ABOUT THE TIGERS

• Coach **Jay Johnson** enters his second season at the helm of the LSU program this weekend versus Western Michigan ... Johnson has worked 10 seasons as a collegiate head coach, including one season (2005) at Point Loma Nazarene, two seasons (2014-15) at Nevada, six seasons (2016-21) at Arizona and one season at LSU ... he directed Arizona to College World Series appearances in 2016 and in 2021, and the Wildcats finished as the national runners-up in 2016 to Coastal Carolina ... Johnson's 2021 Arizona club also won the Pac-12 conference title, and he was named the league's coach of the year.

• **The 2022 LSU squad posted a 40-22 mark** under Jay Johnson's direction and advanced to the final round of the NCAA Hattiesburg Regional ... the Tigers finished 17-13 in the SEC and placed fourth in the league, marking LSU's first Top 4 conference finish since 2017 ... the '22 Tigers were one of the top offensive teams in the nation, finishing in the Top 3 in the SEC in runs scored (No. 2 – 503), slugging percentage (No. 2 – .516), total bases (No. 2 – 1100); on-base percentage (No. 2 – .404), RBI (No. 2 – 477), home runs (No. 3 – 114), batting average (No. 3 – .289) and hit-by-pitch (No. 1 – 125).

• **The 2023 Tigers, ranked No. 1 in every 2023 preseason poll**, return 11 position players with starting experience and nine pitchers who recorded innings last season ... the roster also features several talented transfers who are capable of making an immediate impact, along with a highly-touted class of true freshmen.

• Four LSU baseball players appear on the Preseason Watch List for Golden Spikes Award, as USA Baseball began the process of identifying the nation's top amateur player for the 2023 season. The Tigers on the watch list are junior centerfielder **Dylan Crews**, junior first baseman **Tre' Morgan**, junior right-handed pitcher/utility player **Paul Skenes** and sophomore third baseman **Tommy White**. Crews, Skenes and White are previous Golden Spikes Award semifinalists. All-American right-handed pitcher **Ben McDonald** is LSU's only Golden Spikes Award winner, capturing the trophy in 1989.

Made a staff-high 30 appearances (one start), posting a 4-3 record and a 4.20 ERA in 40.2 innings with eight walks and 35 strikeouts ... finished No. 4 in the SEC in appearances with 30 ... appeared in all three games of three different SEC regular-season series vs. Texas A&M, at Mississippi State and vs. Missouri ... solid relief outing at Vanderbilt (May 21), allowing six hits but just one run with no walks and four strikeouts ... earned a win in Game 1 of the Alabama series (May 6), working 1.2 scoreless innings with three singles allowed ... appeared in all three games of LSU's three-game sweep of Missouri (April 21-23), recording a win and save; he worked a total of 2.2 scoreless innings versus Mizzou, allowing two hits with no walks and two strikeouts ... made two appearances in the Arkansas series (April 14-16) and recorded six strikeouts in 3.2 innings ... appeared in all three games of the Mississippi State series (April 8-10), posting a 1-0 mark and a 0.00 ERA in three innings with one walk and no strikeouts; fired a total of 40 pitches in the three games ... pitched 1.2 scoreless innings vs. Auburn (April 2), allowing just one hit with three strikeouts ... earned his first career LSU win on March 20, defeating Texas A&M with 1.2 innings of scoreless relief ... limited the Aggies to one hit with no walks and one strikeout in the Tigers' 7-6 victory ... appeared in all three games of the Texas A&M series, working 3.1 innings and giving up one earned run on two hits with two walks and two strikeouts.

No. 1 ranked right-handed pitcher in Texas for Class of 2022 by Perfect Game; played in Perfect Game All-American Classic ... ranked nationally as the No. 23 overall prospect and the No. 5 right-handed pitcher by Perfect Game ... participated in the 2022 MLB Draft Combine ... earned All-American, All-State and District MVP honors during his career ... posted an 18-2 career high school record with 211 strikeouts in 142 innings ... worked 72 innings in his senior season, recording an 8-2 mark and 123 strikeouts ... also batted .430 as a senior with 14 doubles, six triples, 10 homers and 47 RBI.



LSU RANKED NO. 1 IN 2023 PRESEASON POLLS

LSU is ranked No 1 in each of the college baseball preseason polls. The top ranking represents LSU's first appearance at No. 1 in a preseason poll since 2019.

LSU returns six position players that started in a significant number of the Tigers' 62 games last season, including junior centerfielder **Dylan Crews**, a 2023 preseason All-American, the 2022 SEC Co-Player of the Year and a consensus first-team All-American last season.

Crews is joined by several other accomplished veterans like junior first baseman/preseason All-American **Tre' Morgan**, senior outfielder/infielder **Gavin Dugas**, junior shortstop **Jordan Thompson**, junior outfielder/DH **Brayden Jobert** and sophomore outfielder **Josh Pearson**.

Other position players with starting experience include junior catchers **Alex Milazzo** and **Hayden Travinski**, senior first baseman/DH **Cade Beloso**, sophomore outfielder **Josh Stevenson** and senior infielder **Jack Merrifield**.

The veterans are joined by several talented newcomers, including impact transfers like utility player/pitcher/preseason All-American **Paul Skenes** (Air Force), infielder/preseason All-American **Tommy White** (North Carolina State) and infielder **Ben Nippolt** (Virginia Commonwealth).

A group of skilled LSU true freshmen features infielder **Gavin Guidry**, outfielders **Paxton Kling**, **Mic Paul** and **Zeb Ruddell**, and catchers **Brady Neal**, **Jared Jones** and **Ethan Frey**.

The Tigers' pitching staff boasts eight hurlers that recorded innings last season, including junior right-handers **Ty Floyd**, **Blake Money**, **Bryce Collins**, **Will Hellmers** and **Garrett Edwards**, junior left-hander **Riley Cooper**, and sophomore right-hander **Sam Dutton**. Sophomore Left-hander **Javen Coleman**, who underwent Tommy John surgery last spring, has a chance to be back on the mound later this season.

High-profile transfers like right-handers **Thatcher Hurd** (UCLA) and **Christian Little** (Vanderbilt) are projected to make an immediate impact upon the staff.

The staff features a gifted crew of true freshmen pitchers that includes left-handers **Griffin Herring**, **Nic Bronzini** and **DJ Primeaux**, and right-handers **Chase Shores**, **Micah Bucknam** and **Aiden Moffett**. JUCO transfer left-hander **Nate Ackenhausen** will bolster the staff out of the bullpen.

FOUR TIGERS EARN 2023 PRESEASON ALL-SEC HONORS IN A VOTE OF THE LEAGUE COACHES

LSU junior centerfielder **Dylan Crews** and sophomore third baseman **Tommy White** voted to the First-Team All-SEC squad, and junior first baseman **Tre' Morgan** and junior right-handed pitcher/utility player **Paul Skenes** were granted Second-Team All-SEC honors.

Dylan Crews

Crews was voted a 2022 consensus First-Team All-American and the SEC Co-Player of the Year, batting .349 with 11 doubles, four triples, 22 homers, 72 RBI and 73 runs. The Tigers' centerfielder was named a semifinalist last season for the Golden Spikes Award and for the Dick Howser National Player of the Year Award.

He finished the season as the SEC leader in runs scored (73), and he was No. 2 in the league in triples (4), No. 3 in RBI (72), No. 3 in total bases (172), No. 4 in home runs (22), No. 4 in slugging percentage (.691), No. 5 in hits (87), No. 5 in on-base percentage (.463) and No. 8 in walks (42).

Crews, a Longwood, Fla., native, also received 2022 SEC Community Service Team and SEC All-Defensive Team recognition. He played this summer with the U.S. Collegiate National Team, helping lead Team USA to a bronze medal at Honkbalweek Haarlem in the Netherlands.

Tommy White

White, a product of St. Pete Beach, Fla., transferred to LSU after an incredible 2022 freshman season at North Carolina State, where he was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Freshman of the Year.

White hit .362 last season with 85 hits, 12 doubles, 27 home runs, 74 RBIs and a .757 slugging percentage, setting the NCAA freshman record for homers in a season. He had 26 multi-hit games and 19 multi-RBI outings, and he finished the year on 26-game reached base streak.

Tre' Morgan

Morgan, a 2022 SEC All-Defensive Team selection, hit .324 in 2022 with 18 doubles, one triple, five homers, 54 RBI and 50 runs. The New Orleans, La., native joined Crews this summer as a member of the U.S. Collegiate National Team that claimed the bronze medal at Honkbalweek Haarlem in the Netherlands.

Morgan batted .500 (6-for-12) in the Tigers' three-game sweep at Vanderbilt (May 19-21) with four doubles, three RBI and five runs, and he delivered the game-winning two-out, two-run single in the top of the ninth inning at Mississippi State (April 8), erasing a 2-1 deficit and sparking LSU to a 5-2 victory.

As a true freshman in 2021, Morgan earned Freshman All-America, Second-Team All-SEC and SEC All-Defensive Team recognition.

Paul Skenes

Skenes, who transferred to LSU this season after two years at Air Force, enjoyed an exceptional 2022 season both on the mound and at the plate, earning first-team All-America recognition.

Skenes, a product of Lake Forest, Calif., recorded a 10-3 record, a 2.96 ERA and 96 strikeouts in 85.2 innings (15 starts) for Air Force, limiting opponents to a .224 batting average. He also hit .314 with 10 doubles, 13 homers and 38 RBI. In 2021, Skenes posted a 2.70 ERA while batting .410 with 11 homers and 43 RBI.

THREE LSU PLAYERS RANKED AMONG THE 2023 PERFECT GAME TOP 100 COLLEGE SOPHOMORES

Three LSU baseball players were ranked among the 2023 Top 100 Sophomores by Perfect Game. LSU third baseman **Tommy White** is No. 2 on the list; right-handed pitcher **Thatcher Hurd** is No. 6; and right-handed pitcher **Grant Taylor** is No. 12. Taylor has since suffered an elbow injury and will not pitch for the Tigers this season.

- White, a product of St. Pete Beach, Fla., transferred to LSU after an incredible 2022 freshman season at North Carolina State, where he was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Freshman of the Year. He hit .362 last season with 85 hits, 12 doubles, 27 home runs, 74 RBIs and a .757 slugging percentage, setting the NCAA freshman record for homers in a season. He had 26 multi-hit games and 19 multi-RBI outings, and he finished the year on 26-game reached base streak.

- Hurd, a product of Manhattan Beach, Calif., made nine appearances – including six starts – last season as a true freshman at UCLA. He posted a 2-0 record with a 1.06 ERA and 48 strikeouts in 34 innings while limiting opponents to a .138 batting average. Hurd was the nation's ninth-ranked pitcher and the No. 1 pitcher in the state of California as a senior at Mira Costa High School.



SIX TIGERS LISTED AMONG PERFECT GAME 2023 TOP 100 FRESHMEN

Six LSU baseball players have been named to the 2023 Perfect Game Top 100 Freshmen list.

The freshmen Tigers appearing on the list include catchers **Brady Neal** and **Jared Jones**, right-handed pitchers **Chase Shores** and **Jaden Noot**, outfielder **Paxton Kling** and infielder **Gavin Guidry**. Noot will not pitch this season due to an arm injury.

- Neal, a product of Tallahassee, Fla., played at IMG Academy, and he was selected in the 17th round of the 2022 MLB Draft by the Milwaukee Brewers. He was ranked as the nation's No. 2 catcher and No. 29 overall prospect by Perfect Game.
- Jones, a product of Walton High School in Marietta, Ga., was ranked nationally as Perfect Game's No. 4 catcher and No. 47 overall prospect.
- Shores, who played at Midland (Texas) Lee High School, was ranked as the nation's No. 5 right-handed pitcher and No. 23 overall prospect by Perfect Game.
- Kling, a member of 2021 18U USA National Team, is a product of Central High School in Roaring Springs, Pa., where he was ranked nationally as Perfect Game's No. 6 overall prospect.
- Guidry, a shortstop at Barbe High in Lake Charles, La., was the No. 1 ranked player in Louisiana by Perfect Game. Guidry, also a member of the 2021 18U Team USA National Team, was rated as the nation's No. 13 shortstop and No. 65 overall prospect.

- Morgan, a 2022 SEC All-Defensive Team selection, hit .324 in 2022 with 18 doubles, one triple, five homers, 54 RBI and 50 runs. The New Orleans, La., native joined Crews this summer as a member of the U.S. Collegiate National Team that claimed the bronze medal at Honkbalweek Haarlem in the Netherlands. As a true freshman in 2021, Morgan earned Freshman All-America, Second-Team All-SEC and SEC All-Defensive Team recognition.
- Floyd, a native of Rockmart, Ga., made 16 appearances (10 starts) in 2022, recording a 5-4 mark and a 3.77 ERA in 59.2 innings with 23 walks and 70 strikeouts while limiting opponents to a .199 cumulative batting average. The two-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll made his second career league start on May 20 at Vanderbilt, and he defeated the Commodores by working 5.1 innings and allowing just one run on four hits with no walks and seven strikeouts.
- Little, a native of St. Louis, Mo., has pitched the past two seasons at Vanderbilt, where he made 32 appearances (14 starts) and posted a 4.65 ERA with 95 strikeouts in 81.1 innings. Little was rated in high school as the nation's No. 5 right-handed pitcher by Perfect Game.
- Money, a product of Spring Hill, Tenn., has appeared in 31 games (14 starts) for the Tigers over the past two seasons, recording 88 strikeouts in 89 career innings. Money was voted to the 2022 SEC Academic Honor Roll and the 2021 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll as a mass communication major.
- Thompson, entering his third season in 2023 as LSU's starting shortstop, batted .286 (63-for-220) in 2022 with 14 doubles, six homers, 36 RBI and 54 runs scored. He hit .349 (22-for-63) on the year with runners in scoring position, and he batted .294 (5-for-17) in the NCAA Hattiesburg Regional with two doubles, five RBI and one run scored. Thompson, a product of Chula Vista, Calif., was voted to the 2021 NCAA Eugene Regional All-Tournament Team after hitting .333 (6-for-18) in LSU's drive to the regional title with two doubles and two RBI. He also received Freshman All-SEC recognition in 2021, and he was twice named the league's Freshman of the Week.

DUGAS TO WEAR ESTEEMED JERSEY NO. 8 IN 2023 SEASON

LSU graduate infielder/outfielder **Gavin Dugas** will wear jersey No. 8 for the second consecutive season. The No. 8 jersey is given each season to the upperclassman who exemplifies the spirit of LSU Baseball through his leadership and dedication to the program.

The No. 8 tradition was started by outfielder Mikie Mahtook (2009-11) and has since been continued by first baseman Mason Katz (2012-13), shortstop Alex Bregman (2014-15), outfielder Jake Fraley (2016), second baseman Cole Freeman (2017), outfielder Antoine Duplantis (2018-19), outfielder Daniel Cabrera (2020) and pitcher Matthew Beck (2021).

- Dugas received his LSU degree in sport administration in the spring of 2022. Though hampered by a thumb injury for much of the 2023 season, Dugas played in 39 games (33 starts), batting .306 (33-for-108) with eight doubles, five homers, 25 RBI and 26 runs. He batted .438 (14-for-32) on the year with runners in scoring position and finished No. 5 in the SEC in hit-by-pitch (15).
- He blasted a solo homer in the bottom of the eighth inning of the championship game of the 2022 NCAA Hattiesburg Regional versus Southern Miss, tying the contest at 7-7. He missed four straight SEC series from early April to early May due to the thumb injury but returned to action in the Alabama series on May 7 and 8; started the May 8 game at DH in the leadoff position and reached base five times in six plate appearances with two hits, including a double, three walks and one run scored.
- Dugas, a native of Houma, La., led the SEC in RBI in 2021 with 66, and he was No. 3 in the league in home runs (19), No. 5 in slugging percentage (.641) and No. 8 in total bases (141).
- Dugas, a three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll, batted .295 (65-for-220) in 2021 with 13 doubles, three triples and 54 runs scored. He was voted the Most Valuable Player of the NCAA Eugene Regional, hitting .438 (7-for-16) with one double, two triples, three home runs, six RBI and seven runs scored. He was 2-for-3 with two homers, three RBI and three runs scored in the regional title game win over Oregon.

JAY JOHNSON

LSU BASEBALL HEAD COACH

A proven track record of postseason success, explosive lineups and highly-ranked recruiting classes make LSU's Jay Johnson one of the best college baseball coaches in the nation. He has made a significant impact at every program he's led, and he is one of the most energetic, innovative and focused coaches in America.

Entering his second season as the head coach of the storied, six-time national champion LSU program, Johnson is poised to lead the Tigers to an elite level.

He was named the head coach at LSU on June 25, 2021, after guiding Arizona to the Pac-12 championship and a berth in the College World Series.

"I view this as the opportunity of my lifetime," Johnson said on the day of his LSU hiring, "and I will do everything in my power to have our team playing a brand of baseball that makes everyone at LSU, the Baton Rouge community and the entire state of Louisiana incredibly proud."

In addition to his reputation for developing hitters, Johnson is also considered one of the top recruiters in college baseball. His

impact at LSU was immediate, as Perfect Game ranked the Tigers' November 2021 signing class No. 1 in the nation. Perfect Game, Collegiate Baseball and Baseball America in the fall of 2022 named LSU's combined class of incoming signees and transfers the best in America, signaling tremendous optimism for the Tigers' 2023 season.

The 2022 LSU squad posted a 40-22 mark under Johnson's direction and advanced to the final round of the NCAA Hattiesburg Regional. The Tigers finished 17-13 in the SEC and placed fourth in the league, marking LSU's first Top 4 conference finish since 2017.

The '22 Tigers were led by centerfielder Dylan Crews, who was voted a consensus first-team All-American and the Southeastern Conference Co-Player of the Year. Crews, who is projected to be the No. 1 overall pick in the 2023 MLB Draft, become the first LSU Tiger to earn SEC Player of the Year honors since outfielder Raph Rhymes in 2012.

Johnson also developed LSU third baseman Jacob Berry, the sixth overall pick – and the first college player selected – in

the 2022 MLB Draft by the Miami Marlins; and second baseman Cade Doughty, the second-round choice of the Toronto Blue Jays.

Johnson's first season at LSU featured tremendous SEC road series victories at eighth-ranked Florida; at Mississippi State, the 2021 College World Series champion; and at Vanderbilt, the 2021 CWS runners-up.

The '22 Tigers were one of the top offensive teams in the nation, finishing in the Top 3 in the SEC in runs scored (No. 2 - 503), slugging percentage (No. 2 - .516), total bases (No. 2 - 1100); on-base percentage (No. 2 - .404), RBI (No. 2 - 477), home runs (No. 3 - 114), batting average (No. 3 - .289) and hit-by-pitch (No. 1 - 125).

The architect of college baseball's best offense in 2021, Johnson led Arizona to two College World Series appearances - including a Championship Series berth in 2016 - over five full seasons.

After landing college baseball's No. 4 recruiting class in the fall, Johnson's 2021 Wildcats smashed their way to Omaha in the spring, leading the nation in hits and ranking first in the Pac-12 in runs, hits, doubles, triples, RBI, walks, batting average, on base percentage, slugging percentage, total bases, and extra base hits.

Overall, Johnson's Wildcat teams finished first in the Pac-12 in hits, runs, and on base percentage in four of his five full seasons, while leading the league in slugging percentage, on base percentage, runs per game, and batting average in three seasons. And in each of his final two full seasons, the Wildcats topped the league in hits, walks, runs, runs per game, slugging percentage, on base percentage, and batting average.

When he was hired by Arizona after the 2015 season, Johnson took the reins of a program with a rich tradition and instantly made it richer. In 2016, he became the fifth coach ever - and the first since 1994 - to lead his team to the College World Series finals in his first season. That team slugged its way to Omaha, finishing fifth nationally in hits and leading the conference in walks, doubles, hits, runs, and stolen bases.

Prior to his success at Arizona, Johnson spent two seasons as head coach at Nevada, earning Mountain West Coach of the Year honors in 2015 after leading the Wolfpack to their first-ever conference championship.

Johnson spent 2006 to 2013 as the associate head coach at the University of San Diego, where he spearheaded recruiting efforts and served as the hitting coach. There, Johnson helped sign the nation's No. 1 class in 2008 and No. 2 class in 2010, and USD's lineups topped

the WCC in hitting six times. At USD, Johnson recruited and coached Kris Bryant, who won the Golden Spikes Award and the Dick Howser Award as the nation's top player before the Cubs selected him No. 2 overall in the 2013 MLB Draft.

Johnson's coaching career began at his alma mater, Point Loma Nazarene, where he served as an assistant coach from 2002 to 2004 before accepting the head coaching position in 2005 at 27 years old. He finished his playing career at Point Loma in 2001, hitting .326 as a senior and earning a Gold Glove as the team's starting second baseman.

A native of Oroville, Calif., Johnson becomes the 26th head coach in LSU baseball history, succeeding Paul Mainieri, who retired after the 2021 season. Johnson and his wife Maureen, a former University of Arizona soccer player, were married in 2016.
