“WE ARE EXPERIENCED”

—Greg Jones,
Head Coach



LSU head coach **Greg Jones** will lead an experienced group of Tigers into the 2004-05

season. The squad returns seven letterwinners and consists of five seniors, one junior, four sophomores and five freshmen. Five seniors is the most that Jones has had on any team since becoming head coach at LSU, and he is counting on their leadership to guide the Tigers throughout the season.

“I think the role for the seniors this year is to simply get it done,” said Jones. “They need to get it done everyday, not just in tournaments, but also in practice and qualifiers. It is also crucial that they lead by example. I think the thing that the seniors have, based on what happened at the end of last year with missing the NCAA Championships by one shot, is that they have maturity, focus and are very hungry.”

Leading the seniors is **Heath West**. The Dothan, Ala., native is entering his fourth season at LSU and is the most experienced member of the squad. West played in all 12 tournaments for the Tigers last season, and his team-best 72.8 stroke average, seven top-20 finishes and four top-10 finishes was enough to earn him Second-Team All-SEC honors for the second time in his career. He will serve as one of two Tiger co-captains this season.

Along with West, senior **Jeff Riemann** will serve as co-captain for the Tigers this season. Like West, Riemann participated in 12 tournaments for LSU in 2003-04, finishing the season with a 74.1 stroke average.

“Of the older guys on the squad, we're looking for those

two guys to provide a lot of leadership on and off the course, especially with their work ethic

and building a relationship with the newcomers to show them how we do things here at LSU. They have shown me that they are willing and able to do that,” said Jones.

Senior **Andrew Lanahan** will be unavailable for the fall schedule after undergoing off-season shoulder surgery, but the Jacksonville, Fla., native will rejoin the squad in the spring. The junior college transfer was a pleasant surprise for the Tigers a season ago as he played in 11 tournaments, finishing the season with a 73.5 stroke average and four top-20 finishes. For his efforts, he was named Louisiana Newcomer of the Year by the Louisiana Sports-Writers Association.

Jones will be counting on several freshmen and sophomores to provide the Tigers with quality depth for the upcoming season. **Garrett Runion** is one sophomore who Jones believes has significantly improved his game over the summer. Runion participated in five tournaments last season for the Tigers as a true freshman, finishing the season with a 75.6 stroke average.

“Garrett Runion, who saw a lot of time as a freshman, has really improved over the summer and climbed the ladder to another level,” said Jones. “I think that's very beneficial because he looks like the future leader of this team. Having gotten that freshman experience last year, Garrett has grown up a little bit and been able to focus more. That's just maturity.”

Chris Wells is a sophomore transfer who comes to LSU

from the University of the Pacific, where he recorded a 73.4 stroke average in eight tournaments for the Tigers as a freshman.

"Chris Wells transferred to us from Pacific," said Jones. "He is a player who we recruited heavily out of high school, and he brings considerable tournament experience to our team."

Brian Noonan is another sophomore transfer who followed LSU assistant coach **Mark McEntire** from St. Edward's University in Austin, Texas, to LSU this season. He earned Heartland Conference Freshman of the Year and Division II All-American honors after participating in 10 tournaments and recording a 73.3 stroke average for St. Edward's.

"Brian Noonan, who is very intense and played Division II golf, he's got experience," said Jones. "He played in 10 tournaments last year, and he brings a lot of experience to our younger class, which most schools typically don't have."

"We've got Runion, Wells and Noonan who are sophomores that are very sound players that also have experience, which is hard to find," said Jones. "The reason that is hard to find is because we can only play five players at any tournament. That makes it hard to get your freshmen a lot of experience."

Jones signed four highly decorated high school players and expects them to be able to contribute immediately. **Jake Creel**, a Dothan, Ala., native, recorded two top-10 finishes in American Junior Golf Association tournaments last year and was voted to the all-state team as a senior at Northview High School. Shreveport, La., native **Jared Mayfield** won the 2002 LGA Junior Amateur Championship and guided Captain Shreve High School to the 2003 Class 5A state championship.

Brent Struthers is a Baton Rouge native and a product of University High School. He led his team to the 2002 Class 2A state championship and won medalist honors at the state tournament as a junior and senior. Struthers was named Class 2A Player of the Year three times and was named to the all-state team four times.

Beck Troutman, a native of Fernwood, Miss., and one of the top 30 junior players in the nation, led Parklane Academy to the 2001 Class 4A state championship. He is a former Southern Junior Amateur champion and runner-up at the Mississippi State Amateur. Troutman was named an American Junior Golf Association All-American in 2003 and earned Southern Golf Association Amateur Player of the Month honors in June 2003.

"This is a strong freshman class, but they are going to need some coaching," said Jones. "It is a good group that will provide depth for us for the future and will go along nicely with last year's class."

Senior **Brandon Aydlett** participated in six tournaments last season, finishing the year with a 74.6 stroke average and one top-10 finish. Senior **Jake Shaw** saw action in three tournaments, recording a 76.6 stroke average. Junior **Aaron Smith** appeared in two tournaments for the Tigers and finished with a

78.4 stroke average. Sophomore **Jeremiah Shields** and freshman **Chad Bailey** redshirted last season.

"We have depth, talent at the top, and we are going to have serious competition throughout the year," said Jones. "I think as they look around the country and around the conference, they realize that there's not anybody here much better than us. I am really looking forward to this season."

The Tigers will open the season Sept. 11-12 with the Bank of Tennessee Intercollegiate at the Ridges Golf and Country Club in Johnson City, Tenn. LSU will stay in the state of Tennessee for their next tournament, the Mason Rudolph Intercollegiate, Sept. 27-28 in Nashville. The team finished in a tie for seventh place at the Mason Rudolph last season.

LSU will begin the month of October by participating in the Windon Memorial Classic in Lake Forest, Ill., Oct. 6-7. The Tigers will then travel to Tampa, Fla., to compete in the prestigious Gary Koch/Cleveland Golf Intercollegiate at Old Memorial Golf Club for the fifth year in a row after finishing in seventh place a season ago. The team will end the fall schedule by hosting its first tournament of the year, the University Club Intercollegiate Oct. 25-26 at the University Club in Baton Rouge.

The spring season begins with a trip to the Gator Invitational Feb. 5-6 in Gainesville, Fla., where the Tigers finished in ninth place a season ago. The Tigers will return to the state of Florida two weeks later to compete in the Mercedes-Benz Collegiate Championship at Sawgrass Country Club in Ponte Vedra, Feb. 20-22. LSU finished in seventh at the Mercedes last season.

LSU's next destination will be Statesboro, Ga., where the Tigers will compete in the Schenkel/E-Z-Go Invitational at Forest Heights Country Club March 19-20. The Tigers will travel to the state of South Carolina to compete in their next tournament, the inaugural Hootie at Bull's Bay Intercollegiate, March 27-29 in Awandaw, S.C. LSU will return to the University Club April 1-3 to host the fifth-annual LSU Spring Invitational and attempt to defend their team title from last season. The Tigers have won the team title in each of the tournament's first four seasons.

The 2005 Southeastern Conference Championships will be held from April 15-17 in Sea Island, Ga. LSU will look to improve on its eighth-place finish last season, and will attempt to make an NCAA Regional appearance for the fourth time in the Greg Jones era.

"My expectations of this team are to advance to the NCAA Championships and to make a run at the top 15 or top 10," said Jones. "In our sport, if you can get to the national championship, anything can happen. For instance, last year No. 21 California won the national championship. So, if we could get there, anything could happen."

GREG JONES

HEAD COACH SIXTH SEASON

Greg Jones enters his sixth season as head coach of the LSU men's golf team in 2004 and his 12th season as a head coach at the collegiate level. He continues in his quest to transform LSU into a championship program.

"I want to be in a position to compete for championships every year," said Jones. "Our program is definitely on solid ground with staff, facilities, schedule, players and support. We must now find tune here and there so that we may climb the national ranks."

Prior to his stint at LSU, Jones coached his alma mater, the University of South Alabama, for six seasons beginning in 1993. As coach at USA, Jones guided the Jaguars to five Sun Belt Conference Championships and five NCAA East Regional appearances, establishing himself as one of the premier young coaches in college golf. For his efforts, Jones was named Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year four times.

Jones' success can be traced directly to his simple coaching philosophy. "Preparation is everything in our philosophy," said Jones. "We must prepare our players in practice to go on the road. Anyone can play their home course, but we must be prepared to play any course, any shot and any pressure situation we may face on the road."

Jones also tries to make the game of golf as simple and understandable for his players as possible. The process of simplification enables his players to focus on what is important at all times. He tries to simplify each player's swing so they can understand what their swing produces and what type of game they have.

"Golf can be overwhelmingly complicated from the technical, mental and equipment areas of the game," said Jones. "No one knows how difficult this game is more than me. It takes guts to play golf, sign a scorecard and have it posted for the world to see. It's my job to keep the swing simple for each player and also to keep the mind clear and focused."

Jones believes that each player must be also committed to do whatever it takes to establish themselves among golf's elite.



"The commitment must be there as a group and as individuals at all times in order to reach new levels of achievement," said Jones. "Our players must be committed to being the best team they can possibly be. This is a once in a lifetime opportunity to build a resume for the future. Our players must stay committed for excellence as a student, an athlete and as a citizen."

Jones is a great motivator and also has a unique way to relate to his players. His positive attitude and friendly demeanor are two reasons for the close relationships he develops with his players. The main reason may be that he was a player on the collegiate and professional levels himself.

Jones played at South Alabama for two seasons and was named an All-American in 1986. There, he posted eight victories and made two NCAA Championship appearances. He also participated in the U.S. Amateur three times and the U.S. Mid-Amateur once.

After finishing his collegiate career in 1987, Jones played professionally for five years on the Emerald Coast, Space Coast, TC Jordan, and Nike tours.

Jones wants to continue to build on the tradition and success of the LSU program each year, and if history is any indication, a rise to elite status is reachable. The program has won 15 Southeastern Conference titles in its history, as well as four national championships. The school has also produced many successful professional golfers, such as Emlyn Aubrey, Bob Friend,

The Tigers have enjoyed much success under Jones' direction, winning nine tournament titles and competing in three NCAA Regional tournaments. In his third season in Baton Rouge, Jones led the Tigers to victory at the prestigious Gator Invitational for the first time since 1988. LSU has also won the annual LSU Spring Invitational in four-consecutive seasons. His success is evident of the fact that he has been named Louisiana Coach of the Year three times by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association.

Under his tutelage, five Tigers have earned All-SEC honors, and Alan Morgan and John Humphries earned Honorable Mention All-America honors in 2001 and 2003 respectively. Four Tigers have gone on to have careers on different professional tours.

Jones was born on April 13, 1965 in Mobile, Ala., and graduated from South Alabama with a bachelor of science degree in business administration in 1993.
