Michael Bonnette enters his fifth year as LSU's Sports Information Director and first as an assistant athletic director after being promoted to his current position in July. Bonnette was originally elevated to Sports Information Director in August of 2000. As Sports Information Director, Bonnette serves as the chief contact for LSU's national champion football team as well as overseeing all publicity activities for the 20 sports sponsored by the Athletic Department.

The 34-year-old Bonnette, who served as an Associate Sports Information Director for seven years, is in his 10th year with the LSU Athletic Department. Prior to taking over as Sports Information Director, Bonnette was the top assistant for football publicity as well as handling all media relations efforts for LSU's nationally-ranked women's basketball team. He also served as the editor of LSU's award winning gameday football program.

Bonnette joined the LSU SID staff as an intern in 1993 after serving as a student assistant within the department for four years.

The Lake Charles, La., native has been around the sports media relations profession his entire life as he is the son of longtime McNeese State Sports Information Director Louis Bonnette. His brother Matthew Bonnette is the Assistant Sports Information Director at Northwestern State University in Natchitoches.

Bonnette, who is a 1993 graduate of LSU, serves as vice president for SIDs of the Louisiana Sports Writer's Association. He is married to the former Robin Arnaud of Opelousas, La., and the couple has two sons, Peyton (7) and Grant (5).

Kent Lowe was appointed senior associate SID in August, 2000, after serving as associate SID for nine years. He serves as the primary media contact for the LSU men's basketball team and women's golf team. Lowe also coordinates the annual Louisiana

His voice is also well known as the color analyst on home women's basketball and softball broadcasts on the LSU Sports Network.

Lowe, 46, came to LSU in 1988 from Louisiana Downs where he served as publicity director for the Bossier City, La., racetrack. Lowe was promoted to associate SID in July of 1991 after serving as assistant SID since August of 1988.

Bill Franques, who served as the LSU baseball administrative assistant for three seasons, returned to the Sports Information office in August of 2000. Franques had previously served as Associate SID for nine years.

Franques' responsibilities as administrative assistant included handling the Tigers' media and public relations, coordinating team and recruiting travel, organizing fund-raising events and booster club meetings, and overseeing office operations.

As associate SID, Franques continues to work as the baseball program's media relations director. He also serves as the Alex Box Stadium public address announcer, and he is the radio color analyst on LSU Sports Network broadcasts of baseball road games. In addition, Franques is the producer and co-host of LSU Sports Journal, a monthly television program featuring LSU sports personalities.

The LSU baseball media guide, edited by Franques, has twice been named best in the nation by the College Sports Information Directors of America and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association. His baseball brochures have finished among the top six in the USA in 10 of the past 12 seasons, including a No. 2 ranking in 2004.

Franques received a bachelor of arts degree from LSU in 1985. The Lafayette, La., native is married to the former Yvette Lemoine of Bunkie, La., and they have three children, William Paul, Jr., born September 23, 2000; Benjamin Lewis, born April 18, 2002; and Madeline Lemoine, born November 20, 2004.

Miller, 31, is the secondary contact for football and the primary contact for LSU's nationally-ranked women's basketball team.

He will also assist in the publicity of all other LSU sports. His 2002-03 LSU women's basketball media guide was named "Best in the Nation" by CoSIDA out of 112 Division I entries.

A native of Hamilton, N.Y., Miller spent three years handling soccer and women's basketball at Auburn and worked with the track and field and women's tennis programs on the Plains. Miller graduated from Northeastern University in Boston, in 1996 with a degree in broadcast journalism and began his career in sports information at NU as a student assistant in charge of the publicity of the Huskies' baseball program.

Miller spent one year at Florida Atlantic University as an assistant SID after graduation before spending three years at Louisiana Tech University, two as an assistant (1996-98) and one as the director (1999). At Louisiana Tech, Miller primarily handled the publicity for football and women's basketball. In addition, the LSU Baseball Media Guide finished third in the nation and was awarded best cover. This past year the LSU Baseball media guide was second in the nation, the softball guide finished third in the nation, and the women's golf guide placed first in district.

Prior to being named the full-time director in August of 2000, Feirman served as publications student assistant for two years in the sports information office. He served as assistant sports editor of *The Reveille* in fall of 1998 and as a sports reporter for Tiger Television in spring of 1998. He was a stringer for The Associated Press from 1996 to 2000 covering LSU, and he held a sports internship at WGNO-TV, ABC affiliate in New Orleans.

Kevin Wagner, LSU's Assistant Athletic Director for Television, is the executive producer/director for LSU's four major coaches' television shows featuring football coach Nick Saban, men's basketball coach John Brady, women's basketball coach Pokey Chatman and baseball coach Smoke Laval.

He oversees all television projects associated with the LSU Athletics Department, including the coordination of LSU's video scoreboards in Tiger Stadium and the Pete Maravich Assembly Center.

Wagner, 48, was promoted to his current position of Assistant AD/Television in August, 2003 after joining LSU as assistant coordinator in August of 1989. He served as Coordinator of Electronic Media/Television for eight years prior to his most recent promotion.

A 1980 graduate of LSU in broadcast journalism, Wagner was a four-year Tiger letterman in diving (1975-79), earning All-Southeastern Conference honors in 1979 on the three-meter springboard.

In August of 2002, Danna returned to the LSU Athletics Department after a two-year stint at ESPN in Bristol, Conn.

Before working for ESPN, Danna served as a full-time television producer at LSU for two years (1999-2000) and was involved with production of LSU programming since 1991

when he was a student at the university.

Danna, 32, worked as a student assistant in the Electronic Media Department from 1991-95 before working for local television station WBRZ, first in the production department and later as a news editor.

He freelanced for various sports production companies for three years, most notably during the 1997 and 1998 seasons as a member of the ESPN College Gameday crew which traveled to various football stadiums around the country prior to games.

The LSU Sports Radio Network, in its 17th year of in-house operation, is scheduled to broadcast all regular-season contests this season along with the Tigers' games in the SEC and NCAA Tournaments. LSU Baseball will be distributed by satellite to 25 radio stations from the broadcast studios on the fifth floor of the athletic administration building.

W D G L - F M (98.1) Radio in Baton Rouge will serve as the flagship station for the LSU Sports Network.

Jim Hawthorne, the "Voice of the Tigers" for all LSU sports, begins his 22nd season of calling baseball play-by-play action. He will be joined on the broadcasts by Charles Hanagriff and LSU baseball publicist Bill Franques.

A veteran sports announcer and radio personality throughout Louisiana, Hawthorne brings years of baseball broadcast experience to his post, including stints with the Shreveport Captains of the AA Texas League, Northwestern State University and Centenary College.

In his 25-year LSU broadcasting career, Hawthorne has called the action from two basketball Final Fours, 13 football bowl games, one football national championship game and five baseball national championship games. Hawthorne, a native of Anacoco, La., is married to the former Juanita Carol Thomason. He has one son, Joseph William; two daughters, Jaime Lynn and Amanda Ruth; and two grandchildren.

Selected LSU Sports Network stations will also air "Tiger Sportsline with Smoke Laval" each Monday from 7-8 p.m., beginning on March 28 and continuing through May 23. The show airs live from Superior Grill on Government Street in Baton Rouge.

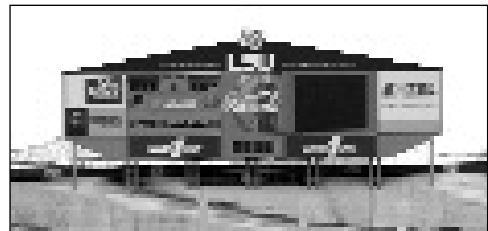

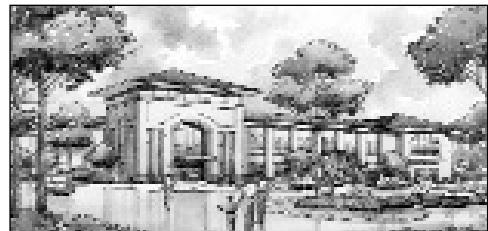

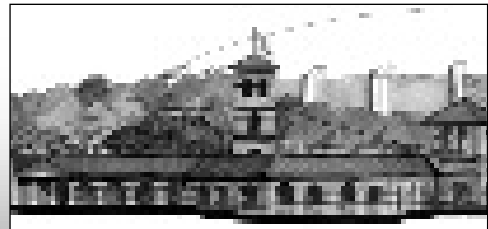
East Side Expansion of Tiger Stadium
