No. 3 LSU Gymnastics Opens Season Against Arkansas

No. 3 LSU Gymnastics will open the 2021 season and the 47th season in program history under first-year head coach Jay Clark against No. 15 Arkansas on Friday inside the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. The season opener kicks off an eight meet SEC schedule. Introductions for the meet will begin at 7:15 p.m. CT with first vault on the SEC Network at 7:35 p.m. John Roethlisberger and Alicia Sacramone Quinn will be calling the meet from home. Doors open at 6:16 p.m. Sophomore Kiya Johnson, the reigning SEC Freshman of the Year, was on pace to set numerous LSU records before the season cut short a year ago. Johnson earned All-America honors on vault, floor and in the all-around after finishing fourth, sixth and second respectively in the final national rankings. The senior class of Reagan Campbell, Bridget Dean, Christina Desiderio, Sami Durante, Sarah Edwards and Olivia Gunter provide a wealth of experience and routines for the Tigers in their fourth year.

Storylines

- LSU owns the all-time series over Arkansas, 38-5-1 with a record of 30-4-1 in the regular season. The Tigers are 8-1 against the Razorbacks inside the Maravich Center and have won 19 straight in the series.
- LSU welcomes a talented freshman class to campus. Elena Arenas, Sierra Ballard, Chase Brock, Haleigh Bryant and Olivia Dunne are expected to make a major impact from the start.
- The No. 3 preseason ranking marks the eighth-straight season that LSU is ranked in the top-five of the preseason poll.
- Friday night in the PMAC will look and feel different in 2021 with reduced capacity and physical distancing to due COVID-19. Fans will be required to wear masks and the capacity will be limited to up to 25 percent.
- LSU's Jay Clark was named the third head coach in school history in August following D-D Breaux's retirement. Clark, who served as an assistant coach for eight seasons and co-head coach for one season, is a 30-year veteran of college gymnastics. This is second stint as a head coach after serving as coach at the University of Georgia, his alma mater.

JAY CLARK

HEAD COACH • 1ST SEASON

Jay Clark, a 30-year veteran of college gymnastics and one of the best recruiters in the sport, is in his first season as the head coach of the LSU gymnastics program.

Clark was tabbed as the third head coach in program history in August 2020 following the retirement of D-D Breaux. Clark is in his ninth season overall at LSU following his hiring as the Tigers' associate head coach in 2012.

Clark is regarded as one of the best recruiters in the sport and the top bars coach in collegiate gymnastics history. The Tigers' associate head coach for eight seasons and co-head coach for one, Clark's leadership and expertise has helped bring unprecedented success on the recruiting trail and in the gym.

During the time since Clark's arrival, LSU has earned the best performances in school history as the NCAA Runner-Up in 2016, 2017 and 2019, appearances in the NCAA Championship Finals in six of seven seasons, numerous school records, produced seven NCAA individual national champions, and five SEC meet and regular season championships.

His work with the Fighting Tigers of LSU has not gone unnoticed. Clark has been named the Central Region Co-Assistant Coach of the Year along with fellow LSU assistant Bob Moore five times.

Clark also earned the 2014 and 2017 National Co-Assistant Coach of the Year award with Moore. It marked the third time in his distinguished coaching career he has garnered the nation's top award. He was inducted into the USA Gymnastics Region 8 Hall of Fame in 2018. Because of his recruiting success, ESPNU and ESPN the Magazine selected Clark as the ninth-best recruiter in all of collegiate athletics in 2011.

In the gym, Clark is viewed as the top bars coach in collegiate gymnastics history. Clark has coached the Tigers to 30 All-America honors on bars, four of the five highest bars team scores in school history and the top two bars title winners in LSU history. In his illustrious career, Clark has coached nine NCAA bars champions and two during his time in Baton Rouge.

Clark tutored Sarah Finnegan, who ended her career in April 2019 as one of the greatest gymnasts in LSU history. Finnegan became the first NCAA bars champion in school history in 2017 and earned the title once again in 2019. Finnegan and Lexie Priesman won SEC bars champions in 2019 and 2017 respectively, scored perfect scores in 2019 and led the squad that finished fourth in the nation.

The 2018 season on bars under Clark marked the best lineup in LSU history and one of the best in the history of the NCAA. The group posted a school record score of 49.725 and once again went on to break the record against Arizona with a 49.750 for the second-highest in all of NCAA Gymnastics since 1988.

The lineup, anchored by Finnegan, led the nation on bars for the first time in school history. Finnegan became the first gymnast in school history to finish the season ranked No. 1 on the event and joined Sharene Mamby (2001) and Syreeta Barnett (1997) as the only gymnasts at LSU to score a perfect 10.0 on the event.

In 2017, Clark coached Finnegan to the first NCAA Uneven Bars Championship in school history. Clark set the record for the most individual national champions on the event in NCAA gymnastics history.

Clark's bars squad finished ranked third in the nation for a fourth-consecutive Top-5 finish in 2017. The team's average score of 49.367 broke the previous record set in 2015. Finnegan and Priesman combined for three All-America honors. Priesman also took home the program's first SEC Uneven Bars championship in more than 20 seasons at the league meet.

LSU earned another Top-5 national ranking on bars in 2016 with an average score of 49.252. Finnegan, Priesman and Myia Hambrick combined to tally four All-America honors during the historic season.

The Tigers posted a Top-5 national ranking on bars in 2015, and the team totaled the second-highest bars total in school history with a 49.600 against Iowa. The Tigers also accumulated the second-best season average on bars in school history with a 49.288 average.

As a team LSU produced four All-America honors on bars in 2015 with three gymnasts (Rheagan Courville, Randii Wyrick and Shae Zamardi) earning First-Team All-America honors at the NCAA Championships. It marked the first time in program history that three gymnasts secured First-Team All-America honors on bars in one season.

Under Clark's direction, LSU shattered the school record with a 49.330 average on bars and finished the 2014 season ranked No. 5 nationally in the event. In addition, the Tigers tallied three of the top-10 bars scores in school history, including a 49.600 that ranks as the second best, and LSU produced three All-America honors on bars.

Clark coached Courville to a First-Team All-America honor at the 2014 NCAA Championships, and Courville went on to finish fifth in the event at the NCAA Individual Finals.

LSU reached the Super Six in the 2013 season, and under Clark's guidance the Tigers finished the season with a 49.260 regional qualifying score on bars, the highest final RQS in that event since the 2009 season.

Clark coached Morrison and Wyrick to First-Team All-America honors on bars in his first season with the Tigers, and it marked the first season LSU produced at least two All-Americans on bars since 2010.

Before Clark joined LSU after he spent 20 seasons at the University of Georgia where he helped guide the Gym Dogs to seven NCAA National Titles and 14 Southeastern Conference Championships.

Clark primarily coached bars at Georgia, and he coached the Gym Dogs to 64 All-America honors and seven NCAA individual national titles on bars, including two-time champions Courtney Kupets and Kat Ding.

From 2009-12, Clark served as the head coach at Georgia, and during that time the Gym Dogs captured three NCAA individual national championships, won the 2012 NCAA Auburn Regional, and produced 23 All-America honors. In 2012, his Georgia team won the Bulldog Cup, which recognizes the UGA team that excels academically, supports their peers in athletics and consistently serves the community.

Prior to his stint as head coach, Clark was the recruiting coordinator at Georgia from 1999-2009 while serving as assistant coach from 1999-2004 and associate head coach from 2005-09 when Georgia won an NCAA record five-straight national titles.

Clark also coached at the club level for 13 years from 1992-2005 as the founder, owner and head coach of Classic City Gymnastics in Athens, Georgia. He coached several Classic City gymnasts to state, regional, national championships and to the Junior Olympic National Team, and eight gymnasts went on to compete collegiately at the NCAA Division I level.

A native of Roswell, Georgia, Clark earned his undergraduate degree in exercise science from Georgia.

Clark is married to the former Julie Ballard, an All-American Georgia gymnast from 1994-98 and a native of Mandeville, Louisiana. The couple has two children – a son, Cole, and a daughter, Kinsey.

Last Time Out

- In the final meet before the season was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic, LSU topped Arkansas, Texas Woman's and Centenary with a 197.000 team score.
- LSU was beginning to gain momentum at that point in the season with the squad healing from injuries and gaining experience.
- A week later the 2020 season was ultimately halted and seniors Kennedi Edney and Ruby Harrold's successful four-year run was ended.

Season Opener Success

- LSU has opened its season with a 197-plus score four times in school history.
- The Tigers have scored a 197 or higher four times in the last seven seasons.
- LSU opened the 2017 season with the highest opening score in school history. The Tigers routed No. 9 Georgia 17.825-193.600.

Clark Begins New Chapter as Head Coach

- Jay Clark, who served on staff for eight seasons on staff, was elevated to head coach of the Fighting Tigers.
- Clark took over for legendary coach D-D Breaux, who served as head coach for 43 seasons.
- Clark owns 30 years of NCAA Gymnastics experience and is one of the most respected coaches in the country.
- In his time at LSU, Clark has elevated the Tigers' bars teams to one of the best in the nation.
- He takes over in 2021 as the third coach in program history.
- Clark previously served for more than 20 years as an assistant coach and head coach at the University of Georgia.

Gnat Makes Her Return to Baton Rouge

- Ashleigh Gnat, a 17-time All-American, four-time Southeastern Conference event champion and 2017 NCAA Floor Champion, was named as the squad's assistant coach in August after Clark's promotion to head coach.
- A two-time graduate of LSU, Gnat's primary responsibility is as the Tigers' beam coach.
- After her gymnastics career, Gnat served as a student coach for two years. She landed her first full-time position in 2019 as an assistant coach at Penn State.
- During her six years in Baton Rouge, Gnat was a part of the most successful stretch of the program's history. The Tigers set the three highest finishes in school history during Gnat's time and won five SEC Championships.
- She brings a wealth of experience as one of the best gymnasts in school history. Gnat led the Tigers inside and outside of the gym as LSU's nominee for the NCAA Woman of the Year Award and a finalist for the Honda Award.
- Gnat set multiple records during her career in Baton Rouge, including the most floor titles in a single season and perfect scores in a career with nine. Gnat was the 2016 and 2017 SEC Specialist of the Year and Central Region Gymnast of the Year.

All-SEC Schedule for 2021

- The 2021 schedule will be unique and one of the most difficult in the nation with just eight meets against SEC teams.
- It will be compromised of eight meets per school over 10 weeks, with the regular season concluding with the SEC Gymnastics Championships on March 20.
- The schedule will include two open dates for all schools in Week 5 and Week 10 to allow for rescheduling of postponed events.

Gymnastics Owns Last Three SEC Meet Titles

- The LSU Gymnastics team has claimed the last three SEC Championships titles and been the most accomplished team in the league during that span.
- The Tigers have claimed back-to-back-to-back SEC meet championships in Jacksonville, Florida, St. Louis, Missouri and New Orleans, Louisiana.
- The three-peat marked the fifth time in SEC history a team has won three or more SEC titles in a row.

Johnson is One of Nation's Top Gymnasts

- LSU's Kiya Johnson has made her name known as the top freshman in the nation and one of the top all-around performers a year ago.
- Prior to the season being canceled due to COVID-19, Johnson was on pace to break every LSU record and compete for SEC and NCAA Championships.
- Johnson won 22 individual titles in 2020 with seven in the all-around, six on floor, five on vault, three on beam and one on bars.
- The Dallas, Texas, native was named the SEC Gymnast of the Week following her performance against Auburn and was named the SEC Freshman of the Week the following four weeks.
- Johnson owns career highs of 39.75 in the all-around, 10 on beam and vault, 9.975 on floor and 9.90 on bars.
- She earned All-America honors on vault, floor and in the all-around after finishing fourth, sixth and second respectively in the final rankings.

Seniors Return Ten Routines to 2021

- The senior class of Reagan Campbell, Bridget Dean, Christina Desiderio, Sami Durante, Sarah Edwards and Olivia Gunter provide a wealth of experience and routines for the Tigers in their fourth year.
- Campbell and Desiderio are beam and floor specialists who have earned All-America honors before.
- Dean is a three-event specialist with experience at NCAA Championships. Durante is the Tigers' anchor on beam and has delivered crucial performances on beam in the last two seasons.
- Edwards was sidelined for a majority of 2020 with an injury but returns to the team with her high energy floor routine and 10.0 vault.
- Gunter rounds out the class with a strong floor routine and crucial energy for the team.

Freshman Class Brings Big Routines

- LSU's freshman class of Elena Arenas, Sierra Ballard, Chase Brock, Haleigh Bryant and Olivia Dunne are poised to bring big performances and will be relied on heavily.
- Arenas, Bryant and Dunne headline as all-around performers and all three should make their debuts on Friday night.
- Brock and Ballard train as two and three-event specialists and will assuredly see the floor in 2021.

Look Out for Shchennikova

- After competing on bars in her debut season after recovering from an Achilles injury, Alyona Shchennikova is expected to make a large impact in three events and eventually the all-around.
- Shchennikova was a two-time member of the U.S. National Team and competed in nine meets during her freshman season.

Rivers Out for 2021

- Sophomore Kai Rivers will miss the 2021 season after suffering an Achilles injury during training this fall.
