# LSU FOOTBALL POSTGAME NOTES

LSU (4-5, 2-4 SEC) at #2 Alabama (8-1, 5-1 SEC)

November 6, 2021 -- Bryant-Denny Stadium (Tuscaloosa, Al.)

## **TEAM NOTES**

- 1. The LSU Captains were DL **Neil Farrell**, OL **Ed Ingram**, DL **Glen Logan**, OL **Spencer Payne**, and OL **Austin Deculus**.
- 2. LSU won the coin toss and deferred to the second half. The Tigers kicked off and defended the South end zone.
- 3. LSU is now 4-5 overall and 2-4 in SEC play.
- 4. Announced attendance for the game was 100,077.
- 5. In his 5+ years as LSU's head coach, Ed Orgeron is 49-19.
  - a. He is 1-8 in his career against Alabama with the lone victory coming in the Tigers' 2019 championship season.
- 6. LSU held Alabama scoreless through the first quarter for the 5th time in the past 10 meetings.
  - a. This is the first time since 2016 that Alabama has been held scoreless in the first quarter.
- 7. DE **Soni Fonua** and LB **Mike Jones Jr.** started for the first time in tonight's game.

# **OFFENSE**

- 1. QB **Max Johnson** made his 11th career start for the Tigers and entered the game ranked No. 2 in the SEC in passing touchdowns with 20. Johnson finished the game 16-32 for 160 yards, two touchdowns, and one interception.
  - a. Johnson put the Tigers on the board first with a 8-yard pass to WR Brian Thomas, making this the 38th straight game where the Tigers have had at least one passing touchdown.
  - b. Johnson's second touchdown pass of the game was an 8-yard completion to WR **Jack Bech** in the third quarter to close the gap to 20-14.
- 2. RB **Ty Davis-Price** joined elite company in rushing for over 100 yards with 104 on 23 attempts with a long of 37.
  - a. He is only one of three 100-yard rushers at Bryant-Denny in LSU History. Kevin Faulk in 1997 and Clyde Edwards-Helaire in 2019 are the only other two to accomplish the feat.
- 3. True freshman WR **Jack Bech** led the team in receptions with five for 33 yards and a touchdown.
- 4. Junior WR **Jaray Jenkins** led the team in receiving yards with 54 on four receptions.
- 5. True freshman WR **Brian Thomas Jr.** received three passes for 28 yards and one touchdown.

#### **DEFENSE**

- 1. The Tigers defense played tough for sixty minutes, tallying 60 tackles, 4 sacks, 8 tackles for loss, 4 pass breakups and two forced fumbles.
- 2. The six yards rushing by Alabama was the fewest net rushing yards allowed by LSU against Alabama in the SEC era (since 1933).

- 3. LB **Damone Clark** led the team in tackles with eight tackles (two for a loss), two sacks, and a pass breakup.
  - a. Clark entered the game on a five-game streak of double-digit tackles and surpassed 100 tackles in the game.
- 4. CB **Dwight McGlothern** has stepped up in a big way for the Tigers, picking up seven tackles (six solo), two pass breakups, and a forced fumble.
- 5. DE **Cameron Lewis** also showed out with six tackles, one sack, one tackle for loss and a forced fumble.
- 6. DL **Neil Farrell** and LB **Mike Jones** each collected a sack for the Tigers, tallying six and five tackles respectively.
  - a. Farrell finished the game with 2.5 tackles for loss and Jones Jr. finished with 1.5.

## **SPECIAL TEAMS**

- 1. PK **Avery Atkins** faked a punt on 4th and 4 in the first quarter with a 26-yard pass to TE **Jack Mashburn** for a first down.
  - a. This was the first completion by an LSU punter since Brad Wing in 2012 against Alabama (on an unsuccessful fake FG).
  - b. This was the first fake punt for a first down since Kendell Beckwith faked a punt with a 5-yard run in the third quarter against Wisconsin on 8/30/14.
  - c. This was the most recent completion on a fake punt since Brady Dalfrey completed a 21-yard pass to Chad Jones in the Chick-fil-A Bowl against Georgia Tech in 2008.
- 2. With his first PAT, junior PK **Cade York** broke LSU's record for consecutive PAT's kicking with 110. The record was previously held by David Browndyke (1986-89).
  - a. York finished the game 2-2 on PATs. This extends him to 111 straight PATs made.
- 3. PK **Avery Atkins** punted five times for 201 yards with an average of 40.1 and long of 53 yards.
  - a. Atkins was 2-3 on kickoffs for touchbacks.
