## LSU FOOTBALL POSTGAME NOTES #1 LSU vs. Texas A&M November 30, 2019 – Tiger Stadium (Baton Rouge, Louisiana)

- 1. The LSU Captains were QB **Joe Burrow**, DL **Breidon Fehoko**, WR **Stephen Sullivan** and WR **Derrick Dillon**
- 2. TAMU won the toss and deferred its decisions until the second half. LSU will receive the opening kickoff and defend the south end zone in the first quarter.
- 3. With Saturday's win, LSU improved to 12-0 and wrapped up its third undefeated regular season in the SEC Era
  - a. LSU was 11-0 in 1958 and finished 13-1 in 2011
  - b. It is just the second time in program history that LSU is 8-0 in SEC play with the other coming in 2011
  - c. Dating back the Fiesta Bowl, LSU has won 13 consecutive games which is tied for the fourth most in LSU history with the 2006-07 teams.
- 4. When playing games as the No. 1 team in either the AP or Coaches Poll, LSU is 28-4
- 5. LSU has scored at least 40 points in 10 games this season, setting a new program record
  - a. In 2011, LSU had nine games in which it scored at least 40 points
- 6. LSU head coach improved to (36-9) as the head coach of the LSU Tigers
  - a. LSU is 35-2 under Coach Orgeron when reaching the 20-point mark
  - b. 28 of Coach Orgeron's wins at LSU have come by double-digits
  - c. Coach Orgeron is 3-1 against Texas A&M in his head coaching career
- 7. LSU scored points in 45-48 quarters throughout the 2019 regular season
- 8. Against former LSU assistant coaches as the opposing head coach, LSU is 14-3
  - a. Jimbo Fischer coached at LSU from 2000-06 as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach
- 9. LSU is 34-21-3 against Texas A&M all-time
  - a. It is the largest margin of victory for LSU in the history of the series
    - i. LSU won by 43 points, 50-7

## Offense

- 1. QB **Joe Burrow** became the best single-season passer in the history of the SEC on Saturday with 352 passing yards and three touchdowns on 23-32 passing.
  - *a.* Burrow set the SEC season records for passing yards and tied the record for passing touchdowns
    - *i*. On a 11-yard pass to Clyde Edwards-Helaire in the 3rd quarter, Burrow set the SEC record for passing yards in a season. He currently has 4,366 passing yards in 2019. He passed Tim Couch's 1998 season at Kentucky when he threw for 4,275 yards.
    - *ii.* On an 18-yard pass to Ja'Marr Chase in the 3rd quarter, Burrow tied the SEC record for passing touchdowns in a season with his 44th, tying Drew Lock who threw for 44 in 2017 at Missouri
  - *b.* Burrow has completed at least 20 passes for 15-straight games dating back to the 2018 season
  - *c.* Burrow continues to hold pace for setting the NCAA Record for completion percentage over an entire season. He is 314-401 for a completion percentage of 78.3-percent
    *i.* Colt McCoy had a 76.7 completion percentage at Texas in 2008
  - *d.* Saturday was Burrow's sixth-straight 300-yard passing game and 10th of the season, both are LSU records
- 2. WR Ja'Marr Chase finished the game with 7 catches for 197 yards and two touchdowns
  - *a.* Saturday was Chase's fifth-straight 100-yard receiving yard game which is the secondmost in LSU behind Josh Reed who had six-straight in 2001

- *i.* It was his eighth 100-yard receiving game of the season which is second to Josh Reed's 2001 season with 11 100-yard receiving games
- *b.* Chase has 17 receiving touchdowns this year and is one away from tying the SEC record for receiving touchdowns in a season with Reidel Anthony from Florida in 1996
- *c*. Chase has 1,612 receiving yards this season
  - *i*. That is third all-time in the SEC behind Amari Cooper (Alabama, 2014, 1,727) and Josh Reed (LSU, 2001, 1,740)
- 3. WR Justin Jefferson recorded 6 receptions for 55 yards and a touchdown
  - *a.* Jefferson has 13 touchdown catches in 2019 which is tied for 10th most in SEC History and is No. 2 in LSU history behind Ja'Marr Chase this season
- 4. RB **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** ran the ball 18 times for 87 yards and one touchdown and recorded four catches for 49 yards
- 5. QB Myles Brennan threw his first touchdown pass of the season, a 58-yard pass to WR Racey McMath
  - *a.* The 58-yard reception was McMath's career-long reception and Brennan's career-long pass

## Defense

- 1. The Tiger's defense held Texas A&M to 169 yards (98 pass, 72 rush), registered 6 sack, had three sacks and forced a safety
  - a. The 98 passing yards allowed in the third fewest allowed by an Orgeron coached LSU team
  - b. It was the fifth fewest yards of total offense allowed by an Orgeron coach LSU team
- 2. LB K'Lavon Chaisson had 1.5 sacks. DT Tyler Shelvin, DE Rashard Lawrence, LB Damone Clark and LB Patrick Queen all had one sack. LB Marcel Brooks recorded 0.5 sacks.
- 3. The safety, which was credited to the team, was LSU's first safety since the 2016 Citrus Bowl when Arden Key sacked Lamar Jackson for a safety
- 4. Chaisson led the Tigers with 6 tackles

## Special Teams

- 1. K Cade York was 2-2 kicking field goals, hitting kicks from 51 and 50 yards. He was a perfect 6-6 kicking PATs.
  - a. York's 51-yarder was the longest by an LSU placekicker in Tiger Stadium since Josh Jasper's 53-yarder on 11/13/2010 vs. ULM. It was also LSU's 16th FG of 50+ yards at home in program history.
  - b. York became the first LSU kicker to hit two 50-yard field goals in the same game
