### LSU Hosts Grambling in Historic Tiger Stadium Matchup

LSU (0-1) opens its home slate on Saturday when the Tigers host Grambling (0-1) at 6:30 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised/streamed on ESPN+ and SECN+. LSU enters the contest coming off a 45-24 loss to No. 8 Florida State on Sunday, while Grambling dropped a 35-31 decision to Hampton. It's the first-ever meeting between LSU and Grambling in football and only the second time the Tigers have faced an HBCU opponent. Last year, LSU beat Southern, 65-17, in its first contest against an HBCU foe. Grambling is coached by Hue Jackson, the former head coach of the Cleveland Browns and Oakland Raiders. LSU has won 12 straight and 61 of its last 62 games against non-conference opponents in Tiger Stadium. LSU also brings a 35-game winning streak against Louisiana opponents into the Grambling game. LSU hasn't lost to an opponent from Louisiana since dropping a 31-28 decision to Tulane on November 27, 1982 in Tiger Stadium. LSU is 3-1 under Brian Kelly in games following a loss. Against Florida State, the Tigers used 22 players who were seeing their first action in an LSU uniform. That list included 11 true freshmen and 11 transfers. Five of the first-time players started – LB Omar Speights, S Andre' Sam, JACK Ovi Oghoufo, CB Zy Alexander, and WR Aaron Anderson. Sophomore DE Maason Smith returns to action against Grambling after missing all but one series of the 2022 season (injury) and last week's season-opener. In 10 career games, Smith has 19 tackles and 4.0 sacks. He earned Freshman All-America honors in 2021.

### LSU Coach Brian Kelly: Winningest Active Coach In College Football

Brian Kelly enters his second year with the Tigers in 2023 after inheriting a roster with only 39 scholarship players, and quickly turning LSU into a 10-win team in his first season in 2022. Kelly is the most accomplished hire in LSU football history, taking over the program after 12 years and 113 wins at Notre Dame. He's 294-102-2 overall (32 years) and is the winningest active coach (all divisions) in college football. Kelly guided the Tigers to a 10-4 mark with Top 10 wins over Ole Miss and Alabama in 2022. His coaching resume includes 11 10-win seasons at the FBS level (7 at Notre Dame, 3 at Cincinnati, 1 at LSU), along with 14 bowl/CFP playoff appearances and 3 National Coach of the Year honors (2009 at Cincinnati, 2012 and 2018 at Notre Dame). Kelly's record includes a 113-40 mark at Notre Dame, where he's the winningest coach in school history; 34-6 at Cincinnati (4 years), 19-16 at Central Michigan (3 years) and 118-35-2 at Grand Valley State (13 years). He won two Division II National Championships at Grand Valley State.

### QUICK NOTES

- LSU enters the Grambling game having won 12 straight and 61 of its last 62 games against non-conference opponents in Tiger Stadium. Since 2000, LSU has only dropped 2 non-conference home games (UAB, 13-10, in 2000; Troy, 24-21 in 2017). Since the start of the 2000 season, LSU is 64-2 vs. non-conference teams in Tiger Stadium.

- LSU has won 35 consecutive games against Louisiana opponents, including last year's 65-17 victory over Southern in Tiger Stadium. LSU's 35-game Louisiana winning streak dates back to 1983 when the Tigers beat Tulane, 20-7, in the Superdome.

- With 44 career starts, Senior **QB Jayden Daniels** ranks No. 3 among active FBS quarterbacks in games started. He trails only Bo Nix (Oregon) with 48 and Sam Hartman (Notre Dame) with 47. **Daniels** has started 15 straight games at LSU after starting 29 at Arizona State from 2019-21.

- **Daniels** had his LSU-best 411 yards of total offense (347 passing, 64 rushing) against Florida State. It marked his second game as a Tiger with 400 yards of total offense - the other coming in a win over UAB last year (408 total yards - 297 passing, 111 rushing).

- All 5 starters on LSU's offensive line have at least 11 career starts to their credit with **C Charles Turner** leading the way with 15. He's followed by **LT Will Campbell** (14), **RG Miles Frazier** (14), **RT Emery Jones Jr.** (13) and **LG Garrett Dellinger** (11). The group has combined for 67 career starts.

- Junior **WR Brian Thomas Jr.** set career-highs for receptions (7), receiving yards (142) and longest reception (75) against Florida State. **Thomas** was targeted 9 times and had 83 yards after catch. It marked the first 100-yard game of his career.

- Junior **WR Malik Nabers** ran his streak of consecutive

games with a reception to 19 vs. Florida State after hauling in 6 passes for 67 yards. In 26 career games, **Nabers** has caught 5 passes or more 11 times. He led the SEC in receptions in 2022 with 72.

- Sophomore **RB Tre Bradford** scored his first career rushing TD with a 1-yard run vs. Florida State. It was the second career TD for **Bradford**, who last reached the endzone against Florida in December of 2020 on a 4-yard reception.

- Senior **RB Noah Cain** rushed for his 11th touchdown as a Tiger on a 1-yard run vs. Florida State. Dating back to last year, **Cain** has a combined 7 rushing TDs in LSU's last 5 games.

- **Daniels** has rushed and passed for a TD 15 times during his career (6 at LSU, 9 at Arizona State). LSU is 6-0 in games in which he accounts for a rushing and passing TD.

- Oregon State transfer **LB Omar Speights** led LSU in tackles (8) in his first career start for the Tigers. **S Major Burns** added 8 tackles, while **Zy Alexander** had 7 tackles in first career start.

- **CB Duce Chestnut** had 4 tackles, a tackle for a 4-yard loss and an interception in his LSU debut after transferring from Syracuse.

- **P Jay Bramblett** punted 3 times, with 2 being downed inside the 20, including one on the 1-yard line. He averaged 45.0 yards with a long of 65 yards.

- **PK Damian Ramos** kicked a 36-yard field goal as time expired in the first half to give the Tigers at 17-14 lead at halftime. **Ramos** is 11-of-15 on field goals for his career.

- LSU has won 12 straight games when rushing for 200 yards. The Tigers were 6-0 in 2022 when reaching the mark. The last time LSU rushed for 200 yards on lost came at Texas A&M in the 7OT game in 2018 (215 yards).

When Brian Kelly was hired away from Notre Dame in December of 2021, LSU announced at the time that "the search for LSU Football's next championship head coach is over."

The most accomplished hire in program history, Kelly wasted little time in making his impact felt, leading the Tigers to a 10-win season and the SEC Western Division title. Despite inheriting a roster with only 39 scholarship players remaining from the 2021 season, Kelly guided the Tigers to Top 10 wins over Ole Miss and Alabama along with road victories over Auburn, Florida and Arkansas.

The Tigers capped the season with a resounding 63-7 win over Purdue in the Citrus Bowl completing one of the biggest turnarounds in college football a year ago.

Kelly, who has more victories than any active coach in major college football, was named LSU's 34th head football coach on December 1, taking over a program that has won four national championships.

Kelly's 10 wins at LSU in 2022 ran his career win total to 294 in 32 years as a head coach and it marked the 11th time he led a team to 10 or more wins in a season at the FBS level. Overall, Kelly has had teams reach double-figure wins 17 times with his teams winning nine games on five other occasions. His coaching career includes 13 seasons at Grand Valley State, three at Central Michigan, four at Cincinnati, 12 at Notre Dame and one at LSU.

His overall mark of 294-102-2 puts him ahead of Alabama's Nick Saban (285) and North Carolina's Mack Brown (268) on the list of most victories by an active FBS head coach. Only twice during Kelly's 32-year coaching career has he had a team finish below .500.

Kelly is also one of only five active FBS coaches who have guided their programs to multiple undefeated regular seasons since 2009 and he's led teams to one berth in the BCS National Championship Game and to a pair of College Football Playoff appearances. Overall, his teams have appeared in bowl games 14 times.

Prior to taking over at LSU in 2022, Kelly spent 12 years as the head coach at Notre Dame where he became the school's winningest coach with 113 victories, moving past legendary Knute Rockne for the top spot on the list. Kelly left Notre Dame with a 113-40 overall mark and his teams averaged 10 wins a season over his last five years – 54-9 during that span – with Irish.

During his Notre Dame career, Kelly led the Irish to the 2012 BCS national title game as well as College Football Playoff appearances in 2018 and 2020. He was named National Coach of the Year by numerous outlets in 2012 and 2018. He's the only coach to win the Home Depot Coach of the Year Award more than once, and he's done it three times (2009,

2012, and 2018).

In 12 seasons at Notre Dame, Kelly's teams won at least 10 games seven times, including 2021, as the Irish posted an 11-1 mark and were ranked as high as No. 5 in the nation during his final season in South Bend. Kelly's final five seasons at Notre Dame saw the Irish win at least 10 games each year, including a 12-1 mark in 2018 and 11-2 in 2019.

Individually, Notre Dame players claimed eight consensus All-America honors playing for Kelly, while the Irish had players win nine national awards during that span. Kelly's Notre Dame teams produced 55 NFL Draft picks since 2012, including 10 in the first round.

Academically under Kelly, the Irish had eight players earn the prestigious CoSIDA Academic All-America honor, and three were selected as National Football Foundation Scholar-Athletes. As a team, Notre Dame consistently ranked among the nation's top four in the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate.

Prior to joining the Irish, Kelly transformed Cincinnati into a football powerhouse, winning Big East titles in 2008 and 2009. In three years at Cincinnati, the Bearcats won 34 games and appeared in the Orange and Sugar Bowls. In 2007, Kelly led Cincinnati to the school's first-ever 10-win season with a 10-3 mark and a win in the PapaJohns.com Bowl. In his final season at Cincinnati, Kelly's team posted a 12-0 regular season mark and earned a berth to the Sugar Bowl.

Kelly's first Division I head coaching position came in 2004 when he took over at Central Michigan. In three years with the Chippewas, Kelly's teams won 19 games, claimed the Mid-American Conference title in 2006 and appeared in a bowl game for the first time in 12 years.

Kelly's first head coaching job came at Division II Grand Valley State in 1991, a position he held for 13 years. In 13 years at Grand Valley, Kelly won 118 games, won five straight conference titles and made six Division II playoff appearances. He led the Lakers to back-to-back national titles in 2002 and 2003, going 14-0 and 14-1, respectively. He won 41 games during his final three years in Allendale.

A native of Everett, Mass., Kelly was a four-year letterwinner at linebacker and two-time team captain at Assumption College in Worcester, Mass. He graduated from Assumption in 1983 with a degree in political science.

Kelly and his wife Paqui have three children – Patrick, Grace and Kenzel. The Kellys are active in community outreach and have established the Kelly Cares Foundation which has donated nearly \$8 million to support causes related to the fight against breast cancer since its founding in 2008.

### Grambling State Brings Historical Program To Tiger Stadium For First Time

Saturday's historic matchup in Tiger Stadium is the first between LSU and Grambling State. Grambling State is one of college football's prominent programs, winning 15 Black College National Championships and 25 SWAC titles. The most historic and influential coach in all of college football, the late Eddie Robinson served as Grambling's head coach from 1941-1997, winning 408 games, 17 SWAC titles and 9 Black College National Championships. He attended high school at McKinley in Baton Rouge. Its program includes 5 College Football Hall of Famers – Buck Buchanan, Gary "Big Hands" Johnson, Eddie Robinson, Doug Williams and Paul Younger. They also have 4 alumni in the Pro Football Hall of Fame – Willie Brown, Buck Buchanan, Willie Davis and Charlie Joiner. Doug Williams quarterbacked the Redskins to a 42-10 Super Bowl win over the Denver Broncos in January of 1988.

### LSU vs. Louisiana Schools

The Tigers bring a 140-25-8 mark all-time against teams from Louisiana going into the Grambling State game. The Tigers have won 35 straight games against in-state opponents. LSU's last loss to an in-state foe came in 1982 when Tulane posted a 31-28 win over LSU in Tiger Stadium. LSU's record against in-state schools include: 69-22-7 vs. Tulane; 22-0 vs. Louisiana-Lafayette; 19-1 vs. Louisiana Tech; 12-0 vs. Northwestern State; 4-1 vs. Loyola (New Orleans); 4-0 vs. Louisiana-Monroe; 3-1-1 vs. Centenary; 2-0 vs. Louisiana College and Southeastern; 2-0 vs. McNeese State; and 1-0 vs. Southern.

### LSU In Home Openers

Overall, LSU is 102-22-4 in home openers, which includes a 74-20-4 mark in Tiger Stadium. LSU has won 25 of its last 27 home openers dating back to a 35-34 win over Houston in 1996. In that span, the only home opener losses came in a 30-27 OT loss to Tennessee in 2005 and 44-34 loss to Mississippi State in 2019. LSU hasn't lost a "Saturday Night" home opener since dropping a 18-13 decision to Texas A&M in 1994.

### LSU's Non-Conference Tiger Stadium Winning Streak Stands at 12 Games

LSU has won 12 straight and 61 of its last 62 games against non-conference opponents in Tiger Stadium. LSU's last loss against a non-conference foe came in 2017 when Troy beat the Tigers, 24-21 on Sept. 30. Prior to that loss, LSU had won 49 straight non-conference games in Tiger Stadium, which ranks as the third-longest streak in college football history, trailing only Harvard (55 from 1890-1895) and Carlisle (54 from 1901-1915). Before the Troy loss in 2017, LSU's last defeat in Tiger Stadium to a non-conference team came in 2000 against UAB.

### LSU Is 88-13 vs. Non-Conference Teams Dating Back to 2001

Dating back to the 2001 season when LSU captured its first outright SEC title since 1986, the Tigers have done quite well against non-conference opponents, going 88-12 against non-SEC foes during that span. Of the 88 wins, 21 have come against top-25 teams. Of the 12 losses, only five have come during the regular season (2002 at Virginia Tech, 2016 vs. Wisconsin at Lambeau Field, 2017 vs. Troy, 2021 at UCLA, 2022 vs. FSU, and 2023 vs. FSU). The other seven losses came in bowl games (2003 Cotton Bowl vs. Texas; 2005 Capital One Bowl vs. Iowa; 2009 Capital One Bowl vs. Penn State; 2012 Chick-Fil-A Bowl vs. Clemson; 2014 Music City Bowl vs. Notre Dame; 2018 Citrus Bowl vs. Notre Dame; 2022 TaxAct Texas Bowl vs. Kansas State).

### LSU To Face A SWAC Team For Second Time in Grambling State

LSU and Grambling State will meet for the first time on the gridiron on Saturday when LSU hosts GSU in Tiger Stadium. This marks the second time that LSU will face the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC). Grambling State is one of two first-time opponents on LSU's 2023 schedule. The only other opponent LSU is meeting for the first time is Georgia State on Nov. 18 in Tiger Stadium.

### Daniels Has Second 400-Yard Total Offense Game

Senior **QB Jayden Daniels** had his second game with 400-yards of offense against Florida State in the season-opener. **Daniels** finished with 347 passing yards and 64 rushing yards. His 411 yards of offense is the most of his LSU career and bettered his previous mark of 408 set last year against UAB (297 passing, 111 rushing). **Daniels'** 411 yards of offense is the most for a Tiger in a season-opener since

### Daniels Sets LSU Season-Opener Marks for Passing Yards and Total Offense

Senior **QB Jayden Daniels** set a pair of LSU season-opener highs against Florida State. His 347 passing yards were the most in a season-opener in school history, bettering the previous mark of 345 by Myles Brennan against Mississippi State in 2020. His 411 yards of total offense were the most in a season-opener in school history, topping the previous high of 346 set by Max Johnson in the 2021 opener at UCLA.

### Daniels Keeps Adding to His List of LSU Records

**Jayden Daniels**, one of the most dynamic quarterbacks in college football, is back for his second season as the starter for the Tigers after leading LSU to a 10-4 mark and the SEC Western Division title in 2022. A first-team preseason All-SEC by both the media and the SEC Coaches, **Daniels** opened 2023 with 411 yards of total offense (347 passing, 64 rushing) against Florida State. A year ago, **Daniels** set LSU records for rushing yards (875) and rushing TDs (11) by a quarterback. He also became the first player in LSU history to run and pass for TDs in 6 games. **Daniels** was one of only 2 quarterbacks (other was John Ryhs Plumlee of UCF) in FBS to rush for 800 yards (885) and throw for at least 2,500 yards (2,913). Here's a look at some of **Daniels'** notable accomplishments in his 15-games with the Tigers:

### Tigers Have 75-Yard TD Receptions In Consecutive Games

For only the second time in modern day LSU history, the Tigers have scored on 75-yard passing plays in consecutive games. LSU closed out the 2022 season with a 75-yard TD pass from **Garrett Nussmeier** to **Malik Nabers** in the Citrus Bowl vs. Purdue. LSU opened the season with another 75-yard TD pass, this time it was **Jayden Daniels** to **Brian Thomas Jr.** in the fourth quarter against Florida State. Both of those 75-yard TD passes came in the same stadium – Camping World Stadium in Orlando.

### BK and Dietzel Only Coaches In LSU History To Lead Tigers to 10 Wins After Dropping Opener

Last year, **Brian Kelly** joined Paul Dietzel as the only coaches in LSU history to lead their teams to a 10-win season after dropping the season-opener. In 2022, **Kelly** and the Tigers fell to Florida State, 24-23, in New Orleans and then went on to win 10 games, including victories over Ole Miss and Alabama, along with a berth in the SEC Championship Game. In 1961, fifth-ranked LSU fell to unranked Rice, 16-3, in Houston and then reeled off 10 straight victories to go 10-1 overall and win the SEC title. LSU won its 10th game that year in the Orange Bowl, beating No. 7 Colorado, 25-7.

### Brian Kelly's Won At Least 10 Games For Six Straight Seasons; Nation's Third-Longest Active Streak

LSU coach **Brian Kelly** brings a 6-year streak of winning at least 10 games into the 2023 season. In his first year at LSU, Kelly guided the Tigers to a 10-4 mark and the SEC Western Division title. **Kelly's** streak of at least 10 wins goes back to 2017 at Notre Dame when the Irish were 10-3 overall. He followed that with a 12-1 mark in 2018, 11-2 in 2019, 10-2 in 2020, and 11-1 in 2021. His six consecutive seasons of at least 10 wins trails only Nick Saban (15) and Dabo Swinney (12).

### Dual-Threat Daniels

**Jayden Daniels** is one of the most prolific dual-threat quarterbacks in the country. He led LSU with 347 passing yards and 64 rushing yards in LSU's season opener against Florida State. Now in his second season at LSU, **Daniels** has led the Tigers in rushing yards in nine games. It was the most yards he has thrown for at LSU, surpassing 300 yards for the third time as a Tiger. His 411 total yards in the Florida State game marked his most total yardage in a LSU uniform.

### First Play From Scrimmage

When **Jayden Daniels** found **Tre Bradford** for a 55-yard catch-and-run on LSU's first offensive snap of the season, it marked LSU longest season-opening play from scrimmage since 2008 when Charles Scott opened the year with 56-yard run against Appalachian State.

### LSU's Won 12 Straight When Rushing for 200 Yards

LSU goes into the Grambling game riding a streak of 12 consecutive wins when rushing for 200 yards. LSU went 6-0 in 2022 when reaching the 200-yard mark in rushing yards with wins over Southern (230 yards), Mississippi State (207 yards), New Mexico (219 yards), Ole Miss (252 yards), UAB (266), and Purdue in the Citrus Bowl (220). The last time LSU rushed for 200 yards and lost came in the 7 OT contest at Texas A&M on November 24, 2018. LSU rushed for 215 yards in that game and lost 74-72.

### LSU Is 4-2 In Non-Conference Games Under Brian Kelly

LSU is 4-2 against non-conference opponents under second-year head coach **Brian Kelly**. LSU's non-conference victories have come against Southern, New Mexico, UAB and Purdue in the Citrus Bowl, while both defeats came against Florida State at neutral sites (2022 in New Orleans, 2023 in Orlando).

### Wingo To Wear No. 18 In 2023

Junior defensive tackle **Mekhi Wingo** will wear No. 18 for the Tigers this year. He was presented the jersey by head coach **Brian Kelly** following practice on Saturday in Tiger Stadium. "The number 18 has great historical significance with our program," **Kelly** said. "It's a number that has national championship significance with Matt Mauck wearing it in 2003 and leading LSU to its first national title since 1958. He passed it on to Jacob Hester who won a national championship in 2007. "It's worn by a player who represents the traits and spirit associated with a successful program and that's Mekhi." **Wingo** quickly established himself as a leader for the Tigers on and off the field after transferring to LSU prior to the 2022 season. Last year, he earned third-team AP All-America honors as well as being a member of the SEC Football Leadership Council and a nominee for the AFCA Good Works Team. He also was one of three players to represent LSU at SEC Football Media Days in July. In May, Wingo was one of 11 LSU players who traveled to Africa as part of the program's first Study Abroad initiative. "This means a lot to me and I want to thank BJ (Ojulari) for showing me how to properly wear this number," **Wingo** told the team after practice. "I'm going to play my heart out and represent this number and all those who have worn it before me the right way."

### Campbell Awarded No. 7 Jersey; Will Wear Patch On His No. 66 Uniform

Sophomore left tackle **Will Campbell** was awarded the No. 7 jersey for the 2023. **Kelly** presented **Campbell** with his jersey following practice on Saturday in Tiger Stadium. As an offensive lineman, the rules of college football prevent **Campbell** from actually wearing the No. 7 jersey so instead his No. 66 jersey will be accompanied by a No. 7 patch. **Campbell**, a native of Monroe, was a day 1 starter on the offensive line for the Tigers in 2022, becoming the first true freshman in school history to be the everyday starter left tackle. He capped his rookie season earning second-team All-SEC honors as well as being a Freshman All-America. "The (number) 7 has an interesting history that starts with Patrick Peterson," **Kelly** said when presenting **Campbell** his jersey. "He was an outstanding player. Prolific playmakers have worn (number) 7. I wanted to take a spin and make it about Louisiana. That's my spin. This year we wanted to highlight the group that doesn't get much notoriety. We went with Louisiana bred **Will Campbell**. I like the significance of the left tackle because he is a playmaker who must protect the quarterback every play." Outside of Billy Cannon's retired No. 20 jersey, the Nos. 18 and 7 are two of the most iconic LSU football numbers and have been worn by some of the all-time greats in school history.

### Brian Thomas Has Best Game As A Tiger In Season-Opener

Junior **WR Brian Thomas** had his best game as a Tiger in the season-opener against Florida State, setting career-highs for receptions (7) and receiving yards (142). He caught a 75-yard TD pass in the fourth quarter, the longest of his career. It marked the first 100-yard receiving game for **Thomas**. In 26 career games, **Thomas** has 66 receptions for 862 yards and 8 TDs.

### Nabers Adds Another 6-Catch Game

Junior **WR Malik Nabers** caught 6 passes for 67 yards against Florida State. It marked the ninth time in 26 games he's had at least 6 receptions in a contest. Last year, **Nabers** had at least 6 receptions in 7 games, including a career-best 9 for 163 yards and a TD against Purdue in the Citrus Bowl. **Nabers** has caught a pass in 19 straight games dating back to the Arkansas game in 2021. For his career, **Nabers** has 106 receptions for 1,504 yards and 7 TDs.

### The Return of Tre Bradford

Sophomore **RB Tre Bradford** returned to the field after a 2-year absence and made an immediate impact, hauling in a 55-yard reception on the first play of the game against Florida State. **Bradford** scored his first rushing TD as a Tiger in the first quarter, tying the game at 7-7 on a 1-yard run. The TD was the second of his career, and the first since catching a 4-yard TD pass from Max Johnson against Florida in December of 2020.

### Cain Scores 11th LSU Touchdown In Season-Opener

Senior **RB Noah Cain** scored his 11th touchdown as a Tiger when he found the endzone from 1-yard out in the second quarter against Florida State. Cain led all LSU running backs with 10 rushing TDs in 2022. He has now scored a rushing TD in 3 straight games dating back to last year. In his last 5 games, Cain has scored 7 rushing TDs (3 vs. UAB, 1 vs. Georgia, 2 vs. Purdue, 1 vs. Florida State).

### Josh Williams Nominated for NFF Scholar-Athlete Award

Senior running back **Josh Williams** has been nominated for the prestigious Campbell Trophy, the National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Award. **Williams** graduated with a 3.4 grade point average in marketing and is currently pursuing a Master's in business administration. He's a 3-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll. A former walk-on, **Williams** led all LSU running backs in rushing yards with 532 to go along with 6 TDs.

### Three Players from 2019 National Championship Still on Roster

### BK Joined Miles and McElwain As First-Year SEC Coaches To Reach League Title Game

LSU coach **Brian Kelly** joined a small group of only two other SEC coaches to take their team to the league's title game in their first season in the conference last year. Kelly joined Les Miles (2005) and Jim McElwain (2015 at Florida) as the only three first-year SEC coaches to reach the championship game.

### 2022 Tigers: From Cellar to Championship Game In Just One Season Under Brian Kelly

In 2022, LSU joined Arkansas in 1995 and Auburn in 2013 as the only teams to reach the SEC title game a year after finishing last in its division. LSU finished last in the SEC Western Division in 2021 with a 3-5 league mark and advanced to the 2022 SEC Championship Game with a 6-2 conference record. Arkansas was the first to do it, going 2-6 in 1994, followed by a division-winning mark of 6-2 in 1995. Auburn was next to accomplish the feat, going 7-1 in 2013 after finishing last in the SEC West in 2012 with an 0-8 mark.

### 11 Tigers Studied Abroad in Senegal In May

The mission of LSU's football under **Brian Kelly** is to "Graduate Champions". One area **Kelly** has emphasized for the players is to build and identity outside of football. He wants them to be more than just football players and to create a brand and image that compliments what they are doing on the field. As he did for many years at Notre Dame, **Kelly** has implemented a "Study Abroad" program for LSU football players. In its first year, 11 players traveled to Senegal for 10 days in May to have an educational experience outside of the United States. "One of the things that I have tried to do since coming to LSU is to not only set the standards and the process of building a program that graduates champions, but to help our players establish an identity outside of football," **Kelly** said. "To get the opportunity to study abroad is an experience that student-athletes really don't get the chance to do so for our players to be able to participate in this unique educational program is something that I think will have a lifelong impact on them. I want our players to have the opportunity to see things from a different perspective and to really take ownership in their studies and to understand that there's much more out there than just being a football player. The opportunities of being an LSU football player go far beyond the field so I want to use the study abroad program to help them understand that. This is one of those pieces that we can continue to build on as we work with their identity outside of football and they are excited about it."

Football Drops Season Opener to Florida State, 45-24

Fifth-ranked LSU held a 17-14 halftime lead over No. 8 Florida State, but the Seminoles scored 31 unanswered points in the second half to post a 45-24 win over the Tigers. FSU quarterback Jordan Travis threw for 342 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Seminoles to the season-opening victory. Wide receiver Keon Coleman caught nine of Travis' passes for 122 yards and three touchdowns, while wide receiver Jonny Wilson added seven catches for 104 yards. LSU quarterback Jayden Daniels completed 22-of-37 passes for 347 yards and one touchdown, marking his second-highest yardage total in two seasons with the Tigers. Wide receiver Brian Thomas caught seven passes for 142 yards, including a 75-yard TD from Daniels. The Tigers drove to the FSU one-yard line on the opening possession of the game; however, LSU could not convert the 61-yard march into points. Florida State grabbed a 7-0 lead when Travis completed a 40-yard touchdown pass to Coleman midway through the first quarter, but the Tigers quickly answered when running back Tre Bradford capped a 75-yard drive with a one-yard TD plunge. LSU surged ahead with 6:02 remaining in the first half when running back Noah Cain's one-yard dive culminated a 51-yard possession, and the Seminoles tied the contest at 14-14 at the 1:01 mark when Travis connected with Coleman on a 21-yard scoring pass. Daniels led an efficient 67-yard drive over the last minute of the half, and Damian Ramos nailed a 36-yard field goal to give the Tigers a 17-14 advantage at intermission. Florida State placekicker Ryan Fitzgerald tied the game at 17-17 with a 33-yard field goal at the 9:19 mark of the third quarter, and the Seminoles followed with four consecutive touchdown drives to seize control of the game.
