LSU Hosts New Mexico in Non-Conference Contest In Tiger Stadium

LSU (2-1, 1-0 SEC) steps out of conference play for the final time until late November when the Tigers host New Mexico (2-1, 0-1 Mountain West) at 6:30 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be streamed on ESPN+ and the SEC Network+. LSU enters the contest coming off a 31-16 win over Mississippi State last week, while the Lobos ran their record to 2-1 with a 27-10 victory over UTEP. It will be the first meeting between LSU and New Mexico in football. LSU returns to SEC action next week when the Tigers travel to Auburn for a 6 p.m. CT contest televised on ESPN.

Brian Kelly: Most Accomplished Hire in LSU History

First-year LSU coach Brian Kelly joined the program as the most accomplished hire in school history, coming to Baton Rouge with 284 career victories and three national Coach of the Year honors. In 12 years at Notre Dame, Kelly guided the Irish to seven 10-win seasons, 10 bowl appearances, including two College Football Playoff games and the BCS National Championship Game in 2012. Kelly's overall coaching record stands at 284-98-2, which ranks his first among all active FBS head coaches in wins. He went 113-40 at Notre Dame (12 years), 34-6 at Cincinnati (4 years), 19-16 at Central Michigan (3 years) and 118-35-2 at Grand Valley State (13 years). Kelly enters the Southern contest with a 149-34-1 mark in home games (62-14 at Notre Dame, 16-2 at Cincinnati, 10-5 at Central Michigan, 61-13-1 at Grand Valley State).

QUICK NOTES

- LSU enters the New Mexico game having won 10 straight and 59 of its last 60 games against non-conference opponents in Tiger Stadium.
- LSU has won 8 straight games, including 2 in 2022, when reaching the 30-point mark.
- LSU S **Jay Ward** earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors for his performance against Mississippi State (11 tackles, 1.5 TFL, 1 interception).
- LSU DE/JACK **BJ Ojulari** earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors – the third of his career – for his play against Mississippi State (4 tackles, 2.5 TFL, 1.5 sacks, 2 QB hurries).
- In 3 games as LSU's starting QB, **Jayden Daniels** has accounted for 8 TDs (6 pass, 2 rush) and he's completed 69.5 percent of his passes (57-of-82) for 556 yards, 6 TDs and no interceptions. He also leads the team in rushing with 225 yards and 2 TDs on 35 carries.
- In his LSU debut, **Daniels** became first QB in school history to pass for 200 yards and rush for 100 yards in a game decided in regulation
- In 10 fourth quarter possessions as LSU's QB, **Daniels** has led the Tigers to 7 scoring drives (6 TDs, 1 FG).
- LSU started 3 true freshmen last week

vs. Mississippi State – LT **Will Campbell**, RT **Emery Jones Jr.**, and TE **Mason Taylor**.

- Offensively, LSU is averaging 439.3 yards per game (193.0 rushing, 246.3 passing) and 39.7 points per game.
- Defensively, LSU is allowing 313.7 yards per game (135.3 rushing, 178.3 passing).
- LSU are limiting opponents to just 5-of-8 on redzone opportunities (3 TDs, 2 FGs).
- The Tigers have held its last 2 opponents to just 5-of-24 on third-down opportunities (Southern 2-of-10; Mississippi State (3-of-14). LSU also denied Mississippi State on 3 of its 4 fourth-down chances last week.
- S **Jay Ward** leads the Tigers in tackles with 19, while S **Major Burns** has 17 tackles and 2.5 TFL to his credit.
- 8 players have been credited with at least a half-sack with LB **Harold Perkins**, DE **BJ Ojulari** and DE **Sai'vion Jones** leading the way with 1.5 each.
- Thru 3 games, 14 players have earned their first start in an LSU uniform (vs. Florida State - QB **Daniels**, LT **Campbell**, LG **Frazier**, RB **Cain**, CB **Richardson**, CB **Garner**, and Nickel **Brooks**; vs. Southern – RB **Goodwin**, TE **M. Taylor**, LB **Little**, DE **S. Jones**, DB **Bernard-Converse**; vs. Miss. State – RT **Emery Jones, Jr.**, DT **J. Guillory**).

Brian Kelly, who has more victories than any active coach in major college football, was named LSU's 34th head football coach on December 1, taking over a program that has won four national championships.

The most accomplished hire in program history, Kelly joins LSU – which has won national championships under each of its last three head coaches – with more than 280 career victories in his collegiate head coaching career, the most among active FBS coaches. He is one of only five active FBS coaches who have guided their programs to multiple undefeated regular seasons since 2009, and he has led his teams to the College Football Playoffs in two of the last three seasons.

In 31 years as a head coach, Kelly has amassed a record of 284-97-2, which ranks him first among all active FBS coaches in career victories, ahead of Alabama's Nick Saban (274 wins) and North Carolina's Mack Brown (259 wins). Kelly has only had two teams finish below .500 during his 31-year collegiate career.

For the past 12 years, he has served as the head coach at Notre Dame. He leaves South Bend as the Irish's all-time winningest coach with 113 victories, moving ahead of legendary Knute Rockne for the top spot in 2021. His 12-year mark at Notre Dame stands at 113-40, which includes a 54-9 mark over the past five seasons.

During his Notre Dame career, Kelly led the Irish to the 2012 BCS national title game as well as College Football Playoff appearances in 2018 and 2020. He was named National Coach of the Year by numerous outlets in 2012 and 2018. He's the only coach to win the Home Depot Coach of the Year Award more than once, and he's done it three times (2009, 2012, and 2018).

In 12 seasons at Notre Dame, Kelly's teams won at least 10 games seven times, including 2021, as the Irish posted an 11-1 mark and were ranked as high as No. 5 in the nation during his final season in South Bend. Notre Dame's current streak of five straight seasons with double-digit wins includes a 10-3 record in 2017, followed by a 12-1 mark in 2018, 11-2 in 2019 and 10-2 in 2020.

Individually, Notre Dame players claimed eight consensus All-America honors playing for Kelly, while the Irish had players win nine national awards during that span. Kelly's Notre Dame teams have produced 55 NFL Draft picks since 2012, including 10 in the first round.

Academically under Kelly, the Irish had eight players earn the prestigious CoSIDA Academic All-America honor, and three were selected as National Football Foundation Scholar-Athletes. As a team, Notre Dame consistently ranked among the nation's top four in the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate.

Prior to joining the Irish, Kelly transformed Cincinnati into a football powerhouse, winning Big East titles in 2008 and 2009. In three years at Cincinnati, the Bearcats won 34 games and appeared in the Orange and Sugar Bowls. In 2007, Kelly led Cincinnati to the school's first-ever 10-win season with a 10-3 mark and a win in the PapaJohns.com Bowl. In his final season at Cincinnati, Kelly's team posted a 12-0 regular season mark and earned a berth to the Sugar Bowl.

Kelly's first Division I head coaching position came in 2004 when he took over at Central Michigan. In three years with the Chippewas, Kelly's teams won 19 games, claimed the Mid-American Conference title in 2006 and appeared in a bowl game for the first time in 12 years.

Kelly's first head coaching job came at Division II Grand Valley State in 1991, a position he held for 13 years. He won 118 games at Grand Valley State and led the Lakers to back-to-back national titles in 2002 and 2003. He won 41 games during his final three years in Allendale.

A native of Everett, Mass., Kelly was a four-year letterwinner at linebacker and two-time team captain at Assumption College in Worcester, Mass. He graduated from Assumption in 1983 with a degree in political science.

Kelly and his wife Paqui have three children – Patrick, Grace and Kenzel. The Kellys are active in community outreach and have established the Kelly Cares Foundation which has donated nearly \$6 million to support causes related to the fight against breast cancer since its founding in 2008.

LSU's Non-Conference Tiger Stadium Winning Streak

LSU has won ten straight and 59 of its last 60 games against non-conference opponents in Tiger Stadium. LSU's last loss against a non-conference foe came in 2017 when Troy beat the Tigers, 24-21 on Sept. 30. Prior to that loss, LSU had won 49 straight non-conference games in Tiger Stadium, which ranks as the third-longest streak in college football history, trailing only Harvard (55 from 1890-1895) and Carlisle (54 from 1901-1915). Before the Troy loss in 2017, LSU's last defeat in Tiger Stadium to a non-conference team came in 2000 against UAB.

LSU vs. Mountain West

The Tigers are 7-1 against current members of the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State, Fresno State, San Jose State, and Wyoming were all members of the WAC when LSU faced them, but they have since joined the Mountain West. LSU's only loss to a current member of the Mountain West Conference came in 1992 when Colorado State beat the Tigers, 17-14, in Tiger Stadium. LSU last faced a member of the Mountain West Conference in 2019 when the Tigers beat Utah State, 42-6, in Tiger Stadium.

Jay Ward and BJ Ojulari Earn Sec Player Of The Week Honors

LSU's Jay Ward and BJ Ojulari were honored by the Southeastern Conference for their performance in the 31-16 win over Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium on Saturday. Ward, who plays both safety and nickel back, is this week's SEC Defensive Player of the Week, while Ojulari has been named the SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week. The honor is the first of Ward's career, while Ojulari has earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week three times. Ward and Ojulari served as the catalyst for an LSU defense that held the Bulldogs to nearly 200 yards below their season average. LSU also limited Mississippi State to just 3-of-14 on third-down attempts and stopped the Bulldogs on fourth down three times.

Will Rogers, who came into the game leading the SEC in nearly every passing category, was held to season lows for yards (214) and touchdowns (1). He was also sacked four times as LSU's defense allowed only 289 yards to a Mississippi State offense that came into the game averaging 486 yards and 44 points a game. Down 13-7 at halftime, the Tiger defense gave up only three second half points and 86 total yards. Meanwhile, LSU's offense outscored Mississippi State, 24-3, in the second half, including 21-0 in the fourth quarter. Ward finished the game with a career-best 11 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, and an interception. His interception came late in the fourth quarter and sealed the win. Ojulari had four tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. He added a pair of quarterback hurries.

LSU Scores 21 Points in 4Q Comeback Win Over Mississippi State

LSU outscored Mississippi State, 24-3, in the second half, including 21-0 in the fourth quarter of last week's win over the Bulldogs. LSU trailed 13-0 in the second quarter before pulling to within 13-7 at halftime. The 13-point come-from-behind win was the largest deficit LSU has overcome since 2017 when the Tigers trailed Auburn 20-0 in the first half before going on to win, 27-23. The 21 fourth quarter points were the most for the Tigers since 2019 when LSU scored 22 points in a 45-38 win over Texas in Austin.

LSU Defense Shuts Down Mississippi State's "Air Raid" Offense

LSU DC Matt House and the Tiger defense held Mississippi State's "Air Raid" offense in check last week - holding the Bulldogs to season lows for points (16), total yards (289), passing yards (214) and rushing yards (75) in the 31-16 victory. The Tiger defense also limited State to just 3-of-14 on third-down opportunities and three times stuffed the Bulldogs on fourth down. LSU's defense finished the Mississippi State game with 9.0 tackles for loss, 4.0 sacks and an interception. LSU S Jay Ward was the SEC's highest graded safety, per PFF, after making 11 tackles, missing none, allowing only one passing yard and getting an interception. After missing the Southern game in week 2, DE BJ Ojulari returned to action and recorded 4 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss (-14) and 1.5 sacks (-13).

Daniels Only QB in SEC Ranked In Top 10 in League in Both Rushing and Passing

LSU QB Jayden goes into the New Mexico game as the only player in the SEC ranked among the top 10 in the conference in rushing and passing yards per game. Daniels currently ranks No. 9 in the SEC in passing yards per game (185.3) and he's eighth in the conference in rushing yards per game (75.0). Daniels also ranks No. 5 in the SEC in TDs accounted for with 8 (6 passing, 2 rushing). In 3 games, Daniels has completed 57-of-82 passes for 556 yards, 6 TDs and no interceptions. He's rushed for 225 yards and 2 scored on 35 carries.

John Emery Jr. Makes Return

Junior RB John Emery Jr. made his long-awaited return to the gridiron last week vs. Mississippi State. In his first action since 2020, Emery Jr. rushed 11 times for 32 yards and caught a pair of passes for 15 yards. It was the 20th game of his career, and the first since appearing in the win over Florida in December of 2020.

True Freshmen Tackles

Emery Jones Jr. and Will Campbell became the first true freshmen in LSU history (dating back to 1985) to start at left and right tackle in a game. They're the fourth combination of true freshmen to start on the offensive line. All instances of 2 true freshmen offensive linemen starting since 1985 (the time when starting lineups were kept) include:

Tigers Break Record for Most Points in a Quarter

LSU's 37 points in the first quarter against Southern marked the most points in a single period in school history. The previous mark was 35 points, set in the third quarter versus Rice in 1977 and in the fourth quarter at Tulane in 1958.

550 Yards of Offense Against Southern

LSU posted 550 total yards of offense in week 2 vs. Southern with 320 yards coming through the air and 230 on the ground. Starting QB Jayden Daniels was 10-for-11 with 137 yards and three touchdowns in just over one quarter of action. Daniels led LSU on touchdown drives on its first five possessions as the Tigers built a 44-0 lead just 40 seconds into the second quarter. Backup QB Garrett Nussmeier spelled Daniels and connected on 13-of-23 passes for 183 yards and a pair of interceptions. The 550 yards of offense were the most by the Tigers since a 593-yard output in a win over Ole Miss on Dec. 19, 2020.

1,300th Game for LSU

LSU's played its 1,300th game in football last week against Mississippi State. LSU's first football game took place in 1893 and have since won four national titles, most recently in 2019 when Heisman Trophy QB Joe Burrow led the Tigers to a 15-0 mark and a win over Clemson in the national championship game. LSU is 825-428-47 all-time in football.

RB Goodwin Making Most of His Opportunities

Sophomore RB Armoni Goodwin – the starter in LSU's last 2 games – has made the most of his opportunities in the backfield. In his first career start in week 2 vs. Southern, Goodwin led the Tigers with 85 yards and 2 TDs on 12 carries. He continued that strong play last week vs. Mississippi State, rushing for 76 yards and a TD on 9 carries. Goodwin iced the win for the Tigers in the fourth quarter when he broke loose on a 47-yard TD run to extend the LSU lead to 31-16. In 3 games, Goodwin ranks second on team (and first among running backs) with 178 yards rushing. He leads the team with 3 rushing TDs and is averaging 6.6 yards per carry. He's also caught a pair of passes for 10 yards.

Like Father, Like Son

Walker Howard joined dad Jamie Howard as the first father-son quarterback tandem in LSU history. Jamie played for the Tigers from 1992-95, while son Walker is a true freshman on this year's team. Walker made his first appearance in an LSU uniform last week vs. Southern, rushing 3 times for 15 yards.

Like Father, Like Son Part 2

In addition to Walker Howard joining his dad Jamie as father-son QB duos for the Tigers, LSU had another father-son tandem take place against Southern when Bo Bordelon saw his first action. Bo, like his dad Ben, is also an offensive lineman for the Tigers. Ben started on the offensive line at LSU in the 1990s and later went to play in the NFL.

LSU Ranks No. 2 in SEC and No. 4 Nationally in Redzone Defense

LSU's defense goes into the Mississippi State game ranked No. 2 in the SEC and No. 4 nationally in redzone defense. The Tigers have allowed opponents to penetrate the redzone 7 times, scoring on just 4 of those trips. Against Florida State, LSU held the Seminoles to 2-of-4 in redzone chances (1 TD, 1 FG). LSU recovered a Florida State fumble at the 1-yard line late in the fourth quarter to stop one redzone opportunity. Florida State also missed a field goal after reaching the redzone. Last week vs. Southern, the Jaguars 2-of-3 on redzone chances.

LSU Passing TD Streak Reaches 45 Games

LSU's streak of having at least 1 passing touchdown in a game has reached 45 contests as the Tigers threw 3 TDs in the win over Southern and one in the win over Mississippi State. LSU opened the season with 2 TD passes against Florida State. The 45-game streak is the longest in school history and dates back to the Arkansas game in 2018 when Joe Burrow connected with Justin Jefferson on a 40-yard TD pass in the first quarter. Six quarterbacks have contributed to the LSU streak with Burrow leading the way with 19 consecutive games with a TD pass. Myles Brennan did it in the first 3 games of 2020. TJ Finley (3 games) and Max Johnson (14) continued the streak into 2021. Garrett Nussmeier kept the streak going with TD passes vs. Ole Miss and Arkansas and then Jontre Kirklín made it No. 42 with 3 TD passes against Kansas State in the Texas Bowl. In 2022, Jayden Daniels has thrown TD passes in the first 2 games of the season to run LSU's current streak to 44 games. The closest the streak has come to ending came against Texas A&M in 2020 when LSU scored on a Max Johnson-to-Terrace Marshall pass with 38 seconds left in the game.

Jarar Jenkins Reaches 1,000 Career Receiving Yards

Senior wide receiver Jarar Jenkins became the 40th Tiger to reach 1,000 career receiving yards when reached the milestone in the season-opener against Florida State. Jenkins' career numbers include 70 receptions for 1,035 yards and 11 TDs. He has 3 TD receptions this year – 2 vs. Florida State and 1 vs. Mississippi State.

Jayden Daniels is Second Tiger To Total 200-yds Passing, 100-yds Rushing

QB Jayden Daniels became the second LSU player in school history to total at least 200 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in a game when the Tigers faced Florida State. Daniels threw for 209 yards and ran for 114 yards, going 26-for-35 with two touchdowns and no interceptions. Joe Burrow was the first to accomplish the feat in 2018 against Texas A&M. Burrow had 100 rushing yards and 270 passing yards in the 7-overtime loss at Kyle Field.

Day Game or Night Game Makes No Difference for LSU

LSU's tradition of night games in Tiger Stadium is like none other in college football. But, LSU's recent success in day games in Tiger Stadium has made playing afternoon games in Death Valley more appealing. LSU has won 20 of its last 22 day games in Tiger Stadium, a stretch that goes back to a 16-14 victory over Tennessee on Oct. 2, 2010. Of LSU's 20 wins during this current stretch, 11 have come against Top 25 teams and 19 were over SEC opponents. Since 2000, LSU is 129-23 overall at home, which includes a 99-16 mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 31-8 record during the day. From 1960-99, LSU posted a 12-19-3 mark in day games in Tiger Stadium.

A Look At The Offense

Quarterback

- Transfer Jayden Daniels is the most seasoned of LSU's quarterbacks with 32 career starts (3 at LSU, 29 at Arizona State). Daniels has thrown for over 6,000 yards, 38 TDs and added another 1,500 rushing yards and 15 scores during his collegiate career.
- He became the first LSU QB to throw for 200 yards and rush for 100 yards in a regulation game in school history vs. Florida State (209 passing, 114 rushing). Joe Burrow is other LSU QB to do it vs. Texas A&M in a 7OT contest (270 passing, 100 rushing).
- In 3 games at LSU, he's accounted for 8 TDs (6 pass, 2 rush).
- LSU scored TDs on 8 straight possessions with Daniels at quarterback (last 3 vs. Florida State, first 5 vs. Southern) before streak was snapped on first possession of Mississippi State game.

Running Back

- Penn State transfer Noah Cain scored his first LSU TD on a 1-yard run late in the 3Q vs. Florida State. He added another rushing TD vs. Southern, the 14th of his career (2 at LSU, 12 at Penn State).
- John Emery returned to action for the first time since the 2020 season last week vs. Mississippi State (32 yards on 11 carries; 2 rec., 15 yards).

NOTEBOOK

returns to action after sitting out the 2021 season. He has 566 rushing yards and 7 TDs in 19 appearances. He will make his 2022 debut vs. Mississippi State.

- Armoni Goodwin rushed for a 47-yard TD in the win over Mississippi State and leads all Tiger running backs in yards (178), TDs (3) and carries (27).
- Goodwin had his best day at LSU last week vs. Southern with 85 yards and 2 TDs on 12 carries.
- Josh Williams, a former walk-on, has rushed for TDs in back-to-back games (Southern, Mississippi State).

Wide Receiver

- One of the deepest and most talented groups in college football led by All-America candidate Kayshon Boutte. Back at full strength after missing final 7 games a year ago, Boutte has 93 career receptions for 1,337 yards and 14 TDs. He's caught at least one pass in every game he's played (19) and has accounted for 13 TD receptions in the 14 games he's started.
- Senior Jaray Jenkins is the veteran among the group with 14 career starts and 32 games played. Jenkins has 70 career receptions for 1,035 yards and 11 TDs, including 2 against Florida State in the season-opener. It was the third multi-TD game of Jenkins' career with other two coming in 2021 (3 vs. Florida, 2 vs. Texas A&M).
- Sophomore Malik Nabers is in position for a breakout season after earning Freshman All-SEC honors in 2021. He leads the Tigers in receptions (14), receiving yards (199) and yards per catch (14.2). Nabers has 42 receptions for 608 yards and 5 TDs for his career.
- Jack Bech led the Tigers in receptions (43) as a true freshman in 2021. He has 2 receptions for 22 yards and a TD this year.
- Brian Thomas has 11 career starts to his credit and has 9 receptions for 121 yards and a TD through 3 games. He's caught 37 passes for his career for 480 yards and 3 TDs. He's among the fastest players on the team, clocked at over 22 mph during practice.
- Chris Hilton appeared in 4 games in 2021, scoring on an 81-yard reception as time expired in the Texas Bowl. He had his best game as a Tiger vs. Southern in week 2 with 5 receptions for 47 yards.
- Kyren Lacy, a UL-Lafayette transfer, has 3 catches for 43 yards.

Tight End

- Kole Taylor and Jack Mashburn are returning starters at tight end, but freshman Mason Taylor, the son of NFL Hall of Famer Jason Taylor, emerged from camp as a player who will contribute in 2022. Kole Taylor has 13 career receptions for 112 yards and a TD.
- Mason Taylor ranks first among the tight ends with 6 receptions for 58 yards in his first 3 games at LSU.
- The other tight end expected to see action is former LSU baseball pitcher Nick Storz. Storz sat out last season after appearing in 10 games with 1 start in 2020.

Offensive Line

- LSU has used a different offensive line combination through the first 3 weeks of the season. Last week's combination included a pair of true freshmen (Will Campbell at LT and Emery Jones Jr. at RT). Charles Turner started for the second straight week at C with Garrett Dellinger at LG and Miles Frazier at RG.
- Dellinger, just a sophomore, started at C vs. Florida State and now has starts at 3 different positions on the line during his career – 3 at LT, 3 at LG, 1 at C.
- Key backups on the line include Cam Wire (can play either tackle position), Tre'Mond Shorts (can play either guard position), and Anthony Bradford (can play either guard or LT)

A Look At The Defense

Defensive Line

- LSU features perhaps the nation's best front in returning starters Ali Gaye, BJ Ojulari, Maason Smith, and Jaquelin Roy. That group has combined for 47.5 tackles for loss and 24.5 sacks. LSU lost Maason Smith for the season against Florida State with a knee injury.
- Ojulari, who plays the hybrid "Jack" position on the Tiger defense, is a preseason All-America selection and leads the group with 19.0 tackles for loss and 12.5 sacks during his LSU career. Roy and Gaye are both preseason All-SEC selections.
- Missouri transfer Mekhi Wingo is coming off a freshman All-SEC season a year ago and had 6 tackles, including a fumble recovery that setup LSU's 99-yard drive late in the 4Q vs. Florida State. He takes over for the injured Maason Smith at DT.
- Harold Perkins, a true freshmen, is a hybrid linebacker/edge rusher and had his best outing last week with 6 tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss (-14) and 1.5 sacks (-13) in the win over Mississippi State.

Linebackers

- Mike Jones Jr. and Greg Penn III lead LSU's group of linebackers. Jones joined the Tigers in 2021 after transferring from Clemson and capped last year playing his best football since joining the team. He's a versatile linebacker who has a knack for finding the football.
- Penn started LSU's game against Kansas State in the Texas Bowl and recorded 7 tackles in what was his most extensive action of the year. He continued that solid play through the spring and into camp. Penn has 14 tackles thru 3 games.
- Micah Baskerville, LSU's top returning tackler from a year ago, can play any linebacker position and played a key role in the Tigers shutting down Mississippi State last week. He had 9 tackles vs. Mississippi State, a week after blocking a punt and returning an interception 29 yards for a TD against Southern.
- Other LBs to watch included Virginia transfer West Weeks (10 tackles, 1.0 TFL, 1 FF in 2022), Jared Small, and South Carolina transfer Kolbe Fields.

Secondary

- LSU's secondary features returning starters Jay Ward (17 career starts) and Major Burns (8 career starts) along with transfers who started at their previous school: Arkansas (Joe Foucha and Greg Brooks), Ohio State (Sevyn Banks), Oklahoma State (Jarrick Bernard-Converse), McNeese (Colby Richardson) and Louisiana-Lafayette (Mekhi Garner).
- What once a question mark heading into camp, this group jelled in August and will be a strength for the Tigers.
- The cornerback position features four players who came to LSU with meaningful starts at their previous schools – Bernard-Converse (47 starts at Oklahoma State), Garner (19 starts at UL-Lafayette), Richardson (21 starts at McNeese), and Banks (14 starts at Ohio State).
- LSU's nickel position this week will be manned by Ward and Sage Ryan with Brooks shifting to safety. Brooks, who started 31 games at Arkansas over the past 3 years, has 12 tackles in his first 3 games at LSU. Against Southern in week 2 Ryan had 2 tackles and recovered a pair of fumbles vs. Southern.
- Burns started the first 5 games a year ago and was among LSU's best defenders (25 tackles, 1 int.), before an injury sidelined him for remainder of season. Since returning to action, Burns has 17 tackles and leads the team with 2.5 tackles for loss.
- Ward earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors for his play vs. Miss. State with 11 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and an interception. He leads the team with 19 tackles.

A Look At Special Teams

- LSU's special teams features all new faces this year as prior to the Florida State game, there wasn't a play on the roster who had punted or kicked in an LSU uniform.
- Jay Bramblett handles the punting duties, joining the Tigers after a standout career at Notre Dame where he averaged 41.6 yards on 164 punts in three years with the Irish. He's punted 9 times this year and is averaging 45.3 yards.
- Redshirt freshman Damian Ramos made his first LSU field goal attempt, a 36-yarder in the 1Q vs. Florida State. He's 2-of-3 this year.
- East Carolina transfer Slade Roy will handle long snapping for the Tigers, while Bramblett will be LSU's holder.
- LSU return game is handled by UTSA transfer Gregory Clayton Jr. (punt returns) and preferred walk-on Javen Nicholas (kickoff returns). Clayton is the nephew of former LSU standout and current New Orleans Saint Jarvis Landry.

A Different Season-Opening QB For The Tigers

When Jayden Daniels took the field as LSU's starter in week one, it marked the 19th time in the last 25 seasons that LSU had a different starting quarterback for the season opener. Only Matt Mauck in 2002 and 2003, JaMarcus Russell in 2004 and 2005, Jordan Jefferson in 2009 and 2010, Zach Mettenberger in 2012 and 2013, Brandon Harris in 2015 and 2016 and Joe Burrow in 2018 and 2019 have started consecutive openers for LSU. New Beginnings

LSU will open the season with a new head coach and new starting quarterback for the second time since 1958. The only other time the Tigers have opened a season with both a new head coach and new starting quarterback was in 1980 when sophomore Alan Risher started the season opener for first-year head coach Jerry Stovall. LSU lost to No. 13 Florida State, 16-0.

Kayshon Boutte to Wear No. 7

LSU wide receiver Kayshon Boutte will wear No. 7 for the Tigers in 2022. A relatively new tradition at LSU, the No. 7 jersey has become associated with a player who is a dynamic playmaker while also displaying all of the qualities necessary to build championship teams around. Some past wearers of the No. 7 jersey for LSU include cornerback Patrick Peterson, defensive back Tyrann Mathieu, running back Leonard Fournette, wide receiver DJ Chark and cornerback Derek Stingley Jr. Boutte is one of the most dynamic receivers in the country and a mismatch for any defense. In 16 career games, he has scored 14 touchdowns and totaled 1,244 yards on 83 receptions. The junior owns 5 100-yard receiving games, including an SEC record 308 yards and 3 TDs on 14 receptions in the 2020 season finale against Ole Miss. Boutte is coming off a season where he was on pace to finish amongst the SEC and national leaders in receiving TDs. Up to the point of his ankle injury six games into the season, Boutte already caught at least one TD pass in every game, including three in the opener against UCLA. In his freshman season, Boutte led the Tigers in receiving yards and finished second in receptions with 735 and 45.

BJ Ojulari to wear No. 18

Junior defensive lineman BJ Ojulari was presented with the coveted No. 18 jersey for the 2022 season. On the third day of fall camp preceding the 2022 season, Head Coach Brian Kelly announced in front of the team that Ojulari would wear the No. 18 jersey. Coach Kelly remarked that "the No. 18 is the player who brings all those traits of someone who leads in an extraordinary manner." It's the "attention to detail, great focus, and representing the program in a positive way, in the classroom, and off the field," that made Ojulari deserving of the honor, said Coach Kelly. The Marietta, Georgia native entering his second season as a starter joins an elite list of former Tigers who have had the honor of wearing the number. Most recently, linebacker Damone Clark and kicker Avery

Atkins wore No. 18 for the Tigers in 2021. LSU's tradition of No. 18 began in 2003 when quarterback Matt Mauck guided the Tigers to their first national championship since 1958. Mauck, now a dentist in Denver, passed his number down to running back Jacob Hester, who went on to lead the Tigers to the 2007 national title. It was the outstanding traits – both on and off the field – of Mauck and Hester that resulted in No. 18 becoming the number worn by the Tiger who best epitomizes what it means to be an LSU football player.

Preseason All-Americans

Standout LSU wide receiver Kayshon Boutte has been named first team preseason all-America by the Associated Press, the news organization announced on Monday. Boutte, a junior from New Iberia, is back at full speed after having his sophomore season cut short due to an injury. Boutte suffered his season-ending injury against Kentucky in week 6, and at the time he ranked among the national leaders in several receiving categories. In six games in 2021, Boutte caught 38 passes for 509 yards and nine touchdowns. Boutte caught at least one TD pass in LSU's first five games last year, including three against UCLA in the season-opener.

Boutte burst onto the national scene late in his rookie season when he set the Southeastern Conference single-game receiving record with 308 yards and three TDs on 14 receptions in the win over Ole Miss in the season-finale. Boutte capped his first year with the Tigers earning Freshman All-America honors as well as being named to the Freshman All-SEC. In 16 career games, Boutte has caught 83 passes for 1,244 yards and 14 touchdowns.

Preseason All-SEC

LSU wide receiver Kayshon Boutte and defensive end BJ Ojulari have been named first team preseason All-Southeastern Conference. The preseason All-SEC team was voted on by the league's 14 head coaches. Coaches could not vote for their own players. The coaches recognized three teams for the preseason All-SEC squad.

Boutte, who was named first team preseason All-America by the Associated Press on Monday, led LSU and ranked among the league leaders in receiving yards (509) and touchdowns (9) despite playing in only six games a year ago. Boutte enters 2022 with 83 career receptions for 1,244 yards and 14 touchdowns. He's the SEC single-game record holder for receiving yards with 308 on 14 catches in the win over Ole Miss in 2020. Boutte missed the final seven games of the 2021 season after suffering an injury against Kentucky in week 6. At the time of his injury, Boutte led the nation in receiving touchdowns (9). Boutte also tied the school-record for consecutive games with a touchdown reception (7) before the injury ended his season.

Ojulari, entering his second season as a starter for the Tigers, led LSU in sacks (7) and was second on the team in tackles for loss (11.5) in 2021. Ojulari had 55 tackles and nine quarterback hurries a year ago as he was one of the most productive defensive linemen in the SEC. Other Tigers named to the preseason All-SEC include defensive end Ali Gaye and defensive tackle/nose guard Jaquelin Roy. Gaye, a recent LSU graduate, enters his third season with the Tigers in 2022. Gaye earned 2020 second team All-SEC honors. In two years at LSU, Gaye has accounted for 51 tackles, 12 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks. Roy, a junior from Baton Rouge, has appeared in 22 games during his career, starting against Kansas State in the Texas Bowl last season. He's recorded 48 tackles, 10 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks.

Second-Generation College Athletes

The Tigers have seven current players whose fathers have been involved in high-level football. Of the seven, four played college football in the SEC. Sophomore West Week's father was an All-SEC three-year starter at Georgia from 1991-95. Three fathers of freshmen, QB Walker Howard, OL Lanson Smith, and OL Bo Bordelon, played their stint in the SEC with LSU. Jamie Howard, father of Walker Howard, played for LSU from 1992-95 and was named to USA Today's Fabulous Freshman Team "Best of the Rest" in 1992.

Lance Smith, father of OL Landon Smith, and Ben Bordelon, father of OL Bo Bordelon, also played for the LSU Tigers. Lance Smith was a First-Team All-America in 1984 and was named to the All-SEC Team twice. Smith was drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals in the third round of the 1985 NFL Draft. He spent nine seasons with the Cardinals before playing another three seasons with the New York Giants. Ben Bordelon was an All-SEC lineman for LSU from 1992-96. Bordelon went undrafted, but signed with the San Diego Chargers in 1997 where he played 16 games. Since 2014, Bordelon has been the President, Chairman, and CEO of Bollinger Shipyards.

Sophomore QB Garrett Nussmeier is the son of Doug Nussmeier, who played quarterback in the NFL from 1994-98 with the New Orleans Saints, Denver Broncos and Indianapolis Colts. Doug Nussmeier currently works as the quarterbacks coach for the Dallas Cowboys.

Frank Wilson III, father of sophomore safety Quad Wilson, is the current Associate Head Coach and running backs coach at LSU. Wilson played for three years at Nicholls and had previous coaching stops at Ole Miss (2005-2007), Southern Miss (2008), Tennessee (2009), LSU (2010-2015), UTSA-HC (2016-2019). He was the head coach at McNeese from 2020-21 before returning to LSU this year. While at LSU previously, he was recognized as the

nation's top assistant coach at his position in 2011. Wilson also was named the 2011 Recruiter of the Year by Rivals.com, the 2014 NFL.com Top Recruiter in College Football and the 2015 Scout.com SEC Recruiter of the Year.

Jason Taylor, father of freshman TE Mason Taylor, was a 2017 NFL Hall of Fame inductee. Taylor played in the NFL for 15 years, spending the majority of his career with the Miami Dolphins. In 2022, Taylor joined the University of Miami's coaching staff as a defensive analyst.

Boutte 6th on LSU's Career Receiving Yards/Game

Junior Kayshon Boutte is in his third year with LSU and currently sits eighth on the Tigers' list of career receiving yards per game. Boutte is one of the most dynamic receivers in the country and a mismatch for any defense. At sixth, Boutte sits just behind Ja'Marr Chase (4th) and Justin Jefferson (5th) on the list. In 19 career games, he has scored 14 touchdowns and totaled 1,337 yards on 93 receptions.

2023 Football Schedule Announced

A season-opening contest against Florida State in Orlando as well as home Southeastern Conference games against Arkansas, Auburn, Florida and Texas A&M headline LSU's 2023 football schedule. League opponents coming to Tiger Stadium in 2023 include Arkansas on Sept. 23, Auburn on Oct. 14, Florida on Nov. 11 and Texas A&M on Nov. 25. The September meeting with the Razorbacks will mark the earliest the teams have met in the 67-game history of the series. In addition to its four SEC home games, LSU will play Grambling for the first time in football when the Tigers come to Tiger Stadium on Sept. 9. LSU will also host Army and Georgia State in Tiger Stadium next year to round out the home slate.

The Tigers host Army on Oct. 21 and Georgia State on Nov. 18. LSU will face Army for the only the second time and the first since 1931. LSU and Georgia State have never met in football. On the road, the Tigers open conference play at Mississippi State on Sept. 16 with other league games coming at Ole Miss on Sept. 30, at Missouri on Oct. 7 and at Alabama on Nov. 4. LSU and Ole Miss have faced each other during the month of September only four times in the history of the rivalry that dates back to 1894. LSU closes out the season with three consecutive home contests, a first for the Tigers since 2001 when Middle Tennessee, Arkansas and Auburn all came to Tiger Stadium over the final three weeks of the season.

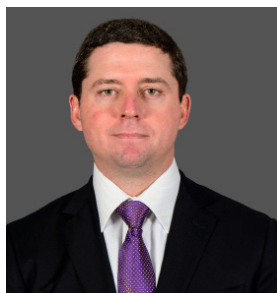

Football Drops Opener to Florida State, 24-23

Jayden Daniels found Jaray Jenkins for a two-yard touchdown as time in regulation expired, but Florida State blocked the extra point to lead the Seminoles over LSU, 24-23, on Sunday Night at the Caesars Superdome. The Tigers fall to 0-1 and will return to action on Saturday for a 6:30 p.m. kickoff at home against Southern on the SEC Network. Trailing 24-10 late in the fourth quarter, LSU showed resiliency by battling back as Daniels found Jenkins up the middle for a 22-yard touchdown connection to cut the deficit to 24-17 with 4:07 left to play. A fumble recovery by defensive tackle Mekhi Wingo on the Tigers' goal line – his first as an LSU player and the first turnover of the season for the Tigers' defense – gave LSU the ball back with another opportunity to get even with 1:20 remaining. Daniels led the offense to a miraculous 99-yard scoring drive, starting at the Tigers' 1-yard line and ending with a two-yard score to Jenkins in the end zone to make it 24-23. That would be Jenkins' 10th career scoring catch. The 99-yard drive marked the 7th by LSU since 1944 and first since Utah State in 2019. The PAT was blocked to end the game. Daniels posted an admirable LSU debut, accounting for 323 yards of total offense (209 passing, 114 rushing). Daniels' 114 yards rushing tied Lynn Amedee (vs. Tulane, 1961) for sixth place on the single-game LSU list for rushing yards by a quarterback. Jenkins led the Tigers in receiving with five catches for 46 yards and two touchdowns. Brian Thomas posted five catches for 44 yards and Malik Nabers added five catches for 42 yards. Defensively, senior Jay Ward recorded a team-high eight tackles, as sophomores Greg Penn III and Wingo had five of their own. FSU quarterback Jordan Travis accounted for 260 yards through the air with two touchdowns, completing 20-of-33 passes.

Football Dominates Southern in Home Opener, 65-17

LSU quarterback Jayden Daniels went 10-for-11 for 137 yards and three touchdowns in just over a quarter of play on Saturday night to lead the Tigers to a commanding 65-17 win over Southern in Tiger Stadium. LSU improved to 1-1 with the victory, while Southern dropped to 1-1 on the year. The Tigers return to Death Valley next Saturday to start conference play by playing host to Mississippi State at 5 p.m. CT on ESPN. The Jaguars' Reginald King fumbled the opening kickoff of the game, as LSU's Xavier Carter forced the miscue and Sage Ryan recovered the ball at the Southern 21. LSU capitalized on the turnover, as on the Tigers' third play from scrimmage, Daniels dashed 18 yards to the end zone. After the LSU defense forced a three-and-out on Southern's first offensive possession, the Tigers moved 62 yards on four plays and increased the lead to 14-0 on a five-yard scoring run by Josh Williams. The drive was highlighted by Armoni Goodwin's 38-yard burst to the Jaguars' five-yard line. On its next possession, LSU marched 71 yards on five plays and scored on Daniels' 17-yard TD strike to wide receiver Jack Bech, giving the Tigers a 21-0 lead at the 7:16 mark of the first quarter. The drive featured a 41-yard sprint by wide receiver Kayshon Boutte on an end-around. LSU linebacker Micah Baskerville intercepted Southern quarterback BeSean McCray's pass on the next play from scrimmage, and Baskerville raced 29 yards to paydirt, increasing the Tigers' advantage to 28-0 with 7:07 remaining in the opening period. LSU collected another first-quarter turnover when linebacker Desmond Little recovered a fumble by Southern running back Jerodd Sims and returned it five yards to the Jaguars' 24. Four plays later, Daniels connected on a five-yard scoring pass to wide receiver Malik Nabers. Baskerville made his presence felt again when he blocked a Southern punt, and the football skipped through the end zone for a safety with 1:31 left in the first quarter. The play marked LSU's first safety since November 30, 2019, when Neil Farrell Jr. sacked Texas A&M's James Foster, and the ball was recovered by the Aggies in their own end zone. Baskerville's play was LSU's first blocked punt for a safety since October 16, 1999, at Kentucky, when Jarvis Green blocked a punt out of the back of the end zone. LSU's 37 points in the first quarter marked the most points in a single period in school history.

Football Powers Past Mississippi State, 31-16

Jayden Daniels and the LSU offense scored 21 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to give the Tigers a victory in the SEC opener over Mississippi State, 31-16, on Saturday night in Tiger Stadium. LSU improved to 2-1 with the victory, while the Bulldogs dropped to 2-1 on the year. The Tigers return to Death Valley next Saturday to face New Mexico at 6:30 p.m. CT. Sophomore wide receiver Malik Nabers caught a team-high six passes for 76 yards as the Tigers posted 416 yards of total offense, while the LSU defense limited the Bulldogs to 289 yards from scrimmage. Jaray Jenkins caught the Tigers' only touchdown pass in the second quarter. Senior safety Jay Ward had a career day with 11 tackles, 1.5 for loss, one pass break-up and an interception. Sophomore defensive end BJ Ojulari was all over the field with four tackles, 2.5 for loss, 1.5 sacks and two quarterback hurries. Armoni Goodwin rushed for 75 yards and a touchdown on 9 carries, but Daniels led LSU's rushing attack with 100 yards on the ground with two scores. After winning the coin toss, LSU elected to receive and take the ball. The first explosive play of the game came via an 18-yard completion from Daniels to Kayshon Boutte, but the Tigers were forced to punt from their own 49-yard line on the opening drive of the contest. On 4th-and-1 from their own 22, Mississippi State rolled the dice and went for it, securing a first down on a 4-yard rush. That would quickly pay off as quarterback Will Rogers found Rara Thomas for a 20-yard completion, then on the next play, Joquavious Marks busted open a 37-yard touchdown run to give the Bulldogs a 6-0 advantage. The extra point was no good. On their next offensive possession, Mississippi State decided to go for it again on 4th-and-1 from LSU's 41-yard line, but Major Burns stopped the Bulldogs for a loss and a turnover on downs. At the end of the first quarter, the Tigers accounted for just 49 yards of total offense, while MSU accounted for 99. State took another chance and went for it on fourth down on their own 29, but Mike Jones and Mekhi Wingo brought down MSU for no gain and a turnover on downs from the MSU 29-yard line. However, Daniels fumbled on the next possession to give the Bulldogs the ball back. On 3rd-and-10, sophomore defensive end Saivion Jones sacked Rogers and forced a fumble, which was recovered by MSU. Sophomore linebacker Harold Perkins gave the Tigers their third sack of the game, while Ojulari recorded a tackle for loss on the next play to turn in another defensive stop. LSU tallied six tackles for loss as a defense at that point. Rogers found Thomas on a fade for a 13-yard touchdown completion, extending Mississippi State's lead to 13-0 with 2:14 left in the half, for a three play, 54-second drive spanning 48 yards. The Tigers finally got the scoring drive they needed with 46 seconds left in the half as Daniels found Jaray Jenkins for an 8-yard score through the air, capping off a seven play, 75-yard drive. Daniels utilized his legs to get LSU in scoring position, scrambling to pick up chunk plays of 13, 15 and 20 yards. LSU forced a three-and-out to open the second half. On the next offensive possession, Daniels led the offense down to the 18-yard line, but an incomplete pass intended for Nabers on third down forced the Tigers to kick a field goal. Damian Ramos' 35-yard attempt was good. Mississippi State's lead was cut in half to 13-10 after LSU's 69-yard scoring drive on 9 plays that spanned 2:33. On 4th-and-4 at midfield, Daniels' pass to Nabers fell incomplete to turn the ball over on downs, but on the next possession, MSU went for it on 4th-and-2 and did not convert to give LSU the ball back. Jay Bramblett's punt to Austin Williams was muffed and recovered by long snapper Salde Roy at the Bulldog 9-yard line. The Tigers took advantage of the turnover as Daniels scored a 3-yard touchdown on a quarterback keep. Goodwin put the game on ice, taking a 47-yard rush to the house to give the Tigers a two-possession lead at 31-16 with 4:50 remaining in the contest.
