### The Breakdown

#### Tigers End Mini Homestand Against Ole Miss

Fresh off a win over Missouri on Sunday, the LSU soccer team (8-5-1, 2-3-1 SEC) will wrap up its mini homestand on Thursday night by hosting the Ole Miss Rebels. The game will begin at 6 p.m. CT and be televised on the SEC Network.

#### Series History - Ole Miss

The series has been an evenly matched one over the years with both teams registering 10 wins to go along with four draws. LSU's last win in the series came in 2016 and Marlena Cutura picked up an assist in the match that aided in LSU's 3-0 win over the Rebels. Alex Thomas scored a goal in last season's defeat to the Rebels.

#### Blanked by Brockmeier

Caroline Brockmeier tallied the 22nd shutout of her career against Alabama (Sept. 27) to help LSU pick up its first SEC win of 2018. It was her eighth shutout of the season which is a career high for the Tallahassee, Fla., native. Brockmeier's eight shutouts are the third most to ever be recorded in a single season at LSU alongside Mo Isom's eight in 2011. Isom owns the school record when she registered 12 in 2009, and Valerie Vogler has the second most in a single season with nine in 2007. Her eight shutouts this year rank sixth nationally.

#### Attacking Adrienne

Sophomore forward Adrienne Richardson has added a dynamic skillset to LSU's attacking front in 2018. A transfer from Florida State, Richardson arrived in Baton Rouge in January and has immediately stepped right in and helped bolster LSU's offense. The Oakdale, Minn., native has scored a team-high six goals and 13 points in 2018. Her first breakout came on Aug. 26 against Texas State. She scored goals in the 21st and 71st minutes of the match against Texas State to lead LSU to a 2-0 win. Nine days later as LSU traveled to Lamar for a showdown on Sept. 4, she recorded another multi-goal performance with scores in the 38th and 55th minutes. Her third multi-goal game of the season came on Sept. 27 against Alabama. Her two goals propelled LSU to its first SEC win of the season. Having scored multiple goals in three games this season, Richardson became the first Tiger to score multiple games in at least three games since Jorian Baucom did so in 2016.

#### Fresh Faces

LSU has received quality minutes from five freshmen in 2018. Abbey Newton headlines the class with three goals scored to go along with two assists for a total of eight points. Molly Thompson just added her second goal of the season on Sunday against Missouri, and Reese Moffatt and Shannon Cooke have each added one assist apiece. Meghan Johnson has come on as of late and has played some crucial minutes in LSU's last two SEC matches. Cooke and Moffatt have contributed heavily to LSU's eight shutouts this season as well.

#### First Half Goals Lead to Success

LSU has scored 12 of its 19 goals in the first half this season. A trend that bodes well for the Tigers, LSU is 7-2-0 this season when it takes a lead into the locker room at the half.

#### Callin' Baton Rouge

After its season-opening loss to Villanova on Aug. 19, the Tigers have rattled off a six-match unbeaten streak in Baton Rouge over the last month of play. The six-match unbeaten streak includes five wins (Texas State, Stetson, Samford, Alabama, Missouri) and a draw against then-No. 9 Auburn on Sept. 20. During Brian Lee's tenure at LSU, the Tigers boast a home record of 77-35-23.

## The Winning Streak

LSU reeled off six straight wins after dropping the season opener to Villanova 2-1 in overtime before dropping its SEC opener to Texas A&M (Sept. 14). The Tigers outscored their opponents in the six-game stretch by a tally of 11-0. It was the seventh time in program history that LSU has registered a win streak of at least six games during a season. It's the second time in program history that the Tigers have registered at least a five-game winning streak in back-to-back seasons. LSU won seven in a row to start the 2017 campaign to go along with six straight this year, and the other occasion came in 2002 (nine in a row/school record) and 2003 (five in a row).

## Cutura Clicking

Marlena Cutura scored her first goal in over a month on Sunday in LSU's 2-1 win over Missouri. It was her third goal of the season and two of them have been game winners. In addition to her goal scoring exploits this season Cutura has been dishing out assists as well. She registered the first multi-assist game of her career earlier this season with a matchup against Stetson (Sept. 6). The first came off a corner and the second was a delicately delivered lead ball sent in to Thompson. She scored seven points (2 goals & 3 assists) in a four-game stretch from Aug. 30 to Sept. 9. She has a career high nine points registered in 2018.

## SEC Defensive Player of the Week

Sophomore Lucy Parker was named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week a little under a month ago (Sept. 10). It was the first time in her career that she has earned this award. Parker played all 270 minutes in LSU's three-win week that included three shutout wins over Lamar, Stetson and Samford.

## Youthful Resurgence

Six of LSU's top eight scorers in 2018 are underclassmen. Adrienne Richardson, a sophomore transfer from Florida State, leads the way with 13 points (6g & 1a) and is followed by freshman Abbey Newton who has accounted for eight points (3g & 2a) in her debut season. Molly Thompson (freshman), Lindsey Eaton (sophomore) and Tinaya Alexander (sophomore) have all accounted for four points apiece and defender Lucy Parker, playing in her second season, has added a goal. The Tigers have played up to as many as nine underclassmen on the field at once this season.

## Roster Breakdown

LSU has 32 athletes on the roster for the 2018 season. Caroline Brockmeier, Alex Thomas and Christyna Pitre are the only three seniors on the roster for 2018. Thomas, Pitre and Brockmeier headline the senior class that will look to take the Tigers back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2015. The Tigers have a total of 25 underclassmen on the roster (13 freshmen, 12 sophomores) to go along with four juniors and three seniors.

## International Flavor

LSU has seven student-athletes on the roster that hail from outside of the United States. The foursome of Tinaya Alexander, Shannon Cooke, Lucy Parker and Chiara Ritchie-Williams all came across the pond from England. Reese Moffatt and Jade Clarke came to Baton Rouge via British Columbia, and Caitie Cantrill arrived in the states from Australia. Cooke, Ritchie-Williams, Parker and Alexander are all products of the England and Arsenal youth systems back home.

## Assisting Alexander

Tinaya Alexander owns the team lead with four assists. Two of her four dimes have come in the last three games assisting Adrienne Richardson's goal against Alabama and Marlena Cutura's goal against Missouri. She also had a multi-assist game earlier this season against Texas State on Aug. 26. Alexander led LSU in assists in 2017 with seven.
