Series Notes: Alabama and LSU will meet for the 88th time on Saturday with the Crimson Tide owning a 55-27-5 all-time advantage in the series, including a 14-8 mark at home. The series, which began in 1895, is the fourth-oldest in UA history. The two teams last met in Tuscaloosa on Nov. 6, 2021, with the Tide earning a 20-14 victory. Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 12-6 for his career against LSU, including a 12-5 mark with the Crimson Tide. LSU head coach Brian Kelly is 1-2 against the Crimson Tide, including a 1-0 mark in Baton Rouge and an 0-2 record while at Notre Dame.

ESPN COLLEGE GAMEDAY: Alabama will be making its 56th appearance overall (35-20, .636) on ESPN's College GameDay when the popular pregame show airs from The Quad in Tuscaloosa this Saturday. The University will be hosting GameDay for the 18th time in the show's history. Saturday also marks Alabama's 47th appearance under head coach Nick Saban (32-14, .696). The 47 appearances in the Saban era are seven better than Ohio State (40) for the most GameDay appearances since the 2007 season.

TOUGH TO GET SABAN'S TIDE TWICE: During his tenure at Alabama, head coach Nick Saban has suffered 28 total losses. Of those 28 losses, the Crimson Tide and Saban have had the opportunity to face the team that beat them at a later date on 23 occasions. In those 23 rematches, Alabama owns a 21-2 mark when avenging its previous loss. The only two times the Crimson Tide has fallen in back-to-back games against the same opponent is LSU (2010-11) and Ole Miss (2014-15). The Crimson Tide has not yet had the opportunity to bounce back from losses against Utah (2009), Clemson (2018), Georgia (2021) and Texas (2023). In Saturday's matchup with LSU, Alabama will have the chance to avenge last season's 32-31 overtime loss in Baton Rouge.

COMING OFF THE BYE: Alabama is 13-6 (.684) in games following a bye under head coach Nick Saban. The Crimson Tide has outscored the opposition 570-363 (30.0 ppg-19.1 ppg) and has held six opponents to 10 points or less in those 19 contests. Alabama's most frequent opponent coming off the bye week is LSU, with the Tide holding an 8-5 record in 13 matchups.

FEWER POINTS FOR A WIN: Alabama and LSU have played 12 times since the 9-6, touchdown-less 'game of the century' on Nov. 5, 2011. Across the 12 contests since that night, the Crimson Tide is 10-0 when limiting the Tigers to 17 points or fewer. The only two instances where LSU scored more than 17 points both finished in losses for the Crimson Tide (2019 - 41-46, 2022 - 31-32).

ALABAMA-LSU STAYS CLOSE OFTEN: Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival, the Alabama-LSU matchups have typically been close. Of the 17 total pairings between the Tide and Tigers, 11 have been decided by 10 points or less. Of those 11 contests, nine were decided by one score with three finishing within a field goal margin.

CLIMBING TO 201: Nick Saban has recorded 201 total victories as the head coach at Alabama. His 201 wins ties Vince Dooley (Georgia) for the second-most wins at one school in Southeastern Conference history. The conference's all-time leader for victories at the same school is Paul W. "Bear" Bryant with 224 while with the Crimson Tide. The NCAA's all-time leader for Division I wins at the same school is Joe Paterno with 409 at Penn State.

SABAN'S SEC HOME RECORD: Alabama head coach Nick Saban owns a 77-11 (.875) all-time record when playing in a Southeastern Conference game at home, going 16-4 (.800) during his time at LSU and owning a 61-7 (.897) record at Alabama. While with the Crimson Tide, Saban has posted nine perfect home SEC slates (most recently a 4-0 mark in 2022) and has not lost more than one home conference game in any season other than 2007 (two losses). All seven of his losses at home have been by seven points or less with three of those by three or fewer. Under Saban, Alabama has outscored its SEC home opponents 2,465-1,013 (36.3-14.9 points per game) and has limited the opposition to 14 points or less on 41 occasions, including eight shutout victories.

SABAN'S HOME RECORD: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 165-21 (.887) in home games during his collegiate head coaching career. He owns an advantage at every stop he has made as a college head coach, including a 106-9 (.922) mark while at UA. Of those nine losses at Bryant-Denny Stadium, only one has been by more than seven points (10 against Texas on Sept. 9). Additionally, Saban has won 76 of his last 80 contests at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES OF BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM: Alabama boasts the best all-time home winning percentage in the FBS with an .840 (295-55-3) mark at Bryant-Denny Stadium since its opening in 1929. Boise State's Albertsons Stadium (285-63), which opened in 1970, is the next closest in second at .819. The Crimson Tide is 106-9 (.922) at Bryant-Denny Stadium during Nick Saban's tenure, including a 102-6 (.944) record since the start of the 2008 season.

BEATING THE BEST: The Crimson Tide is 78-21 (.788) against the Associated Press Top 25 since the start of 2008. That record includes a 2-1 record in 2023 with wins against then-No. 15 Ole Miss on Sept. 23 and then-No. 17 Tennessee on Oct. 21.

SABAN vs. AP TOP 25 OPPOSITION: The Crimson Tide's 34-20 win over then-No. 17 Tennessee on Oct. 21 was Nick Saban's 102nd career win, and 80th at Alabama, against the Associated Press Top 25. Saban moved past Joe Paterno (86) for the most career wins against the AP Top 25 when he defeated then-No. 22 Auburn on Nov. 28, 2020. The late Florida State legend Bobby Bowden ranks third all-time (82), while Alabama's Paul "Bear" Bryant is fourth (66). Former Duke, Florida and South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier is fifth (64). Saban's winning percentage against AP ranked teams (102-47, .685) tops Bryant (.592), Bowden (.557), Spurrier (.529) and Paterno (.512).

DOMINATING THE AP TOP 25: Alabama's 45-20 win over then-No. 11 Kansas State in the Allstate Sugar Bowl to close out the 2022 campaign was head coach Nick Saban's 23rd career win by 25-plus points against a ranked opponent. Saban is the all-time leader for the most wins by 25-plus points in the Associated Press Poll Era (since 1936), sitting just ahead of Bobby Bowden's previous record of 20. Saban is also the NCAA record holder with 25 career wins of 20-plus points against AP top-15 opponents, including the win over the Wildcats. A total of 22 of Saban's career 20-plus point wins against AP top-15 opponents have come while at UA.

50-PLUS vs. RANKED OPPONENTS: Under head coach Nick Saban, Alabama has posted 50-plus points against Associated Press Top 25 teams on seven occasions, while three of those seven occasions came in 2020. The most recent instance came on Jan. 11, 2021 at the College Football Playoff National Championship Game when the Crimson Tide defeated then-No. 3/3/3 Ohio State, 52-24. ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL: Alabama's No. 11 ranking in the Week 10 release of the Associated Press Poll marked the 255th consecutive week that the Crimson Tide has appeared in the poll. That streak is the longest active streak in college football. The 255 weeks more than doubles second-place Georgia with the Bulldogs appearing in the poll for 108 consecutive weeks. Alabama's 255 straight weeks tops the Crimson Tide's previous program-long streak of 105 consecutive weeks under head coach Gene Stallings in the mid-1990s.

ALABAMA IN THE AP SINCE 2008: Alabama began the 2008 season at No. 24 in the Associated Press Preseason Poll. The Crimson Tide opened the year with a dominant 34-10 win over then-No. 9 Clemson in Atlanta, and since that win over the Tigers, UA has not been ranked lower than No. 17 in 254 polls that have followed. According to the College Poll Archive, the Tide is the only team to be represented on all 255 editions of the poll from the start of the 2008 season to the current week. The next closest team is Ohio State with 240 appearances followed by Oklahoma at 231. Alabama has spent 94.9 percent of the 15-plus years ranked in the top 10. A whopping 83.1 percent of that time Alabama has been ranked in the top five. The Crimson Tide has also been ranked No. 1 a total of 109 times since 2008. Only 13 other teams have earned the No. 1 ranking over that time, with the second-most appearances coming from Georgia at 33 and Clemson close behind at 23.

ALABAMA HAS THE MOST WINS SINCE 2008: Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 194 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. That total is 19 more than second-place Ohio State, who has totaled 175 wins over that stretch.

ALWAYS IN THE HUNT: Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in 180 of 186 regular season games that have had national championship implications. The final three games of the 2010 campaign and the final three weeks of the 2022 schedule marked the only six regular season contests without direct national championship implications over the last 15 seasons.

MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICANS: Numerous outlets released their midseason All-America lists during the week of Oct. 16-20 with the Crimson Tide well-represented. The Associated Press named Kool-Aid McKinstry, Will Reichard and Dallas Turner to their first teams. The trio was also named to CBS Sports' All-America squad while ESPN.com tabbed Reichard, Turner and Terrion Arnold to their team. Reichard and Turner were a part of the midseason lists from both The Athletic and USA Today while Turner and McKinstry were recognized by The Sporting News.

ALABAMA IN THE AP RANKINGS

Alabama has been ranked in 867 of the 1,227 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 536-137-8 (.793) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including a 177-25 (.876) mark under head coach Nick Saban. Alabama is also ranked in the AP poll for the 255th consecutive week, topping its previous streak of 105 consecutive polls from 1991-97 under head coach Gene Stallings. The 255 consecutive weeks is the second-longest stretch by any program in the poll's history, trailing only Nebraska's all-time mark of 348 consecutive weeks. Alabama has started nine seasons at No. 1 (2022, 2021, 2018, 2017, 2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches' rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 33 seasons (1991-present) with U.S. LBM coming on the title sponsor of the poll at the start of the 2023 season. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020 seasons. The Tide has compiled four UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 and 1979) and seven USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020) coaches poll national titles.

NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS IN THE SABAN ERA: Alabama recorded its 92nd non-offensive touchdown of the Nick Saban era and second this season with Jihad Campbell's 24-yard scoop and score against then-No. 17/15 Tennessee on Oct. 21. Campbell's touchdown followed Chris Braswell's 28-yard interception return at Mississippi State on Sept. 30 earlier this year. Since Saban's arrival in 2007, no team in college football has totaled more non-offensive scores than the Crimson Tide. During Saban's tenure, Alabama recorded a single-season record 15 in 2016, which led the Football Bowl Subdivision and was the most in a season by any FBS team in the last 20 years. The Tide also scored a non-offensive touchdown in 10 straight games dating from to the CFP Semifinal against Michigan State on Dec. 31, 2015 to the Texas A&M game on Oct. 22, 2016 for 14 non-offensive scores in that span – four interceptions, four punt returns, five fumble recoveries and a kickoff return.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

FIRST-YEAR STARTERS UNDER SABAN: With the exit of two-year starter and 2021 Heisman Trophy winner Bryce Young, the Crimson Tide was tasked with finding a new starting quarterback. Under head coach Nick Saban, a total of eight quarterbacks have maintained their starting role for 10-plus games of a season in which they were named QB1. The list of eight includes: Bryce Young (2021), Mac Jones (2020), Tua Tagovailoa (2018), Jalen Hurts (2016), Jake Coker (2015), Blake Sims (2014), AJ McCarron (2011) and Greg McElroy (2009). All but McCarron won an SEC Championship in their first season while the upperclassmen (redshirt sophomore or above) won four national titles - Jones (redshirt junior), Coker (senior), McCarron (redshirt sophomore) and McElroy (junior).

SECOND CHANCE: Quarterback Jalen Milroe has responded in a big way the last five weeks since losing his starting job for the USF game. The redshirt sophomore has led Alabama to five straight SEC victories, including a pair on the road at Mississippi State and at Texas A&M. Since his return to the lineup, Milroe is averaging 233.7 passing yards per game (1,168 total) while completing 66.7 percent of his passes and accounting for 11 total touchdowns (eight passing).

THROWING THE BOMB: In seven starts this season, Jalen Milroe has completed 99-of-153 passes for 1,617 yards. Milroe leads the SEC and ranks third nationally with a 16.33 yards per completion mark while averaging 10.57 yards per pass attempt, good for second in the conference and third in the country. Overall, the redshirt sophomore owns a 175.0 passing efficiency mark that is second among the league's signal-callers and ranks him eighth in Division I.

HOME RUN HITTER: Jalen Milroe enters this weekend's contest with 13 passing touchdowns on the season. All but one of those scores have been from at least 15 yards out with six scores from 40-plus yards, including a season-long 79-yarder against Arkansas on Oct. 14. Milroe is averaging 38.1 yards on his touchdown strikes.

CONVERTING IN THE RED: Alabama is 22-for-24 on scoring opportunities inside the red zone this season. The Crimson Tide has recorded 14 touchdowns, 11 of which have come on the ground and three through the air, with Will Reichard contributing eight field goals. The Tide ranks 21st nationally and fourth in the SEC in red zone conversion.

SCORING AFTER HALF: Alabama's offense has come out of the halftime break on fire this season. The Crimson Tide has totaled 79 of its 245 points (32.3 percent) in the third quarter, its highest point total in any quarter in 2023. The offensive output pairs with a Tide defense that has allowed just 24 points in the third quarter and only 56 total points in the second half of games.

THIRD SATURDAY IN OCTOBER COMEBACK: Alabama went to halftime trailing then-No. 17/15 Tennessee by 13 with a score of 20-7. The Crimson Tide would rally for 27 unanswered points in the second half to secure the 34-20 victory. The 13-point comeback represented UA's largest comeback at home since 1995 (Southern Miss) and the third-largest halftime comeback at home in school history.

400+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE: Alabama has gained 400-plus yards of total offense in 62 of its last 77 games, dating back to the start of the 2018 season. In the 15 instances where the offense did not go over 400 yards Alabama is 13-2.

40-OR-MORE SINCE 2018: Alabama has scored 40-or-more points in 49 of the last 77 games. Forty-nine leads the nation for the most total games of 40-plus points since the start of the 2018 season. Ohio State has the second-most instances of scoring 40-or-more points over that stretch at 44, while Oklahoma is third with 37.

OPENING DRIVE TOUCHDOWNS: The Crimson Tide has won 51 of its last 52 games when scoring a touchdown on the first offensive possession of the game. The most recent instance came on opening weekend against Middle Tennessee when Jalen Milroe scrambled for six from 21-yards out. Alabama's lone loss when scoring a touchdown on the opening drive during that stretch came at Texas A&M on Oct. 9, 2021.

SCORING STREAK CONTINUES: Alabama extended its school record for consecutive games with a score to 304 thanks to Jermaine Burton's 10-yard receiving touchdown in the second quarter of the Oct. 21 contest with then-No. 17/15 Tennessee. The Tide was last held off the scoreboard in a 9-0 loss to Auburn on Nov. 18, 2000. Alabama owns a 245-59 (.806) record over the course of the current streak.

BALL PROTECTION: In the last 215 games (dating back to the start of the 2008 season), Alabama has turned the ball over only 230 times (123 fumbles, 107 interceptions) for an average of 1.07 turnovers per game. Since 2009, the Tide has turned the ball over only 212 times in 202 games (1.05/game). The 212 turnovers since 2009 includes 87 interceptions in 5,408 attempts (one interception every 62.2 attempts) by UA starting quarterbacks and 32 lost fumbles in 5,339 carries (one fumble lost every 166.8 carries) by the Tide's top two running backs.

MCCLELLAN FINDING THE HARD YARDS: Jase McClellan has done the dirty work for the Alabama ground game during the 2023 season. According to Pro Football Focus, the senior ranks 19th nationally in missed tackles forced after a rush with 38 across his team-high 122 carries this season. He has gained 68.9 percent of his rushing yards (396 of 569 yards) after contact this season while averaging 3.19 yards after contact per carry.

BIG PLAY BURTON: Jermaine Burton has emerged as a big-play threat for the Crimson Tide this season. The senior leads UA with 508 yards and five touchdowns on a team-high tying 23 receptions. A total of 13 of his receptions have converted a first down while Burton averages 22.1 yards per reception to rank second in the SEC and seventh nationally in that category.

LATHAM NAMED SEC OL OF THE WEEK AFTER ARKANSAS: Right tackle JC Latham was selected as the SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week on Oct. 16 for his play in the Tide's Homecoming matchup with Arkansas. Latham helped clear a path for Alabama's ground game to accumulate 217 yards rushing. Individually, the junior did not allow a sack, quarterback or a hurry against the Hogs.

MILROE'S NATIONAL RECOGNITION FOLLOWING A&M: Jalen Milroe earned national recognition from two separate awards on Oct. 9 following his standout play at Texas A&M. The redshirt sophomore was named one of the Davey O'Brien Award's 'Great 8' while also being tabbed to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Honorable Mention list. Milroe finished 21-of-33 for a career-high 321 yards and three touchdowns to go with a pick in Bryan-College Station. He also rushed eight times with a long of 12 in the 26-20 win over the Aggies.

BOOKER EARNS SEC OFFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK ACCOLADES: Guard Tyler Booker was named the SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week on Sept. 25 for his efforts against then-No. 15/16 Ole Miss in the Tide's SEC opener. Booker anchored an Alabama offensive line that controlled the line of scrimmage, allowing for 356 yards of total offense, including 132 on the ground. The sophomore recorded a career-high six knockdown blocks and did not allow a sack in the win over the Rebels.

MILROE NAMED SEC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Quarterback Jalen Milroe was selected as the SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 4 for his performance against Middle Tennessee in the season opener. It was Milroe's first league honor as a member of the Crimson Tide. He was also named one of the Alabama coaching staff's offensive players of the week for his performance against the Blue Raiders.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

SLOWING DOWN THE VOLS: The Crimson Tide defense did an exceptional job of limiting the high-powered offense of then-No. 17/15 Tennessee on Oct. 21. The Volunteers entered the game scoring 32.2 points per game and averaged 442.8 yards per contest, including 230.3 rushing yards per game to rank sixth nationally at the time. Alabama was able to limit the Vols to just 20 points on the day, including zero in the second half. The Tide also kept the ground game in check, giving up only 133 yards rushing to the Vols.

LIMITING THE POINTS: Alabama's defense has held its opponents to a combined 132 points on the season, 34 of which came against then-No. 11/10 Texas. Despite the matchup with the Longhorns, the Tide defense is averaging just 16.5 points allowed per game, a total that ranks 16th nationally and second in the SEC.

ADJUSTING AT THE BREAK: The Crimson Tide defense has allowed just 56 points in the second half of games this season, including 24 in the third quarter and 32 in the fourth. Teams are averaging just 7.0 points in the second half against UA, with the defense allowing a touchdown or less in six contests. Below is a look at how teams have fared against Alabama coming out of the halftime break.

GETTING IN THE BACKFIELD: The Tide defense has gotten in opponents' backfields with regularity this season. Through eight games, Alabama has accumulated 58.0 tackles for loss (-269 yards) and 29.0 sacks (-202 yards). The Tide is averaging 7.2 tackles for loss per game to rank 16th nationally and is fourth in the country with a 3.6 sacks per game average.

GETTING IN THE BACKFIELD - MORE RECENTLY: In the last six contests dating back to the USF matchup, Alabama's defense has finished with at least 6.0 TFLs and 3.0 sacks-or-better each game. Below is a look at how the defense has fared since the Tampa trip.

KEEPING THE GROUND GAME IN-CHECK: The Crimson Tide defense limited Texas A&M to only 67 yards rushing in their Oct. 7 matchup. Entering this weekend's contest with LSU, Alabama's defensive unit has held 20 of its last 36 opponents (dating back to the 2021 season) to less than 100 yards rushing. UA has also limited 10 of the last 21 opponents to 80 yards or less dating back to the start of the 2022 campaign, including three times in 2023.

TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS: Alabama has forced at least one turnover in 107 of the last 121 contests (dating back to the start of the 2015 season). During the current run, Alabama has forced 186 turnovers (120 interceptions, 66 fumbles) and returned 42 of those miscues for touchdowns.

SHUTOUTS SINCE 2007: Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, Alabama has recorded 26 shutouts, including 12 in Southeastern Conference play. With its 34-0 win over Austin Peay on Nov. 19 last year, the Crimson Tide defense has 12 more shutouts than its nearest competitor over that span. Ranking second in shutouts during that time is Ohio State with 14.

10 POINTS OR LESS: Alabama's trademark has been its defense ever since head coach Nick Saban's arrival on campus. Since that first season in Tuscaloosa, Saban-coached defenses have held the Crimson Tide's opponents to 10 points or less on 105 occasions. Dating back to the start of the 2015 season, UA's defense has limited the opposition to 10 or fewer points 49 times across 121 total contests.

TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND: Alabama's defense has been a force in the run game since head coach Nick Saban's arrival on campus. More recently, the Tide has given up just 84 rushing scores in the last 121 games (dating to the start of the 2015 season). Overall since Saban arrived in 2007, UA has allowed the fewest rushing touchdowns in the nation at 142, a total that is 31 fewer than second-place Iowa.

RUSHING DEFENSE: UA has surrendered only 34 individual 100-yard rushing performances dating back to the 2005 season, a mark that is the fewest in the nation. Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival in 2007, the Tide has allowed 29 players to rush for more than 100 yards in a game.

TURNER OFF THE EDGE: Through eight games, Dallas Turner has accumulated 34 total tackles, including a team-high 10.5 for loss (-69 yards) and seven sacks (-55 yards). Turner's seven sacks are tied for second in the SEC and seventh nationally while his 0.88 sacks per game average is second in the conference and ranks 10th in Division I. He is also tied for second in the conference and 11th nationally in total tackles for loss while averaging 1.3 TFLs per game, good for second in the SEC and 21st in Division I. Turner is on-pace for 16.0 tackles for loss and 11.0 sacks in the regular season. For comparison, Will Anderson Jr. finished with 17 tackles for loss and 10 sacks in 2022 when he swept the national defensive player of the year awards.

BRAS ON THE OTHER SIDE: Chris Braswell has paired with Dallas Turner to make things difficult on opposing offenses. The senior linebacker has accumulated 32 total tackles, including nine for loss (-42 yards) and 6.5 sacks (-38 yards) to rank second on UA, just behind Turner in both categories. Braswell's sack total is third in the SEC while he ranks in the league's top-10 for TFLs.

OUTSIDE LBs WREACKING HAVOC: Alabama outside linebacker Dallas Turner is playing the best football of his career. In addition to his tackle for loss and sack totals, he is 13th in total pressures according to Pro Football Focus with 37, including seven sacks, eight quarterback hits and 21 hurries. Turner has graded out at fourth nationally in pass-rush grade (88.0) and owns a PRP (combines sacks, hits and hurries relative to how many times a player rushes the passer) of 13.7 that leads all Division I defenders. Fellow outside linebacker Chris Braswell is close behind in PRP, ranking fifth nationally at 11.8.

BAMA CORNERS LOCKING IT DOWN: Alabama cornerbacks Kool-Aid McKinstry and Terrion Arnold are two of the top-graded defensive backs according to Pro Football Focus. Among players who have been in coverage on 80 percent of their snaps in 2023, McKinstry has graded out at 12th nationally with Arnold close behind in 26th. Kool-Aid has been targeted just 27 times in eight games, allowing 131 total yards receiving and ranks sixth in forced incomplections at eight. Arnold is 10th nationally in forced incomplections (7) with a 75.2 NFL passer rating on his targets.

BAMA SAFETIES SHOWING OUT: Alabama safeties Caleb Downs, Malachi Moore and Jaylen Key are also among the highest rated defensive backs in the country. Downs ranks seventh nationally in coverage grade with three forced incomplections and two picks. Moore has added 34 stops with four tackles for loss and one interception. Jaylen Key has surrendered just a 56.3 NFL passer rating against that ranks 16th nationally among players with 80 percent of their snaps in coverage.

CAMPBELL EARNS HONORS AFTER UT: Jihaad Campbell was named the SEC's Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 23 thanks to his efforts against then-No. 17/15 Tennessee. He was also tabbed the Nagurski Trophy National Defensive Player of the Week and the Lott IMPACT Trophy Player of the Week. The sophomore picked up a Joe Milton fumble and raced 24 yards for a touchdown to give UA a two-score lead late. He also contributed 10 tackles, including one for loss (-4 yards), in the Third Saturday in October matchup.

EBOIGBE SELECTED AS SEC DEFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK AFTER A&M:

Justin Eboigbe was selected as the SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week on Oct. 9 for his performance at Texas A&M. The redshirt senior led the Tide defense with 1.5 sacks (-10 yards) and matched the team-high total for tackles for loss at 1.5, part of his five total stops on the day. He also added one quarterback pressure against the Aggies.

DOWNS EARNS WEEKLY HONORS FOLLOWING STATE: Caleb Downs picked up two weekly honors following a standout effort at Mississippi State. Downs was first named SEC Co-Freshman of the Week on Oct. 2 and then earned Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Week recognition a day later from the Maxwell Football Club. Downs totaled 13 tackles and an interception against the Bulldogs.

DOWNS NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK: Safety Caleb Downs was named the SEC Co-Freshman of the Week on Sept. 4 for his performance against Middle Tennessee. Downs earned the start at safety in his collegiate debut, finishing with a team-high eight tackles, including one for loss (-2 yards). Additionally, Downs earned defensive player of the week accolades from the Alabama coaching staff for his efforts against the Blue Raiders.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

ALL-TIME POINTS LEADER: Will Reichard is quickly approaching the NCAA's all-time career points mark. Now in his graduate year, Reichard has accumulated 496 total points to rank fifth in NCAA history. The all-time NCAA record of 530 is held by quarterback Keenan Reynolds of Navy from 2012-15. Below is a look at where Reichard currently sits.

SEC POINTS LEADER - WILL REICHARD: With his PAT make following the Crimson Tide's first touchdown against Arkansas on Oct. 14, Will Reichard became the Southeastern Conference's career points leader. Reichard entered the matchup with the Razorbacks tied at 480 points with former Auburn kicker Daniel Carlson for the league's all-time mark.

MOVING UP THE CAREER FIELD GOALS LIST: Placekicker Will Reichard ranks third on the Alabama career list for field goals with 77. The graduate kicker has also made 28 consecutive field goals dating back to his make against Mississippi State on Oct. 22 of last season. Below is a look at where Reichard ranks entering this weekend.

PATs FOR REICHARD: Will Reichard owns the Crimson Tide's career record for made PATs. Entering this weekend's contest, Reichard has made 265-of-267 career PATs. The senior recorded nine PATs against ULM on Sept. 17 of last season to move past the former record of 186 (188 attempts) by Adam Griffith from 2013-16.

50-PLUS FOR REICHARD: A 50-yard field goal from Will Reichard midway through the fourth quarter against then-No. 17/15 Tennessee represented his second from 50-plus this season. The three-point make was also the seventh for Reichard from 50 yards or better during his career to tie him with Van Tiffin (1983-86) for the Alabama all-time mark. Tiffin used a kicking tee for the entirety of his career.

REICHARD CHASING PERFECTION (AGAIN): Will Reichard is trying to record his second perfect season across his five-year career at the Capstone. Reichard did not miss a kick during the 2020 season, finishing 13-of-13 on field goals and 84-of-84 on PATs. Through eight games this season, the Hoover native has made all 15 field goal tries to go with 25 PATs.

BIG LEG BURNIP: James Burnip has shined in year three with the Tide. He has accumulated 1,735 yards on 36 punts to average 48.2 yards per boot. Burnip's 48.2 mark is third in the SEC and seventh nationally. The Aussie has boomed 15 punts of 50-plus yards this season, including a career-long 67-yarder at Mississippi State on Sept. 30. The punt against the Bulldogs was Burnip's fourth of 60-plus this season to go with his 61-yarder against then-No. 11/10 Texas on Sept. 9, a 60-yarder one week later at USF and a 63-yarder at Texas A&M on Oct. 7. Burnip's 67-yarder in Starkville was the longest punt for the Crimson Tide since JK Scott's 73-yard kick against Ohio State in the 2014 CFP Semifinal at the Allstate Sugar Bowl.

REICHARD RECOGNIZED FOLLOWING UT: Will Reichard was named the SEC's Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 23 thanks to his play against then-No. 17/15 Tennessee. The veteran placekicker contributed 10 of the Tide's 34 points on the day, connecting on a pair of field goals from 42 and 50 yards to go with three PATs. Reichard also kicked off seven times with five touchbacks and averaged 64.4 yards per boot.

REICHARD EARNS SEC SPECIAL TEAMS POTW AFTER A&M: Will Reichard was selected as the SEC Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 9 for his play at Texas A&M. The graduate hit one field goal from 30 and added three PATs, but his most impressive efforts came in the punting game. Following an injury to starter James Burnip, Reichard stepped in to punt four times for 165 yards to average 41.2 yards per boot with a long of 45.

SERIES NOTES

THE ALABAMA-LSU SERIES: Alabama and LSU will meet for the 88th time when the two SEC West rivals square off on Saturday. The Crimson Tide holds a 55-27-5 (.661) all-time advantage in the series which dates back to the 1895 season. That record includes a 25-17-2 (.591) mark at home for UA. The two teams met last season in Baton Rouge with the Tigers claiming a 32-21 overtime victory on the last play of the game.

SABAN vs. LSU: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 12-6 (.667) in his career against LSU and has won 10 of the last 12 meetings against the Bayou Bengals. Before his arrival in Tuscaloosa, Saban-coached teams were 0-1 against LSU, losing 46-25 to the Tigers while at Michigan State in the 1995 Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La. Saban was the head coach at LSU from 2000-04 and compiled a 48-16 (.750) record, leading the Tigers to two SEC Championships during his tenure. In 2003, Saban coached the Tigers to a 13-1 record and a 21-14 win over Oklahoma in the BCS National Championship Game played at the Sugar Bowl in New Orleans, La.

ALABAMA-LSU AT VARIOUS SITES: The Alabama-LSU series has been played at six different sites since the initial meeting in 1895. The city of Baton Rouge has hosted the most games in the series (41), with Alabama posting a 29-10-2 record on the LSU campus. New Orleans is the only other Louisiana city to host the series, with Alabama and LSU playing to a 7-7 tie in New Orleans in 1921 and the Crimson Tide claiming the 2011 national championship inside the Superdome, 21-0, over the Tigers. Four Alabama cities have played host to this rivalry, including Tuscaloosa (14-8), Mobile (1-2-1), Montgomery (2-0) and Birmingham (8-7-1).

ALABAMA-LSU SERIES IS A LONG ONE: The LSU series is tied for the third-longest series in Alabama history. The two teams first met on Nov. 23, 1895, the 15th game in Crimson Tide history, and the 2023 game marks the 88th meeting between the two teams. Only Tennessee (106) and Mississippi State (108) have played Alabama more than LSU. Auburn and LSU have both played the Tide 86 times entering this weekend. The series with the Bayou Bengals is also the fourth-oldest in UA history with a current SEC member, trailing only Auburn (1892), Ole Miss (1894) and Georgia, which played Alabama for the first time on Nov. 2, 1895, three weeks before the Tide's first game with LSU.

GENERAL NOTES

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama's success on the field over the past 16 seasons under Nick Saban has coincided with the Tide's success in the classroom. The 2023 squad is no exception as the Crimson Tide entered the season with 11 student-athletes who already had their degrees in-hand and are wearing an SEC Graduate patch on their jersey. The list of graduates includes Chris Braswell, James Burnip, Darrian Dalcourt, Justin Eboigbe, Terrence Ferguson II, Jaylen Key, Jase McClellan, Seth McLaughlin, Malachi Moore, Will Reichard and Roydell Williams. Since Saban's arrival in 2007, Alabama football has seen a total of 642 degrees earned, including 100 master's.

CHAMPIONS IN THE CLASSROOM: Alabama's achievements in the classroom have been most impressive during national title seasons. Those six squads (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020) included 139 student-athletes who had earned their degrees prior to game time.

APR SUCCESS: According to the most recent Academic Progress Rate (APR) numbers that were announced by the NCAA last May, figures that cover the four-year period extending from the 2018-19 through 2021-22 school years, the Crimson Tide continued to score well above the national cutoff standard. The football program's total average of 995 was tied for the best among all Southeastern Conference schools and bettered the national average for football by more than 25 points. In total, the football program was one of 15 University of Alabama sports to score a 995 or better.

RETURNING HOME: Each year during head coach Nick Saban's tenure at least one Alabama player leaves campus early to declare for the NFL Draft. The Crimson Tide staff has made it a point to stay connected with guys who begin their pro careers but have yet to graduate in hopes of one day helping them earn a degree. The Tide's academics staff have has succeeded in that task for a total of 15 players that have returned from pro careers to earn their first or second degree. The list of 15 includes: Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, Terrence Cody, Landon Collins, Glen Coffee, Amari Cooper, Ronnie Harrison, Derrick Henry, Marlon Humphrey, Nico Johnson, Rolando McClain, Dee Milliner, Bo Scarbrough, Vinnie Sunseri, Tua Tagovailoa and Chance Warmack (master's). Additionally, Jimmy Johns returned to the Capstone to receive his degree in May 2023.

MCLAUGHLIN NAMED CAMPBELL SEMIFINALIST: Alabama center Seth McLaughlin was selected as a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, the National Football Foundation announced on Sept. 27. The Campbell recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. The NFF will announce 12-14 finalists on Oct. 25 with the winner being announced at the 65th NFF Annual Awards Dinner in Las Vegas on Dec. 5.

NEW HIRES: Saban's 2023 coaching staff features three new hires including Robert Bala (inside linebackers), Tommy Rees (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks) and Kevin Steele (defensive coordinator).

ALABAMA'S TV RECORD: Alabama's matchup with then-No. 17/15 Tennessee on CBS was the Crimson Tide's 480th televised game. Alabama has compiled a 335-141-4 (.702) all-time record in televised games (not including pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed-circuit telecasts).

199 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 213 GAMES: Alabama's win over then-No. 17/15 Tennessee on Oct. 21 was the Tide's 199th nationally televised game since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest since the start of 2014.

174-9 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: Under head coach Nick Saban, Alabama is 174-9 (.951) when leading at the half. UA is also 157-4 (.975) when leading by seven or more points at the break during the Saban era. The Crimson Tide has held the lead at the half in 92 of its last 121 games (dating back to the start of the 2015 season).

MOST WINS BY ACTIVE HEAD COACH: Alabama head coach Nick Saban's 287 career wins are the most career victories by an active FBS head coach. Saban ranks just ahead of North Carolina's Mack Brown, who has 280, with LSU's Brian Kelly close behind in third, collecting 279 career wins across his stops.

SABAN LEADS IN WINS vs. TOP-FIVE TEAMS: Alabama's 27-6 win over No. 4 Cincinnati in the 2021 College Football Playoff Semifinal at the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic on Dec. 31 was Nick Saban's 29th career victory against a team ranked in the top five of the Associated Press Top 25 Poll, the most in college football history. Saban's 29-15 career record in top-five contests gives him a .659 winning percentage, which is also college football's best. Following Saban on the all-time victory list are Bobby Bowden (18/.378 winning percentage), Barry Switzer (15/.516), Woody Hayes (15/.516), Steve Spurrier (15/.429) and Lou Holtz (15/.419).

AGAINST THE TOP 10: Alabama owns an 84-79-1 (.515) all-time record against teams ranked in the top-10 of the Associated Press poll. Since the start of the 2008 season, the Crimson Tide has posted a 35-13 (.729) overall record against top-10 teams, including a 20-7 (.741) mark versus the top 10 since the inception of the College Football Playoff. In Saban's six national championship seasons at Alabama, his teams have gone 18-2 (.900) against top-10 opponents.

UNRANKED, NO PROBLEM UNDER SABAN: With its 24-21 win over Arkansas on Oct. 14, Alabama has won 17 straight against unranked opponents and improved to 121-4 (.968) (117-4, .967 after vacations) against unranked opponents under head coach Nick Saban. Included in that record was a streak of 100 consecutive wins over unranked teams, which ranks as the longest streak in FBS history. The streak began with a win over Colorado on Dec. 30, 2007 in the Independence Bowl and ended at Texas A&M in 2021. The previous record was 72 games, shared by Miami (Fla.) (1984-95) and Florida (1989-2000).

SABAN AT No. 1: Alabama head coach Nick Saban has coached the most games as the Associated Press Poll's No. 1 team among active head coaches. Following last season's Oct. 8 victory over Texas A&M, Saban has coached 98 games as the nation's top-ranked team, which is 72 more games than Kirby Smart's 26. Close behind Smart is Dabo Swinney at 21.

MORE THAN A DECADE AT No. 1: With Alabama's Aug. 15 preseason ranking at No. 1 in 2022, the Crimson Tide has been ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press poll at least once each season since 2008. The 15-year streak is the longest by any program and coach in the history of the AP rankings. The previous long streak by any one team was seven seasons by Miami (Fla.) from 1986-92. The previous streak by one coach is six straight seasons, which was accomplished by Frank Leahy at Notre Dame in 1943 and continued from 1946-50 following an absence while Leahy served in the Navy.

SIX RINGS IN 12 SEASONS: The Crimson Tide's win in the 2021 College Football Playoff National Championship Game helped Alabama claim its sixth national title in 12 seasons, making UA the first team in the Associated Press Poll Era (since 1936) to win six championships over a 12-season span. The only other team in college football history to win six titles in a quarter of a century or less was also Alabama, coming across a 19-season stretch from 1961-79.

SIGN WITH THE TIDE, LEAVE WITH A RING: Since Nick Saban's arrival at Alabama in 2007, members of each one of his recruiting classes have won at least one national championship. The 2009 class tops the list with three to their name while the 2008, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015 and 2017 classes each achieved two national titles during their time in Tuscaloosa. The 2007, 2013, 2016, 2018, 2019 and 2020 classes can each claim one national title with the latter group still having time to add to that number.

BAMA IN THE NFL

LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL: As of the 2023 NFL Draft, Alabama has had more draft picks over the last 15 drafts (123) than any other program in the nation. The list of 123 features 12 Super Bowl champions, 27 Pro Bowl selections, 14 First Team All-Pro members and one Offensive Rookie of the Year.

2023 NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw 10 former players selected in the 2023 NFL Draft, including three first-round picks in quarterback Bryce Young (No. 1, Carolina Panthers), linebacker Will Anderson Jr. (Houston Texans) and running back Jahmyr Gibbs (No. 12, Detroit Lions). Defensive back Brian Branch (Lions) went early in the second round while four former Tide standouts went in the third round - Tyler Steen (Philadelphia Eagles), Byron Young (Las Vegas Raiders), Jordan Battle (Cincinnati Bengals) and Cameron Latu (San Francisco 49ers). Henry To'oTo'o was next up, going in the fifth round (Texans) with DeMarcco Hellams (Atlanta Falcons) rounding out the group following his seventh-round selection.

SABAN AND FIRST ROUND NFL DRAFT PICKS: Since the advent of the NFL Draft, Alabama head coach Nick Saban has produced the most first rounders of any NCAA Division I head coach with 49 players chosen in the opening round of the draft, including 44 while at Alabama. The Crimson Tide's three first-round selections in the 2023 NFL Draft extended Saban's all-time mark, producing 16 more first-rounders than second-place Joe Paterno (33).

QUICK HITS ON ALABAMA'S NFL DRAFT SUCCESS: Below is a look at some of Alabama's recent success in the NFL Draft.

- Over the last 15 NFL Drafts, Alabama has produced 123 total picks which is more than any other program in the nation. Of those 123, an impressive 44 (35.8 percent) have been first-rounders.
- Since 2000, the Crimson Tide has produced an NCAA-leading 46 first-rounders, a number that is nine better than the next closet school in Ohio State (37).

- Since 2010, Alabama has had an NCAA-best 43 players selected in the first round, a number that nearly doubles the next closest school in OSU (24).
- In 2023, Bryce Young became the only Alabama player in program history to be selected first overall in the Common Draft Era (since 1967). Young is also the only player to go 1-1 during head coach Nick Saban's career.
- Will Anderson Jr.'s third overall selection matched Marcell Dareus (2011) and Quinnen Williams (2019) for the highest defender taken during Saban's tenure in Tuscaloosa.
- With Young at No. 1 and Anderson Jr. at No. 3, UA produced the first offensive and defensive player taken in the 2023 NFL Draft.
- Jahmyr Gibbs went 12th overall to the Detroit Lions, making him the second-highest running back selected during Saban's tenure. He trailed only Trent Richardson, who went No. 3 overall to the Cleveland Browns in the 2012 Draft.
- With the selection of Young in the 2023 NFL Draft, Alabama has had at least one player selected in the first round of 15 straight drafts (2009-present) to set the new NCAA record. The Crimson Tide was previously tied with Miami (1995-2008), who owned the old mark of 14 consecutive first-rounders
- Alabama has produced multiple first round picks in 12 of the last 15 NFL Drafts with single first-round selections in 2009, 2015 and 2016.
- With Jameson Williams' selection in the 2022 NFL Draft, Alabama became the just the second college program to produce a first-rounder at wideout in a three-year stretch. Tennessee also accomplished the feat from 1982-84.
- After the 2021 NFL Draft, Alabama became the first school in the modern draft era to have four wide receivers drafted in the first round in a two-year span (2020 - Henry Ruggs III, Jerry Jeudy; 2021 - DeVonta Smith, Jaylen Waddle).
- Also in 2021, Alabama became one of just two schools (Oklahoma) to have quarterbacks selected in the first round in back-to-back years (2020 - Tua Tagovailoa; 2021 - Mac Jones).
- With the first-round selection of Tagovailoa in the 2020 NFL Draft, Saban has produced at least one first-rounder at every starting position on offense and defense during his illustrious collegiate head coaching career.

CRIMSON TIDE IN THE NFL: Alabama entered Week 1 of the 2023-24 NFL season with 58 players on active 53-man rosters, the most of any college. In total, the Crimson Tide currently has 73 players on an NFL roster (including reserve/practice squad) and is represented on 26 of the league's 32 teams. Below is a look at where former Crimson Tide standouts are currently playing.

LEADERS IN THE LEAGUE: Every year, the National Football League allows each of its 32 teams to name up to eight team captains. The start of the 2023-24 season featured 13 former Crimson Tide players who were selected as one of the permanent captains for their respective squad. The list of captains to start the year included Jonathan Allen (Commanders), Derrick Henry (Titans), Jalen Hurts (Eagles), Eddie Jackson (Bears), Kareem Jackson (Broncos), Josh Jacobs (Raiders), Mac Jones (Patriots), Ryan Kelly (Colts), Xavier McKinney (Giants), C.J. Mosley (Jets), DeVonta Smith (Eagles), Tua Tagovailoa (Dolphins) and Bryce Young (Panthers). The Baltimore Ravens do not name team captains, per head coach John Harbaugh's rules, while the Dallas Cowboys name team captains on a game-by-game basis.

70 IN A SEASON: A total of 70 former Crimson Tide players appeared in a game and played at least one snap during the 2022-23 NFL regular season. Alabama became the first program to have 70 former players see game action in any regular season in NFL history. Reggie Ragland earned snaps in the Cleveland Browns' Week 15 matchup with the Baltimore Ravens to push the total to 70. The number of former Tide players to play in an NFL regular-season contest has now increased each year for six consecutive seasons starting with 38 in 2016. The 2017 season saw 44 former players earn game action, breaking Alabama's previous record of 40 in 1987, and was followed by 52 in 2018. The total moved to 62 in 2019, followed by 64 in 2020 and 68 in 2021.

• Saban has compiled a 292-70-1 (.806) record as a college head coach. He has claimed seven national championships – six at Alabama – 11 conference championships and 23 of his teams will have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship Game following the 2003, 2009, 2011 and 2012 seasons and the College Football Playoff Semifinals in seven of the last nine seasons including six of the last eight CFP National Championship Games.

• Saban is the only coach to win four BCS national championships, the only coach to win back-to-back BCS national championships and the only coach to win three CFP National Championships. He has won seven titles in his last 17 years coaching college football, most recently capturing the CFP National Championship following the 2020 season. Saban is one of three college coaches in the poll era (since 1936) to win three national championships in four years (2009, 2011-12). His title in 2020 moved him past Paul "Bear" Bryant for the most national championships in the poll era with seven.

• In 2009, Saban produced Alabama's first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship Game. He then followed that up with his second BCS championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. Saban made it back-to-back BCS national championships in 2012 with a 42-14 win over Notre Dame in the Discover BCS National Championship Game. He took down Clemson, 45-40, to capture title No. 5 following the 2015 season in the CFP National Championship Game and took home his sixth national championship - and fifth at Alabama - in 2017 with a 26-23 overtime win over Georgia in the 2018 CFP National Championship Game. Saban's most recent title came in dominating fashion as the Crimson Tide defeated Ohio State, 52-24, in the 2021 CFP National Championship Game in Miami Gardens, Fla.

• In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team's response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom that year with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.

• A five-season run at LSU (2000-04) produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships and three SEC West Division championships. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America.

• Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach, including four postseason appearances. In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season.

• Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points) and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

• A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen. They have one granddaughter, Amélie, and one grandson, James.

• At Michigan State, the Sabans started the Nick's Kids Foundation, which they have continued in Tuscaloosa, a vibrant example of their continuing concern for disadvantaged children. Since Nick and Terry arrived in Tuscaloosa, over \$12 million has been distributed to students, teachers and children's causes at over 150 charities through the Nick's Kids Foundation.

• Personally, Nick and Terry have given over \$1 million to their First Generation Scholarship at The University of Alabama. The Sabans also contributed \$1 million to The Crimson Standard, Alabama's 10-year, \$600 million capital campaign. Most recently, the Sabans announced plans for The Saban Center in Tuscaloosa, a learning and discovery center on the Black Warrior River that brings together the Children's Hands-On Museum and the Tuscaloosa Children's Theater. The Sabans made a personal gift of \$1 million to the project and the Nick's Kids Foundation contributed another \$2 million.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — The No. 4/3 Alabama football team opened the 2023 campaign with a resounding 56-7 win over Middle Tennessee in front of a sold-out crowd at Bryant-Denny Stadium. With the victory, the Crimson Tide won its 21st consecutive home game which stands as the fourth-best streak in program history.

Making just his second career start, quarterback Jalen Milroe shined against the Blue Raiders, accounting for five touchdowns and 242 total yards of offense. Milroe closed the night with 194 yards and three touchdowns through the air, while also rushing seven times for 48 yards and a pair of scores.

Eight different receivers caught at least one pass in the win, led by Isaiah Bonds five catches for 76 yards and a touchdown. Both Jermaine Burton (3 receptions, 62 yards) and Amari Niblack (2 receptions, 49 yards) also found the back of the endzone for Alabama.

Defensively, the Tide was led by Caleb Downs' eight tackles, which included six solo stops, while Deontae Lawson added seven tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack. As a unit, Alabama combined to make three sacks, seven tackles for loss, six quarterback hurries and a pair of turnovers.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — The No. 3/3 Alabama football team dropped a 34-24 decision to No. 11/10 Texas. The Longhorns trailed by a field goal entering the fourth quarter of play but scored three touchdowns in less than a six-minute span to pull away for the victory.

The loss was Alabama's first at home since Nov. 9, 2019 (lost 46-41 to then-No. 1 LSU), while it's the first time since Nov. 17, 2007 that the Tide has lost a non-conference home game (lost 21-14 to ULM). The defeat not only ended UA's 21-game overall home-winning streak, but also snapped a streak of 43 consecutive home wins over non-conference opponents.

Alabama quarterback Jalen Milroe finished the night with 299 yards of combined offense, passing for 255 yards and a pair of touchdowns through the air while also rushing for 44 yards on 15 carries. Kobe Prentice had five receptions for 68 yards while Jermaine Burton (2 receptions, 58 yards) and Amari Niblack (2 receptions, 45 yards) each found the back of the end zone.

Defensively, the Tide was led by Caleb Downs and Trezmen Marshall, who each finished with 10 tackles, while Deontae Lawson added eight stops.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. – The No. 11/10 Alabama football team defeated the Arkansas Razorbacks, 24-21, in front of a sellout crowd inside Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Crimson Tide built an 18-point lead late in the third quarter and held on for the victory to remain unbeaten in SEC play.

With the win, head coach Nick Saban earned his 200th on-field victory at Alabama, improving to 200-28 (.877) in 17 seasons at the Capstone.

Quarterback Jalen Milroe completed 10-of-21 passes for 238 yards through the air (23.8 yards per pass) and a pair of touchdowns. It is the fourth time in his six starts this season that he has thrown for at least 220 yards and at least two touchdowns. Both Kobe Prentice (two receptions, 93 yards) and Jermaine Burton (two receptions, 60 yards) had touchdown receptions in the contest.

Overall, it was a balanced offensive attack as the Tide's 415 yards of total offense included 177 yards on the ground. Running back Jase McClellan led the group with 83 yards on 16 carries (5.2 yards per carry) while Roydell Williams added 68 yards on seven rushing attempts (9.7 ypc).

The Crimson Tide defense limited the Razorbacks to 250 yards of total offense led by Jaylen Key, who finished with seven tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss. Caleb Downs also added seven stops as he and Key were two of seven UA defensive players who had at least five tackles in the game.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. – The No. 11/8 Alabama football team dominated the second half on its way to a 34-20 come-from-behind victory over No. 17/15 Tennessee in front of a sold-out crowd at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

The Crimson Tide fell behind 13-0 early and entered the locker room at halftime trailing 20-7. However, UA scored on its first four drives of the second half and went on to outscore UT 27-0 over the final 30 minutes of play.

Alabama dominated the statistics in the second half, limiting Tennessee to only 129 yards and 3.9 yards per play compared to 225 total yards and 7.0 yards per play for the Tide. Deontae Lawson led the defense with 12 tackles for the game, with Jihaad Campbell adding 10 tackles and a fumble recovery that he ran back for a touchdown. In all, the Alabama defense combined for eight tackles for loss, four sacks and four pass breakups.

Quarterback Jalen Milroe completed 14-of-21 passes for 220 and a pair of scores, marking the fifth time in seven starts this season that he has thrown for at least 220 yards and at least two touchdowns. Jermaine Burton had four catches for 62 yards and a touchdown while Isaiah Bond also found paydirt, finishing with three catches for 77 yards.

Running back Jase McClellan once again led the ground attack, finishing with 115 of the Crimson Tide's 138 total rushing yards.
