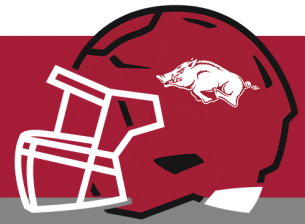

POSTGAME NOTES: LSU 56, ARKANSAS 20

PREGAME NOTES

- The Razorbacks wore cardinal helmets, cardinal jerseys and white pants, a uniform from Nike that dates back to the 2006-07 seasons. Arkansas has worn it every home game this year.
- LSU won the coin toss and elected to receive. Arkansas defended the north end zone.
- Arkansas' captains were seniors McTelvin Agim, DeJon Harris, Connor Limpert and T.J. Smith. Agim, Harris & Smith were named permanent captains before the season and donned a "C" on their left shoulder all year.
- Weather - 54, clear, winds WNW 4 mph

GENERAL NOTES

- Saturday marked the 65th meeting between the Razorbacks and Tigers. LSU leads the all-time series, 40-22-2.
- The Razorbacks are now 3-11-1 against LSU all-time in Baton Rouge.
- The announced attendance for the game: 101,173
- Today's starters: **Offense** - KJ Jefferson (QB), Myron Cunningham (LT), Austin Capps (LG), Ty Clary (C), Ricky Stromberg (RG), Dalton Wagner (RT), Rakeem Boyd (RB), Michael Woods (WR), Treyton Burks (WR), Trey Knox (WR), Grayson Gunter (TE). **Defense** - Mataio Soli (DE), McTelvin Agim (DT), T.J. Smith (DT), Gabe Richardson (DE), DeJon Harris (MIKE), Bumper Pool (WILL), Greg Brooks Jr. (NICK), Jarques McClellion (CB), Kamren Curl (SS), Joe Foucha (FS), LaDarius Bishop (CB).
- DeJon Harris made his 35th consecutive start, the most on the either side of the ball.
- McTelvin Agim started in his 38th game of his collegiate career, the most by a current Razorback.
- Seven freshmen, six true, started today's game for the Razorbacks. A total of 21 freshmen/redshirt played against LSU.
- It was KJ Jefferson's first start of the season. He is the first true freshman to start at quarterback since Connor Noland against Tulsa in 2018.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Treyton Burks hauled in a 31-yard pass in the first quarter, pushing him past the 400-yard threshold for receiving this season. It made him just the fourth true freshman in Arkansas history with 400+ receiving yards.
- The Razorbacks recorded 100 total yards in the first half, with 56 passing yards on five completions.
- Jefferson completed passes to four players in the first half, including one to himself.
- Burks finished the night with 80 receiving yards, the most by a Razorback since 91 from C.J. O'Grady against Texas A&M on Sept. 28. It's the second-highest yardage total for Burks this season (92 vs. Colorado State).
- Both of Arkansas' touchdowns came from the hands of QB Jack Lindsey as he led the Hogs on two touchdown drives late in the fourth quarter. One came on a 24-yard pass to WR Mike Woods, the other on a 2-yard handoff to RB Devwah Whaley.
- Whaley's touchdown run was his fourth of the season and 17th of his career.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Jonathan Marshall recorded a sack in the first quarter, the first for the Razorbacks since Arkansas' game against Auburn on Oct. 19.
- LSU's seven points in the first quarter were the fewest Arkansas has allowed in an opening frame since Oct. 12 at Kentucky (0).
- DeJon Harris recorded eight tackles on Saturday night in his home state. It was his fifth double-digit tackle game of the season, 20th of his career and marked the seventh-straight game a Razorback has tallied 10 or more.
- Kam Curl forced and recovered his own fumble in the third quarter. It was the third-straight game Arkansas has recovered a fumble and was the 10th recovery for the Razorbacks this season.
- It was the second time this season Curl has recovered the fumble he caused, also doing so against Ole Miss on Sept. 7, returning it 69 yards for a touchdown.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Connor Limpert connected on a 24-yard field goal with 3:39 remaining in the first quarter. It was his 13th made FG of the year.
- Limpert added another FG, this one from 47 yards, with 9:43 left in the second quarter. It was his sixth from 40+ yards this season.
- He needs to make three more to tie for sixth in career field goals made at Arkansas with 44.
- Limpert is two attempts away from tying for eighth in career field goal attempts by a Razorback at 53.

PLAYER NOTES

QB K.J. Jefferson

- Made his first career start and third appearance this year.
- Completed 7-of-14 passing for 105 yards. Three of his seven completions came on third down and resulted in first downs.
- The 105 passing yards is a season high, topping his previous high of 60 set against Western Kentucky (11/9) two weeks ago.

QB Jack Lindsey

- Made his first appearance of the season at quarterback and finished off a 9-play, 75-yard drive, completing a 24-yard touchdown pass to Mike Woods after an injury to Nick Starkel.
- Finished the game 3-for-4 through the air, totaling 51 yards and one touchdown. It was his first touchdown pass of his career.
- Also rushed for 30 yards on three carries, finishing the game as the team's second-leading rusher.
- His first play at quarterback was a 30-yard QB sneak, which was the longest rush by a Razorback in the game and longest by a QB this year.

WR Treyton Burks

- Finished the game with three catches for 80 yards. Now has 13 catches for 469 yards this year, which is best on the team in both categories.
- Has at least one catch in all 10 games he's played this year.
- His 31-yard reception in the first quarter tied for his third-longest catch of the year. Followed that up with a 38-yard catch to start the 2nd half, tying for his longest this year (vs. Colorado St. - 9/14).
- Is the fourth true freshman in Arkansas history with 400+ yards receiving in a single season and first since Hunter Henry (409 - 2013).
- He's the first true freshman receiver at Arkansas with 400+ yards in a season since Marcus Monk had 569 in 2004.

WR Mike Woods

- Finished the game with three catches for 47 yards and one touchdown.
- Connected with QB Jack Lindsey on a 24-yard touchdown pass midway through the fourth quarter for his fifth touchdown catch of the year, leading all Razorback receivers.

K Connor Limpert

- 2-for-3 FG - 24 and 47 yards; Now has connected on 13-of-17 field goal attempts for an 76 percent clip.
- His 47-yarder in the second quarter was his seventh this year of 40+ yards.
- Has now made 41 field goals in his career, which remains 7th all-time in Arkansas history. Needs three more to move into a tie for 6th all-time.
- Now has 51 career FG attempts, needing two more to reach eighth on the Arkansas all-time list.
- Has at least one made FG in 20 of his last 22 games and has made at least one FG in every game that he's had a FG attempt, standing at 27 games over the 2017-19 seasons.

LB De'Jon Harris

- Had eight tackles in the game, all eight coming in the first half.
- Now has 360 career tackles, passing Ronnie Caveness (1962-64) for seventh all-time in Arkansas history.
- Needs seven more tackles to tie Cliff Powell (1967-69) for sixth all-time.
- Led the team in stops for the third time this year, tying with Bumper Pool for the most on the team.
- Also had one tackle for loss, giving him 4.5 TFL this year and 24.0 for his career. Has recorded 3.5 of his TFL in conference play this year.
- It's the second time this year that he's recorded eight or more tackles in a half (8 at Alabama - Oct. 26).

DB La'Darrius Bishop

- Made his third career start and racked up seven tackles, two being solo.
- It's his second game this year with five or more tackles, one shy of a career-high (8 vs. San Jose State - Sept. 21).

DB Kamren Curl

- Had one tackle in the game, a solo stop, to go along with a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.
- It's his second forced fumble of the season and first since forcing one at Ole Miss (9/7). It's his second fumble recovery of the season and first since the same game where he returned one 69 yards for a touchdown.

DL Jonathan Marshall

- Tied a season high with two tackles in the game, one being a sack in the fourth quarter.
- It was his first career sack and the first sack by a Razorback since Oct. 19 against Auburn.
