1st Year at LSU · 8th Year as a Head Coach

When Matt McMahon stepped to the podium for the first time as the 25th LSU men's basketball head coach he listed the core values of his coaching career and his teams.

"Hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy."

Those words are now the cornerstone of LSU Basketball as it moves into a new era as a very successful head coach begins to reshape the program in his image.

The image was on display during the past seven years at Murray State University where the Racers posted a record of 154-67, a .697 winning percentage. He led Murray State to 93 OVC regular-season wins, winning 75 percent of league games.

He has also coached multiple all-Americans and all-league players such as Ja Morant who was named NBA Rookie of the Year in 2020.

The Racers won regular season league titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2022 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2018, 2019 and 2022 (the 2020 appearance was canceled by the pandemic).

Since the native of Oak Ridge, Tennessee, became the third-youngest rookie among D1 coaches in 2015, McMahon has continued a steady move forward with a reputation for developing talent both as an assistant and head coach. He has become known nationally as an excellent recruiter and he is among the best in the nation in the area of player development and game planning.

In his final season at Murray State in 2021-22, McMahon coached OVC Player of the Year KJ Williams and two other recipients of first-team honors (Tevin Brown, Justice Hill). In addition, McMahon was named the league's Coach of the Year.

Two of those players, Williams and Hill, are now at LSU.

Williams, who ranked 12th nationally in 3-pointers made (94), became the third Murray State player to score 1,500 points and grab 800 rebounds. Hill took over point guard duties in a Racer program known for good guards, leading Murray State in assists in 19 games with a plus-101 margin in assists to turnovers.

McMahon's Racers, picked third in the OVC preseason poll, were just the sixth team in league history to go undefeated and the first to do it in an 18-game conference schedule. Murray State then won the two league tournament games to advance to the NCAA Tournament where, as a No. 7 seed, the Racers defeated San Francisco to advance to the round of 32.

The 2021-22 team was one of seven teams to win 30 or more games that season and led the nation in win percentage at 91.2 percent (31-3). The Racers were ranked No. 20 in the final AP poll and No. 22 in the Ferris Mowers Coaches Poll

McMahon was the first MSU coach to have

three seasons of 25 or more wins and was one of just three Murray State coaches to have four 20-win seasons.

Although the 2019-20 season was called early because of the pandemic, it marked the third year in a three-year run when Coach McMahon led the Racers to three-straight OVC regular season championships (2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20) and two consecutive OVC Tournament titles (2017-18, 2018-19).

Coach McMahon's commitment to defense showed in those years as the Racers ranked as the league leader twice in defensive field goal percentage and each of the three seasons the team led the league in defending the 3-point shot

The 2018-19 team won 28 games and made its mark in the NCAA Tournament when the 12th-seeded Racers won their fourth all-time tourney game by defeating No. 5 seed Marquette. That season is when Morant stepped to the forefront at Murray State.

He was named the OVC POY, leading Division I in assists and earning first-team all-America honors from the USBWA. In the NCAA Tournament win over Marquette, Morant posted a triple double of 17 points, 11 rebounds and 16 assists as he became the eighth player to record a triple double in the tournament.

He was drafted second overall in the 2019 NBA draft by the Memphis Grizzlies.

In 2017-18, McMahon's team won 26 games and the OVC regular season and tournament championship, sending the Racers to what was at that time the school's 16th NCAA Tournament.

Prior to being named head coach, he was a key part of Coach Steve Prohm's staff as assistant at Murray State as the Racers won a pair of Ohio Valley Conference championships, a Collegelnsider.com Tournament championship and an appearance in the NIT. He was part of a staff that won 104 games from 2011-15.

PRIOR TO MURRAY STATE

Coach McMahon has had success in college basketball since his days as a player at Appalachian

State. Known as an excellent shooter and tough competitor, he played on three Southern Conference regular season title teams in 1998, 1999 and 2000. The Mountaineers won the SoCon Tournament in 2000 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. He played in 90 career games under coach Buzz Peterson and made 124 three-pointers, graduating in 2000..

His coaching career began immediately at Appalachian State as a student assistant under Houston Fancher in 2000-01. He would rejoin Peterson's staff as a student coach at Tennessee before returning to ASU in 2002, where he stayed until the end of the 2009-10 season. A year at UNC Wilmington (2010-11) as assistant coach set the stage for his journey to Murray State, starting first as an assistant in the 2011-12 season and then as head coach prior to the 2015-16 season.

Like his time at Murray State, McMahon coached some outstanding talent in the early stages of his coaching career, including Southern Conference POY Donald Sims as well as all-league picks Jeremy Clayton and D.J. Thompson.

At UNCW, he recruited Adam Smith, a Parade All-America Second-Team selection.

Coach McMahon and his wife Mary, a former standout for the Furman women's basketball team, have three children – Maris, Mason and Mabry.

A NEW DAY FOR LSU BASKETBALL

What all began in 1909 now begins its 115th season of play as LSU Basketball enters a new age under new Coach Matt McMahon. The proven winner from Murray State has had to build a roster completely from scratch as players after the 2021-22 season left for NBA drreams, end of eligibility and the transfer protal. As listed above in some 46 days, Coach McMahon has been able to rebuild his roster from 0 to 17 players which includes 13 scholarship players and four walk-ons. Three players on scholarship returned to be a part of this new day of Tiger basketball -- Mwani Wilkinson, Justice Williams and Adam Miller. Miller is the only one that didn't play last year, having torn an ACL just prior to the team's exhibition contest a year ago.

So after a combined 26 years of Dale Brown and John Brady, Matt McMahon will be the fourth LSU Basketball head coach in the last 15 seasons.

TIGERS PICKED EIGHTH IN SEC

The media panel of regional and national media picked the TIgers eighth in the preseason standings poll announced at SEC Tipoff in October. The selections by thte media:

1. Kentucky; 2. Arkansas; 3. Tennessee; 4 Auburn; 5 Alabama; 6 Texas A&M; 7 Florida; **8 LSU;** 9. Ole Miss; 10. Mississippi State; 11. Missouri; 12 Vanderbilt; 13 Georgia; 14 South Carolina

KJ Williams, last year's OVC Player of the Year, was selected second-team preseason All-SEC in the same balloting.

THE SCHEDULE

And with the selection announcements, it is now official what everyone already knew that the Tigers will start with one of the most difficult opening schedules that LSU has ever faced in the SEC.

In the first eight games of league play, the TIgers will face the seven teams predicted in front of them, including two with second selection Arkansas.:

TONIGHT'S OPPONENT

Kansas City dropped its opening game on Monday night, 59-56, at home to Lincoln (Mo.). Kansas City led the game, 35-26 at the half, but could not hold the lead in the final minutes.

Shemarri Allen led the Roos with 14 points, five rebounds, four assists, with ALlen David Mukeba Jr adding 13 points and 12 boards. RayQuawndis Mitchell also had 13 points.

The Roos new coach is a veteran on the bench in Marvin Menzies with more than 30 years of college coaching experience, 246 wins as a head coach and five NCAA Tournament appearances at New Mexico State and UNLV.

THE MURRAY STATE GUYS

Obviously, there is the head coach, Matt McMahon who spent the last seven years as head coach there and time before that as a member of the coaching staff. He has 154 wins as head coach, three NCAA appearances (two in round of 32) and last season 31 wins and 18-0 in the OVC. McMahon, in building the LSU roster for 2022-23, brought three players (KJ Williams, Justice Hill, Trae Hanibal) with him to Baton Rouge who were prominent parts of the success of last season:

51.4% of Murray State's scoring last season 40.0% of Murray State's rebounding last season 56.0% of Murray State's assists last season

KJ Williams, who was the OVC Player of the Year, averaged 18.0 points, 8.4 rebounds in 2021-22, making 53.8 percent of his field goal attempts (245-455) ... He has started all 60 games over the last two years (90-of-124 over his four years at Murray State) and for four years has made 676-of-1190 field goal attempts (56.8 percent) and 82-of-231 three-pointers (35.5%). In four years he has scored 1,667 points and 888 rebounds, certainly on pace to be a 2,000-point scorer and a 1,000-rebound guy time his career is over.

Justice (Juice) Hill, played two years at Murray State following a junior college year and last season averaged 10.1 points, 2.2 rebounds and averaged 5.1 assists this past season. He started all 34 games last season and was 63-of-176 from distance (35.8 percent) and played an average of 31.2 minutes a contest last season.

Trae Hannibal started just one game a year ago but averaged almost 22 minutes a game for the Racers, averaging 9.2 points and 5.1 rebounds a game. Hannibal made 108-of-208 field goal attempts. He is familiar with the SEC, having played for South Carolina during the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons.

NOT THE FIRST TIGER FROM CLEVELAND, MISSISSIPPI

KJ Williams, who hails from Cleveland, Mississippi, is not the first player with excellent credentials from that town of some 12,000 population. Johnny O'Bryant III had a three-year college career at LSU (2011-14), and at the time was one of just 14 LSU players to score 1,000 points and grab 700 rebounds. He was a two-time first-team All-SEC selection.

O'Bryant III played for three NBA teams after leaving LSU and continued to play in foreign leagues, including as late as last month in the Philippines.

I'VE SEEN THIS GUY IN THE PMAC BEFORE

If you are speaking of Kendal Coleman, then yes you have. For the last two years he played for the Northwestern State Demons and this past season he earned first team All-Southland Conference honors, averaging a double double of 15.4 points and 10.0 rebounds a contest. He had 17 double doubles last season to rank 10th nationally in that category (18 for his two years) ... In fact, one of those double ups came in December 2021 in the Maravich Center when the Demons came to Baton Rouge. Coleman, a native of Shreveport, had 16 points and 13 rebounds.

HE'S THE LSU VETERAN AMONG SCHOLARSHIP PLAYERS

Mwani Wilkinson elected to come back to the LSU program after briefly entering the transfer portal following the 2021-22 season. He is the veteran scholar-ship returnee, having been a part of the Tiger team in both 2020-21 and 2021-22. He has been a part of two NCAA teams and a team that went to the finals of the SEC Tournament in 2021.

Wilkinson, from Las Vegas, has started 44-of-61 games over his two seasons, including 30-of-34 last season as the one starter returning for the Tlgers this season. He averaged 4.0 points and 3.0 rebounds this past season with 41 steals and 25 made three-pointers. He averaged 24.2 minutes a game.

IS HE READY TO GO FINALLY?

It has been a frustrating year for Adam Miller, who came to LSU with high expectations following a strong freshman year at Illinois. But in the week prior to the team's charity exhibition against Nicholls State at the end of October 2021, Miller tore his ACL and was forced to miss the entire 2021-22 season. Like the remainder of the Tiger players of that team with eligibility remaining, he entered the portal, but Coach McMahon was able to get him to stay at LSU and after medical clearance, appears to be ready to play his first counting basketball game at LSU.

Miller started all 31 games in the 2020-21 season at Illinois, averaging 8.3 points and 2.8 rebounds, while playing 25.5 minutes a game. He made 52 three pointers (shooting 34.0%).

A WELL BALANCED COACHING STAFF

One of the first things that Coach Matt McMahon did when he came to LSU was put together a high quality staff and he reached out to several different avenues to put together a quality group that has had success in helping put together this roster and now working with the players on the court.

Assistant Coach -- Casey Long -- Part of Matt McMahon's staff over the last five seasons ... Native of Leesville, Louisiana.

Assistant Coach -- Ronnie Hamilton -- Knows SEC with last four years on the Ole Miss coaching staff ... Also stops at The Citadel, Tulane, Houston, Middle Tennessee St

Assistant Coach -- Cody Toppert -- Previously an assistant coach at Memphis ... Also head coach in the G-League and assistant for the Phoenix Suns. Chief of Staff -- Tim Kaine -- Assistant Coach at Murray State last seven seasons ... Some 20 years of experience on college coaching staffs.

Special Asst. to HC -- Tasmin Mitchell -- One of the most popular former Tigers ... Player on two SEC title teams, one NCAA Final Four team ... Sixth year on LSU staff

Director to Player-Development -- Ronrico White -- Something very important to Coach McMahon ... Three years at Murray ... Tennessee All-America Tony White his dad.

Director of Recruiting -- Jeff Moore -- Years of college experience, including last 16 seasons at Northwestern State ... Louisiana native from Lake Arthur. **Strength & Conditioning -- Briant Puckett --** Spent last two years at Murray State bringing his innovative ideas now to the Tiger program.

AGAINST THE OPENING OPPONENT

This will be the first meeting between LSU and Kansas City in basketball. The Roos will have a game in hand when they come to Baton Rouge, hosting Lincoln on Nov. 7 before the game against LSU on Wednesday, Nov. 9. The team was picked sixth in the Summit in the preseason poll. The Roos enter their first year under Head Coach Marvin Menzies, who boasts five NCAA Tournament appearances in his coaching career. The team has 14 newcomers this year, including 11 freshmen. Menzies has more than 30 years coaching experience and 246 head coaching victories at New Mexico State and UNLV.

OPENING HOMESTAND

LSU starts with three home games against Kansas City (Nov. 9), Arkansas State (Nov. 12) and UNO (Nov. 17). The Tigers will be trying to win a pre-conference tournament for the second straight year when LSU takes part in the Cayman Islands Classic, Nov. 21-23. LSU will play Illinois State on Nov. 21, either Western Kentucky or Akron on Nov. 22 and then one of four teams -- Nevada, Tulane, Kansas State or Rhode Island -- on the final day (Nov. 23).

The start time for the Arkansas State game is now also decided now that the networks have decided the start time for the LSU at Arkansas FB game the same day. The LSU basketball game will tip at 5 p.m.

Tickets for the non-conference games are available at LSUTix.net and season tickets still remain on sale as well.

IT WAS QUITE AN OPENER A YEAR AGO FOR LSU

It wasn't that much of a story on November 9, 2021 that LSU defeated ULM, 101-39, but it was the shooting night that senior Darius Day had against the Warhawks. On a night when LSU made 12 three-pointers, Days made 8-of-9 from distance and 11-of-13 from the field to score 30 points in 22 minutes to lead LSU in scoring in the opener.

FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE

Last year, LSU was 16-1 when opponents shot under 40 percent and the Tigers are 52-2 since the start of the 2017-18 season when opponents shoot under 40 percent.

However, LSU was 6-10 last year when opponents shoot 40 percent or better from the field.

Offensively, the Tigers have won the last 14 games when shooting 50 percent or more in a game and LSU is 101-9 in the last 110 games when LSU shot 50 percent or better since the start of the 2007-08 season.

ITS A FATHER AND SON THING

There are a couple of guys who knows something about the Southeastern Conference because their fathers played in the league with good success. We've mentioned Director of Player Development Ronrico White whose dad, Tony, was an All-America at Tennessee. Tony White played from 1983 to 1987 at Tennessee.

Then there is freshman Jalen Reed from Jackson, Mississippi, whose dad, Justin, was an All-America at Ole Miss and the SEC Freshman of the Year in 2001. Justin Reed was an All-SEC selection in each of his four years at Ole Miss, guiding the Rebels through two NCAA Tournament wins en route to a first ever "Sweet Sixteen" appearance for the program.

NEW LOCATION, SAME BROADCAST DUO

They've put up with each other for the last five seasons and now the Voice of the Tigers Chris Blair and former LSU Basketball coach John Brady will again be courtside to call the contests. Patrick Wright will fill in where necessary when there are conflicts in the non-conference schedule. The network broadcast location will be new after the remodel of the floor area so Blair and Brady will move to the scorer's table along with the visiting team's radio crew as well. The broadcasts

begin 30 minutes before tip time followed by a 30 minute post-game show that will feature an interview with Head Coach Matt McMahon.

Also back this year for many of the home non-conference games that are not picked up for over-theair SEC Network coverage, will be Lyn Rollins and Victor Howell to call the games on the streaming SECN+ service. Three of the games will feature a simulcast with the LSU Radio Network crew (Arkansas State, UT-Arlington and NC Central).

52 YEARS IN THE PMAC

The Tigers open the 52nd season of play in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, originally know as the LSU Assembly Center until 1988 when the building was renamed by government legislation followed by the untimely death of the star LSU player.

The Maravich Center is the fourth oldest continuous basketball arena in the league having hosted its first game in January 1972. Memorial Gym at Vanderbilt opened in 1952, Stegeman Coliseum at UGA in 1964 and Coleman Coliseum at Alabama opened in 1968.

LSU was 15-2 a year ago in the building and in 806 games the Tigers have an on court record of 605-201 (75.1%) ... In non-conference games, LSU is 323-44 (88.0%).

GAME TIME SET FOR SATURDAY

With the football kickoff set at Arkansas for 11 a.m. this Saturday (Nov. 12), the Tigers and Arkansas State will play now at the Maravich Center at 5 p.m. that afternoon. Tickets are available at the LSU Athletic Ticket Office and at LSUTix.net. The game will be broadcast on the LSU Sports Radio Network and streamed on SECN+.
