Series Notes: Alabama and LSU will meet for the 84th time on Saturday. The Crimson Tide leads the all-time series, 53-25-5, and won last year's meeting, 29-0, in Baton Rouge. Alabama has won the last eight meetings between the two schools, including a 24-10 win in the Tigers' last visit to Tuscaloosa in 2017. Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 10-4 in his career against LSU, including a 10-3 mark at Alabama. LSU head coach Ed Orgeron is 0-6 all-time against the Crimson Tide, including an 0-3 mark with the Tigers.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES OF BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM: Alabama has won 31 straight and 48 of the last 49 games at its home stadium following the Crimson Tide's 48-7 homecoming performance against Arkansas on Oct. 26. Prior to the Sept. 19, 2015 loss to Ole Miss, the Crimson Tide had not lost a game at home since falling to Texas A&M in 2012. Alabama boasts the best all-time home winning percentage in the FBS at .833 (271-53-3) at Bryant-Denny Stadium since the stadium opened in 1929. Boise State's Albertsons Stadium (269-56), which opened in 1970 is second at .828. Georgia Southern's Paulson Stadium (195-41), which debuted in 1984 is third at .826. Marshall's Joan C. Edwards Stadium (1991) is fourth at .823 (163-35) while Oklahoma's Gaylord Family-Oklahoma Memorial Stadium (1923) is fifth at .814 (401-86-15). The Crimson Tide is 82-7 (.921) at Bryant-Denny Stadium during the tenure of Nick Saban and 78-4 (.951) since the 2008 season.

SABAN'S HOME RECORD: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 141-19 (.881) in home games during his college head coaching career. He owns the advantage at every stop he has made as a college head coach, including an 82-7 (.921) mark while at Alabama. Saban has won 52 of his last 54 contests at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

MORE THAN A DECADE AT NO. 1: With Alabama's Sept. 29 ranking at No. 1, the Crimson Tide has now been ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press poll at least once each season since 2008. The 12-year streak is the longest in the history of the AP rankings. The previous long streak was seven seasons by Miami (Fla.) from 1986-92.

LONGEST TOP-FIVE STREAK: The Crimson Tide's No. 2 ranking in this week's Associated Press Top 25 marks the 65th consecutive AP poll in which Alabama has been ranked in the top-five. That stretch of top-five rankings is the longest streak in the poll's history, surpassing the previous record of 54 straight weeks set by Miami from Oct. 8, 2000 through Oct. 26, 2003. Alabama's run in the top-five began on Nov. 8, 2015, following a dominant 30-16 victory by the seventh-ranked Tide over then-No. 4 LSU at Bryant-Denny Stadium. During the current run, the Crimson Tide has maintained a 55-3 (.948) record and claimed two national championships to go with three Southeastern Conference titles.

LONGEST ACTIVE TOP-10 STREAK: Alabama's No. 2 ranking in this week's Associated Press Top 25 Poll marks the 71st consecutive week the Tide has appeared in the AP top-10, which leads the Football Bowl Subdivision for most consecutive weeks in the top-10 in the writers' poll. Alabama's last appearance below No. 10 was the week of Sept. 27, 2015, when the Tide was No. 13 heading to a matchup at Georgia, which resulted in a 38-10 UA victory over the No. 8 Bulldogs. The Tide has also appeared in 188 consecutive AP polls, dating back to the start of the 2008 season.

SABAN LEADS IN WINS VS. TOP-FIVE TEAMS: Alabama's 45-34 win over No. 4 Oklahoma in the 2018 Capital One Orange Bowl on Dec. 29 was Nick Saban's 24th career victory against a team ranked in the top five of the Associated Press Top 25, the most in college football history. Saban's 24-13 career record in those contests gives him a .649 winning percentage, which is also college football's best. Following Saban on the all-time victory list are Bobby Bowden (18/.378 winning percentage), Barry Switzer (15/.516), Woody Hayes (15/.516), Steve Spurrier (15/.429) and Lou Holtz (15/.419). Saban's record includes six wins in the College Football Playoff: No. 3 Michigan State (38-0) and No. 1 Clemson (45-40) in 2015; No. 4 Washington (24-7) in 2016; No. 1 Clemson (24-6) and No. 3 Georgia (26-23) in 2017; and a 45-34 victory over fourth-ranked Oklahoma last season. Alabama also went 3-0 in BCS National Championship Games (vs. Texas, 37-21, 2009; vs. LSU, 21-0, 2011; vs. Notre Dame, 42-14, 2012).

AGAINST THE TOP 10: Since the start of the 2008 season, the Crimson Tide has posted a 30-10 (.750) overall record against top-10 teams, including a 15-4 (.790) mark versus the top 10 since the inception of the College Football Playoff. In Saban's five national championship seasons at Alabama, his teams have gone 17-2 against top-10 opponents.

OUTSIDE THE TOP 15: In addition to its 89-game winning streak against unranked teams, Alabama has lost just one game to a team ranked outside the top 15 in the Associated Press poll since the start of the 2008 season (No. 19 South Carolina in 2010). For perspective, no team in the FBS has lost fewer than 10 games to teams outside the top 15 in that same time frame.

SABAN VS. AP TOP 25: Alabama's 47-28 win over then-No. 24/21 Texas A&M on Oct. 12 was Nick Saban's 83rd career win vs. the Associated Press Top 25, pushing him past Florida State legend Bobby Bowden for second all-time. Former Penn State head coach Joe Paterno leads the list with 86, three ahead of Saban. Bowden is third with 82, while Alabama's Paul "Bear" Bryant is fourth at 66. Former Duke, Florida and South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier is fifth at 64. Saban's winning percentage against AP ranked teams (83-40, .675) tops Bryant (.592), Bowden (.557), Spurrier (.529) and Paterno (.512).

BEATING THE BEST: The Crimson Tide is 59-15 (.797) against the Associated Press Top 25, including a 32-9 (.781) mark against AP top-10 teams since the start of 2008. Alabama finished 5-1 against ranked opponents in 2018 after facing 10 teams ranked in the AP poll in 2017, going 9-1 and outscoring those opponents by an average score of 38.0-17.3. Alabama finished 8-1 in 2015 against the AP Top 25.

UNRANKED, NO PROBLEM UNDER SABAN: With its 48-7 win over Arkansas on Oct. 26, Alabama has defeated 89 consecutive unranked teams under head coach Nick Saban, the longest streak in FBS history. The current streak began with a win over Colorado on December 30, 2007 in the Independence Bowl. The previous record was 72 games, shared by Miami (Fla.) (1984-95) and Florida (1989-2000). Under Saban, Alabama holds a 93-3 (.970) (89-3, .967 after vacations) mark against unranked opponents.

ALWAYS IN THE HUNT: Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in 137 of 140 regular season games that have had national championship implications. Following the Crimson Tide's 24-21 loss to LSU during the 2010 calendar year, UA was essentially eliminated from a chance to keep itself in the national championship discussion. The final three games of that season mark the only three regular season contests without direct national championship implications over the last 12 seasons.

THE 2010s HAVE BEEN THE TIDE'S DECADE: Since the start of the 2010 season, Alabama has won 121 games to lead all NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision teams. Ohio State is second on the wins list during the decade with 111. Alabama has been the wins leader in two other decades in program history, including the 1960s (85 wins) and 1970s (103 wins). Predating the creation of the NCAA, Penn won 124 games and Harvard won 116 as major college football powers in the 1890s.

ALABAMA HAS MOST WINS SINCE 2008: Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 147 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Crimson Tide won 12 games in 2008, followed by a perfect 14-0 record in 2009, a 10-3 mark in 2010 and a 12-1 record in 2011. Alabama finished 13-1 in 2012 and 2017, 11-2 in 2013, 12-2 in 2014, and 14-1 in 2015, 2016 and 2018. Ohio State is second with 133 wins, followed by Boise State and Clemson tied at No. 3 with 128 and Oklahoma with 124 to round out the top five.

ONE AND ONLY: Since 2014, the start of the College Football Playoff era, Alabama has only lost one game by 13-plus points. The Crimson Tide's only loss by 13-plus points or more in that time period came in last season's 16-44 loss to Clemson in the College Football Playoff National Championship on Jan. 7. To compare, Clemson has three losses by 13-plus points in the same time span while Oklahoma has four and Ohio State has five.

NO MORE THAN ONE: Alabama entered November with no more than one loss for the 12th straight season (since 2008). Only one other FBS program has done that since 1950, the Nebraska Cornhuskers under Tom Osborne. In those 12 seasons, the Crimson Tide has entered November undefeated eight times (2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019).

ESPN COLLEGE GAMEDAY: Alabama will be making its 47th (30-16, .652) appearance on ESPN's College GameDay when the popular pregame show broadcasts from Tuscaloosa prior to the Crimson Tide's matchup with No.1/2 LSU on Nov. 9. It marked Alabama's 38th appearance under head coach Nick Saban (27-10, .730). The 38 appearances in the Saban era are 12 better than Ohio State (26) for the most GameDay appearances since the 2007 season.

SEC NATION: Alabama will appear on SEC Network's popular pregame show SEC Nation for the 32nd time when the Crimson Tide welcomes the No. 1/2 LSU Tigers to Tuscaloosa on Nov. 9. UA has appeared on the broadcast the most of any Southeastern Conference team, holding a 28-3 (.903) mark in those matchups. The Crimson Tide has also hosted a league-high seven times and is a perfect 7-0 in Tuscaloosa since Nation's first broadcast at the start of the 2014 season.

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL

Alabama has been ranked in 801 of the 1,163 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 489-130-8 (.786) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including a 130-18 (.878) mark under head coach Nick Saban. Alabama is also ranked in the AP poll for the 188th consecutive week, topping its previous streak set in the mid-1990s when UA was ranked for 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings. Alabama has started seven seasons at No. 1 (2018, 2017, 2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 29 seasons (1991-2019), and in 2014, Amway became the title sponsor. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches' poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2017 seasons. The Tide has compiled four UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 and 1979) and six USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2017) coaches poll national titles.

TIDE'S TURNOVER MARGIN: Through eight games played during the 2019 season, Alabama leads the nation for turnover margin, averaging +1.63 per a game. The Crimson Tide is also tied for fourth in turnovers lost (five) and tied for sixth in turnovers gained (18).

NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS IN THE SABAN ERA: Senior defensive back Trevon Diggs recorded his second consecutive non-offensive touchdown in a game by returning an interception for an 84-yard touchdown in the second quarter against Arkansas on Oct. 26, marking Alabama's 72nd non-offensive touchdown of the Nick Saban era and the fourth in 2019. The first of this season came on a blocked punt return by sophomore linebacker Ale Kaho against Ole Miss on Sept. 28. That was followed up by another blocked punt return, this time from redshirt sophomore wide receiver Tyrell Shavers in the Tide's win at Texas A&M on Oct.12. Diggs notched his first non-offensive touchdown of the season on Oct. 19 against Tennessee by recovering a fumble for a 100-yard touchdown. Alabama totaled seven non-offensive scores in 2018 and recorded a single-season record 15 in 2016, which led the Football Bowl Subdivision and was the most in a season by any FBS team in the last 20 years. Alabama scored a non-offensive touchdown in 10 consecutive games dating from to the CFP Semifinal vs. Michigan State on Dec. 31, 2015, to the Texas A&M game on Oct. 22, 2016, and had 14 non-offensive touchdowns in that span – four interceptions, four punt returns, five fumble recoveries and a kickoff return.

FIRST TIME STARTERS: Redshirt sophomore quarterback Mac Jones and freshman placekicker/punter Ty Perine became the 15th and 16th Crimson Tide student-athletes to make their first career start this season when they took the field against Arkansas on Oct. 26. The duo joined freshman defensive linemen Byron Young who started against Tennessee on Oct. 19 and Justin Eboigbe (Southern Miss on Sept. 21). Junior running back Najee Harris and freshman defensive back Jordan Battle recorded their first starts against New Mexico State on Sept. 7. That duo joined running back Jerome Ford, offensive linemen Landon Dickerson, Evan Neal and Chris Owens, defensive lineman DJ Dale, linebackers Christian Harris and Shane Lee, defensive backs Josh Jobe and Jared Mayden and placekicker/punter Will Reichard who all started for the first time in the season opener against Duke on Aug. 31 in Atlanta.

FIRST TIME PLAYERS: True freshman placekicker/punter Ty Perine became the 22nd Crimson Tide student-athlete to make his first career appearance this season when he took the field in the third quarter against Tennessee on Oct. 19. Perine joined freshman defensive lineman Justin Eboigbe who played for the first time at South Carolina on Sept. 14. The Crimson Tide had six student-athletes make their first career appearance vs. New Mexico State on Sept. 7, including four true freshmen in tight end Jahleel Billingsley, linebacker King Mwikuta and offensive linemen Pierce Quick and Tanner Bowles. A pair of redshirt freshmen also made their Crimson Tide debuts, including linebacker Jarez Parks and defensive lineman Christian Barmore. The group joined 14 true freshmen who made an appearance against Duke on Aug. 31, including: Marcus Banks (DB), Jordan Battle (DB), Scooby Carter (DB), Darrian Dalcourt (OL), DJ Dale (DL), Christian Harris (LB), DeMarcco Hellams (DB), Shane Lee (LB), John Metchie III (WR), Evan Neal (OL), Will Reichard (PK), Keilan Robinson (RB), Taulia Tagovailoa (QB) and Byron Young (DL). Redshirt junior Landon Dickerson (OL), redshirt freshmen Jalyn Armour-Davis (DB) and Tommy Brown (OL), along with redshirt sophomore Kendall Randolph (TE/OL) also saw their first playing time against the Blue Devils.

FRESHMAN STARTERS: Alabama leads the nation in freshman starters with nine players taking the field for the opening play of a game following last weekend's contest against Arkansas on Oct. 26. The Crimson Tide has started one freshman on offense and two on special teams with an NCAA-high six on defense during the 2019 season. UMass, Stanford and Texas A&M sit tied at second with seven, while two other programs have started six freshmen.

LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL: Alabama has had more draft picks over the last 11 drafts (87) than any other college in the nation. Twenty-nine of those picks have been first-round selections and 45 have gone in the first two rounds. The list of 87 features six Super Bowl champions, 13 Pro Bowl selections, seven All-Pro members and one Offensive Rookie of the Year. Following the 2019 Draft that saw 10 former Alabama standouts selected, the Crimson Tide has now had 32 players taken in the last three NFL Drafts, marking the third consecutive year 10 or more players have been chosen. Alabama had five players picked on offense and five on defense in the 2019 draft.

2019 NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw 10 former players selected in the 2019 NFL Draft, including three first-round picks in Quinnen Williams (No. 3, New York Jets), Jonah Williams (No. 11, Cincinnati Bengals) and Josh Jacobs (No. 24, Oakland Raiders). Irv Smith Jr. (No. 50, Minnesota Vikings) followed in round two with Damien Harris (No. 87, New England Patriots) then going as a third-round selection. In the next round, Christian Miller (No. 115, Carolina Panthers) heard his name called followed by a trio of Crimson Tide players going in the fifth round, including: Deionte Thompson (No. 139, Arizona Cardinals), Ross Pierschbacher (No. 153, Washington Redskins) and Mack Wilson (No. 155, Cleveland Browns). Isaiah Buggs (No. 191, Pittsburgh Steelers) rounded out the Tide's 10 picks, going in the sixth round. The 10 selections ties Alabama's 2017 roster along with the 1945 squad (32-round draft) for the second-most players taken in one draft in program history. The Crimson Tide all-time mark is 12 from the 2018 draft which also set a Southeastern Conference record for the most players taken in a single draft from one member team. Alabama has now had double-digit players selected in three consecutive drafts and has produced multiple first-round picks in eight of the last 11 NFL Drafts with single first-round selections in 2009, 2015 and 2016.

OFF-THE-FIELD NOTES

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama's success on the field over the past 12 seasons under Nick Saban has coincided with the Crimson Tide's success in the classroom. The 2019 squad is no exception as Alabama enters the season with eight players who already have degrees in hand going into the season opener with Duke. The seven Tide graduates are: Giles Amos, Mike Bernier, Shyheim Carter, Landon Dickerson, Miller Forristall, Anfernee Jennings, Chris Owens and Matt Womack. Since 2013, Alabama has seen 158 degrees earned (graduate and undergraduate) by players who were still suiting up for the Crimson Tide after having graduated. Since the 2010 season, Alabama has seen an impressive 24 players earn a master's degree before stepping foot on the field for the final time.

GRADUATING WITH THE BEST: The Alabama football team has not only been dominant on the field, but also in the classroom. The Crimson Tide remained at an 84 in the most recent Graduation Success Rate (GSR) figures released last November. Those numbers covered student-athletes who attended the University during 2008-11. The 84 mark ranked fourth among Southeastern Conference football programs, marking the 10th year in a row that the Crimson Tide football squad has ranked in the top four in the SEC by GSR.

ACADEMIC PROWESS: The Tide has been a model of success on the football field, but the team has generated plenty of accolades in the classroom as well. Below are some of the academic highlights under Nick Saban.

- A total of eight Crimson Tide players will take the field with their degrees in hand for the season opener with Duke.
- Earned Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 84 in 2017-18 ranked fourth among SEC football programs.
- In 2018, Alabama ranked among the national leaders with 22 graduates on its roster during postseason play. The Tide led the nation in graduates on its roster during postseason play in 2015 (29), 2014 (22) and 2013 (28).
- Alabama's five national title football teams under Nick Saban (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017) included 114 players who had earned their degrees prior to game time.
- The 2014 team was recognized as one of the nation's top academic programs, ranking third in the annual academic rankings of the top 25 college football teams produced by New America, a Washington D.C. think-tank.
- The 2011 BCS national championship team had 21 graduates playing in the bowl game, which was the second most in the country.
- That 2011 team led the SEC with 38 student-athletes being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- The 2009 BCS national championship team led the country with 11 graduates playing in the bowl game.
- In 2017-18, Alabama finished second in the number of football student-athletes being named to the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll with 10 honorees. Alabama topped that list in 2009, 2010 and 2011 and shared the top spot in the 2015-16 academic year.

CRIMSON TIDE IN THE COMMUNITY: Last season, Alabama worked 400-plus hours of community service in Tuscaloosa and the surrounding areas. The team volunteered its time across numerous areas during the 2018 season including in schools, hospitals, with Habitat for Humanity and on campus.

ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM NOMINEE CHRIS OWENS: Chris Owens was nominated for the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. The award is one of the most esteemed off-the-field honors in college football and recognizes nominees across all NCAA and NAIA divisions for the 2019 season. While at UA, Owens has been a team leader in the community and on campus. He has given his time to several groups in his time with the football program, including visits to the Tuscaloosa Magnet Elementary to promote the importance of reading while sharing some of his favorite books. He has also volunteered at the VA Medical Center and, most recently, helped to rebuild neighboring Lee County in tornado relief efforts.

ALABAMA ATHLETICS AS A WHOLE: The University of Alabama has built a total program, winning championships on the field and bringing home plenty of academic awards in the classroom.

- Since 2008, Crimson Tide athletics teams have won 11 national championships in five different sports and 26 SEC championships in eight different sports.
- Alabama claimed two SEC team titles during the 2018-19 academic year, including football and softball.
- On a department-wide basis, Alabama's approximately 600 student-athletes earned better than a 3.25 grade point average. All 17 programs earned better than a 2.7 GPA with 15 earning better than a 3.0. A total of seven Tide teams earned over a 3.5 GPA in 2018-19, marking the ninth year in a row that at least five teams have met that standard.
- Alabama was also prolific when it came to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, earning the accolade 361 times during the 2018-19 academic year. The Crimson Tide had 90, 66 and 126 student-athletes named to the SEC Fall, Winter and Spring Academic Honor Rolls and 79 named to the First-Year Academic Honor Roll.
- Alabama was once again among the nation's leaders in Academic All-America honors, totaling 10 during the 2018-19 academic year. The Crimson Tide's total makes Alabama the only school to earn double-digit honors the last six years in a row.
- Alabama has earned Academic All-America honors a Division I-best 98 times since 2009-10 and 66 times over the last six years. The Tide's six-year total is 5 better than second-place Stanford over that span. Alabama has also made a significant jump in the rankings when it comes to honors since 2000, jumping Notre Dame in 2017-18 to move up to second place with 144.

10 POINTS OR LESS: Alabama's 48-7 win against Arkansas on Oct. 26 marked the 89th time under head coach Nick Saban that the Crimson Tide has held opponents to 10 points or less and the 33rd time in the last 67 games dating to the start of the 2015 season.

TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS: With a fumble recovery and three interceptions against Arkansas on Oct. 26, the Crimson Tide has now forced at least one turnover in 62 of its last 67 contests dating back to the start of the 2015 season. During the current run, the Crimson Tide has forced 111 turnovers (73 interceptions, 38 fumbles) and returned 24 of those miscues for touchdowns.

POINTS OFF TURNOVERS: Alabama has caused at least one turnover in each of its games this season with eight fumble recoveries and 10 interceptions. The Crimson Tide is outscoring opponents, 79-17, in points off turnovers, adding 24 in the first half against Arkansas on Oct. 26. The victory over the Razorbacks marked the fourth time this season Alabama has earned double-digit points off turnovers (Sept. 7 vs. New Mexico State – 17; Sept. 14 at South Carolina – 10; Sept. 21 vs. Southern Miss – 14; Oct. 26 vs. Arkansas – 24).

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 200: Mississippi State's 169 yards in total offense on Nov. 10 of last season marked the 50th time in the last 163 games under Nick Saban (since the start of the 2008 season) that the Crimson Tide defense has held the opposition to fewer than 200 yards of total offense.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 300: The Crimson Tide defense held Arkansas to 213 yards of total offense in Alabama's 48-7 victory over the Razorbacks on Oct. 26, marking the 110th time in 175 games (62.9 percent) under head coach Nick Saban that the Tide has held an opponent to less than 300 yards of total offense. The Tide has held 22 of its last 37 opponents below 300 yards, dating back to the start of the 2017 campaign.

HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE: Since the start of the 2009 season, no team has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama has surrendered only 232 touchdowns over the last 147 games. That is 55 fewer than the second most in the nation (LSU with 287).

TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND: Alabama has permitted just 35 scores on the ground in its last 67 games dating to the start of the 2015 season. The Crimson Tide allowed 11 rushing touchdowns in 2018 after allowing nine rushing touchdowns in 2017. The Tide defense led the nation in 2016 with only five rushing touchdowns allowed, one year after giving up only seven rushing scores through 15 games in 2015, the second-lowest total in the country. Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, the Crimson Tide has allowed 91 rushing touchdowns. Iowa is No. 2 in that category, giving up 141 since 2007, followed by Ohio State (146) at #3. At #4 with 156 is Utah and TCU (167) at No. 5 rounds out the top five.

RUSHING DEFENSE: Alabama has surrendered only 24 individual 100-yard rushing performances dating back to the 2005 season, a mark that is the fewest in the nation. Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival in 2007, the Tide has allowed 19 players to rush for more than 100 yards in a game.

DEFENSE STEPPING UP AGAINST ARKANSAS: Arkansas gained 53 yards on its first 10 plays before a fumble that set up Alabama's first touchdown (Oct. 26). Following that fumble, the Razorbacks gained a grand total of 49 yards on the following five drives (19 plays), resulting in three punts and two interceptions. In that same time frame, Alabama totaled 196 yards and 31 points. The Hogs gained 51 yards on their next drive before throwing a pick to give the Crimson Tide a 41-0 halftime lead.

GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK: Alabama finished at Texas A&M (Oct. 12) with a season-high five sacks, two more than it has had in a single game all season. Redshirt junior linebacker Terrell Lewis led the way with a career-best two sacks, while redshirt senior linebacker Anfernee Jennings and redshirt freshman defensive lineman Christian Barmore added one apiece. Freshmen Justin Eboigbe (defensive line) and Shane Lee (linebacker) combined for another.

ALABAMA NEARLY DOUBLES SEASON TOTAL OF PASS BREAKUPS: Heading into the matchup at Texas A&M on Oct. 12, Alabama had compiled 13 pass breakups to start the season. Against Texas A&M, the Tide accounted for 10 PBU's with senior defensive backs Shyheim Carter and Trevon Diggs and sophomore defensive back Patrick Surtain II leading the way with two each.

McKINNEY CAREER-HIGH MARK FOR TACKLES: Junior defensive back Xavier McKinney turned in a new career-high total for tackles with 13 stops in against Ole Miss on Sept. 28. Through eight games, McKinney has accumulated a team-best 56 tackles.

MAYDEN TOTALS CAREER HIGH FOR TACKLES: Senior defensive back Jared Mayden had a career-high total for tackles with eight stops against Southern Miss on Sept. 21, five of which were solo. His previous career high was five at South Carolina (Sept. 14).

DJ DALE SELECTED AS SEC CO-DEFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK: Freshman defensive lineman DJ Dale earned SEC Co-Defensive Lineman of the Week honors for his performance against Duke on Aug. 31. The Birmingham, Ala., native put together a standout performance in the trenches in his first career start, finishing with three tackles including half a stop for a loss. Dale helped the Tide defense limit Duke's rushing attack to only 107 yards on 32 carries as part of just 204 total yards of offense by the Blue Devils on the afternoon.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

BALL PROTECTION: In the last 163 games dating to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has turned the ball over only 176 times (96 fumbles, 80 interceptions) for 1.08 turnovers per game. Since 2009, the Tide has turned the ball over only 158 times in 148 games (1.07/game). That number since 2009 includes 62 interceptions in 3,761 attempts (1 INT every 60.7 attempts) by UA starting quarterbacks and 24 fumbles in 3,851 carries (one fumble lost every 160.5 carries) by the Tide's top two running backs.

500+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE: Alabama recorded 573 yards of total offense against Ole Miss on Sept. 28. The 500-plus yard performance marked the 29th time in the last 67 games, dating to the start of the 2015 season, that the Crimson Tide has eclipsed the 500-yard mark. Last season, UA totaled 500 or more yards in 12 of 15 games to set a single-season school record. The Tide has eclipsed 500 yards of offense in five of the eight games in the 2019 campaign.

600+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE: Alabama recorded 603 yards of total offense against New Mexico State on Sept. 7, marking the first time the Tide exceeded 600 yards of total offense since Oct. 6, 2018 at Arkansas when the Tide tallied 639 yards. Overall, the Tide's 603 yards against the Aggies was the 14th 600+ yard game under head coach Nick Saban.

ALABAMA 300+ YARDS RUSHING IN A GAME: Alabama rushed for 318 yards against New Mexico State on Sept. 7, marking the first time the Crimson Tide rushed for 300-plus yards since Oct. 14, 2017 when the Tide had 308 yards against Arkansas.

OPENING DRIVE TOUCHDOWNS: Junior running back Najee Harris' found the endzone on the opening possession against Tennessee on Oct. 19. With that score, Alabama extended its streak to 32 straight wins when scoring a touchdown on its first offensive possession of a game. The Tide's last loss after finding the end zone on its first drive was to the Oklahoma Sooners in the 2014 Allstate Sugar Bowl.

SCORING STREAK CONTINUES: Alabama extended its school record for consecutive games with a score to 250 thanks redshirt sophomore placekicker Joseph Bulovas' 31-yard field goal in the first quarter against the Arkansas Razorbacks on Oct. 26. The Crimson Tide was last held off the scoreboard in a 9-0 loss to Auburn on Nov. 18, 2000. Alabama has a 196-53 (.787) record over the course of the current streak.

ALABAMA IN THE RED ZONE: The Crimson Tide went 6-for-7 on its attempts in the red zone against Arkansas on Oct. 26, scoring four touchdowns and two field goals. For the season, Alabama has scored on 32 of its 38 attempts in the red zone (25 touchdowns; seven field goals).

MOST POINTS IN A QUARTER SINCE 2014: Alabama's 31 points in the second quarter against Ole Miss on Sept. 28 marked the most scored by the Crimson Tide in a quarter since it had 35 in the second against Texas A&M on Oct. 18, 2014.

ONE FOR THE BOOKS IN COLUMBIA: The Crimson Tide's 495 passing yards at South Carolina on Sept. 14 set the new Alabama single-game record, surpassing the Tide's previous high of 484 in the 1969 Iron Bowl. Quarterback Tua Tagovailoa's 444 yards through the air were the third most by a quarterback in a single game while Mac Jones added 51 yards on three attempts. In all, Tagovailoa and Jones were 33-of-39 for 495 yards and five touchdowns.

HARRIS ECLIPSES 100-YARD RUSHING MARK: Junior running back Najee Harris finished with 105 yards on the ground against Tennessee last weekend. Harris is the only Alabama rusher to go over the century mark this season. It is the fourth 100-plus yard performance of his career (Arkansas State on Sept. 8, 2018 – 135 yards; Southern Miss on Sept. 21, 2019 – 110 yards; Texas A&M on Oct. 12, 2019 – 114 yards; Tennessee on Oct. 17, 2019 – 105 yards).

DeVONTA'S NATIONAL RANKS: After junior wide receiver DeVonta Smith's 47-yard touchdown catch at Texas A&M on Oct. 12, he is now tied for fifth in the nation in receiving touchdowns (9). Smith's yardage total also ranks near the top with a team-leading 721 receiving yards, a total that is third-best in the SEC and ranks 15th nationally.

RUGGS III AVERAGE TOUCHDOWN LENGTH: Junior wideout Henry Ruggs III has accumulated 23 touchdown receptions for his career, a total that is third on the Alabama career touchdown receptions list. The Montgomery, Ala., native is currently averaging 40.2 yards per touchdown over his career, including an average of 21.7 yards on six touchdown catches in the first eight games this season.

TWO OVER 100: With 100-yard receiving performances by DeVonta Smith (136) and Henry Ruggs III (122) against South Carolina on Sept. 14, Alabama has now recorded nine games with two receivers over 100 yards, including one this year and three in 2018. Prior to 2018, Alabama had only seen receiving duos post 100 or more receiving yards in the same game five times in program history and only once in the Nick Saban era.

FOUR ABOVE 1K CAREER RECEIVING YARDS: The Alabama roster currently features four wideouts with 1,000-plus yards receiving for their careers. With a 136-yard receiving performance at South Carolina on Sept. 14, junior DeVonta Smith eclipsed the 1,000-yard mark. In addition, sophomore Jaylen Waddle moved past 1,000 yards with a 12-yard performance against the Gamecocks. The duo joined juniors Jerry Jeudy and Henry Ruggs III, who had each amassed over 1,000 yard receiving previously. Jeudy leads the group with 2,261 yards for his career, a total that ranks fifth all-time in Alabama annals. Smith is next on the list at 1,574 with Ruggs III behind him at 1,483 while Waddle rounds out the foursome with 1,145 total receiving yards. Prior to the matchup in Columbia, Alabama had only seen three 1,000-plus yard receivers on a roster at the same time. The last time three receivers were on the same roster at the same time and accumulated over 1,000 yards receiving was during the 2016 season with O.J. Howard (1,457), Calvin Ridley (1,814) and ArDarius Stewart (1,713).

JEUDY MAKING HIS MARK ON ALL-TIME RECEIVING YARDS LIST: Junior Jerry Jeudy has accumulated 2,261 receiving yards for his career, a total that is fifth-best on the Alabama career receiving yards list. The Deerfield Beach, Fla., native is currently averaging 85.3 yards per game in 2019 and has totaled 100-plus yards receiving on eight occasions during his time with Crimson Tide, including three matchups this season.

TUA'S TOUCHDOWN RESPONSIBILITY: Junior Quarterback Tua Tagovailoa set an Alabama single-season record for touchdown responsibility in 2018 with 48 scores (43 passing/five rushing). Tagovailoa has thrown for 27 and ran for two touchdowns (29 total) as a junior. Tagovailoa, the school's career leader in total touchdowns accounts for 90, a number that includes 81 through the air and nine on the ground (31 games), an average of 2.6 touchdowns per game for his career.

TAGOVAILOA SETS CAREER PASSING TOUCHDOWNS RECORD: On the Crimson Tide's second touchdown of the first quarter at Texas A&M on Oct. 12, junior signal-caller Tua Tagovailoa set the UA career touchdown record, moving ahead of AJ McCarron (2010-13) who previously held the record with 77. With his four passing touchdowns at Texas A&M, Tagovailoa now has 81 for his career.

TAGOVAILOA NOW THIRD ON UA CAREER PASSING YARDS LIST: With his 153 passing yards against Tennessee on Oct. 19, junior quarterback Tua Tagovailoa has accumulated 6,768 passing yards in 31 career games to rank third all-time at Alabama. Tagovailoa is now 1,156 yards shy of passing John Parker Wilson (2005-08) who is second on the list with 7,924 yards. AJ McCarron (2010-13), the program's all-time leader, finished with 9,019 yards across his four seasons in Tuscaloosa.

TAGOVAILOA THROWS FOR 300+ YARDS FOR THE NINTH TIME: Tua Tagovailoa threw for 418 yards against Ole Miss on Sept. 28, marking his ninth career 300+ passing performance at Alabama, the most in school history. He has now accounted for nine of the 38 performances of 300 or more passing yards by a UA quarterback in school history. The junior quarterback has also thrown over +290 yards on 13 occasions.

TAGOVAILOA SETS PASSING TOUCHDOWN MARK; THROWS FOUR-PLUS TOUCHDOWNS AGAIN: Junior quarterback Tua Tagovailoa's four touchdown passes at Texas A&M on Oct. 12 marked the 11th time he has thrown for four or more touchdowns in a game during his career (fifth time in eight games in 2019). The 11 games with at least four touchdowns passes AJ McCarron (2010-13) for the Alabama program record. Last season, Tagovailoa threw for four or more scores six times to set a new single-season school record. The Crimson Tide has played 1,285 games in program history and only 13 times prior to Tagovailoa had a Tide quarterback thrown for four touchdowns in a game.

TAGOVAILOA VS. SEC: In four games against Southeastern Conference opponents this season, quarterback Tua Tagovailoa has thrown 1,310 yards and 15 touchdowns with only two interceptions on 86-of-118 passing (72.9).

TOUCHDOWN TOSSES: Tua Tagovailoa has 27 touchdowns to tie for third in the nation through eight games of the 2019 season. He has those touchdowns on just 145 completions and 194 pass attempts. That averages out to score every 5.4 completions and 7.2 attempts.

TRACKING TUA: Tua Tagovailoa is authoring another impressive season at quarterback in 2019. The junior is among the highest-rated passers in the nation and has completed 74.7 percent of his passes for 2,166 yards and 27 touchdowns despite playing in the fourth quarter only three times this season, going 10-of-12 for 103 yards and two touchdowns (210.4 passer rating). A deeper look at his numbers shows he's been a consistent performer regardless of quarter, down or field position.

TAGOVAILOA PASSING TD PER ATTEMPT: Tua Tagovailoa threw for 155 yards on 12 attempts in the first half against Tennessee on Oct. 19 and is averaging a touchdown pass every 7.2 attempts or 13.9 percent of his total attempts (194). During his three seasons in an Alabama uniform, Tagovailoa has thrown 81 touchdowns across 626 career passing attempts, which averages out to a passing touchdown every 7.7 attempts or 12.9 percent of his career attempts.

250+ AT HALF: For the fifth time in his career, Tua Tagovailoa accounted for 250 or more yards with his performance in the first half against Ole Miss on Sept. 28. He accounted for 286 passing yards in the first half at South Carolina (Sept. 14) and 301 against the Rebels. His career high for first half passing yards is 334 at Arkansas in 2018, going 10-of-12 with four touchdowns against the Hogs.

CAREER GAME FOR DeVONTA SMITH: In the SEC home-opener against Ole Miss on Sept. 28, junior wide receiver DeVonta Smith became the program's all-time receiving touchdowns leader in a game with his fourth catch in the second quarter, passing the previous record of three touchdown catches, which was held by multiple players and last achieved by ArDarius Stewart against Mississippi State on Nov. 12, 2016. Smith also passed Amari Cooper for most receiving yards in a game (224). The junior finished the day with 11 receptions for 274 yards and five receiving touchdowns. His five touchdown receptions ties the SEC record for touchdowns in a game (last in 2006 by Sidney Rice, South Carolina) and 274 yards ranks sixth in a game in SEC annals. Smith also became the sixth player in the SEC to score at least two touchdowns and go over 200 yards in a game, which he did in one quarter alone.

JUDY HAULS IN CAREER RECORD CATCHES AGAINST DUKE: Jerry Judy set a new career-high total for receptions with 10 against Duke in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game on Aug. 31. The junior wide receiver finished with 137 yards and a score as part of his 10 catches. The double-digit receiving performance was the Crimson Tide's first since ArDarius Stewart (2013-16) caught 10 passes against Auburn on Nov. 26, 2016.

CAREER GAME FOR HARRIS: In the SEC-opener against South Carolina (Sept. 14), junior running back Najee Harris recorded the most receiving yards (87) for a running back since Shaun Alexander's 110 receiving yards against Mississippi State on Nov. 14, 1998. Harris also marks the only running back to score two receiving touchdowns in a game since the 1998 season.

RUGGS III SHINES IN FIRST QUARTER VS. SOUTHERN MISS: Henry Ruggs III recorded a career-high 131 yards on two catches for two touchdown receptions in the first quarter alone against Southern Miss on Sept. 21. He finished the game against the Golden Eagles with a career-high 148 yards and two scores on only five receptions.

SMITH NAMED SEC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR PERFORMANCE AGAINST OLE MISS:

Junior wide receiver DeVonta Smith was selected as the Southeastern Conference's Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Crimson Tide's 59-31 win against Ole Miss on Sept. 28. The junior set Alabama single-game receiving records with 274 yards and five touchdowns, while hauling in a career-best 11 passes on the day to average 24.9 yards per catch, the second-best mark in a single game by a wide receiver at UA with at least eight catches. Smith's five touchdowns tied the SEC single-game record while his 274 yards ranked sixth in league annals.

TAGOVAILOA NAMED SEC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR PERFORMANCE AT SOUTH CAROLINA:

Alabama quarterback Tua Tagovailoa was selected as the Southeastern Conference's Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Crimson Tide's 47-23 win at South Carolina on Sept. 14. Tagovailoa shined in his first SEC matchup of the 2019 campaign, going 28-of-36 for 444 yards and five touchdowns. With his day in Columbia, Tagovailoa became the first quarterback in Alabama history to throw for 400-plus yards and five touchdowns in the same game.

DICKERSON EARNS SEC OFFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK HONORS FOLLOWING SOUTH CAROLINA VICTORY:

Alabama offensive tackle Landon Dickerson was selected as the Southeastern Conference's Offensive Lineman of the Week following his performance in Alabama's 47-23 win at South Carolina on Sept. 14. The redshirt junior turned in his most consistent performance as a member of the Crimson Tide, with 58 snaps at guard and did not allow a quarterback hurry, pressure or sack against the Gamecocks.

TAGOVAILOA NAMED SEC CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Junior quarterback Tua Tagovailoa earned SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors for his performance against Duke on Aug. 31. The Tide signal-caller led an Alabama offense that put up 42 points and 512 yards of total offense. He finished with a career-high total for completions as part of a 26-for-31 performance that resulted in 336 yards and four touchdowns.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

PUNT DEFENSE CONTINUES IMPRESSIVE PLAY IN 2019: Alabama's punt return defense remains stout this season, allowing just five returns for 37 total yards this year. Last season Alabama gave up just nine punt returns in 42 attempts for 24 yards to rank fifth in the Football Bowl Subdivision in punt return defense at 2.67 yards per return.

PERINE'S PUNT PERFORMANCE: In his first career appearance against Tennessee, freshman punter Ty Perine averaged 46.5 yards after sending a pair of punts for a combined 93 yards against Tennessee on Oct. 19. He recorded a long of 51 on his second attempt and followed that up by making the tackle on the returner.

RETURN YARDS A PLENTY FOR WADDLE AND RUGGS: Sophomore wide receiver Jaylen Waddle and junior wide receiver Henry Ruggs III combined for 259 return yards at Texas A&M on Oct. 12. Waddle's 128 punt return yards ranks No. 3 in the Alabama record book for most in a game, while both set career-best marks in those respective categories.

WADDLE'S PUNT RETURN RANKING: Sophomore wide receiver Jaylen Waddle leads the nation in punt return average (21.6) with 14 punt returns for 302 yards over the past eight games. Waddle is averaging 17.8 yards for his career, a total that ranks atop the Alabama career list.

WADDLE EARNS SEC SPECIAL TEAMS OF THE WEEK HONORS FOLLOWING TEXAS A&M VICTORY: Alabama sophomore Jaylen Waddle was selected as the Southeastern Conference's Special Teams Player of the Week following his performance in Alabama's 47-28 win at Texas A&M on Oct. 12. The sophomore recorded 128 yards on four punt returns, a total that ranked the third-most in Crimson Tide single-game annals. Against the Aggies, Waddle averaged 32.0 yards per return with a long of 43.

SERIES NOTES

THE ALABAMA-LSU SERIES: Alabama leads the series with LSU 53-25-5, which dates back to the 1895 season. The 2019 game will be the 84th meeting between these two long-time Southern football rivals. Since 2005, the LSU-Alabama games have been true battles, with seven of those games being decided by seven points or less. During head coach Nick Saban's tenure in Tuscaloosa, six of the 12 duels between the two teams have been decided by that same narrow margin, with three of those games going into overtime. During the last meeting in Tuscaloosa in 2017, Jalen Hurts rushed for one score and threw for a second as the Crimson Tide handed the Tigers a 24-10 defeat at Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Tigers won the inaugural meeting in Baton Rouge, 12-6, on Nov. 18, 1895. The two teams did not meet again until the 1902 season, with LSU prevailing once again. Alabama's first series win came on Nov. 9, 1903, in Baton Rouge as the Crimson Tide scored a 10-0 victory. From 1919-45, Alabama posted a 12-game unbeaten streak (9-0-3) against LSU. The series was resumed during the 1944 season with the Tigers gaining a slight advantage over the next nine meetings, posting a 5-3-1 record from 1946-58. Alabama went 16-2 (.889) against LSU from 1964-81, including a series-best 11-game winning streak from 1971-81. LSU also ended UA's school record 31-game (30-0-1) unbeaten streak with a 17-13 win at Bryant-Denny Stadium in 1993. The Tigers snapped a 15-game winless streak to the Crimson Tide in Tiger Stadium with a 30-28 win in Baton Rouge on Nov. 4, 2000. Alabama snapped a five-game series skid with the 27-21 overtime win in Baton Rouge in 2008 and followed that with a 24-15 win in Tuscaloosa in 2009. In 2011, the Tide fell to the Tigers 9-6 in overtime in the regular-season contest before meeting for the BCS National Championship, where Alabama came out on top, 21-0. Alabama then produced one of the more memorable victories with a come-from-behind 21-17 victory at Tiger Stadium in 2012 as AJ McCarron found T.J. Yeldon on a screen pass for a 28-yard touchdown with 51 seconds remaining in the game. Alabama pulled away in the second half for a convincing 38-17 win in 2013. In 2014, a stunning last-minute drive in the fourth quarter by Blake Sims produced a game-tying field goal to send the 2014 matchup into overtime. The Crimson Tide would secure the win, 20-13, as Sims found DeAndrew White in the corner of the end zone for a six-yard score to push UA ahead for the win in Baton Rouge. In 2015, Derrick Henry rushed for three touchdowns and the Tide defense limited LSU to just 182 yards in a 30-16 Alabama win. During the 2016 matchup, Jalen Hurts engineered two fourth-quarter scoring drives to break open a scoreless tie as No. 1-ranked Alabama downed the 15th-ranked Tigers, 10-0, at Tiger Stadium. Last time out, quarterback Tua Tagovailoa and the Crimson Tide shutout the Tigers 29-0 on Nov. 3, 2018.

SABAN VS. LSU: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 10-4 (.714) in his career against LSU and has won the last eight meetings with the Bayou Bengals, following last year's 29-0 shutout in Baton Rouge. The Tide defeated LSU, 24-10, in UA's last visit to Tuscaloosa in 2017. Alabama defeated the Tigers, 10-0, in Baton Rouge in 2016, 30-16 at Bryant-Denny Stadium in 2015 and took down Tigers, 20-13, in overtime in Baton Rouge in 2014. Saban's squad defeated LSU, 38-17, in Tuscaloosa in 2013. Alabama earned a victory in the final minutes in 2012 in Baton Rouge, coming away with a last-minute, 21-17 win. Saban also beat the Tigers in the 2012 BCS National Championship Game (21-0) in New Orleans. Prior to that, Alabama had lost two in a row with a 9-6 overtime defeat in Tuscaloosa on Nov. 5, 2011, and a 24-21 loss in Baton Rouge in 2010. Alabama won the 2008 and 2009 meetings, posting a 27-21 overtime victory in 2008 and a 24-15 win in 2009. Before his arrival in Tuscaloosa, Saban-coached teams were 0-1 against LSU, losing 46-25 to the Tigers while at Michigan State in the 1995 Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La. Saban was the head coach at LSU from 2000-04 and compiled a 48-16 (.750) record, leading the Tigers to two SEC Championships during his tenure. In 2003, Saban coached the Tigers to a 13-1 record and a 21-14 win over Oklahoma in the BCS National Championship Game played at the Sugar Bowl in New Orleans, La.

ALABAMA-LSU AT VARIOUS SITES: The Alabama-LSU series has been played at six different sites since the initial meeting in 1895. The city of Baton Rouge has hosted the most games in the series (38), with Alabama posting a 28-9-2 record on the LSU campus. New Orleans is the only other Louisiana city to host the series, with Alabama and LSU playing to a 7-7 tie in New Orleans in 1921 and the Crimson Tide claiming the 2011 national championship inside the Superdome, 21-0, over the Tigers. Four Alabama cities have played host to this rivalry, including Tuscaloosa (13-7), Mobile (1-2-1), Montgomery (2-0) and Birmingham (8-7-1).

ALABAMA-LSU SERIES IS A LONG ONE: The LSU series is tied for the third-longest series in school history. The two teams first met on Nov. 23, 1895, the 15th game in Crimson Tide history, and the 2019 game marks the 84th meeting between the two teams. Only Tennessee (102) and Mississippi State (102) have played Alabama more than LSU. Auburn and LSU have played the Tide 83 times. The series with the Tigers is also the fourth-oldest in UA history with a current SEC member, trailing only Auburn (1892), Ole Miss (1894) and Georgia, which played Alabama for the first time on Nov. 2, 1895, three weeks before the Tide's first game with LSU.

GENERAL NOTES

SABAN MOVING UP SEC WINS LIST: Alabama head coach Nick Saban's 122 conference wins (including SEC championship games) ranks No. 3 on the SEC career conference wins list. Saban ranks first in league history in SEC regular season winning percentage at .824 (122-26). He is also second in SEC history in winning percentage in all games at .841 (196-37). Saban is fifth on the league's career wins list at 196 victories.

137-7 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: Under head coach Nick Saban, the Crimson Tide is 137-7 (.951) when leading at the half. Alabama has held the lead in 54 of its last 67 games dating back to the start of the 2015 season. Alabama is also 121-4 (.968) when leading by seven or more points at the break during the Saban era.

ALABAMA'S TV RECORD: The Crimson Tide's matchup against Arkansas on Oct. 26 was the Tide's 426th televised game. Alabama has compiled a 288-134-4 (.680) all-time record in televised games (not including pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed circuit telecasts).

145 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 161 GAMES: Alabama's appearance on ESPN against Arkansas on Oct. 26 was the Tide's 145th nationally televised game since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest since the start of the 2014 campaign.

RETURNING SUCCESS: The Alabama Crimson Tide returned 16 starters and 41 lettermen for the 2019 season. On offense, 19 letterwinners and seven starters returned while the defense has 17 lettermen and another six starters back on the field, with five starting specialists returning, as well. On offense, the Crimson Tide returned consensus All-America quarterback Tua Tagovailoa who shattered school passing records with 3,966 yards and 43 touchdowns as a sophomore. Tagovailoa is surrounded by one of the deepest and most talented receiving corps in the nation as Biletnikoff Award winner Jerry Jeudy returned along with fellow juniors Henry Ruggs III and DeVonta Smith to go with sophomore Jaylen Waddle. The defense returned four starters in the backfield led by senior cornerback Trevon Diggs and junior safety Xavier McKinney along with senior STAR Shyheim Carter and sophomore corner Patrick Surtain II. Redshirt senior Anfernee Jennings returned on the outside with 23 career starts, 111 tackles and 22 tackles for loss. The front welcomed back two-year starting defensive end Raekwon Davis, who elected to return for his senior season.

SEC RECORD: Alabama extended its record for most consecutive 10-win seasons in SEC history to 12 when it defeated Auburn 52-21, on Nov. 24, 2018, to improve to 11-0 on the year. UA had a 12-2 record in 2008, 14-0 in 2009, 10-3 in 2010, 12-1 in 2011, 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013, 12-2 in 2014, 14-1 marks in 2015 and 2016, 13-1 in 2017 and a 14-1 mark in 2018.

10-YEAR RUN: Nick Saban entered 2018 with a 125-14 (.899) record over his previous 10 seasons in Tuscaloosa (2008-17), which is the best of any major college school over a 10-year span since Bud Wilkinson and Oklahoma in the late 1940s through the late 1950s. UA's 125 wins over that decade are the most for any FBS school during a 10-year span in the Associated Press poll era (since 1936).

ALABAMA LEADS IN QUALITY WINS OVER LAST FIVE YEARS: According to College Football News, Alabama led all Division I programs from 2014-18 in "quality wins" with 47. Quality wins are defined as victories over FBS opponents that finished the season with a winning record. The Crimson Tide's win total was three ahead of second-place Clemson (44) with Ohio State (36) ranking third. Head coach Nick Saban and the Tide finished at 67-6 (.918) over that stretch with 70.2 percent of the team's victories being defined as quality wins.

SABAN AMONG 20-YEAR LEADERS: Alabama's 45-40 win over Clemson in the 2016 College Football Playoff Championship Game was head coach Nick Saban's 191st victory in his first 20 years as a college head coach. That total is the second-most in FBS history for a coach in the first 20 seasons of his career. Former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne won 195 games in the opening two decades of his tenure in Lincoln. Long-time Penn State head coach Joe Paterno ranks third with 187. Saban's five national championships in 20 seasons tops both Osborne (none) and Paterno (one).

NEW HIRES: Nick Saban's 2019 coaching staff features seven new faces, including five newcomers to Tuscaloosa and a pair of returnees from previous staffs. Saban's five new hires include: Brian Baker as associate head coach and defensive line coach; Kyle Flood as offensive line coach; Charles Huff as associate head coach and running backs coach; Charles Kelly as associate defensive coordinator and safeties coach; and Holmon Wiggins as wide receivers coach. In addition, Steve Sarkisian returned to the Capstone as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, while Sal Sunseri assumed the role of outside linebackers coach. Sarkisian was previously in Tuscaloosa as an analyst during the 2016 season, eventually taking over play-calling duties for the 2017 College Football Playoff National Championship Game in Tampa, Fla. Sunseri enters his fourth year overall on Saban's staff, previously spending three seasons from 2009-11 as assistant head coach while guiding the outside linebackers.

ALABAMA AMONG NFL COACHING EXPERIENCE LEADERS: The Alabama coaching staff ranks third among all Football Bowl Subdivision programs - and places second in the SEC - in years of National Football League coaching experience among its on-field coaching staff. The Crimson Tide boast 43 years of NFL experience between head coach Nick Saban (eight years), associate head/defensive line coach Brian Baker (19), outside linebackers coach Sal Sunseri (10), offensive coordinator Steve Sarkisian (3), offensive line coach Kyle Flood (2) and associate head/running backs coach Charles Huff (1). Illinois ranks No. 1 with 49 years followed by LSU (45) to round out the top three.

SABAN AND FIRST ROUND NFL DRAFT PICKS: Since the advent of the NFL Draft, Alabama head coach Nick Saban has produced the most first-rounders of any NCAA Division I head coach. Saban has coached a total of 34 players who were chosen in the opening round of the draft, including 29 while at Alabama. This year's three selections in the 2019 NFL Draft pushed Saban past Bobby Bowden (32) at No. 2 and ahead of the previous all-time leader Joe Paterno, who produced 33 first-rounders.

CRIMSON TIDE PLAYERS ON NFL ROSTERS: The Alabama football program is again well-represented in the NFL during the 2019 season with numerous former players on league rosters. The Tide has 64 former players (active, injured reserve, practice squad) working on an NFL roster. Week one of the NFL season saw 43 of those 64 players earn playing time on the field. In the last 11 NFL Drafts (including 2019), Alabama has had 87 players selected, including 29 players in first round, 25 in the second and third rounds, nine in the fourth, 11 in the fifth, four in the sixth and nine in the seventh round.

- Saban has a 245-63-1 (.795) record as a college head coach to date (240-63-1, .791 after vacations). He has six national championships – five at Alabama – nine conference championships and 20 of his teams have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship Game following the 2003, 2009, 2011 and 2012 seasons and the College Football Playoff Semifinals each of the last five seasons including the last four CFP National Championship Games.

- Saban is the only coach to win four BCS national championships, the only coach to win back-to-back BCS national championships and one of only two coaches to win multiple CFP National Championships. He has won six titles in his last 15 years coaching college football, most recently capturing the CFP National Championship following the 2017 season. Saban is one of three college coaches in the poll era (since 1936) to win three national championships in four years, joining Frank Leahy (Notre Dame - 1946-47, 1949) and Tom Osborne (Nebraska - 1994-95, 1997). He is also just the second coach in the poll era to win six national championships (Paul "Bear" Bryant) and the first to ever win five titles in a nine-year span.

- In 2009, Saban produced Alabama's first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship Game. He then followed that up with his second BCS championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. He made it back-to-back BCS national championships in 2012 with a 42-14 win over Notre Dame in the Discover BCS National Championship Game. He took down Clemson 45-40 to capture title No. 5 following the 2015 season in the CFP National Championship Game. He captured his sixth national championship - and fifth at Alabama - in 2017 with a 26-23 overtime win over Georgia in the 2018 CFP National Championship Game.

- In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team's response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom that year with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.

- His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).

- Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.

- In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.

- Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points) and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

- A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen. They have one granddaughter, Amélie.

- At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Sabans have helped raise roughly \$8 million for "Nick's Kids" that has been distributed to more than 250 charities and organizations throughout the state of Alabama and the Southeast. The Sabans also built 16 homes, one for each of the Tide's national championships, with Habitat for Humanity following the April 27, 2011, tornado that struck Tuscaloosa.

- In June of 2008, the Sabans announced a \$1 million gift to benefit Alabama's first-generation scholarship program. The gift has a special meaning to the Sabans as both Nick and Terry were both first-generation graduates.

ATLANTA — A stout defense paired with stellar quarterback play propelled the No. 2/2-ranked Alabama to a 42-3 win over Duke in the 2019 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Mercedes-Benz Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The victory to start the season moved the Crimson Tide to 6-0 all-time in Chick-fil-A Kickoff Games and to 14-1 in games played in Atlanta since head coach Nick Saban arrived in Tuscaloosa, including 13 straight wins.

The Crimson Tide defense limited the Blue Devils to only 204 yards of total offense and forced three turnovers on the day. Junior defensive back Xavier McKinney led all defenders with eight tackles while Trevon Diggs made an impact in the turnover department. The senior defensive back picked off a pass while also recovering a fumble to go with a pair of tackles. The fumble was forced by Patrick Surtain II with the sophomore also contributing a pass breakup and four tackles.

Alabama's offense began slowly but kept the pressure on from the second quarter until the final whistle. Junior quarterback Tua Tagovailoa accounted for four touchdowns - all through the air - as part of his 26-of-31 passing effort totaling 336 yards. Ten of Tagovailoa's throws went to fellow junior Jerry Jeudy. The third-year wideout finished with a career-high 10 catches for 137 yards and a touchdown. Redshirt freshman running back Jerome Ford led the Tide runners, totaling 64 yards and a score on 10 carries.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — The No. 2/2 ranked Crimson Tide put 603 yards of total offense in its 62-10 win over New Mexico State in Alabama's home opener inside Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Tide's huge offensive day was Alabama's first 600-plus yard performance since 2018 when UA eclipsed the 600-yard mark at Arkansas.

On offense, junior quarterback Tua Tagovailoa totaled 227 yards and three touchdowns on 16-of-24 passing, to go along with a 25-yard rushing touchdown as part of his 33 yards on the ground. Fellow junior, wideout Jerry Jeudy, had a career-high three touchdowns and ended his day with eight receptions for 103 yards. Wide receiver Henry Ruggs III added 141 yards of total offense and two scores with the junior tallying one rushing and one receiving.

The defense was led by senior Raekwon Davis and junior Xavier McKinney with the pair tying for the most tackles at six apiece. Sophomore defensive back Patrick Surtain came up with his first interception of the season while also forcing a fumble, one of two for the Tide on the day that made up Alabama's three total turnovers.

COLUMBIA, S.C. — The No. 2/2-ranked Alabama Crimson Tide beat South Carolina, 47-23, in both teams' Southeastern Conference opener in Columbia, S.C., on Saturday afternoon at Williams-Brice Stadium. The win moved Alabama to 3-0 overall and improved UA to 12-1 in SEC openers (home and away) under head coach Nick Saban.

The offense was led once again by quarterback Tua Tagovailoa. The junior totaled a career-best 444 yards and a career-high tying five touchdowns through the air on 28-of-36 passing. Running back Najee Harris had a huge game with the junior hauling in five passes for 87 yards and two touchdowns to go with 36 yards rushing.

Junior wide receivers DeVonta Smith and Henry Ruggs III tallied 136 and 122 yards, respectively, marking just the ninth time in school history that two Alabama receivers have gone over 100 yards in the same game. Smith caught two touchdown passes while Ruggs III hauled in one of his own.

On defense, 22 players recorded a tackle, led by junior safety Xavier McKinney, who tallied nine, including five solo stops. McKinney also recorded an interception and a tackle for loss. Redshirt senior linebacker Anfernee Jennings forced a fumble and had a sack while the freshman duo of defensive lineman DJ Dale and defensive back Jordan Battle also notched sacks on the afternoon.

Tagovailoa completed 17-of-21 passes for 293 yards and five passing scores marking the first time in Alabama history that a quarterback has had back-to-back games with four or more touchdown passes. On the receiving end of two of those touchdown throws was junior wideout Henry Ruggs III, who had four catches for a career-best 148 yards. Fellow junior wideout Jerry Jeudy caught six passes for 96 yards while also contributing two touchdown receptions. On the ground, Najee Harris totaled 110 yards on 14 carries with the junior adding a touchdown catch from five yards out.

On defense, senior defensive back Jared Mayden led the Tide with a career-high eight tackles, while freshman linebacker Christian Harris finished second in stops with six, including 1.5 for loss (-4 yards). Senior Trevon Diggs grabbed his second interception of the season while redshirt sophomore Phidarian Mathis forced a fumble that was recovered by freshman Jordan Battle for the Tide defense's two turnovers on the day.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas — Big plays on offense and special teams helped No. 1/1 Alabama to a 47-28 road victory against No. 24/21 Texas A&M at Kyle Field in College Station. The victory moved the Crimson Tide to 6-0 overall and 3-0 in Southeastern Conference play.

On offense, junior quarterback Tua Tagovailoa went 21-of-34 for 293 yards, while setting the Alabama career touchdown record with 81, moving ahead of the previous all-time mark of 77 set by AJ McCarron (2010-13). The Tide signal-caller recorded four scores through the air in the game and now has 81 for his career. Junior running back Najee Harris was tops in the UA ground game, totaling a career-high 20 carries resulting in a season-best 114 yards.

Junior DeVonta Smith totaled 99 receiving yards and one touchdown on a team-high seven catches to lead all Alabama wide receivers. Sophomore wideout and punt returner Jaylen Waddle totaled 176 all-purpose yards after catching three passes for 48 yards and his first receiving touchdown of the season to go with 128 yards on his four punt returns. Junior Henry Ruggs III had one score on his only grab of the day from 33-yards out while also accounting for 131 yards on four kickoff returns.

On defense, linebackers Anfernee Jennings and freshman Shane Lee tallied a team-high eight tackles apiece. Jennings, a redshirt senior, added one sack, a pair of tackles for loss and one pass breakup on the day. Senior defensive back Shyheim Carter anchored the Tide secondary with seven tackles, two pass breakups and a forced fumble.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — No. 1/1 Alabama claimed its 13th straight victory over Tennessee, coming away with a 35-13 win under the lights at Bryant-Denny Stadium on Saturday night.

The Crimson Tide defense dominated the game all night, led by freshman linebacker Christian Harris who had a career-high eight tackles, including one for loss. Redshirt junior Terrell Lewis totaled seven tackles from his linebacker spot, a number that included a team-high two sacks and a career-best three tackles for loss. Freshman linebacker Shane Lee forced his first career fumble and compiled six tackles to go with one sack. Senior defensive backs Jared Mayden and Trevon Diggs each forced a turnover against the Vols. Mayden grabbed an interception in the first half to go with his five tackles and two pass breakups, while Diggs added a 100-plus yard scoop-and-score on a Tennessee fumble at the goal line in the fourth quarter to put the game out of reach.

Junior running back Najee Harris anchored the Tide offense, carrying the ball a career-high 21 times for 105 yards and two rushing scores. He also added four catches for 48 yards on the night. Junior quarterback Tua Tagovailoa was 11-of-12 for 155 yards through the air before leaving with an injury in the second quarter. Redshirt sophomore Mac Jones came in to replace Tagovailoa at quarterback and went 6-of-11 for 72 yards. Redshirt freshman Slade Bolden attempted his first career pass, completing the throw to Miller Forristall for a six-yard score to cap off the offense's scoring on the Third Saturday in October.

Jones finished 18-of-22 for 235 yards with three touchdowns in just over two quarters of work. Junior Jerry Jeudy led all receivers with 103 yards and two touchdowns on seven catches. Running back Najee Harris paced the rushers with the junior totaling 86 yards and two touchdowns on just 13 attempts.

The Crimson Tide defense forced four turnovers in the game, including an 84-yard pick-six by senior defensive back Trevon Diggs. Two fumble recoveries and another interception resulted in 17 additional points off turnovers. Freshman linebacker Shane Lee led the Tide defense with six tackles, including two tackles for loss and a sack. Fellow first-year backer Christian Harris also contributed six tackles while adding a 37-yard fumble recovery that led to an eventual Crimson Tide touchdown in the first quarter.
