LSU Back In Tiger Stadium To Host Auburn on ESPN

Saturday Night in Death Valley is back this week as LSU (4-2, 3-1 SEC) hosts Auburn (3-2, 0-2 SEC) in a crucial SEC Western Division matchup. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. and will be televised on ESPN with Joe Tessitore (pyp), Jordan Rodgers (analyst) and Katie George (sideline) on the call. LSU is coming off a 49-39 road win over No. 21 Missouri last week, while Auburn enjoyed an open date. Auburn dropped a 27-20 decision to top-ranked Georgia in its last outing on Sept. 30. LSU enters the contest ranked No. 20 in the Coaches poll and No. 22 in the AP poll. Auburn is unranked. LSU won last year's meeting, 21-17, at Jordan-Hare Stadium and leads the overall series 32-24-1. The teams aren't scheduled to play next year, marking the end of a 32-year streak (1992-2023) between LSU and Auburn. LSU enters the contest with the top offense in the SEC and No. 3 nationally as the Tigers are averaging 558.3 yards per game (210.7 rushing, 337.7 passing). LSU also leads the SEC in scoring (44.8), pass efficiency (185.8 rating), offensive TDs (34), 3rd-down conversions (40-of-71, 56.3 pct) and first downs per game (28.2). LSU is No. 2 in the league in both pass offense (337.7) and rush offense (210.7). QB Jayden Daniels leads the SEC and ranks No. 2 in the nation in total offense with 398.5 yards per game (328.2 passing, 70.3 rushing). Daniels has accounted for 4 or more TDs in 5 consecutive games, the longest streak in school history. WR Brian Thomas leads the nation in TD receptions with 9. He's caught 37 passes for 603 yards, while teammate Malik Nabers is No. 2 in the nation in receiving yards (771) and second in the SEC and fifth nationally in receptions (46). RB Logan Diggs had his second straight 100-yard game vs. Missouri with a career-best 134 yards and a TD. Diggs has rushed for 488 yards and 4 TDs and ranks No. 2 in the SEC in yards per game (97.6). Defensively, the Tigers are allowing 32.3 points and 445.7 total yards a game (163.0 rushing, 282.7 passing). S Major Burns leads LSU in tackles with 42, followed by S Andre Sam (41) and LB Greg Penn (40). LB Harold Perkins has 28 tackles and leads the Tigers in both tackles for loss (5.5) and sacks (2). He also has an interception, 4 pass breakups, 3 QB hurries and 2 forced fumbles.

LSU Coach Brian Kelly: Winningest Active Coach In College Football

Brian Kelly is in his second with the Tigers and has guided LSU to a 14-6 overall mark through 20 games. After inheriting a roster with only 39 scholarship players, Kelly quickly turned LSU into a 10-win team in his first season in 2022 as the Tigers went 10-4 overall, beat Top 10 teams in Ole Miss and Alabama and won the SEC Western Division. Kelly became the most accomplished hire in LSU football history when he was named to the position in December of 2021. He joined the Tigers after 12 years and 113 wins at Notre Dame. He's 298-103-2 overall (32 years) and is the winningest active coach (all divisions) in college football. His coaching resume includes 11 10-win seasons at the FBS level (7 at Notre Dame, 3 at Cincinnati, 1 at LSU), along with 14 bowl/CFP playoff appearances and 3 National Coach of the Year honors (2009 at Cincinnati, 2012 and 2018 at Notre Dame). Kelly's record includes a 113-40 mark at Notre Dame, where he's the winningest coach in school history; 34-6 at Cincinnati (4 years), 19-16 at Central Michigan (3 years) and 118-35-2 at Grand Valley State (13 years). He won two Division II National Championships at Grand Valley State. Kelly is 1-0 vs. Auburn.

QUICK NOTES

- LSU will wear a No. 3 decal on its helmet again this week to honor senior captain **Greg Brooks**, who was diagnosed with a brain tumor the week of the Mississippi State game. **Brooks** is in Memphis at St. Jude's Children's Hospital receiving treatment.
- LSU QB **Jayden Daniels** earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors for the third time this season on Monday for his performance vs. Missouri. **Daniels** has been the SEC Player of the Week following wins over Mississippi State, Arkansas and Mizzou.
- OT **Emery Jones** earned SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week honors for his performance in the win over Missouri. LSU had 2 100-yard rushers and racked up 274 rushing yards against a Missouri team that led the SEC in rushing defense at 74 yards per game.
- LSU's offense ranks in the Top 10 nationally in 6 categories: No. 1 in first downs (169), No. 3 in total offense (548.3) and 3rd-down conversions (56.3 pct.), No. 5 in scoring (44.8) and pass efficiency (185.8 rating), and No. 7 in passing (337.7).
- For only the 8th time in school history, LSU's offense vs. Missouri featured 2 100-yard rushers (**Logan Diggs**, 134 yards; **Jayden Daniels**, 130 yards) and a 100-yard receiver (**Malik Nabers**, 146 yards).
- **Logan Diggs** has rushed for 100-yards in back-to-back games (101 vs. Ole Miss; 134 vs. Missouri) becoming the first LSU running back to do so in SEC games since Ty Davis-Price did it vs. Alabama (104) and Arkansas (106) in November of 2021.
- Against Arkansas in week 4, **Daniels** became just the 6th player in FBS history pass for 10,000 yards and rush for 4,000-yards in a career when he went over the 10,000-passing yard mark vs. the Razorbacks. In 49 career games, **Daniels** has thrown for 10,906 yards and rushed for 2,570 yards.
- **Daniels** has accounted for at least 4 TDs in 5 consecutive games. He's the only player in LSU history to account for 4 TDs in 5 straight

games.

- **Daniels** has also topped the 400-yard mark for total offense 3 times in 2023, joining Joe Burrow in 2019 as the only players in school history to do it at least 3 times in same season. **Daniels** has 4 games with 400 yards of total offense in his LSU career, second to only Burrow, who did it 6 times.
- WR **Brian Thomas** leads the nation in receiving TDs with 9. He's coming off a 4-catch, 66-yard, 1-TD effort vs. Missouri.
- WR **Malik Nabers** ranks No. 2 in the nation in receiving yards (771) and No. 5 in receptions (46). **Nabers** has caught a pass in 24 consecutive games and he's riding a streak of 4 straight 100-yard games, the third-longest streak in LSU history.
- **Nabers** became the 11th player in LSU history to top the 2,000-yard mark in receiving yards vs. Ole Miss with 8 catches for 102 yards. In 31 career games, **Nabers** has 178 receptions for 2,205 yards and 18 TDs.
- With 49 career starts, senior QB **Jayden Daniels** ranks No. 3 among active FBS quarterbacks in games started. He trails only Bo Nix (Oregon) with 52 and Sam Hartman (Notre Dame) with 52. **Daniels** has started 20 straight games at LSU (14-6) after starting 29 at Arizona State from 2019-21.
- All 5 starters on LSU's offensive line have at least 16 career starts to their credit with C **Charles Turner** leading the way with 20. He's followed by LT **Will Campbell** (19), RG **Miles Frazier** (19), RT **Emery Jones Jr.** (18) and LG **Garrett Dellinger** (16). The group has combined for 92 career starts.
- **Brian Thomas** and **Malik Nabers** stand as the top receiving duo in the SEC as they have combined for 83 catches for 1,374 yards and 15 TDs. The duo is combining to average 13.8 receptions for 229.0 yards and 2.5 TDs per game

When Brian Kelly was hired away from Notre Dame in December of 2021, LSU announced at the time that "the search for LSU Football's next championship head coach is over."

The most accomplished hire in program history, Kelly wasted little time in making his impact felt, leading the Tigers to a 10-win season and the SEC Western Division title. Despite inheriting a roster with only 39 scholarship players remaining from the 2021 season, Kelly guided the Tigers to Top 10 wins over Ole Miss and Alabama along with road victories over Auburn, Florida and Arkansas.

The Tigers capped the season with a resounding 63-7 win over Purdue in the Citrus Bowl completing one of the biggest turnarounds in college football a year ago.

Kelly, who has more victories than any active coach in major college football, was named LSU's 34th head football coach on December 1, taking over a program that has won four national championships.

Kelly's 10 wins at LSU in 2022 ran his career win total to 294 in 32 years as a head coach and it marked the 11th time he led a team to 10 or more wins in a season at the FBS level. Overall, Kelly has had teams reach double-figure wins 17 times with his teams winning nine games on five other occasions. His coaching career includes 13 seasons at Grand Valley State, three at Central Michigan, four at Cincinnati, 12 at Notre Dame and one at LSU.

His overall mark of 298-103-2 puts him ahead of Alabama's Nick Saban (290) and North Carolina's Mack Brown (273) on the list of most victories by an active FBS head coach. Only twice during Kelly's 32-year coaching career has he had a team finish below .500.

Kelly is also one of only five active FBS coaches who have guided their programs to multiple undefeated regular seasons since 2009 and he's led teams to one berth in the BCS National Championship Game and to a pair of College Football Playoff appearances. Overall, his teams have appeared in bowl games 14 times.

Prior to taking over at LSU in 2022, Kelly spent 12 years as the head coach at Notre Dame where he became the school's winningest coach with 113 victories, moving past legendary Knute Rockne for the top spot on the list. Kelly left Notre Dame with a 113-40 overall mark and his teams averaged 10 wins a season over his last five years – 54-9 during that span – with Irish.

During his Notre Dame career, Kelly led the Irish to the 2012 BCS national title game as well as College Football Playoff appearances in 2018 and 2020. He was named National Coach of the Year by numerous outlets in 2012 and 2018. He's the only coach to win the Home Depot Coach of the Year Award more than once, and he's done it three times (2009,

2012, and 2018).

In 12 seasons at Notre Dame, Kelly's teams won at least 10 games seven times, including 2021, as the Irish posted an 11-1 mark and were ranked as high as No. 5 in the nation during his final season in South Bend. Kelly's final five seasons at Notre Dame saw the Irish win at least 10 games each year, including a 12-1 mark in 2018 and 11-2 in 2019.

Individually, Notre Dame players claimed eight consensus All-America honors playing for Kelly, while the Irish had players win nine national awards during that span. Kelly's Notre Dame teams produced 55 NFL Draft picks since 2012, including 10 in the first round.

Academically under Kelly, the Irish had eight players earn the prestigious CoSIDA Academic All-America honor, and three were selected as National Football Foundation Scholar-Athletes. As a team, Notre Dame consistently ranked among the nation's top four in the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate.

Prior to joining the Irish, Kelly transformed Cincinnati into a football powerhouse, winning Big East titles in 2008 and 2009. In three years at Cincinnati, the Bearcats won 34 games and appeared in the Orange and Sugar Bowls. In 2007, Kelly led Cincinnati to the school's first-ever 10-win season with a 10-3 mark and a win in the PapaJohns.com Bowl. In his final season at Cincinnati, Kelly's team posted a 12-0 regular season mark and earned a berth to the Sugar Bowl.

Kelly's first Division I head coaching position came in 2004 when he took over at Central Michigan. In three years with the Chippewas, Kelly's teams won 19 games, claimed the Mid-American Conference title in 2006 and appeared in a bowl game for the first time in 12 years.

Kelly's first head coaching job came at Division II Grand Valley State in 1991, a position he held for 13 years. In 13 years at Grand Valley, Kelly won 118 games, won five straight conference titles and made six Division II playoff appearances. He led the Lakers to back-to-back national titles in 2002 and 2003, going 14-0 and 14-1, respectively. He won 41 games during his final three years in Allendale.

A native of Everett, Mass., Kelly was a four-year letterwinner at linebacker and two-time team captain at Assumption College in Worcester, Mass. He graduated from Assumption in 1983 with a degree in political science.

Kelly and his wife Paqui have three children – Patrick, Grace and Kenzel. The Kellys are active in community outreach and have established the Kelly Cares Foundation which has donated nearly \$8 million to support causes related to the fight against breast cancer since its founding in 2008.

LSU Hosts Auburn For Saturday Night in Tiger Stadium

After playing 4 of its first 6 games away from home, LSU returns to Tiger Stadium on Saturday night, hosting Auburn at 6 on ESPN in Death Valley. LSU has won 8 straight night games in Tiger Stadium and brings a 4-2 overall mark and a 3-1 SEC record into the contest. LSU is coming off a 49-39 win over No. 21 Missouri last week in Columbia. Auburn enters the contest with a 3-2 overall record and an 0-2 league mark. Auburn was off last week, but took top-ranked Georgia to the wire two weeks ago, falling 27-20 at Jordan-Hare Stadium. LSU enters the contest ranked No. 20 in the Coaches poll and No. 22 in the AP poll.

LSU-Auburn Series: LSU leads 32-24-1

LSU holds a 32-24-1 advantage in the series that dates back to 1901 when Auburn posted a 28-0 victory in Baton Rouge. LSU won, 5-0, in the following year in Baton Rouge for its first victory in the series. The teams have met every year since 1992 when the league went to a divisional format when Arkansas and South Carolina joined the conference. Since 1992, LSU is 17-14 vs. Auburn, which includes a 21-17 victory last year at Jordan-Hare Stadium. During the 31-game streak since 1992, the LSU-Auburn game has been decided by a touchdown or less 17 times. LSU coach **Brian Kelly** is 1-0 vs. Auburn, rallying his Tigers from a 17-0 first half deficit to win, 21-17.

Expect The Unexpected When LSU and Auburn Get Together

Since 1988, the LSU-Auburn series has become one of close calls and one in which the teams and the fans have come to expect the unexpected. The following is a listing of some of the notable happenings in the series since 1988:

1988: LSU's Tommy Hodson hit Eddie Fuller in the back of the endzone on fourth down with 1:41 left to lift the Tigers to a 7-6 win over fourth-ranked Auburn. The noise from the stadium crowd after the play registered on a seismograph across campus prompting the game to be titled "The Earthquake Game."

1994: Auburn intercepted five passes in the fourth quarter, returning three for TDs as the Tigers rally to post a 30-26 win over LSU in a game that become known as "The Interception Game."

1995: LSU donned white jerseys at home for the first time since the early 1980's and promptly went out and upset fifth-ranked Auburn, 12-6. LSU preserved the win with an interception in the endzone on the last play of the game. The contest was dubbed the "Bring Back the Magic" game.

1996: With the old Auburn Sports Arena burning to the ground a couple hundred yards away, LSU beat Auburn, 19-15, in a game titled "The Night the Barn Burned."

1997: Titled "The Comeback," Auburn QB Dameyune Craig engineered a 10-play, 80-yard drive late in the fourth quarter to spark the Tigers to a 31-28 upset of 10th-ranked LSU.

2004: Titled "The Call," Auburn appeared to have missed an extra point with 1:14 left that would have left the game tied at 9-9. However, LSU was called for a penalty on the extra point, thus giving Auburn a second chance at winning the game. The second PAT was good, and Auburn held on for a 10-9 win, snapping LSU's 10-game winning streak.

2005: Auburn missed five field goals, including one in overtime, as LSU held on for a 20-17 win over Auburn in Tiger Stadium. The win helped propel LSU to the SEC Western Division title and the game is now known as the "Field Goal Game."

2007: "Can't See Me" Demetrius Byrd caught a 22-yard TD pass from Matt Flynn with just one second left to send LSU to a 30-24 win over Auburn in Tiger Stadium. The play seemed to have caught Auburn off-guard as the Tigers could have attempted a 39-yard field goal for the win. However, LSU took one final shot at the endzone as Flynn connected with Byrd for the score, who then gave the "Can't See Me" gesture to the LSU student section after coming up with the catch.

2008: Freshman quarterback Jarrett Lee led LSU on a 7-play, 54-yard capped with an 18-yard TD pass to Brandon LaFell as the LSU Tigers rallied for a 26-21 win over Auburn. It marked the second straight year that LSU scored in the closing moments of the game to beat Auburn.

2010: Cam Newton rushed for 217 yards and 2 TDs in fourth-ranked Auburn's 24-17 win over undefeated and sixth-ranked LSU in Jordan-Hare Stadium. As a team, Auburn rushed for 440 yards, the most ever given up by an LSU team.

2011: LSU stepped out of its usual home attire and donned the Nike Pro Combat uniforms and responded with a 45-10 win in Tiger Stadium in what was the most lopsided victory (for either team) in the series.

2012: Trailing 10-9 at the half, No. 2 LSU held off an unranked Auburn team using a third-quarter field goal to prevail 12-10. Drew Alleman's field goal proved to be the only points for either team in the second half. Sam Montgomery had a safety and finished with 3.5 tackles for loss.

2016: Quarterback Danny Etling drove LSU the length of the field and connected with DJ Chark on 15-yard game-winning touchdown drive with no time remaining on the clock. The call was overturned by video review citing no time remaining on the clock and LSU fell to Auburn, 18-13. On the previous play, LSU was flagged for an illegal shift after picking up a first down at the Auburn 2-yard line with 0:01 to play. With the clock starting on the official's whistle, Etling - who rolled out of the pocket and found Chark for a tip-toe grab in the back-right corner of the endzone - was ruled to have received the snap after time had expired.

2017: Trailing 20-0 early in second quarter, LSU rallied for a 27-23 win to mark the largest comeback victory in a SEC game in Tiger Stadium for the Tigers. DJ Chark's 75-yard fourth quarter punt return got LSU to with 23-21 and then Connor Culp provided the go-ahead points on a 42-yard field goal to put the Tigers up 24-23 with 2:36 to go. Culp added a 36-yard field with 38 seconds left for the final margin.

2018: Down 21-13 midway through the fourth quarter, LSU quarterback Joe Burrow connected with Derrick Dillon for 71 yards on the first play of the drive to make it a two-point game at 21-19. After a defensive stop by LSU and with just over five minutes left in the contest, Burrow marched the Tigers down the field on a 14-play, 52-yard drive to the Auburn 24 where Cole Tracy drilled a 42-yard field goal as time expired, sending LSU to a 22-21 win over seventh-ranked Auburn in Jordan-Hare Stadium. Tracy's field goal marked the first time in school history LSU won a game on a field goal on the final play of regulation.

2019: No. 2 LSU overcame a pair of turnovers to defeat No. 9 Auburn, 23-20. Defensively, LSU held Auburn to 287 yards, forced 10 punts and had three sacks, as quarterback Bo Nix managed only 15-of-

35 passing for 157 yards with a touchdown and an interception. LSU was led by quarterback Joe Burrow, who posted career highs in passes (32) and attempts (42) for 321 yards with a touchdown passing and another rushing that put the homestanding Tigers ahead by 10 points early in the fourth quarter. It was the closest game LSU had in the 2019 perfect season.

2021: Auburn erased a 19-10 second half deficit, scoring 14 points in the fourth quarter to knock off LSU, 24-19, in Tiger Stadium.

2022: In **Brian Kelly's** first visit to the Plains, LSU came back from a 17-0 first half deficit, outscoring the homestanding Tigers 21-0 over the final 31 minutes of the contest to register the comeback.

Up Next: LSU Welcomes Army to Tiger Stadium

LSU plays its eighth straight game before finally getting to an open date, when the Tigers host Army at 6:30 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised on the SEC Network. It's only the second meeting between LSU and Army. The teams first met in 1931 in West Point with Army posting a 20-0 win over the Tigers.

LSU in the Polls

The Tigers remained in the Top 25 for the seventh straight week, moving up in both polls. The Tigers are No. 20 in this week's Coaches poll and No. 22 in the AP poll.

LSU's Won 8 Straight Night Games in Tiger Stadium; BK 6-0 At Night in Death Valley

LSU enters the Auburn contest riding a streak of 8 straight night game wins in Tiger Stadium. LSU is 2-0 in night games in Tiger Stadium this year (Grambling, Arkansas) and the Tigers won all 4 of their night games in 2022 after wins over ULM and Texas A&M under the lights in 2021. LSU's last home night game loss came to Arkansas on Nov. 13, 2021 by a 16-13 count in overtime. LSU coach **Brian Kelly** is 6-0 in night games at Tiger Stadium.

Nothing Like A Night Game in Tiger Stadium

There's not a better setting for college football than a night game in Tiger Stadium. It's not only the best atmosphere in college football, but it also creates a huge home field advantage for the Tigers. LSU has currently won 8 straight night games in Death Valley and since the turn of the century (2000-23), LSU is 103-15 in night games in Tiger Stadium. LSU went 49-5 from 2000-09, 43-7 from 2010-19 and is 11-3 in those games since 2020. Of the 15 losses since the start of the 2000 season, 8 have come to teams ranked in the Top 10 with five of those coming to teams ranked No. 1. LSU has only 2 non-conference losses in night games in Tiger Stadium since 2000 (UAB in 2000; Troy in 2017). Here's a look at LSU's night game record in Tiger Stadium by decade since the first game was played under the lights on Oct. 31, 1931 vs. Sewanee (lost, 12-6).

LSU Wins Again Despite Double-Digit First Half Deficit

For the fifth time under **Brian Kelly**, LSU rallied from a double-digit first half deficit to win a game as the Tigers erased a Missouri 15-point second quarter lead to beat Mizzou, 49-39. LSU trailed Missouri, 22-7, at the 10:47 mark in the second quarter. From there, it was all LSU as the Tigers outscored Missouri, 42-17, the rest of the way to win. A **Harold Perkins** interception at the 5:08 mark in the second quarter ignited LSU's rally as the Tigers got to within 25-22 at halftime and then took their first lead of the game on a 42-yard TD pass from **Jayden Daniels** to **Brian Thomas** at the 6-minute mark in the third quarter. LSU nearly made it a sixth victory despite trailing by double-digits in the first half vs. Ole Miss but the Tigers came up short in that contest, 55-49. LSU trailed Ole Miss 21-7 and 28-14 in the first half only to take the lead at 35-31 early in the third quarter. Ole Miss scored with 39 seconds left to win. For the third time this year, **QB Jayden Daniels** has been tabbed as the SEC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in the win over Missouri. **Daniels** is joined this week by sophomore **Emery Jones**, who earned SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week recognition. **Daniels**, who was also named SEC Player of the Week following wins over Mississippi State and Arkansas, turned in a gritty performance against Missouri, shaking off badly bruised ribs to lead the Tigers to the 49-39 victory. **Daniels** became the first player in LSU history to account for four TDs in a five straight games, throwing for three and rushing for one, as he guided a Tiger offense that racked up 533 total yards, including 274 on the ground. **Daniels** connected

on 15-of-21 passes, including 10-of-12 in the second half, for 259 yards and three scores. He also set a career-best with 130 rushing yards as he accumulated 389 yards of total offense.

After leaving game for three plays early in fourth quarter, **Daniels** returned on LSU's next series, throwing a 35-yard pass to **Malik Nabers** and then scoring on a 35-yard run to give LSU a 35-32 advantage with 7:54 to play. He then connected with **Nabers** on a 28-yard TD pass on LSU's next possession, putting the Tigers up for good, 42-39, with 2:58 remaining. **Daniels** rallied LSU from a 22-7 first half deficit marking the fifth time in his two years with the Tigers he led his team to victory despite trailing by double-digits in first half. **Jones**, a sophomore from Baton Rouge, played a dominant game, helping the Tigers to 274 rushing yards against a Missouri defense that led the SEC and ranked No. 8 nationally in rush defense at 74.8 yards per game. LSU averaged 6.5 yards per carry and didn't have a negative play on designed runs as the Tigers produced two 100-yard rushers – the first time in 2023 Missouri allowed an opponent to top the 100-yard mark. Jones played all 73 snaps in the win as the Tigers ran their record to 4-2 overall and 3-1 in conference play. It's the first conference player of the week honor for **Jones**.

Daniels Extends His Record Streak of Games With At Least 4 TDs to 5

QB Jayden Daniels extended his school-record streak of consecutive games accounting for at least 4 touchdowns to 5 in the win over Missouri when he rushed for 1 and threw for 3 in the 49-39 victory. **Daniels'** streak of consecutive games with at least 4 TDs dates back to the Grambling game in week 2 when he tossed 5 touchdown passes in the 72-10 win. Prior to last week, **Daniels** and Joe Burrow were the only players in LSU history to account for 4 TDs in 4 consecutive games. **Daniels** currently leads the SEC and ranks No. 2 in the nation in passing TDs (19), total TDs (23) and points responsible for (140). He trails only USC's Caleb Williams (22 passing TDs, 28 total TDs and 172 points responsible for) nationally in the 3 categories. Here's a look at **Daniels'** current streak:

Daniels Closing In On Burrow For Career 4 TD-Responsible For Games

QB Jayden Daniels is closing in on Joe Burrow's LSU career record of 12 games of being responsible for at least 4 TDs. **Daniels** has 8 games where he's accounted for at least 4 TDs – 3 in 2022 and 5 this year. Burrow did it 3 times in his first year at LSU in 2018 and then followed that with 9 games of 4 or more TDs in 2019.

Daniels Nearing 5,000 Passing Yards at LSU

QB Jayden Daniels goes into the Auburn game with 4,882 passing yards at LSU as he currently ranks No. 8 in LSU history on the career charts. **Daniels** is just 118 yards from becoming eighth player in LSU history to pass for 5,000 yards in a career. Tommy Hodson holds the LSU mark with 9,115 passing yards during his 4-year career from 1986-89.

LSU Has 2 100-Yard Rushers in Win Over Missouri (And SEC's best Run Defense)

RB Logan Diggs and **QB Jayden Daniels** each topped the 100-yard mark in rushing yards in the win over Missouri as the Tiger racked up 274 yards on the ground against a Mizzou defense that entered the game allowing only 75 yards a contest – best in the SEC. **Diggs** led the Tigers with a career-best 134 yards and a TD, while **Daniels** also set a career-high with 130 yards and a score. It marked the first time since the Ole Miss game in 2017 that LSU has had 2 players rush for 100 yards in the same game. In that game, Derrius Guice rushed for 276 yards, while Darrel Williams added 103. Against Missouri, LSU averaged 6.4 yards per carry and didn't have any negative plays on designed rushes. For the year, LSU has only lost 10 yards on designed running plays.

LSU Has 2 100-Yard Rushers and a 100-Yard Receiver vs. Missouri – Only 8th Time in School History

For only the 8th time in school history, LSU's offense featured a pair of 100-yard rushers along with a 100-yard receiver in the win over Missouri. **RB Logan Diggs** (134 yards) and **QB Jayden Daniels** (130 yards) both topped the 100-yard mark for rushing yards, while **WR Malik Nabers** had 146 receiving yards on 6 receptions. It's the first time since the Ole Miss game in 2017 that LSU featured 2 100-yard rushers and a 100-yard receiver in the same game – Derrius Guice, 276 rushing, Darrel Williams, 103 rushing, Darrel Williams 105 receiving. LSU Brings SEC's Top Offense Back To Baton Rouge

LSU brings the SEC's top-rated offense into Saturday's game against Auburn as the Tigers lead the league in points per game (44.8) and total offense (548.3). LSU is No. 2 in the SEC in both passing offense (337.7) and rushing offense (210.7). LSU leads the nation in total first downs (169) and first downs per game (28.2) and they stand atop the SEC offensive TDs (35) and 3rd-down conversions (40-of-71 for 56 pct.).

Daniels Ranks Among National Leaders in Most Passing Categories.

Six games into the season, **QB Jayden Daniels** has clearly established himself as one of the nation's top quarterbacks. The 3-time SEC Offensive Player of the Week in 2023, **Daniels** has completed 132-of-181 passes for 1,969 yards, 19 TDs, and only 2 interceptions. He's also rushed for 422 yards and four scores. Here's how he ranks both nationally and in the SEC in offensive categories:

Nabers and Thomas – The Best 1-2 WR Punch in SEC

Through 6 games, **Malik Nabers** and **Brian Thomas** have established themselves as the top wide receiver combination in the SEC. The duo has combined to catch 83 passes for 1,374 yards and 15 TDs. There's no other pass-catching combination in the league with better numbers. **Nabers** is No. 2 in the SEC in total receptions (46), receptions per game (7.7), receiving yards (771) and is third in receiving TDs (6). **Thomas** leads the FBS in receiving TDs (9), and ranks No. 4 in the SEC in receiving yards (603), t-No. 3 in total receptions (37), and receptions per game (6.2). Diggs Has 2nd Straight 100-Yard Game; Ranks No. 2 in SEC in Rushing

RB Logan Diggs had his second straight 100-yard game against Missouri, totaling a career-best 134 yards and a TD in the 49-39 victory. **Diggs** currently ranks No. 2 in the SEC in rushing yards per game with 97.6 a contest. He's the first LSU running back to have back-to-back 100-yard games in SEC play since 2021 when Ty Davis-Price did it against Alabama (104) and Arkansas (106). In 5 games (didn't play in the opener), **Diggs** has rushed for 488 yards and 4 TDs on 81 carries. He has yet to be tackled for a loss. He's averaging 6.4 yards a carry.

Perkins Settles In At Outside Linebacker/Nickel Position

Sophomore **Harold Perkins** has found his home on the defensive side of the ball for the Tigers, playing the outside linebacker spot in LSU's base defense and then moving to the nickel position in sub-packages. **Perkins** had another outstanding game against Missouri, recording 3 tackles, including one for a 3-yard loss, an interception, a pass breakup and a QB hurry in the win. It was **Perkins'** second quarter interception, when he dropped into coverage after showing blitz, that proved to be the spark the Tigers needed as LSU outscored Missouri, 42-17, from that point on. **Perkins'** interception resulted in an LSU touchdown 6 plays later as the Tigers pulled to within 22-17 late in the second quarter. Perkins, a preseason All-America selection, has 28 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss, 2 sacks 4 pass breakups, 3 QB hurries, 2 forced fumbles and an interception through 6 games.

Daniels Top 500-Yard Total Offense Mark vs. Ole Miss

Jayden Daniels topped the 500-yard mark for total offense for the first time of his career in week 5 vs. Ole Miss when he totaled 513 yards (414 passing, 99 rushing) in the contest. The 513 yards rank as the second-highest total in FBS this year (Byrum Brown of South Florida had 517 vs. Rice). **Daniels** joined only Rohan Davey and Joe Burrow as LSU players with 500-yard games to their credit. Davey did it once (540 vs. Alabama in 2001), while Burrow did it 3 times (all in 2019). **Daniels'** 513 yards vs. Ole Miss rank as the fifth-highest single-game total in LSU history.

LSU Comes From 17 Down to Beat Auburn, 21-17

A 23-yard fumble return for a touchdown by Jay Ward in the second quarter sparked a rally as LSU overcame a 17-0 first half deficit to beat Auburn, 21-17, at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Auburn took an early 7-0 lead on a 53-yard TD reception by Ja'Varrius Johnson on the opening possession of the game. Auburn stretched the margin to 14-0 following a 99-yard scoring drive early in the second quarter. A 29-yard field goal gave Auburn a 17-0 advantage with 9:38 left before halftime. LSU punted on its first five possessions but found life when BJ Ojuluri sacked Auburn quarterback Robby Ashford, forcing a fumble that was picked up by Ward, who raced 23-yards for a touchdown. Leading 17-7, Auburn missed a 40-yard field goal at the 1:56 mark in the second quarter and LSU took advantage, going 77 yards on 11 plays, capped with a 1-yard TD run by Jayden Daniels to pull to within 17-14 at halftime. After stopping Auburn on 4-and-10 at the LSU 37-yard line, LSU used its running game to go 63 yards on 7 plays, capped with a 20-yard TD run by John Emery to take its first lead of the game at 21-17 with 3:32 left in the third quarter. Auburn responded with a drive inside the LSU 10-yard line, however a Harold Perkins interception ended that Auburn drive. Auburn had one final chance at victory, driving to the LSU 35-yard line with just over two minutes left in the contest. However, on 2-and-11 at the LSU 36, Greg Brooks picked off Ashford at the 25-yard line, returning it 30 yards to the Auburn 45. LSU, needing only a first down to run out the clock, got it when Josh Williams moved the chains with a 3-yard run on 3-and-3 icing the victory.

Series Notes: No. 20/22 LSU will meet Auburn in football for the 58th time when the teams square off in Baton Rouge on Saturday. LSU is coming off a 49-39 victory over No. 25 Missouri last week, while Auburn had a bye week following a 27-20 loss to No. 1 Georgia. The last meeting between the two squads came in 2022, where LSU erased a 17-point deficit by scoring 21 unanswered points to come out of Jordan-Hare Stadium victorious. The Bayou Bengals hold a 32-24-1 advantage in the all-time series and a 19-6-1 advantage at their home stadium. The first meeting came in 1901 in Baton Rouge when LSU was defeated 28-0. Brian Kelly will be seeking his second career win over Auburn in this year's battle of the Tigers.

NOTEBOOK

Nabers Becomes Fifth-Fastest LSU WR to Reach 2,000 Career Receiving Yards

When LSU WR **Malik Nabers** recorded a catch-and-run of 39 yards on his third reception of the contest against Ole Miss, he became the fifth-fastest WR in program history to surpass 2,000 career receiving yards. By reaching the 2,000-yard mark in his 30th game, he sits behind only Ja'Marr Chase (24 games), Wendell Davis (26 games), Josh Reed (26 games), and Justin Jefferson (29 games) as the fastest to 2,000 yards in school history.

Defensive First-Timers

Unlike the LSU offense where the Tigers returned 17 players who had at least 1 career start for the Tigers at their position, that's not the case on the other side of the ball where the defense features just 8 players with at least 1 start at LSU. The Tiger defense is starting a transfer at cornerback (**Zy Alexander** from Southeastern Louisiana), a true freshman **Whit Weeks** or transfer **Omar Speights** (Oregon State) at linebacker, a pair of transfers at the JACK position (**Ovie Oghoufo** from Texas or **Bradyn Swinson** from Oregon), and McNeese/Marshall transfer **Andre Sam** at safety.

Nabers and Thomas Jr. Both Eclipse 100 Receiving Yards In 2 Straight Games – Arkansas and Ole Miss

Through 5 contests, LSU WR **Malik Nabers** and **Brian Thomas Jr.** have consistently shown they are the best receiving duo in the country. Against Ole Miss, **Nabers** and **Thomas Jr.** both finished the contest with 100-plus receiving yards for the second game in a row, marking the first time in program history a wide receiver tandem has done so. **Nabers** caught 8 passes for 102 yards against the Rebels, while **Thomas Jr.** hauled in 8 catches for 124 yards. In the matchup vs. Arkansas, **Nabers** (130) and **Thomas Jr.** (133) became the second wide receiver pair at LSU to account for more than 130 receiving yards in the same game since Ja'Marr Chase and Justin Jefferson did so against Texas in 2019.

LSU Pulls A Rarity With 2 100-Yard Receivers, 100-Yard Rusher vs. Ole Miss

With a pair of 100-yard receivers and a 100-yard rusher against Ole Miss, LSU's offensive trio of **Malik Nabers**, **Brian Thomas** and **Logan Diggs** pulled a rarity in the loss to the Rebels. It marked only the seventh time in school history LSU has had 2 100-yard receivers and a 100-yard rusher in the same game. The last time it happened came against Clemson in the 2019 CFP National Championship Game when Ja'Marr Chase (221 receiving), Justin Jefferson (106 receiving) and Clyde Edwards-Helaire (110 rushing) all hit the mark. Daniels Becomes First LSU QB To Account for 4-Plus TDs in 5 Straight Games During Same Season

With his performance against Missouri, QB **Jayden Daniels** became the first LSU QB to account for 4-plus TD's in 5 straight games in the same season. Prior to accomplishing this feat, **Daniels** was the first LSU QB to account for 4-plus TDs in four-straight games. In the last 5 games, **Daniels** has thrown 18 TD passes and run for 4 scores. Only 1 other player in LSU history has accounted for 4 TDs in 4 straight games – Joe Burrow, who did it in the final 2 games of 2018 and the first 2 games of the 2019 season. **Daniels** has now accounted for 51 TDs (36 passing, 15 rushing) in his 20-game career with the Tigers. The 51 TDs rank No. 6 in school history for a career. Burrow holds the mark with 88 and **Daniels** needs 3 more to jump into the top-5 and eclipse legendary RB Kevin Faulk's 53 total TDs.

Daniels Moves Up Career TD Responsible For List at LSU

By accounting for 4 TDs against Missouri (3 passing, 1 rushing), **QB Jayden Daniels** ran his career total to 51, which ranks No. 6 in school history. During his 20-game LSU career, **Daniels** has passed for 36 TDs and rushed for another 15. Joe Burrow holds the LSU mark with 88 TDs responsible for during his 29-game career with the Tigers. **Daniels** sits behind Kevin Faulk at No. 5 with 53 and JaMarcus Russell at No. 4 with 56.

LSU Starts Same Group On Offensive Line In First 6 Games of Season - A First Since 2013

LSU's starting 5 on the offensive line remained intact against Missouri as the Tigers used the same starting 5 for the first 6 games of the season. It's the first time since 2013 LSU has opened a season with the same starting offensive line in the first 6 games of the year. This year's LSU offensive line has combined for 92 starts and all 5 starters have at least 16 career starts to their credit with **C Charles Turner** leading the way with 20. He's followed by **LT Will Campbell** (19), **RG Miles Frazier** (19), **RT Emery Jones Jr.** (18) and **LG Garrett Dellinger** (16). In 2013, LSU used its same starting 5 on the offensive line for the first 8 games of the season. That starting 5 included: La'el Collins (LT), Vadal Alexander (LG), Elliot Porter (C), Trae Turner (RG), and Jeremy Hawkins (RT).

LSU Is 5-1 After A Loss Under BK

LSU is 5-1 under head coach **Brian Kelly** is games following a loss. The Tigers were 3-1 in those games last year and are 2-0 this year. The Tigers have lost back-to-back games only once under BK, that coming last year when the Tigers dropped a 38-23 decision to Texas A&M in the regular-season finale and then fell to No. 1 Georgia, 50-30, in the SEC Championship Game.

Daniels Joins Elite Group in FBS 10,000-Passing Yard, 2,000-Rushing Yard Club

LSU **QB Jayden Daniels** became only the 6th player in FBS history to pass for 10,000 yards and rush for 2,000 yards in a career against Arkansas in week 4. **Daniels** reached the 10,000-yard milestone on a 26-yard completion to **Brian Thomas** with 38 seconds remaining in the second quarter. **Daniels**, who spent his first 3 years at Arizona State, accomplished the milestone in the 46th game of his career. Daniels Joins Jordan Jefferson on LSU's 4,000-1,000-Yard (Passing-Rushing) Club

When **Jayden Daniels** connected with **Brian Thomas** on a 49-yard TD just before halftime in week 4 vs. Arkansas, he became the latest 4,000-yard passer in LSU history, topping the mark with 38 seconds left in the second quarter. In doing so, **Daniels** joined former Tiger Jordan Jefferson as the only players in school history with 4,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in an LSU uniform. **Daniels** goes into the Auburn game with 4,882 passing yards and 1,177 rushing yards during his 20-game LSU career. Jefferson finished his career with 4,733 passing yards and 1,307 rushing yards.

Daniels Holds LSU Career Mark for Rushing Yards By A QB

Jayden Daniels set the LSU career rushing mark by a quarterback when bettered Jordan Jefferson's previous record of 1,018 against Mississippi State in week 3. **Daniels** needed only 16 games to break the mark. He goes into the Auburn game with 1,307 yards rushing in 20 games at LSU.

Nabers and Thomas Add Names To Jefferson-Chase List

When **Malik Nabers** and **Brian Thomas** each went over 130 receiving yards against Arkansas, they became only the second duo in LSU history to accomplish such a feat. The only other time in school history LSU has had a pair of receivers with 130 yards or more in the same game came against Texas in 2019 when Justin Jefferson (163) and Ja'Marr Chase (147) did it in the win over the Longhorns. LSU actually had a third receiver with 100 yards in the Texas game as Terrace Marshall hauled in 6 passes for 123 yards.

Game Ball

Following each win dating back to the beginning of head coach **Brian Kelly's** tenure in 2022, he and the staff present the "game ball" to a player who had the biggest impact on the win. **RB Noah Cain** received the first game ball of the season in the locker room following LSU's win over Grambling State in week 2. **WR Brian Thomas Jr.** earned the game ball for his performance against Arkansas, catching 5 passes for 133 yards and 2 TDs. Most recently, **Jayden Daniels** was awarded the game ball for his gutsy performance vs. Missouri where he accounted for 4 TDs and 389 yards of total offense (130 rushing, 259 passing) in the victory. **Greg Brooks** earned the game ball following LSU's win over Mississippi State when the team dedicated its performance to its team captain. Daniels Keeps Adding to His List of LSU Records

Jayden Daniels, one of the most dynamic quarterbacks in college football, is back for his second season as the starter for the Tigers after leading LSU to a 10-4 mark and the SEC Western Division title in 2022. A first-team preseason All-SEC by both the media and the SEC Coaches, **Daniels** opened 2023 with 411 yards of total offense (347 passing, 64 rushing) against Florida State. A year ago, **Daniels** set LSU records for rushing yards (875) and rushing TDs (11) by a quarterback. He also became the first player in LSU history to run for 3 TDs and pass for 3 TDs in game decided in regulation (at Florida in 2022). **Daniels** was one of only 2 quarterbacks (other was John Rhys Plumlee of UCF) in FBS to rush for 800 yards (885) and throw for at least 2,500 yards (2,913). - 5 TD passes vs. Grambling, a career-best and ties for third-highest total in LSU history

- Rushed (2) and passed (2) for 4 TDs vs. Mississippi State marking 7th time at LSU he's rushed/passed for TDs in same game (LSU is 7-0 in those games)
- Accounted for 5 TD's against Ole Miss, becoming the first LSU QB to account for 4-plus TD's in four-straight games during the same season
- Added to his streak of games with 4-plus TDs accounted for by passing for 3 and rushing for 1 against Missouri

- 3,798 yards of total offense (885 rushing, 2,913 passing) ranks No. 2 in single-season LSU history

- One of only 2 QBs nationally with 800-plus rushing yards and 2,500-plus passing yards

Daniels Ranks No. 2 to Only Burrow at LSU in Career 400-Yard Total Offense Games

QB Jayden Daniels had 400 yards of total offense for the fourth time of his LSU career vs. Ole Miss with 513 vs. the Rebels. It's the third time this year **Daniels** has gone over the 400-yard mark for total offense – he opened the season with 411 yards (367 passing, 64 rushing) against Florida State. Only Heisman Trophy winner Joe Burrow has more 400-yard games in LSU history than **Daniels**. Burrow did it 6 times during his career at LSU from 2018-19. Mason Taylor Moves Up Tight End Receiving List

With 4 receptions against Missouri, sophomore **TE Mason Taylor** ran his career numbers to 55 receptions for 574 yards. **Taylor's** 55 receptions rank No. 7 on LSU's all-time list for a player at his position. **Taylor** is one catch short of tying Brad Boyd and needs 5 receptions to move past Robert Royal (59 catches). Richard Dickson holds the LSU record for receptions by a tight end with 90.

Nabers Ties LSU Mark For Receptions in a Half; Fourth-Most Receiving Yards in a Half

WR Malik Nabers tied the LSU mark for receptions in a half when he caught 10 passes for 188 yards in the win over Mississippi State. The 10 receptions tied Josh Reed's previous mark set against Alabama in 2001. In that game, Reed set the SEC record with 19 receptions for 293 yards in the 35-21 LSU victory. **Nabers'** 188 receiving yards stand as the fourth-highest total for a half in LSU history trailing only Kayshon Boutte (199 vs. Ole Miss, 2020), Ja'Marr Chase (199 at Vanderbilt, 2019), and Terrace Marshall (195 at Missouri, 2020).

LSU Has Punted Only 13 Times In 2023

The one person who suffers from an efficient offense is that of the punter as senior **Jay Bramblett** has punted only 13 times this year. The 13 punts are the fewest in the SEC and tie for the third-fewest among all FBS teams in 2023. **Bramblett** has made the most of his punts, averaging 42.2 yards on 13 punts. He's had 5 of his punts downed inside the 20-yard line, including one at the goal line vs. Florida State and one at the Missouri 5-yard line on their second-to-last drive of the game.

Diggs Joins Cecil "The Diesel" In Rare LSU Company

When transfer **RB Logan Diggs** rushed for 115 yards in his LSU debut vs. Grambling, he became the first Tiger running back to go over 100 yards in his debut as a Tiger since Cecil "The Diesel" Collins did it in 1997. Collins rushed for 172 yards on 22 carries in a 24-9 win over Mississippi State in week 2 of the 1997 season. Collins didn't play in the season-opener that year against Texas-El Paso. **Diggs** leads the Tigers n rushing with 354 yards and 3 TDs on 57 carries. He's averaging 88.5 yards per game, which ranks No. 3 in the SEC.

LSU's Running Back Room Features 3 Who Have Rushed for 100 Yards In A Game

With the return of **John Emery** to the field in week 3 vs. Mississippi State, LSU's running back room features 3 players who have a 100-yard rushing game to their credit. Notre Dame transfer **Logan Diggs** (134) and **QB Jayden Daniels** (130) are the most recent to reach the 100-yard mark with 264 yards and 2 TD's combined in the win against Missouri. **Emery** and **Josh Williams** both have 100-yard games to their credit. LSU Scores TDs On Modern Day School-Record 10 Straight Possessions Against Grambling

LSU opened the Grambling game by scoring touchdowns on its first 10 possessions, a first in modern day school history. **QB Jayden Daniels** directed LSU on 6 TD drives in the first half before giving way to **Garrett Nussmeier**, who then directed the Tigers on 3 more scores. True freshman **Rickie Collins** guided LSU on the 10th and final scoring drive before the Tigers eventually turned the ball over on downs on their next possession.

LSU Goes Over 300-Yards Both Passing and Rushing vs. Grambling

LSU accomplished another rare feat against Grambling as the Tigers went over the 300-yard mark in both rushing and passing yards in the win over the G-Men. LSU finished the game with 302 yards on the ground and 320 yards through the air. It's the first time since 2013 vs. Furman, and only the fourth time in school history that the Tigers managed to top the 300-yard mark in both categories. Daniels Has Fourth Game Accounting For 5 TDs

Jayden Daniels accounted for 5 TDs in a game for the fourth time of his career in week 5 vs. Ole Miss. **Daniels** passed for 4 TDs and rushed for another against the Rebels. It marked the fourth time in his 19-game LSU career **Daniels** has been responsible for 5 touchdowns in a game. Joe Burrow did it 7 times during his career, the most in school history. Last year, **Daniels** became the first player in LSU history to rush for 3 TDs and pass for 3 TDs in a game decided in a regulation when he did it in the win over Florida. The following week against Ole Miss, **Daniels** rushed for 3 TDs and passed for 2 more in the LSU victory. Here's a look at **Daniels'** 5 TD games at LSU:

Daniels 1 of 4 LSU Quarterbacks With 5 Passing TDs in a Game

With 5 TD passes against Grambling, **QB Jayden Daniels** joined Joe Burrow, Max Johnson and Zach Mettenberger as the only players in school history to reach that total in a single-game. Burrow holds the school-record with 7 against Oklahoma in the CFP Semifinal and he has the most games with at least 5 TD passes at 6. Johnson did it against Central Michigan in 2021, while Mettenberger was the first Tiger to reach the mark against UAB in 2013. Here's a look at the LSU players with at least 5 TD passes in a game:

In LSU's 72-point performance against Grambling, the Tigers had 9 players record either receiving, rushing or passing touchdowns. Jayden Daniels led the way with 5 passing touchdowns, becoming the fourth Tiger to do so in a game. Furthermore, all 5 of his touchdowns came through the air as he joined Joe Burrow (7 vs. Oklahoma in the first half of the 2019 Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl) as the only other LSU QB with at least 5 in one half. Logan Diggs (1), Kaleb Jackson (2), Noah Cain (1) and Garrett Nussmeier all had rushing touchdowns. Brian Thomas Jr. (2), Malik Nabers (1), Kyren Lacy (1) and Mason Taylor (1) recorded receiving touchdowns. It marked the third time in program history and first time since 1977 where the Tigers had at least five rushing touchdowns and five passing touchdowns in the same contest. BK and Dietzel Only Coaches In LSU History To Lead Tigers to 10 Wins After Dropping Opener

Last year, **Brian Kelly** joined Paul Dietzel as the only coaches in LSU history to lead their teams to a 10-win season after dropping the season-opener. In 2022, **Kelly** and the Tigers fell to Florida State, 24-23, in New Orleans and then went on to win 10 games, including victories over Ole Miss and Alabama, along with a berth in the SEC Championship Game. In 1961, fifth-ranked LSU fell to unranked Rice, 16-3, in Houston and then reeled off 10 straight victories to go 10-1 overall and win the SEC title. LSU won its 10th game that year in the Orange Bowl, beating No. 7 Colorado, 25-7.

Brian Kelly's Won At Least 10 Games For Six Straight Seasons; Nation's Third-Longest Active Streak

LSU coach **Brian Kelly** brings a 6-year streak of winning at least 10 games into the 2023 season. In his first year at LSU, Kelly guided the Tigers to a 10-4 mark and the SEC Western Division title. **Kelly's** streak of at least 10 wins goes back to 2017 at Notre Dame when the Irish were 10-3 overall. He followed that with a 12-1 mark in 2018, 11-2 in 2019, 10-2 in 2020, and 11-1 in 2021. His six consecutive seasons of at least 10 wins trails only Nick Saban (15) and Dabo Swinney (12).

Brooks, Campbell, Daniels and Wingo Named LSU Captains for 2023

LSU coach **Brian Kelly** announced Tuesday of Florida State game week that **Jayden Daniels**, **Will Campbell**, **Mekhi Wingo** and **Greg Brooks** will serve as team captains for the Tigers in 2023. The four captains were voted to their leadership role by their teammates. All four players are entering their second season with the Tigers and they were all starters on last year's team that won 10 games and claimed the SEC Western Division crown.

Perkins Headlines List of 3 Tigers on AP Preseason All-America Team

LSU sophomore **LB Harold Perkins Jr.** is one of 3 Tigers named to the AP Preseason All-America Team. **Perkins** is a first-team selection, while **DT Mekhi Wingo** and **WR Malik Nabers** were both named second-team. Here's how the three players have fared in LSU's first 6 games of the season:

Wingo To Wear No. 18 In 2023

Junior **DT Mekhi Wingo** will wear No. 18 for the Tigers this year. He was presented the jersey by head coach **Brian Kelly** following practice on the Saturday prior to the season opener in Tiger Stadium. "The number 18 has great historical significance with our program," **Kelly** said. "It's a number that has national championship significance with Matt Mauck wearing it in 2003 and leading LSU to its first national title since 1958. He passed it on to Jacob Hester who won a national championship in 2007. "It's worn by a player who represents the traits and spirit associated with a successful program and that's Mekhi." **Wingo** quickly established himself as a leader for the Tigers on and off the field after transferring to LSU prior to the 2022 season. Last year, he earned third-team AP All-America honors as well as being a member of the SEC Football Leadership Council and a nominee for the AFCA Good Works Team. He also was one of three players to represent LSU at SEC Football Media Days in July. In May, **Wingo** was one of 11 LSU players who traveled to Africa as part of the program's first Study Abroad initiative. "This means a lot to me and I want to thank BJ (Ojulari) for showing me how to properly wear this number," **Wingo** told the team after practice. "I'm going to play my heart out and represent this number and all those who have worn it before me the right way."

Campbell Awarded No. 7 Jersey; Will Wear Patch On His No. 66 Uniform

Sophomore left tackle **Will Campbell** was awarded the No. 7 jersey for the 2023. **Kelly** presented **Campbell** with his jersey following practice on the Saturday prior to the season-opener in Tiger Stadium. As an offensive lineman, the rules of college football prevent **Campbell** from actually wearing the No. 7 jersey so instead his No. 66 jersey will be accompanied by a No. 7 patch. **Campbell**, a native of Monroe, was a day 1 starter on the offensive line for the Tigers in 2022, becoming the first true freshman in school history to be the everyday starter left tackle. He capped his rookie season earning second-team All-SEC honors as well as being a Freshman All-America. "The (number) 7 has an interesting history that starts with Patrick Peterson," **Kelly** said when presenting **Campbell** his jersey. "He was an outstanding player. Prolific playmakers have worn (number) 7. I wanted to take a spin and make it about Louisiana. That's my spin. This year we wanted to highlight the group that doesn't get much notoriety. We went with Louisiana bred Will Campbell. I like the significance of the left tackle because he is a playmaker who must protect the quarterback every play." Outside of Billy Cannon's retired No. 20 jersey, the Nos. 18 and 7 are two of the most iconic LSU football numbers and have been worn by some of the all-time greats in school history.

Wingo Named to Allstate Good Works Team

DT Mekhi Wingo is one of 11 players from the Football Bowl Division (FBS) to be selected for the 2023 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team was established in 1992 as a way to recognize college football players for their work in communities. This year's Allstate AFCA Good Works Team was selected from 136 student-athletes who were nominated from across the country. **Wingo**, a junior from St. Louis, has been a leader for the Tigers since arriving on campus last year after transferring from Missouri. A member of the SEC Football Leadership Council, **Wingo** is one of four permanent team captains for the Tigers this year. He was also selected to wear No. 18 for the Tigers, a number given to a player who best represents the traits associated with LSU football and its mission to graduate champions.

Wingo's list of community involvement during his time at LSU include:

- Served as a host for the Boys & Girls Club on a recent visit to the LSU Football Operations Center.
- Participated in Literacy Fest at McKinley Senior High School where he addressed the students about the importance of academics as well as being a well-rounded person.
- Joined LSU teammates at the Baton Rouge Food Bank in August as they packed nearly 8,000 pounds of water, 32,000 pounds of food – the equivalent of nearly 27,000 meals for the less fortunate in the Baton Rouge area.
- Distributed food for victims at the Domestic Violence Shelter.
- At a community service event at the Citrus Bowl, he befriended a young girl and noticed her shoes were too small. He took it upon himself to find out what size shoes she wore and purchased her a new pair.
- As part of LSU's football leadership, he helps coordinate visits with sick children and the team. Recently he was part of a group of players who hosted a 9-year-old boy with lymphoblastic lymphoma. Mekhi and his teammates presented the child with an LSU jersey, took pictures with the family and gave him a tour of the football facility.
- Serves as LSU's representative on the SEC Football Leadership Council. The council travels to the SEC headquarters to meet with the Commissioner and others around the league to discuss their sport and the student-athlete experience.
- He was one of 11 LSU football players to Study Abroad in May. The group traveled to Senegal where they learned about the culture, participated in community service events, and engaged in activities with the youth of Senegal. The 8-day trip is the first of its kind for LSU football players to participate in.

Josh Williams Nominated for NFF Scholar-Athlete Award

Senior running back **Josh Williams** has been nominated for the prestigious Campbell Trophy, the National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Award. **Williams** graduated with a 3.4 grade point average in marketing and is currently pursuing a Master's in business administration. He's a 3-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll. A former walk-on, **Williams** led all LSU running backs in rushing yards with 532 to go along with 6 TDs in 2022.

Three Players from 2019 National Championship Still on Roster

BK Joined Miles and McElwain As First-Year SEC Coaches To Reach League Title Game

LSU coach **Brian Kelly** joined a small group of only two other SEC coaches to take their team to the league's title game in their first season in the conference last year. **Kelly** joined Les Miles (2005) and Jim McElwain (2015 at Florida) as the only three first-year SEC coaches to reach the championship game.

2022 Tigers: From Cellar to Championship Game In Just One Season Under Brian Kelly

In 2022, LSU joined Arkansas in 1995 and Auburn in 2013 as the only teams to reach the SEC title game a year after finishing last in its division. LSU finished last in the SEC Western Division in 2021 with a 3-5 league mark and advanced to the 2022 SEC Championship Game with a 6-2 conference record. Arkansas was the first to do it, going 2-6 in 1994, followed by a division-winning mark of 6-2 in 1995. Auburn was next to accomplish the feat, going 7-1 in 2013 after finishing last in the SEC West in 2012 with an 0-8 mark.

11 Tigers Studied Abroad in Senegal In May

The mission of LSU's football under **Brian Kelly** is to "Graduate Champions". One area Kelly has emphasized for the players is to build and identity outside of football. He wants them to be more than just football players and to create a brand and image that compliments what they are doing on the field. As he did for many years at Notre Dame, **Kelly** has implemented a "Study Abroad" program for LSU football players. In its first year, 11 players traveled to Senegal for 10 days in May to have an educational experience outside of the United States. "One of the things that I have tried to do since coming to LSU is to not only set the standards and the process of building a program that graduates champions, but to help our players establish an identity outside of football," **Kelly** said. "To get the opportunity to study abroad is an experience that student-athletes really don't get the chance to do so for our players to be able to participate in this unique educational program is something that I think will have a lifelong impact on them. I want our players to have the opportunity to see things from a different perspective and to really take ownership in their studies and to understand that there's much more out there than just being a football player. The opportunities of being an LSU football player go far beyond the field so I want to use the study abroad program to help them understand that. This is one of those pieces that we can continue to build on as we work with their identity outside of football and they are excited about it."

Football Drops Season Opener to Florida State, 45-24

Fifth-ranked LSU held a 17-14 halftime lead over No. 8 Florida State, but the Seminoles scored 31 unanswered points in the second half to post a 45-24 win over the Tigers. FSU quarterback Jordan Travis threw for 342 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Seminoles to the season-opening victory. Wide receiver Keon Coleman caught nine of Travis' passes for 122 yards and three touchdowns, while wide receiver Jonny Wilson added seven catches for 104 yards. LSU quarterback Jayden Daniels completed 22-of-37 passes for 347 yards and one touchdown, marking his second-highest yardage total in two seasons with the Tigers. Wide receiver Brian Thomas caught seven passes for 142 yards, including a 75-yard TD from Daniels. The Tigers drove to the FSU one-yard line on the opening possession of the game; however, LSU could not convert the 61-yard march into points. Florida State grabbed a 7-0 lead when Travis completed a 40-yard touchdown pass to Coleman midway through the first quarter, but the Tigers quickly answered when running back Tre Bradford capped a 75-yard drive with a one-yard TD plunge. LSU surged ahead with 6:02 remaining in the first half when running back Noah Cain's one-yard dive culminated a 51-yard possession, and the Seminoles tied the contest at 14-14 at the 1:01 mark when Travis connected with Coleman on a 21-yard scoring pass. Daniels led an efficient 67-yard drive over the last minute of the half, and Damian Ramos nailed a 36-yard field goal to give the Tigers a 17-14 advantage at intermission. Florida State placekicker Ryan Fitzgerald tied the game at 17-17 with a 33-yard field goal at the 9:19 mark of the third quarter, and the Seminoles followed with four consecutive touchdown drives to seize control of the game.

Football Dominates Grambling in Home Opener, 72-10

LSU quarterback Jayden Daniels fired five touchdown passes to lead the 14th-ranked Tigers to a 72-10 win over Grambling State in Tiger Stadium. LSU improved to 1-1 on the season, while Grambling dropped to 0-2 in the historic first meeting between the schools on the gridiron. LSU's 72 points marked its highest scoring total in a four-quarter game since September 24, 1977, when the Tigers blanked Rice, 77-0, in Death Valley. Daniels completed 18 of 24 passes for 269 yards and a career-high five touchdowns, all in the first half, as LSU bolted to a 42-10 halftime advantage. He became the fourth Tiger to throw for at least five TDs in a single game, joining Zach Mettenberger (one time in 2013), Joe Burrow (six times in 2019) and Max Johnson (one time in 2021) as LSU quarterbacks to accomplish the feat. Daniels' outing increased his total number of passing touchdowns at LSU to 23 and to 55 for his entire collegiate career. Brian Thomas Jr. led all of LSU's receivers with six receptions for 78 yards and two touchdowns. Running back Logan Diggs, a transfer from Notre Dame, saw action for the first time in an LSU uniform and led the Tigers with 115 yards rushing and a touchdown on 15 carries. The LSU defense blanked Grambling in the second half and limited the GSU offense to just 61 yards after halftime. Cornerback Zy Alexander and linebacker West Weeks each recorded six tackles to lead the Tigers. Linebacker Greg Penn III intercepted a pass with 12:29 left in the third quarter, marking the junior's first career interception. LSU did not record a punt in the game, marking the eighth time since 1960 the Tigers were not forced to punt for an entire contest.

Daniels, Nabers Unstoppable; Football Rolls Past Mississippi State, 41-14

LSU quarterback Jayden Daniels completed 30-of-34 passes for 361 yards and two touchdowns to lead the 14th-ranked Tigers to a 41-14 win over Mississippi State in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams. LSU improved to 2-1 on the season, 1-0 in the SEC, while Mississippi State dropped to 2-1 overall and 0-1 in league play. LSU, which compiled 530 yards in total offense, improved to 21-3 in its series with Mississippi State since the 2000 season. Daniels, who also rushed 15 times for 64 yards and two touchdowns, completed his first 13 passes of the game and recorded his ninth career 300-yard passing outing. Wide receiver Malik Nabers turned in spectacular performance with 13 receptions for 239 yards and two first-half touchdown connections with Daniels covering 26 and 33 yards, as the Tigers bolted to a 24-0 second-quarter lead. Nabers tied the LSU record for most receptions in a half, as he logged 10 catches for 188 yards in the first half, matching the first-half total of Josh Reed at Alabama in 2001. Nabers' total of 239 receiving yards was the fourth-highest single-game mark in LSU history, and his total of 13 receptions was No. 5 in the Tigers' single-game annals. LSU's defense was also superb in Starkville, limiting Mississippi State to just 201 yards in total offense. The Bulldogs had only two first downs and 79 total yards in the first half. True freshman linebacker Whit Weeks, making his first career start, led the Tigers with eight total tackles, and he added a quarterback hurry. LSU posted four sacks, one each by linebacker Harold Perkins Jr., defensive tackle Mekhi Wingo, defensive end Sa'vion Jones and safety Major Burns.

Late Field Goal Powers No. 12 LSU Past Arkansas, 34-31

LSU placekicker Damian Ramos booted a 20-yard field goal with five second remaining in the game to lift the 12th-ranked Tigers to a 34-31 win over Arkansas in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams. LSU improved to 3-1 on the season, 2-0 in the SEC, while Arkansas dropped to 2-2 overall and 0-1 in league play. The game-winning drive was engineered by quarterback Jayden Daniels, who led the Tigers on a nine-play, 72-yard march to the Razorbacks' three-yard line that ran 5:01 off the clock and set up Ramos' deciding kick. Daniels directed an LSU offense that rolled up 509 total yards, as he completed 20-of-29 passes for 320 yards and four touchdowns. Wide receivers Brian Thomas Jr. and Malik Nabers combined to catch 13 of Daniels' tosses for 263 yards and four touchdowns. Thomas Jr. recorded five receptions for 133 yards and two touchdowns, with each score covering 49 yards. Nabers caught eight passes for 130 yards and two touchdowns that covered eight and 20 yards. The Tigers also netted 189 yards on the ground, with running back Logan Diggs gaining 97 yards on 14 carries. LSU trailed 13-3 with 48 seconds left in the first half when Daniels whisked the Tigers 75 yards in three plays, with the march culminating in a 49-yard TD strike to Thomas Jr. The Tigers grabbed their first lead of the contest in the opening minute of the second half, as Daniels again directed a three-play, 75-yard drive that also ended in a 49-yard scoring connection with Thomas Jr. Daniels' 20-yard TD pass to Nabers in the fourth quarter broke a 24-24 deadlock, and after Arkansas responded to tie the game with 5:06 remaining, the Tigers embarked on their final march to victory.

Football Falls to No. 20 Ole Miss in Offensive Shootout, 55-49

Ole Miss quarterback Jaxson Dart threw a 13-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Tre Harris with 39 seconds remaining in the game to give the 20th-ranked Rebels a 55-49 win over No. 12 LSU. The Tigers dropped to 3-2 on the season, 2-1 in the SEC, while Ole Miss improved to 4-1 overall and 1-1 in league play. LSU quarterback Jayden Daniels guided the Tigers to the Ole Miss 26-yard line with a chance to win the game, but his final pass to the end zone fell incomplete, securing the Rebels' victory. Daniels produced a phenomenal performance, completing 27-of-36 passes for 414 yards and four touchdowns. He also rushed 15 times for 99 yards and one TD. LSU accumulated 637 yards in total offense, 414 through the air and 223 on the ground. Wide receiver Brian Thomas Jr. caught eight passes from Daniels for 124 yards and three touchdowns covering 20, 11 and 34 yards. Wide receiver Malik Nabers added eight receptions for 102 yards, including a 39-yard catch. LSU running back Logan Diggs rushed for 101 yards on 19 carries, and he scored twice on TD bursts of one and 12 yards. The Tigers overcame a 14-point first-half deficit and grabbed their first lead of the game at the 11:30 mark of the third quarter when Daniels' one-yard quarterback sneak gave LSU a 35-31 advantage. Daniels' 34-yard TD strike to Thomas Jr. with 8:34 left in the contest gave the Tigers their largest lead at 49-40, but Ole Miss scored touchdowns on its next two offensive possessions to claim the win.

Defense Holds Late; Football Powers Past No. 21 Missouri, 49-39

LSU quarterback Jayden Daniels fired a 29-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Malik Nabers with 2:58 remaining in the game to provide the go-ahead score, and safety Major Burns sealed the outcome with a pick-six as No. 23 LSU defeated No. 21 Missouri, 49-39. LSU improved to 4-2 on the season, 3-1 in the SEC, while Missouri dropped to 5-1 overall and 1-1 in league play. The Daniels-to-Nabers connection capped a five-play, 75-yard march that erased a 39-35 Missouri lead. The LSU defense followed with two stops of the Mizzou offense, the first on a turnover-on-downs and the second on Burns' interception of quarterback Brady Cook that resulted in a 17-yard touchdown return. LSU, which trailed 22-7 in the second quarter, won its seventh game away from home since 1943 when trailing by 15+ points. The Tigers improved to 33-3 since 2000 when recording a pick-6 in a game. Daniels brilliantly guided the LSU offense to a total of 533 yards, as he rushed 15 times for 130 yard and a 35-yard touchdown, and he completed 15-of-21 passes for 259 yards and three TDs. Running back Logan Diggs rushed for a career-high 134 yards and one touchdown on 24 carries, averaging 5.6 yards per attempt. Nabers caught six passes for 146 and one TD, and wide receiver Brian Thomas Jr. had four receptions for 66 yards and one score. Burns' late-game interception was the second turnover produced by the LSU defense, as linebacker Harold Perkins Jr.'s second-quarter pick of a Cook pass at the Mizzou 45-yard line led to a three-yard scoring pass from Daniels to tight end Mason Taylor.
