SERIES RECORDS VS. NORTHERN ILLINOIS/STONY BROOK

• Thursday's game marks the 18th meeting between LSU and Northern Illinois, but it's the first meeting between the schools since 1970 ... the Tigers played the Huskies 17 times from 1939-70, and LSU holds a 12-5 advantage in the all-time series ... LSU has a 24-7 mark all-time against schools in the Mid-American Conference – the Tigers are 12-5 vs. Northern Illinois; 0-1 vs. Kent State; 2-1 vs. Ball State; 2-0 vs. Central Michigan; 3-0 vs. Western Michigan; 3-0 vs. Ohio and 2-0 vs. Toledo.

• LSU has a 2-2 mark all-time against Stony Brook, and Friday's game will mark the first regular-season meeting between the schools ... Stony Brook won two of three games over the Tigers in the 2012 NCAA Super Regional, and LSU defeated the Seawolves in the opening round of the 2019 NCAA Regional ... all four of the previous meetings were played in Alex Box Stadium, Skip Bertman Field ... Stony Brook is a member of the Coastal Athletic Association, and LSU has a 13-2 all-time mark versus CAA schools – the Tigers are 2-2 vs. Stony Brook; 1-0 vs. Northeastern; 3-0 vs. UNC Wilmington; 1-0 vs. Charleston; 3-0 vs. William & Mary; 1-0 vs. Hofstra and 2-0 vs. Towson

ABOUT THE TIGERS

• **LSU is the reigning National Champion**, having captured the 2023 College World Series title last June in Omaha, Neb. LSU has **seven national championships (1991, 1993, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2009, 2023)**, the second-most in NCAA history ... LSU has the second-highest all-time NCAA Tournament winning percentage (.707, 174-72).

• LSU began the 2024 season with four straight wins last week, defeating VMI twice and Central Arkansas twice ... the Tigers' 11-8 win over VMI on Friday marked LSU's 23rd straight victory in a season opener.

• Graduate catcher/designated hitter **Hayden Travinski** was named SEC Co-Player of the Week on Monday ... he led LSU offensively in Week 1, batting .571 (8-for-14) with one homer, five RBI and nine runs scored ... Travinski also walked three times and was hit by a pitch on two occasions, as he recorded a .684 on-base percentage ... he was 3-for-5 in Sunday's win over VMI with two RBI and three runs scored ... his solo homer in the bottom of the eighth inning on Friday with LSU holding a 10-8 lead provided an insurance run in the Tigers' 11-8 victory over VMI.

• Junior right-hander **Luke Holman** enjoyed a spectacular LSU debut last Saturday in a win over Central Arkansas ... Holman, a transfer from Alabama, worked 5.1 shutout innings and limited the Bears to three hits with one walk and 10 strikeouts ... Holman fired 87 pitches in the outing, 55 for strikes ... he retired nine straight Central Arkansas batters in his first three innings of work, and he allowed just one runner to advance beyond second base over the course of his outing.

- Freshman second baseman **Steven Milam** excelled in his collegiate debut last weekend, batting .545 (6-for-11) in three games with one double, four RBI, five runs, one steal, two walks, one hit-by-pitch and a .643 on-base percentage ... Milam delivered the game-winning hit in LSU's 2-0 victory Saturday over Central Arkansas, lining an RBI single in the bottom of the fourth inning to give the Tigers a 1-0 lead ... in Sunday's win over VMI, Milam batted in the lead-off position and was 4-for-6 at the plate with one double, three RBI and four runs.

- Third baseman **Tommy White** has been named to the **2024 Golden Spikes Award Watch List**. He batted .374 (102-for-273) last season with 24 doubles, 24 homers, 105 RBI and 64 runs scored. He finished No. 1 in the nation in RBI (105), No. 3 in total bases (198) and No. 4 in RBI per game (1.59). White, a product of St. Pete Beach, Fla., completed last season No. 1 in the SEC in RBI (105), No. 2 in total bases (198), No. 2 in hits (102), No. 2 in doubles (24), No. 4 in homers (24), No. 6 in batting average (.374) and No. 7 in slugging percentage (.725).

- Right-hander **Luke Holman** has been named to the **2024 Golden Spikes Award Watch List**. Holman, who transferred to LSU from Alabama, made 31 appearances (15 starts) over two seasons for the Crimson Tide and posted a 4.05 ERA with 111 strikeouts in 100.0 innings. Holman, a native of Sinking Springs, Pa., worked as Alabama's No. 1 starter in 2023, recording a 7-4 mark and a 3.67 ERA in 81.0 innings with 87 strikeouts and a .186 opponent batting average. He finished No. 2 in the SEC in WHIP (1.05) and No. 3 in opponent batting average and hits per nine innings (6.00).

- LSU sophomore right-hander **Gavin Guidry** has been named to the 2024 Stopper of the Year Watch List by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association. Guidry, a product of Lake Charles, La., developed into one of LSU's top arms out of the bullpen last season as a true freshman, making 23 appearances (one start) and posting a 3-0 record with a 3.77 ERA and three saves in 28.2 innings. He recorded 42 strikeouts and 12 walks, and limited opponents to a .209 cumulative batting average.

- Five LSU players have been named to the D1Baseball Top 100 College Prospects List for the 2024 Major League Baseball Draft. LSU junior third baseman **Tommy White** is No. 7 on the list; junior right-handed pitcher **Luke Holman** is No. 12; junior right-handed pitcher **Thatcher Hurd** is No. 25; sophomore outfielder **Paxton Kling** is No. 50; and junior left-handed pitcher **Gage Jump** is No. 62.

- Two LSU players have been named to the 2024 Perfect Game Top 50 list of college seniors. Catcher **Hayden Travinski** is No. 13 on the list, and outfielder **Mac Bingham** is No. 17. **Travinski**, a native of Shreveport, La., earned

the starting catcher position last April. He appeared in 41 games (23 starts) on the year, batting .356 (37-for-104) with five doubles, 10 homers, 30 RBI and 30 runs scored. He was voted to the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional All-Tournament Team after hitting .429 (6-for-14) with one double, two HR, five RBI and five runs. **Bingham** transferred to LSU after four seasons at Arizona (2020-23), where he earned 2023 All-Pac 12 recognition while hitting .360 with 68 runs scored, 20 doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 51 RBI and a .573 slugging percentage. He also received 2023 ABCA All-West Region recognition.

- Three LSU players have been named to the 2024 D1 Baseball Top 20 list of draft-eligible sophomores. The Tigers appearing in the Top 20 are right-handed pitcher/infielder **Gavin Guidry**, first baseman/catcher **Jared Jones** and outfielder **Paxton Kling**. As a true freshman, **Guidry** made 23 appearances (one start) last season and posted a 3-0 record with a 3.77 ERA, 12 walks, 42 strikeouts and three saves in 28.2 innings. **Jones** earned Freshman All-America and Freshman All-SEC recognition in 2023, as he played in 55 games (47 starts), batting .304 (49-for-161) with 12 doubles, 14 homers, 45 RBI and 37 runs. **Kling** played in 57 games (22 starts) last season, batting .289 (26-for-90) with five doubles, two triples, four homers, nine RBI and 29 runs.

- Three LSU players have been named to the 2024 Perfect Game Top 75 list of college freshmen. Left-handed pitcher **Cam Johnson** is No. 1 on the list; outfielder/left-handed pitcher **Jake Brown** is No. 30; and infielder **Steven Milam** is No. 67. **Johnson** was rated as the No. 42 overall prospect entering the 2023 MLB Draft by MLB Pipeline. He recorded 43 strikeouts in 27 innings in his senior year at IMG Academy, limiting opponents to an .082 batting average with no extra-base hits. **Brown** was voted the 2023 Gatorade Louisiana Baseball Player of the Year, as he posted a 10-2 record on the mound with a 1.71 ERA. He also batted .336 with seven home runs, 26 RBI and 20 stolen bases. **Milam** was voted the 2023 Gatorade New Mexico Player of the Year after batting .627 with 52 hits, 50 RBI and 65 runs.

- D1 Baseball has ranked LSU No. 2 in its Top 25 list of the nation's best transfer classes for the 2024 season. LSU has seven transfers that will make a significant impact this season, including shortstop **Michael Braswell III**, outfielder **Mac Bingham**, right-handed pitcher **Luke Holman**, left-handed pitcher **Gage Jump**, left-handed pitcher **Justin Loer**, right-handed pitcher **Fidel Ulloa** and right-handed pitcher **Kade Woods**.

- LSU senior catcher/DH **Hayden Travinski** will wear jersey No. 8 for the 2024 season. No. 8 is given each season to the upperclassman who exemplifies the spirit of LSU Baseball through his leadership and dedication to the program. The No. 8 tradition was started by outfielder **Mikie Mahtook** (2009-11).





JAY JOHNSON

LSU BASEBALL HEAD COACH

A proven track record of postseason success, explosive lineups and highly-ranked recruiting classes make LSU's Jay Johnson one of the best college baseball coaches in the nation. He has made a significant impact at every program he's led, and he is one of the most energetic, innovative and focused coaches in America.

Now at the helm of one of the nation's most storied college baseball programs, Johnson has enhanced LSU's elite legacy by guiding the Tigers to the 2023 College World Series title, marking the seventh National Championship in school history.

In just his second season at LSU, Johnson directed the Tigers to the 2023 National Championship as their drive to the title was culminated with an 18-4 win over Florida in Game 3 of the College World Series Finals.

He was voted 2023 National Coach of the Year by D1 Baseball, the American Baseball Coaches Association and by Collegiate Baseball newspaper.

Johnson has a 411-211 (.661) record in 11 seasons as a college head coach, including a 94-39 (.707) mark in two seasons at LSU.

He has a 30-13 record in NCAA Tournament games, including a 13-4 mark with the Tigers.

LSU was the nation's consensus No. 1 team for the first 12 weeks of the 2023 regular season, and the Tigers finished the year at the pinnacle of college baseball.

Johnson led LSU to its seventh national title and its first since 2009. He also guided the Tigers to their first College World Series appearance since 2017 and their first 50-win season since 2017.

The Tigers completed the 2023 regular season with a 19-10 Southeastern Conference record, their best league mark since 2017.

LSU was No. 1 in the nation in runs scored (634) and in shutouts by its pitching staff (12). The Tigers finished No. 2 in the nation in homers (144), walks received (413), hit-by-pitches (143), on-base percentage (.432) and strikeouts pitched per nine innings (11.7).

LSU completed the year No. 5 in the nation in slugging percentage (.554); No. 6 in hits allowed per nine innings (7.67) and No. 8 in scoring (8.9 runs per game).

The pitching staff recorded a school-record 798 strikeouts, eclipsing the previous

mark of 682 set in 1997.

The Tigers led the SEC in 12 offensive categories, including batting average (.308), slugging percentage (.554), on-base percentage (.432), runs (634), hits (744), RBI (582), total bases (1,337), HBP (143), walks (413); sacrifice flies (42); plate appearances (3,028) and at-bats (2,412).

LSU finished No. 2 in the SEC in home runs (144), doubles (125) and triples (18).

The 2023 Tigers featured three First-Team All-Americans – centerfielder Dylan Crews, the Golden Spikes Award winner; right-handed pitcher Paul Skenes, the Dick Howser Trophy recipient; and third baseman Tommy White, the nation's leader in RBI (105).

Crews was also voted the SEC Male Athlete of the Year and SEC Player of the Year, and Skenes received National Player of the Year and SEC Pitcher of the Year recognition.

An SEC-record 13 LSU players were selected in the 2023 MLB Draft, including five in the first three rounds. Skenes and Crews made MLB history by becoming the first players from the same school to be drafted No. 1 and No. 2 overall.

Johnson was named the head coach at LSU on June 25, 2021, after guiding Arizona to the Pac-12 championship and a berth in the College World Series.

"I view this as the opportunity of my lifetime," Johnson said on the day of his LSU hiring, "and I will do everything in my power to have our team playing a brand of baseball that makes everyone at LSU, the Baton Rouge community and the entire state of Louisiana incredibly proud."

In addition to his reputation for developing hitters, Johnson is also considered one of the

top recruiters in college baseball. His impact at LSU was immediate, as Perfect Game ranked the Tigers' November 2021 signing class No. 1 in the nation. Perfect Game, Collegiate Baseball and Baseball America in the fall of 2022 named LSU's combined class of incoming signees and transfers the best in America.

Johnson led Arizona to two College World Series appearances – including a Championship Series berth in 2016 – over five full seasons (2016-21).

He worked two seasons (2014-15) as head coach at Nevada, earning Mountain West Coach of the Year honors in 2015 after leading the Wolfpack to their first-ever conference championship.

Johnson was the associate head coach at the University of San Diego (2006-13), where he spearheaded recruiting efforts and served as the hitting coach. Johnson helped sign the

nation's No. 1 class in 2008 and No. 2 class in 2010. At USD, Johnson recruited and coached Kris Bryant, who won the Golden Spikes Award and the Dick Howser Award as the nation's top player before the Cubs selected him No. 2 overall in the 2013 MLB Draft.

Johnson's coaching career began at his alma mater, Point Loma Nazarene, where he served as an assistant coach from 2002 to 2004 before accepting the head coaching position in 2005. He finished his playing career at Point Loma in 2001, hitting .326 as a senior and earning a Gold Glove as the team's starting second baseman.

A native of Oroville, Calif., Johnson is the 26th head coach in LSU baseball history. Johnson and his wife Maureen, a former University of Arizona soccer player, were married in 2016.
