centenary, he allowed no runs on two hits with one walk and three strikeouts before leaving the game due to the injury.

HIGH SCHOOL

A three-year baseball letterman (pitcher/outfielder) at Catholic High School ... posted a 10-5 mark and a 1.32 ERA in 2001, recording 136 strikeouts and seven walks in 100.1 innings ... earned 2001 all-state and academic all-state honors ... voted the District 5-5A Most Valuable Player ... maintained a 3.92 GPA and was named the Catholic High Man of the Year ... also received the Brent Pecue Memorial Scholarship.
