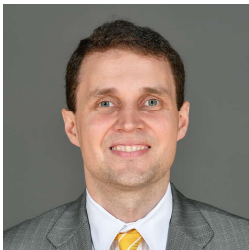

3rd Year at LSU • 7th Year as a Head Coach

Build a solid foundation for the LSU basketball program. Check.

Recruit players that would work hard, play hard and be committed to the LSU program. Check.

Change the mindset to believe in consistent winning. Check.

Represent the University as coaches and players in a positive way both on and off the court. Check.

Entering his third season as the head coach of the LSU Fighting Tiger basketball program, Coach Will Wade has been able to check all the boxes of program building that he set out to accomplish when he was named the 22nd head coach of the LSU program prior to the 2017-18 season.

This past season, Coach Wade, his staff and players put together a team that posted a 16-2 record in the Southeastern Conference, winning the 11th regular season title in school history and going on to advance to the NCAA Sweet 16.

But one sentence does not tell the story of the championship season, both on and off the court. How does a Coach and a team handle the worst possible tragedy, the death of a teammate? Not just a teammate, but a friend and a person known throughout the LSU community.

Junior Wayde Sims was killed in the early morning of Sept. 28, just hours before what was to be the first team workout in preparation for the 2018-19 season.

Coach Wade and athletic staff met early that morning with the team and began the long process of reflection and recovery. Coach Wade met with the media in a press conference later that morning that was televised live on many outlets including the SEC Network.

He was honest and frank about the situation and thoughts and memories of Sims. His ability to get out in front of the ongoing situation answered many questions and stopped growing speculation about the death.

The team dedicated the season to Wayde and his parents, which included former Tiger player Wayne Sims. Fingers showing Wayde's 44 number were displayed prominently and Coach Wade's mantra of "We'll be playing with six" in reference to Wayde watching and being with the Tigers sure seemed to be prophetic.

Time after time, the Tigers appeared to need a spark to stay alive for a win and things would turn around. LSU would go a perfect 9-0 in the league on the road, winning four overtime games and another at the buzzer. The Tigers would win 16 league games, one of their best overall 18-game league records.

As good as the players were in November when the season started, the team showed improvement from start to finish and that was all due to Coach Wade and his staff and the work that was put in on the court, in the video room, in scouting reports and so much more.

It was all part of the vision the coach has for the program. It's a vision to have "unwavering commitment to put the team first, to put the state first, to put our school first to represent all of these folks in a first-class fashion. We are going to be a hard-working team that represents this great university that represents this great state."

Frank William "Will" Wade said those words on March 20, 2017 when he was named the head coach at LSU. He came to LSU after a stellar two-year stint as the head coach at Virginia Commonwealth University and two years at UT-Chattanooga.

In two seasons at LSU, he is the first Tiger mentor to get the Tigers to post-season play in both of the first two seasons on the job. He's been on the bench for 43 wins over two seasons and he is now one of just five LSU coaches to lead his team to an SEC Championship.

Through the first two seasons, the Tigers under Wade have posted wins that excited the LSU fan base, another item that can be put on the positive check list for

the program.

So far in two seasons, LSU under Wade has posted 16 wins in the Quadrant I rankings in the NCAA RPI/now NET rankings. After five in 2018, Wade's Tigers posted 11 Q1 wins in 2019. That included at No. 4 NET ranked Kentucky, versus No. 9 Tennessee, No. 13 Auburn and at No. 21 Mississippi State.

The Tigers also had the ability to win in so many different ways. In the final seconds (at Kentucky, versus Tennessee and Maryland) and on the road in overtime (at Arkansas, at Missouri, at Mississippi State, at Florida). The 2019 Tigers became the first LSU squad to go 9-0 in the league on the road and ended the year tied for the longest road win streak in the country.

In two years, the Tigers have drawn four crowds that are in the top 12 single game attendances in the present seating configuration of the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. Fans are caring again about LSU basketball, not just because of wins, but because of what they have seen on the court.

The fans have seen the things that Coach Wade promised when he took the job – an energized staff that was integrated in the game making coaching decisions and alterations as needed; player that were working hard to enact a game plan and making big plays.

More than anything, LSU fans saw the advancement of returning players under Coach Wade and his staff and the way that the new player blended with the improved veterans.

Wade, one of the younger coaches in Division I, who will turn 36 on Nov. 26, has also proven to be one of the most energetic both in practices and games, and his players have responded in kind. Wade has also brought analytics and trends to his coaching practices at LSU and his ability to know situations and tendencies has proven beneficial to the Tigers in his first two seasons.

PRIOR TO LSU

The native of Nashville, Tennessee, directed VCU to a 51-20 record and two NCAA Tournament appearances in 2015-2016 and 2016-2017. The 2016 Rams advanced to the second round of the tournament, defeating seventh-seed Oregon State before losing to Oklahoma. Wade was the youngest head coach in the NCAA Tournament in 2016. In 2017, VCU lost to St. Mary's in the first round of the NCAA tourney.

Wade previously served at VCU as an assistant with the Rams under Shaka Smart from 2009-13. VCU was 113-37 during that time, reached three NCAA Tournament and won the 2012 Colonial Athletic Association Championship. He was part of the staff in 2011 when VCU advanced from the NCAA "First Four" all the way to the Final Four in Houston.

Wade is credited with being a key figure in four top non-power five recruiting classes in his four seasons at VCU.

Prior to becoming the head coach at VCU, Wade served as the head coach at Chattanooga for the 2013-14 and 2014-15 seasons.

His first Mocs squad went 18-15 in 2014, finishing 12-6 and second in regular season Southern Conference play.

The 18 wins overall were the most by the program since 2008-09 and the 12 wins in league games was the

highest total since 2010-11. The team made the school's first postseason appearance since 2009 in the CIT.

Wade was honored with the Anton Foy Southern Conference Coach of the Year award for his efforts in 2014.

The Mocs won 22 games in 2015 and finished 15-3 in the league as Wade guided Chattanooga to its first 20-win season since 2004-05. He finished his two seasons there at 40-25 and 27-7 in league play. In the two seasons prior to his arrival, Chattanooga was 24-40 overall and 13-23 in SoCon play.

Wade was VCU Head Coach Shaka Smart's first hire upon being named the head VCU coach in 2009.

That reputation was cemented prior to his arrival on the VCU campus. He served as an assistant to Tommy Amaker at Harvard in 2007-08 and 2008-09. Much like at VCU, he was Amaker's first hire. In their second year, the Crimson went 14-14, the first season of .500 or better in the program since 2001-02.

Wade's coaching start came at Clemson where he served as Director of Basketball Operations (2006-07) and Graduate Assistant (2005-06) after four seasons as a student manager (2002-05). There he worked for coaches Larry Shyatt (2002-03) and Oliver Purnell (2004-07).

In eight years on coaching staffs at Clemson, Harvard and VCU, the teams had a record of 177-97 with six postseason appearances (2005-13).

Wade is married to the former Lauren Deason, and the couple has one daughter, Caroline Elizabeth (2).

LAST GAME: LSU 88, BOWLING GREEN 79 (BATON ROUGE -- 11/8/19)

The Tigers had a successful opening night Friday at the Maravich Center with the 88-79 win over Bowling Green, one of the favorites in the MAC after winning 22-games last year.

LSU was down six in the early going before the Tigers put together a 19-0 run that included three-pointers by Emmitt Williams, Darius Days, Skylar Mays and two by Javonte Smart. Trendon Watford had the final four points on a bucket and a driving layup.

Those five players involved in that 19-0 were the five players that were in double figures scoring for the Tigers -- Smart and Williams each had 21, while Mays had 18, Days 13 and Watford 10. For Williams, who was 5-of-9 from the field overall with 10-of-12 at the free throw line, it was a career scoring high for the sophomore, while Smart, who had three-treys and 8-of-8 at the line, had his second career 20-plus point game.

LSU continued its success in the paint with 36 points and a 36-10 advantage as Bowling Green made 14 three-pointers and just 24 total for the game. LSU shot 47.4 percent overall and 79.4 percent (27-34) from the line, while BGSU was held to just 32 percent overall.

The Tigers had 46 rebounds with guards Smart and Mays getting eight each and then Days, Watford and Williams each had seven rebounds apiece.

LSU'S BAYOU BACKCOURT

It was a good opening night from LSU's two Baton Rouge guards -- Javonte Smart and Skylar Mays -- combined for 39 points, 16 rebounds, 8 assists and two steals.

Smart has proven to be the heir apparent at point guard for Tremont Waters, who set LSU's single season steal record a year ago and provided a lot of "wow" plays both offensively and defensively the last two years. Waters is off

to life between the NBA and the G-League after being selected in the second round of the NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics.

Smart, the sophomore and Mays, the senior, both have their strengths and ability to make “wow” plays. Smart can make the three and make the pass and Mays can draw the fouls and drive to the bucket with a finesse that makes defenders unable to keep up.

Mays also is an academic star at LSU, having earned first-team Academic All-America honors from CoSIDA and the scholar-athlete for the league in men’s basketball last year. He also has gotten recognition from the league coaches as first-team All-SEC preseason selection. Mays averaged 13.4 points and 2.1 assists last year and he is the leading returning scorer on the LSU team.

Smart averaged 11.1 points a game and 2.4 assists last season. He showed his ability at the point, filling in for the injured Waters against No. 5 Tennessee when he scored 29 points in the February meeting.

The pair combined to make 274 field goals, 96 three-pointers and 202-of-237 free throws.

Mays is one of a group of players to have scored 1,100 points, dished out over 200 assists and gotten 100 steals in their LSU career. He is already 33rd on the school scoring list (1,118), 15 on the career assist list (285) and 12 on the steal career list (159).

Ironically, Mays moved past the father of his former teammate the late Wayne Sims in the Bowling Green game when he passed Wayne Sims (1,107) to move to No. 33. He needs two points to past the late Don Redd (1983-86) into 32nd. As far as assists go, he needs seven to go past present LSU assistant Tasmin Mitchell who is 14th on the school list.

EMMITT WILLIAMS

Coach has said several times that it’s not really that important who starts a game but who ends up having the hot hand, playing the best and playing the most minutes.

Emmitt Williams came off the bench about five minutes into the game and played almost 31 minutes scoring a career high 21 points. Williams played all 20 minutes of the second half, scoring 16 points, hitting 4-of-5 field goals and 8-of-10 free throws. For the game, Williams was 5-of-9 from the field with a trey and 10-of-12 from the charity line.

Williams had eight double figure scoring games a year ago with four double doubles in averaging 7.0 points and 5.4 rebounds a game.

DARIUS DAYS

He shot 42 percent from three last year in league games and showed he’s willing to shoot from the new line this year, making 2-of-3 against Bowling Green in the Friday game.

Days scored 13 points, hitting 5-of-8 overall from the field. That tied for his third best game of his two years at LSU and his sixth double figure scoring game. Days had 15 in the regular season finale against Vanderbilt when he hit five three-pointers.

The sophomore was part of the very balanced night of rebounds with seven boards. Days played just over 21 minutes.

MARLON TAYLOR

Taylor started 24-of-35 games a year ago, averaging 6.7 points per game and 3.6 rebounds. Taylor was the one with athletic, high-flying dunks that earned him a spot of couple of times on ESPN’s Top 10 plays on SportsCenter. Taylor has yet to dress for a game while recovering from summer surgery on his leg. He has been practicing on and off to trying to get back on the court on a consistent basis.

TRENDON WATFORD

A lot of eyes early on are on the five-star recruit Trendon Watford of Birmingham, Alabama, who signed with the Tigers last May from Mountain Brooke High School in Birmingham, Alabama. He averaged just over 15 points and 4.5 rebounds in the four games in Spain.

Watford led Mountain Brook to three consecutive Class 7A state championships (2017, 2018, 2019) and averaged 23.7 points, 11.8 rebounds and 3.6 assists during his senior season. He finished his career in the top 10 in scoring in AHSAA history and set an AHSAA record with 1,909 career rebounds. He played in both the McDonald’s All-America game and the Jordan Brands Classic.

Watford is on the Karl Malone watch list in the preseason. Watford had 10 points and seven rebounds in just over 25.5 minutes of play, although he was just 4-of-12 from the field.

CHARLES MANNING, JR.

It was after the exhibition tour of Spain in August that Coach Will Wade noted the good play of Charles Manning, Jr., in his first year at LSU after coming here from Florida SouthWestern State where he was named a third team NJCAA All-America after the 2018-19 season.

The 6-5 guard averaged 9.7 points and 3.0 rebounds in the four games in Madrid, Valencia and Barcelona. In the exhibition game at Louisiana Tech (11/2), Manning scored 13 points on 6-of-10 shooting with one trey, three rebounds and three assists.

Manning didn’t have a lot of shots in the opener with Bowling Green (1-4), but he did have four rebounds and four blocks on his ledger for the game. He finished with three points.

SEASON OPENERS

LSU is now 92-20 in opening games after the game with Bowling Green and LSU has now won six straight openers. LSU last lost an opening night game that was played in Baton Rouge in 1986 when the Tigers fell to TCU.

GOING ON THE ROAD

Tonight’s game will be the earliest road game since the Tigers opened the 2013-14 season, losing at UMass, 92-90 (11/12/13). The Tigers also played a road game at Coastal Carolina in the second game of the 2011-12 season, losing 71-63.

LSU’s last loss on an opponent’s court was on Dec. 12, 2018 when the Tigers fell at Houston, 82-76.

From there, LSU went a perfect 9-0 in the SEC on the road last year – winning road games in order at Arkansas, Ole Miss, Missouri, Texas A&M, Mississippi State, Kentucky, Georgia, Alabama and Florida. For LSU this topped the 1981 team that went 8-0 on the road before losing the season finale at Kentucky.

This is a complete turnaround from LSU losing nine straight games overall on opponents’ home courts, including that loss at Houston as part of the 2018 portion of the schedule.

LSU won five of the road games in overtime, one in regulation on a tip at the buzzer and seven total on the road by six points or less – 6 at Arkansas and Missouri, 5 at Alabama, 4 at Mississippi State, and Georgia, 2 at

Kentucky and 1 at Florida. Included in that was a rally from 14 down with 2:14 to go in regulation at Missouri, forcing overtime in the final two seconds.

There have been only 10 seasons (conference and non-conference combined) in the history of the program that LSU teams have won nine or more road games in a season:

10 -- 1942-43; 1985-86

9 -- 2018-19; 1916-17; 1919-20

Since the league went back to the 18-game schedule, LSU is now one of three SEC teams to have gone undefeated on the road at 9-0 -- Kentucky in 2015 and Florida in 2014. Kentucky was the last team to go undefeated in the old 16-game schedule, 8-0 in 2012.

When the season opened, LSU was one of four teams with nine consecutive road wins.

9 -- LSU, Wofford, North Carolina, Houston

Since then, North Carolina has a win at UNCW to go to 10. LSU will be the next one to play a road game here at VCU on Wednesday. Of course, VCU's streaks should also be acknowledged -- 13 at home and six on the road entering the week.

LSU is 428-637 on opponent courts all-time in program history and Will Wade at LSU is 12-9 in his first two years on opponent's home courts.

RETURNING NUMBERS

Despite the top two scorers from last year being gone and three of the five, the Tigers are returning 54.3% of their scoring from last season, 48.7% of the rebound numbers and 44.5% of the assists. A couple of categories the Tigers will be looking for numbers in is blocks. Last year's team had 148 blocks and only 35.8% of that number returns this season. Senior Kavell Bigby-Williams blocked 67 shots himself a year ago for the Tigers.

LAST YEAR PAINT POINTS BIG FOR TIGERS

Paint points were big last year for the Tigers and the LSU had 40-or-more paint points on 17 occasions.

According to ESPN Stats and Info that was the second most by any team in a power conference with the exception of Duke which did it 19 times.

The Tigers topped 50 twice with 50 vs. No. 24 Furman and 58 at Mississippi State.

LSU is a much different team without big post players and so what second chance points will look like remains to be seen. The offense fans will see is different with some different ideas and plays as LSU tries to run more this season. Coach Wade has emphasized all five players going to the defensive boards to block out to hopefully prevent issues with opponents getting second chances with offensive boards.

LSU had just five second chance points in the exhibition game at Louisiana Tech with the Bulldogs getting 18. But in the opening game with Bowling Green, the Tigers had 36 points in the paint with BGSU getting just 10.

TIGERS SEC TITLE WAS ITS 11TH LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP

LSU's SEC championship in 2019 was its 11th in the history of the Southeastern Conference and that is now second overall only to Kentucky.

LSU's championship years were: 1935, 1953, 1954, 1979, 1981, 1985, 1991, 2000, 2006, 2009, **2019**.

FREE THROWS

The Tigers had a good year at the line last season, making 75.2 percent overall (603-of-802) and 76.9 percent in the 18 SEC games (352-458). The 603 free throws made was tenth in the nation last year and the 75.2 percent was No. 32 in the NCAA.

LSU, after shooting in the 50 percentile in the exhibition game at Louisiana Tech, got back on its game, making 27-of-34 in the opening 79.4 percent. Javonte Smart was 8-of-8, Emmitt Williams was 10-of-12 and Skylar Mays 5-of-7. After 100 career games, Mays is 280-of-334 for his career or 83.8 percent. The senior is 20th all-time at LSU in free throw makes and fifth all-time (minimum 200 attempts) in free throw percentage.

Although not as many attempts in 35 games, Smart is 81-of-95 for 85.3 percent. Williams shot 68.8 percent a year ago but his 10-of-12 upped his 35-game percentage to 70.4 (69-of-98).

LSU DID ITS LONG-RANGE SHOOTING IN THE FIRST HALF

The Tigers made seven treys in the opener, all coming in the first half when LSU made 7-of-15 (46.7%). Five of those came in the 19-0 run when Williams, Mays, Day and two by Smart all contributed to the run at the newly extended three-point line.

LSU missed its only three attempts in the second half to finish 7-of-18 or 38.9 percent. Last year, LSU made 6.7 a game which was 269 in the nation. LSU's percentage of 31.9 was 299 in the nation.

INSIDE THE ARC

Last year, LSU shot 52.9 percent inside the arc and was not too far off in the opener, shooting 51.3 percent from two-point range.

ABOUT VCU

VCU played two games last week at the Siegel Center, defeated St. Francis PA, 72-58, on Tuesday and then North Texas, 59-56, on Friday. Marcus Evans led VCU in the UNT game with 13 points, while Di'Rante Jenkins added 12. VCU shot 17-of-46 from the field overall with 10 of those coming outside the arc. VCU turned the ball over 18 times and the rebounds were even at 31.

In the St. Francis win, VCU shot 27-of-55, but only had three treys in the game. Marcus Santos-Silva had 21 points and 18 rebounds in the game with Jenkins 16 and Evans 12. VCU had 18 turnovers and a 42-39 rebound advantage.

Mike Rhoades is in his third season as the head coach at VCU with a record of 45-23 after stops as head coach at Rice (three years) and 10 years at Randolph-Mason.

This will be the second meeting between the two schools in the first game of a home-and-home series that will be played in Baton Rouge during the 2020-21 season. VCU defeated LSU, 85-74, in the only previous meeting which took place at the Battle for Atlantis in the Bahamas on Nov. 25, 2016. The head coach of VCU was Will Wade.

SPEAKING OF WILL WADE

Wade when he became the LSU head coach became the third LSU head coach in the last four at LSU to become the head coach after winning a game on the opposite bench in their previous tenure. Another one was former LSU head coach John Brady who is now the color analyst for the LSU Sports Radio Network. Brady brought a Samford team to Baton Rouge in 1996 and scored a 53-50 win over the Tigers. The next year he was the LSU coach.

The other one was former LSU player and assistant coach Johnny Jones. He brought a North Texas team to Baton Rouge in 2010 and scored a 20-point win over the Tigers. Two years later, he was the LSU head coach.

THE SOUTHEASTERN GUY FROM LAST YEAR'S OPENER IS PLAYING FOR US

It was one of the more interesting things of the season opener last year when walk-on freshman Parker Edwards came off the bench for Southeastern in the final 11 minutes and made six three-pointers and finished the game with 25 points. He's now playing for LSU having transferred and walked on to the Tiger program.

It is the second time in the last 30-plus years that this has happened with LSU. In the first month of the 1988 season, Mike Hansen of Tennessee-Martin scored 38 points against LSU and then transferred to LSU for his last three seasons of eligibility.

PRO BALL FOR THE TIGERS

The Tigers have several players taking part in the pro leagues this season with Garrett Temple the senior member of the LSU squad in the NBA, playing his 10th season overall and his first with the Brooklyn Nets.

Naz Reid, a member of the 2018-19 Tigers, was undrafted, but his Summer League performance got him a roster spot with the Minnesota Timberwolves. He has yet to see any action.

Tremont Waters, also a member of the Tigers the last two seasons, was drafted in the second round by the Celtics and signed a two-way deal that will see him get some time in Boston along with primarily in the G-League with the Maine Red Claws.

Josh Gray has the same deal with the NOLA Pelicans and will be heading to the G-League team in Erie along with Kavell Bigby-Williams. The NBA G League began on Nov. 8.

This season, there are more ways to listen to LSU Basketball games besides the over-the-air broadcasts on your statewide LSU Sports Radio Network affiliates.

Live streaming radio broadcasts are available at www.LSUsports.net/live, eagle981.com, SiriusXM (channel listings at LSUsports.net/satellite), TuneIn and Radio.com (via WWL). A complete listing can be found at www.LSUsports.net/radioaffiliates.

The "Voice of the Tigers" Chris Blair and former LSU head basketball coach John Brady will be calling the action this season with Patrick Wright, the voice of women's basketball and softball, handling the action for three upcoming games (vs. Nicholls and the two games in Jamaica).

RULE CHANGES

With this being a rule change cycle, there are a few different things that will be seen this season:

1) The distance of the three-point line has gone from 20-9 to 22-1 3/4 at the top of the key and 21-7 7/8 in the corners (same as the distance for international basketball).

2) The officials' shirt will change to include a raglan style shoulder (you are on your own for that one).

3) The shot clock will be reset to 20 seconds after an offensive team rebound that does not go into the backcourt before team control is gained by the offensive team.

4) A head coach may request and be granted a timeout when a player of that team has control of the ball in the last two minutes of the second half or the last two minutes of any overtime period.

5) When there is a monitor review at 30 seconds or less before a media mark (other than for determining if a basket was a two-or-a-three-point try), it becomes a media timeout.

6) In the last two minutes, instant replay will be allowed to review basket interference and goaltending when a call has been made. After such review, in the event of an officiating error, the alternating possession arrow shall be used to determine possession.

JAMAICA CLASSIC STARTS IN BATON ROUGE

LSU's next four games are technically part of the Jersey Mike's Jamaica Classic although the first two games are to be played at the Maravich Center in Baton Rouge. The Tigers will host Nicholls Saturday at 3 p.m. (SEC+ streaming video) and Maryland-Baltimore County on Tuesday, Nov. 19 (6 p.m., SEC Network).

LSU will then head to Jamaica for games on Friday, Nov. 22 (nationally-ranked Utah State) and Rhode Island on Sunday, Nov. 24. Those two games will be televised on the CBS Sports Network.
