ARMY PREPARES FOR TOUGH TEST VS. #19 LSU

Army (2-4) fell at home to Troy last Saturday, 19-0. It was the first time that Army was shutout at home at Michie Stadium since 2003. A bright spot however was freshman RB Kanye Udoh, who rushed for a season-best 124 yards on 18 carries (6.9 avg.), becoming the first Army freshman to rush over the century mark since Tyrell Robinson rushed for 126 yards vs. Abilene-Christian on 10/3/2020.

LSU (5-2) enters with the second-best total offense in the country averaging 550.4 yards per game and also ranking third in points per game (45.3). LSU is led by its QB Jayden Daniels, a Heisman contender, who is first in the country in passing efficiency (197.1) and third in passing yards (2,420).

This marks the second all-time coaching matchup between Jeff Monken and Brian Kelly as they also met in 2016 when Kelly was coaching Notre Dame, a 44-6 Irish win over Army.

1ST AND 10

- This is the second all-time meeting, between Army-LSU, as they played once before in 1931, with Army winning, 20-0 at West Point.
 Under Coach Jeff Monken, Army has a history of playing major Power-five opponents down to the wire. In 2015, Army lost 20-14 to Penn State. In 2018, Army took the Kyler Murray led #5 Oklahoma Sooners to OT, losing 28-21. The following season in 2019, Army took #7 Michigan to double OT, falling 24-21.
- Army's last win vs. a ranked opponent was defeating #25 Navy in 2016, who was ranked in the CFP poll. Army's last win over an AP-ranked team was in 1972, defeating #19 Air Force.
- Army's last win over a non-service academy-ranked team was in 1968, defeating #16 California, 10-7.
- Army freshman RB Kanye Udoh rushed for a season-best 124 yards on 18 carries (6.9 avg.) vs. Troy (10/14), becoming the first Army freshman to rush over the century mark since Tyrell Robinson rushed for 126 yards vs. Abilene-Christian on 10/3/2020.
- Army has three different players that have recorded two touchdown receptions this season (WR, Isaiah Alston, WR Noah Short, TE Tyson Riley). It is only the second time in Monken's tenure that three different players have each had 2+ receiving touchdowns in a season (2021).
- Army's defense ranks 12th in the FBS in fewest first downs giving up to opponents with 99. Penn State leads the nation with only 67 first downs given up.
- Senior DB Jabari Moore has played in 52 career games, which is currently the second most games played in an Army football behind Greg McGlasker's 54 games played (1973-1977), with data dating back to the 1956 season.
- DB Cam Jones is ranked 39th by PFF in defensive grade for CBs in the country
- LB Leo Lowin leads the Black Knights with 43.0 tackles this season. He has logged two games of 10+ tackles this season and has eight for his career.

NEW COACHES

Drew Thatcher, Offensive Coordinator -- Joins Army from offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Nebraska-Kearney (2019-22). In 2022, guided quarterback TJ Davis to repeat as MIAA Offensive Player of the Year in 2022 as he had 2,506 combined yards over 11 games. The Lopers finished with an 8-3 record and averaged 33 points and 402 yards per game.

Darren Paige, Running Backs -- Spent the last two seasons (2021-22) as the running backs coach at the University of Cincinnati. In 2021, he aided in the development of then junior Jerome Ford, who had one of the best seasons ever for a Cincinnati running back, rushing for 1,319 yards and a school-record-tying 19 touchdowns.

Danny Verpaele, Safeties -- Coached at Kennesaw State (2019-22). Was at Army before serving as a quality control coach for Monken (2014-15).

Justin Weaver, Inside Linebackers -- Was the Head Coach of the United States Military Academy Preparatory School (USMAPS) this past season (2022), and also served as the USMAPS defensive coordinator from 2019-21.

NO. 2 IN THE RECORD BOOKS

With the victory vs. Villanova in 2022, Head Coach Jeff Monken logged his 59th career win at Army West Point, breaking the tie and surpassing the legendary Charles Daly for No. 2 on the Academy's all-time win list. Daly still holds the best win percentage for all Army coaches with over 40 games of coaching at .804.

Head Coach Jeff Monken holds an overall home record of 42-16 with Army since the start of his tenure in 2014.

Monken and the Black Knights are 28-7 at home since the start of the 2018 season.

Even better Army is 18-5 at home since the start of the 2020 season. Army's 18 home wins are tied for 14th most in this span.

THE MONKEN WAY

Army has three 10+ win seasons in program history (1996, 2017, 2018) and Head Coach Jeff Monken has led two of them, being the only Army coach to lead two 10-plus game winning seasons during a head coaching tenure in Academy history.

HOME COOKING

Monken has led two of the longest home winning streaks in program history. Last season, the Black Knights secured their 13th consecutive-win on home turf at Michie Stadium on Sept. 25, a streak that lasted from Nov. 2019 to Sept. 2021.

The latest home stand winning-streak was Monken's second best, behind his 15-game home win streak, spanning from 2016-19. The 13-win streak at home sits at **No. 5** on the longest NCAA home-game winning streaks from Week 11 in 2019 through Week 8 of the 2021 season.

4TH AND GO

The Army offense had started the season a perfect 13-13 on converting on 4th down, before failing an attempt in the second half at Syracuse. Army currently ranks T-3rd in most successful conversions in the country with 14 behind Texas Tech and South Florida (15).

MULTIPLE TOUCHDOWN PLAYMAKERS

Army has three different players who have recorded two touchdown receptions this season (WR, Isaiah Alston, WR Noah Short, TE Tyson Riley). It is only the second time in Monken's tenure that three different players have each had 2+ receiving touchdowns in a season (2021).

RISING SOPHOMORE

Sophomore Noah Short recorded touchdown catches in back-to-back games (UTSA & Syracuse) from QB Bryson Daily. Short hauled in three catches for 68 yards and a touchdown against UTSA, before posting an 80-yard touchdown reception at Syracuse. Short's six catches and 105 yards against the Orange each marked new career highs. Short and teammate Isaiah Alston have each posted 100-yard receiving games.

TWO 100-YARD RECEIVERS

Short and teammate Isaiah Alston have each posted 100-yard receiving games. this season. For only the second time in the Monken era, two separate players recorded over 100 yards receiving in the same season. If a third player records a 100-yard game, it will mark the first time ever having three players break 100 yards receiving in a game all in the same season.

TWO 100-YARD RUSHERS, SAME GAME

RB Hayden Reed rushed for a career-high 107 yards and scored a touchdown at UTSA. QB Bryson Daily rushed for 102 rushing yards on 24 attempts and a touchdown.

Reed and Daily became the first pair of Army teammates to each rush for over 100 yards since RB Tyrell Robinson and QB Jemel Jones achieved the feat on 10/3/2020 vs. Abilene Christian.

It is the eighth time in the Monken era, that two Army rushers eclipsed 100 rushing yards in the same game.

JIMMY SACKS

Senior team captain LB Jimmy Ciarlo has logged 3.0 sacks, 4.0 TFLs, a FF and has 27 tackles this season. He has logged sacks in games vs. ULM, Delaware State and Syracuse. If Ciarlo gets three more sacks this season, he would work his way into the top-10 of Army's single-season sack leaders.

2023 USMA graduate Andre Carter is the all-time single-season leader racking up 15.5 sacks in 2021.

FOOTBALL'S VERSION OF A "PERFECT GAME"

In Army's Week 3 win over UTSA, Army dominated the time of possession 44:25 to 15:35 in favor of the Black Knights, the fourth-highest time of possession mark by Army since 1996.

Army also converted 6-for-6 on 4th downs, its first time with 6+ 4th down conversions since 2019, however, it was Army's first time converting 100% on over six conversions.

Additionally, the Black Knights had zero penalties, zero turnovers and allowed zero sacks in the game.

Since 2000, 32 college football teams have won a game with no penalties or turnovers, but Army is the FIRST to do so with over 40+ minutes of time of possession.

It was Army's 14th game under Jeff Monken having 40+ minutes of time of possession in a game.

DOMINANT HOME WIN

Army's Week 2, 57-0 win vs. Delaware State was Army's largest margin of victory in a shutout win since defeating Columbia (60-0) on Oct. 27, 1956.

The shutout win also marked Army's first shutout win while scoring 50+ points since defeating Fordham, 55-0 in 2011.

It was also Army's first shutout victory since 2020, when defeating Navy, 15-0.

500 YARDS / 8 TOUCHDOWNS

Army totaled 525 total yards, the first-time posting 500+ yards in a game since 2021, while scoring eight offensive touchdowns vs. Delaware State. It was the ninth time in the Monken era, posting over 500 total yards and scoring 8+ touchdowns. Army is 8-1 in such games.

FRESHMAN FINDING THE ENDZONE

Freshman QB Larry Robinson and RB Kayne Udoh made their collegiate debuts in Week 2 vs. Delaware State, eaching finding the endzone. Robinson scampered in from 23 yards, and Udoh pushed in from five yards out.

NOT SO "SMALL" FEAT

Freshman Brady Small started at center in the Week 1 game at ULM, marking the first freshman to start in his first game since WR Kevin Waites started in in the season opener vs. Fordham in 2017. Small is a 6-0, 309-pound center, who played at St. Augustine Preparatory School in Mt. Ephraim, NJ and then spent the 2022 season at USMAPS.

NEW FACES TO THE LINEUP

WR Noah Short, WR Liam Fortner, RB Miles Stewart, OL Lucas Scott and LB Jackson Powell all logged their first career starts in Week 2 vs. Delaware State.

BO KNOWS

Senior DB Bo Nicolas-Paul intercepted ULM QB Jiya Wright and returned it 44 yards for Army's first TD of the season in the second quarter of the season opener. It was Army's first interception returned for a touchdown since Jabari Moore did so vs. Mercer in 2020. It was Nicolas-Paul's second career INT.

Through the first three weeks of the season, Nicolas-Paul was the highest graded cornerback by PFF, who had an interception on only seven targets in his primary coverage and has allowed just 0.63 yards per coverage snap.

PICK CITY

DB Max DiDomenico also intercepted a pass at ULM. It was the first of his career.

In the Jeff Monken era, Army is now 19-2 when recording 2+ defensive interceptions in a game, including the loss to ULM.

Since 2020, when Defensive Coordinator Nate Woody arrived, Army has nine multi-interception games, ranking in the top 30 nationally, in multi-INT games in that span.

THE PRIDE OF HAWAI'I

Special teams coordinator Sean Saturnio, K Quinn Maretzki and DL Isaiah Filisi ran out with Hawai'i state flags, as all three are Hawaiian born players, showing support for the Hawaiian community following the wildfires that destroyed parts of Maui.

BLOCK PARTY

DB Cam Jones blocked a 24-yard field goal try in Week 1 at ULM. Under Saturnio, the Army special teams unit have 13 combined field goal and punt blocks since 2020.

In Week 2, LB Trey Sofia blocked a Delaware State field goal attempt before the half.





BRYSON DAILY NOTES

NOT EVERY "DAY"-ILY

Making his second career start in Week 2 vs. Delaware State, junior QB Bryson Daily totaled five touchdowns (three passing, two rushing) on 8-11 passing for 193 yards, adding nine carries for 65 yards on the ground.

Daily became the second Army QB to throw three touchdowns in a game under Jeff Monken (Jabari Laws, vs. Wake Forest, 10-23-21).

Daily also became the first Army QB since at least 1956, with three passing TDs and two rushing touchdowns in the same game.







TYRELL ROBINSON

Monken joins a group of 20 head coaches across all of college football from the FBS, FCS, D-II, D-III & NAIA to be up for this award.

The final 22-member team of players and one honorary coach are selected by a voting panel of former Allstate AFCA Good Works Team members, current and former head coaches and journalists. They look for exceptional leadership on and off the football field. To be considered for a spot on the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, each player/coach must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining strong academic standing.

2022 SEASON SUMMARY: ARMY BLACK KNIGHTS (6-6)

Army West Point overcame a difficult 1-4 start to its season by winning five out its last seven games to finish 6-6, culminating with a double-OT victory over rival navy. With the win over Navy, Army has beat its rivals in five of the last seven meetings since 2016. In Week 3 win vs. Villanova, Head Coach Jeff Monken reached a significant milestone, logging his then 59th victory with Army and moving past legendary Army Head Coach Charles Daly for 2nd place on Army's all-time coaching wins list. The offense was led by Senior QB Tyhier Tyler, who posted a career high 12 rushing touchdowns, which was second in the FBS by all quarterbacks. He also was the first Army quarterback with 10+ rushing touchdowns since Kelvin Hopkins Jr totaled 17 in 2018. The Senior quarterback finishes his Army career with 24 rushing touchdowns, T-3rd most by an Army QB, which is also good for T-10th on Army's all-time rushing TD list. With Tyler primarily at the helm, the Black Knights ranked second in the country rushing for 289.4 yards per game. Army's 38 rushing touchdowns were tied for second most only behind Tennessee (39). The defense saw consistent improvement throughout the season, behind third-year Defensive Coordinator Nate Woody. During Army's 5-2 finish, the defense only gave up 15.0 points per game. During this span of the season, Army's 105 points allowed was tied for sixth fewest in the country. Sean Saturnio's special teams units made big plays throughout the season, including a punt return touchdown by Tyrell Robinson and two blocked punts for touchdowns against UConn and Navy. Army's three special teams TDs were second most in the FBS. Army sees a senior class that will graduate 19 players who went 21-5 at Michie Stadium over their four years (2019-22). 21 home wins ranks tied for ninth in the FBS during that span. Seven Black Knights were selected to Phil Steele's Postseason All-Independent Team in first-team selections, C Connor Bishop, LB Andre Carter II, S Marquel Broughton and Tyrell Robinson who was selected as a

Michie Stadium, splendid in its scenic beauty and long recognized as one of the most popular stadiums in the nation, will celebrate its 100th season as the home of Army football during the 2023 campaign. Over the years, the venerable stadium has received its share of plaudits as one of the most desired locations in which to watch a college football game. Recently, noted football analyst Mel Kiper Jr. of ESPN.com hailed the Academy's game day atmosphere as among the most inspirational in the country.

Realizing the need for a permanent athletic field as Army's football program continued to assert itself nationally, West Point officials selected a patch of meadow land adjacent to Lusk Reservoir and within the shadow of historic Fort Putnam. Construction of Michie Stadium was completed in 1924, just in time for Army's 35th football campaign.

The original stadium structure was formally dedicated to the memory of Dennis Mahan Michie, who was instrumental in starting the game of football at the U.S. Military Academy in 1890. It was Michie who organized, managed and coached the first football team in history at West Point.

There have been several facelifts since that first game in 1924 when Army defeated Saint Louis University 17-0.

In honor of legendary mentor Earl "Red" Blaik, Army christened the Michie Stadium playing surface "Blaik Field" in 1999. Blaik, a gridiron innovator, compiled an 18-year Army record of 121-33-10 and brought Army its only three national championships (1944, 1945, 1946). The winningest coach in Army annals, Blaik is enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

2015 – New FieldTurf surface installed, allowing lines to be erased and repainted. 2019 –A 3,100 square foot video board is installed in the north end zone, in addition to an LED ribbon board display along the upper deck and a final LED display in the south end

2020 - In the year of the pandemic, Army hosts Navy, the first time playing the Mids at West Point since 1943 followed by Air Force, winning both to capture its ninth CIC Trophy. 2021 - Army West Point Athletics Association (AWPAA) announced initial plans for the launch of the Michie Stadium Preservation Project. The goal is to raise \$177 million in support of the Academy's vision to reconstruct the East Stands. This transformational project will ensure that the unique and storied Michie Stadium experience carries on for generations to come.

2023 - Army Athletics celebrates the 100th season of Michie Stadium, while a brand new FieldTurf was installed ahead of the season.

Army has blocked three punts in each of the last three seasons (2020-22) as nine blocked punts are tied for the most in the FBS with Notre Dame in that span.

Punt Return TD -- RB Tyrell Robinson returned a punt 73-yards for a touchdown vs. Villanova, marking Army's first punt or kickoff return for a touchdown since Jeremy Trimble did so in 2007 vs. Temple

Blocked Punt for TD vs. UConn -- Blocked by DB Jabril Williams recovered for a TD by RB Miles Stewart. It was Army's first blocked punt returned for a TD since 11/11/2017 vs. Duke, when Javhari Boudreau blocked a punt and returned it 25 yards.

Blocked Punt for TD vs. navy -- Blocked by Noah Short and recovered for a TD by DB Jabrill Williams.

Army's two blocked punts both resulting in TDs made them one of seven teams with two blocked punts for TDs, joining Bowling Green, Middle Tennessee, San Diego State, South Carolina, UAB and UCF.

Army special teams have 13 combined field goal and punt blocks since 2020

The special teams units cumulatively ranked 17th overall in the country in the Special Teams FEI (Fremeau Efficiency Index Rankings), marking the highest-ever ranking for an Army special teams unit since Football Outsiders began tracking advanced statistics in 2007..

ARMY DROPS OPENER AT LOUISIANA-MONROE

MONROE, La. -- Army West Point football kicked off its 2023 season with a 17-13 defeat at Louisiana-Monroe on Saturday night. The game began in an unorthodox way, as a power outage at Malone Stadium caused the videoboard to be off as the game started without a functional videoboard as the referees kept the official clock on the field. The videoboard and power were restored midway through the second quarter.

On Army's first offensive drive of the season under new offensive coordinator Drew Thatcher, QB Bryson Daily, who was making his first career start, completed his first career pass, a 53yard reception to sophomore WR Liam Fortner, also his first career reception. From the ULM 17-yard-line threatening to score, Daily was strip sacked by ULM's Norman Massey which was recovered by the Warhawks and took away Army's scoring opportunity.

The Army offense pieced together another drive moving 47 yards on 11 plays, but senior K Quinn Maretzki missed a field goal try from 37 yards out, as Army failed to get on the board for the second straight drive. The Warhawks got into Army territory for the first time on their third drive after converting on a pair of third down conversions. They were eventually forced into a third straight punt after Brett Gerena sniffed out a QB draw on third-and-ten from the Army 43. Two plays after a 20-yard pickup on a slant to WR Isaiah Alston, Daily threw an interception on an attempt over the middle that ULM LB Ja'Terious Evans picked off. The Warhawks were able to capitalize on Army's second turnover, converting a 24-yard field goal by Derek McCormick, to take a 3-0 at the 6:20 mark in the second quarter.

Army found the spark it needed when DB Bo Nicolas-Paul intercepted ULM QB Jiya Wright and returned it 44 yards for Army's first TD of the season with 2:33 remaining in the second quarter. It was Army's first interception returned for a touchdown since Jabari Moore did so vs. Mercer in 2020. It was Nicolas-Paul's second career INT.

On the next ensuing drive, DB Max DiDomenico picked off Wright and gave the offense the ball at the 35 yard-line. Army would capitalize on the turnover when Maretzki converted a 22-yard field goal, to give Army a 10-3 lead with seven seconds to go in the half. In the third quarter, each team was stalled offensively as each punted twice.

To begin the fourth quarter, Army pieced together a nine play, 58-yard drive which was capped off on a 28-yard field goal by Maretzki to give the Black Knights a two-score lead, 13-3. The Army defense remained stout, forcing the sixth ULM punt of the night with 8:19 left to play. Army was pinned inside its own ten-yard line following the Warhawks' punt, with Cooper Allan then booting a career-best 52-yard punt from his own end zone. Starting from its own 38-yard line, ULM was able to break its largest gain of the day with Hunter Smith taking a rush up the middle to the house for the first touchdown of the night for the home team. A Mc-Cormick PAT made it a 13-10 contest.

Army faced a third-and-long on its ensuing drive, with Daily hitting Marshall over the middle for a big gain. However, Car'lin Vigers was able to force the ball loose and ULM took over with its second fumble recovery of the evening. Isaiah Woullard was then able to break free for a 33-yard gain, setting up a nine-yard touchdown pass from Hunter Herring to Tyrone Powell which gave ULM a 17-13 lead with 2:48 remaining.

Army got the ball back trailing by four but turned it over for the fourth time on the night on the second play of the drive as A.J. Watts came down with the interception. ULM's drive stalled with under a minute left, with Cameron Jones then blocking a 24-yard field goal attempt on fourth down with 29 seconds remaining. Army got the ball back at its own 15-yard line, but with no timeouts, the Black Knights were unable to move the ball downfield with ULM recovering a last-ditch lateral as time expired.

ARMY BLANKS DELAWARE STATE, 57-0 IN HOME OPENER

WEST POINT, N.Y. — The Army West Point football team kicked off the 100th season of Michie Stadium with a statement victory, defeating Delaware State in the home opener 57-0.

It marked Army's largest margin of victory in a shutout win since defeating Columbia (60-0) on Oct. 27, 1956. It was also Army's first shutout victory since 2020, defeating Navy, 15-0.

Army totaled 525 total yards, the first-time posting 500+ yards in a game since 2021, while scoring eight offensive touchdowns on the day, led by junior QB Bryson Daily who had three passing touchdowns and two on the ground. Daily finished passing 8-11 for 193 yards and added nine carries for 65 yards. Junior WR Isaiah Alston set a career high with 135 receiving yards with two touchdowns on three receptions. Alston became the first Army receiver with 130+ receiving yards and two TDs since Jeremy Trimble did so twice in the 2007 season. Alston joins only Trimble (twice), William White (2003), and Aaron Alexander (2003), as Army players to eclipse these totals in a single game since 1996.

On the opening drive of the game, Army's OLB Trey Sofia sacked Delaware State QB Aaron Angelos on third-down to complete an opening drive three and out for the Black Knights defense, Sofia's first full sack of his career.

Con Army's opening drive offensively, sophomore Zach Mundell made his collegiate debut, recording a reception for seven yards. On the drive, the Army offense faced a fourth-and-2 from the Delaware State 17-yard line, which RB Jakobi Buchanan plunged forward for a gain of three and a first down. The 10-play drive was capped off on a 13-yard touchdown run by QB Bryson Daily. Army would line up for the extra point but fake it with a direct snap which was converted on a run by RB Hayden Reed, to take an 8-0 lead with 8:00 in the first quarter.

On Army's second offensive drive, Daily connected with WR Isaiah Alston on a double-move down the right sideline for a 59-yard touchdown, Alston's fifth career receiving touchdown and Daily's first career passing touchdown to take a 15-0 into the second quarter. Army would find the endzone again with 8:01 in the second quarter, on Daily's second rushing touchdown of the game, from four yards out to extend the Black Knights lead 22-0. The Hornets moved the ball into Army territory on the ensuing drive, before being faced with a fourth-and-one from the Black Knights 30-yard line. On the play, Chris Frey and Spencer Jones were able to get into the backfield and force the turnover on downs on an attempted dive play.

Army got all 70 yards on one play to find the end zone on its ensuing drive, with Daily hitting Alston on a quick slant where the Army receiver burned through the secondary for a career-long 70-yard touchdown catch. The Army defense continued its dominant first half, with Jack Latore pouncing on a loose ball in the backfield to give the Black Knights an immediate red zone opportunity. The Cadets converted on the first play of the drive once again, with Daily hitting Tyson Riley in stride for a 16-yard touchdown connection. Maretzki knocked in his fourth PAT of the ballgame to make it a 36-0 Army advantage.

Getting the ball back with just under three minutes to play, Delaware State moved the ball deep into Army territory, eventually setting up a first and goal from the seven-yard line. Eventually and third and long with the goal to go, Kyle Lewis broke free from the right edge to complete a strip-sack and recovery to give Army the ball back and secure the first half shutout. Freshman QB Champ Harris made his Army debut in the closing seconds of the half, completing a pair of passes to Casey Reynolds for 20 yards. Cole Talley attempted a 58-yard field goal as time expired, with it missing wide right.

In the second half, Army kept the gas on scoring three more touchdowns, one in the third quarter and two in the fourth quarter. Freshman QB Larry Robinson made his collegiate debut and scored his first touchdown on a 23-yard run. Another freshman, RB Kayne Udoh also scored his first touchdown on a five-yard run.

Daily paced all Army rushers (9-65) followed by Robinson (4-63), Ay'Jaun Marshall (2-44), Markel Johnson (6-32), and Udoh (5-32).

ARMY SURGES PAST UTSA ON ROAD WITH 37-29 VICTORY

SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS -- The Army West Point football team (2-1) defeated UTSA (1-2), 37-29 in a primetime game on ESPN on Friday night, its third win over UTSA in San Antonio in the last five years.

Army converted a perfect 6-for-6 on fourth down to help dominate time of possession as the Black Knights held the ball for over 44 minutes of gametime. RB Hayden Reed rushed for a career-high 107 yards while QB Bryson Daily also topped the century mark on the ground. On the opening drive of the game, Army marched 75 yards on 16 plays taking 7:28 off the clock as RB Hayden Reed punched in a touchdown from one yard out. Reed also broke free on a 27-yard run on a third and short. Army picked up all 75 yards by virtue of the ground game.

On the second play of UTSA's first drive, LB Jimmy Ciarlo punched the ball loose on a rush attempt by UTSA RB Kevorian Barnes, with DB Quindrelin Hammonds picking up the fumble recovery. Forcing its fifth turnover of the season, Army got the ball back on the Roadrunners 41-yard line. On Army's second offensive possession, Army went for it on 4th-and-7 and was able to convert on a defensive pass inference on a pass intended for WR Ay'Jaun Marshall to give the offense a fresh set of downs at the UTSA 23-yardline. Senior RB Jakobi Buchanan finished off the drive with a bruising 10-yard touchdown run up the middle.

Army led 14-0 at the end of the first quarter, dominating the opening period, running 26 plays to UTSA's six, outgaining the Roadrunners 101 yards to 41 and having possession for 13:19.Early in the second, UTSA answered on a 19-yard touchdown run by RB Robert Henry, to cut into the Black Knights lead, 14-7. QB Bryson Daily's first completion came on a 26-yard pitch and catch on a swing route to RB Markel Johnson. Three plays later, Daily found WR Noah Short down the field for a gain of 38, as Short made a ridiculous catch with tight coverage. UTSA's defense held, and K Quinn Maretzki banged in a 23-yard field goal to make it a 17-7 game.

Army's defense held firm again, forcing a punt after LB Kalib Fortner blew up a running play behind the line of scrimmage for a loss. Daily and the Black Knights then embarked on a 13-play drive culminating in a career-long 45-yard field goal from Maretzki which made it a 20-7 game in favor of Army. The big plays on the drive came via gains of 13 and 11 through the air to Isaiah Alston and Casey Reynolds, respectively. UTSA responded with a blow just before the half, with QB Eddie Lee Marburger connecting with Tykee Ogle-Kellogg on a 46-yard Hail Mary touchdown pass as time expired. Army went into the half holding a 20-14 lead despite a 22:49 to 7:11 advantage in time of possession.

To start the second half, Army's defense was able to get off the field stopping UTSA on 4th-and-6 from the 49-yardline to give the offense good field position. Following a 14-yard run by Reed, Army settled for a 36-yard field goal by Maretzki to give Army a 23-14 lead. With the make, Maretzki set a career high with three field goal makes in a game. The Roadrunners responded on the following drive as Marburger hit WR Joshua Cephus for 44 yards for a touchdown, to make it a 23-21 game.

Army quickly responded on a two-play drive as Markel Johnson took a lateral screen from Daily, with the running back connecting on a pass with WR Isaiah Alston for a gain of 55 yards. Daily then hit Short for a 25-yard touchdown down the seam, Short's first career touchdown to again give the Black Knights a nine-point lead, 30-21. To begin the fourth quarter, Army marched 70 yards on 14 plays, which was capped off by a three-yard touchdown run by Daily to extend the lead, 37-21. UTSA responded quickly and efficiently, with Marburger hitting Devin McCuinn for a 72-yard deep touchdown pass on the second play of the drive. The duo connected once again on the two-point conversion attempt, making it a one-score game with 6:12 to play.

Army failed to move the chains on its ensuing drive, punting the ball away as UTSA took over at their own 35 with 4:34 to play, trailing 37-29. Needing a stop, the Army defense stepped up with Jackson Powell sacking Marburger on third down, marking consecutive games with a sack for the senior. With all three timeouts, UTSA punted back to the Black Knights with 3:12 to go. Army continued to grind out yards on the ground, with Daily breaking loose for a gain of 13 on a third down and five which forced UTSA to use all of its remaining timeouts. Needing one more first down to clinch the game, Daily once again plunged forward on a third down and short to pick up a key first down to secure the win. It marked just UTSA's second defeat in its last 19 games at the Alamodome, as the Black Knights outran the Roadrunners 254-121 on the ground en route to the victory.

BLACK KNIGHTS FALL TO ORANGE, 29-16

SYRACUSE, **N.Y.** - The Army West Point football team (2-2) was defeated 29-16 at Syracuse (4-0) on Saturday afternoon from the JMA Wireless Dome.

On the opening drive of the game, Army marched 17 plays, 75 yards, which was capitalized by RB Jakobi Buchanan's one-yard touchdown run. On the drive, Army faced a fourth-and-one, in which they went for and converted their 11th consecutive fourth down try, as Buchanan plunged forward for four yards.

The Army defense quickly responded, forcing a three-and-out, where DB Cameron Jones broke up a pass on third down, a play in which he had a possible pick-six in his sights.

Early in the second quarter, Army LB Kalib Fortner, who was making his first career start, logged his first career sack bringing down Syracuse QB Garrett Shrader to force a field goal attempt. Syracuse K Brady Denaburg connected from 46 yards. to cut the Army lead. 7-3.

After the team's traded punts, Army got the ball back with 9:49 to play in the half. The Black Knights continued to convert on fourth down and short, with Buchanan converting two more on the drive bringing Army to a perfect 13-13 on fourth down conversions this season. Rushes of 15, four and eight from QB Bryson Daily eventually got Army into field goal range, with K Quinn Maretzki knocking in a 38-yard field goal to extend Army's lead to 10-3. The drive totaled 19 plays in total while chewing up 9:20 of gametime.

The Orange received the ball back with 29 seconds left to play, quickly connecting on a 23-yard strike to get the ball to midfield. Two plays later, Cameron Jones intercepted a pass from Shrader to bring the first half to a close. Army held an advantage of 23:24 to 6:36 in time of possession through the opening half hour.

In the second half, Syracuse would tie up the game at 10 apiece when LeQuint Allen Jr. rushed for a 13-yard touchdown. On the drive, Shrader hit WR Damien Alford on two big pass plays for gains of 31 and 19.

After a punt by Army, Syracuse went 91 yards in 10 plays to take the lead on a 13-yard touchdown pass from Shrader to WR Umari Hatcher to give the Orange their first lead of the afternoon, 16-10 as the PAT was missed.

Syracuse got the ball back just before the end of the third quarter, eventually extending its lead to a two-possession game, 19-10 on a Denaburg 30-yard field goal. Army was then faced with a fourth-and-eight from its own 27-yard line with just over ten minutes to play in the game. Daily saw his pass tipped at the line, ending Army's perfect fourth down conversion streak at 13 to begin the season.

The Orange capitalized on the good field position with a touchdown rush on the second play of the drive, making it a 26-10 game. After an Army interception on its ensuing drive, an Orange field goal made it a three-score contest at 29-10 with 6:05 to play.

The Black Knights got the ball back with just under three minutes to play, with Daily hitting Noah Short over the middle for an 80-yard touchdown strike, marking consecutive weeks that the duo has connected for a score through the air. With the score 29-16, Army attempted an onside kick to keep the game alive, but the ball was knocked out of bounds to give Syracuse possession as the Orange improved to 4-0 on the campaign.

WEST POINT, N.Y. -- The Army West Point football team (2-3) fell to Boston College (3-3), 27-24 in a wet and rainy, non-stop downpour at Michie Stadium.

Army erased a 10-point halftime deficit of 13-3 to take its first lead of the game, 24-20 with 11:43 left in the fourth quarter. Army scored touchdowns on each of its first three drives to start the second half. However, Boston College's QB Thomas Castellanos' 142 rushing yards and four touchdown performance was too much for the Black Knights to overcome.

Receiving the opening kickoff, Boston College managed just 15 yards on six plays on its first drive, with the lone first down coming via penalty. Army's first drive resulted in a three-and-out, with RB Tyrell Robinson logging a seven-yard carry in his first play back from injury since October of last season.

Boston College QB Thomas Castellanos ran for a 20-yard touchdown midway through the first quarter, the first points that the Army defense has given up in the first quarter all season. The Eagles took advantage of a short field following a 16-yard punt by Army.

Army Sophomore DL Jack Latore recorded his first career sack on the last play of the first quarter, bringing down Castellanos for a loss of five. A few plays later, DB Quindrelin Hammonds picked off Castellanos, his first career interception to set the Army offense up with great field position.

QB Bryson Daily then connected with Robinson for a 21-yard gain down to the BC eight-yard line to set up a first and goal. K Quinn Maretzki eventually knocked in a 22-yard field goal which put Army on the board and made it a 6-3 game. The Eagles were then able to march down the field on a 17-play, 75-yard touchdown drive which burned 8:44 off the clock.

Castellanos found pay dirt on a four-yard touchdown run with 1:24 to go in the half. The PAT was converted by Liam Connor to make it a 13-3 contest. With rain pouring down in the closing moments of the half, Army was unable to move across midfield and punted for the fourth time in the game to go into the half trailing by ten.

On the opening kickoff of the second half, Zach Mundell broke off a 55-yard return from the Army 10-yard to the Boston College 37. It marked the first kickoff return of Mundell's career and the longest kickoff return in the Jeff Monken era at West Point.

Daily broke off a 14-yard run on the first play of the drive, with a Robinson five-yard carry getting Army into the red zone for the second time on the afternoon. Getting down to the ten-yard line, RB Tyrell Robinson took a handoff up the middle for his first touchdown of the season and 12th overall of his career which cut the deficit down to three after a Maretzki PAT.

Boston College answered Army's score by marching 75 yards on six plays which was capped off by a 10-yard touchdown run by Castellanos, his second of the game to extend the BC lead, 20-10.

Trading blows, the Army offense marched eight plays, 69 yards that featured a 23-yard run by QB Bryson Daily and a 17-yard pitch and catch from Daily to WR Noah Short in which RB Hayden Reed pounded in a touchdown run from six yards out to again make it a three-point game, 20-17. For Reed, it was his second touchdown of the season and the fourth of his career.

After a big stop by the Army defense, Army scored on its third consecutive possession of the second half to take its first lead of the afternoon, 24-20 when Daily connected with TE Tyson Riley on a nine-yard touchdown pass. On the drive Daily hit WR Casey Reynolds for a gain of 27 yards to set the Black Knights up with good field position. Army would get a critical play overturned when looking to extend its lead, when Daily pitched the ball to Reed in which he ran 50 yards for a touchdown, but it was called an illegal forward pass and Army was forced the punt.

On the ensuing drive, Boston College drove 12 plays, 62 yards in which Castellanos scored his fourth rushing touchdown, as the Eagles took the lead 27-24 with only 25 seconds left on the clock. With only a few ticks remaining Army fumbled in its last chance desperation to get into field goal range.

Castellanos finished with a game-high 142 rushing yards and four rushing touchdowns for the Eagles. RB Patrick Garwo also had an 100-yard performance, totaling 111 yards on 14 carries.

ARMY SHUTOUT AT HOME TO TROY

WEST POINT, N.Y. -- Army West Point (2-4) fell to the Troy Trojans (5-2), 19-0 at Michie Stadium. For the second week in a row, Army played in a cold, wet, and rainy game at Michie Stadium. Troy posted 449 total yards, led by WR Jabre Barber's career-high 138 yards on four receptions. The nation's leading rusher RB Kimani Vidal rushed 23 times for 118 yards, his fourth 100-yard performance of the season.

On Troy's first offensive drive, QB Gunnar Watson hit Barber for a gain of 47 yards on a slant to set the Trojans up at Army's nine-yardline The Army defense held in the redzone and forced a field goal made by K Scott Taylor Renfroe from 24 yards out.

The Black Knights were driving on their second drive of the game after runs of 18 and 10 by QB Bryson Daily and then a 13-yard reception by WR Noah Short to get down to the Troy 23-yardline. However, RB Tyrell Robinson fumbled with Troy recovering to stall a promising drive.

Troy's Watson connected again with Barber on a deep pass for 53 yards, however, Barber fumbled on the play with the tackle by DB Max DiDomenico as LB Leo Lowin recovered at Army's own two-yardline, preventing a potential score.

Early in the second quarter, Troy threatened again at Army's 18-yardline, but Army held with great pass coverage on a shot to the endzone intended for Barber by DB Casey Larkin to force a 35-yard field goal by Renfroe to extend Troy's lead to 6-0.

Later in the quarter, Watson found Barber yet again for a pickup of 29 yards which was capped off by a 32-yard field goal by Renfroe to push Troy's lead to 9-0 as the Army defense held again in the redzone.

With 32 seconds until the break, Watson connected deep down the left sideline with Chris Lewis for a 52-yard touchdown, the lone touchdown of the game, as the Trojans took a 16-0 lead into the locker room.

To open the second half, Troy marched ten plays and added to its lead on the fourth field goal of the game by Renfroe, drilling from 43 yards out.

Army's defense played better in the second half, only allowing the one field goal.

Offensively, Army struggled going 2-13 on third downs in the game, totaling 255 total yards. Freshman QB Champ Harris played the entire second half, after Daily left the game with an injury in the second quarter. Harris passed 6-13 for 63 yards and had an interception. Before leaving the game, Daily was 3-4 passing for 15 yards and rushed 10 times for 46 yards.

Army freshman RB Kanye Udoh rushed for a season-best 124 yards on 18 carries (6.9 avg.), becoming the first Army freshman rush over the century mark since Tyrell Robinson rushed for 126 yards vs. Abilene-Christian on 10/3/2020.




