Chris Jackson's SEC scoring title in 1989 marked the 12th time an LSU player had won the title since the league began in 1933. LSU All-America Sparky Wade, won the title in 1932 (LSU's last in the Southern Intercollegiate Conference) and again in the school's first year in the SEC (1933). Wade scored 193 points in 20 games (9.6 average). The next year Wade averaged over 12 points a contest to win the 1934 SEC title.
