AT A GLANCE

- *LSU and UCLA have never met on the gridiron.
- *UCLA has posted an 18-15-4 record in games against current members of the SEC, including wins in 5 of the last 6 meetings.
- *The Bruins have played in a bowl game in each of the last 6 seasons in which they have earned a win in game one of that season.
- *UCLA's last win over a ranked opponent was a 42-32 decision in 2019 over #24 Arizona State --- its last win over a top-15 ranked team was 2014 season win over No. 11 Kansas St. in Alamo Bowl.
- *UCLA finished 3-4 in 2020, losing 4 games by a total of 15 points.
- *UCLA opens the season with three home games for the first time since 2000 when it defeated Alabama, Fresno St. and Michigan.
- *UCLA posted its first win over a non-conference opponent since 2017 with its victory last week over Hawai'i.
- *UCLA is plus-17 in wins under Coach Kelly; +2 vs. Hawai'i
- *UCLA played 5 true freshmen in the opener against Hawai'i.
- *UCLA has rushed for at least 200 yards in 5 of last 7 games.
- *UCLA held three opponents under 20 points last season-all wins.
- *UCLA has won 37 straight overall games and 56 straight regular season games in which it has held the opponent to less than 20 points (last loss 17-16 to BYU in 2007 Las Vegas Bowl /last regular season loss 16-14 at Colorado 2003).

BRUINS TO HOST LSU ON SATURDAY EVENING — UCLA's season-opening homestand continues on Saturday, Sept. 4 as the Bruins welcome LSU to Spieker Field at the Rose Bowl for a 5:30 p.m. contest to be broadcast by FOX. The Bruin Learfield Radio Network will broadcast the contest, which will also be aired by Westwood One and over SiriusXM and the Varsity App. The battle with LSU will mark the first meeting between the schools in football.

UCLA owns an 18-15-4 record in games versus teams which comprise this year's SEC Conference. The Bruins split a home-and-home series with Texas A&M in the 2017 and 2016 seasons in its last encounter with an SEC opponent.

Fourth-year head coach Chip Kelly was named UCLA's head football coach on Nov. 25, 2017. Kelly owns a collegiate record of 57-28 compiled in three-plus seasons at UCLA and in four seasons as the head coach at the University of Oregon (2009-12). During that span in Eugene, his Duck teams captured first place or a share of first in the North Division of the conference (three outright conference championships 2009-11) and four BCS bowl games. Kelly guided Oregon to appearances in a National Championship Game (2010), two Rose Bowls (after 2011 and 2009 seasons) and the Fiesta Bowl following the 2012 season. Kelly was named the 2009 and 2010 Pac-10 Coach of the Year, 2010 Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year, 2010 Walter Camp Coach of the Year, 2010 Sporting News Coach of the Year, 2010 AFCA Coach of the Year Award and 2010 Associated Press Coach of the Year. In six of his seven seasons as a collegiate head coach, Kelly has produced a top-15 rated NCAA rushing leader in yards per game average -- 2020: Demetric Felton, Jr., 14th; 2018: Joshua Kelley, 9th; 2012: Kenjon Barner, 4th; 2011: LaMichael James, 1st; 2010: LaMichael James, 1st; 2009: LaMichael James, 9th.

UCLA VS. LSU / SEC — While LSU and UCLA have not met on the gridiron, the Bruins have battled teams from the SEC quite often over the years and own a combined 18-15-4 record versus the current members of the league -- Alabama 2-1; Arkansas 1-0-1; Auburn 0-0; Florida 3-2; Georgia 0-2; Kentucky 0-0; LSU; Mississippi 0-0; Mississippi State 0-0; Missouri 2-0-1; Tennessee 6-7-2; South Carolina 0-0; Texas A&M 3-3; Vanderbilt 1-0. UCLA will return the game against LSU in Baton Rouge on Sept. 21, 2024. Since 2000, UCLA has posted a 5-1 record versus SEC teams with the loss coming in an overtime decision in College Station -- 2017 W vs. A&M; 2016 L at A&M; 2009 W at Tennessee; 2008 W vs. Tennessee; 2001 W at Alabama; 2000 W vs. Alabama.

THE WATCHLIST

- New **transfers** played key roles in the win over Hawaii --- RB Zach Charbonnet (Michigan) ran for 106 yards on six carries while scoring TDs on runs of 21, 47 and 21 yards; Ale Kaho (Alabama) blocked a punt which was recovered for a TD; CB Cameron Johnson (20 starts at North Texas over the past two seasons) made his first start for UCLA; Kam Brown (4 starts last season at Texas A&M) started at WR; Jordan Genmark Heath (1 career start at Notre Dame) made his first start for the Bruins.
- **Fast start:** UCLA limited Hawaii to 9 plays and 2 yards on its first three possessions while jumping out to a 17-0 first-quarter lead.
- The Bruins have gone on to play in a **bowl game** in each of the last six seasons in which they have earned a win in the first game of that season: 2017 (Cactus Bowl-opening win over A&M); 2015 (Foster Farms Bowl-opening win over UVA); 2014 (Alamo Bowl-opening win over UVA); 2013 (Sun Bowl-opening win over Rice); 2012 (Holiday Bowl-opening win over Nevada); 2009 (Eagle Bank Bowl-opening win over San Diego St.).
- UCLA is +17 **turnovers** in wins and -27 in losses under Coach Kelly... In its four 2020 losses, UCLA committed 12 of its 13 turnovers on the season. It turned the ball over 4 times at Colorado, 4 times at Oregon, 3 times vs. USC and once vs. Stanford.
- **Dorian Thompson-Robinson** (5,262 yds) needs 37 passing yards to move past Troy Aikman (5,298) and into 7th on the all-time school career list ... With two more TD passes, DTR (41) will move past Cory Paus (42) and slide into sixth on that all-time school list.
- UCLA played 5 **true freshmen** in the opener against Hawaii. The Bruins used 21 true freshmen in 2018 to set a new school record - the old mark was 18 in 2013... True freshmen played in recent seasons: 2020: 11, 2019: 9, 2018: 21, 2017: 8, 2016: 11, 2015: 10.
- **Mitchell Agude** has now been credited with at least 0.5 TFL in each of his UCLA games ... he led the team with 9.0 tackles for loss in 2020 and was the only Bruin to have at least 0.5 TFL in each of the seven games in 2020 ... He registered a season-high 3.5 TFLs vs. Oregon ... Agude was also credited with the forced fumble which was returned for a TD at Oregon and two forced fumbles vs. Arizona ... he rated 10th nationally in forced fumbles (0.43/g) in 2020 and opened 2021 with two more forced fumbles against Hawai'i.
- **Defensive Improvement** -- UCLA limited Hawaii to 26 rushing yards (1.2 avg. per rush) in the opener, the fewest by an opponent since BYU totaled 23 in a 2016 game ... Hawai'i also generated just 3.6 yards per play average overall... Rushing Yards per game allowed 2017: 287.4 / 2018: 199.4 / 2019: 145.5 / 2020: 135.7; Average Yards per rush allowed 2017: 5.8 / 2018: 4.6 / 2019: 4.3 / 2020: 3.6; Average yards allowed per play 2017: 6.3 / 2018: 6.0 / 2019: 6.7 / 2020: 5.4.
- **Ale Kaho** was credited with a punt block which was recovered for a Bruin touchdown against Hawaii. The transfer from Alabama had a punt deflection in action last season and three punt blocks during 2019 for the Crimson Tide.
- UCLA has rushed for at least 200 yards in five of the last seven contests ... last year's average **rushing offense** per game of 230.6 yards per game rated 12th in NCAA/2nd in Pac-12 ... the Bruins surpassed the **200-yards rushing per game** average milestone for a season for only the fourth time since 1990 -- 2014-209.5, 1995-212.5 and 1991-200.1.
- **Zach Charbonnet** rushed for 106 yards and three scores on six first-half carries in his Bruin debut against Hawai'i ... the Michigan transfer scored 11 touchdowns as a true freshman while at Michigan in 2019 and posted two 100-yard games (vs. Army and Illinois) ... he also scored three rushing touchdowns in a 2019 contest against Army ... last season at UM, he had a 70-yard run for a score against Minnesota.
- In his last four games, **Dorian Thompson-Robinson** has completed 66 of 92 passes (.717) for 751 yards; 6 TDs, 2 int.; he has rushed 37 times for 161 yards (4.4 avg. and a TD) ... Thompson-Robinson's progression -- **Pass Efficiency** Rating-2020: 156.29; 2019: 134.86; 2018: 122.28 ... The last Bruin starting QB to post a higher rating for a season was Drew Olson in 2005 (161.6).
- In his last four games, **Britain Brown** has rushed 56 times for 425 yards (7.6 yds per rush) and 2 TDs ... his 6.6 yards per rush average in 2021 was the best by a Bruin back, with at least 80 carries, since 1988 (Shawn Wills 94 att-622 yds-6.6) ... Brown recorded a career-best 219 yards rushing on 29 carries in the 2020 season finale against Stanford ... he scored on a 15-yard run vs. USC ... he made his first career start at Arizona State and

BRUINS IN GRAD SCHOOL

Fifteen of the UCLA Bruins are currently enrolled in the master's degree program in Transformative Coaching and Leadership -- Brittain Brown, Ethan Fernea, Jon Gaines II, Jordan Genmark Heath, Paul Grattan, Chase Griffin, Odua Isibor, Datona Jackson, Cameron Johnson, Qwuantrezz Knight, Quentin Lake, Sam Marrazzo, Otito Ogbonnia, Mo Osling III, Shea Pitts.

Offered by UCLA's Department of Education, the master's degree in Transformative Coaching and Leadership prepares graduates for careers in coaching and sports leadership in professional and collegiate athletics, K-12 schools and community-based sports organizations. Inspired by the legendary John Wooden, the goals of the program include enabling prospective candidates to develop their own philosophy of coaching and leadership—and one that is premised on a holistic understanding of persons and sound principles of coaching, teaching and learning. The degree program is also informed by an ethic of social justice, where teaching and coaching in various contexts—collegiate sports, professional sports, K-12 schools, Boys and Girls Clubs and other community sports programs—are analyzed through the lens of equity, access, diversity, and human dignity with the steadfast aim of contributing to the creation of a more just, equitable and humane society through enlightened and socially conscious sports education and leadership. In addition, Obi Eboh has completed the Masters of Legal Studies degree program with a specialization in business law.

ran for 94 yards on seven carries; he also caught 2 passes for 36 yards ... he found the end zone in three straight games earlier in 2020 --- 16-yard pass play vs. Arizona, 2-yard rush at Oregon and 31-yard run against Cal.

- **First-career starts** as Bruins - Hawaii: CB Cameron Johnson, WR Kam Brown, LB Jordan Genmark Heath (Atonio Mafi started for first time at OL after 14 starts as a Bruin defensive lineman-he played on offense for the first time in 2020 season).
- **First action** as Bruins - WR Kam Brown, DB Cameron Johnson, QB Ethan Garbers, LB Ale Kaho, LB Jordan Genmark Heath, WR Keonte Leis, RB Zach Charbonnet, DB Devin Kirkwood, RB Brian Kowall, WR Devanti Dillard, DL Hayden Harris, LB Joquarri Price, OL Brad Whitworth, OL Baraka Beckett, OL Garrett DiGiorgio, OL Bruno Fina, DL Jay Toia, DL Tiaoaalii Savea.
- **Special Teams:** UCLA allowed zero return yards on five punts and eight kickoffs vs. Hawai'i ... kickoff man RJ Lopez was a perfect 8-8 in touchbacks; punter Luke Akers had a 45.0-yard average and a career-best 66-yard boot with two kicks inside the 20; kicker Nicholas Barr-Mira has now connected on 7-8 career field goals after hitting from 27 yards out against UH.
- UCLA utilized 74 players against Hawaii -- 9-RSr.; 14-Sr.; 5-RJr.; 6-Jr.; 8-So.; 10-RSo.; 7-RFr.; 5-Fr.
- **Defensive Growth:** UCLA's **sacks** progression -- (NCAA rank/avg) 2020: 8th/3.3 per game; 2019: 62nd/2.2; 2018: 118th/1.3 --- 2021: 2.0 UCLA's **tackles for loss** progression -- (NCAA rank/avg) 2020: 34th/6.9 per game; 2019: 61st/6.0; 2018: 115th/4.6 -- 2021: 7.0
- Tight end **Greg Dulcich** averaged 19.88 yards per catch (13th in NCAA) and 73.9 receiving yards per game ... both marks rated as second-best among the nation's tight ends in 2020 and best among Power 5 tight ends ... His 100-yard receiving game at Colorado marked the seventh straight season in which a Bruin **TE has gone over the century mark** in at least one game in a season (Devin Asiasi in 2019, Caleb Wilson in 2018 and 2017, Nate lese in 2016, Thomas Duarte in 2015 and 2014) ... he added 167 receiving yards vs. USC.
- **Kyle Philips** has a reception in each of the last 19 games ... he led the Bruins in catches again in 2020 (38) and he became the 27th UCLA receiver to reach the 100-catch mark (104) for a career... In 2019, he topped UCLA in receptions (60), which was the most ever in a single season by a Bruin freshman/redshirt freshman ... he was first redshirt freshman to lead the team since Craig Bragg in 2001.
- **Caleb Johnson** has 27 tackles in his last four games ... he ranked 27th in the NCAA in sacks/g (0.79) in 2020 ... Johnson paced the Bruins in sacks with 5.5 (most by a Bruin LB since Aaron Wallace had 7.0 in 2015) and was second in TFLs at 7.0.
- In its four losses in 2020: Oregon scored 28 **points off of UCLA turnovers**, 21 in first half, two on scoring drives of less than 30 yards ... Colorado scored 21 first-half points off Bruin miscues with two TDs on drives of less than 10 yards ... USC scored 15 points off of 3 Bruin turnovers, including TDs after drives of 30 and 31 yards and a field goal on a 3-yard drive ... Stanford scored a touchdown after a Bruin fumble.
- **Dorian Thompson-Robinson** has rushed for an average of 3.7 yards per carry in Bruin wins (89 att. for 328 yds.) and 1.9 per carry in losses (137 att. for 262 yds.) ... he rushed for a season-high 109 yards in the 2020 opener at Colorado ... DTR totaled 306 yards rushing in 2020 (5.6 avg.) and 3 TDs; 2019: 198 yards (1.7 avg.) and 4 TDs; 2018: 68 yards (1.4 avg.) and 0 TDs.
- **Stephan (steff-en) Blaylock** finished second on the Bruins in tackles in 2020 (42) ... He picked off his first career pass vs. Arizona and added a second pick vs. USC ... He matched his career best with 11 stops at Colorado.
- **Dorian Thompson-Robinson** has exceeded the .600 threshold 10 times in his career (6-4 record). His 13-for-15 effort (.866) at Cal in 2018 was the third-best mark by a Bruin since 1980 (with at least 15 attempts) ... In 2019 wins, he completed .675 of passes (83-123, with 11 TDs and 3 Int.) and in losses, .556 (133-239, with 10 TDs and 9 Int.).
- The Bruins have played in a bowl game after 13 of previous 20 seasons (not after 2001, 2008, 2010, 2016, 2018, 2019, 2020 seasons).

UCLA SIGNS DEAL WITH JORDAN / NIKE — UCLA's Alice and Nahum Lainer Family Director of Athletics Martin Jarmond forged a six-year agreement with Nike, Inc. to make Jordan Brand and Nike the Bruins' official athletic footwear, apparel and equipment provider beginning on July 1, 2021. Under the terms of the agreement, Nike will supply uniforms, footwear, apparel and equipment to 22 of UCLA's 25 varsity athletic teams, while Jordan Brand will outfit the football and men's and women's basketball programs with "Jumpman" product. With this agreement, UCLA becomes the only school to wear the Jumpman in the Pac-12 Conference, and only the fifth university in the country to join forces with Jordan Brand on football, as well as both men's and women's basketball. The contract will extend beyond outfitting some of the most iconic teams in collegiate athletics. NIKE, Inc. also will lend its support to UCLA Athletics' student-athlete development programs, offer two summer internships per calendar year to UCLA students, and annually host a group of selected UCLA students at its headquarters for an educational experience.

ON THE SIDE

- Linebacker Jordan Genmark Heath was born and grew up in Sweden ... he learned about football by watching the NFL on television late at night with his father and through YouTube clips ... he learned to speak English by watching American TV shows and listening to music ... his family moved to Southern California during his high school years where he played football for the first time and earned a scholarship to Notre Dame.
- Defensive back Obi Eboh has an undergrad degree from Stanford in Management Science and Engineering and a graduate degree from UCLA in Legal Studies. He is hopeful for a career in the NFL and/or as an equities manager in the financial world.
- Kazmeir Allen is one of three highly regarded sprinters on the Bruin roster - 2018 CIF state 100m event champ (10.44); also Christian Grubb - 2019 100m CIF state event 2nd place (10.53); Keegan Jones 2018 200m event Tennessee state champ (21.10)
- Defensive back Martell Irby has been playing the saxophone since the fourth grade ... He attended the San Diego School of Creative and Performing Arts (a San Diego Unified School District college-preparatory, arts-focused public magnet school for students in grades 6 through 12 who have a strong interest and talent in the arts) and was a member of their award-winning jazz ensemble at the school ... Since the school did not sponsor a sports program, he was able to play football at nearby Morse HS.
- Defensive lineman Otito Ogbonnia is also a standout track and field performer ... Ogbonnia recorded a 10th-place finish in the shot put (19.44 m/63-9.5) at the 2020 NCAA Championship Meet to earn second-team All-America honors ... At the 2020 Pac-12 Championship meet, he placed fourth in the shot put (19.59m/64-3.25) and eighth in the discus (174-7) ... In the summer of 2020, he won the shot put competition at the USATF U20 National Track and Field Championships (70-3.5) in Miramar, Fla. ... He then came away with the gold medal in the shot put at the 2020 Pan American U20 Championships in Costa Rica with a mark of 67-11.5.

In alignment with Pac-12 Team Green, a conference-wide initiative promoting greening and sustainability efforts, UCLA is taking the first step toward a paperless press box in the Rose Bowl. THE STORY OF NO. 36 - A WALK-ON EARNS A SCHOLARSHIP

On Sunday, Aug. 18, 2019, Coach Kelly awarded Ethan Fernea (FIR-nee-uh) the No. 36 jersey in honor of Nick Pasquale who wore the number for the Bruins in 2012 and 2013 before his death in a car accident. Nick's parents, Mel and Laurie, along with his brother A.J. were on the practice field for the presentation. On Aug. 29, just before leaving for the first game of the 2019 season, Fernea was put on scholarship. He caught his first career touchdown pass against Colorado.

Nick was a 5-7, 172 pound redshirt freshman walk-on receiver for the Bruins who had seen his first game action a week before his death in September of 2013. He was known for his passion for the game, his limitless determination and his high qualities as a teammate.

Current UCLA coaches Jerry Neuheisel and Daniel Fields were teammates with Pasquale. The 2019 season was the first that a Bruin had worn the No. 36 since the start of the 2013 season.

UCLA HEAD COACH CHIP KELLY



Chip Kelly was named UCLA's 17th head football coach on Nov. 25, 2017. Kelly, the National College Coach of the Year in 2010 and a two-time Pac-12 Conference Coach of the Year, holds 30 seasons of coaching experience at both the professional and collegiate levels. Before coming to UCLA, he served as the head coach of the San Francisco 49ers in 2016. Prior to that, Kelly was the head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles from 2013-15 and worked for four seasons (2009-12) as head coach at the University of Oregon where he posted a record of 46-7.

In 2020, UCLA led the Pac-12 in scoring (248 points) and touchdowns scored (31). Bruin quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson produced the school's best pass efficiency mark since 2005 (156.29). The third-year starter became the first Bruin quarterback to record a 300-yard passing (303) and 100-yard rushing game (109) in the same contest (at Colorado). UCLA produced a team rushing average of over 200 yards per game for just the fourth time since 1990. The mark of 230.6 rushing yards per game ranked 12th nationally. A Bruin team has not finished with a rushing yards per carry mark greater than 2020's 5.1 mark since 1976. Tight end Greg Dulcich rated No. 2 in the nation among tight ends with both his 73.9 receiving yards per game average and 19.88 yards per catch mark. Dulcich's 126-yard performance in the opener at Colorado marked the seventh straight season in which a Bruin tight end had reach the century receiving yards mark in a game. Demetric Felton Jr. led the Pac-12 and ranked sixth in the NCAA in all-purpose yards (165.83). UCLA's defense showed improvement in all phases. The unit allowed almost 50 yards less in total offense (409.9) than the previous season, while reducing its rushing defense average by almost 10 yards per game (135.7). It sliced almost a half a yard off the rushing average per carry to 3.6, a mark which led the Pac-12. Per game averages for tackles for loss (6.8) and sacks (3.3-8th in NCAA) both went up in 2020.

In 2019, Thompson-Robinson finished among the top-10 at the school for a single season in completions (216-9th), total offense (2,899-10th) and TD passes (21-10th). He set a school mark with 564 yards of total offense in a win at Washington State while leading the second-largest comeback in school history (32 points). Running back Joshua Kelley became the eighth Bruin to post back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons. Kelley finished second in the Pac-12 in rushing yards per game average. Felton set a school mark for a running back with 55 receptions and added a school-record four scoring plays of 75-yards or more in length. UCLA produced five consecutive 200-yard rushing games for the first time since the 1978 season. Kyle Philips finished with the most catches (60) ever by a Bruin freshman player and became the first redshirt freshman to lead the team in receptions since 2001. The rush defense knocked off almost 0.5 yard/carry off the average of the previous season and the number of quarterback sacks increased dramatically to 26. Special teams improved across the board and featured a punt and kickoff return for a touchdown. UCLA ranked second in the nation in punt return average (22.5 yards).

In his first season in Westwood, Kelly became just the fourth Bruin head coach to guide his team past USC in his initial meeting with the crosstown rival. Kelly racked up 289 rushing yards in the win against the Trojans, most ever by a back in the series. The Bruin back finished ninth in the nation in rushing average (113.0 yds per game) and 18th nationally in all-purpose yards (130.55). It marked the fifth consecutive season in which Coach Kelly had produced an NCAA top-10 rated rushing offense leader as a college head coach. A young Bruin team, which saw a school-record 21 true freshman student-athletes take the field during the season, showed steady improvement and generated 432.9 yards of total offense per game over the last eight games of the season, including a 528-yard effort in the season-finale versus Stanford.

Kelly's lone season in San Francisco saw the 49ers improve from the league's 21st-ranked rushing attack in 2015 (1,544 yards) to the 4th-best ground game in 2016 (2,019 yards). Running back Carlos Hyde was the biggest beneficiary of the improvement, gaining 988 yards in just 13 contests (76.0 yards per game).

Over Kelly's three seasons in Philadelphia, the Eagles ranked third in the NFL in points per game (26.9) and total offense (392.8 yards per game), as well as fourth in rushing yards per game (131.3). Sixteen Pro Bowlers were selected from his teams, including eight in 2014. The Eagles won 10 games in each of his first two seasons, as his 2014 offense scored a franchise-record 474 points to surpass his 2013 team's previous-record total of 442. The Eagles showed a marked improvement in Year 1 under Kelly, as their 10 wins followed a four-win 2012. He became just the second head coach in league history to win a division title in his first season in the NFL, as the Eagles captured an NFC East Division Championship. He was also named the Maxwell Club NFL Coach of the Year.

Kelly began his head coaching career at the University of Oregon in 2009, leading the Ducks to a 10-3 record and a trip to the Rose Bowl. He finished his time at Oregon with an overall record of 46-7 as head coach (2009-12), including a 33-3 mark in conference play. In his four seasons in Eugene, the Ducks averaged 44.7 points per game. Kelly became the first coach in school history to guide the program to three consecutive undisputed conference championships (2009-11) and its first three 12-win seasons (2010-12).

Oregon made an appearance in a BCS Bowl game in each of Kelly's four seasons, including a trip to the National Championship game following the 2010 campaign. Kelly was named Pac-10 Coach of the Year in back-to-back seasons in 2009 and '10, and Associated Press Coach of the Year in 2010.

The 2012 Ducks finished second in the nation in scoring (49.6 points per game) and fifth in total offense (537.4 yards per game) with freshman quarterback Marcus Mariota under center. They would conclude the season with a Fiesta Bowl victory over Kansas State. A January bowl game was also the end result for Oregon the year prior, as the Ducks defeated Wisconsin in a Rose Bowl thriller, 45-38. Kelly's offense notched Top-5 finishes in points per game (46.1, third) and total offense (522.8 yards per game, fourth) in 2011.

In 2010, the Ducks led the nation both points per game (46.1) and total yardage (530.7 per game) en route to a BCS National Championship Game appearance. In addition to his Pac-10 Coach of the Year and Associated Press Coach of the Year awards, Kelly garnered Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year, Walter Camp Coach of the Year, Sporting News Coach of the Year and American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Coach of the Year accolades.

Kelly's first season as a head coach (2009) culminated in a Rose Bowl appearance and the Pac-10 Coach of the Year award, as his offense ranked sixth in the country in both points per game (36.1) and rushing yards per game (231.7). He was promoted to the top spot after his offenses led the Pac-10 in a number of categories during his two seasons (2007-08) as offensive coordinator under Mike Bellotti.

Kelly had spent the previous 13 years at his alma mater, the University of New Hampshire, before being named offensive coordinator at Oregon. As offensive coordinator at UNH, Kelly protégée Ricky Santos earned the Walter Payton Award as the most outstanding player in FCS in 2006. The quarterback previously finished second in 2005. Kelly also coached the Wildcats' offensive line (1997, 1998) and running backs (1992, 1994-96). The New Hampshire offense averaged better than 400 yards of total offense per game in seven of his eight seasons on staff.

Kelly began his coaching career guiding defensive backs and special teams at Columbia University in 1990. He moved to outside linebackers and safeties in 1991 before his first stint at UNH as running backs coach in 1992. He also spent one season at Johns Hopkins University as defensive coordinator in 1993.

UCLA REMEMBERS LEGENDARY COACH TERRY DONAHUE

Terry Donahue, the winningest coach in Pacific-12 Conference and UCLA football history, passed away on July 4, at his home in Newport Beach, Calif., surrounded by family, following a two-year battle with cancer. He was 77.

Donahue devoted the majority of his adult life to championing UCLA after enrolling at the school as a walk-on defensive lineman. In his first season (1965) in Westwood as a student-athlete, the 190-pound lineman helped lead the Bruins to the program's first-ever Rose Bowl victory with an upset of previously unbeaten and No. 1-ranked Michigan State. He went on to serve as an assistant coach for the Bruins under Pepper Rodgers and Dick Vermeil and then took over the reins as UCLA's head coach, at age 31, beginning with the 1976 season. Donahue, the first person to appear in a Rose Bowl Game as a player, assistant coach and head coach at his alma mater, would go on to post a conference-record 98 wins (98-51-5) and a school-record 151 wins (151-74-8). In a 20-year span, he won or shared five conference titles (1982, 1983, 1985, 1987, 1993) while finishing first or second in the league standings 12 times. The Bruins captured wins in three Rose Bowls (1983, 1984, 1986) during his tenure and he became the first college coach to come away with bowl game victories in seven consecutive seasons (1983 Rose Bowl, 1984 Rose Bowl, 1985 Fiesta Bowl, 1986 Rose Bowl, 1986 Freedom Bowl, 1987 Aloha Bowl, 1989 Cotton Bowl), including four New Year's Day wins in a row. Donahue's Bruins recorded seven straight top-20 finishes in the final Associated Press football poll from 1982-88.

During his 20-year head coaching reign, Donahue's Bruin teams produced 40 wins over ranked opponents culminating with his final coaching victory, a 24-20 decision in the L.A. Coliseum over No. 11 USC in 1995. He posted a 10-9-1 career ledger in battles against the crosstown rivals. Donahue's UCLA teams yielded 34 first-team All-America team selections, a list featuring some of the top performers in school history --- LB Jerry Robinson, S Kenny Easley, RB Freeman McNeil, K John Lee, LB Ken Norton Jr., QB Troy Aikman, LB Carnell Lake, S Eric Turner and OL Jonathan Ogden. Fourteen of Donahue's Bruins were chosen in the first round of the NFL Draft, including future Pro Football Hall of Famers Aikman, Easley and Ogden.

Donahue himself was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2000. In 1997, he was welcomed into the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame. Donahue joined the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame with the class of 2001. In 2013, the press box at the Rose Bowl was officially dedicated as the Terry Donahue Pavilion. ESPN named Donahue one of the 150 Greatest College Coaches in its 2019 celebration of College Football's 150th Anniversary.

SPIEKER FIELD AT THE ROSE BOWL: HOME OF BRUIN FOOTBALL

The nation's most famous college football stadium – The Rose Bowl – will be in its 40th season as the home of the UCLA Bruins football team. The stadium is recognized as both a United States National Historic Landmark and a California Historic Civil Engineering landmark. Thanks to a generous donation in 2017 from prominent UCLA alum Tod Spieker and his family, the playing surface is called Spieker Field at the Rose Bowl.

The Rose Bowl was built specifically for football, but has been utilized as a venue for portions of the 1932 Olympic Games' cycling events and was the soccer site for the 1984 Olympics. The Rose Bowl has also played host to five NFL Super Bowls – XI in 1977, XIV in 1980, XVII in 1983, XXI in 1987 and XXVII in 1993. It was a venue for the 1994 World Cup and the 1999 Women's World Cup soccer tournaments, including the championship games. The USA women's soccer team victory over China in the 1999 event drew over 90,000 fans. In addition, the 1983 Army-Navy game was played in the Rose Bowl.

On Jan. 1, 2018 and Jan. 1, 2015, the Rose Bowl served as the site of one of the College Football Playoff semifinal games. In 2014, the Rose Bowl hosted the final BCS Championship contest. It had also played host to the BCS Championship game in 2002, 2006 and 2010.

Considered an ideal concert venue, the Rose Bowl has hosted shows by such groups and artists as Taylor Swift, Beyonce, Jay-Z, Kenny Chesney, Jason Aldean, One Direction, U2, 'N Sync, Eagles, Rolling Stones, Pink Floyd, Michael Jackson, Metallica, Guns and Roses, Depeche Mode and Journey.

The iconic stadium has put the final touches on a \$181 million dollar renovation, and now features a new video board, improved exiting, wider aisles in the end zones and the Terry Donahue Pavilion. The Pavilion area houses the press boxes, broadcast booths, premium seating, boxes and suites. In December of 2015, the radio and TV booths were renamed "The Keith Jackson Broadcast Center". Jackson, the former sportscaster, coined the phrase "The Granddaddy of Them All" for the Rose Bowl Game. Also added are field level entrances and exits, and additional concession stands and restroom facilities.

Since 2007, UCLA and its opponents have dressed in new locker rooms located underneath the south concourse of the stadium. The locker area



features all of the latest amenities to benefit the players, coaches, sports medicine and equipment staffs. In addition, a new media interview room and working press area were included in the upgrades. In 1998, new individual chairs were installed in the seating areas between the end zones. Also, improved seating areas for the physically challenged were installed, as well as a new sound system.

Completed in 1922 at a cost of \$272,198, the Rose Bowl was first used for the USC-California football game that year which was won by the Golden Bears 12-0. The stadium was originally horseshoe shaped and seated 57,000 persons when it hosted the 1923 Rose Bowl Game. The south end zone was enclosed prior to the 1929 game to increase seating capacity to 76,000. Further enlargements took place in 1932 (83,677) and 1949 (100,807). A record crowd of 106,869 fans wit-

nessed the 1973 Ohio State – USC Rose Bowl contest.

The Rose Bowl has many firsts in its vast history. On Jan. 1, 1927, radio stations across the nation were linked together for the first time in a coast-to-coast broadcast. On Jan. 1, 1954, The UCLA-Michigan State Rose Bowl Game was the first west-to-east color telecast on a nationwide connection.

The Rose Bowl has 77 rows of seats. It measures 880 feet from the north to south rims and 695 feet from east to west. Its circumference around the rim is 2,430 feet, compared to 1,350 feet at field level. It took 28 miles of lumber to provide the original seats. The square footage of the grass on the floor of the stadium is 79,156.

Bruins on the Radio

The 2021 season is UCLA's 25th season with Clear Channel Radio. This will be the 15th year for the Bruins to be aired on AM 570 LA Sports (or am 1150 KTLK) in Southern California (97.3 FM The Fan in San Diego). The broadcasts are produced by Learfield, UCLA's corporate and media-rights holder. The broadcast includes a pre- and post-game show.

Josh Lewin returns as the voice of the Bruins for a sixth season. Former Bruin quarterback Matt Stevens ('83-86) is set to begin his 25th year on the broadcast team and his 21st as the analyst in the booth after being welcomed into the So Cal Sports Broadcasters Hall of Fame in 2019. Another Bruin signal caller, Wayne Cook ('91-94) is in his 21st season as the sideline reporter.

AM 570 LA Sports also provides ancillary programming, including head coach and player interviews during game weeks. The weekly hour-long Bruin Insider Show also returns.

UCLA IMG Sports Network games are available nationally through an agreement with Sirius XM Satellite Radio, the Official Satellite Partner of UCLA Athletics. Games can also be heard, via the internet, at the Varsity App.

Bruins on Television

Following the 2021 Hawaii game, 206 of UCLA's last 207 games have been televised live, including 135 in a row. The Oregon State game in 2009 is the last game not to be aired live (it was on delayed television).

The Pac-12 Networks will air conference games and ancillary programming which feature football coach and player interviews during the season including special features.

GAME 1: UCLA 44, Hawai'i 10

Aug. 28 - Rose Bowl



PASADENA, Calif. - Zach Charbonnet reached the end zone three times in his Bruin debut and Brittain Brown added another rushing touchdown, as the Bruins ran for 245 yards in a 44-10 season-opening victory over Hawai'i on Saturday at the Rose Bowl.

The 34-point margin of victory was the highest in a season opener for UCLA since Aug. 31, 2013 against Nevada.

Charbonnet finished the game with 106 yards on just six carries, with Brown running for 78 yards on 13 rushes. Dorian Thompson-Robinson tied Troy Aikman for seventh on UCLA's all-time touchdown passes list with 41, going 10-for-20 for 130 yards, adding 19 yards rushing.

The Bruins scored on each of their first five possessions, three on short fields thanks to a few Hawai'i miscues. After a 27-yard field goal by Nicholas Barr-Mira opened the scoring, UCLA posted a three-and-out on defense and then compiled a nine-play, 87-yard drive, punctuated by a 21-yard Charbonnet touchdown to put the Bruins up 10-0.

On the second play of the Rainbow Warriors' next possession, Chevan Cordeiro was intercepted by Datona Jackson, giving the Bruins a goal-to-go situation. Brown punched it in from the 1-yard line on fourth down to give UCLA a 17-0 lead with six minutes left in the first quarter.

Hawai'i got on the board in its next turn with the ball on a field goal, but UCLA stormed right back with a 61-second, four-play drive encompassing 75 yards, as Charbonnet scampered for a 47-yard touchdown run to make it 24-3 with just under a minute remaining in the first quarter. The 24 points for the Bruins over the first 15 minutes marked the most in an opening quarter since Sept. 10, 1988 against Nebraska (28).

The Rainbow Warriors turned the ball over on downs near midfield to end their next possession, and the Bruins turned it into even more points, with Charbonnet going for the trifecta on a 21-yard score to put the home team up 31-3, which would also be the score at halftime. The 28-point margin at intermission was the largest lead for the Bruins after two quarters since their last meeting with Hawai'i in 2017.

Out of the halftime break, the Bruins took only five plays to make it 37-3, as Thompson-Robinson completed four passes, including a 44-yard touchdown to Kazmeir Allen. The extra point was missed.

UCLA then added a special teams score, as Ale Kaho blocked a punt in the end zone, which was recovered by David Priebe to make it 44-3. Hawai'i reached double figures late in the third quarter on a 1-yard passing touchdown, with neither team cracking the scoreboard in the fourth.

The Bruins are back in action next Saturday at the Rose Bowl against LSU. Start time is 5:30 p.m. and the game will air on FOX and AM 1150 Radio.
