COMING BACK STRONG

TIGERS EARN FIRST TRIP TO NCAA SUPER REGIONALS

After sweeping through the NCAA Region 13 bracket in Baton Rouge, the Tigers earned their first trip to the NCAA Super Regionals since the tournament went to its current format in 2005. LSU, the top seed in its region and 15th overall national seed advanced undefeated through Regional play, including a pair of one-run wins over in-state rival UL-Lafayette.

The Tigers advanced to face No. 2 seed and top-ranked Arizona in Tucson. After losing the first game, LSU came back to even the best-of-three format with a 3-2 win in game two. It marked the Tigers' first win over a top-ranked team in school history and sent the series to a decisive game three. Unfortunately, LSU could not make it two in a row as the Wildcats won to advance to the Women's College World Series, where they claimed their seventh NCAA Championship.

TIGERS POST PROGRAM WIN NO. 500

With a 13-2 win in five innings over Kentucky on March 25, 2006, the LSU softball program earned its 500th victory since the program's re-instatement in 1997. The Tigers entered the last season with 470 wins and posted the 500th win just 35 games into the season. LSU is the only school in the SEC to break the 500-win plateau since the conference began sponsoring softball in 1997. South Carolina has the most program wins of any school in the league (1,125), but has been competing in softball since 1974.

LSU HITS THE HALF CENTURY MARK AGAINST AUBURN

With a win over Auburn at the SEC Tournament on May 11, 2006, LSU hit 50 wins in just 61 games. It also marked the eighth time in the last 10 years that the Tigers have hit the 50-win plateau and are one of only two teams to have eight 50-win seasons in the last 10 years.

TIGERS ON THE TUBE

The Tigers appeared on television 14 times in 2006, including six games broadcast by the ESPN networks. LSU's first television appearances of the season was on ESPNU at the Palm Springs Classic against

Stanford. The Tigers then appeared on Cox Sports Television six times, including an NCAA Regional championship win over UL-Lafayette. LSU also faced South Carolina and Tennessee on Fox Sports as part of the SEC-TV package. In addition, two of the Tigers' three games at Tennessee were aired by ESPN, with the first game of the series televised by ESPNU and the final game broadcast by ESPNU. LSU closed out the season with all three of its NCAA Super Regional games at Arizona broadcast on ESPNU.

LSU VS. RANKED TEAMS

In 2006, the Tigers had one of the toughest schedules in the nation. LSU finished 19-14 against nationally ranked teams, including an 8-10 record against teams ranked in the top 10. The Tigers recorded their first win over a No. 1-ranked team when LSU topped Arizona, 3-2, in the second game of the NCAA Super Regional.

TIGERS SCORE EARLY...

The LSU softball team made a habit of taking early leads on opponents. In 69 games, the Tigers outscored their opponents, 81-29 (+52), in the first inning. By the end of the fourth inning, the Tigers held a commanding 231-82 (+149) scoring margin. LSU was 43-1 when leading after the fourth inning.

In games where the Tigers took the lead first, LSU lost only once last season, going 48-1 (.980). In games where the opponent scored first the Tigers were just 7-13 (.330). The only time LSU scored first and lost was on April 26, 2006, when LSU fell to Arkansas, 3-2, in nine innings.

...AND TIGERS SCORE OFTEN

Last season, the Tigers scored 350 runs in 69 games for a 5.07 runs per game average, 22nd best in the NCAA, and just behind the school record of 5.58 set in 2004. On nine occasions LSU broke into double figures in runs, including a school record-tying 20 runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Grambling State.

The Tigers also had two innings in which they have scored eight or more runs. Against Texas Southern, LSU recorded the second most runs in an inning in school history with 12 in the second inning. That mark was

behind the 15 scored in the fourth against Nicholls State on April 1, 2004, and tied the 12 runs scored in the third against Ole Miss in 1997.

THREE PROVES TO BE LSU'S MAGIC NUMBER

On the offensive side, the magic number for the Tigers seems to be three. LSU was 47-1 (.980) when scoring three or more runs in a game, with the only loss of the season when scoring three runs coming in the final game of the year against No. 1 Arizona in the NCAA Super Regionals. However, the Tigers were 8-13 (.381) when scoring fewer than three runs.

TWO OUTS ... NO PROBLEM

The third out was quite elusive for opponents of LSU last season. The Tigers recorded 193 of their 350 runs with two outs, accounting for 55-percent of their total runs. LSU hit .316 as a team with two outs, led by Quinlan Duhon with a .378 average, followed by Leslie Klein at .375 and Lauren Castle at .368.

All but one of the Tigers recorded a two-out RBI. Nine players posted double-figure RBI totals with two outs, led by Leslie Klein and Stephanie Hill with 19, while Lauren Delahoussaye had 17, Lauren Castle had 15 and Camille Harris, Killian Roessner and Andrea Smith all had 14.

IT TAKES A THIEF

In 69 games last season, LSU ranked third in the SEC with 93 stolen bases, the fifth most in LSU single-season history, on 113 attempts for an .823 percentage with 1.35 stolen bases/game. Three Tigers stole at least 10 bases with 11 players stealing at least one base. Dee Dee Henderson led the team with a 28-for-32 mark, which ranked 23rd in the NCAA, while Leslie Klein stole 18 bases and Camille Harris had 17.

PITCHER PERFECT

LSU laid claim to the one of the top pitching staffs in the nation. The Tigers allowed only 126 runs, 88 earned, in 69 games with a 1.37 team earned run average, which ranked 13th in the NCAA. In addition, LSU posted 31 shutouts and averaged 7.64 strikeouts per seven innings. Three of the four Tiger pitchers ranked in the top 10 in the league in ERA, including Emily Turner, who ranked ninth in the nation with a 0.93 ERA.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

As a team, the Tigers hit 102 doubles in 69 games last season, or 1.48 doubles per game, 10th-best in the NCAA. This was the second-most doubles in a season in school history. The 1998 Tigers set the school record with 133 doubles in 72 games. Ten players recorded three or more doubles, led by the 17 by Vanessa Soto and the 16 by Stephanie Hill, 14 by Leslie Klein and 12 by Camille Harris.

STREAKING...

Leslie Klein tied for the sixth longest hitting streak in school history with a 12-game mark. She posted hits in 12 straight games beginning with a 1-for-3 performance against Georgia on March 19. It ended with an 0-for-4 mark against Auburn in the second game of a doubleheader on April 8. During her streak, she went 21-for-37 (.568) with three doubles, a triple, three home runs and 14 RBIs.

ROESSNER CALLING THE SHOTS

Last season, catcher Killian Roessner began calling the pitch selection from behind the plate for the Tiger pitchers. During the year, she called two no-hitters and a perfect game, just the third perfect game in LSU history. In addition, Roessner led the Tiger pitching staff to 31 complete-game shutouts and a 1.37 earned run average.

PRIME TARGET

Camille Harris was hit by a pitch 16 times last season, breaking her LSU single-season record of 14 from 2005. She tied for second in the SEC and ranked 13th in the NCAA. For her career, she was hit 35 times, breaking the school career record with the second most in SEC career history.

GIVING IT UP FOR THE CAUSE

With a game-winning sacrifice fly in the bottom of the seventh against UL-Lafayette in NCAA Regional play, Vanessa Soto broke the LSU single-season sacrifice fly record. The sac fly that scored Quinlan Duhon from third was the seventh of the season for Soto, topping the eight-year old mark of six set by Tara Asbill in 1998.

With a sacrifice fly by Killian Roessner at No. 6 Tennessee on May 7, LSU broke the SEC single-season team record for sacrifice flies. The previous record of 27 was held by the 1998 Tigers. For the season, LSU had 30 sacrifice flies. The Tigers had 10 players who recorded sacrifice flies, including five with three or more.

GARCIA MAKES HISTORY WITH NO-NO NUMBER TWO

Against Mississippi Valley State on Feb. 17, in her second appearance of the season, Tiffany Garcia hurled her second-straight no-hitter, becoming the first player in LSU history to record back-to-back complete-game no-hitters. She was two outs from recording her second-straight perfect game after posting her first career perfect game against Grambling State two days earlier. It was also the 26th no-hitter in the program's history.

GARCIA THROWS PERFECT GAME

In the second game of a doubleheader against Grambling State on Feb. 15, Tiffany Garcia hurled her first career perfect game. The first appearance of the season for Garcia also marked her first complete-game no-hitter as a Tiger. The third perfect game in LSU history, it was also the 25th no-hitter in the program's history and the second of the season.

HOFFER HURLS NO-HITTER

In her first collegiate outing, Dani Hofer hurled a no-hitter against Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Feb. 11. It marked the first complete-game no-hitter for Hofer as a Tiger, who tossed 15 no-no's during her senior year in high school. It was also the 24th no-hitter in LSU softball history, and the first since Kristin Schmidt fired a no-no against Centenary on April 2, 2003.

LUCKY 14 IN A ROW

LSU opened play in 2006 with 14 consecutive wins. It marked the longest season-opening winning streak for the Tigers in the program's history, besting the nine-game winning streak to open the 2000 season. In addition, it tied for the eighth longest winning streak overall in the program's history, five games shy of the school record of 19-consecutive wins during the 2000 season.

The Tigers also opened the home schedule at 15-0, the second best home start in school history, coming 10 games behind the best home start in school history of 25-0 that began the inaugural 1997 season. During the 2006 winning streak, LSU also recorded a school record seven consecutive shutouts from Feb. 12 - Feb. 18.

LSU TIES SINGLE-SEASON HOME WINS MARK

With a 31-3 record at Tiger Park in 2006, LSU tied the 2000 team for the most home victories in school history. The Tigers also recorded the third best winning percentage in LSU history with a .912 mark, behind only the .967 (29-1) clip of the 2001 team and the .933 (28-2) percentage of the 1998 team. LSU began the 2006 season with 15 straight wins at Tiger Park, including two wins over then-No. 11 Washington. After a pair of losses to nationally ranked Georgia, LSU then rattled off nine more wins at home.
