

LSU FOOTBALL POSTGAME NOTES

LSU at Auburn

October 31, 2020 – Jordan-Hare Stadium (Auburn, Ala.)

1. The LSU Captains were PK **Avery Atkins**, OG **Chasen Hines**, OG **Ed Ingram**, DL **Ali Gaye**
2. Auburn won the toss and elected to kick. LSU received the ball in the north endzone while Auburn defended the south endzone.
3. The Tigers improve to 2-3 and 2-3gotcha in SEC play.
 - a. The Tigers are now 8-13 at Auburn
 - b. This is the 16th game LSU has played on Halloween night and is now 7-8-1 in those games.
4. LSU is now 31-23-1 against Auburn
 - a. **Ed Orgeron** is now 3-4 against Auburn with a 3-1 mark at LSU.
5. Orgeron is now 42-12 as head coach of the Tigers.
 - a. Orgeron is now 26-10 against SEC teams at LSU.
 - b. Orgeron is 14-3 in the month of October.
6. The home team in this series has won 18 of the last 21 games dating back to 2000 when Auburn beat LSU 34-17 in Jordan-Hare Stadium.
7. This was the 24th straight game LSU has had at least one passing touchdown.
8. It was the 13th consecutive start for WR **Terrace Marshall Jr.**, ninth for OL **Austin Deculus** and 24th for S **JaCoby Stevens**.
9. LB **BJ Ojulari** made his first start as a Tiger which brings the total to 18 first-time starters for LSU on the season.
10. The two teams went scoreless in the first quarter which was the first time since January 1, 2018 (Citrus Bowl vs. Notre Dame).

Offense

- 1) QB **TJ Finley** made his second start for the Tigers and is 1-1 as the starting quarterback.
 - a) Was 13-24 with 143 yards and two interceptions.
- 2) QB **Max Johnson** made his second appearance for the Tigers in the first quarter.
 - a) Threw his first career touchdown pass in the fourth quarter, a 43-yard strike to Kayshon Boutte.
 - b) Finished 15-24, for 172 yards, and one touchdown.
- 3) WR **Terrace Marshall Jr.** has now started in 13 consecutive games.
 - a) Had four catches for 28 yards with a long of 13.
- 4) TE **Arik Gilbert** tied his career high with six receptions. Led the team with 55 yards and had a long of 17.
- 5) WR **Racey McMath** tied his career-high in receptions with 5 for 51 yards.
- 6) WR Kayshon Boutte caught his first career TD in the fourth quarter.
 - a) Finished with two catches for 48 yards and a TD.

Defense

- 1) S **JaCoby Stevens** made his 24th consecutive start in his career and had seven tackles with one tackle for loss.
- 2) CB **Derek Stingley Jr.** forced his first fumble in his career in the second quarter which resulted in a touchback for the Tigers.
 - a) Finished with five tackles, including one tackle for loss.
- 3) LB **BJ Ojulari** made his first start of his career and recorded three tackles.
- 4) LB **Micah Baskerville** was one tackle away from tying his career high of 11.
 - a) Finished with a team leading 10 tackles, including one tackle for loss.

Special Teams

- 1) K **Cade York** was 1-2 on field goals with a long of 50 yards.
 - a) He is 7-of-9 from 50+ yards – holds school record for 50 yard field goals made.
 - b) He attempted a career-long 54 yard field goal to start the second quarter but missed.
 - c) He is 3 points away from becoming the 7th Tiger placekicker with 200 (kicking points only) for his career.

- 2) PK **Avery Atkins** kicked 1-of-1 on kickoffs for touchbacks.
- 3) P **Zach Von Rosenberg** kicked seven punts for an average of 48.9 yards. His long was 55 yards with two inside the 20-yard line.
 - a) Moved into fifth on the all-time career list for punting yards (6,926) – passing Rusty Jackson (6,603) in 1972-74.
 - b) He is the second oldest player in College Football in 2020 at 30 years old.
- 4) KOR **Trey Palmer** had three kick returns for a total of 85 yards.
