



Head coach Chuck Winstead begins his second season at the helm of the LSU men's golf program with a relatively young group of Tigers that will compete against a tough schedule in the 2006-07 season.

The squad returns six letterwinners from a year ago led by one senior, a class of four juniors, a single sophomore and four freshmen. Winstead is counting on the leadership of the team's lone senior – All-SEC performer Chris Wells – to guide the Tigers to the top of the Southeastern Conference this season.

Wells has been a steady performer for the Tigers since he first teed it up as a sophomore in 2004-05 when he was named a second-team All-SEC selection. The Mobile, Ala., native has earned seven career top-10 finishes and finished second on the team with a 73.7 stroke average in 11 tournament appearances in 2005-06. Wells also has experience at the highest level of amateur golf as he was a participant in the 2005 United States Amateur Championship.

LSU's junior class is led by a pair of 2006 U.S. Amateur participants in standouts Brian Noonan and Beck Troutman. Noonan enjoyed a successful sophomore season after transferring to LSU from St. Edward's University in his hometown of Austin, Texas. He competed in nine tournaments highlighted by his first appearance in the SEC Championships when he shot a team-low 68 in the second round. He carried that momentum into a successful summer in which he qualified for the U.S. Amateur by finishing third in the qualifier at The Player Course at The Woodlands Country Club near his hometown.

Troutman enjoyed similar success in his sophomore season as he led the Tigers with three top-five finishes on the year while competing in all 11 tournaments, finishing the season with a 73.8 stroke average in 33 competitive rounds. He looks forward to a stellar junior season as he also found success during the summer by qualifying for the U.S. Amateur and advancing to match play after finishing in fifth place in the stroke play competition out of more than 300 participants.

Winstead also looks for contributions from another pair of experienced juniors in returning letterwinners Garrett Runion and Brent Struthers. Runion received a redshirt last season after competing in a total of 15 tournaments in his first two seasons with the program and looks get off to a fast start in his junior year. Struthers has appeared in 14 career tournaments for the Tigers and has earned valuable postseason experience while making two SEC Championship appearances and cracking the lineup at the NCAA

West Regional in 2005.

Sophomore Jarrod Barsamian leads a group of talented underclassmen after making an appearance in five tournaments as a true freshman a year ago, including four tournaments during the fall season. With the addition of true freshmen Brent Blaum, Thomas Galloway and Bryant Lach, as well as the return of redshirt freshman Brian Leveille, Winstead has built a solid foundation for the future success of the program.

Lach comes to Baton Rouge as one of the top juniors in the class of 2006 as he was ranked among the top 50 juniors in the country according to Golfweek/Titleist during the summer and was named a Rolex Junior All-American in 2005. Blaum earned recognition as one of the top junior golfers in the Southeast after competing in the U.S. Amateur in 2004, while Galloway was widely considered the top high school senior in Louisiana throughout his spring season at St. Paul's High School in Covington.

Winstead and the Tigers look forward to competing against an outstanding schedule this season that features some of the strongest fields in college golf at some of the nation's premier courses. They begin the 2006-07 campaign with a brief fall season highlighted by three prestigious tournaments led by the second-annual Shoal Creek Intercollegiate from Sept. 25-26. The Tigers look to defend their title from a year ago in which they earned their first tournament victory of the Chuck Winstead era.

They follow with an appearance in one of the nation's elite tournaments in the Jerry Pate Intercollegiate hosted by Alabama at Old Overton Club in Birmingham from Oct. 9-10, which features one of the strongest fields in all of college golf. LSU closes its spring season in the inaugural Oklahoma Intercollegiate hosted by the Oklahoma Sooners at historic Oak Tree Golf Club in Edmond, Okla., which has been the site of past NCAA Championships.

The spring season begins with a familiar trip to Gainesville, Fla., as the Tigers will compete in the Gator Invitational at the University of Florida Golf Course from Feb. 10-11. The Tigers earned a fifth-place finish in the event last year after capturing the team title in 2002. They close the month of February the following week with a trip to

famous Sawgrass Country Club in Ponte Vedra Beach, Fla., to compete in the prestigious North Florida Collegiate Championship, which was previously known as the Mercedes-Benz Collegiate Championship.

The Tigers look forward to three tournament appearances in the month of March in preparation for the SEC Championships in April, led by their return to the Seminole Intercollegiate hosted by Florida State at Golden Eagle Country Club in Tallahassee, March 4-6. They break for two weeks before returning to the Schenkel/E-Z-Go Invitational in Statesboro, Ga., from March 17-18, followed by an appearance in the third-annual Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate from March 25-27 at Bulls Bay Golf Club in Awendaw, S.C.

The SEC Championships will be held from April 20-22 at Sea Island Golf Club in St. Simons Island, Ga., where it has been for the last six years. LSU looks to improve upon its sixth-place finish from a year ago and make a return to the NCAA Regionals for the first time since 2005. The Tigers will prepare for a potential regional bid by competing in the prestigious Linger Longer Invitational hosted by Mercer University at Reynolds Plantation in Greensboro, Ga., from May 13-14.

The NCAA Regionals are scheduled to begin May 17 with the East Regional being hosted by Georgia Tech at The Golf Club of Georgia in Alpharetta, Ga., while the Central Regional will be hosted by Northern Illinois at Rich Harvest Farms in Sugar Grove, Ill., and the West Regional is set to be hosted by Arizona State at ASU Karsten Golf Course in Tempe. The top 10-teams from each region will advance to compete in the 2006 NCAA Championships hosted by Golden Horseshoe Golf Club in Williamsburg, Va., beginning May 30.

HEAD COACH • SECOND SEASON

Chuck Winstead enters his second season as the head coach of the LSU men's golf program after leading the Tigers to their highest finish at the Southeastern Conference Championships since 2002 during his inaugural campaign in 2005-06.

Winstead, who played at LSU from 1989-91 and is a native of Ruston, La., said it is a privilege to coach his alma mater and plans to return the program he loves to the top of the SEC and the nation during his tenure.

"This is truly a dream come true for me," Winstead said. "As most people know, my passion for LSU and my passion for the game of golf have collided. LSU is a very special place to me and to the many others who have had the good fortune to play here. I take this responsibility very seriously, and I will do my best to help this program return to the success it has enjoyed in the past."

LSU is a program that owns four national championships and ranks second in the SEC with 15 conference titles, and Winstead hopes to turn the Tigers into perennial contenders at both the SEC and NCAA Championships. He knows that will not be an easy task, but he believes that LSU has the potential and the resources to become one of the elite programs in the nation.

"I want to create the best environment for our student-athletes to achieve their individual goals," Winstead said. "The players that come through here will aspire to play on the PGA Tour, and I want to create an environment that will allow them to reach that goal. They certainly have the facilities and resources here at LSU to make that next step in their careers."



The foundation of any successful program is built on recruiting the best high school athletes the sport has to offer. He believes that through the vast network of contacts he has built in the last 14 years of teaching the game, he will be able to attract the top players in the nation to continue their education on and off the course in Baton Rouge.

"We'll recruit players through the network of our past players, our LSU supporters and through my personal network built in the field of teaching the game over the past 14 years," Winstead said. "We certainly want to attract the best players we can to take this program where it should be among the nation's elite."

Widely considered one of the top teaching professionals in the country, Winstead was named by Golf Magazine as a Top 100 Teacher for 2005-06. Golf Magazine's Top 100 also includes the likes of Butch Harmon, Peter Kostis, Jim Flick and former LSU standout and recent LSU Hall of Fame inductee Eddie Merrins. Winstead was also named Louisiana's Top Teacher by Golf Digest.

In addition, Winstead has been featured on The Golf Channel and appears frequently in such publications as Golf Magazine and Golf Tips Magazine, in which he serves as Senior Instruction Editor.

Winstead's credentials include a five-year stint as part of Jack Nicklaus' Golden Bear Golf Centers in North Palm Beach, Fla., where he served as Director of Instruction for Golden Bear Golf. Winstead also served as part of the senior management team responsible for developing, managing and initiating the start-up of Jack Nicklaus Golf Academies throughout the world.

"In addition to having played here, spending the last 14 plus years helping players at each level of golf try to get the most out of their game, whether it be high school, college or touring professionals, is great experience to draw upon to help these players reach their goals," Winstead said. "I've been around not only some of the best teachers in the game, but I have also been around the best player the game has ever seen in Jack Nicklaus."

Prior to moving to the University Club in 2000 where he served as Director of Instruction and owner of the Chuck Winstead Golf Academy for five years, Winstead served as Director of Instruction at English Turn Golf and Country Club in New Orleans. He also served as the head instructor for the Bob Toski Golf Learning Center in Sunrise, Fla., from 1993-95.

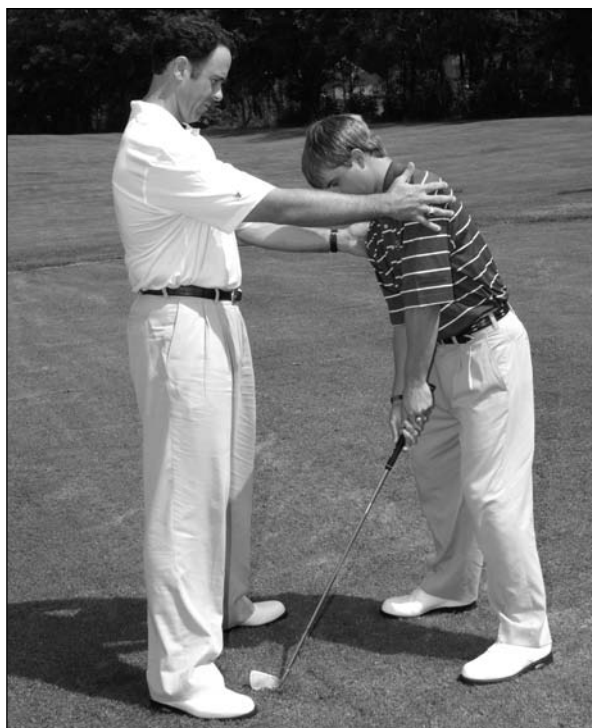

The Tigers captured the first team title of the Chuck Winstead era at the inaugural Shoal Creek Intercollegiate.

Newly appointed head coach Chuck Winstead took the reigns of the LSU men's golf program prior to the start of the 2005-06 season and built a solid foundation for the team's future success in his inaugural campaign. A pair of seniors and seven letterwinners returned to lead a young squad of two juniors, four sophomores and three true freshmen through the rigors of the always difficult Southeastern Conference.

The Tigers finished the season with one tournament victory against a strong field at the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate in September and earned their best finish at the SEC Championships since 2002 at sixth place, posting their best 54-hole score in the tournament's six years at the Seaside Course at Sea Island Golf Club with a 28-over 868.

Returning for the LSU squad was senior standout Andrew Lanahan, who was forced to sit out the entire 2004-05 season after undergoing surgery to repair a torn rotator cuff in his shoulder. The Jacksonville, Fla., native responded by appearing in nine of the team's 11 tournaments and leading the Tigers with a 73.4 stroke average, while posting one top-10 and a team-high six top-20 finishes. Lanahan was LSU's low individual at the SEC Championships as he finished in a tie for 11th.

The Tigers were also led by the stellar play of sophomore Beck Troutman, who competed in all 11 tournaments and finished the season with a 73.8 stroke average in 33

rounds, including a team-high 11 rounds at par or better. Troutman led the squad with three top-five finishes as he tied for fourth place in three tournaments, including the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate, the Gary Koch Invitational and the Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate, and equaled the best 54-hole score of his career in both the Shoal Creek and Gary Koch with a 5-under 211.

LSU opened the season on Sept. 12 as it teed it up in the Coca-Cola Tournament of Champions hosted by Tennessee at Holston Hills Country Club in Knoxville. Sophomore Brent Struthers earned the best finish of his LSU career and what would be his best finish of the season by tying for 12th at 1-under 212, a three-round total that included a 5-under 66 in the final round. The Tigers finished seventh in the 14-team field.

The team built upon its solid play in the season opener by winning the first tournament of the Chuck Winstead era on Sept. 27 at the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate at the picturesque Shoal Creek Country Club in Birmingham, Ala. The Tigers finished a single shot ahead of Tennessee in the team standings at 1-under 863 and earned victories over five teams ranked in the Golfweek Top 25. Troutman fired rounds of 69, 72 and 70 for a 54-hole total of 5-under 211, earning his first top-five finish of the season. Junior All-SEC performer Chris Wells also finished in the top 10 as he tied for eighth place at 2-under 214 for the seventh top-10 finish of his career.

The Tigers carried their momentum into the prestigious Gary Koch/Cleveland Golf Invitational hosted by the Florida Gators at Old Memorial Golf Club in Tampa by earning a tie for fourth place in the difficult 12-team field. They posted a team total of 3-over 867 for the event, and Troutman earned his second straight top-five finish by also tying for fourth place. Lanahan made his return to the lineup by posting a tie for 20th in his first action of the season.

LSU concluded its fall season with two tournaments at the end of October in the Bank of Tennessee Intercollegiate from Oct. 15-16 and the Tunica National Intercollegiate from Oct. 31-Nov. 1. The Tigers posted a 15th-place finish in the Bank of Tennessee Intercollegiate as Struthers, Troutman and Wells each carded 54-hole totals of 8-over 224. The team came back to finish in 11th place at the Tunica National Intercollegiate. LSU was originally scheduled to play host to the tournament as the second-annual University Club Intercollegiate in Baton Rouge, but it moved to Tunica, Miss., due to the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina.

After breaking for three months, the Tigers returned to the state of Florida on Feb. 5 to begin their spring season in the Mercedes-Benz Collegiate Championship at famous Sawgrass Country Club in Ponte Vedra Beach. Three Tigers earned top-20 finishes in the event led by Troutman, who tied for 11th, with Lanahan and Wells each tying for 19th place. LSU earned a sixth-place finish in the overall standings out of 15 teams at 49-over 913.

The Tigers made their annual trip to Gainesville, Fla., two weeks later to compete in the annual SunTrust Gator Invitational hosted by Florida at the University of Florida Golf Course. Lanahan paced the Tigers to a fifth-place finish in the 16-team field by earning the best finish of his LSU career by tying for sixth place in the individual standings at 5-over 215. Lanahan's previous best was a ninth-place showing at the Baylor Invitational during the fall season of 2003. The Tigers posted a 54-hole total of 41-over 881 at the par-70 course.

LSU competed in two tournaments during the month

of March led off by an appearance in the always competitive Schenkel/E-Z-Go Invitational held at Forest Heights Country Club in Statesboro, Ga., from March 18-19. Lanahan was the lone Tiger to finish the event in the top 20 as he tied for 19th, and the Tigers earned a 12th place finish in the 15-team field. They followed a week later with an appearance in the second-annual Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate at Bulls Bay Golf Club in Awendaw, S.C., earning a sixth-place finish with a 54-hole total of 22-over 874. Troutman tied for fourth in the individual standings for the third time by firing a three-round score of even-par 213.

The Tigers' made their first ever appearance in the Administaf Augusta State Invitational on April 1 and used the event as a tune-up for their annual appearance in the SEC Championships. The tournament was held at Champions Retreat Golf Club in Evans, Ga., with the Tigers finishing in 15th place before their three-week break.

They concluded the 2005-06 season on April 23 at the 2006 SEC Championships at the picturesque Seaside Course at Sea Island Golf Club in St. Simons Island, Ga., where the event has resided for the past six years. The Tigers earned their best finish in the event since 2002 as they finished in sixth place with a 28-over 868 in perhaps the most competitive conference tournament in college golf. Lanahan finished in a tie for 11th place in the individual competition at 2-over 212, including a 1-under 69 in the first round and an even-par 70 in the second round. Sophomore Brian Noonan fired the team's lowest round of the tournament and his lowest round of the season with a 2-under 68 in the second round.

The Tigers were able to accomplish many things in the first year of the Chuck Winstead era. Not only did they capture one tournament title against one of the strongest fields they faced all season, but also made their best showing in the SEC Championships in four years. LSU excelled off the course as well as seven Tigers were named to the 2006 SEC Academic Honor Roll and junior Garrett Runion was named a member of the SEC Good Works Team for the second straight year.

SEC GOLFERS ARE LEADERS ON THE LINKS

Throughout the illustrious history of the Southeastern Conference the league has provided a strong tradition of excellence on the links with its men's golf programs, and the 2005-06 season was no different.

Florida was the runner-up at the 2006 NCAA Championships and was joined among the top six teams in the event by fifth-place Kentucky and sixth-place Georgia. A trio of golfers also finished among the top 10 players in the event led by Chris Kirk of Georgia, who finished in a tie for second place in the individual standings.

The conference has captured 10 NCAA team titles in its history with four belonging to both LSU and Florida, while Georgia has added a pair of its own. Thirty-seven SEC teams have finished in the top 10 in the NCAA Championships since 1985.

Individually, the SEC has witnessed six national champions with Florida's Nick Gilliam winning the latest title in 2001. In addition, 36 individuals have finished among the top 10 in the NCAA Championships since 1985.

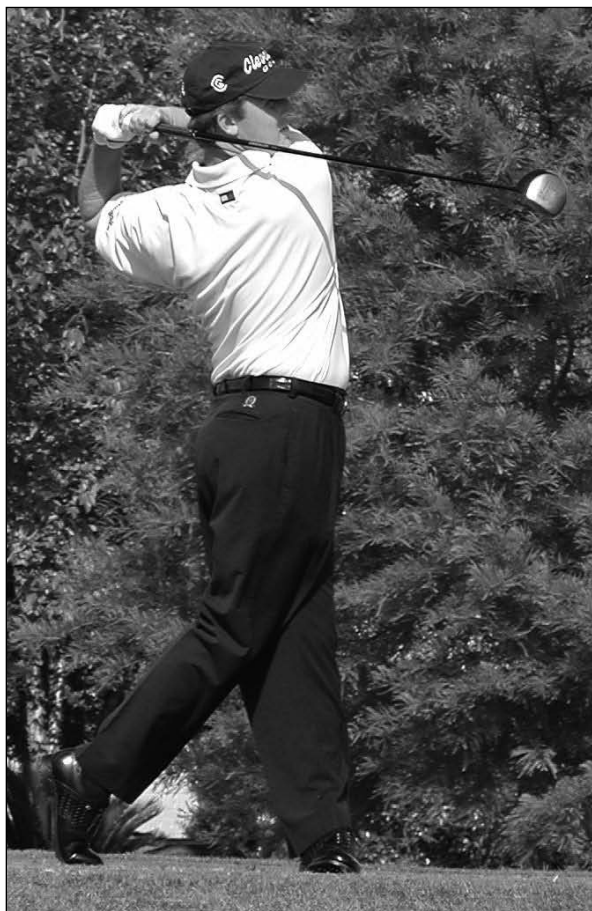

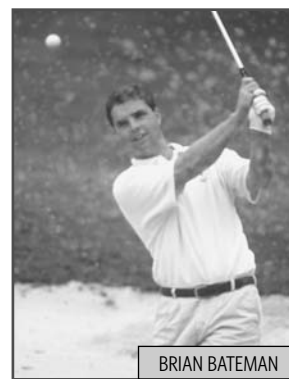

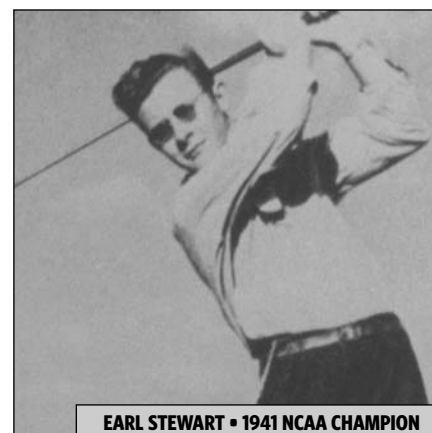

Already a Louisiana Legend and one of the greatest college baseball coaches of all time, J. Stanley "Skip" Bertman has made the seamless transition into the athletics director's chair with the same enthusiasm, vision and demand for excellence that were trademarks of his stellar coaching career.

In just four years as LSU's director of athletics, Bertman has already added to his impressive list of on-the-field achievements. Under his direction, LSU enjoyed arguably the greatest athletics years in the history of the institution. In 2003-04 three teams won national championships, nine teams finished in the nation's top ten, and fourteen teams ranked in the top 25 and in 2004-05 14 teams advanced to the post-season. LSU teams also enjoyed improved grade point averages across the board, making the LSU student-athlete experience a success on and off the fields of competition.

While supervising the Tigers' progress on the playing fields, he has begun to implement measures necessary to realize his vision of building the LSU athletics department into the best in the country. Bertman's bold and innovative plans promise to keep the Tigers among the nation's elite in all phases of collegiate athletics.

Bertman is now in the midst of upgrading LSU's athletics complex. Working hand in hand with the Tiger Athletic Foundation, Bertman has already overseen the completion of the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes while renovating Tiger Stadium and the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, and constructing the Football Operations Center.

It was also Bertman who took the bold but essential move to implement a seat contribution program in Tiger Stadium to fund facility improvements and ensure the financial stability of the LSU Athletics Department for the next decade.

Bertman was named LSU's athletics director on January 19, 2001. With Bertman, LSU gained an athletics director who provides the leadership and experience necessary to manage the Tigers' \$52 million budget.

Bertman guided LSU to five NCAA baseball titles, and his teams drew huge crowds to venerable Alex Box Stadium, as the Tigers led the nation in attendance in each of his final six seasons (1996-2001).

He also served as head coach of the 1996 U.S. Olympic team which captured the bronze medal in Atlanta.

Bertman continues to be honored for his remarkable coaching tenure, as he was inducted in June, 2002, into the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame. He was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in January, 2003.

In a Baseball America poll published in 1999, Bertman was voted the second greatest college baseball coach of the 20th century, trailing only Rod Dedeaux of Southern California. Bertman and Dedeaux are the only coaches to win five CWS titles.

He had previously earned recognition as one of the nation's brightest assistant coaches while at the University of Miami (Fla.) for eight seasons (1976-83). Before working at Miami, Bertman was renowned for his coaching excellence. In 11 seasons at Miami Beach High School, he directed the Hi-Tides to a state championship and two runners-up finishes and he was named Florida's Coach of the Year on three occasions.

In 1975, Bertman coached at Miami-Dade Downtown, leaving after one season to join legendary head coach Ron Fraser at Miami. The move was a homecoming of sorts, as Bertman spent his collegiate playing days with the Hurricanes as an outfielder and catcher from 1958-60. He earned his B.A. in health and physical education from Miami in 1961 and received his master's degree from UM in 1964.

Bertman and his wife Sandy are the parents of four daughters -- Jan, Jodi, Lisa and Lori. The Bertman's have three grandchildren -- Sophie Faith and Isaac Stanley, the children of Emile and Lori Bertman Guirard, and Samuel Aaron, the son of Drew and Lisa Pate.
