1st Year at LSU · 8th Year as a Head Coach

When Matt McMahon stepped to the podium for the first time as the 25th LSU men's basketball head coach he listed the core values of his coaching career and his teams.

"Hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy."

Those words are now the cornerstone of LSU Basketball as it moves into a new era as a very successful head coach begins to reshape the program in his image.

The image was on display during the past seven years at Murray State University where the Racers posted a record of 154-67, a .697 winning percentage. He led Murray State to 93 OVC regular-season wins, winning 75 percent of league games.

He has also coached multiple all-Americans and all-league players such as Ja Morant who was named NBA Rookie of the Year in 2020.

The Racers won regular season league titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2022 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2018, 2019 and 2022 (the 2020 appearance was canceled by the pandemic).

Since the native of Oak Ridge, Tennessee, became the third-youngest rookie among D1 coaches in 2015, McMahon has continued a steady move forward with a reputation for developing talent both as an assistant and head coach. He has become known nationally as an excellent recruiter and he is among the best in the nation in the area of player development and game planning.

In his final season at Murray State in 2021-22, McMahon coached OVC Player of the Year KJ Williams and two other recipients of first-team honors (Tevin Brown, Justice Hill). In addition, McMahon was named the league's Coach of the Year.

Two of those players, Williams and Hill, are now at LSU.

Williams, who ranked 12th nationally in 3-pointers made (94), became the third Murray State player to score 1,500 points and grab 800 rebounds. Hill took over point guard duties in a Racer program known for good guards, leading Murray State in assists in 19 games with a plus-101 margin in assists to turnovers.

McMahon's Racers, picked third in the OVC preseason poll, were just the sixth team in league history to go undefeated and the first to do it in an 18-game conference schedule. Murray State then won the two league tournament games to advance to the NCAA Tournament where, as a No. 7 seed, the Racers defeated San Francisco to advance to the round of 32.

The 2021-22 team was one of seven teams to win 30 or more games that season and led the nation in win percentage at 91.2 percent (31-3). The Racers were ranked No. 20 in the final AP poll and No. 22 in the Ferris Mowers Coaches Poll

McMahon was the first MSU coach to have

three seasons of 25 or more wins and was one of just three Murray State coaches to have four 20-win seasons.

Although the 2019-20 season was called early because of the pandemic, it marked the third year in a three-year run when Coach McMahon led the Racers to three-straight OVC regular season championships (2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20) and two consecutive OVC Tournament titles (2017-18, 2018-19).

Coach McMahon's commitment to defense showed in those years as the Racers ranked as the league leader twice in defensive field goal percentage and each of the three seasons the team led the league in defending the 3-point shot

The 2018-19 team won 28 games and made its mark in the NCAA Tournament when the 12th-seeded Racers won their fourth all-time tourney game by defeating No. 5 seed Marquette. That season is when Morant stepped to the forefront at Murray State.

He was named the OVC POY, leading Division I in assists and earning first-team all-America honors from the USBWA. In the NCAA Tournament win over Marquette, Morant posted a triple double of 17 points, 11 rebounds and 16 assists as he became the eighth player to record a triple double in the tournament.

He was drafted second overall in the 2019 NBA draft by the Memphis Grizzlies.

In 2017-18, McMahon's team won 26 games and the OVC regular season and tournament championship, sending the Racers to what was at that time the school's 16th NCAA Tournament.

Prior to being named head coach, he was a key part of Coach Steve Prohm's staff as assistant at Murray State as the Racers won a pair of Ohio Valley Conference championships, a Collegelnsider.com Tournament championship and an appearance in the NIT. He was part of a staff that won 104 games from 2011-15.

PRIOR TO MURRAY STATE

Coach McMahon has had success in college basketball since his days as a player at Appalachian

State. Known as an excellent shooter and tough competitor, he played on three Southern Conference regular season title teams in 1998, 1999 and 2000. The Mountaineers won the SoCon Tournament in 2000 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. He played in 90 career games under coach Buzz Peterson and made 124 three-pointers, graduating in 2000..

His coaching career began immediately at Appalachian State as a student assistant under Houston Fancher in 2000-01. He would rejoin Peterson's staff as a student coach at Tennessee before returning to ASU in 2002, where he stayed until the end of the 2009-10 season. A year at UNC Wilmington (2010-11) as assistant coach set the stage for his journey to Murray State, starting first as an assistant in the 2011-12 season and then as head coach prior to the 2015-16 season.

Like his time at Murray State, McMahon coached some outstanding talent in the early stages of his coaching career, including Southern Conference POY Donald Sims as well as all-league picks Jeremy Clayton and D.J. Thompson.

At UNCW, he recruited Adam Smith, a Parade All-America Second-Team selection.

Coach McMahon and his wife Mary, a former standout for the Furman women's basketball team, have three children – Maris, Mason and Mabry.

A NEW DAY FOR LSU BASKETBALL

What all began in 1909 has now begun its 115th season of play as LSU Basketball enters a new age under Coach Matt McMahon. The proven winner from Murray State has had to build a roster completely from scratch as players after the 2021-22 season left for NBA dreams, end of eligibility and the transfer portal. As listed above in some 46 days, Coach McMahon has been able to rebuild his roster from 0 to 17 players which includes 13 scholarship players and four walk-ons. Three players on scholarship returned to be a part of this new day of Tiger basketball -- Mwani Wilkinson, Justice Williams and Adam Miller. Miller is the only one that didn't play last year, having torn an ACL just prior to the team's exhibition contest a year ago.

So, after a combined 26 years of Dale Brown and John Brady, Matt McMahon is the fourth LSU Basketball head coach in the last 15 seasons.

TIGERS PICKED EIGHTH IN SEC

The media panel of regional and national media picked the TIgers eighth in the preseason standings poll announced at SEC Tipoff in October. The selections by the media:

1. Kentucky; 2. Arkansas; 3. Tennessee; 4 Auburn; 5 Alabama; 6 Texas A&M; 7 Florida; **8 LSU;** 9. Ole Miss; 10. Mississippi State; 11. Missouri; 12 Vanderbilt; 13 Georgia; 14 South Carolina

KJ Williams, last year's OVC Player of the Year, was selected second-team preseason All-SEC in the same balloting.

THE SCHEDULE

And with the selection announcements, it became official what everyone already knew that the Tigers will start with one of the most difficult opening schedules that LSU has ever faced in the SEC.

In the first eight games of league play, the Tigers will face the seven teams predicted in front of them, including two with second selection Arkansas.:

RECAP: The Tigers won its second consecutive game, holding Arkansas State scoreless for some 7 minutes after the Red Wolves had cut LSU's lead down to just two points, 45-43, with 9:58 to go in the second half ... LSU scored the next 11 points to go up 56-43 with just 2:50 to play in the game ... LSU shot 39.2 percent for the game (39.2%), but for the second straight game made 8 treys (8-20, 40.0%) ... Arkansas State shot 38.6 percent for the game, but just 5-of-25 from the arc. For the second straight game, Adam Miller hit four treys and finished with 26 points, while KJ Williams added 15 and Justice Hill 11. In a stat oddity, those three

players were the only ones to make field goals for LSU ... The game also marked the first time LSU trailed this season, behind 10-9, for 1:02 in the early going.

TONIGHT'S OPPONENT

UNO comes to town with a 1-1 record after an 89-53 loss at Butler and a 65-63 win at Lakefront Arena last Saturday over St. Francis of Illinois. Jordan Johnson and Khaleb Wilson-Rouse each scored 14 points to lead the Privateers. For the game UNO shot 35.5 percent (22-of-62) with three treys and 15-of-26 at the free throw line. UNO scored 28 points off St. Francis turnovers.

Mark Slessinger is in his 12th season as the head coach of UNO.

UNO and LSU have met 16 previous times since 1977 with LSU holding a 12-4 advantage in the series. LSU leads in Baton Rouge, 8-3. UNO won the first meeting in 1977 in Baton Rouge, 73-69. The teams last met on Dec. 3, 2019 with LSU winning, 90-54. LSU has won six consecutive meetings, dating back to 2002.

DOUBLE DOUBLES

Might as well add to the total on opening night. Forward KJ Williams made his first game at LSU a good one with his 28th career double double of 13 points and 14 rebounds. Williams had 10 boards entering the final 25 seconds of the first half and six of his 14 were offensive.

Williams also tied his career college high for the seventh time of three blocks in the contest. Williams is tied for fourth in the league entering the week among active players in career double doubles.

Williams added 15 points in the win over Arkansas State to averaged 14.0 points and 9.0 rebounds through the first two games.

HILL AT THE POINT

Justice Hill, like Williams, came to LSU from Murray State, giving LSU a true point guard to run the LSU offense this season.

Hill had seven assists in the opening game and added 11 points and three assists in the second game against Arkansas State.

Hill is averaged 12.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists early on. He has a 10-4 assist-to-turnover ratio. He last year had 173 assists to 65 turnovers and so far in his Division I career the senior has 276 assists and 113 turnovers.

MORE ON WILLIAMS, HILL AND MURRAY STATE TIES

Obviously, there is the head coach, Matt McMahon who spent the last seven years as head coach there and time before that as a member of the coaching staff. He now after Saturday has 156 wins as head coach, three NCAA appearances (two in round of 32) and last season 31 wins and 18-0 in the OVC. McMahon, in building the LSU roster for 2022-23, brought three players (KJ Williams, Justice Hill, Trae Hannibal) with him to Baton Rouge who were prominent parts of the success of last season:

51.4% of Murray State's scoring last season 40.0% of Murray State's rebounding last season 56.0% of Murray State's assists last season

Williams, who was the OVC Player of the Year, averaged 18.0 points, 8.4 rebounds in 2021-22, making 53.8 percent of his field goal attempts (245-455) ... He started all 60 games over the last two years (90-of-124 over his four years at Murray State) and for his first four years made 676-of-1190 field goal attempts (56.8 percent) and 82-of-231 three-pointers (35.5%). In four years, he scored 1,667 points and 888 rebounds, certainly on pace to be a 2,000-point scorer and a 1,000-rebound guy time his career is over.

(Juice) Hill, played two years at Murray State following a junior college year and last season averaged 10.1 points, 2.2 rebounds and averaged 5.1 assists this past season. He started all 34 games last season and was 63-of-176 from distance (35.8 percent) and played an average of 31.2 minutes a contest last season.

Trae Hannibal started just one game a year ago but averaged almost 22 minutes a game for the Racers, averaging 9.2 points and 5.1 rebounds a game. Hannibal made 108-of-208 field goal attempts. He is familiar with the SEC, having played for South Carolina during the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons.

Hannibal drew five fouls against Kansas City (11/9) and was 5-of-9 at the line with seven points and eight rebounds. Against Arkansas State he was 4-of-5 at the line and had two assists and three steals.

ADAM MILLER

He hadn't played in a counting regular season game since March of 2021 when Illinois played its final game of the 2020-21 season. He transferred to LSU but tore his ACL prior to the team's exhibition game and missed the entire 2021-22 season. He was medically cleared during the summer for a full go this season and Tiger fans couldn't be happier.

Miller hit 4-of-9 treys and scored 18 points against Kansas City in the Nov. 9 opener, and then on Saturday, Miller hit 4-of-9 treys again in a 26-point effort against Arkansas State. Miller finished two points off his Illinois scoring high.

Miller has started all 33 games he has played in (31 at Illinois), averaging 8.3 points at Illinois. After two games at LSU, he averaging 22.0 points, hitting 15-of-29 overall from the field, 8-of-18 from the arc and 6-6 from the free throw line.

NOT THE FIRST TIGER FROM CLEVELAND, MISSISSIPPI

KJ Williams, who hails from Cleveland, Mississippi, is not the first player with excellent credentials from that town of some 12,000 population. Johnny O'Bryant III had a three-year college career at LSU (2011-14), and at the time was one of just 14 LSU players to score 1,000 points and grab 700 rebounds. He was a two-time first-team All-SEC selection.

O'Bryant III played for three NBA teams after leaving LSU and continued to play in foreign leagues, including as late as last month in the Philippines.

I'VE SEEN THIS GUY IN THE PMAC BEFORE

If you are speaking of Kendal Coleman, then yes you have. For the last two years he played for the Northwestern State Demons and this past season he earned first team All-Southland Conference honors, averaging a double double of 15.4 points and 10.0 rebounds a contest. He had 17 double doubles last season to rank 10th nationally in that category (18 for his two years) ... In fact, one of those double ups came in December 2021 in the Maravich Center when the Demons came to Baton Rouge. Coleman, a native of Shreveport, had 16 points and 13 rebounds.

In two games, Coleman has played 13 minutes with four rebounds in an LSU uniform.

THE LSU VETERAN SCHOLARSHIP PLAYER HAD A GOOD OPENER

Mwani Wilkinson elected to come back to the LSU program after briefly entering the transfer portal following the 2021-22 season. He is the veteran scholarship returnee, having been a part of the Tiger team in both 2020-21 and 2021-22. He has been a part of two NCAA teams and a team that went to the finals of the SEC Tournament in 2021.

Wilkinson had a good opening night (11/9) for the Tigers with nine points making 3-of-4 three-pointers, tying his career highs in treys made in a 22-minute start for LSU.

Wilkinson, from Las Vegas, has started 45-of-62 career games, including 30-of-34 last season. He averaged 4.0 points and 3.0 rebounds this past season with 41 steals and 25 made three-pointers. He averaged 24.2 minutes a game.

JALEN REED

The freshman from Jackson, Mississippi has started both games of the young season and has scored eight points with six rebounds in some 45 minutes of playing time. Reed is just 1-of-7 from the field, but 6-of-7 at the free throw line with two blocks.

Reed is the son of SEC star Justin Reed, who played at Ole Miss.

ASSISTS TO BASKETS

The Tigers had 24 made baskets and 16 assists on those baskets during the opening contest (66.7%). LSU was nine assists on 12 baskets in the opening 20 minutes (75%) and 7-of-12 in the second half.

Justice Hill had seven assists and four other players (Wilkinson, Miller, Hannibal, J. Williams) had two each with Jalen Reed getting the other one. LSU had nine assists on 20 baskets against Arkansas State.

TURNOVERS

One thing Coach McMahon would like to cut down after two games is turnovers with 15 against Kansas City (11/9) and 13 more against Arkansas State (11/12). While LSU has committed 28 turnovers in the first two games, LSU has forced 32 in the opening two games.

SHOT CLOCK VIOLATIONS

Last year, LSU was the Division I leader in shot clock violations drawn according to @CBBAnalytics with 38, four more than Richmond and Virginia in college basketball.

So far, LSU has drawn two in each of the first two game – two in the first half against Kansas City (11/9) and then one each in each half against Arkansas State (11/12)

ELEVEN PLAY IN OPENER; DOUBTFUL NORM FOR TIGERS

The Tigers played 11 players in the opening 20 minutes of the opener against Kansas City (11/9), but as Coach McMahon has said before in media sessions and again after the game, his mantra was that he preferred to play an eight-man rotation on a regular basis.

Coach McMahon and the Tigers were forced to go to the 11-man rotation when foul trouble hit LSU in the opening 20 minutes. LSU was called for 23 fouls in the opening contest and Kansas City shot 27 free throws.

The Tigers did play 11 players again against Arkansas State (11/12), but Shawn Phillips and Tyrell Ward only played in the first half and Kendal Coleman only saw action in the second half. For Ward, it his first action as an LSU Tiger.

A WELL-BALANCED COACHING STAFF

One of the first things that Coach Matt McMahon did when he came to LSU was put together a high-quality staff and he reached out to several different avenues to put together a group that has had success in helping put together this roster and now working with the players on the court:

Assistant Coach -- Casey Long -- Part of Matt McMahon's staff over the last five seasons ... Native of Leesville, Louisiana.

Assistant Coach -- Ronnie Hamilton -- Knows SEC with last four years on the Ole Miss coaching staff ... Also stops at The Citadel, Tulane, Houston, Middle Tennessee St.

Assistant Coach -- Cody Toppert -- Previously an assistant coach at Memphis ... Also head coach in the G-League and assistant for the Phoenix Suns.

Chief of Staff -- Tim Kaine -- Assistant Coach at Murray State last seven seasons ... Some 20 years of experience on college coaching staffs.

Special Asst. to HC -- Tasmin Mitchell -- One of the most popular former Tigers ... Player on two SEC title teams, one NCAA Final Four team ... Sixth year on LSU

Director to Player-Development -- Ronrico White -- Player Development is something very important to Coach McMahon ... Three years at Murray ... Tennessee All-America Tony White his dad.

Director of Recruiting -- Jeff Moore -- Years of college experience, including last 16 seasons at Northwestern State ... Louisiana native from Lake Arthur. **Strength & Conditioning -- Brian Puckett --** Spent last two years at Murray State bringing his innovative ideas now to the Tiger program.

The Tigers will be trying to start 3-0 on the young season for the second consecutive year.

VS. LOUISIANA SCHOOLS

The Tigers will be looking to continue its current winning streak against Louisiana schools against UNO Thursday night, having last lost to a state school on Nov. 16, 2010 against Nicholls, 62-53. Since then, LSU has won 26 straight games against Louisiana universities. The present streak:

FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE

Last year, LSU was 16-1 when opponents shot under 40 percent and has held Kansas City to 32.8 percent and Arkansas State to 38.6 percent in the first two games. The Tigers are 54-2 since the start of the 2017-18 season when opponents shoot under 40 percent.

However, LSU was 6-10 last year when opponents shoot 40 percent or better from the field. Offensively, the Tlagers have won the last 14 games when shooting 50 percent or more in a game and LSU is 101-9 in the last 110 games when LSU shot 50 percent or better since the start of the 2007-08 season

ITS A FATHER AND SON THING

There are a couple of guys who knows something about the Southeastern Conference because their fathers played in the league with good success.

We've mentioned Director of Player Development Ronrico White whose dad, Tony, was an All-America at Tennessee. Tony White played from 1983 to 1987 at Tennessee.

Then there is freshman Jalen Reed from Jackson, Mississippi, whose dad, Justin, was an All-America at Ole Miss and the SEC Freshman of the Year in 2001. Justin Reed was an All-SEC selection in each of his four years at Ole Miss, guiding the Rebels through two NCAA Tournament wins en route to a first ever "Sweet Sixteen" appearance for the program.

SPEAKING OF FATHER AND SON DUOS

Longtime LSU men's basketball fans will remember Baton Rouge product Howard "Hi-C" Carter who was a part of the 1981 NCAA Final Four team for Coach Dale Brown and the Tigers.

This week the final roster was named for the 2022 World Cup, the every four-year soccer event which begins Sunday in Qatar. On that roster is Carter's son, Cameron Carter-Vickers, who was named a defender on the American squad.

Carter-Vickers plays for the Scottish Premiership Club Celtic when not on the American national team. Carter-Vickers mother, Geraldine Vickers is from Essex and met Howard Carter while both were working in Greece

Howard Carter, a third-team Parade All-American while at Redemptorist High School in Baton Rouge, was three times an All-SEC selection at LSU and was the 15th pick in the NBA Draft of 1983 by the Denver Nuggets. He played one season for Denver and Dallas and then played nearly a decade in France, eventually taking out French citizenship and playing on the French national team. He finished his playing career in Greece

52 YEARS IN THE PMAC

The Tigers are in their 52nd season of play in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, originally known as the LSU Assembly Center until 1988 when the building was renamed by government legislation followed by the untimely death of the star LSU player.

The Maravich Center is the fourth oldest continuous basketball arena in the league having hosted its

OFF TO THE CAYMAN ISLANDS

LSU will depart on Saturday for the Cayman Islands Classic which is set for Monday through Wednesday in George Town, Cayman Islands.

The Tigers will play the opening game of the event on Monday at 10 a.m. CST against Illinois State. The Tigers will then play either Western Kentucky or Akron at either 10 a.m. or 12:30 p.m. CST. The opponent and start time will be determined after Tuesday's play. The potential opponents on Wednesday are Nevada, Kansas State, Rhode Island and Tulane.

Illinois State is 2-1 and playing Northwestern State in the second of two back-to-back games Thursday night in Normal, Illinois. Illinois State won, 69-67, this past Saturday in Natchitoches.

The games will be broadcast on the affiliates of the LSU Sports Radio Network and streamed by FloSports.

LSU will be trying to win an MTE for the second straight year after winning the Emerald Coast Classic last November by defeating Penn State and Wake Forest.

LSU will be back home for a 2 p.m. game on Sunday, Nov. 27 against Wofford.
