LSU FOOTBALL POSTGAME NOTES

No. 17/16 LSU at Missouri

October 10, 2020 - Faurot Field (Columbia, Mo.)

- 1. The LSU Captains were OL Austin Deculus, OL Liam Shanahan, PK Avery Atkins and LB Jabril Cox.
- 2. Missouri won the toss and elected to receive; The Tigers kicked off and defended the south end zone to begin the game.
- 3. The Tigers fall to 1-2 and 1-2 in SEC play
- 4. LSU falls to 1-2-0 against Missouri
 - a. **Ed Orgeron** is now 1-3 against Missouri and 1-1 against Missouri as LSU's head coach.
 - b. Due to Hurricane Delta, the game was moved to Columbia Missouri this game was scheduled to be played in Baton Rouge at 8 p.m.
 - c. This is the fifth game since 2015 that an LSU game has been impacted by weather.
 - d. This is the first time LSU has played in the state of Missouri in program history the last these two teams met was in 2016 when Coach Orgeron made as debut as interim head coach.
- 5. Orgeron is now 41-11 as head coach of the Tigers.
 - a. LSU is 45-7 as a Top 25 team under Orgeron, which includes a 20-4 record as a Top 10 team.
 - b. Orgeron is now 25-9 against SEC teams at LSU.
 - c. Orgeron is 13-2 in the month of October.
 - d. LSU is now 12-5 on the road under Orgeron and have won the last five SEC road games.
- 6. The Tigers now have 10th consecutive games of at least 30 points dating back to Alabama game last season.
- 7. The Tigers now have 12th consecutive games that they have thrown for at least 300 yards the longest streak in school history.
- 8. LB Antoine Sampah (true freshman) saw his first action as a Tiger.
- 9. This was the 22nd straight game LSU has had at least one passing touchdown.
- 10. The Tigers two fumbles in the first half was the first time the Tigers recovered two-plus fumbles in a game since Georgia Southern last season.
- 11. The Tigers' three fumble recoveries is the most in Coach Orgeron era.
- 12. The Tigers' 41 points through three quarters is the second most in an LSU game through three quarters; last year's Vandy game was most at 59-31.

Offense

- 1) QB Myles Brennan made his third career start against Missouri and is now 1-2 as LSU's starting quarterback.
 - a) Had four passing touchdowns on the game to bring his career total to 13
 - b) Had career long pass 75 yard to Marshall Jr. longest TD pass since Burrow-to-Chase vs. TAMU in 2019 (78).
 - c) Had a career-high of 29 completions and 48 pass attempts for a career-high of 430 yards.
 - d) First 400 yard passing game for an LSU quarterback since Joe Burrow in the National Championship against Clemson.
- 2) TE Arik Gilbert made his third consecutive start at Missouri
 - a) Had a career-long of 20 yards on his first reception of the game in the Tigers first possession.
 - b) Recorded his second career touchdown in the second on a career long reception of 25 yards
 - c) Finished with a career-high total of 97 yards with 84 coming in the first half and a career-high of six receptions.
- 3) WR Terrace Marshall Jr. has now started in 11 consecutive games.
 - a) Picked up his 18th career touchdown in the first quarter a 6 yard pass from Brennan.
 - b) Scored 19th career touchdown in first quarter a 2 yard pass from Brennan to take a 13-7 lead.
 - c) His 20th career touchdown came in the third quarter on a career long 75 yard reception from Brennan that gave LSU a 37-31 lead longest TD since Burrow-to-Chase vs. TAMU in 2019 (78).
 - d) Had a total of 11 receptions (career high) for a career-high 235 yards with an average of 21.4 yards per reception. His 235 yards are the fourth most a Tiger receiver has ever had in one game.

- e) He has caught at least 1 TD pass in 11 of the 15 games he's started during his career and has six straight games with a TD pass.
- f) This was his seventh career game with multiple touchdowns.
- g) Has seven touchdowns on the season.
- h) First 200 yard receiving game for an LSU receiver since Ja'Marr Chase against Clemson in the National Championship.
- 4) RB **Tyrion Davis Price** finished the game with nine carries for a total of 38 yards
 - a) Recorded his seventh career TD in third quarter to give the Tigers a 30-24 lead.
- 5) OL Austin Deculus made his seventh consecutive start for the Tigers at Missouri.

Defense

- 1) S JaCoby Stevens made his 22nd consecutive start in his career and had five tackles with one pass break up.
- 2) LB Damone Clark led the Tigers in tackles with nine, including five solo and one for loss
- 3) SNP Quentin Skinner recovered his first fumble of his career in the second quarter.
- 4) WR **Racey McMath** forced his first fumble of his career in the second guarter.
- 5) DL Ali Gaye recovered his first fumble as a Tiger in the second quarter.
- 6) BJ Ojluari forced his first fumble as a Tiger
- 7) Jabril Cox recovered his first fumble as a Tiger and fourth in his career
 - a) He finished with a career high nine tackles, including five solo and two tackles for loss.
- 8) Maurice Hampton finished with a career high seven tackles, including four solo and one tackle for loss.

Special Teams

- 1) K Cade York was 2-of-3 on field goals with a long of 51 yards.
 - a) He was 2-of-2 on PAT attempts.
 - b) York is 6-for-7 in his career on 50+ yard field goals.
 - c) His 42-yard field goal extended the Tigers' lead to 24-14 in the second quarter.
 - d) His 51-yard field goal gave the Tigers a 41-38 lead in the third quarter.
 - e) His 45-yard attempt in the fourth quarter was the first LSU field goal to be blocked since 2016 against Alabama.
- 2) PK **Avery Atkins** kicked 6-of-6 on kickoffs for touchbacks
- 3) P **Zach Von Rosenberg** kicked five punts for an average of 45.2 yards. His long was 60 yards with three inside the 20-yard line and had a total of 226 yards.
 - a) Moved into sixth on the all-time career list for punting yards (6,584) passing Jerry Stovall's 6,477 in 1960-62.
 - b) He is the second oldest player in College Football in 2020. He turned 30 this week.
