3rd Year at LSU • 7th Year as a Head Coach

Build a solid foundation for the LSU basketball program. Check.

Recruit players that would work hard, play hard and be committed to the LSU program. Check.

Change the mindset to believe in consistent winning. Check.

Represent the University as coaches and players in a positive way both on and off the court. Check.

Entering his third season as the head coach of the LSU Fighting Tiger basketball program, Coach Will Wade has been able to check all the boxes of program building that he set out to accomplish when he was named the 22nd head coach of the LSU program prior to the 2017-18 season.

This past season, Coach Wade, his staff and players put together a team that posted a 16-2 record in the Southeastern Conference, winning the 11th regular season title in school history and going on to advance to the NCAA Sweet 16.

But one sentence does not tell the story of the championship season, both on and off the court. How does a Coach and a team handle the worst possible tragedy, the death of a teammate? Not just a teammate, but a friend and a person known throughout the LSU community.

Junior Wayde Sims was killed in the early morning of Sept. 28, just hours before what was to be the first team workout in preparation for the 2018-19 season.

Coach Wade and athletic staff met early that morning with the team and began the long process of reflection and recovery. Coach Wade met with the media in a press conference later that morning that was televised live on many outlets including the SEC Network.

He was honest and frank about the situation and thoughts and memories of Sims. His ability to get out in front of the ongoing situation answered many questions and stopped growing speculation about the death.

The team dedicated the season to Wayde and his parents, which included former Tiger player Wayne Sims. Fingers showing Wayde's 44 number were displayed prominently and Coach Wade's mantra of "We'll be playing with six" in reference to Wayde watching and being with the Tigers sure seemed to be prophetic.

Time after time, the Tigers appeared to need a spark to stay alive for a win and things would turn around. LSU would go a perfect 9-0 in the league on the road, winning four overtime games and another at the buzzer. The Tigers would win 16 league games, one of their best overall 18-game league records.

As good as the players were in November when the season started, the team showed improvement from start to finish and that was all due to Coach Wade and his staff and the work that was put in on the court, in the video room, in scouting reports and so much more.

It was all part of the vision the coach has for the program. It's a vision to have "unwavering commitment to put the team first, to put the state first, to put our school first to represent all of these folks in a first-class fashion. We are going to be a hard-working team that represents this great university that represents this great state."

Frank William "Will" Wade said those words on March 20, 2017 when he was named the head coach at LSU. He came to LSU after a stellar two-year stint as the head coach at Virginia Commonwealth University and two years at UT-Chattanooga.

In two seasons at LSU, he is the first Tiger mentor to get the Tigers to post-season play in both of the first two seasons on the job. He's been on the bench for 43 wins over two seasons and he is now one of just five LSU coaches to lead his team to an SEC Championship.

Through the first two seasons, the Tigers under Wade have posted wins that excited the LSU fan base, another item that can be put on the positive check list for

the program.

So far in two seasons, LSU under Wade has posted 16 wins in the Quadrant I rankings in the NCAA RPI/now NET rankings. After five in 2018, Wade's Tigers posted 11 Q1 wins in 2019. That included at No. 4 NET ranked Kentucky, versus No. 9 Tennessee, No. 13 Auburn and at No. 21 Mississippi State.

The Tigers also had the ability to win in so many different ways. In the final seconds (at Kentucky, versus Tennessee and Maryland) and on the road in overtime (at Arkansas, at Missouri, at Mississippi State, at Florida). The 2019 Tigers became the first LSU squad to go 9-0 in the league on the road and ended the year tied for the longest road win streak in the country.

In two years, the Tigers have drawn four crowds that are in the top 12 single game attendances in the present seating configuration of the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. Fans are caring again about LSU basketball, not just because of wins, but because of what they have seen on the court.

The fans have seen the things that Coach Wade promised when he took the job – an energized staff that was integrated in the game making coaching decisions and alterations as needed; player that were working hard to enact a game plan and making big plays.

More than anything, LSU fans saw the advancement of returning players under Coach Wade and his staff and the way that the new player blended with the improved veterans.

Wade, one of the younger coaches in Division I, who will turn 36 on Nov. 26, has also proven to be one of the most energetic both in practices and games, and his players have responded in kind. Wade has also brought analytics and trends to his coaching practices at LSU and his ability to know situations and tendencies has proven beneficial to the Tigers in his first two seasons.

PRIOR TO LSU

The native of Nashville, Tennessee, directed VCU to a 51-20 record and two NCAA Tournament appearances in 2015-2016 and 2016-2017. The 2016 Rams advanced to the second round of the tournament, defeating seventh-seed Oregon State before losing to Oklahoma. Wade was the youngest head coach in the NCAA Tournament in 2016. In 2017, VCU lost to St. Mary's in the first round of the NCAA tourney.

Wade previously served at VCU as an assistant with the Rams under Shaka Smart from 2009-13. VCU was 113-37 during that time, reached three NCAA Tournament and won the 2012 Colonial Athletic Association Championship. He was part of the staff in 2011 when VCU advanced from the NCAA "First Four" all the way to the Final Four in Houston.

Wade is credited with being a key figure in four top non-power five recruiting classes in his four seasons at VCU.

Prior to becoming the head coach at VCU, Wade served as the head coach at Chattanooga for the 2013-14 and 2014-15 seasons.

His first Mocs squad went 18-15 in 2014, finishing 12-6 and second in regular season Southern Conference play. The 18 wins overall were the most by the program since 2008-09 and the 12 wins in league games was the

highest total since 2010-11. The team made the school's first postseason appearance since 2009 in the CIT.

Wade was honored with the Anton Foy Southern Conference Coach of the Year award for his efforts in 2014.

The Mocs won 22 games in 2015 and finished 15-3 in the league as Wade guided Chattanooga to its first 20-win season since 2004-05. He finished his two seasons there at 40-25 and 27-7 in league play. In the two seasons prior to his arrival, Chattanooga was 24-40 overall and 13-23 in SoCon play.

Wade was VCU Head Coach Shaka Smart's first hire upon being named the head VCU coach in 2009.

That reputation was cemented prior to his arrival on the VCU campus. He served as an assistant to Tommy Amaker at Harvard in 2007-08 and 2008-09. Much like at VCU, he was Amaker's first hire. In their second year, the Crimson went 14-14, the first season of .500 or better in the program since 2001-02.

Wade's coaching start came at Clemson where he served as Director of Basketball Operations (2006-07) and Graduate Assistant (2005-06) after four seasons as a student manager (2002-05). There he worked for coaches Larry Shyatt (2002-03) and Oliver Purnell (2004-07).

In eight years on coaching staffs at Clemson, Harvard and VCU, the teams had a record of 177-97 with six postseason appearances (2005-13).

Wade is married to the former Lauren Deason, and the couple has one daughter, Caroline Elizabeth (2).

LAST GAME: VCU 84, LSU 82 (RICHMOND, Virginia -- 11/13/19)

LSU's nine-game road winning streak came to an end on Wednesday with the 84-82 loss at VCU before a sold-out crowd at the Siegel Center.

LSU did some good things like shooting 51.7 percent from the floor (31-60) and 7-17 (41.2%) from the arc, while out rebounding VCU, 39-31.

But the Tigers had 26 turnovers, 12 in the first half, 14 in the second half and that results in 37 of VCU's 84 points (44.0 percent) while LSU had just 13 points off 16 VCU turnovers.

VCU jumped out to a 15-point lead with 1:15 to go in the first half after hitting back-to-back-to-back three-pointers and led LSU 12, 50-38, at the intermission. LSU trailed by 14 at 62-48 with 15:32 to go in the game when, like so many other times last season, LSU made a big move to get back in the game.

The Tigers cut the game to 62-59 after an 11-0 and tied the game back for the first time at the 8:55 mark at 67-67 with an Emmitt Williams dunk. The Tigers would eventually take an 82-81 lead with 41 seconds to go on Skylar Mays free throws, but an LSU foul on a three-pointer and LSU's inability to make a field goal in the final 80 seconds doomed the Tigers.

For the second straight game, five LSU players were in double figures with Skylar Mays getting 23 and a team high 8 rebounds, Javonte Smart had 15, Trendon Watford 11 and Darius Days and Charles Manning, Jr., 10 each.

LSU'S BAYOU BACKCOURT

LSU's Baton Rouge backcourt -- sophomore Javonte Smart and senior Skylar Mays -- have done what they needed to do in many areas on the court but both players know they need to bring down the turnover numbers from LSU's first two contests.

Smart scored 21 points in the opening win over Bowling Green, while Mays had the second highest scoring

game of his career with 23 points in the VCU game. Both Smart and Mays had eight rebounds to lead the way against BGSU, while Mays had eight to be the leading rebounder at VCU. Both players had three assists each after combining for eight in the opener.

Smart has proven to be the heir apparent at point guard for Tremont Waters, who set LSU's single season steal record a year ago and provided a lot of "wow" plays both offensively and defensively the last two years. Waters is off to life between the NBA and the G-League after being selected in the second round of the NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics.

Smart and Mays both have their strengths and ability to make "wow" plays. Smart can make the three and make the pass and Mays can draw the fouls and drive to the bucket with a finesse that makes defenders unable to keep up.

Mays also is an academic star at LSU, having earned first-team Academic All-America honors from CoSIDA and the scholar-athlete for the league in men's basketball last year. He also has gotten recognition from the league coaches as first-team All-SEC preseason selection. Mays averaged 13.4 points and 2.1 assists last year and he is the leading returning scorer on the LSU team.

Smart averaged 11.1 points a game and 2.4 assists last season. He showed his ability at the point, filling in for the injured Waters against No. 5 Tennessee when he scored 29 points in the February meeting.

The pair combined to make 274 field goals, 96 three-pointers and 202-of-237 free throws.

Mays is one of a group of players to have scored 1,100 points, dished out over 200 assists and gotten 100 steals in their LSU career. He is already 33rd on the school scoring list (1,141), 15 on the career assist list (288) and 12 on the steal career list (161).

Ironically, Mays moved past the father of his former teammate the late Wayne Sims in the Bowling Green game when he passed Wayne Sims (1,107) to move to No. 33. As far as assists go, he needs four to go past present LSU assistant Tashin Mitchell who is 14th on the school list.

EMMITT WILLIAMS

Coach has said several times that it's not really that important who starts a game but who ends up having the hot hand, playing the best and playing the most minutes.

Emmitt Williams came off the bench about five minutes into the opener and played almost 31 minutes scoring a career high 21 points. Williams played all 20 minutes of the second half, scoring 16 points, hitting 4-of-5 field goals and 8-of-10 free throws. For the game, Williams was 5-of-9 from the field with a trey and 10-of-12 from the charity line.

Williams had eight double figure scoring games a year ago with four double doubles in averaging 7.0 points and 5.4 rebounds a game last year.

Williams came off the bench to play 22 minutes before fouling out at VCU (11/13) and scored nine points.

FOULS DRAWN

Of the 42 fouls that LSU players have been able to draw in the first two games, the three that has drawn a combined 30 are Skylar Mays (11), Emmitt Williams (10) and Javonte Smart (9).

That's probably why the three players combined are 33-of-40 at the line in just two games (82.5%).

Mays is 10-of-12, Smart 12-of-14 and Williams 11-of-14 against the BGSU and VCU games.

Fouls drawn is now on the official box score this season as provided by the NCAA LIVESTATS through Genius Sports.

LSU has kept an unofficial fouls drawn since the Ben Simmons days as he was able to draw fouls and get to the line several times during a game.

DARIUS DAYS

He shot 42 percent from three last year in league games and showed he's willing to shoot from the new line this year, making 2-of-3 against Bowling Green in the opener.

Then he comes out in the VCU game and hits 2-of-2 from the arc to stand at 4-of-5 from the new three-point distance after two games.

Days scored 13 points against BGSU and followed up with 10 against VCU as he was overall perfect from the field at 4-of-4.

The 13 points tied for his third best game of his two years at LSU and the VCU game was his seventh double figure scoring game. Days had 15 in the regular season finale against Vanderbilt when he hit five three-pointers.

MARLON TAYLOR

Taylor started 24-of-35 games a year ago, averaging 6.7 points per game and 3.6 rebounds. Taylor was the one with athletic, high-flying dunks that earned him a spot of couple of times on ESPN's Top 10 plays on SportsCenter. Taylor has yet to dress for a game while recovering from summer surgery on his leg. His status right now is day-to-day and game-to-game as to when he will dress.

TRENDON WATFORD

A lot of eyes early on are on the five-star recruit Trendon Watford of Birmingham, Alabama, who signed with the Tigers last May from Mountain Brooke High School in Birmingham, Alabama. He averaged just over 15 points and 4.5 rebounds in the four games in Spain.

Watford led Mountain Brook to three consecutive Class 7A state championships (2017, 2018, 2019) and averaged 23.7 points, 11.8 rebounds and 3.6 assists during his senior season. He finished his career in the top 10 in scoring in AHSAA history and set an AHSAA record with 1,909 career rebounds. He played in both the McDonald's All-America game and the Jordan Brands Classic.

Watford is on the Karl Malone watch list in the preseason.

In the opener, Watford had 10 points and seven rebounds in just over 25.5 minutes of play, although he was just 4-of-12 from the field. In the VCU game, Watford scored 11 points on 5-of-10 shooting, including his first college three-pointer.

CHARLES MANNING, JR.

It was after the exhibition tour of Spain in August that Coach Will Wade noted the good play of Charles Manning, Jr., in his first year at LSU after coming here from Florida SouthWestern State where he was named a third team NJCAA All-America after the 2018-19 season.

The 6-5 guard averaged 9.7 points and 3.0 rebounds in the four games in Madrid, Valencia and Barcelona. In the exhibition game at Louisiana Tech (11/2), Manning scored 13 points on 6-of-10 shooting with one trey, three rebounds and three assists.

Manning was able to get his first D1 college double figure scoring game with 10 points on 3-of-5 shooting, a

make on his only three attempt and 3-of-3 at the line.

JAMES BISHOP

James Bishop got his first college points at VCU (11/13) scoring four points on 2-of-3 shooting in seven minutes. Bishop has played 19 total minutes in the two games and was the first sub into the game at VCU for Javonte Smart.

AUNDRE HYATT

Aundre Hyatt, who has come back nicely from a leg injury suffered late in the third of the four Spanish exhibitions in August, did not score in the VCU game, but was second high on the team in rebounds with seven. Hyatt scored two points in the Bowling Green game.

NEW YORK CONNECTION

While LSU has the Bayou Connection of Baton Rouge guards in Javonte Smart and Skylar Mays, Charles Manning, Aundre Hyatt and Marlon Taylor bring a "New York Connection" to the team.

Manning is a junior college transfer who hails from Riverhead, New York, while Hyatt is a redshirt freshman that came to Baton Rouge from the Bronx, New York and Marlon Taylor is a senior who played on last year's SEC Championship team from Mount Vernon, New York.

Both Manning and Hyatt have made their debuts this season in the first two games while the Tigers are still waiting for Marlon Taylor's 2019-20 debut.

HOME CONTESTS

The Tigers are 1-0 this year in what is season No. 49 of play in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center and will play two games at home in the next five days and technically this starts the Jersey Mike's Jamaica Classic run of games for LSU.

Both Nicholls (Saturday) and UMBC (Tuesday) are in the Jamaica Classic in the other side of the event and LSU is guaranteed four games in the event – these two in Baton Rouge and the two in Jamaica (Utah State on Nov. 22 and Rhode Island on Nov. 24).

LSU is presently on a four-game winning streak, capturing the final three of last season before winning the opener this season.

LSU ROAD STREAK STOPPED

LSU's two-point loss at VCU stopped a nine-game road winning streak that took LSU through the entire SEC schedule a year ago.

It was LSU's last loss on an opponent's court since Dec. 12, 2018 when the Tigers fell at Houston, 82-76.

Ironically LSU has bookend nine-game streaks on the road, losing nine in a row before winning nine in a row. LSU's next true road game will be the conference opener on Jan. 4 at Tennessee. LSU will play two games on a neutral court in Jamaica and a technical neutral court against USC in Los Angeles at the Staples Center in December.

RETURNING NUMBERS

Despite the top two scorers from last year being gone and three of the five, the Tigers are returning 54.3% of their scoring from last season, 48.7% of the rebound numbers and 44.5% of the assists. A couple of categories the Tigers will be looking for numbers in is blocks. Last year's team had 148 blocks and only 35.8% of that number returns this season. Senior Kavell Bigby-Williams blocked 67 shots himself a year ago for the Tigers.

LAST YEAR PAINT POINTS BIG FOR TIGERS

Paint points were big last year for the Tigers and the LSU had 40-or-more paint points on 17 occasions.

According to ESPN Stats and Info that was the second most by any team in a power conference with the exception of Duke which did it 19 times.

The Tigers topped 50 twice with 50 vs. No. 24 Furman and 58 at Mississippi State.

LSU is a much different team without big post players and so what second chance points will look like remains to be seen. The offense fans will see is different with some different ideas and plays as LSU tries to run more this season. Coach Wade has emphasized all five players going to the defensive boards to block out to hopefully prevent issues with opponents getting second chances with offensive boards.

LSU had 36 points in the paint in the opener and then came back with 46 in the road game at VCU so even with a smaller lineup, the new offensive is allowing the Tigers to get to the paint for shots.

TIGERS SEC TITLE WAS ITS 11TH LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP

LSU's SEC championship in 2019 was its 11th in the history of the Southeastern Conference and that is now second overall only to Kentucky.

LSU's championship years were: 1935, 1953, 1954, 1979, 1981, 1985, 1991, 2000, 2006, 2009, 2019.

FREE THROWS

LSU's ability to get to the line was a factor last year as the Tigers made 75.2 percent overall (603-of-802) and 76.9 percent in the 18 SEC games (352-458). The 603 free throws made was tenth in the nation last year and the 75.2 percent was No. 32 in the NCAA.

LSU, after shooting in the 50 percentile in the exhibition game at Louisiana Tech, got back on its game, making 27-of-34 in the opening game or 79.4 percent. Javonte Smart was 8-of-8, Emmitt Williams was 10-of-12 and Skylar Mays 5-of-7.

LSU made 76.5 percent (13-of-17) in the game at VCU with Mays (5-5) and Manning (3-3) perfect at the stripe. After 101 career games, Mays is 285-of-339 for his career or 84.1 percent. The senior is 18th all-time at LSU in free throw makes and third all-time (minimum 200 attempts) in free throw percentage.

Although not as many attempts in 36 games, Smart is 85-of-101 for 84.2 percent. Williams shot 68.8 percent a year ago but his 11-of-14 for the season upped his 36-game percentage to 70.0 (70-of-100).

LSU DID ITS LONG-RANGE SHOOTING IN THE FIRST HALF

The Tigers made seven treys in the opener, all coming in the first half when LSU made 7-of-15 (46.7%).

LSU missed its only three attempts in the second half to finish 7-of-18 or 38.9 percent.

The Tigers also made seven three-pointers at VCU, but it was spread more evenly with three in the first half and four in the second half.

Last year, LSU made 6.7 a game which was 269th in the nation. LSU's percentage of 31.9 was 299 in the nation. Early on, LSU's 14-of-35 (40 percent) is second in the league behind only Tennessee's.

INSIDE THE ARC

Last year, LSU shot 52.9 percent inside the arc in the opener and then 55.8 percent inside the arc in the road game at VCU. For the two game, LSU is averaging 53.7 percent shooting inside the arc in the first two games.

ABOUT NICHOLLS AND THE SERIES

The Colonels are off to a 2-1 start after losing to Illinois in overtime, 78-70, and then winning at Pittsburgh, 75-70, and defeating Paul Quinn in the home opener on Tuesday, 81-66. In the Paul Quinn game, Dexter McClanahan had 18 points to lead the way with Elvis Harvey adding 17, D'Angelo Hunter 16 and Andre Jones added 14. The Colonels shot 41 percent from the field with eight treys and out rebounded Paul Quinn, 45-38.

Austin Claunch is in his second year as the head coach of the Colonels after serving two years as an assistant coach at Nicholls. Prior to coming to Nicholls, he served as assistant coach at George Mason and Graduate Manager and Assistant Coach at Clemson.

This will be meeting No. 18 with LSU and Nicholls taking place in Baton Rouge with LSU leading 17-1. LSU won the last meeting in 2011, 96-74. The teams first met in 1987.

AGAINST THE STATE

Dating back to the loss to Nicholls on Nov. 16, 2010, which stopped a long win streak against state universities, LSU has since won 18 straight games against state schools, including the NIT post-season game against UL-Lafayette at the end of the 2018 season.

NON-CONFERENCE AT HOME

LSU has won 10 straight non-conference games at home under Coach Will Wade back to a loss on Dec. 16, 2017 when LSU was beaten by Stephen F. Austin, 83-82 ... LSU was 8-0 at home in nonconference play last year. In the first 48 years of the Maravich Center, the Tigers have had undefeated nonconference seasons at home 19 times.

THE SOUTHEASTERN GUY FROM LAST YEAR'S OPENER IS PLAYING FOR US

It was one of the more interesting things of the season opener last year when walk-on freshman Parker Edwards came off the bench for Southeastern in the final 11 minutes and made six three-pointers and finished the game with 25 points. He's now playing for LSU having transferred and walked on to the Tiger program.

It is the second time in the last 30-plus years that this has happened with LSU. In the first month of the 1988 season, Mike Hansen of Tennessee-Martin scored 38 points against LSU and then transferred to LSU for his last three seasons of eligibility.

TIGERS SIGN TWO IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

The Tigers signed two in the first two days of the early signing period -- point guard Jalen Cook of Walker High School in Walker, Louisiana and Bradley Ezewiro of Torrance, California who will be attending Oak Hill Academy in Virginia this season.

Cook, a 6-0 point guard, helped Walker to a Class 5A title as a sophomore and then in 2018-19 averaged 29.5 points, 5.1 rebounds, 4.7 assists and 2.8 steals for a Wildcats team that finished as the Class 5A runner-up. Cook is listed as a four-star recruit and the No. 2 prospect in the state of Louisiana and 16th in the nation at the position

The last Livingston Parish school basketball signee for the basketball Tigers was former Denham Springs High School star and present LSU Assistant Coach Tasmin Mitchell in 2005.

Ezewiro, a 6-8, 230-pound center, played last season at Bishop Montgomery High School in Torrance, California. He is a three-star recruit and is listed as the No. 10 recruit in California and 29th nationally on the list of centers. Ezewiro in the summer AAU circuit averaged 8.6 points and 3.6 rebounds in the 13-game Nike EYBL season, but raised that to 13.4 points and 8.8 rebounds per game during the Peach Invitational, including two double-doubles.

PRO BALL FOR THE TIGERS

The Tigers have several players taking part in the pro leagues this season with Garrett Temple the senior member of the LSU squad in the NBA, playing his 10th season overall and his first with the Brooklyn Nets.

Naz Reid, a member of the 2018-19 Tigers, was undrafted, but his Summer League performance got him a roster spot with the Minnesota Timberwolves. He has yet to see any action.

Tremont Waters, also a member of the Tigers the last two seasons, was drafted in the second round by the Celtics and signed a two-way deal that will see him get some time in Boston along with primarily in the G-League with the Maine Red Claws.

Josh Gray has the same deal with the NOLA Pelicans and will be heading to the G-League team in Erie along with Kavell Bigby-Williams. The NBA G League began on Nov. 8.

Several former Tigers are playing overseas with Brandon Bass, Justin Hamilton and Antonio Blakeney in the Chinese CBA, Shavon Coleman in the Belgium Scoore League, Corban Collins in Italy, Anthony Hickey is in the German BBL and Keith Hornsby in the Polish TBL. Jordan Mickey and Anthony Randolph are continuing their career in the Spanish ACB while Duop Reath is in the Serbian KLS.

The "Voice of the Tigers" Chris Blair and former LSU head basketball coach John Brady will be calling the action this season with Patrick Wright, the voice of women's basketball and softball, handling the action for three upcoming games (vs. Nicholls and the two games in Jamaica).

RULE CHANGES

With this being a rule change cycle, there are a few different things that will be seen this season:

1) The distance of the three-point line has gone from 20-9 to 22-1 3/4 at the top of the key and 21-7 7/8 in the corners (same as the distance for international basketball).

2) The officials' shirt will change to include a raglan style shoulder (you are on your own for that one).

3) The shot clock will be reset to 20 seconds after an offensive team rebound that does not go into the backcourt before team control is gained by the offensive team.

4) A head coach may request and be granted a timeout when a player of that team has control of the ball in the last two minutes of the second half or the last two minutes of any overtime period.

5) When there is a monitor review at 30 seconds or less before a media mark (other than for determining if a basket was a two-or-a-three-point try), it becomes a media timeout.

6) In the last two minutes, instant replay will be allowed to review basket interference and goaltending when a call has been made. After such review, in the event of an officiating error, the alternating possession arrow shall be used to determine possession.
