GAME NOTES

General

- For the third time this season in a SEC game, LSU overcame a double-digit deficit to win. On Saturday the Tigers trailed by 14 points in the second quarter, but outscored the Rebels 42-3 the remainder of the game.
 - On September 17, LSU fell behind 13-0 in the second quarter against Mississippi State, but outscored the Bulldogs 31-3 the remainder of the game.
 - On October 1, LSU fell behind 17-0 in the second quarter in a game at Auburn, but outscored the Tigers 21-0 the remainder of the game.
 - The only other time LSU has come back in a single season was 2007 (Florida, Auburn, at Alabama).
 - In the second half of both Saturday's game against Ole Miss and the game against Auburn LSU's defense held the opposing offense scoreless. The Tigers allowed only 3 points in the second half of the Mississippi St. game.
- With the win over No. 7 Ole Miss, LSU has its first victory over a Top-10 team since taking down Florida, 37-34, during the 2021 season in Baton Rouge.
- Saturday's 25-point margin of victory over No. 7 Ole Miss is LSU's largest margin of victory over a top-10 team in the regular season since No. 2 LSU beat No. 9 Virginia Tech, 48-7, on 9/8/2007 in Tiger Stadium.
- LSU has now won seven consecutive games against Ole Miss in Tiger Stadium.
- Brian Kelly coached teams are 3-1 all-time against Lane Kiffin coached teams.
- LSU has won 11 straight games, including 5 this season, when reaching the 30-point mark.
- LSU has won four straight and 21 of its last 22 Homecoming games.
- Since 2000, LSU is 18-1 in Tiger Stadium on the week prior to an open date.

Offense

- QB Jayden Daniels** continued to shine both passing and rushing the football. He set the LSU record for the most rushing yards in a season by a QB and the LSU record for most rushing touchdowns in a season by a QB. Daniels rushed 23 times for 121 yards and 3 touchdowns. Daniels was also 21-28 throwing the football for 248 yards and 2 touchdowns.
 - With the 121 rushing yards, Daniels now has 524 rushing yards on the season, setting a LSU record for rushing yards by a QB.
 - Jordan Jefferson previously held the record with 450 rushing yards in 2010.
 - Daniels' second rushing touchdown of the game was the 8th of the season for him, setting the LSU single-season record by a QB. It came with 14:18 remaining in the fourth quarter to give LSU a multi-score lead.
 - Five LSU QBs have rushed for 7 TDs in a season, most recently by Joe Burrow in 2019.
 - The 121 rushing yards by Daniels is the fourth most in a game by a LSU quarter back and the most by a LSU quarterback this century.
 - Between last week's win at Florida (3 rushing TDs and 3 passing TDs by Daniels) and Saturday's win over Ole Miss, the LSU QB has accounted for a total of 11 touchdowns over the past two weeks.
- True freshman **TE Mason Taylor** recorded his first career touchdown reception on Saturday, a 1-yard completion from Daniels with 8:25 remaining in the 3rd quarter to give LSU its first lead of the day, 24-20. Taylor finished the day with 3 catches for 44 yards and the score.

Defense

- With Ole Miss in the red zone with 4:03 left in the 3rd quarter, **S Joe Foucha** recorded his first interception as a Tiger. The transfer from Arkansas had four picks during his time as a Razorback. LSU scored on its ensuing offensive possession to go up two scores.
- LB Micah Baskerville** led the Tigers with 9 tackles, including 1 tackle for loss.
- DT Mekhi Wingo** had 1.5 sacks for LSU and **LB Harold Perkins Jr.** had 1.0 sack.

Special Teams

- P Jay Bramblet** punted twice for an average of 42.0 yards, placing one inside the 20-yard line.
