# Matt McMahon

## Head Coach

2nd Year at LSU · 9th Year as a Head Coach

LSU Men's Basketball Head Coach Matt McMahon has five simple core values that define him and his basketball program at LSU:

**Hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy.**

Those were some of the first words he said when he stepped to the podium for the first time as the 25th LSU men's basketball head coach on March 22, 2022.

And even though the first season proved difficult as Coach McMahon and staff had to rebuild a roster completely from scratch in less than 45 days, the characteristics of a Matt McMahon program were there for people to clearly see.

Now as the LSU Basketball program begins its second season, Coach McMahon under the cornerstone of those core values has welcomed in an older, more experienced group of players who not only understand the fundamentals of the game, but also the culture of the environment with many having lived and played in around the Baton Rouge/LSU area.

LSU, Coach McMahon and staff laid a new foundation a year ago and now has many of the tools needed to build on that foundation.

The culture and success were on display during the seven years at Murray State University where Coach McMahon led the Racers to a record of 154-67, a .697 winning percentage. He led Murray State to 93 OVC regular-season wins, winning 75 percent of league games.

He has also coached multiple all-Americans and all-league players such as Ja Morant who was named NBA Rookie of the Year in 2020.

The Racers won regular season league titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2022 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2018, 2019 and 2022 (the 2020 appearance was canceled by the pandemic).

Since the native of Oak Ridge, Tennessee, became the third-youngest rookie among D1 coaches in 2015, McMahon has continued a steady move forward with a reputation for developing talent both as an assistant and head coach. He has become known nationally as an excellent recruiter and he is among the best in the nation in the area of player development and game planning.

In his final season at Murray State in 2021-22, McMahon coached OVC Player of the Year KJ Williams and two other recipients of first-team honors (Tevin Brown, Justice Hill). In addition, McMahon was named the league's Coach of the Year.

Williams and his successfully play translated to the Southeastern Conference where he earned All-SEC honors in a super senior year when he became at the time in January 2023 the 123rd player in Division I college basketball to amass 2,000 career points and 1,000 rebounds.

McMahon's Racers, in 2021-22, were just the

sixth team in league history to go undefeated and the first to do it in an 18-game conference schedule. Murray State then won the two league tournament games to advance to the NCAA Tournament where, as a No. 7 seed, the Racers defeated San Francisco to advance to the round of 32.

The 2021-22 team was one of seven teams to win 30 or more games and led the nation in win percentage at 91.2 percent (31-3). The Racers were ranked No. 20 in the final AP poll and No. 22 in the Ferris Mowers Coaches Poll.

McMahon was the first MSU coach to have three seasons of 25 or more wins and one of just three Murray State coaches to have four 20-win seasons.

Coach McMahon led the Racers to three-straight OVC regular season championships (2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20) and two consecutive OVC Tournament titles (2017-18, 2018-19).

The 2018-19 team won 28 games and made its mark in the NCAA Tournament when the 12th-seeded Racers won their fourth all-time tourney game by defeating No. 5 seed Marquette.

That season, Morant named the OVC POY, leading Division I in assists and earning first-team all-America honors from the USBWA.

He was drafted second overall in the 2019 NBA draft by the Memphis Grizzlies.

In 2017-18, McMahon's team won 26 games and the OVC regular season and tournament championship, sending the Racers to what was at that time the school's 16th NCAA Tournament.

Prior to being named head coach, he was a key part of Coach Steve Prohm's staff as assistant at Murray State as the Racers won a pair of Ohio Valley Conference championships, a CollegeInsider.com Tournament championship and an appearance in the NIT. He was part of a staff that won 104 games from 2011-15.

In 2014-15, MSU became the first team in school history to go undefeated in the OVC at 16-0 and set a league record with a 25-game win streak that was second best in the nation. Three seasons earlier, McMahon was named to the list of best assistant coaches

by FoxSports.com and CollegeInsider.com.

In his first season as an assistant at Murray State, the team was 31-2 and earned a No. 6 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

### PRIOR TO MURRAY STATE

Coach McMahon has had success in college basketball since his days as a player at Appalachian State.

Known as an excellent shooter and tough competitor, he played on three Southern Conference regular season title teams in 1998, 1999 and 2000. The Mountaineers won the SoCon Tournament in 2000 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

He played in 90 career games under coach Buzz Peterson and made 124 three-pointers, graduating in 2000 with a bachelor's in marketing.

His coaching career began immediately at Appalachian State as a student assistant under Houston Fancher in 2000-01. He would rejoin Peterson's staff as a student coach at Tennessee before returning to ASU in 2002, where he stayed until the end of the 2009-10 season. A year at UNC Wilmington (2010-11) as assistant coach set the stage for his journey to Murray State, starting first as an assistant in the 2011-12 season and then as head coach prior to the 2015-16 season.

Coach McMahon and his wife Mary, a former standout for the Furman women's basketball team, have three children – Maris, Mason and Mabry.

## YEAR 2 FOR MATT MCMAHON

The 116th season of LSU Basketball is one that will take a new direction under second year Head Coach Matt McMahon. After a season in which the LSU Coaching Staff arrived to find no players on the roster and it was a matter of how many rather than certain credentials, the LSU staff was able to build the 2023-24 staff with an intentional aspect and philosophy.

This team is older, more mature, more together with a certain Louisiana flair of players who are part of the nine new members of the team that includes two high school signees.

Also back are six players from the previous season that included players who had good strong performances during the season, including two freshman who advanced significantly at the end of the campaign.

It's a group that allows the Head Coach, staff and players to control the narrative for the 2023-24 season.

## THE SCHEDULE

The season features 17 home games, including the nine home Southeastern Conference games.

The non-conference schedule features the MTE in Charleston Nov. 16, 17, 19 and the inaugural SEC/ACC Challenge on Nov. 28 that will take LSU on the road for a game at Syracuse.

The schedule also features the first November-December home game with a team from one of the "Power" conferences in college basketball outside the SEC (ACC, Big 12, Big 10, Big East, Pac 12) since Dec. 29, 2015 (Wake Forest) when Kansas State and LSU begin a home-and-home series on Dec. 9 (12:30 p.m.).

The teams played last year in the finals of the Cayman Islands Classic with Kansas State scoring a 61-59 decision. It appeared LSU had scored the game-tying basket just before the horn off an inbounds play with 4.0 seconds to play, but after video review and stopwatch technology applied by the officials, the bucket was nullified after the clock operator did not start the clock properly.

Houston and LSU played in Baton Rouge in December 2017, but at that time they were not in the Big 12, then playing in the AAC.

## TONIGHT'S OPPONENT

This marks the first time since preseason of the 2016-17 season that LSU has played an exhibition game at the Maravich Center. It marks the first time Louisiana Christian has been the exhibition opponent since 2006.

The teams met previously 35 times between 1913 and 1995 with LSU posting a 29-6 advantage in those regular season games with the Pineville school that formally was known as Louisiana College.

The Wildcats after the exhibition game tonight will open their 2023-24 season across town against Southern University. LC was 13-17 a year ago and 8-12 in the

NAIA Red River Athletic Conference.

Reni Mason is the coach and athletics director at Louisiana Christian with a record of 100-100 in his eight seasons. Mason played collegiate basketball at both Louisiana Tech and UNO.

Two of the top three scorers are expected to be back for the Wildcats as Bailey Hardy averaged 14.4 points last season and Jude Akabueze averaged 10.6.

## **LOUISIANA INFLUENCE RETURNS**

After a year away, the logo and phrase "Boot Up" has truly returned to the LSU Basketball program as five players have Southeast Louisiana ties to the program in 2023-24.

Carlos Stewart is from Baton Rouge and Jordan Wright is from Waggaman. Both played for The Dunham School in Baton Rouge. Stewart transferred from Santa Clara and Wright from Vanderbilt.

Jalen Cook played for LSU in the 2020-21 season and returns to Baton Rouge after two seasons at Tulane. He is from Walker. Hunter Dean is from Mandeville and came to LSU from George Washington.

Freshman Corey Chest hails from New Orleans where he played three years of high school before finishing up last year at The Link Academy in Missouri.

It is the most since there were eight players from Louisiana on the 2017-18 roster.

## **OLDER PLAYERS**

This will be one of the older rosters in recent LSU basketball history with 11 players who are at least in their third year of college basketball.

Three players – Jordan Wright (Vanderbilt), Will Baker (Nevada), Hunter Dean (George Washington) – are grad transfers, while Trae Hannibal is a fifth-year senior thanks to the pandemic season of 2020.

## **BUT A STATISTICAL NOTE ABOUT THEIR BIRTHDATES**

The 2023-24 edition of the Tigers marks the first year that every player on the roster was born in 2000 or later. Only Graduates Jordan Wright and Will Baker were born in 2000.

## **MORE ASSISTANT COACHES**

The NCAA as of July 1, changed the rule this year to allow up to two more assistant coaches on the floor coaching in practice and in games and LSU will have four listed assistant coaches for the 2023-24 season. The limit is five, but LSU will go with four this year after Cody Toppert recently became the head coach of the Capital City Go-Go of the NBA G-League.

These additional coaches may engage in coaching activities but may not recruit off campus. The rules change codified a waiver in those sports that allowed noncoaching staff members to engage in skill instruction.

So, joining assistant coaches Casey Long and Ronnie Hamilton, will be Chief of Staff Tim Kaine and Director of Player Development Ronrico White who will add Assistant Coach to their present titles. Both Kaine and White worked with McMahon at Murray State.

## **ONE THING TO NOTE ON THE SHOT CLOCK THIS SEASON**

You will see a little difference this year as the shot clock is running down this season. In the last five seconds on the 30-second shot clock the clock will go to tenths of a second to count down play until the shot clock buzzer expires. This is much like the game clock goes to tenths of a second in the final minute. There are several rule changes in the this cycle for 2023-24, but this will be the most notable (along with the new uniform number standards discussed on another page) that you will notice tonight.

## **LSU OPENS WITH 9 PLAYERS ON 6 TEAMS IN NBA**

Nine former LSU basketball stars on six different teams were on opening night rosters for National Basketball Association's start of the 2023-24 season.

Three players – Javonte Smart for Philadelphia and, Skylar Mays and Duop Reath for Portland -- are on two-way contracts that will allow them a certain number of days with the NBA franchise while also getting playing time with the club's respective G-League team.

Garrett Temple continues his long NBA career at age 37 has played 716 games across 10 NBA teams (Houston, Sacramento, San Antonio, Milwaukee, Charlotte, Washington, Memphis, Los Angeles Clippers, Brooklyn and the last two seasons with the New Orleans Pelicans). This year he has signed a contract with Toronto.

Only Shaquille O'Neal, Brandon Bass and Bob Pettit have played more NBA games among LSU alums in the history of the NBA.

Temple, whose father Collis Jr., and brother Collis Temple III were both LSU basketball stars in their own right, played on the 2006 NCAA Final Four team and won his second conference championship in his senior season of 2009.

In June, Naz Reid and the Timberwolves agreed to a three-year, \$42 million extension with a player option on the final season according to Reid's agents. Reid has played 245 games for the Timberwolves and this past season averaged 11.5 points, 4.9 rebounds and 1.1 assists a game while shooting 53.7 percent from the field and almost 35 percent from the arc.

Reed played on the 2019 SEC Championship team at LSU that advanced to the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament.

Tari Eason played in all 82 games as a rookie for the Houston Rockets a year ago, averaging 9.3 points and 6.0 rebounds. Eason played on the 2022 LSU team that advanced to the NCAA Tournament after transferring from Cincinnati and was the No. 17 selection in the 2022 draft.

He is out for an unknown time with what is being called a lower leg issue.

The Brooklyn Nets have a trio of former LSU players in Ben Simmons, Cam Thomas and Trenderon Watford.

Simmons, who only played 42 games a year ago and averaged 6.9 points, 6.3 rebounds and 6.1 assists, has career numbers of 14.7 points, 7.8 rebounds and 7.5 assists in 317 career games for Philadelphia and Brooklyn. Simmons played the 2015-16 season for the Tigers.

Thomas was the 27th pick of the 2021 NBA Draft after a spectacular freshman campaign at LSU and in his two years in Brooklyn has played 124 games, averaging 9.5 points, 2.1 rebounds and 1.3 assists. He has been known to go off for some impressive numbers, scoring 30 in 2022 and last year 47 in one game. He played in 57 games a year ago and averaged 10.6 points.

Watford will be making his Brooklyn debut after two years in Portland. There he averaged 7.5 points, 4.0 rebounds and 1.9 assists in 110 games played, shooting 54.7 percent from the floor.

Smart's contract with the 76ers was converted from an Exhibit 10 deal to the two-way contract after impressing in the preseason according to media reports. Smart played in 17 games a season ago on two-way contracts with Milwaukee and Miami, averaging 3.0 points the last two years.

Mays has played 67 games for the Atlanta Hawks and Portland Trail Blazers who resigned him several weeks ago to a two-way deal. Mays has averaged 4.4 points, 1.2 rebounds and 1.4 assists. Mays played on the 2019 SEC Championship team at LSU and was one of the rare four-year players for LSU.

Reath joins the Trail Blazers after playing for the team in the NBA Summer League. Reath, who played for LSU for two seasons in 2017 and 2018, played for Australia in the FIBA World Cup this past summer and in four games with Portland in the preseason averaged 7.8 points and 4.3 rebounds.

## **IT STARTS FOR REAL ON MONDAY, NOV. 6**

The 2023-24 season begins on Monday, Nov. 6 when Mississippi Valley State comes to Baton Rouge for a 7 p.m. contest at the Maravich Center. Tickets are available at LSUTix.net. It will be the first of two games at home on opening week with LSU hosting Nicholls on Friday, Nov. 10, on the evening before the Florida-LSU football game.

Both games will be streamed on the SECN+ site and once again this year, all games will be broadcast on the affiliates of the LSU Sports Radio Network (Guaranty Media flagship affiliate Eagle 98.1 FM) with the Voice of the Tigers Chris Blair in his eighth basketball season and former LSU men's basketball head coach John Brady.
