EXPERIENCED TIGERS LOOKING TO PEAK IN POSTSEASON COMPETITION

The 2007-08 Tigers turned it up a notch in postseason meets last season, breaking two school records and earning six All-America honors at the NCAA Championships. However, with 16 letterwinners and three All-Americans returning and several key additions coming on board, head coach Adam Schmitt feels his squad has the upside to finish even stronger this year.

"I think the men's team is on the cusp of doing some great things," Schmitt said. "We have multiple All-Americans in our program right now, but I can see a lot more. We have guys capable of stepping up and scoring at the SEC Championships, reaching the finals at the conference meet and not only that, but going to NCAAs and getting in the top 20.

"It's the focus and the length of our season, and that's what's going to determine our outcome at the end of the year. I want to be there at SECs and at NCAAs, and I think we will."

In order to prepare for the postseason, coach Schmitt and his staff have once again assembled a rigorous schedule, and the team doesn't have to wait long for its first major test as the Tigers open the dual-meet

season at home against perennial powerhouse Florida on Oct. 22.

Following another home meet against the Alabama Crimson Tide on Nov. 7, the men's squad makes its first road trip of the season two weeks later, traveling to College Station, Texas, the site of the 2009 NCAA Championships, to compete in the Texas A&M Invitational. The team finishes the fall season with a matchup against SEC rival, Auburn in Fort Lauderdale, Fla.

The Tigers will remain in Florida through the start of the new year and face off against Clemson and Florida Atlantic before returning to Baton Rouge for three consecutive home meets. The squad revisits the Texas A&M campus on Jan. 24 looking to take out the Aggies for the second consecutive year and concludes the regular season against the New Orleans Privateers at the end of the month.

By the end of dual-meet competition, the team should be well-conditioned for the SEC Championships in Auburn, Ala., and the Last Chance Meet in Athens, Ga., as the Tiger athletes make their final push to receive bids to the NCAAs in March.

Freestyle

With the departure of 2008 Olympian Miko Malberg, the sprint races will take on a bit of a different look this season, but senior Brandon Selts is poised to break out and become the Tigers' next great 50-free specialist.

After transferring from Arizona in 2007, Selts provided the team with an immediate boost, anchoring last year's school record-breaking, All-American 200 freestyle relay squad in his first season. As an individual competitor, the Miami, Fla., native set the team's second-best mark of the season in the 50 free at the SEC Championships Time Trial with a time of 22.33 seconds.

Sophomore Hannes Heyl is expected to carry the Tigers in the 100 free. Heyl swam a time of 44.22 to lead off LSU's 400 freestyle relay team at the NCAA Championships last season, which ranks as the 10th-fastest 100-free split in program history. The international sensation also competed in the 100 free at the NCAAs in his first year and placed 44th.

Sophomore James Meyers and senior Connor Farber are athletic swimmers who will help the

Tigers compete in both short-distance freestyle races, and junior Andrew Reynolds should emerge as one of the team's better middle distance swimmers after finishing last season on a strong note.

However, Julius Gloeckner, a staple in the men's 200 and 500 freestyle events the past three years, will once again lead the way in middle-distance events. The senior owns the school's second-fastest all-time marks in both races.

Sophomores Clint Hallum and Luis Gonzalez set the bar quite high in distance freestyle events after a pair of stellar freshman campaigns and return as two of the better distance swimmers in the conference. Hallum tallied top-five program marks in three events – the 500, 1000 and 1650 freestyle races – during his first year. Gonzalez sits in the school's top six in two events after one season.

Backstroke

Heyl had a remarkable freshman season, yet he's barely scratched the surface of his enormous potential. While the butterfly is the German's best stroke at this point in his career, his backstroke

isn't far behind, and the sophomore has as much upside in the 100 back as with any of his other races.

His backstroking abilities were already good enough in his first year to earn him 24th-place in that event at the NCAAs with a time of 47.95, the second-fastest mark in program annals. This year, he'll be shooting for an All-America honor in the race.

"When Hannes came over from Germany, we weren't really sure what to expect," said Schmitt. "We heard some good reports, and we knew he was a good kicker, but he's just an incredible athlete. I think he may have surprised himself in his freshman year, and now, I hope he can refocus and realize he can be even better. He can be one of the best LSU has ever had."

In addition to Heyl, Meyers is expected to make some strides in backstroke competition after a steady freshman season in those races. Meyers just missed the finals of the 100 back at the SECs after clocking a career best of 49.93. Freshman Simon Diefenthal, an international prospect from Zuelpich, Germany, will also see action in the backstroke events.

Breaststroke

Senior Chris White and junior Nate Telep are the Tigers' top returning breaststrokers in the 100 and 200 breaststroke events, respectively. Both swimmers are hoping to follow up on solid 2007-08 seasons with even better results this year.

White enjoyed the best season of his career last year, shaving nearly two seconds off his top times in both breaststroke races. Telep secured four victories in the 200 breast last season and placed 13th at the SECs with his personal-best time of 2:02.94 in the event.

Furthermore, the coaching staff is expecting incoming freshman Ben Decker of Kingwood, Texas to bolster the team's breaststroke efforts right away. The 2007 state champion in the 100 breast, Decker brings in a personal record of 56.14 in the race.

Butterfly

Without a doubt, the strength of the 2008-09 team lies in the butterfly stroke as the Tigers return arguably its deepest group of fly performers in the history of the program. The sensational duo of senior Christoph Lubenau and Heyl form one of the top 100-fly tandems in the country, and the two hope to build upon their All-American success from a year ago.

Lubenau finished last season on an absolute tear, shattering the school record in the 100 fly at the NAAs with a blistering mark of 46.24 seconds. Heyl wasn't far behind, registering the program's only other time in the event under 47 seconds.

"Hannes got up there at the NAAs last year and broke Lubenau's record in the 100 fly, and Christoph came back one minute later and took it right back from him," said Schmitt. "It was like those guys were feeding off each other, and that was really good to see."

Look for each to push his top time in the event as the pair seeks to return to the national competition. If Lubenau can get into a groove, it's certainly conceivable to see him record a time in the 45-second range and go after the SEC and NCAA championships.

Gloeckner, the team's record-holder in the 200 fly, will anchor the squad in that race for the fourth consecutive season. The senior won the event five times and notched a team-best mark of 1:48.60 against the fifth-ranked Florida Gators last year.

The wildcard in this equation is incoming freshman Martin Jungfleisch, a product of Bremerhaven, Germany, who has the potential to

make an immediate impact in butterfly races. Jungfleisch boasts a personal best of 55.99 in the 100-meter fly and competed in the German Olympic Trials in April 2008.

"Martin, coming in, is sort of where Christoph was coming out of Germany," said Schmitt. "He's a 55-second, long-course flyer, and he can do some freestyle as well. With our training, I can see him popping out pretty quick."

Individual Medley

Gloeckner, the school's record holder in both the 200 and 400 IMs, should continue to cement his legacy as the finest medley swimmer in school history. While he wasn't able to top either of his phenomenal PRs set during his sophomore campaign, the Tigers' most versatile swimmer remained a force, capturing five event titles in 2007-08.

During the summer, Gloeckner trained vigorously in an effort to get back to the NCAA Championships, which eluded him for the first time in his career last season.

"Julius' talent is there," Schmitt added. "I think it's a case where he just has to put the year behind him and move forward. I know he had a great summer of training. With him, I think it's just a matter of staying focused and being confident going into your senior year. I think it's ultimately up to him to where he sees himself going."

However, Gloeckner isn't the only athlete who's expected to make a splash in medley races this season. Junior Sean LeNeave, whose career-best time of 3:57.36 sits in sixth-place all-time at LSU, is coming off a fantastic summer of training, culminating in a remarkable performance at the 2008 U.S. Open in August.

Swimming alongside some of the nation's best swimmers, the Conroe, Texas, native swam to three personal records in long course races and finished 13th out of 64 competitors in the 400-meter IM. If LeNeave can translate his recent long course success over to the collegiate short-course format this year, the junior could be in for a fine season.

Schmitt also feels Hallum, Gonzalez, Telep and the freshman Decker can be valuable contributors in the individual medley.

Diving

The diving team returns only one athlete from its stellar 2007-08 season, but he happens to be one of the top divers in the SEC. After sitting out the entire 2006-07 year due to a shoulder injury, Niko

Dalman stormed back last year, winning three springboard events and capturing the third-place medal in the 3-meter dive at the SECs with the highest score in school history, 391.55.

Heading into this season, diving coach Doug Shaffer believes his fifth-year senior is primed for an enormous year.

"I think Niko has the opportunity to have his best year here," Shaffer said. "The redshirt year due to a shoulder injury was beneficial in terms of maturity for him."

"Niko's been in the sport a long time, and he's a little more competitively mature. I think if he puts his mind to what he can do, he could really set some things on fire."

If Dalman is at his best, he can be one of the nation's elite springboard divers and is fully capable of exceeding the 400-point barrier in the 3-meter. However, the senior is not only expected to compete at a high level, but Shaffer hopes he'll provide valuable leadership to a promising pair of freshmen as newcomers Brian Gemberling and Matt Vieke will be counted on to contribute in their first seasons.

Gemberling, a product of Levittown, Pa., is an advanced diver who won two district championships and qualified for his state's high school meet four times during his prep career. Vieke, an Indianapolis, Ind., native, is a talented athlete who has performed well in regional competitions over the past couple of years. Both freshmen specialize in springboard competition, but under Shaffer's tutelage, should develop into solid, if not spectacular platform divers.

"Brian Gemberling is a dark horse and has a tremendous amount of talent," Shaffer added. "I would say the same for Matt Vieke as well. I'm really excited with their enthusiasm and potential with the backgrounds they come in with."

"They have good backgrounds in Junior Olympic diving but haven't had a real opportunity in a full-time program to really prove themselves. You get in this environment where it's very structured and very organized and directed in what we do, and I think they will excel."

Outside of dual-meet competition, the men's divers will compete in two diving meets at Auburn and Tennessee. Following the regular season, Shaffer's athletes will travel to the SEC Championships in February and the NCAA Zone Diving Regional in March, where they'll attempt to qualify for the NCAA Championships, March 26-28.

Miko Malberg capped his collegiate career with his first All-America honor in 2008.

For Miko Malberg, the 2007-08 season was his last chance to earn All-America status. In three collegiate seasons and two previous trips to the NCAA Championships, the honor had escaped the freestyle sprinter, but with one year remaining, the senior was determined to get back to the national meet and capture the elusive accolade.

After seven enduring months of competition, Malberg returned to the NCAAs and departed triumphantly, receiving All-America recognition as the leader of the school's record-breaking 200 freestyle relay squad.

However, his feat was only one aspect of the team's accomplishments. Last season also saw the emergence of the best pair of butterfly swimmers in program history as both Christoph Lubenau and Hannes Heyl enjoyed All-American performances at the NCAAs.

Overall, the Tigers claimed six All-America honors, shattered four school records and registered a top-30 finish at the NCAAs for the second consecutive year. The 2007-08 season was a success from start to finish.

The men's team began the year in promising fashion, taking the second-ranked Stanford Cardinal down to the wire in the season opener at the LSU Natatorium on Sept. 14. With one event remaining and the dual-meet victory hanging in the balance, the 2007 NCAA runner-up held off the feisty Tigers with a 1-3 finish in the 200 freestyle relay and made it out of Baton Rouge, La., with a 139-123 win.

Despite the tough loss, the Tigers were able to carry the momentum they gained from their near-upset of the perennial Pac-10 powerhouse and tally three wins in their next four contests, including resounding victories over Southeastern conference rivals, South Carolina and Alabama.

The squad followed its steady month of dual-meet competition with an outstanding showing at the Georgia Tech Invitational in November, culminating in a second-place finish at the seven-team meet in Atlanta, Ga.

After a month off from team meets, the Tigers returned to action on Jan. 1 and rang in the new year with a win over No. 22 Notre Dame in Fort Lauderdale, Fla. The team finished the dual-meet season with two more victories over nationally-ranked foes, Florida State and Texas A&M, and entered postseason competition beaming with confidence.

At the SEC Championships in February, the squad placed sixth overall, and six athletes – four swimmers and two divers – reached the medalists' podium after sensational efforts in their respective events. Malberg shined at the conference meet, seizing third-place in the 50-yard freestyle and leading the 200 freestyle relay team to a third-place finish with the second-fastest 50-yard split in program annals (19.62 seconds).

Furthermore, freshman diver Michael Neubacher notched second in the platform event at the SECs with a remarkable score of 431.55 en route to SEC Male Freshman Diver of the Year honors. Junior Niko Dalman secured the bronze medal in the 3-meter springboard with a school-record mark of 391.55.

In March, the diving team competed at the NCAA Zone 'B' Diving Regional in Auburn, Ala., where Neubacher qualified for the final rounds of both springboard events and Dalman reached the finals of the 1-meter.

The swimmers traveled to Federal Way, Wash., to swim in the NCAA Championships two weeks later. The 200 freestyle relay team of Malberg, Heyl, Lubenau and Brandon Selts started the competition off with a bang, finishing ninth in the preliminary heats with a program-record time of 1:18.46. The squad missed the finals of the event by a mere hundredth of a second but took 12th in the consolation final to receive honorable mention All-America recognition.

With the 200 freestyle relay in the books, Lubenau, Heyl and Malberg proceeded to their respective individual races at the national meet. Lubenau enjoyed the finest moment of his career, finishing ninth overall in the 100 butterfly after beating the field in the consolation final with a blistering, school-record mark of 46.24.

Heyl placed 16th overall in the same event and also competed in the 100 back and 100 free prelims at the NCAAs. Malberg took part in the 50 and 100 freestyles, recording 21st- and 48th-place, respectively.

In addition to LSU's achievements in the pool, the team excelled in the classroom and in the community as well. Eleven students were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, and junior breaststroker Chris White was one of seven conference athletes to be recognized on the SEC Men's Swimming and Diving Community Service Team for his contributions to the Baton Rouge area.
