NEXT UP

- LSU (0-1) plays its home opener on Saturday, Sept. 11 when the Tigers host McNeese (0-1) at 7 p.m. in Tiger Stadium.
- The game will be streamed on SEC+/ESPN+.
- LSU is coming off a 38-27 setback to UCLA last week, while the Cowboys dropped a 42-36 decision to West Florida.
- It will mark the third scheduled game between LSU and McNeese. LSU won the first meeting between the teams 32-10 in 2010. The 2015 game was delayed for over two hours and then eventually ruled a no contest after only five minutes of game action due to weather.
- Saturday's game will feature LSU head coach Ed Orgeron facing his son Cody, the starting quarterback for the Cowboys. The game will include four Orgeron's – the other two are Parker Orgeron and Tyler – are on the LSU coaching staff.
- McNeese head coach Frank Wilson is a former assistant coach for the Tigers.
- Orgeron is 45-15 in his 5-plus years as head coach of the Tigers.
- Of Orgeron's 45 wins with the Tigers, 33 have come by double-figures, 19 have come against teams ranked in the Top 25 with 13 of those coming against Top 10 opponents. Orgeron is 13-4 against Top 10 teams at LSU.
- LSU has won 32 straight games against in-state opponents with its most recent contest against a Louisiana school coming in 2019 when the Tigers beat Northwestern State, 65-14, in Tiger Stadium.
- LSU is 137-25-8 all-time against teams from the state of Louisiana.
- Sophomore QB Max Johnson – a left-hander – will make his fourth start at the position on Saturday. Johnson is 2-1 as LSU's starting QB, leading the Tigers to wins over No. 6 Florida and Ole Miss in the final two games of the 2020 season. He's the son of Super Bowl champion QB Brad Johnson (Tampa Bay).
- Johnson has thrown 3 TD passes in each of his 3 starts (3 at Florida, 3 vs. Ole Miss, 3 at UCLA).
- In seven career games, Johnson has completed 114-of-196 passes for 1,399 yards, 11 TDs and only 2

- interceptions. He will be backed up by true freshman Garrett Nussmeier, also the son of a former NFL QB (Doug Nussmeier – current QB coach for Dallas Cowboys).
- Sophomore WR Kayshon Boutte caught 9 passes for 148 yard and 3 TDs against UCLA. Dating back to last year, Boutte has 36 receptions for 675 yards and 7 TDs over his past four games.
- RB Ty Davis-Price has 771 career rushing yards with 9 TDs.
- LSU is 26-1 overall under Orgeron when having a 100-yard rusher.
- Sophomore Kayshon Boutte, who set the SEC record with 308 yards on 14 catches in the season-finale against Ole Miss, is LSU's top returning receiver. He caught 45 passes for 735 yards and 5 TDs a year ago.
- Junior CB Derek Stingley Jr. (6 interceptions) and sophomore CB Eli Ricks (5 interceptions) have combined for 11 interceptions and they are considered the nation's top duo at the position. Stingley is a two-time first team All-America, while Ricks earned third team All-America honors as a true freshman in 2020.
- LSU's defense accounted for 4 sacks and 9.0 tackles for loss against UCLA.
- Senior LB Damone Clark, LSU's top returning tackler for a year ago, opened the season with a game-high 14 tackles against UCLA.
- Senior DE Ali Gaye ranked No. 6 in the SEC in tackles for loss with 9.5 last year in what was his first season with the Tigers. He opened the year with 4 tackles and a sack for a 12-yard loss.
- PK Cade York, a second team All-America in 2020, is 41-of-50 on field goals in his career, which includes a school-record 10 from at least 50 yards out. York kicked an LSU record 57-yard field goal with 23 seconds to beat Florida in week 9 last year.
- Return specialist Trey Palmer is one of only eight players in school history to return both a punt and kickoff for a TD. Palmer returned a punt 54 yards for a TD against Northwestern State in 2019 and last year, he returned a kickoff 93 yards for a score against South Carolina.

When it comes to building a championship football program, there's none better than LSU Head Coach Ed Orgeron. A driven leader with a vision on how to achieve success, Orgeron needed only three seasons to fulfill a pledge he made at his introductory press conference on Nov. 26, 2016, when he vowed to "build a championship program at LSU."

Orgeron did just that in 2019, earning numerous National Coach of the Year honors on his way to leading LSU to the most dominant season in college football history with a 15-0 record and the CFP National Championship. But Orgeron's definition of a championship program goes much farther than winning championships on the football field. It's also about developing young men, both on and off the field; it's about fielding a team of high-character players that are determined to compete at the highest level on the field, while pursuing an education off the field; it's about players focused on the success of the team, not individual awards; it's about players doing the right thing, all of the time. It's known as the LSU Standard of Performance, not just on Saturday nights during the fall, but year-round.

And with that mentality, which starts at the top with Orgeron — a coach who never takes credit for his team's success, but instead praises his staff and his players — LSU stormed its way to the 2019 national title, winning 12 of 15 games by double-figures and beating seven Top-10 opponents along the way. LSU had five wins over teams that finished the 2019 season ranked in the Top 10.

In 2020, Orgeron and the Tigers found a way to still have success despite losing their starting quarterback just three games into the season. Behind the play of true freshman quarterback Max Johnson, LSU capped 2020 on a high note, beating No. 6 Florida in Gainesville and wrapping up the year with a win over Ole Miss in Tiger Stadium to finish with a 5-5 overall mark. Of the 48 players who saw action in the win over Florida, 26 were either freshmen or sophomores with three true freshmen accounting for three of LSU's four touchdowns in the victory. Since taking over the Tigers four games into the 2016 season, Orgeron has guided LSU to a 45-14 mark. He's also led the Tigers to five postseason victories — one in the SEC Championship Game, two bowl games and two in the College Football Playoff.

Of LSU's 45 wins under Orgeron, 33 have come by double-figures and 13 have been over Top-10 teams. The 13 Top-10 wins rank as the second-most for any coach in LSU history, trailing only Les Miles who won 16 games over Top 10 opponents in 12 years. LSU has a 29-12 record under Orgeron against SEC teams, which includes a 37-10 win over fourth-ranked Georgia in the 2019 SEC Championship Game.

Under Orgeron, the Tiger program has produced 12 first-team All-Americans, four national award winners including the 2019 Heisman Trophy winner in quarterback Joe Burrow, and 39 NFL Draft picks including 10 in the first round. In the 2020 NFL Draft, LSU set an SEC record with five first-round picks and tied the all-time mark with 14 players selected during the seven-round event. In 2020, quarterback Burrow went No. 1 overall and LSU became the first school in the history of the NFL Draft to have a quarterback, running back (Clyde Edwards-Helaire) and wide receiver (Justin Jefferson) picked in the first round.

In the 2021 NFL Draft, the Tigers saw another seven players selected, including the No. 5 overall pick in wide receiver Ja'Marr Chase. LSU's two-year draft total from 2020-21 stands at 21, the most for any school in college football over that span in the history of the NFL Draft.

When it comes to recruiting, there are none better than Orgeron and his staff who continue to assemble the best roster in college football with a focus that includes keeping the best players in Louisiana at home, while also attracting the top talent from coast to coast.

Now entering its fifth full season under Orgeron, LSU has used the "One Team, One Heartbeat" philosophy along with the ability to "block out the noise" to become the premier program in college football.

2020

In a COVID-altered season, Orgeron led LSU to a 5-5 mark despite having to start a true freshman at quarterback for the final six games of the year due to the season-ending injury to Myles Brennan in week 3. In addition, the Tigers had five returning starters opt out of the season due to COVID-19 concerns leaving LSU with only six returning starters from its national championship team. Still, LSU, with a young and inexperienced roster, competed each week, beating South Carolina at home and Arkansas on the road.

Counting on many freshmen and sophomores, LSU won three of its final five games, including wins over No. 6 Florida in Gainesville and Ole Miss in Tiger Stadium to cap season on a high note. In the win over Florida, the Tigers started nine true freshmen and sophomores, including quarterback Max Johnson who earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week in what was his first career start. Johnson threw for 239 yards and three TDs and true freshman accounted for three of LSU's four touchdowns in the 37-34 victory. A week later against Ole Miss, true freshman Kayshon Boutte set the SEC record for single-game receiving yards with 308 on 14 receptions and Johnson passed for 435 yards and three scores in the 53-48 win. The back-to-back wins to close out the 2020 season set the stage for an outstanding spring for the Tigers as LSU returns 29 players in 2021 who have at least one career start to their credit.

LSU's 2020 season wrapped up with the Tigers having seven players selected in the NFL Draft led by wide receiver Ja'Marr Chase, who was selected No. 5 overall.

THE COACH O WAY

A native of LaRose, Louisiana, Orgeron developed a passion for the Tigers at an early age, becoming a fan of some of the all-time LSU greats in the 1970s. Players like Bert Jones, Ronnie Estay, Tommy Casanova, Charles Alexander and of course, coach Charles McClendon, ignited a purple and gold fire under Orgeron that still burns today.

Orgeron has reunited the current roster with former players, making them an integral part of the program and he's leveraged his passion and love for LSU into a determination and drive that sees him spend nearly every waking moment focused on LSU football and his vision for the program.

With the "One Team, One Heartbeat" motto, the Tigers seemingly became a different team overnight when Orgeron was elevated to interim head coach on Sept. 25, 2016 and the results that LSU sought soon followed. As the head coach of the Tigers, Orgeron said he was going to "flip the script" and he assigned a theme for the daily practices. The purpose of the descriptive practice themes for each day during the week is one of the ways that Orgeron and his staff hold the players accountable and focused both prior to and during the workout. The daily practice nicknames are as follows: Tell the Truth Monday, Competition Tuesday, Turnover/No Turnover Wednesday, No Repeat Thursday, and Focus Friday.

Orgeron has also opened the doors for former LSU players to come back and be active in the program. Having former players actively involved is a way for the current Tigers to get a better understanding of who helped build the foundation for the program, while also letting them see first-hand what it means to be an LSU Tiger and the responsibility that goes along with it. Orgeron routinely has former Tigers speak to the team, attend



practices and be involved with the organization. He also invited former Tigers to come back on gamedays and be part of the "Tiger Walk" as they lead the current team down "Victory Hill" on their way to the stadium.

ORGERON COACHING HISTORY

Orgeron, who has also served as head coach at Ole Miss and Southern Cal, is 45-14 at LSU. His career mark as a collegiate head coach is 61-41, however he's 51-16 over his last 67 games. Orgeron went 6-2 as Southern Cal's interim head coach in 2013, taking over a USC team that stumbled to a 3-2 mark over the first five games of the year. Orgeron rallied the Trojans as USC closed out the regular season with wins in six of its final eight games. Orgeron originally joined the Tiger staff in 2015 as defensive line coach, before adding the title of recruiting coordinator in the spring of 2016.

Prior to joining the LSU staff, Orgeron's last coaching stop came at Southern Cal where he served as recruiting coordinator and defensive line coach for the Trojans for four years (2010-13). Orgeron was elevated to interim head coach at USC for the final eight games of the 2013 season.

Orgeron served two stints at Southern Cal, the first as the Trojans' defensive line coach from 1998 to 2004. Orgeron coached under Paul Hackett at USC for three years from 1998 to 2000 and was one of just a handful of coaches retained by Pete Carroll when he took over as the Trojans' head coach in 2001.

Orgeron left USC in 2005 to become the head coach at Ole Miss, where he went 10-25 in three years with Rebels from 2005-07.

Orgeron spent the 2008 season coaching the defensive line for the New Orleans Saints and then joined Tennessee as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in 2009. He returned to Southern Cal following the 2009 season.

Orgeron made a name for himself as a top defensive line coach at the University of Miami from 1988-92, where he coached eight All-Americans, including NFL first-rounders Cortez Kennedy, Russell Maryland and Warren Sapp. In 1988, he was a graduate assistant at Miami, working with the defensive line.

Orgeron also was a graduate assistant at Northwestern (La.) State, his alma mater, in 1984 and McNeese State in 1985, working with the defensive line at both schools, then was an assistant strength coach at Arkansas for two years (1986-87).

ORGERON'S LOUISIANA ROOTS

Born July 27, 1961, he has three sons, Tyler, and twins Parker and Cody and a grandson Emmett. Parker and Tyler are both member of the LSU football coaching staff, while Cody is the starting quarterback at McNeese. Cody, who still have one year of eligibility remaining, earned his undergraduate degree from McNeese last May. Parker was a two-year starter at wide receiver for McNeese and is currently pursuing his degree at LSU.

Away from the field, Coach O has taken up the sport of boxing and trains three times a week at a local gym. He also teamed with Louisiana Governor John Bel Edwards to educate and inform the citizens of Louisiana during the Covid-19 pandemic. Coach O appeared on commercials and other mediums to support the wearing of masks during the pandemic.

He's also been heavily involved in many community service efforts in the Baton Rouge area, including "Basket of Hope", which has the mission of giving hope to children diagnosed with cancer or other serious illness through the delivery of a Basket of Hope filled with toys, games, craft items, stuffed animals, gift cards, and other items. Coach O makes several trips to local hospitals each year to hand deliver these baskets and to spend time with the children and their families.

NOTEBOOK

LSU's McNeese Ties

LSU head coach Ed Orgeron served on the McNeese staff in 1985 ... LSU offensive analyst Steve Ensminger was offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Cowboys in 1985 ... LSU staff member Parker Orgeron was a starting wide receiver for McNeese for three years before retiring from football due to injuries ... McNeese starting quarterback Cody Orgeron is the son of LSU coach Ed Orgeron and he's the twin brother of Parker ... McNeese head coach Frank Wilson served six years as LSU's running backs coach and recruiting coordinator ... Assistant coaches Chris Truax (offensive line) and Blaine Gautier (wide receivers) also have LSU connections with Truax playing for the Tigers from 1988-91 and Gautier serving as an offensive analyst from 2015-19 ... McNeese SID Matthew Bonnette is the younger brother of LSU SID Michael Bonnette ... They are the son of Louis Bonnette, who served as the McNeese SID for 46 years.

LSU vs. Louisiana Schools

The Tigers bring a 137-25-8 mark all-time against teams from Louisiana into the McNeese game. The Tigers have won 32 straight games against in-state opponents. LSU's last loss to an in-state foe came in 1982 when Tulane posted a 31-28 win over LSU in Tiger Stadium. LSU's record against in-state schools include: 69-22-7 vs. Tulane; 22-0 vs. Louisiana-Lafayette; 19-1 vs. Louisiana Tech; 12-0 vs. Northwestern State; 4-1 vs. Loyola (New Orleans); 3-0 vs. Louisiana-Monroe; 3-1-1 vs. Centenary; 2-0 vs. Louisiana College and Southeastern; and 1-0 vs. McNeese State.

LSU vs. the Southland Conference

LSU is 16-0 all-time against current members of the Southland Conference. The last game against a team from the Southland came in 2019, a 65-14 win over Northwestern State. LSU is 12-0 vs. Northwestern State, 2-0 against Southeastern Louisiana and 1-0 against McNeese State and Sam Houston State.

LSU vs. The Football Championship Subdivision (FCS)

Saturday's game against McNeese marks the 18th time that LSU will face a team from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). LSU is 28-0 all-time against FCS teams. LSU has an undefeated record against Chattanooga, Citadel, Fordham, Furman, Howard, McNeese, Mercer, Northwestern State, Sam Houston State, Southeastern Louisiana, Towson, Western Carolina and Western Illinois.

LSU In Home Openers

Overall, LSU is 100-22-4 in home openers, which includes a 72-20-4 mark in Tiger Stadium. LSU has won 23 of its last 25 home openers dating back to a 35-34 win over Houston in 1996. In that span, the only home opener losses came in a 30-27 OT loss to Tennessee in 2005 and 44-34 loss to Mississippi State in 2019. LSU hasn't lost a "Saturday Night" home opener since dropping a 18-13 decision to Texas A&M in 1994.

LSU is 15-1 Following A Loss Under Orgeron

LSU goes into the home opener against McNeese with a 15-1 record under Ed Orgeron in games following a loss. LSU has only lost back-to-back games under Orgeron once. In 2020, LSU went 4-1 after a loss, beating Vanderbilt, South Carolina, Arkansas and No. 6 Florida.

LSU's Non-Conference Tiger Stadium Winning Streak

LSU has won six straight and 55 of its last 56 games against non-conference opponents in Tiger Stadium. LSU's last loss against a non-conference foe came in 2017 when Troy beat the Tigers, 24-21 on Sept. 30. Prior to that loss, LSU had won 49 straight non-conference games in Tiger Stadium, which ranks as the third-longest streak in college football history, trailing only Harvard (55 from 1890-1895) and Carlisle (54 from 1901-1915). Before the Troy loss in 2017, LSU's last defeat in Tiger Stadium to a non-conference team came in 2000 against UAB.

Boutte Picks Up Where He Left Off in 2020

LSU sophomore WR Kayshon Boutte picked up where he left off in 2020 as he led the Tigers with 9 receptions for 148 yards and 3 TDs against UCLA. It marked Boutte's fourth straight 100-yard game. Over his last four games, Boutte has caught 36 passes for 675 yards and 7 TDs. For his career, Boutte has 54 receptions for 883 yards and 8 TDs. Of his 54 receptions, 37 have resulted in either a touchdown or a first down. Going back to last year's Alabama game, Boutte has caught 36 passes and 27 of those resulted in either a first down or a touchdown. Boutte is the first LSU player to have back to back games with three receiving touchdowns.

Atkins is LSU's Special Teams Swiss Army Knife

Senior Avery Atkins serves as LSU's Swiss Army Knife on special teams as the LSU graduate sees action at three positions for the unit. Atkins handles LSU's kickoffs duties, serves as the holder on all placekicks and for the first time in his career with the Tigers, punted against UCLA. Against the Bruins, Atkins had five kickoffs with three touchbacks and he punted six times for an average of 40 yards. He pinned UCLA inside its 20 on four of six punts.

Johnson Adds Another 3-TD Game To His List

Sophomore QB Max Johnson added another 3-touchdown game to his list last week against UCLA. All three of Johnson's TD passes went to sophomore Kayshon Boutte. Johnson has tossed 11 career TD passes with 7 going to Boutte. In his three career starts, Johnson has combined to complete 114-of-196 passes for 1,399 yards, 11 TDs and only 2 interceptions.

LSU vs. Non-Conference Foes Under Orgeron

LSU is 16-3vs. non-conference opponents under Coach Orgeron. The Tigers have won 11 of their last 12 non-SEC games under Orgeron with the only loss during that span coming to UCLA. With the Tigers playing an SEC-only schedule in 2020, it marked the first time in the modern era LSU did not play a non-conference team.

NOTEBOOK

Ten True Freshmen See Action In Season-Opener

Ten true freshmen saw their first action as LSU Tigers in the season-opener against UCLA. Among the highlights for LSU's true freshmen against the Bruins include: WR Jack Bech (1 rec, 17 yards), WR Brian Thomas Jr. (1 rec., 18 yards) and LB Greg Penn III (two tackles).

LSU Is 81-10 vs. Non-Conference Teams Dating Back to 2001

Dating back to the 2001 season when LSU captured its first outright SEC title since 1986, the Tigers have done quite well against non-conference opponents, going 81-10 against non-SEC foes during that span. Of the 81 wins, 21 have come against top-25 teams. Of the 10 losses, only four have come during the regular season (2002 at Virginia Tech, 2016 vs. Wisconsin at Lambeau Field, 2017 vs. Troy, and 2021 at UCLA). The other six losses came in bowl games (2003 Cotton Bowl vs. Texas; 2005 Capital One Bowl vs. Iowa; 2009 Capital One Bowl vs. Penn State; 2012 Chick-Fil-A Bowl vs. Clemson; 2014 Music City Bowl vs. Notre Dame, 2018 Citrus Bowl vs. Notre Dame).

Second-Generation Signal Callers

Two of LSU's quarterbacks are the sons of former NFL QBs. Sophomore Max Johnson is the son of Brad Johnson, who led the Tampa Bay Buccaneers to the Super Bowl XXXVII title over the Oakland Raiders in January 2003. Brad Johnson played in the NFL from 1992-2008 with the Buccaneers, the Minnesota Vikings, the Washington Football Team and the Dallas Cowboys. LSU true freshman QB Garrett Nussmeier is the son of Doug Nussmeier, who played quarterback in the NFL from 1994-98 with the New Orleans Saints, Denver Broncos and Indianapolis Colts. Doug Nussmeier currently works as the quarterbacks coach for the Dallas Cowboys. LSU and Bowling Green are the only FBS teams with two quarterbacks on its roster who are the sons of former NFL starting quarterbacks. Bowling Green's roster features Matt McDonald (son of Paul McDonald) and Jayden George (son of Jeff George).

Max Johnson as LSU's Starting Quarterback

Sophomore QB Max Johnson is 2-1 as LSU's starting quarterback and has connected on 114-of-196 passes for 1,399 yards, 11 touchdowns and two interceptions. He started his first game in week nine of the 2020 season and led the Tigers to an improbable 37-34 win over No. 6 Florida in Gainesville. He then threw for 435 passing yards against Ole Miss to move to 2-0 as the starter. Johnson made history as the first LSU quarterback to throw three TD passes against Florida in the swamp and his 435 passing yards in the win over Ole Miss are the most-ever by a freshman quarterback.

Davis-Price, Emery Jr. Return Majority of Rushing Yards

Juniors Tyrion Davis-Price and John Emery Jr. bring back nearly 70 percent of LSU's rushing yards from a year ago. Davis-Price led the rushing attack with 446 yards and Emery Jr. was second with 378 yards. The duo combined for 825 of 1,217 yards and six of the team's nine rushing TDs in 2020.

Stingley to Wear No. 7

LSU's two-time All-America cornerback Derek Stingley Jr. will wear No. 7 for the Tigers in 2021. A relatively new tradition at LSU, the No. 7 jersey has become associated with a player who is a dynamic play maker while also displaying all of the qualities necessary to build championship teams around. Some past wearers of the No. 7 jersey for LSU include cornerback Patrick Peterson, defensive back Tyrann Mathieu, running back Leonard Fournette and wide receiver DJ Chark.

In two years with the Tigers, Stingley has made his mark as the nation's top cover cornerback. A player with elite ball skills and coverage ability, Stingley has appeared in 22 games for the Tigers, registering 65 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and six interceptions. He's also recorded 26 pass breakups, recovered two fumbles and forced another.

Tigers Present No. 18 Jerseys for 2021

Senior kickoff specialist Avery Atkins joined senior linebacker Damone Clark in wearing the coveted No. 18 in 2021. Atkins was presented with the number by Ed Orgeron on Wednesday, Sept. 1 in Houston during the team meeting. Atkins, who owns every LSU kickoff record, joined the Tigers in 2018 as a walk on and was eventually awarded a scholarship. Clark, a native of Baton Rouge and a product of Southern Lab, has played in 38 games with eight starts during his career.

Atkins and Clark are a part of an elite group of No. 18s at LSU, a tradition that was born in 2003 when quarterback Matt Mauck led the Tigers to their first national title in football since 1958. Mauck's No. 18 became synonymous with success – both on and off the field – as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player.

Three Tigers Part of 2016 Signing Class

Andre Anthony, Cam Lewis and Glen Logan will take the field in 2021 as LSU graduates and sixth-year seniors. The trio were a part of the signing class that included NFL draft picks Lloyd Cushenberry III, Kristian Fulton, Rashard Lawrence, Stephen Sullivan, Devin White and Greedy Williams. All on the defensive side, the group has played alongside other NFL draft picks like Jamal Adams, Kendall Beckwith, K'Lavon Chaisson, Jabril Cox, Grant Delpit, Davon Godchaux, Donte Jackson, Arden Key, Jacob Phillips, Patrick Queen and Tre'Davious White. In five years the group has been a part of 47 wins, four bowl wins, and the 2019 SEC Championship and National Championship team.

Six New Coaches Make Up Staff

LSU heads into 2021 with more than half of the staff being new to the program. Daronte Jones and Jake Peetz were named the defensive and offensive coordinators by head coach Ed Orgeron. Blake Baker (linebackers) and Andre Carter (defensive line) were added to the defensive side of the ball. DJ Mangas was appointed as the program's passing game coordinator. Mangas previously served as an analyst alongside Joe Brady on the historic 2019 team. Brad Davis was also appointed as the offensive line coach in June.

Austin Deculus has a chance to set LSU record for most games played in a career

Deculus, who hails from Mamou, La., is a 2020 LSU graduate in sport administration and a member of the 2020 SEC Academic Honor Roll who is pursuing a master's degree in liberal arts. He enters his fourth season as a starting offensive tackle for the Tigers, and he has appeared in 50 career games (35 starts). A powerful run blocker who also excels in pass protection, Deculus is seeking to become in 2021 the first player in LSU football history to appear in 60 career games.

Offensive Line Owns Combined 89 Career Starts

LSU's offensive linemen Austin Deculus, Chasen Hines, Ed Ingram, Liam Shanahan, Charles Turner, Cam Wire and Anthony Bradford own a combined 89 career starts on the offensive line. Deculus leads the group with 35 career starts and 50 games played. Ingram is second on the list with 32 games played and 24 starts. Shanahan has 11 starts to his credit, followed by Hines (10), Turner (1) and Bradford (1). Bradford started for the first time of his career last week at UCLA.

LSU Adds Three Transfers During Offseason

The Tigers added a trio of transfers during the offseason as linebacker Mike Jones Jr. (Clemson), safety Major Burns (Georgia) and defensive back Pig Cage (Nicholls) all joined the team. The trio of transfers joins starting center Liam Shanahan (Harvard) and cornerback Darren Evans (Nicholls) as LSU's five active transfers. All five have played with Shanahan owning 11 career starts and Burns starting at safety in the opener.

Return Specialist Trey Palmer In Unique Company

Junior wide receiver Trey Palmer, who also doubles as a return specialist for the Tigers, added his name to an elite list when he returned a kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown last year against South Carolina. Palmer is one of only eight players in LSU history to return both a punt and kickoff for a touchdown in their career. As a freshman, Palmer returned a punt 54 yards for a TD against Northwestern State. Palmer joins a list that includes: 1959 Heisman Trophy winner Billy Cannon, Kevin Faulk, Eddie Kennison, Trindon Holliday, Kenny Konz, Sammy Grezaffi, and Pinky Rohm. A year ago, Palmer became the first LSU player since Eric Martin in 1981 vs. Kentucky to return a kickoff for a touchdown in Tiger Stadium.

Cade York in the Record Books

Junior Cade York is one of the top kickers in the nation. A second-team all-America by the Associated Press and Football Writers Association of America a year ago, York is 2-for-2 on field goals in 2021 and 41-for-50 on his career. His career field goals (41) rank fifth in school history and he's the school-record holder for the most 50-yard field goals in a career (10). He ranks No. 4 in LSU history in total points scored by kicking with 251. York is 128-of-132 on point-after touchdowns, which ranks No. 4 in LSU history. He has now made 82-straight PATs, which also ranks fourth in school history.

LSU Is 84-0 When Rushing For 100 Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

In the 208 games since 2005, LSU's success is easy to predict. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win, as the Tigers are 153-22 when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100 yards and the Tigers are 86-6. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100 yards, the Tigers are 84-0.

Day Game or Night Game Makes No Difference for LSU

LSU's tradition of night games in Tiger Stadium is like none other in college football. But, LSU's recent success in day games in Tiger Stadium has made playing afternoon games in Death Valley more appealing. LSU has won 19 of its last 21 day games in Tiger Stadium, a stretch that goes back to a 16-14 victory over Tennessee on Oct. 2, 2010. Of LSU's 19 wins during this current stretch, 10 have come against Top 25 teams and 18 were over SEC opponents. Since 2000, LSU is 122-21 overall at home, which includes a 93-14 mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 30-8 record during the day. From 1960-99, LSU posted a 12-19-3 mark in day games in Tiger Stadium.

Brennan Out with Left Arm Injury

Prior to the start of fall camp on Aug. 2 head coach Ed Orgeron announced that LSU quarterback Myles Brennan suffered a left arm injury that required surgery. Brennan, who started LSU's first three games last year before being injured, could return at some point in 2021. For his career, Brennan has completed 121-of-201 passes for 1,712 yards, 13 touchdowns and six interceptions.

Seven Named to Preseason All-SEC Teams

CB Derek Stingley Jr., PK Cade York, WR Kayshon Boutte, DL Ali Gaye, OL Ed Ingram, CB Eli Ricks and OL Austin Deculus were named to the media and coaches All-SEC preseason teams over the summer. Stingley Jr. appeared on every defensive and top player award watch lists.

Faulk, James Named to College Football HOF Ballot

Kevin Faulk and Bradie James, two of the most decorated players in LSU football history, are among 78 players and seven coaches from the Football Bowl Subdivision included on the 2022 College Football Hall of Fame ballot. One of the all-time LSU greats and a member of the Louisiana Sports, LSU Athletic and New England Patriots Halls of Fame, Faulk helped lead the Tigers to three bowl appearances from 1995-97. He earned first team Associated Press All-America honors as an all-purpose back in 1996. James, who graduated from LSU in 2003 with a degree in sociology, was a first team All-America selection as a senior in 2002. A two-time All-SEC linebacker in 2001 and 2002, James holds LSU's single-season record for tackles in a season with 154.

Faulk and James are looking to join an elite list of LSU Tigers in the College Football Hall of Fame. Former Tigers in the College Football Hall of Fame include: Gus Tinsley, Ken Kavanaugh Sr., Abe Mickal, Doc Fenton, Tommy Casanova, Billy Cannon, Jerry Stovall, Charles Alexander, Bert Jones, and Glenn Bernsey. Faneca Enshrined into Pro Football HOF

Former LSU All-America offensive lineman Alan Faneca was formally enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in August. Faneca was one of eight inductees in the Class of 2021, which also included Louisiana native Peyton Manning, Tom Flores, Calvin Johnson, John Lynch, Bill Nunn, Drew Pearson and Charles Woodson. Faneca became the sixth former LSU player elected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame joining Kevin Mawae, Johnny Robinson, Jimmy Taylor, Y.A. Tittle, and Steve Van Buren.

Faneca, who started as an offensive lineman for the Tigers in the 1990s, played 13 years in the NFL, 10 with the Steelers (1998-2007), two with the New York jets (2008-09) and one with the Arizona Cardinals (2010). At LSU, Faneca was a three-year starter for the Tigers from 1995-97, earning first team All-SEC honors twice as well as winning the Jacobs Blocking Trophy in 1997, which given to the top lineman in the SEC. Faneca was one of three finalists for the Outland Trophy in 1997 and was a consensus All-America that year.

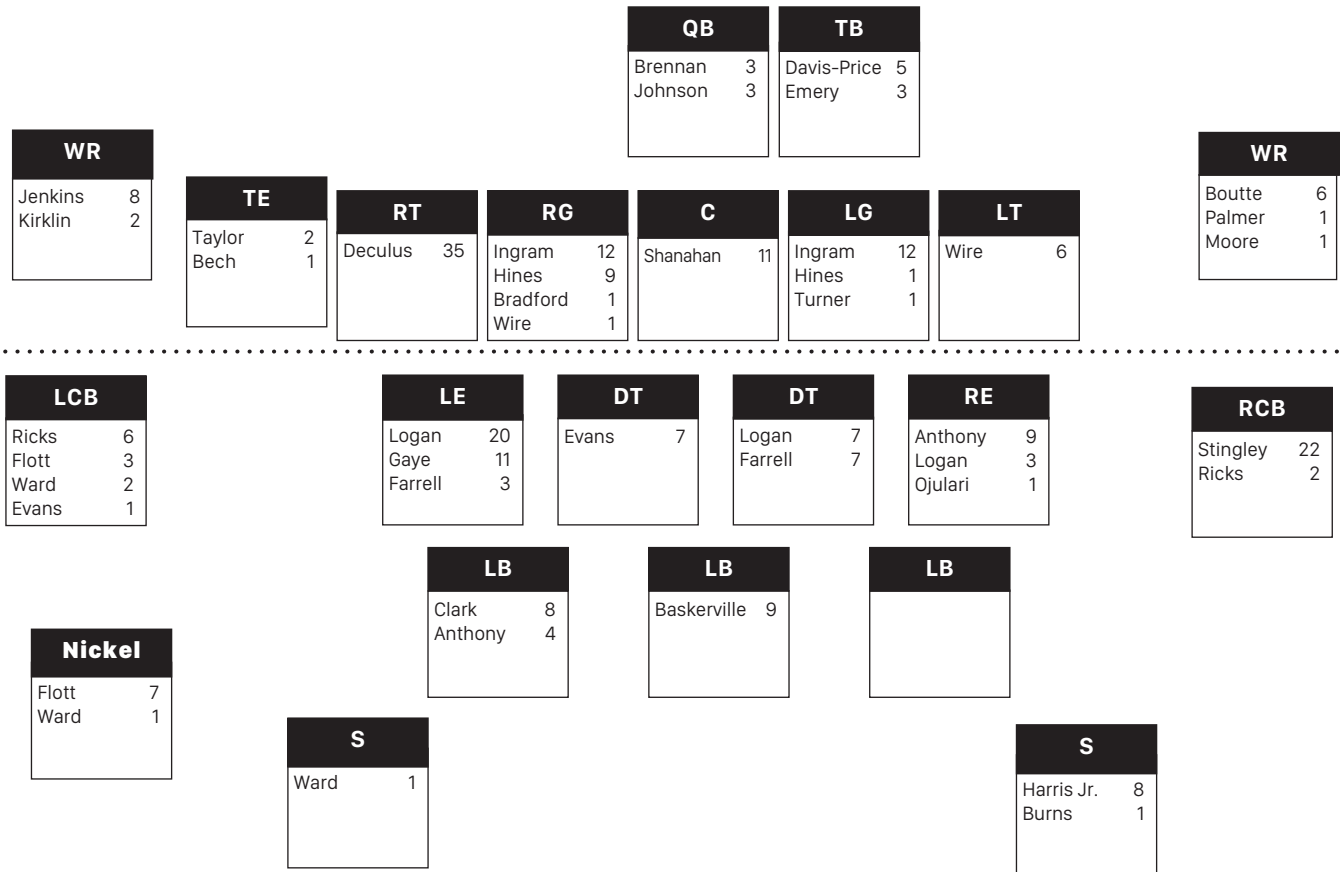

UCLA Pulls Away from LSU, 38-27

Quarterback **Max Johnson** connected with wide receiver **Kayshon Boutte** for three touchdowns, but it wasn't enough for No. 16-ranked LSU on Saturday at the Rose Bowl. UCLA won the first meeting between the teams, 38-27. UCLA senior quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson threw for three touchdowns, as the Bruins pulled away from LSU with a pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns. LSU (0-1) pulled within four points, 24-20, following a **Cade York** field goal with 1:07 left in the third quarter. UCLA (2-0) then used a pair of eight-play drives that spanned 73 and 81 yards in the fourth quarter to earn a victory in the first meeting between the programs on the gridiron. Johnson, who started for the third time in his LSU career, completed 26-of-46 passes for 330 yards and three touchdowns. He was intercepted once and sacked twice. LSU struggled to find momentum in its running game, finishing with 48 net yards on 25 carries. Bruins' quarterback Thompson-Robinson was 9-of-16 passing for 260 yards with touchdown passes of 75, 14 and 45 yards. Tight end Greg Dulcich caught three passes for 117 yards including a 75-yard touchdown pass. UCLA's Zach Charbonnet had 117 rushing yards on 11 carries with a touchdown.
