### The Breakdown

### **Tigers Travel to Florida**

The LSU soccer team (6-3-1, 1-0-1 SEC) is set to take on Florida in Gainesville on Sunday at 12 p.m. CT in its third SEC match of the season.

## **Series History - Florida**

Florida owns the series advantage between the two schools with 17 wins in the 20 matchups. LSU's only win in the series came in 2011, a 1-0 win in Gainesville when Florida was ranked 11th in the nation.

### **Blanked by Brockmeier**

Caroline Brockmeier tallied the 21st shutout of her career on Thursday night against No. 9 Auburn. The shutout was the seventh of her season which has her tied for the third-most in the NCAA entering Sunday's match. Brockmeier and LSU's backline did not allow a goal for 558:59 consecutive minutes of play, which is a career long; the streak began with LSU's shutout victory over Liberty (Aug. 23) and ended when Texas A&M scored in the 19th minute of the match contested on Sept. 14. The 558:59 minute streak was the second longest in program history. Brockmeier had a stretch from the end of her sophomore year to the beginning of her junior year that she didn't allow a goal for 447 minutes of play. There has been four instances in LSU's 24-year history that the Tigers have registered four-straight shutouts or more; two of those have come in 2017 and 2018 with Brockmeier in the net. Having only allowed seven goals in 922 minutes of play, Brockmeier is averaging 0.68 goals against during her senior campaign which is a career best.

### **Attacking Adrienne**

Sophomore forward Adrienne Richardson has added a dynamic skillset to LSU's attacking front in 2018. A transfer from Florida State, Richardson arrived in Baton Rouge in January and has immediately stepped right in and helped bolster LSU's offense. The Oakdale, Minn., native has already scored a team-high four goals and nine points in 2018. Her first breakout came on Aug. 26 against Texas State. She scored goals in the 21st in 71st minutes of the match against Texas State to lead LSU to a 2-0 win. Nine days later as LSU traveled to Lamar for a showdown on Sept. 4, she recorded another multi-goal performance with scores in the 38th and 55th minutes. She ranks fourth in the SEC in shots per game (3.89).

### **Last Time Out**

LSU became the first team to hold No. 9 Auburn scoreless in 2018 on Thursday night at LSU Soccer Stadium. Brockmeier registered a season-best 11 saves in the shutout effort. Auburn entered the match with the most prolific scoring attack in the NCAA, but Brockmeier and the LSU backline were up to the task and grinded out the most impressive shutout of the season to date. The Tigers outshot Auburn 8-5 in the first half and uptick in opportunities for Auburn in the second half challenged Brockmeier and crew. Brockmeier made nine saves in the final 65 minutes of play to keep the clean sheet.

### **Fresh Faces**

LSU has had five true freshman play this year – Abbey Newton, Shannon Cooke, Reese Moffatt, Molly Thompson and Meghan Johnson have all earned playing time. Newton has scored three goals and registered two assists to rank second on the team in points registered with eight. Thompson scored her first-career collegiate goal against Stetson (Sept. 6) in the 79th minute, and the duo of Cooke and Moffatt have played big time minutes on the backline to aid in LSU's seven shutouts this season.

### **Offensive Variety**

LSU's 13 goals this season have come from seven different players. Adrienne Richardson owns the team lead with four goals. Abbey Newton (3) and Marlena Cutura (2) are next on the goals scored list, and four of those five goals have been game winners. Molly Thompson, Lucy Parker, Tiana Caffey and Alex Thomas, who each have one goal, are the fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh goal scorers for the Tigers in 2018.

### **The Winning Streak**

LSU reeled off six straight wins after dropping the season opener to Villanova 2-1 in overtime before dropping its SEC opener to Texas A&M last Friday night. The Tigers outscored their opponents in the six-game stretch by a tally of 11-0. It was the seventh time in program history that LSU has registered a win streak of at least six games during a season. It's the second time in program history that the Tigers have registered at least a five-game winning streak in back-to-back seasons. LSU won seven in a row to start the 2017 campaign to go along with six straight this year, and the other occasion came in 2002 (nine in a row/school record) and 2003 (five in a row).

# **Cutura Clicking**

Marlena Cutura registered the first multi-assist game of her career earlier this season with a matchup against Stetson (Sept. 6). The first came off a corner and the second was a delicately delivered lead ball sent in to Thompson. She has scored seven points (2 goals & 3 assists) in in a four-game stretch from Aug. 30 to Sept. 9. She has a career high seven points registered in 2018 and both of her goals have been game winners.

### **SEC Defensive Player of the Week**

Sophomore Lucy Parker was named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Monday (Sept. 10). It was the first time in her career that she has earned this award. Parker played all 270 minutes in LSU's three-win week that included three more shutouts. A member of the backline that has only allowed five goals in the last 830 minutes of play, Parker also added the first goal of her season in Sunday's win against Samford (Sept. 9).
