WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- This game marks the 109th all-time meeting between the Ole Miss Rebels and LSU Tigers dating back to 1894.
- · LSU is Ole Miss' second-most played opponent behind Mississippi State, whom the Rebels will play for the 117th time on Nov. 28.
- · LSU holds a 63-40-4 advantage in the series, 41-24-1 in Baton Rouge ... The original record is 63-41-4 in favor of LSU with Ole Miss' 2013 win vacated due to NCAA ruling.
- The home team has won six of the last eight meetings on the field.
- Saturday will mark the first regular season December game for Ole Miss since 2001 ... It's only the second such game for the Rebels in the last 50 seasons.
- It is also the first time since 2001 that Ole Miss hasn't ended its regular season facing Mississippi State.
- The Dec. 19 matchup will be the latest regular season game played in program history.
- The Rebels have won three straight SEC games for the first time since 2014.
- QB Matt Corral ranks No. 3 in FBS in passing yards per game (343.0), No. 8 in passing TDs (24), No. 2 in total offense per game (381.9) and No. 7 in passing efficiency (187.3).
- RB Jerrion Ealy's nine rushing touchdowns are the fifth-most in the SEC and No. 22 in FBS.
- WR Elijah Moore and TE Kenny Yeboah have elected to forgo the remaining games of their Rebel football careers in order to begin preparation for the 2021 NFL Draft.

By the time the LSU game kicks off, 21 days will have passed since the Rebels last played, the longest break (regular season) for Ole Miss since 1900 (34 days).

Saturday's contest vs. the Tigers will mark the first regular season December game for Ole Miss since 2001.

Matt Corral ranks No. 2 in FBS with 381.9 yards of total offense per game, including surpassing 425 yards of total offense in two of the last three contests.



WEEKLY MEDIA AVAILABILITY: Ole Miss will host its weekly fall press conferences every Monday at noon CT via Zoom. Lane Kiffin and various players will be made available virtually. Members of the media unable to join the Zoom interview may watch live on SEC Network+ (on the ESPN app). The interviews will also be made available Monday afternoon on Ole Miss' YouTube page and FTP site. Select players will be available during Monday's press conference and after practice on Tuesday. Coach Kiffin will be available on Monday and after practice on Wednesday. All media interviews will be held virtually via Zoom. There is no availability on Thursday or Friday.

PRACTICES: All practices are closed to media and the public.

AUDIO/VIDEO RESTRICTIONS: Press conferences, media opportunities and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content attained via FTP, which should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions. Ole Miss offers free FTP downloads of practice footage, interviews and game highlights for television stations to use during regularly scheduled news/sportscasts. To access the Ole Miss FTP site, please contact Seth Austin with Ole Miss Sports Productions at saaustin@olemiss.edu or 662-816-3436.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: Credential requests will be handled on a single-game basis and should be submitted by the editor/sports director of your media outlet. Ole Miss' credentialing website, www.sportssystems.com/OleMiss, will be available to accept requests 10 days prior to each game (two Wednesdays before) and will close the Wednesday before the game at noon CT. Approvals will take place Wednesday afternoon. The site is currently available for the Florida game. Approved media will receive a COVID screening form on Friday of game week that must be completed in order to receive credentials on Saturday. No credentials will be mailed out. Approved media will receive a unique parking pass via email, and game credentials will be picked up at media check-in. Recognized media members that are denied gameday credentials due to space limitations may be provided virtual credentials for the postgame press conferences.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Pursuant with SEC quidelines, six media photographers/videographers will be credentialed per game -- two pool shooters on the field and four shooters in the stands. The pool shooters will share their content with other media outlets and will receive details on the process of posting their content on the SEC media portal after the game. Both options may be applied for at the credentialing website. The two pool shooters, which is expected to be one local media photographer and one local TV videographer, must participate in required COVID screening consistent with institutional personnel permitted on the field. One shooter will be assigned to each end of the field. Shooters may move from sideline-to-sideline during the game by moving behind the end zone. At no time may a pool shooter come within six feet of the bench area or move behind the bench area. Shooters will not be permitted to leave the sideline area during the game. There will be a work space off the northeast corner of the field (old photo workroom is not available this season). Per NCAA rule, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes.

GAMEDAY PARKING: Gameday media parking will be located in the garage adjacent to The Pavilion. Each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Approved media will receive a unique parking pass via e-mail through the credentialing system.

MEDIA GAMEDAY CHECK-IN: Media check-in will take place in The Pavilion Club. Media should exit the garage on the stadium side and walk along the outside of the building to the club entrance. After check-in, media members will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium. Check-in will begin three and a half (3.5) hours prior to kickoff, and media are encouraged to arrive early. Media must wear a face covering at all times.

RECRUITS: Media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect -- from when they check in until after they have checked out or concluded their visit and are no longer inside our facilities. Media are also forbidden from having direct contact with the prospects' family members who are present at the visit. In addition, media may not be present during any recruiting contact and may not video or photograph a prospect during a visit.

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST LSU

Nov. 16, 2019 • Oxford, Miss. • #1 LSU 58, Ole Miss 37: Freshman quarterback John Rhys Plumlee ran wild for 212 yards and four touchdowns, but it wasn't quite enough as eventual national champion LSU survived the offensive flurry in a 58-37 win. Eventual Heisman Trophy winner Joe Burrow threw for 489 yards with five touchdowns and two interceptions as the Tigers held off the Rebels' second-half rally at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Sept. 29, 2018 • Baton Rouge, La. • #5 LSU 45, Ole Miss 16: Ole Miss couldn't keep up with No. 5 LSU in Death Valley. The Rebels struck first, taking an early 3-0 lead, but the Tigers responded, taking a 28-6 lead into the locker room. Ole Miss cut that deficit to 15 in the third quarter, but the Tigers held off the rally, outgaining the Rebels 573-328 en route to victory.

Oct., 21, 2017 • Oxford, Miss. • #24 LSU 40, Ole Miss 24:
Ole Miss had no answer for the LSU ground attack, led by star running back Derrius Guice. The Tigers amassed 393 yards on the ground en

route to victory. The Rebels cut the Tiger lead to seven on a Jordan Wilkins touchdown run, but 17 unanswered LSU points sealed the deal.

Oct., 22, 2016 • Baton Rouge, La. • #25 LSU 38, #23 Ole Miss 21: Ole Miss took an early 10-0 lead behind the arm of Chad Kelly, but the Rebels couldn't contain a powerful rushing game led by Leonard Fournette. The game was tied at 21 at the half, but LSU's physical ground game won out down the stretch.

Nov. 21, 2015 • Oxford, Miss. • #22 Ole Miss 38, #15 LSU 17: Chad Kelly and the Rebel offense broke numerous school records as No. 22 Ole Miss cruised to a 38-17 victory over No. 15 LSU at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. It was the third Rebel victory of the season over a top-15 team. The Rebels broke the school record for points (445), passing yards (3,768) and touchdowns (57) in a season.



OLE MISS HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin (Fresno State, 1998) is in his first season at Ole Miss, taking the reins for the Rebels as the 39th head coach in program history. Kiffin, who won two Conference USA titles in three seasons at Florida Atlantic, has more than 10 years of head coaching experience, including eight years at the NCAA level where he has posted an all-time record of 65-38. In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons. In his head coaching stops at USC, Tennessee and FAU, Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. In his first season at all three locations, Kiffin's team improved in win differential (+3.33), scoring (+10.2), passing (+34.5 ypg) and rushing (+51.3 ypg). Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998. He moved on to Colorado State in 1999 as a graduate assistant. He spent the 2000 season as defensive quality control assistant with the Jacksonville Jaguars under Tom Coughlin.

LSU HEAD COACH ED ORGERON

Ed Orgeron (Northwestern State, 1984) is in his fifth year - fourth full year - as LSU's head coach and has a 44-14 record with the Tigers, including a 4-5 mark so far this season. Of LSU's 44 wins under Orgeron, 33 have come by double-figures and 13 have been over top 10 teams. The 13 top 10 wins rank as the second-most for any coach in LSU history, trailing only Les Miles who won 16 games over top 10 opponents in 12 years. In 2019, Orgeron led LSU to a national title and was consensus National Coach of the Year earning the honor from the Associated Press, Walter Camp, Eddie Robinson, Home Depot, George Munger and the AFCA. Orgeron, a native of Larose, Louisiana, is LSU's 33rd head football coach, and the first Louisiana native to serve as head coach of the Tigers since West Monroe native Jerry Stovall held the position for three seasons in the early 1980s. Orgeron, who has also served as head coach at Ole Miss and Southern Cal, is 20-6 in his past 26 games as a head coach. Overall, Orgeron has a 35-33 overall mark as a collegiate head coach, including a 10-25 mark with the Rebels from 2005-07. Of LSU's six losses under Orgeron, three have come by six points or less and two others came against the nation's No. 1 ranked team.

TIGER SCOUTING REPORT

LSU is 4-5 overall entering this week's game with Ole Miss and are coming off a 37-34 road upset over No. 6 Florida. The Tigers are averaging 416 yards of total offense per game, with 299 through the air and 117 yards coming on the ground. LSU has started two separate true freshmen in its last six games. Max Johnson got the start for the Tigers in Gainesville and completed 21 of his 36 passes for 239 yards and three touchdowns. Johnson also rushed 18 times for 52 yards. The Tigers' top receiver, Terrace Marshall Jr. opted out of the season in November after tallying 731 receiving yards and 10 TDs through seven games. True freshman Kayshon Boutte has stepped up in Marshall's absence and has tallied 100 yards receiving in back-to-back games. Tyrion Davis-Price is the leading rusher for the Tigers. He's rushed 104 times for 446 and three touchdowns on the season. Defensively, the Tigers are allowing just 485 yards per game, giving up 331 through the air and 154 rushing yards per game. Cornerback Eli Ricks ranks No. 5 in FBS with four interceptions on the season. The Tigers' kicker Cade York has connected on 14 his 17 field goal attempts, including five makes from greater than 50 yards.

MOORE, YEBOAH END OLE MISS CAREERS

WR **Elijah Moore** and TE **Kenny Yeboah** have elected to forgo the remaining games of their Rebel football careers in order to begin preparation for the 2021 NFL Draft. Moore, a semifinalist for Biletnikoff Award, currently leads the country in receptions (86) and ranks No. 2 in receiving yards (1,193). He ranks No. 14 nationally with eight receiving touchdowns and No. 11 in all-purpose yards (158.3 ypg). Moore's 1,193 receiving yards this season ranks No. 3 on Ole Miss' single season record books. Yeboah has hauled in 27 catches for 524 yards and six touchdowns in his lone season at Ole Miss after transferring in from Temple. Yeboah's receiving yards and six receiving TDs rank fifth and sixth respectively amongst FBS tight ends.

IT'S BEGINNING TO LOOK A LOT LIKE FOOTBALL

Saturday will mark the first regular season December game for Ole Miss since 2001. It's only the second such game for the Rebels in the last 50 seasons. The Dec. 19 matchup will be the latest regular season game played in program history. It is also the first time since 2001 that Ole Miss hasn't ended its regular season facing Mississippi State. By the time the LSU game kicks off, 21 days will have passed since the Rebels last played, the longest regular season break for Ole Miss since 1900 when they had 34 days between games.

HARD TO CORRAL

In his last three games, quarterback **Matt Corral** has put up video game-like numbers as he's helped lead the Rebels to three straight SEC wins for the first time since 2014. Corral combined to complete 81.4 percent of his passes for 1,310 and 12 touchdowns yards against Vanderbilt, South Carolina and Mississippi State.

LIFE IN THE FAST LANE

The Ole Miss offense has moved the football up and down the field under head coach **Lane Kiffin** and offensive coordinator **Jeff Lebby** this season. The Rebels rank in the top 3 in the SEC in 11 offensive categories.

CORRAL NAMED MANNING AWARD FINALIST

Ole Miss sophomore quarterback **Matt Corral** was named as one of 12 finalists for the Manning Award on Thursday. The Manning Award was created by the Allstate Sugar Bowl in honor of the college football accomplishments of Archie, Peyton and Eli Manning. It is the only quarterback award that takes the candidates' bowl performances into consideration in its balloting. Corral currently ranks top 10 nationally in passing yards (2,744), passing TDs (24), completion percentage (.729), passing efficiency (187.3) and yards per pass attempt (10.8).

Of the 22 total signees, 16 will be mid-year enrollees and will get a head start on their careers in Oxford in the coming weeks.

THE KIFFIN FILE

HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin, who won two Conference USA titles in three seasons at Florida Atlantic, was announced as the Rebels' 39th head coach on Dec. 7, 2019.

Kiffin, who arrives in Oxford after three seasons in the same position at FAU, has more than 10 years of head coaching experience, including eight years at the NCAA level where he has posted an all-time record of 61-34.

In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons.

In his head coaching stops at USC, Tennessee and FAU, Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. In his first season at all three locations, Kiffin's team improved in win differential (+3.33), scoring (+10.2), passing (+34.5 ypg) and rushing (+51.3 ypg).

Kiffin led the Owls to a 10-3 record in 2019, including a 49-6 win over UAB in the Conference USA Championship Game. The Owls lead the nation in interceptions (19) and turnovers gained (29). FAU also leads C-USA in scoring offense (34.1), red zone offense (0.911), fumbles lost (3) and turnover margin (1.58).

In his first season in Boca Raton, Kiffin started 1-3 but reeled off a program-high 10 consecutive wins to finish the 2017 campaign at 11-3. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. The seven-game improvement tied for the fifth-best turnaround in FBS history. Along the way, 41 individual or team records were amassed, and an FAU-record 21 players earned All-Conference USA recognition.

The Owls captured their second conference title in program history, the first since joining C-USA and first since 2007. FAU remained a perfect 3-0 in bowl play by defeating Akron in the Boca Raton Bowl, 50-3. Statistically, the Owls finished in the top-25 in 16 team categories, including: No. 2 in passes intercepted, No. 5 in first down offense, No. 6 in rushing offense, No. 8 in kickoff return defense, red zone offense and turnovers lost, and No. 9 in total offense and turnover margin (by comparison, FAU was No. 72 the previous season in total offense and No. 99 in turnovers gained).

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's best assistant coach.

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to an SEC title and to the National Championship game. Hurts was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the Year and the SEC Freshman of the Year. He was a finalist for the Manning Award, the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, a semifinalist for the Walter Camp Player of the Year and the Davey O'Brien Award, presented annually to the nation's top quarterback.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year.

Kiffin led the Trojans to a 10-2 record in 2011 and a sixth-place finish in the final Associated Press poll. The team finished first in the Pac-12 South with a 7-2 mark. His 2011 USC offense produced a 3,500-yard passer, a pair of 1,000-yard receivers and a 1,000yard rusher.

In his first year as the head coach at USC, Kiffin led the Trojans to an 8-5 record (5-4 Pac-10). Before his arrival, the Trojans were averaging 26.5 points per game in scoring offense and 389.1 yards per game in total offense. In his first two seasons, those numbers increased to 31.0 points per game and 431.5 yards in 2011 and 35.8 points and 456.8 yards in 2012.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a secondplace finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Volunteers' offense jumped at least 34 places in every national statistical category over the 2008 figures. Tennessee improved from 17.3 to 29.3 points per game while going from 268.8 to 383.5 yards per game in total offense.

Kiffin came to Tennessee from the Oakland Raiders, where he served as head coach from 2007-08. At 31, he was the youngest head coach in the NFL's modern era. Oakland's offense significantly improved in his first year, up 7.2 points per game and 48.6 yards per game from 2006.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998. He moved on to Colorado State in 1999 as a graduate assistant. He spent the 2000 season as defensive quality control assistant with the Jacksonville Jaquars under Tom Coughlin.

Kiffin attended Bloomington Jefferson High in Bloomington, Minnesota, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.

Sophomore quarterback Matt Corral completed 22 of 31 passes for 395 yards and three touchdown passes. Elijah Moore also had 10 catches for 227 yards, the second most in a single game in Ole Miss history and most against an SEC opponent in school history.

Defensively, the Rebels were led by Keidron Smith, who finished with 12 tackles, followed by Jacquez Jones and Jaylon Jones, who combined for 15 tackles.

Corral found Dontario Drummond twice in the first half, both times for touchdowns. Ole Miss kept pace with Florida through most of the first half, but the Gators used a late two-minute drive to push their lead to 28-14 at the half.

It wouldn't take long for Florida to seize control for good. Two plays into the third quarter, Trask found Pitts for the third time with a 71-yard touchdown strike on a deep pattern to take a 35-14 lead. The Rebels responded with a two-play drive of their own, with Corral finding Elijah Moore wide open for a 57-yard gain. Ealy then hit the end zone from 18 yards out with 13:43 remaining in the third quarter to cut Florida's lead to 35-21.

Ole Miss held firm defensively in their own territory, forcing Florida to kick field goals on their three ensuing drives. Senior Kenny Yeboah broke out for the Rebels, sealing a five play, 81-yard drive with an eight-yard TD reception in the fourth quarter. Jonathan Mingo caught the two-point conversion to make the score 44-29 with 11:00 left to play.

The Rebels had a chance late in the fourth quarter, but the Gators drained 5:37 off the clock on another scoring drive. Snoop Conner found the end zone, capping off a 16-play, 75-yard drive with a goal line score with 58 seconds left. The Rebels recovered the ensuing onside kick and marched down to the Florida 10-yard line but could not convert on two pass attempts in the final eight seconds, ultimately falling to Florida, 51-35.

GAME TWO OLE MISS 42, KENTUCKY 41 (OVERTIME)

LEXINGTON, **Ky**. — For the second consecutive week, the Ole Miss Rebels found themselves in a shootout, but this time, they were able to complete the rally. Ole Miss(1-1) overcame a 14-point deficit in the second half to force overtime and knock off the Kentucky Wildcats, 42-41, for the first win of the Lane Kiffin era in Oxford and the program's first overtime win since 2004.

Matt Corral completed 24 of 29 passes for 320 yards and four touchdowns, two of which went to Jonathan Mingo, who had eight catches for 128 yards. Elijah Moore and Kenny Yeboah combined for 13 catches for 175 and a touchdown each. On the ground, Jerrion Ealy and Snoop Conner combined for 18 carries, 69 yards and a touchdown each. Corral also added 51 rushing yards on 13 attempts. Defensively, the Rebels were led by Jaylon Jones who finished with 10 total tackles, including six solo stops.

After a back and forth first half with a rushing touchdown from Ealy and a 14-yard touchdown grab from Yeboah, Kentucky scored with 29 seconds remaining in the second quarter to take a 21-14 lead heading into halftime.

UK came out running the footbal in the third quarter to claim a two touchdown lead. Ole Miss responded quickly with Corral hitting Mingo for a 24-yard touchdown pass, bringing the Rebels within 7. A five play drive at the beginning of the fourth quarter, allowed Corral to connect with Mingo again, to tie the game at 28. In the Rebels next offensive series, Snoop Conner scored his second rushing touchdown of the game, putting Ole Miss up 35-28 with 8:23 left.

The Wildcats converted twice on third down, resulting in a drive to tie the game with 2:04 left to play. Two negative plays by the Ole Miss offense resulted in punting the football away with 35 seconds left, forcing the game into overtime.

Terry Wilson quickly found the endzone for Kentucky from 10 yards out, but Mark Ruffolo's missed PAT made the score 41-35. Corral found Elijah Moore near the goal line after four plays and Luke Logan kicking the game winning PAT to secure the Rebels first win of the season.

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss went toe-to-toe with the No. 2 Crimson Tide, finishing with 647 yards of total offense, but at the end of the night it wasn't enough as Alabama found the end zone eight straight times to defeat the Rebels 63-48.

Quarterback Matt Corral completed 21 of 28 passes for 365 yards, hitting tight end Kenny Yeboah for two touchdowns. Yeboah's 181 recieving yards on seven catches were the most ever by a Rebel tight end, while wide receiver Elijah Moore added 143 yards off of 11 catches. On the ground, Snoop Conner and Jerrion Ealy combined for 40 carries and 248 yards with two touchdowns each. Defensively, Momo Sanogo led the Rebels with nine tackles and Keidron Smith and Jakorey Hawkins each finished with eight tackles.

The 111 combined points and 1,370 combined total yardage were both the most in SEC history for a non-overtime game.

Ole Miss started hot on offense, as it only took four plays to get on the board in a 75-yard drive, resulting in Corral tossing a 6-yard touchdown to Yeboah. The Tide struck back with a pair of 20+ yard gains that ended with a 14-yard touchdown pass from Mac Jones to Devonta Smith.

After a bad snap forced the Rebels into a third-and-long which led to a punt, Alabama had first-and-goal on the Ole Miss one-yard line. Yet, for the second consecutive week, Ole Miss forced a goal line fumble and the Rebels recovered at the 11-yard line.

With the Crimson Tide ahead 42-35, Ole Miss completed their third fourth down conversion of the game with a Conner touchdown from the one-yard line. Alabama made their way back to the endzone quickly, pulling away to a 49-42 lead with 10 minutes left. The Rebels were unable to catch up the rest of the game, with a pair of field goals from kicker Luke Logan cutting the deficit to 56-48 with 1:28 remaining, ultimately falling 63-48.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. — An Ole Miss Rebel offense that has been among the nation's best through the first three weeks of the season was silenced for two and a half quarters. Turnovers and goal line stops proved costly as the Rebels (1-3) could not complete a 20-point rally as they fell the Arkansas Razorbacks 33-21 at Donald W. Reynolds Stadium on Saturday.

Matt Corral completed 20 of 38 passes for 200 yards and two touchdown passs with six interceptions. on the ground, Jerrion Ealy led the Rebels with 112 yards and a touchdown on 23 carries. Elijah Moore had 113 yards and a touchdown catch, his fourth straight game with 10 or more catches. Overall, the Rebels out-gained Arkansas 442-394. Defensivley, the Rebels were led by Ryder Anderson who finished with 13 tackles, two TFLs and a sack. Jalen Jordan also added a career-high 11 tackles.

The Rebels started the game on defense and forced a three-and-out for the first time this season on an opening drive. Ole Miss later converted a 4th down and moved the ball to the Arkansas goal line. On fourth down, Corral's exchange went awry and Arkansas took over at their own 5-yard line with 9:58 to go in the first quarter.

Ole Miss was held scoreless throughout the first half for the first time this season, and was unable to reach the endzone until the third quarter off a 10-play, 56-yard drive with a touchdown pass from Corral to Moore from seven yards out. On the ensuing drive, Ole Miss got their first turnover of the game, as LeDarrius Cox recovered the football at the Arkansas 17-yard line.

The Rebels were back in the game early in the fourth quarter from an eight-play, 66-yard drive with a 21-yard touchdown pass from Corral to Jonathan Mingo. With 12:06 remaning, Arkansas lead was cut to 20-14. After the Razorbacks added another touchdown to the board, Ole Miss answered with a fake punt on fourth down to MoMo Sanogo to lead them into Arkansas territory. With 5:50 left, the Rebels only trailed 26-21. Corral's fifth interception of the day resulted in a pick-six to put Arkansas up 33-21.

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss came out on the short end of Saturday's game agains the Auburn Tigers in a second half that featured four lead changes. Matt Corral accounted for three scores and 242 yards of total offense, but all to no avail as the Rebels fell 35-28.

Corral completed 16 of 27 passes for 154 yards and a touchdown pass to Elijah Moore, who had five catches and 16 yards. Corral also led the Rebels on the ground with 88 yards on $10\,$ attempts. Kenny Yeboah led the Rebels throught the air with four catches and 83 yards. On the ground, Snoop Conner and Jerrion Ealy combined for 30 carries and 149 yards with Ealy getting a touchdown run. Defensively, the Rebels were led by Keidron Smith, who finished with 12 total tackles. Sam Williams, Jacquez Jones and Lakia Henry combined for 29 tackles. The Rebels defense surrendered 21 second-half points after yielding the fewest first-half points this season.

Following consecutive three-and-outs to open the game, the Rebels found their way to the Tiger four-yard line. Corral's pass across the middle of the end zone was intercepted which set up an Auburn drive at their own five-yard line. The Tigers proceeed to go 95 yards in 14 plays to give them a 7-0 lead with 2:!4 left in the first quarter.

To start the second quarter, Corral capped off a 10-play, 75-yard drive with a six-yard touchdown pass to tie the game at seven. The Tigers used 10 plays of their own to retake the lead at 14-7. The Rebels would again reach Auburn territory where Corral found the end zone with his legs from five yards out. The game was once tied again at 14 and knotted up going into halftime.

In the third, Corral found Kenny Yeboah wide open on the sideline for a 60-yard gain, setting up a 10-yard touchdown run for Corral the next play. The Rebels took their first lead of the game, 21-14, with 7:09 left in the guarter. The Tigers answered with a 10-play, 88-yard drive to tie the game at 21 with 2:57 remaining in the third quarter.

The Tigers regained the lead with 10:12 left in the game off an 18-yard touchdown run, after a failed PAT attempt Auburn had a 27-21 lead. Ole Miss moved the ball down field mostly via run game and found the end zone with 5:43 left to play to take a 28-27 lead. With 1:11 remaining, Auburn reached the endzone from 58 yards out. After a successful two-point conversion, the Tigers ultimately took the lead and the win at 35-28.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The Rebels scored early and often in a dominant 54-21 win over the Vanderbilt Commodores on Halloween night, setting plenty of records along the way.

Elijah Moore put on a record setting performance in the first half. He became the only Rebel to have multiple 200-yard receiving games in a single season, broke A.J. Brown's school record for yards in a single game (238) and tied Brown and Laquon Treadwell's school record for most receptions in a game (14).

Matt Corral completed 31-of-34 passes for 412 yards and six touchdowns with no interceptions. His 19-for-19 start in the first half broke Eli Manning's record for consecutive completions that stood for 19 years. His 91.2 completion percentage is also a school record for a minimum of 30 attempts and tied the SEC record.

Besides Moore, Johnathan Mingo finished second on the team with six catches and 90 yards. Dontario Drummond, Kenny Yeboah and Braylon Sanders all combined for four touchdown grabs with Yeboah catching two to tie Moore with a team-high six on the year.

On the ground, Jerrion Ealy rushed for 95 yards on 15 carries but snapped a string of six consecutive games with a rushing touchdown.

Defensively, the Rebels allowed their lowest point total of the season (21) and the fewest rushing yards (102) since last season against New Mexico State.

The Rebels scored early and often, with their first touchdown from Snoop Conner at 3:19 into the game. A 93 yard drive resulting in a Corral to Yeboah touchdown, and Corral connecting with Moore for a 36-yard touchdown allowed the Rebels to take 21-0 lead after the first guarter.

Vanderbilt was able to find the endzone twice in the second guarter, but the Rebels persisted adding two more touchdowns from Corral to Moore to take a 33-14 lead at the half.

Ole Miss tacked on three touchdowns in the third quarter to extend their lead, and take the win over the Commodores.

OXFORD, Miss. —For the second consecutive week, the opponent had few answers for the Ole Miss Rebel offense. Trailing by four, the Rebels scored 21 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to outlast the South Carolina Gamecocks 59-42. The 101 combined points tied for the third most between the two SEC opponents in regulation.

Matt Corral became the first Rebel quarterback to crack 500 yards passing in a single game. He completed 28 of 32 passes for 513 yards with four touchdowns. Elijah Moore became only the fourth Rebel reciever to surpass 1,000 yards and the fastest reciever to do so. Moore caught 13 passes for 225 yards and two touchdowns. Braylon Sanders caught four passes for a careerhigh 141 yards. On the ground, Jerrion Ealy had 84 yards on 17 carries. Ole Miss finished with 708 yards of total offense, the third most in school history, including the most ever in an SEC game. Defensively, Ole Miss was led by Lakia Henry with 10 tackles followed by Jon Haynes with nine. A.J. Finley had six tackles with the Rebels' only turnover, an interception.

After a back and forth first half where Corral threw for two touchdowns and accounted for one on the ground, Ole Miss took a three point lead headed into the lockerroom off a Luke Logan 22-yard field goal.

The Rebels were able to capitalize having the ball to start the half, with a two-yard touchdown run from Snoop Conner to increase the lead to 31-21. The Gamecocks fired back to cut the Ole Miss lead within three with 5:39 remaining in the third quarter. followed by a 44-yard touchdown run to re-take the lead at 35-31. The see-saw game continued as Ole Miss grabbed the lead back off a 12-yard touchdown run from Ealy.

South Carolina once again found the endzone to take a 42-38 lead with 12:50 remaining. However the Ole Miss offense proved to be too much, scoring three touchdowns in the remaining minutes of the game to defeat the Gamecocks and win their first game at home of the season.

OXFORD, Miss. — The Rebels started fast and did just enough defensively in a 31-24 victory over the Mississippi State Bulldogs in the 117th edition of the Egg Bowl Rivalry.

Matt Corral completed 24 of 36 passes for 385 yards and two touchdown passes. Elijah Moore became the school's all-time record holder for receptions in a season with 86, passing A.J. Brown. Moore added 139 yards through the air. Braylon Sanders and Dontario Drummond combined for four catches and 171 yards with a score each.

On the ground, Jerrion Ealy led the Rebels with 93 yards on 18 carries and a touchdown which sealed the game late. Henry Parrish, Snoop Conner and Corral combined for 68 yards on 25 attempts.

Defensively, Ole Miss was led by Lakia Henry with 10 total tackles. Otis Reese totaled eight tackles and a pass breakup in his first action as an Ole Miss Rebel. The Rebel defense forced MSU to go 3-of-14 on third down, including an 0-for-4 mark in the game's final 15 minutes.

After being unable to convert in the MSU endzone early, the Rebels ultimately drew first blood following another three-and-out. Corral connected with four different recievers and capped off a 54-yard drive with a 48-yard touchdown strike to Drummond to give Ole Miss a 7-0 lead with 6:03 left in the first quarter.

Ole Miss was able to capitalize off of Deane Leonard's fumble recovery to take the ball from the MSU 16-yard line and into the end zone off a Conner 1-yard touchdown run to extend the lead to 14-0 as the first quarter drew to a close.

Mississippi State fired back early in the second quarter off a four play drive to cut the Rebel lead to 14-7. After forcing a three-and-out, Ole Miss faced 3rd-and-18 from their own 19-yard line. Corral threw a rocket to Sanders to come up with an 81-yard touchdown and a 21-7 lead. As time on the clocked neared halftime, MSU was able to complete a 93-yard drive off an 11-yard touchdown to trail 21-14 at the break.

With four consecutive punts to begin the second half and a scoreless third quarter, the Rebels extended their lead to 24-14 off a 26-yard Luke Logan field goal. MSU responded with a 75-yard drive to pull within three at 24-21 with 7:51 remaining in the game.

Ole Miss countered by converting twice on third down and reaching the Bulldog end zone off an 8-yard Ealy run to extend their lead by 10 with 4:48 remaining.

MSU had to settle for a 25-yard field goal with 2:08 left to play. The Rebels recovered the ensuing onside kick, to milk the clock and seal Lane Kiffin's first Egg Bowl victory.




