SERIES RECORD VS. LOUISIANA TECH

• LSU leads the all-time series versus Louisiana Tech, 45-19, in a series that began in 1902 ... the Tigers defeated the Bulldogs twice last season in Baton Rouge by scores of 16-7 (Feb. 22) and 16-8 (May 11) ... LSU has won 15 of its last 16 meetings with Louisiana Tech; the Bulldogs' only win over LSU in the last 16 meetings was a 12-1 victory in 2019 in Baton Rouge ... prior to 2019, Louisiana Tech's last win over the Tigers came on April 16, 1987, a 5-4 victory in Ruston ... Wednesday night's game marks LSU's first visit to Ruston since March 25, 1997, when the Tigers posted a 13-1 victory over the Bulldogs..

ABOUT THE TIGERS

• Coach **Jay Johnson** is in his first season at the helm of the LSU program, and he's in his 10th season as a collegiate head coach, including one season (2005) at Point Loma Nazarene, two seasons (2014-15) at Nevada and six seasons (2016-21) at Arizona ... he directed Arizona to College World Series appearances in 2016 and in 2021, and the Wildcats finished as the national runners-up in 2016 to Coastal Carolina ... Johnson's 2021 Arizona club also won the Pac-12 conference title, and he was named the league's coach of the year.

• The 2022 Tigers returned nine position players with starting experience and 10 pitchers who recorded innings last season. LSU was predicted to finish fourth in the SEC West in the league coaches' poll.

• LSU opened the 2022 season with a three-game sweep of Maine in Alex Box Stadium, Skip Bertman Field ... the Tigers scored a combined 51 runs in the three games, marking LSU's largest run total in a season-opening series ... the previous LSU mark in an opening series was 45 runs scored by the 1996 Tigers in a sweep of Western Kentucky in the original Alex Box Stadium.

• LSU's 51 runs scored last weekend is also the highest in any three-game LSU stretch since 2001, when the Tigers scored 52 runs in wins over Duquesne (twice) and Nicholls ... LSU's 13-1 win on Friday night marked the Tigers' 21st straight victory in a season-opening game.

• LSU infielder **Cade Doughty** was named Southeastern Conference Player of the Week Monday after leading the Tigers to a season-opening three-game sweep of Maine over the weekend ... Doughty was also voted as one of the Collegiate Baseball newspaper National Players of the Week ... Doughty, a redshirt sophomore from Denham Springs, La., hit .571 (8-for-14) with three doubles, two homers, seven runs and 12 RBI in the three-game set versus the Black Bears ... his slugging percentage for the weekend was 1.214 and his on-base percentage was .563 ... the honor marked the second time Doughty has earned SEC Player of the Week recognition during his career. He was also named the league's top player on March 15, 2021, after leading LSU to a three-game sweep of UT San Antonio.

• Sophomore right-hander **Blake Money** was brilliant on Friday night in LSU's opening game of the 2022 season, as he defeated Maine with seven shutout innings ... Money limited the Black Bears to no runs on just two hits – a pair of singles – in seven innings with one walk and a career-high 10 strikeouts ... he fired 79 pitches in the outing, 58 for strikes ... Money allowed just one

Maine base runner to advance beyond first base over the course of seven innings ... he retired the first seven batters that he faced and later retired 10 consecutive Maine hitters.

- LSU batted .387 as a team in last weekend's three-game sweep of Maine ... the Tigers collected 11 doubles, three triples and seven homers in the series ... designated hitter **Brayden Jobert** was 6-for-9 (.667) in the series with two doubles, two homers and nine RBI ... centerfielder **Dylan Crews** was 6-for-11 with one double, two triples, four RBI and eight runs ... outfielder **Giovanni DiGiacomo** doubled, homered and collected six RBI, while outfielder **Jacob Berry** launched two homers and drove in five runs.

- Sophomore right-hander **Ty Floyd** earned his first career collegiate win on Sunday, limiting Maine to one run on two hits in five innings with a career-high eight strikeouts ... sophomore left-hander Javen Coleman picked up a relief victory on Saturday, allowing just one run on one hit in three innings with no walks and three strikeouts ... as a staff, LSU pitchers recorded 37 strikeouts in 27 innings and limited Maine to a .200 batting average.

- Eleven LSU players appeared in the 2022 D1 Baseball Preseason Position Rankings: **Dylan Crews** is rated No. 1 among outfielders, **Tre' Morgan** is the No. 1 first baseman, **Jacob Berry** is the No. 1 third baseman, and **Cade Doughty** is the No. 4 second baseman. Other Tigers in the position rankings are **Gavin Dugas** (No. 14 outfielder), **Jordan Thompson** (No. 23 shortstop), **Tyler McManus** (No. 29 catcher), **Eric Reyzelman** (No. 42 relief pitcher), **Paul Gervase** (No. 51 relief pitcher), **Javen Coleman** (No. 98 starting pitcher) and **Devin Fontenot** (No. 102 starting pitcher).

- LSU leads the nation with three players on the 2022 Golden Spikes Award Preseason Watch List released by USA Baseball on Feb. 15. The announcement of the 55-player watch list begins the process of identifying the top amateur baseball player in the country for the 2022 season. The LSU players on the Golden Spikes Award Watch list are sophomore outfielder **Dylan Crews**, sophomore first baseman **Tre' Morgan** and sophomore infielder **Jacob Berry**. LSU is the only school with three players on the list and is followed by Arizona State, Arkansas, California, Florida, Ole Miss, Texas and Vanderbilt, all of which have two representatives.

LSU RANKED IN THE TOP 10 OF FIVE 2022 PRESEASON POLLS

LSU appeared in the Top 10 of five 2022 preseason polls - the Tigers were ranked No. 3 by Collegiate Baseball, No. 4 by Perfect Game, No. 7 by USA Today, No. 8 by D1 Baseball and No. 10 by Baseball America.

LSU's 2022 roster includes nine position players that started in a significant number of the Tigers' 63 games last season, including outfielder **Dylan Crews**, the 2021 Perfect Game National Freshman of the Year; Freshman All-America first baseman **Tre' Morgan**; outfielder **Gavin Dugas**, the 2021 SEC leader in RBI; infielder **Cade Doughty**, shortstop **Jordan Thompson**, designated hitter **Cade Beloso**, catcher **Alex Milazzo**, outfielder **Giovanni DiGiacomo** and outfielder/infielder **Drew Bianco**.

Other players with starting experience include outfielder **Brody Drost**, infielders **Collier Cranford** and **Will Safford**, and catcher **Hayden Travinski**.

The veterans are joined by several talented newcomers, including impact transfers like infielder **Jacob Berry** - the 2021 Collegiate Baseball National Freshman of the Year at Arizona - catcher **Tyler McManus** (Samford) and first baseman/outfielder **Brayden Jobert** (Delgado CC).

Infielder **Jack Merrifield** is an accomplished transfer from LSU-Eunice, and a group of skilled true freshmen features outfielders **Josh Pearson** and **Josh Stevenson**, and infielders **Luke Leto** and **Brennan Holt**.

The LSU pitching staff includes 10 hurlers that recorded innings last season, including graduate right-hander **Devin Fontenot**, senior right-hander **Ma'Khail Hilliard** and graduate right-hander **Trent Vietmeier**.

Other returners on the mound include redshirt sophomore left-hander Jacob Hasty, sophomore left-hander Javen Coleman, and sophomore right-handers **Ty Floyd**, **Will Hellmers**, **Garrett Edwards**, **Michael Fowler** and **Blake Money**.

Right-hander **Eric Reyzelman**, a transfer from the University of San Francisco, is expected to impact the staff, as are a pair of transfers from Arizona - right-hander **Bryce Collins** and left-hander **Riley Cooper**.

The staff is bolstered by left-hander **Trey Shaffer**, a graduate transfer from Southeastern Louisiana, JUCO transfer right-hander **Paul Gervase**, and by a gifted crew of true freshmen pitchers that includes right-handers **Cale Lansville**, **Grant Taylor**, **Grant Fontenot** and **Samuel Dutton**.

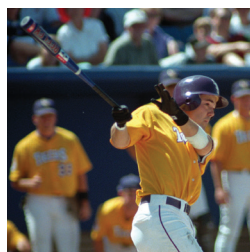

LSU BASEBALL HEAD COACH

Jay Johnson, the reigning Pac-12 Baseball Coach of the Year who led Arizona to a conference championship and a berth in the College World Series in 2021, was named the head coach of the six-time national champions LSU Tigers on June 25, 2021.

"I am humbled and honored to be the head baseball coach at LSU and serve as the steward of the next generation of national champions," Johnson said. "LSU is a phenomenal University and athletics department, and I am very thankful to (athletics director) Scott Woodward and (executive deputy AD) Stephanie Rempe for entrusting me to lead this storied program into its next winning chapter.

"I view this as the opportunity of my lifetime and will do everything in my power to have our team playing a brand of baseball that makes everyone at LSU, the Baton Rouge community, and the entire state of Louisiana incredibly proud. Geaux Tigers!"

Johnson already has made a tremendous impact upon the LSU program, as the Tigers signed this fall the No. 1 recruiting class in the nation for the 2023 season.

The architect of college baseball's best

offense in 2021, the 44-year-old Johnson led Arizona to two College World Series appearances – including a Championship Series berth in 2016 – over five full seasons, regularly producing the nation's most potent lineups and signing top players from across the country.

After landing college baseball's No. 4 recruiting class in the fall, Johnson's 2021 Wildcats smashed their way to Omaha in the spring, leading the nation in hits and ranking first in the Pac-12 in runs, hits, doubles, triples, RBI, walks, batting avg., on base pct., slugging pct., total bases and extra base hits.

Overall, Johnson's Wildcat teams finished first in the Pac-12 in hits, runs, and on base percentage in four of his five full seasons, while leading the league in slugging percentage, on base percentage, runs per game, and batting average in three seasons. And in each of his final two full seasons, the Wildcats topped the league in hits, walks, runs, runs per game, slugging percentage, on base percentage, and batting average.

When he was hired by Arizona after the 2015 season, Johnson took the reins of a program with a rich tradition and instantly made it richer.

When he arrived in Tucson, the Wildcats had won four national championships, recorded three national runners-up finishes (now four), made 16 CWS appearances (now 18), and made 37 NCAA Tournament appearances (now 40).

Johnson's impact was immediate. In 2016, he became the fifth coach ever – and the first since 1994 – to lead his team to the College World Series finals in his first season. That team, which had finished 12-18 and 9-21 in the Pac-12 in its previous two seasons, slugged its way to Omaha, finishing fifth nationally in hits and leading the conference in walks, doubles, hits, runs, and stolen bases.

The Wildcats returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2017 and finished first in the Pac-12 in batting average, doubles, hits, on base percentage, runs, scoring, and slugging percentage. In 2019, Johnson's offense led all Power 5 teams and finished second nationally in runs per game, slugging percentage, and on base percentage, while finishing third in batting average and total runs.

In addition to his reputation for developing hitters, Johnson is also considered one of the top recruiters in college baseball. Both Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball ranked Johnson's 2020 signing class No. 4 in the country – the highest ranking for a program west of the Mississippi River. The class featured 14 players from six states, including two players who ranked in Perfect Game's Top 100 prep rankings. In 2018 and 2019, Johnson landed Collegiate Baseball's No. 3 and No. 11 ranked classes, respectively.

Arizona was not the first program where Johnson's impact was felt instantly. Prior to his success at Arizona, Johnson spent two seasons

as head coach at the University of Nevada, earning Mountain West Coach of the Year honors in 2015 and leading the Wolfpack to their first ever conference championship in just his second season. That year, the Wolfpack finished 41-15 and ranked first in the country in on base percentage, second in slugging percentage, and third in batting average.

Johnson spent 2006 to 2013 as the associate head coach at the University of San Diego, where he spearheaded recruiting efforts and served as the hitting coach over eight seasons. There, Johnson helped sign the nation's No. 1 class in 2008 and No. 2 class in 2010, and USD's lineups topped the West Coast Conference (WCC) in hitting six times. At USD, Johnson recruited and coached Kris Bryant, who won the Golden Spikes Award and the Dick Howser Award as the nation's

top player before the Cubs selected him No. 2 overall in the 2013 MLB Draft.

Johnson's coaching career began at his alma mater, Point Loma Nazarene, where he served as an assistant coach from 2002 to 2004 before accepting the head coaching position in 2005 at 27 years old. He finished his playing career at Point Loma in 2001, hitting .326 as a senior and earning a Gold Glove as the team's starting second baseman.

A native of Oroville, Calif., Johnson is the 25th head coach in LSU baseball history, succeeding ABCA Hall of Fame coach Paul Mainieri, who retired after the 2021 season.

Johnson and his wife Maureen, a former University of Arizona soccer player, were married in 2016.

THREE TIGERS EARN PRESEASON ALL-SEC HONORS

LSU outfielder **Dylan Crews**, first baseman **Tre' Morgan** and infielder **Jacob Berry** were named 2022 First-Team Preseason All-SEC by the league coaches. LSU and Vanderbilt claimed an SEC-best three first-team selections. In addition, the league coaches in their annual preseason survey predicted the Tigers to finish fourth in the SEC Western Division.

Crews, the 2021 Perfect Game National Freshman of the Year, hit .362 (89-for-246) last season with 16 doubles, two triples, 18 homers, 42 RBI, 64 runs scored and 12 stolen bases. The product of Longwood, Fla., also received All-America, Freshman All-America, Second-Team All-SEC and Freshman All-SEC recognition, and he was voted the Louisiana Freshman of the Year.

Crews finished No. 1 in the SEC last season in total bases (163), No. 3 in batting average, No. 3 in on-base percentage (.453), No. 4 in base hits, No. 4 in runs scored, No. 5 in doubles and No. 5 in home runs.

Morgan, a product of New Orleans, La., batted .357 (89-for-249) in 2021 with 16 doubles, four triples, six homers, 42 RBI, 64 runs scored and 15 stolen bases. He received Freshman All-America, Second-Team All-SEC and Freshman All-SEC honors, and he was named to the SEC All-Defensive Team. He finished No. 4 in the SEC in batting average, No. 4 in base hits, No. 4 in runs scored, No. 4 in triples, No. 5 in doubles, No. 5 in stolen bases and No. 7 in on-base percentage (.441).

Berry, who transferred last summer to LSU from Arizona, led the Wildcats to the 2021 College World Series and the Pac-12 championship. A product of Queen Creek, Ariz., Berry batted .352 in 2021 with team highs of 17 homers and 70 RBI, and Collegiate Baseball newspaper named him the National Co-Freshman of the Year.

Berry earned first-team All-America recognition from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association, and he received second-team All-America honors from D1Baseball and Perfect Game.

SIX LSU PLAYERS RANKED AMONG THE 2022 PERFECT GAME TOP 100 COLLEGE SOPHOMORES

Six LSU baseball players appear in the 2022 Perfect Game list of Top 100 College Sophomores, as the Tigers lead the nation with the most prospects in the Top 100 ranking.

Outfielder **Dylan Crews** is No. 1 on the list; infielder **Jacob Berry** is No. 4; first baseman **Tre' Morgan** is No. 8, shortstop **Jordan Thompson** is No. 61; left-hander pitcher **Javen Coleman** is No. 77; and right-handed pitcher **Ty Floyd** is No. 87.

Crews, the 2021 Perfect Game National Freshman of the Year, hit .362 (89-for-246) in 2021 with 16 doubles, two triples, 18 homers, 42 RBI, 64 runs scored and 12 stolen bases.

Berry, who transferred this summer to LSU from Arizona, led the Wildcats to the 2021 College World Series and the Pac-12 championship. A product of Queen Creek, Ariz., Berry batted .352 in 2021 with team highs of 17 homers and 70 RBI, and Collegiate Baseball newspaper named him the National Co-Freshman of the Year.

Morgan, a product of New Orleans, La., batted .357 (89-for-249) in 2021 with 16 doubles, four triples, six homers, 42 RBI, 64 runs scored and 15 stolen bases. He received Freshman All-America, Second-Team All-SEC and Freshman All-SEC honors, and he was named to the SEC All-Defensive Team. Morgan was twice recognized as the SEC Freshman of the Week during a three-week period in late April-early May.

Thompson, a product of Chula Vista, Calif. was named 2021 Freshman All-SEC, as he hit .250 with four doubles, one triple, eight homers, 26 RBI, 32 runs and five stolen bases. He was voted to the NCAA Eugene Regional All-Tournament Team after batting .333 (6-for-18) in the regional with two doubles and two RBI.

Coleman, a product of Richmond, Texas, was voted to the 2021 NCAA Eugene Regional All-Tournament Team after he posted a brilliant relief win over Oregon in the first game of the championship round. Coleman limited the Ducks to one run on three hits in six innings with three walks and six strikeouts. Coleman appeared in 14 games (two starts) last season, posting a 3-2 record and a 5.79 ERA in 32.2 innings with 18 walks and 43 strikeouts, and he pitched effectively late in the year as the Tigers surged toward a postseason berth.

Floyd, a member of the 2021 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, made 20 relief appearances last season, recording 14 walks and 39 strikeouts in 24.1 innings while limiting opponents to a .195 batting average.

The product of Rockmart, Ga., posted an outstanding relief outing at Texas A&M (May 21), allowing no runs on one hit in 3.2 innings with no walks and four strikeouts.



DOUGHTY, REYZELMAN RECOGNIZED BY PERFECT GAME AS TOP PROSPECTS

LSU infielder **Cade Doughty** and right-handed pitcher **Eric Reyzelman** are rated among the 2022 Perfect Game Top 100 College Juniors. Doughty, a Denham Springs, La., native, is No. 25 on the list, and Reyzelman, a product of San Ramon, Calif., is slotted at No. 85. Each is a third-year college player who is a redshirt sophomore in athletic eligibility due to the 2020 COVID season.

Doughty batted .308 (70-for-227) for LSU in 2021 with 11 doubles, two triples, 13 homers, 55 RBI and 41 runs scored. He was 5-for-18 in the NCAA Eugene Regional with two doubles, one RBI and four runs, including 3-for-4 in the regional championship game win over Oregon with two doubles and two runs scored.

Doughty led LSU to a crucial series win at Texas A&M May 20-22, batting .333 (5-for-15) with one double, one homer, six RBI and three runs scored. In the Tigers' Game 2 win over the Aggies, Doughty doubled, homered and collected five RBI.

His two-out, three-run homer in the fifth inning erased a 6-3 deficit and the game remained tied at 6-6 until the top of the 13th, when Doughty's two-run double highlighted a six-run outburst in the 12-6 LSU victory over the Aggies that clinched a berth in the SEC Tournament.

Doughty was named National and SEC Player of the Week on March 15, as he collected five home runs, six runs scored and 12 RBI in leading LSU to five wins in five games versus Texas Southern, New Orleans and UT San Antonio.

Reyzelman, who transferred to LSU last summer from the University of San Francisco, had Tommy John surgery in March of 2020 and returned to game action just 10 months after surgery.

Reyzelman was named to the Cape Cod League All-Star Team this summer as a member of the Harwich (Mass.) Mariners. The right-hander, featuring a fastball clocked at 97 mph, recorded a 2.66 ERA and 36 strikeouts in 23.2 innings, and he limited opponents to a .212 cumulative batting average.

DUGAS, FONTENOT RATED AMONG TOP COLLEGE SENIORS

LSU outfielder **Gavin Dugas** and right-handed pitcher **Devin Fontenot** are rated among the 2022 Perfect Game Top 75 College Seniors. Dugas, a Houma, La., native, is No. 18 on the list, and Fontenot, a product of The Woodlands, Texas, is slotted at No. 42.

Dugas is a fourth-year player with two seasons of eligibility remaining due to the pandemic-shortened 2020 season. He led the SEC in RBI last season with 66, and he was No. 3 in the league in home runs with 19, including two grand slams. He was also No. 5 in slugging percentage (.641) and No. 8 in total bases (141).

Dugas, a two-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll, batted .295 (65-for-220) in 2021 with 13 doubles, three triples and 54 runs scored. He was voted the Most Valuable Player of the NCAA Eugene Regional, hitting .438 (7-for-16) with one double, two triples, three home runs, six RBI and seven runs scored.

Fontenot, who earned his LSU degree in sport administration last spring, has worked as the Tigers' closer for the past three seasons and is expected to contend for a starting role in 2022.

Fontenot made 26 relief appearances in 2021, posting a 4-2 mark and a 2.86 ERA in 34.2 innings with 40 strikeouts and five saves, including a win and a save in the 2021 NCAA Eugene Regional.

Fontenot, who received Collegiate Baseball All-America recognition in 2020, has made 90 career appearances at LSU, recording 13 wins, 16 saves and 155 strikeouts in 135 innings.

DUGAS TO WEAR ESTEEMED JERSEY NO. 8 IN 2022 SEASON

LSU redshirt-junior outfielder **Gavin Dugas** will wear jersey No. 8 for the 2022 season. The No. 8 jersey is given each season to the upperclassman who exemplifies the spirit of LSU Baseball through his leadership and dedication to the program.

The No. 8 tradition was started by outfielder Mikie Mahtook (2009-11) and has since been continued by first baseman Mason Katz (2012-13), shortstop Alex Bregman (2014-15), outfielder Jake Fraley (2016), second baseman Cole Freeman (2017), outfielder Antoine Duplantis (2018-19), outfielder Daniel Cabrera (2020) and pitcher Matthew Beck (2021).

Dugas, a native of Houma, La., led the SEC in RBI last season with 66, and he was No. 3 in the league in home runs (19), No. 5 in slugging percentage (.641) and No. 8 in total bases (141).

Dugas, a two-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll, batted .295 (65-for-220) in 2021 with 13 doubles, three triples and 54 runs scored. He was voted the Most Valuable Player of the NCAA Eugene Regional, hitting .438 (7-for-16) with one double, two triples, three home runs, six RBI and seven runs scored. He was 2-for-3 with two homers, three RBI and three runs scored in the regional title game win over Oregon.
