## JUNIOR SEASON (2007)

Played in 59 games, starting 35 ... Was selected a team captain for the 2008 season ... Had an outstanding postseason, being named to both the NCAA Palo Alto Regional and Tempe Super Regional All-Tournament teams ... Recorded three home runs in NCAA play, including a two-run shot against Cal State Northridge in the first round of the NCAA Regionals as part of a 3-2 win ... Also recorded a solo home run against Stanford in the NCAA Regional championship game and a two-run shot against Arizona State in the NCAA Super Regionals ... Was second on the team with nine home runs, the most in a single season in her career ... Ranked fourth on the team with 31 RBIs ... Is tied for second in career sacrifice flies in LSU history ... Posted five multiple-hit games, including one, three-hit game ... Ranked second on the team with nine multiple-RBI games, including two, three-RBI games ... Recorded a seven-game hitting streak ... Knocked in the game-winning runs against Mississippi State and Ole Miss ... Member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

## SOPHOMORE SEASON (2006)

Played in 67 games, starting 56 ... Was an honorable mention All-Louisiana selection ... Named to the Tiger Classic All-Tournament team ... Scored the walk-off game-winning run in the NCAA Regional Championship to send the Tigers to their first NCAA Super Regional ... Is tied for eighth in career sacrifice flies in LSU history ... Tied the LSU single-game record for walks with three against McNeese State ... Tied for sixth in sacrifice flies in SEC games with two ... Posted 10 multiple-hit games, including one, three-hit game ... Recorded four multiple-RBI games ... Recorded the seventh longest hitting streak on the team during the season at six games ... Knocked in the game-winning runs against Eastern Michigan, Troy and in the final game of a three-game sweep over No. 3 Alabama ... Member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

## FRESHMAN SEASON (2005)

Played in all 54 games, starting 53 ... Named to the Purple & Gold Challenge and Tiger Classic All-Tournament teams ... Led the team with eight home runs ... Ranked second on the team with 38 RBIs and was tied for third with 12 doubles ... Recorded the second-most single-season sacrifice flies in LSU history with five, which was tied for second in the SEC ... Tied for the conference lead with three sacrifice flies in league games ... Recorded the longest hitting streak on the team during the season at nine games ... Posted 12 multiple-hit games, including three, three-hit games ... Recorded nine multiple-RBI games, the second most on the team ... Knocked in the game-winning runs against Grambling State, Ohio, Nicholls State and against Florida ... Tied the LSU single-game record for runs scored (4) against Columbia and home runs (2) vs. Fresno State ... Tied for the team lead in RBIs in a single game with five vs. McNeese State ... Member of the SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll.

## JUNIOR SEASON (2007)

Made 12 appearances, going 6-1 ... Threw her third career no-hitter against Centenary ... Posted three complete-game shutouts and combined for two more shutouts ... Recorded a career-high nine strikeouts against Texas State ... Allowed only eight earned runs in 42 innings pitched ... Averaged over 6.8 strikeouts per seven innings ... Threw a complete-game one-hitter against Southern Miss ... Did not allow a double or a triple on the season ... Did not record a wild pitch.

## SOPHOMORE SEASON (2006)

Made eight appearances, going a perfect 5-0 ... Threw just the third perfect game in school history, with the feat coming against Grambling State in the second game of a doubleheader ... Threw back-to-back no-hitters; after recording the perfect game against Grambling, she threw a no-no against Mississippi Valley State ... Became the first player in LSU history to throw back-to-back complete-game no-hitters ... Led the SEC in earned run average, opponent's batting average, hits allowed, runs allowed and earned runs allowed, doubles allowed, triples allowed and home runs allowed for the season ... Ranked second in the league in walks allowed ... Missed the latter part of the season with a broken bone in her foot that required surgery.

## FRESHMAN SEASON (2005)

Made 17 appearances, going 7-2 ... Threw three complete-game shutouts on the season ... Threw a one-hit shutout against Grambling State in the Tiger Classic ... Also threw two-hitters against Grambling State, Ohio and Columbia ... Struck out a season-best six batters twice (vs. Grambling State and Ohio) ... Did not allow a home run in 64.2 innings pitched.

## HIGH SCHOOL

Earned four letters in softball ... Team was ranked as high as fifth nationally her senior season, finishing the year ranked eighth ... Team was ranked 13th in 2003 ... Led her team to district championships as a junior and senior ... Team advanced to the regional finals in 2003 and 2004 ... Played in 61 games, starting 35 ... Had the best season of her career after seeing action at designated player ... Was selected a team captain for the 2008 season ... Became LSU's third player to earn Academic All-America honors after being named to the ESPN the Magazine third team ... Was also an ESPN the Magazine first-team Academic All-District selection ... Earned LSWA first-team All-Louisiana honors at designated player ... Selected the LSWA Louisiana Hitter of the week on March 13 ... Led the team with 29 stolen bases, the fifth most in school history ... Ranked 10th in the SEC and 49th in the NCAA in stolen bases ... Tied the school record with a 15-game hitting streak ... **SOPHOMORE SEASON (2007)**

Made 33 appearances, including 26 games started, with a 24-3 record ... Was the unanimous selection for Louisiana Pitcher of Year ... Earned second-team NFCA All-South Region honors ... Was a first-team All-SEC selection ... Named the Most Valuable Player of the SEC Tournament ... Selected to the NCAA Palo Alto Regional All-Tournament Team ... Earned SEC Pitcher of the Week honors on Feb. 26 and March 12 ... Was a four-time Louisiana Pitcher of the week (Feb. 27, March 13, March 27 and April 10) ... Named the LSU Female Student-Athlete of the Week on Feb. 26, April 10 and April 17 ... Selected the Most Valuable Player of the Easton Purple & Gold Challenge ... Moved into the top five in LSU history in career strikeouts and career strikeouts per seven innings ... Recorded only three losses on the season, at No. 11 Washington, vs. then No. 1 Tennessee and at No. 9 Arizona State ... Ranked 20th in the NCAA in ERA, 17th in strikeouts per seven innings and 29th in victories ... Ranked fifth in the SEC with a 1.36 earned run average, third in opponent's batting average, ninth in innings pitched, fifth in strikeouts, second in strikeouts looking, tied for fourth in wins, fifth in hits allowed and runs allowed, and was tied for sixth in earned runs allowed ... Also ranked in the top 10 in the league in fewest doubles and triples allowed ... Numbers were even better in SEC play as she ranked second in wins, fourth in earned run average, second in opponent's batting average, tied for third in saves and was third in strikeouts and strikeouts looking ... Recorded no-hitters against Southern Miss and Missouri State ... Recorded four wins and two saves against nationally ranked teams, including a win and a save against then No. 2 Alabama and a save against then No. 1 Tennessee ... Struck out 10 or more batters in nine games ... Threw complete-game nine-inning two-hitters against Memphis and Ole Miss ... Did not allow more than two earned runs in 27 of her 33 appearances.

Made 27 appearances, going 16-5 ... Was named the Louisiana Tri-Freshman of the Year ... Member of the SEC All-Freshman team ... Earned All-Louisiana second team honors ... Was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Feb. 20 ... Earned Louisiana Pitcher of the Week honors on March 13 ... Member of the Purple & Gold Challenge and the Tiger Classic All-Tournament teams ... For her career, threw 13 perfect games, including seven her senior year, which ranks fourth all-time in the national high school record book ... Led Palm Harbor to back-to-back Florida Class 5A state championships, including a perfect 31-0 record and No. 2 national ranking in 2005 ... Went 25-0 as senior with 21 shutouts (including 15 no-hitters), 404 strikeouts and a 0.08 ERA, averaging 17.1 strikeouts per seven innings with only four walks ...
