2nd Year at LSU • 9th Year as a Head Coach

LSU Men's Basketball Head Coach Matt McMahon has five simple core values that define him and his basketball program at LSU:

Hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy.

Those were some of the first words he said when he stepped to the podium for the first time as the 25th LSU men's basketball head coach on March 22, 2022.

And even though the first season proved difficult as Coach McMahon and staff had to rebuild a roster completely from scratch in less than 45 days, the characteristics of a Matt McMahon program were there for people to clearly see.

Now as the LSU Basketball program begins its second season, Coach McMahon under the cornerstone of those core values has welcomed in an older, more experienced group of players who not only understand the fundamentals of the game, but also the culture of the environment with many having lived and played in around the Baton Rouge/LSU area.

LSU, Coach McMahon and staff laid a new foundation a year ago and now has many of the tools needed to build on that foundation.

The culture and success were on display during the seven years at Murray State University where Coach McMahon led the Racers to a record of 154-67, a .697 winning percentage. He led Murray State to 93 OVC regular-season wins, winning 75 percent of league games.

He has also coached multiple all-Americans and all-league players such as Ja Morant who was named NBA Rookie of the Year in 2020.

The Racers won regular season league titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2022 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2018, 2019 and 2022 (the 2020 appearance was canceled by the pandemic).

Since the native of Oak Ridge, Tennessee, became the third-youngest rookie among D1 coaches in 2015, McMahon has continued a steady move forward with a reputation for developing talent both as an assistant and head coach. He has become known nationally as an excellent recruiter and he is among the best in the nation in the area of player development and game planning.

In his final season at Murray State in 2021-22, McMahon coached OVC Player of the Year KJ Williams and two other recipients of first-team honors (Tevin Brown, Justice Hill). In addition, McMahon was named the league's Coach of the Year.

Williams and his successfully play translated to the Southeastern Conference where he earned All-SEC honors in a super senior year when he became at the time in January 2023 the 123rd player in Division I college basketball to amass 2,000 career points and 1,000 rebounds.

McMahon's Racers, in 2021-22, were just the

sixth team in league history to go undefeated and the first to do it in an 18-game conference schedule. Murray State then won the two league tournament games to advance to the NCAA Tournament where, as a No. 7 seed, the Racers defeated San Francisco to advance to the round of 32.

The 2021-22 team was one of seven teams to win 30 or more games and led the nation in win percentage at 91.2 percent (31-3). The Racers were ranked No. 20 in the final AP poll and No. 22 in the Ferris Mowers Coaches Poll.

McMahon was the first MSU coach to have three seasons of 25 or more wins and one of just three Murray State coaches to have four 20-win seasons.

Coach McMahon led the Racers to three-straight OVC regular season championships (2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20) and two consecutive OVC Tournament titles (2017-18, 2018-19).

The 2018-19 team won 28 games and made its mark in the NCAA Tournament when the 12th-seeded Racers won their fourth all-time tourney game by defeating No. 5 seed Marquette.

That season, Morant named the OVC POY, leading Division I in assists and earning first-team all-America honors from the USBWA.

He was drafted second overall in the 2019 NBA draft by the Memphis Grizzlies.

In 2017-18, McMahon's team won 26 games and the OVC regular season and tournament championship, sending the Racers to what was at that time the school's 16th NCAA Tournament.

Prior to being named head coach, he was a key part of Coach Steve Prohm's staff as assistant at Murray State as the Racers won a pair of Ohio Valley Conference championships, a CollegeInsider.com Tournament championship and an appearance in the NIT. He was part of a staff that won 104 games from 2011-15.

In 2014-15, MSU became the first team in school history to go undefeated in the OVC at 16-0 and set a league record with a 25-game win streak that was second best in the nation. Three seasons earlier, McMahon was named to the list of best

assistant coaches by FoxSports.com and CollegeInsider.com.

In his first season as an assistant at Murray State, the team was 31-2 and earned a No. 6 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

PRIOR TO MURRAY STATE

Coach McMahon has had success in college basketball since his days as a player at Appalachian State.

Known as an excellent shooter and tough competitor, he played on three Southern Conference regular season title teams in 1998, 1999 and 2000. The Mountaineers won the SoCon Tournament in 2000 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

He played in 90 career games under coach Buzz Peterson and made 124 three-pointers, graduating in 2000 with a bachelor's in marketing.

His coaching career began immediately at Appalachian State as a student assistant under Houston Fancher in 2000-01. He would rejoin Peterson's staff as a student coach at Tennessee before returning to ASU in 2002, where he stayed until the end of the 2009-10 season. A year at UNC Wilmington (2010-11) as assistant coach set the stage for his journey to Murray State, starting first as an assistant in the 2011-12 season and then as head coach prior to the 2015-16 season.

Coach McMahon and his wife Mary, a former standout for the Furman women's basketball team, have three children – Maris, Mason and Mabry.

TIGERS AT THE CHARLESTON CLASSIC

The Tigers will be playing their annual MTE in Charleston at the Shriners Children's Charleston Classic.

This will mark the second time the Tigers have played in the Charleston Classic with LSU last here for the 2011 event. LSU won two games in the 2011 event:

Nov. 17, 2011 -- Northwestern 88, LSU 82

Nov. 18, 2011 -- LSU 76, Western Kentucky 57

Nov. 20, 2011 -- LSU 59, Georgia Tech 50

The event follows a similar format with games on Thursday, Friday and Sunday of tournament week. LSU will open on Thursday at 4 p.m. ET (3 p.m. Baton Rouge time) against Dayton. The Tigers Friday opponent will be either St John's or North Texas at either 11:30 a.m. or 2 p.m. ET (10:30/1 p.m. BR time). The Sunday opponent and time will be determined as the event moves forward.

Since its first appearance in 1947 in the Fort Worth Collegiate, the Tigers are 83-70 all-time in what are known in 2023 vernacular as MTEs (multi-team events). Here are results in recent events:

2022 -- Cayman Islands Classic -- 2-1 -- lost championship to Kansas State (George Town, Cayman Islands)

2021 -- Emerald Coast Classic -- 2-0 -- win championship over Wake Forest (Niceville, Florida)

2020 -- Billiken Classic -- 1-1 (St. Louis, Missouri)

2019 -- Jersey Mike's Jamaica Classic -- 1-1 (Kingston, Jamaica)

LSU overall is 2-2 in TD Arena, having a 70-58 loss to Charleston in 2015 along with the 2-1 Charleston Classic arena.

TODAY'S OPPONENT

The Flyers are 1-1 overall after a road loss at Northwestern, falling 71-66. In the opener at home earlier in the week, Dayton was a 67-43 winner over SIUE.

DaRon Holmes II led Dayton in the Northwestern game with 17 points and six assists, while Koby Brea scored 15 points (4 treys) with Javon Bennett adding 12 points and five assists. Nate Santos scored 11 points. In the loss, Dayton made 21-of-39 field goal attempts, including 12-of-23 from distance.

The teams have only played twice and both of those events were on neutral courts. The Tigers lost to Dayton in 1984 in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament, 74-66, in Salt Lake City and then the Flyers defeated LSU, 86-73, in the November 1995 Hawaii Tipoff Classic in Honolulu.

Anthony Grant is the head coach of the Dayton Flyers. Grant coached against the Tigers in his six years in Tuscaloosa at Alabama, 2019-15. The team faced each other 12 times with Grant getting seven wins.

SERIES AGAINST POSSIBLE FRIDAY OPPONENTS

ST. JOHN'S – The Red Storm was 1-0 heading into a Monday game ... LSU and St. John's have played three times but not since 1969 (all at neutral sites). LSU lost 80-49 in 1949 and 102-62 in 1965, before LSU won 80-70 in 1969 in the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu. Rick Pitino is in his first year at St. John's and his illustrious career included eight years when he faced LSU at Kentucky (1989-97). Pitino has nine wins in 12 meetings with LSU.

NORTH TEXAS – LSU and North Texas played a home-and-home series in 2010 and 2011 with the road team winning on both occasions. North Texas won in Baton Rouge in 2010, 75-55, and LSU was a 67-58 winner in Denton in 2011. North Texas is 2-0 with wins over Northern Iowa (83-77 ot) and Omaha (75-64) in games played in Denton. Ross Hodge is in his first year as the head coach at North Texas.

THE RECENT GAMES

GAME 2 -- NICHOLLS 68, LSU 66 -- November 10, 2023 | Maravich Center | Baton Rouge, Louisiana

RECAP: Nicholls was the last Louisiana school to beat LSU in 2010 in a regular season game and turned the trick again at the Maravich Center. The Colonels came out hitting 9-of-17 three-point attempts in the first half in building a 44-points, 44-20 with 2:04 remaining. LSU would score the last five points to go to half down, 44-25. In the second half, the Tigers came out with more aggression and eventually would tie the game at 57-57 and take their first lead on a Jalen Reed free throw, 58-57, with 5:36 to play. LSU would lead 66-63 with 1:41 to play on a Daimion Collins rebound dunk, but the Tigers would not score again.

Nicholls would get two free throws and then after a couple of LSU misses, the Colonels would hit the winning three-pointer with 1.2 to play. LSU missed a long turn-around jumper at the buzzer. Jalen Reed would lead LSU with 14 points and eight rebounds. Reed hit 5-of-6 field goal attempts. Jordan Wright was the only other player in double figures with 11 points. LSU shot just 39.3 percent for the game (51.7, 15-29 in the second half), but just 3-of-19 from three-point range for the game.

NOTES ON THE FIRST TWO LSU CONTESTS

While Coach Matt McMahon's coaching style is to play an 8-9 rotation once the season settles in, he played all 12 players that were dressed against Mississippi Valley State with the score as it was (with no player playing more than 22 minutes) and then 11 players against Nicholls trying to find the right combination.

The 10-of-11 performance by Will Baker (vs. Mississippi Valley State-11/6) is T3 on the list for games in the Maravich Assembly Center (minimum 10 attempts) for best field goal percentage:

Stanley Roberts (10-10) vs. Loyola Marymount, 2/3/90 – 100 percent

Durand Macklin (12-12) vs. Miss. State, 1/5/80 – 100 percent

Will Baker (10-11) vs. Miss. Valley State, 11/6/23 – 90.9 percent

Tyrus Thomas (10-11) vs. Nicholls, 11/21/05 – 90.9 percent

The Tigers scored on 46-of-71 possessions in the opening game (64.8%) and 32-of-66 against Nicholls ... Nicholls actually had a lower percentage of scores, 28-of-63, but made 12 threes compared to three for the Tigers.

LSU has outscored opponents 72 to 42 in the paint in the first two games combined. LSU had a 38-28 advantage against Mississippi State and 34-14 against Nicholls.

The Tigers have double figure steals in the two games (12 vs. Miss. Valley State, 11 versus Nicholls). Jordan Wright led 11 with four against MVSU and Mike Williams III had four against Nicholls.

In that regard, LSU has forced 42 turnovers in the two games which has led to 59 points off turnovers for the Tigers ... LSU has made 25 turnovers in the two games resulting in 26 points for the opponents.

MORE ON 100 POINTS

LSU scored over 100 against Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 6 (106) for the first time in a regular season game since the opening game of the 2021-22 season, Nov. 9, versus ULM when LSU won 101-39.

It made Matt McMahon the eighth LSU coach in history to coach a game where the Tigers have scored 100 points or more.

The Tigers are now 105-8 overall when scoring 100 or more and LSU has now won 20 straight games when scoring 100 points or more. That last lost when scoring 100 was almost 30 years ago when Arkansas defeated LSU, 108-105, in overtime on March 2, 1994.

The 2017-18 season was the last year a Tiger team cracked 100 points more than once in a season.

LOUISIANA INFLUENCE RETURNS

After a year away, the logo and phrase "Boot Up" has truly returned to the LSU Basketball program as five players have Southeast Louisiana ties to the program in 2023-24.

Carlos Stewart is from Baton Rouge and Jordan Wright is from Waggaman. Both played for The Dunham School in Baton Rouge. Stewart transferred from Santa Clara and Wright from Vanderbilt.

Jalen Cook played for LSU in the 2020-21 season and returns to Baton Rouge after two seasons at Tulane. He is from Walker. Hunter Dean is from Mandeville and came to LSU from George Washington.

Freshman Corey Chest hails from New Orleans where he played three years of high school before finishing up last year at The Link Academy in Missouri.

It is the most since there were eight players from Louisiana on the 2017-18 roster.

OLDER PLAYERS

This will be one of the older rosters in recent LSU basketball history with 11 players who are at least in their third year of college basketball.

Three players – Jordan Wright (Vanderbilt), Will Baker (Nevada), Hunter Dean (George Washington) – are grad transfers, while Trae Hannibal is a fifth-year senior thanks to the pandemic season of 2020.

BUT A STATISTICAL NOTE ABOUT THEIR BIRTHDATES

The 2023-24 edition of the Tigers marks the first year that every player on the roster was born in 2000 or later. Only Graduates Jordan Wright and Will Baker were born in 2000.

STILL WAITING ON NCAA APPEAL

As of the start of the week, Jalen Cook remained unable to play after his request for a transfer waiver was denied by the NCAA. Cook played at LSU during the 2020-21 season before transferring to Tulane for the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons.

LSU and Cook is appealing the decision as the Walker, Louisiana product looks to come back to his original school. He is one of many still awaiting final decision from the NCAA regarding his transfer situation.

Cook has been with the team and has continued to practice with the squad while awaiting a decision.

BAKER WITH AN OPENING BURST

Will Baker's opening night burst of 29 points (11/6) topped his career high, previously at 28, at Nevada this past January against New Mexico.

The 29 points was the ninth 20-point game of Baker's career with the previous eight happening during his time at Texas and Nevada.

Baker is averaging 15.5 points per game and 4.5 rebounds.

A FRESHMAN STARTED FOR SEVENTH STRAIGHT YEAR

Baltimore freshman Mike Williams III got the nod at guard against Mississippi Valley (11/6) to be the 10th freshman to start a regular season opener dating back to the start of the 2017-18 season. Twice in that time there has been more than one freshman in the starting lineup. The freshman and the year of the opening game they started:

Williams played 15 minutes and scored 5 points with 2 assists and 2 steals in the opener. Against Nicholls, he also had five points with four steals in 18 minutes. Through the two games, Williams is averaging 5.0 points per game, 1.5 rebounds, 1.0 assist and 3.0 steals.

JALEN REED LOOKED GOOD AGAINST NICHOLLS

Jalen Reed started early last season as a freshman but would only start 11 of 33 total games, struggling early before showing a spark at the end of the season. The son of the late Ole Miss-NBA star Justin Reed finished the year averaging 3.7 points and 3.2 rebounds a game.

But in the first two games, it is obvious the work Reed has put in with player development and strength and conditioning has paid off as he scored 11 points against Mississippi Valley State and a team high 14 against Nicholls. Against the Colonels, Reed hit 5-of-6 field goals and 4-of-6 at the line in 22 minutes with a team best eight rebounds.

For the season, he is averaging 11.5 points with a team best 7.0 rebounds per game, making 7-of-10 from the field.

SHOOTING THE THREE

The Tigers were very good and very bad in the first two games when it comes to shooting the three-pointer.

In the Nov. 6 opener against Mississippi Valley, LSU made 14 three-pointers out of 34 total field goals. LSU was 14-of-26 from distance in the game. The Tigers also, were 20-of-33 inside the arc that game.

Against Nicholls, the Tigers made its only three-pointer of the first 20 minutes at the 14:06 mark and finished the first 20 minutes 1-of-11. Nothing changed much in the second half as the Tigers made just 2-of-8 for a 3-of-19 total for the game. LSU was 19-of-37 inside the arc.

For the first two games, the Tigers are 17-of-45 from the arc (37.8%). LSU has allowed 18 makes from the same number of attempts by the opponents.

BUT LSU GETTING TO THE FREE THROW LINE

In the first two games the Tigers have done a good job of getting to the line, making 43-of-60 free throw attempts, compared to 26-of-38 for opponents (68.4%). LSU has made 71.7 percent of attempts.

Will Baker drew six fouls in the opener in going 7-of-8 at the line, while against Nicholls, Jalen Reed drew five fouls and was 4-of-6 at the line. The free throws have been spread out with seven players having at least five attempts.

JORDAN WRIGHT

Averaging 11.5 points in the first two games, the graduate from Waggaman, Louisiana is making it a fifth year in the SEC after his four years at Vanderbilt.

Wright, who played with junior Carlos Stewart at The Dunham School in Baton Rouge, is in his career on the verge of 1,200 career points with 1,190 career points entering the Charleston Classic. He has played 125 career games with 75 starts.

He was the 2022 SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year in men's basketball and received his degree from Vanderbilt in May 2023.

TRAE HANNIBAL

Trae Hannibal has played just under 38 minutes off the bench combined in the first two games but it is obvious that his ability to drive inside can still be a very important aspect of the Tigers offense when it needs to change the tempo a bit.

The fifth-year senior is averaging 4.5 points a game, but 4.0 assists per game with five assists versus Mississippi Valley State and three against Nicholls.

Hannibal is his second year with the Tigers.

DERRICK FOUNTAIN

It was good to see Derek Fountain have a good 22 minute effort against Nicholls on Friday. Fountain missed the entire Bahamas exhibition trip in August and then the scrimmage and the exhibition game with a "stomach issue" that occurred on more than one occasion. But against Nicholls, Fountain, in his second year with the team after transferring from Mississippi State, scored nine points on 2-of-3 shooting, including a trey, and 4-of-5 at the free throw line.

Through the first two games, he is averaging 5.5 points and 3.5 rebounds.

MORE ASSISTANT COACHES

The NCAA as of July 1, changed the rule this year to allow up to two more assistant coaches on the floor coaching in practice and in games and LSU will have four listed assistant coaches for the 2023-24 season. The limit is five, but LSU will go with four this year after Cody Toppert recently became the head coach of the Capital City Go-Go of the NBA G-League.

These additional coaches may engage in coaching activities but may not recruit off campus. The rules change codified a waiver in those sports that allowed noncoaching staff members to engage in skill instruction.

So, joining assistant coaches Casey Long and Ronnie Hamilton, will be Chief of Staff Tim Kaine and Director of Player Development Ronrico White who will add

Assistant Coach to their present titles. Both Kaine and White worked with McMahon at Murray State.

SKYLAR MAYS GETS FULL RIDE FOR PORTLAND THIS SEASON

Former LSU Tiger Skylar Mays got some good news on Sunday when his two-way contract was converted to a rest of the year contract as he has become a regular part of the Portland Trailblazers guard rotation. Mays, a Baton Rouge native, has played in seven games with Portland this season, averaging 6.1 points, 2.7 assists and 0.9 steals in 14.2 minutes per game.

Former Tiger Cam Thomas had a great start since moving into the starting lineup for Brooklyn averaging 26.9 points per game, but an ankle sprain late last week has him out for at least two weeks.

In all, nine former LSU players are on the rosters of six NBA teams.

FOUR STAR SIGNEES INKED

LSU received the national letter of intent papers from two four-star signees for the 2024-25 season on national signing day.

The signees are 6-11 forward Robert Miller III of Houston’s Pasadena Memorial High School and 6-3 guard Curtis Givens III of Memphis, Tennessee, who attends Monteverde Academy in Florida.

Miller III was ranked No. 40 by On3 and No. 49 nationally by 247sports and the No. 2 recruit in the state of Texas.

“Rob has grown up loving LSU and he will take great pride in wearing the purple and gold,” said Coach Matt McMahon. “He is incredibly talented and possesses a unique skill set at 6-11. His versatility on the perimeter really stands out with his ability to handle the basketball and attack the basket off the dribble. He shoots it well from behind the 3-point arc as well. On the defensive side of the ball, Rob provides shot blocking and rim protection with his athleticism and 7-4 wingspan. He has a very high ceiling, and we cannot wait to coach him at LSU.”

Miller is the son of former LSU football defensive lineman Robert Miller II. His mother Teana (McKiver) Miller played basketball for Tulane and in the WNBA. As a junior at Pasadena Memorial, Miller III averaged 19.7 points, 13.4 rebounds and 5.4 blocks per game.

This past summer, Miller III was invited to the 2023 NBPA Top 100 Camp at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex in Orlando, Florida. The camp features some of the best high school basketball players from around the country and provides comprehensive on and off the court programming to maximize a player’s potential. He also attended the Pangos All-American Camp in both 2022 and 2023.

Givens III is ranked No. 33 by ON3 nationally and number four among point guards, while ESPN’s recruiting rankings has Givens III ranked at number 48.

“Curtis is a player we have recruited for a long time,” said Coach McMahon. “He is a versatile lead guard who can not only run your team, but he is also a proven scorer. I just love what he is about. He possesses a relentless work ethic, a competitive drive, and outstanding leadership qualities. Curtis is a consistent 3-point shooter, a creative playmaker, and a guard who makes great decisions on the court. Ultimately, I believe he makes everyone around him better and that is the best compliment you can give a player. We are excited for the opportunity to coach him at LSU.”

Givens III has had great success on the AAU and EYBL circuit, playing for Moka Elite in Missouri. He had games of 18 points, 4 assists; 21 points; and, 23 points and 5 asts and in the Peach Jam had games of 16 points-4 assists and, 13 points-8 rebounds. In session one on the EYBL circuit, he averaged 18.8 points a contest. He also was invited to the NBPA Top 100 camp for top high school prospects. The camp features some of the best high school basketball players from around the country and provides comprehensive on and off the court programming to maximize a player’s potential.

Of the two signees Coach McMahon said, “We are thrilled to officially welcome Rob Miller and Curtis Givens to the LSU Basketball Family. We have really enjoyed building relationships with their families and we look forward to the impact both will make on our program,” said Coach McMahon.

HALL OF FAMER TO BE ON TODAY’S TELECAST

Perry Clark will be handling the color commentary on today’s tournament telecast and back in Louisiana, the folks in Natchitoches are waiting to welcome him at the 2024 induction ceremony for the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame. Clark was one of nine former coaches/players voted to be inducted in ceremonies that will be held in late spring or early summer.

As Tulane’s basketball coach from 1989-2000, Clark led the program back from a self-imposed shutdown to three NCAA Tournament appearances in a four-year span – the only three NCAA trips in the program’s history. In 11 seasons at Tulane, Clark had six 20-win seasons and seven postseason appearances. Clark was head coach for four years each at Miami and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and has 304 career wins.

Also in the class representing LSU will be wrestling star Kevin Jackson and women’s basketball star Seimone Augustus.


