

As a member of the LSU swimming team in the 1980s, Schmitt played a key role in leading the Tigers to their highest finish ever at both the conference meet as well as the NCAA Championships in 1988. That year, LSU won its only Southeastern Conference title and then went on to a sixth-place showing at the NCAA Championships.

Individually, Schmitt capped his LSU career by capturing the SEC title in the 50 yard freestyle three times. He's also the second-most decorated swimmer in LSU history, earning a total of 10 all-America honors during his career. Schmitt's all-America awards include being a three-time recipient in both the 100 freestyle and the 400 freestyle relay as well as being honored twice in the 50-freestyle and the 400-freestyle medley relay.

Schmitt still holds the LSU record in the 100 freestyle with a 43.22 clocking, which he set in 1988. He also ranks second in school history in the 50 freestyle with a time of 19.65, also recorded in 1988.

On the international level, Schmitt was a member of several U.S. National Teams and participated in the 1986 Goodwill Games, the 1987 World University Games and the 1991 Pan-American Games. He was the 1989 U.S. Open Champion in the 50 freestyle, and



Schmitt, a native of Houston, Texas, enters his second season as a head coach at his alma mater after serving as associate head coach at Arizona State for three years. Prior to his three-year stint at Arizona State, Schmitt served as an assistant coach at Auburn for four years, helping the Tigers to one NCAA title and pair of NCAA runner-up finishes.

At Auburn and Arizona State, Schmitt's expertise in the sprint races helped produce multiple top eight NCAA finishes in both individual and relay races for both schools during his four and three-year tenures.

Internationally, he has placed many athletes on U.S. and foreign national teams including the 1999 and 2003 Pan American Games, 2002 Pan Pacific Championships and the 2005 World Championships. Schmitt has also coached many U.S. Olympic Trials' finalists and helped one Arizona State swimmer secure a spot as an alternative for the 2004 U.S. Olympic Team.

brought that international experience to the 2004-05 squad as several Tiger swimmers competed in elite competitions over the summer. He helped Lady Tiger captain Heather Brand train and then qualify for the World Championships as she represented her native country of Zimbabwe. Brand also earned a berth as a 2008 Olympic representative. Colleen Bertirotti and Kevin Braud earned experience on the national level while participating at the U.S. World Championship Swimming Trials. Both secured U.S. Olympic Trial standards for 2008.

Schmitt's other collegiate head-coaching stop came at Long Beach City College where he served as head coach for one season.

Schmitt is a 1989 graduate of LSU in marketing, and is married to former Stanford swimming All-American Aimee Berzins. The couple has two daughters, Hannah and Haley.



The 2004-05 season exemplified Shaffer's expertise as freshman Niko Dalman made an immediate impact and entered the LSU record books. Having gathered only five months of collegiate experience, Dalman captured honorable mention All-America honors in the 1-meter at the NCAA Championships. The Auburn, Wash., native also became the first diver in school history to receive the SEC Freshman Diver of the Year award. His All-America achievement was only the fourth by a freshman in the program's history.

Lady Tiger divers Hali Saucier and Paige Brown also set a benchmark for the future of the program, becoming the first LSU divers of the new millennium to qualify for the U.S. National Championships.

In 2003-04, Shaffer coached Jessica Wantz to two All-American finishes in the 1-meter and 3-meter, respectively at the 2004 NCAA Championships. Wantz' score in the 3-meter of 540.15 -- a career high -- earned the Houston, Texas, native a third-place finish in the country.

During the 2002-03 season, Shaffer's guidance enabled three LSU divers to earn five NCAA All-American performances. Making her debut at the NCAA Championships, Wantz finished fourth in the 3-meter competition with a score of 532.45, the first All-America honor of her career. Barb Gorst, coming off of an All-America campaign in 2001-02, continued her success in 2002-03 capping off her senior season by placing 15th in the 10-meter platform diving competition with a mark of 372.80. It was the Calgary, Canada, native's third All-America honor. Fellow senior Kyle VanArsdall ended his career on a right note. The first-time All-American finished 12th in the 10-meter platform at NCAAs.

The LSU program has produced at least one SEC diving champion in three out of the past six seasons and two Lady Tigers were NCAA Champions in 2000. Shaffer's elite recruiting classes look to continue that trend.

Shaffer, 42, is no stranger to leading a successful collegiate diving program. He was the head coach at the University of Minnesota from 1989-96 and then at UCLA in 1988-89.

Shaffer experienced a great deal of success at Minnesota as he was honored as Big Ten Diving Coach of the Year three times, two times on the women's side and once for the men's team. Shaffer coached 11 Big Ten champions, 29 All-Americans and two NCAA champions while at Minnesota. He was named NCAA Diving Coach of the Year in 1993. Shaffer also coached three Pac-10 champions and four All-Americans during his tenure at UCLA.

He has coached the United States in numerous international competitions since 1989, including the U.S. National Diving teams in China, Sweden, Spain and the United States. Shaffer was the assistant competition manager during the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta and in 2001 was recruited to serve in England as the head diving coach at the Sheffield, England, High Performance Center. There he coached five Olympians on the Lottery Funded World Class Performance Program but declined a four-year contract extension for the opportunity to coach at LSU.

Shaffer graduated from UCLA in 1986 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in history. Shaffer was an 11-time U.S. National champion, the 1986 NCAA Diver of the Year and the NCAA 1-meter and 3-meter champion in 1986 for the Bruins. One of the few divers to defeat the legendary Greg Louganis, Shaffer ousted the four-time Olympian five times in 1987, three of which were in U.S. National competition. Shaffer was a silver medalist in the 3-meter at the 1987 Pan American Games and won a gold medal at the 1987 USA-USSR dual meet in the 3-meter competition. An Olympic Trials' finalist in 1984 and 1988, Shaffer retired from competition in 1988 due to a back injury and moved into the nation's coaching ranks.

Shaffer is a native of Canton, Ohio and is married to Dr. Tracy Stephenson Shaffer, an LSU assistant professor in communication studies. The two welcomed a newborn baby girl, Sara Melissa on Nov. 30, 2005.

Morgan Bailey

Second Season



Morgan Bailey is no stranger to championship swimming and his addition to the LSU staff in the summer of 2004 certainly solidifies the Tigers' hopes for landing several highly touted recruits.

Bailey served as the head senior coach at the Mecklenburg Aquatics Club in Charlotte, N.C., before joining the Tiger staff. He

enters his second year at LSU with eight years of experience as an assistant in the collegiate ranks. During his previous coaching stints, Bailey accounted for six national championships as both a swimmer and coach.

As an assistant coach in charge of sprints at Georgia from 1999-2001, he was part of a staff that led the women's team to consecutive SEC and NCAA titles in 2000 and 2001. He was also instrumental in coaching Bulldog All-American Courtney Shealy to an appearance at the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney. Shealy swam in the 100 backstroke and also joined her teammates in winning the gold medal in the 4x100 freestyle relay.

Bailey also served as an assistant at Auburn from 1997-99 where the Tigers claimed both the men's SEC and NCAA titles in 1999. While at Auburn, the 34-year old served as recruiting coordinator and brought in several of the nation's top swimmers. Prior to his stint with the Tigers, Bailey served as an assistant coach at UNLV from 1995-97.

An outstanding freestyle and backstroke swimmer himself, Bailey was a 23-time All-American at Oakland University and helped the school claim two national titles.

Bailey graduated with a bachelor's degree in exercise science from Oakland in 1995. He would later earn his master's degree from Auburn in 1998.

Before joining the LSU staff in the summer of 2004, Shawhan served an assistant coach at her alma mater of Florida State. In her three seasons there, the Brampton, Canada native helped guide the Florida State women's

team to a top-20 national finish and also led the men's and women's squads to top-three finishes at the ACC Championships. During her tenure, the Seminoles produced four Olympians and numerous school record holders.

Shawhan had a unique opportunity to work at the Nike World Headquarters in Beaverton, Ore. following college graduation. She gained unlimited experience working as an intern for the Director of College Marketing, as well as aiding the college account managers and field representatives involved in all team aspects of Nike. Her success was evident when she was immediately hired as the Marketing Assistant Coordinator for the sales department following the completion of her internship.

Shawhan, 29, began swimming at a young age, which finally led her to a scholarship at Florida State in 1996. As a Seminole, she became one of the most prolific swimmers in school history, earning All-America status five times during her four-year career. She captured All-American honors three times in 2000 as a member of three freestyle relay teams. She earned her first All-America honor in 1997 in the 200 individual medley.

The Canada native graduated from Florida State in 2000, earning a bachelor's degree in sports management. She is married to George Shawhan.

Veteran Experience

Brand, Bertirotti, Saucier guide Lady Tigers into 2005-06

f the success of LSU's offseason international competition and training program is any indication of where the team is heading, then head coach Adam Schmitt should expect a solid finish at the SEC and NCAA Championships. The LSU women's team returns 14 letterwinners, including several key names who look to build on their successes from last season. The possibilities are even more exciting when a talented recruiting class that the LSU staff inked in the signing period joins those seniors.

Schmitt's signing class and veteran leaders will be tested early in meets against some of the best programs in the nation. The Lady Tigers open the season with last year's NCAA runner up, Auburn, at home. Meets on the road at Florida State and Alabama present a formidable challenge. Top-10 ranked Texas A&M and Florida also visit the LSU Natatorium in February. The tough dual meet schedule leads up to the SEC Championships at Knoxville, Tenn., and then the NCAA Championships at Athens, Ga.

Freestyle

Without question, LSU's freestyle personnel could be the strongest the team has seen in years. In sprint events, Colleen Bertirotti returns after another stellar season, one in which the junior qualified for the World Championship Trials in the 50 free. Bertirotti, a native of San Antonio, Texas, enters the season as the owner of the third-fastest 50 free time in school history. The time of 23.27 was recorded at the Last Chance Meet and just missed qualifying for the NCAA Championships. Bertirotti has aspirations of reaching the event this season.

One member of the LSU team that did reach the NCAA Championships was Heather Brand. Brand, a team co-captain, placed 49th in the 50 free prelims at NCAAs. She was also the Lady Tigers' highest finisher in the event at the SEC Championships last season. What Brand did following LSU's season is what may give the senior even more of an advantage in 2005-06. Brand qualified and participated in four events for her native country of Zimbabwe at the 2005 FINA World Championships. Both Bertirotti and Brand return for LSU in the 100 free as well.

"We are strong here with two returning sprint scorers but also we have a good core of young sprinters as well," said Schmitt. "It is a pretty solid group of athletes right now. Colleen and Heather have really grown within the program to where they provide leadership for the younger sprinters to help achieve our goals."

Freshmen Katie Gilmore, Nele Trepp and Jamie Wright provide immediate depth and look to continue the success established by Brand and Bertirotti. Gilmore was a two-time 50 free state champion and record holder in the state of Alabama. Trepp comes to LSU with international freestyle experience in Estonia, and Wright was a standout Junior National qualifier for the Bengal Tiger Aquatic Club in Baton Rouge.

In distance freestyle events, Clare Schepens will be counted upon heavily after an outstanding freshman campaign. Schepens posted the Lady Tigers' fastest times of the season in the 500, 1000 and 1650 free events. Her clockings in the 1000 and 1650 free reached the all-time top 10. She was also the team's best scorer at the SEC Championships.

"Clare is the backbone of our distance group, and we look to her to fill the need in those events," said Schmitt.

Hannah Martin enters her senior year with experience in distance freestyle events. She recorded the best finish by any LSU swimmer at SECs in the 200 free. Newcomers Lauren Simons and Angela Jurma enter the program as distance freestyle participants at their previous levels.

Mallory Neltner returns in backstroke events. Neltner, a native of Fort Thomas, Ky., earned the fastest time of the season in the 200 back last year and was second to Lindsay Staak in the 100 back. Both times were in finishes at the SEC Championships. With a time of 2:02.83 in the 200 back, Neltner moved into the school's all-time top 10. It's a spot, she looks to progress on in 2005-06

Despite losing Staak, a talented recruiting class in backstroke events led by Monica McJunkin and Berit Aljand could fill the void. McJunkin was one of the top high school swimmers in North Carolina, while Aljand gathered experience on the international level in Estonia. Returning standout Stefanie Carver posted the second and third-best times of the season in the 200 and 100 back, respectively. Carver's versatility could be used in other events as well.

Breaststroke

LSU looks to fill another void in breast-stroke this season, following a brilliant career by Lauren Harvey. Harvey left her mark in the breaststroke as a holder of two all-time top 5 times in the events. Closely behind Harvey was freshman Michelle Hanson. Hanson, now a sophomore, had the second-best clockings of the season in the 100 and 200 breast-stroke. She took in her first SEC Championship appearance as the second-highest scorer for the Lady Tigers in both events. Hanson's times continue on the verge of cracking the school's all-time top 10.

One of the most coveted prospects of Schmitt's first recruiting class was the top breaststroker in the state of Louisiana. Baton Rouge native Sarah Bedell was a four-time Class 2A state breaststroke champion at Episcopal High School. Bedell currently owns the state record in the 100 breaststroke with a time of 1:06.12. Upperclassmen Jeannine Malbrough and Rachel Taylor will also add depth.

Butterfly



Heather Brand

Consider the butterfly one of the strength's of the 2005-06 squad. Not only does Heather Brand shine in freestyle, it is here where the team cocaptain swam at the NCAA and World Championships. Brand placed 29th in the 100 fly prelims at NCAAs and has one more shot at reaching a higher place as a senior. The time of 54.54 in the 100 fly went down as the third-fastest mark in school history.

Teammate Colleen Bertirotti will be used in butterfly events again, but what should be intriguing is the progress of freshman Katherine Noland. Noland, a native of Deerfield Beach, Fla., could be the top first-year swimmer in 2005-06. She was the Florida state high school champion in the 100 fly as a senior. Recognized around the state, Noland was named to the Miami Herald's First Team All-State. Perhaps even more valuable was that Noland was a member of three state championship teams and knows what it takes to be competitive. Seniors Jenna Molinski and Hannah Martin provide quality senior leadership into the butterfly this season.

Individual Medley

Jenna Molinski returns in the 400 IM. Molinski, a team co-captain this season, was the best scorer on the team in the 400 IM at the SEC Championships with a 19th-place finish in the prelims. LSU also returns Stefanie Carver, Jeannine Malbrough and Michelle Hanson in the IM. Noland and Aljand are two freshmen who will see immediate action in IM events.

Diving

Doug Shaffer and the Lady Tigers return an outstanding squad in 2005-06. Shaffer developed Hali Saucier and Paige Brown in the summer and both reached the U.S. Diving National Championships. He also added two talented freshmen, one from the state of Texas and one from California.

Jessica Wantz wrapped up her career last spring at the NCAA Championships. She leaves a legacy behind that saw three All-America honors and two SEC Diver of the Week awards. At one point last season, Wantz won 12 consecutive events. Wantz will continue to help the squad as a volunteer assistant.

During her reign, Wantz and Saucier became a solid tandem for the LSU team. Saucier now takes over as the top diver but it's a position the junior is comfortable with. Even with Wantz on the roster, Saucier was the Lady Tigers' best scorer at the 2005 SEC Championships. In the summer, Saucier earned a runner-up finish in the 1-meter at the U.S. Zone C Midwest Championships. More impressively might have been the fact that she and Brown qualified for the platform at the U.S. National Championships in an event where the two had only been training for a little over a year.

"It's a tribute to the hard work that they have brought to the program," said Shaffer. "They have developed tremendously. When I came to LSU three years ago it was turnover period. Now, they are the first divers in at least the past three seasons to qualify for nationals."

Now both have higher aspirations of reaching the NCAA Championships with a solid performance at Zones. Joining the mix will be freshmen Ryanne Snyder and Alyson Thomas. Both were Junior National qualifiers during their high school careers and enter LSU with promising futures.


