### The Breakdown

#### Tigers Host SEC Home Opener

From here on out its SEC play for the LSU soccer team (6-3-0). The Tigers host No. 9 Auburn on Thursday night at LSU Soccer Stadium with first kick set for 7 p.m.

#### Series History - Auburn

Auburn owns the series advantage between the two schools with 18 wins in the 27 matchups. LSU earned a draw in 110 minutes of play last season double overtime match that featured no goals. Caroline Brockmeier has made six saves in each of the past two contests against Auburn.

#### Blanked by Brockmeier

Caroline Brockmeier tallied the 20th shutout of her career on Sept. 9 against Samford. The shutout was the sixth of her season which, at the time, tied for the NCAA lead with five other keepers. She now ranks third nationally in shutouts with six shutouts this season. Brockmeier and LSU's backline did not allow a goal for 558:59 consecutive minutes of play, which is a career long. The 558:59 minute streak was the second longest in program history. Brockmeier had a stretch from the end of her sophomore year to the beginning of her junior year that she didn't allow a goal for 447 minutes of play. There has been four instances in LSU's 24-year history that the Tigers have registered four-straight shutouts or more; two of those have come in 2017 and 2018 with Brockmeier in the net. Having only allowed five goals in 722 minutes of play, Brockmeier is averaging 0.78 goals against during her senior campaign which is a career best.

#### Attacking Adrienne

Sophomore forward Adrienne Richardson has added a dynamic skillset to LSU's attacking front in 2018. A transfer from Florida State, Richardson arrived in Baton Rouge in January and has immediately stepped right in and helped bolster LSU's offense. The Oakdale, Minn., native has already scored a team-high four goals and nine points in 2018. Her first breakout came on Aug. 26 against Texas State. She scored goals in the 21st and 71st minutes of the match against Texas State to lead LSU to a 2-0 win. Nine days later as LSU traveled to Lamar for a showdown on Sept. 4, she recorded another multi-goal performance with scores in the 38th and 55th minutes. She ranks fourth in the SEC in shots per game (3.89).

#### Last Time Out

Two second half goals by the Cincinnati Bearcats within a four-minute stretch proved to be deciding factor on Sunday (Sept. 16) as the Bearcats downed the LSU soccer team 2-1 at Gettler Stadium. Tiana Caffey scored her first-career goal in the 28th minute of the match to give LSU a one-goal advantage. Her goal was scored on the second of two corner kicks that the Tigers earned in a 20-second span. Marlena Cutura took both corners and the second one was initially touched by a Bearcat defender before Caffey took her left-footed shot from five yards out that gave the Cincinnati keeper no chance.

#### Fresh Faces

LSU has had five true freshman play this year – Abbey Newton, Shannon Cooke, Reese Moffatt, Molly Thompson and Meghan Johnson have all earned playing time. Newton has scored three goals and registered two assists to rank second on the team in points registered with eight. Thompson scored her first-career collegiate goal against Stetson (Sept. 6) in the 79th minute, and the duo of Cooke and Moffatt have played big time minutes on the backline to aid in LSU's six shutouts this season.

## Offensive Variety

LSU's 13 goals this season have come from seven different players. Adrienne Richardson owns the team lead with four goals. Abbey Newton (3) and Marlana Cutura (2) are next on the goals scored list, and four of those five goals have been game winners. Molly Thompson, Lucy Parker, Tiana Caffey and Alex Thomas, who each have one goal, are the fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh goal scorers for the Tigers in 2018.

## The Winning Streak

LSU reeled off six straight wins after dropping the season opener to Villanova 2-1 in overtime before dropping its SEC opener to Texas A&M last Friday night. The Tigers outscored their opponents in the six-game stretch by a tally of 11-0. It was the seventh time in program history that LSU has registered a win streak of at least six games during a season. It's the second time in program history that the Tigers have registered at least a five-game winning streak in back-to-back seasons. LSU won seven in a row to start the 2017 campaign to go along with six straight this year, and the other occasion came in 2002 (nine in a row/school record) and 2003 (five in a row).

## Cutura Clicking

Marlena Cutura registered the first multi-assist game of her career earlier this season with a matchup against Stetson (Sept. 6). The first came off a corner and the second was a delicately delivered lead ball sent in to Thompson. She has scored seven points (2 goals & 3 assists) in a four-game stretch from Aug. 30 to Sept. 9. She has a career high seven points registered in 2018 and both of her goals have been game winners.

## SEC Defensive Player of the Week

Sophomore Lucy Parker was named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Monday (Sept. 10). This is the first time in her career that she has earned this award. Parker played all 270 minutes in LSU's three-win week that included three more shutouts. A member of the backline that has not allowed a goal in the last 540 minutes of play, Parker also added the first goal of her season in Sunday's win against Samford.

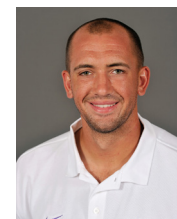
