Storylines

- The Tigers secured their spot in the NCAA Semifinals after winning the Fayetteville Regional and earning the program's 14th regional title.

- This year marks LSU's 33rd appearance in the NCAA Championships in school history, including back-to-back appearances under Clark.

- The Tigers are the No. 2 team in the country and remained in the top-5 nationally during all 12 weeks of regular season

competition.

- LSU also remained ranked in the top-5 nationally on every event for six consecutive weeks, finishing second on vault, third on bars, third on beam and first on floor in the standings.

- The Tigers are the top floor team in the nation, earning the highest NQS (49.725) in school and NCAA history on the event.

- Haleigh Bryant was named this year's AAI Award Winner, recognizing her as the top senior

gymnast in the nation. She is only the fourth winner in school history.

- LSU is one of four SEC teams to reach the elite eight, along with Arkansas, Alabama and Florida.

- LSU, California, Arkansas, Stanford, Oklahoma, Utah, Alabama and Florida make up this year's field of eight as four teams will compete for their spot in the NCAA Finals on Saturday, April 20.

Quote from head coach Jay Clark

"I'm proud of our group. It was a great showing for us at regionals. Now, we're one step closer to where we're trying to go and we're ready to keep the train rolling. This team has done a good job of staying present and doing it for each other. That's been a huge key for our success this year and we just want to continue to stay true to ourselves. It doesn't get any easier now that we're headed to the semifinals. That in itself is certainly a great accomplishment, but we want to continue to move forward and stay in the same mindset we have all year. We are grateful for each step of this journey and we're excited to get out there and do what we've done all year."

Gymnastics Makes Second Straight Appearance in NCAA Championships

The No. 2 LSU Gymnastics team (25-3, 5-2 SEC) secured their spot in the 2024 NCAA Gymnastics Championships and is set to kick off competition in Fort Worth in the first session of semifinals on Thursday, April 18 at 3:30 p.m. CT in Dickies Arena. LSU will face Arkansas, California and Stanford with the top two teams advancing to the NCAA Finals on Saturday, April 20. The meet will be broadcast nationally on ESPN2 with Aly Raisman and John Roethlisberger on the call and Taylor Davis as the on-site reporter.



JAY CLARK

HEAD COACH • 4th Season

Jay Clark owns over 30 years of experience in college gymnastics and is one of the best recruiters in the sport, is in his fourth season as the head coach of the LSU gymnastics program.

Clark was tabbed as the third head coach in program history in August 2021 following the retirement of D-D Breaux. Clark is in his tenth season overall at LSU following his hiring as the Tigers' associate head coach in 2012.

Last year, he led the Tigers to their first Final Four appearance under his tenure as he continues to grow the LSU Gymnastics program.

Clark is regarded as one of the best recruiters in the sport and the top bars coach in collegiate gymnastics history. The Tigers' associate head coach for eight seasons and co-head coach for one, Clark's leadership and expertise has helped bring unprecedented success on the recruiting trail and in the gym.

During the time since Clark's arrival, LSU has earned the best performances in school history as the NCAA Runner-Up in 2016, 2017 and 2019, appearances in the NCAA Championship Finals in six of seven seasons, numerous school records, produced seven NCAA individual national champions, and five SEC meet and regular season championships.

His work with the Fighting Tigers of LSU has not gone unnoticed. Clark has been named the Central Region Co-Assistant Coach of the Year along with former LSU assistant Bob Moore five times.

Clark also earned the 2014 and 2017 National Co-Assistant Coach of the Year award with Moore. It marked the third time in his distinguished coaching career he has garnered the nation's top award. He was inducted into the USA Gymnastics Region 8 Hall of Fame in 2018. Because of his recruiting success, ESPN and ESPN the Magazine selected Clark as the ninth-best recruiter in all of collegiate athletics in 2011.

In the gym, Clark is viewed as the top bars coach in collegiate gymnastics history. Clark has coached the Tigers to 33 All-America honors on bars, four of the five highest bars team scores in school history and the top two bars title winners in LSU history. In his illustrious career, Clark has coached nine NCAA bars champions and two during his time in Baton Rouge.

Clark tutored Sarah Finnegan, who ended her career in April 2019 as one of the greatest gymnasts in LSU history. Finnegan became the first NCAA bars champion in school history in 2017 and earned the title once again in 2019. Finnegan and Lexie Priesman won SEC bars champions in 2019 and 2017 respectively, scored perfect scores in 2019 and led the squad that finished fourth in the nation.

The 2018 season on bars under Clark marked the best lineup in LSU history and one of the best in the history of the NCAA. The group posted a school record score of 49.725 and once again went on to break the record against Arizona with a 49.750 for the second-highest in all of NCAA Gymnastics since 1988.

The lineup, anchored by Finnegan, led the nation on bars for the first time in school history. Finnegan became the first gymnast in school history to finish the season ranked No. 1 on the event and joined Sharene Mamby (2001) and Syreeta Barnett (1997) as the only gymnasts at LSU to score a perfect 10.0 on the event.

In 2017, Clark coached Finnegan to the first NCAA Uneven Bars Championship in school history. Clark set the record for the most individual national champions on the event in NCAA gymnastics history.

Clark's bars squad finished ranked third in the nation for a fourth-consecutive Top-5 finish in 2017. The team's average score of 49.367 broke the previous record set in 2015. Finnegan and Priesman combined for three All-America honors. Priesman also took home the program's first SEC Uneven Bars

championship in more than 20 seasons at the league meet.

LSU earned another Top-5 national ranking on bars in 2016 with an average score of 49.252. Finnegan, Priesman and Myia Hambrick combined to tally four All-America honors during the historic season.

The Tigers posted a Top-5 national ranking on bars in 2015, and the team totaled the second-highest bars total in school history with a 49.600 against Iowa. The Tigers also accumulated the second-best season average on bars in school history with a 49.288 average.

As a team LSU produced four All-America honors on bars in 2015 with three gymnasts (Rheagan Courville, Randii Wyrick and Shae Zamardi) earning First-Team All-America honors at the NCAA Championships. It marked the first time in program history that three gymnasts secured First-Team All-America honors on bars in one season.

Under Clark's direction, LSU shattered the school record with a 49.330 average on bars and finished the 2014 season ranked No. 5 nationally in the event. In addition, the Tigers tallied three of the top-10 bars scores in school history, including a 49.600 that ranks as the second best, and LSU produced three All-America honors on bars.

Clark coached Courville to a First-Team All-America honor at the 2014 NCAA Championships, and Courville went on to finish fifth in the event at the NCAA Individual Finals.

LSU reached the Super Six in the 2013 season, and under Clark's guidance the Tigers finished the season with a 49.260 regional qualifying score on bars, the highest final RQS in that event since the 2009 season.

Clark coached Morrison and Wyrick to First-Team All-America honors on bars in his first season with the Tigers, and it marked the first season LSU produced at least two All-Americans on bars since 2010.

Before Clark joined LSU after he spent 20 seasons at the University of Georgia where he helped guide the Gym Dogs to seven NCAA National Titles and 14 Southeastern Conference Championships.

Clark primarily coached bars at Georgia, and he coached the Gym Dogs to 64 All-America honors and seven NCAA individual national titles on bars, including two-time champions Courtney Kupets and Kat Ding.

From 2009-12, Clark served as the head coach at Georgia, and during that time the Gym Dogs captured three NCAA individual national championships, won the 2012 NCAA Auburn Regional, and produced 23 All-America honors. In 2012, his Georgia team won the Bulldog Cup, which recognizes the UGA team that excels academically, supports their peers in athletics and consistently serves the community.

Prior to his stint as head coach, Clark was the recruiting coordinator at Georgia from 1999-2009 while serving as assistant coach from 1999-2004 and associate head coach from 2005-09 when Georgia won a NCAA record five-straight national titles.

Clark also coached at the club level for 13 years from 1992-2005 as the founder, owner and head coach of Classic City Gymnastics in Athens, Georgia. He coached several Classic City gymnasts to state, regional, national championships and to the Junior Olympic National Team, and eight gymnasts went on to compete collegiately at the NCAA Division I level.

A native of Roswell, Georgia, Clark earned his undergraduate degree in exercise science from Georgia.

Clark has two children – a son, Cole, and a daughter, Kinsey.

2024 LSU Gymnastics - Week 14 at NCAA Semifinals

NOTEBOOK

Last Time On The Floor

- The Tigers finished on top in the Fayetteville Regional to earn the program's 14th regional title and secure their spot in the NCAA Championships.
- LSU finished first in the meet with a score of 198.250, their second highest at a regional., to defeat No. 10 Arkansas (197.825), No. 7 Kentucky (197.475) and No. 15 Minnesota (197.400).
- LSU and Arkansas finished as the two top performers in the regional final on April 6th to advance to the NCAA Semifinals on Thursday, April 18 in Fort Worth.
- The Tigers started off the regional final on beam, where they scored a 49.450, their fourth highest in program history at a regional.
- Konnor McClain's 9.950 earned her the title on the night, her eighth this year and sixth on beam. The Tigers took the early lead in Bud Walton Arena over Minnesota (49.425), Kentucky (49.400) and Arkansas (49.375).
- It was a 49.625 for LSU in the second rotation on floor, their third highest score at a regional. The Tigers have recorded two program-best scores on floor across both days of competition at the Fayetteville Regional.
- After being named regional floor champion in the second round of competition, Finnegan continued to show out on floor as she finished as the top performer in the finals on Saturday night. The title marks her eighth this year, fifth on floor and 22nd in her career.
- LSU posted a 49.550 on vault in the third rotation, the third highest regional score in program history.
- Vault was highlighted by Haleigh Bryant's perfect score was her 10th career on vault, making her the gymnast with the most vault 10's in LSU history. Her performance earned her the title on the night as she now owns nine vault titles this year.
- In the final rotation, the LSU bars squad finished strong with a 49.625, which is their highest regional score.
- Bryant continued to have a record night after earning her second 10 at the meet, this time on bars to close out the meet. The perfect score on bars was the first by any LSU gymnast during a regional, and the first time in school history that a Tiger has earned two perfect scores in the same meet at a regional. The senior now owns 18 perfect scores in LSU history with 10 on vault, four on bars, three on floor and one on beam.
- With two 10's on the night, Bryant finished as the top performer on vault, bars and the all-around at the meet with her score of 39.850. Her score on the night was her second highest this year. The senior moved her total to 31 titles this year, with 32 on vault, 15 on bars, 28 in the all-around and 91 in her career.

LSU's Journey in the NCAA Postseason

- This year marks the Tigers 33rd program appearance in the NCAA Championships, including back-to-back appearances under Jay Clark's tenure.
- LSU began their postseason journey in the Fayetteville Regional after being selected as the No. 2 overall seed. The top 36 teams were selected for regional competition based on the national qualifying score (NQS).
- The Tigers own an NQS of 198.215 heading into the NCAA postseason, their highest in program history.
- This year's NCAA Regional berth for the Tigers marked their 41st overall appearance in the postseason and 39th straight berth for the program.
- On day one of competition in Fayetteville, LSU finished first over Minnesota, BYU and Oregon State to advance to the regional final on day two. Minnesota finished in second at the meet to move on alongside the Tigers.
- On day two, LSU once again finished in first to win the Fayetteville Regional and secure their spot at nationals. Their score of 198.250 at the meet was the second highest at a regional in program history. Arkansas took the second spot to also advance to Fort Worth, while Kentucky and Minnesota's journey came to an end.
- The other regional hosts this year included Ann Arbor (Michigan), Berkeley (California), and Gainesville (Florida). After advancing out of Fayetteville, LSU will meet the two top finishers from the Berkeley Regional, California and Stanford.
- No. 2 LSU will face off against Arkansas, Cal and Stanford in the first session of the NCAA Semifinals at 3:30 p.m. CT on Thursday, April 18 in Dickies Arena.
- Oklahoma, Utah, Florida and Alabama make up the other side of the bracket and will compete in the second session on Thursday at 8 p.m. CT.
- The top two teams from both sessions of the NCAA Semifinals will advance to the championship final on Saturday, April 20 at 3 p.m. CT on ABC.
- LSU will start on vault and rotate in Olympic order to bars and beam before finishing on floor in Thursday's semifinal. Saturday's rotation order is determined by semifinal finish.
- All semifinal sessions will be broadcast nationally on ESPN2 with Aly Raisman, John Roethlisberger on the call and Taylor Davis as the on-site reporter. There

will also be additional streams of each apparatus.

- The LSU Gymnastics (12-3, 5-2 SEC) is the No. 2 team in the country heading into the NCAA postseason. The Tigers have ranked in the top-five nationally for all 12 weeks of the regular season.
- The Tigers enter this weekend with a National Qualifying Score (NQS) of 198.215 and rank in the top-five on all four events for six consecutive weeks. The squad's five counting scores are 198.425, 198.325, 198.300, 198.075 and 197.950.
- LSU ranks second on vault (49.510), third on bars (49.570), third on beam (49.530) and first on floor (49.725). The Tigers own the highest score on vault in the country this year and second highest floor score.
- The squad's top floor ranking marked the Tigers sixth consecutive week at No. 1 as they own the highest NQS in school and NCAA history on the event.
- Haleigh Bryant continues to lead the Tigers as she ranks the top gymnast in the country for the 10th consecutive week with her NQS of 39.810. The senior owns the highest all-around score in the country (39.925), which is a program record, the second best score in SEC history and ties for fourth-best in NCAA history.
- Bryant owns an NQS of 9.900 or higher across the board and ranks individually on every event, marking her fourth week in the top-10 on every event and tenth week in the top-25. She currently ranks first on vault, fourth on bars, eighth on beam and seventh on floor.
- Kiya Johnson also placed amongst the top gymnasts in the country for the ninth consecutive week as she ranks No. 15 in the all-around with her NQS of 39.570. The fifth-year senior also improved to No. 5 in the floor rankings with her NQS of 9.970.
- Aleah Finnegan and KJ Johnson remained in the top-20 in the floor rankings. Finnegan marked her fifth straight week in the event rankings as she is ninth in the country with her NQS of 9.960 while Johnson ranks at No. 14 on the event with her NQS of 9.950.
- Freshman Konnor McClain improved her NQS to 9.975 on beam to place her at No. 3 on the event nationally. The ranking marked her fifth straight week in the top-10 on the event.

Tiger Nation Reaches New Heights, Finishes First in Attendance

- LSU finished with the highest average attendance in the nation for the second time in program history in 2024. Tiger fans continue to show out every year as LSU has finished in the top four of average attendance nationally for seven consecutive years. The Tigers claimed the No. 1 spot in the country for the first time in 2022 to end Utah's streak and once again took the top spot in 2024.
- The Tigers finished the regular season with an average attendance of 12,590, marking the highest average in school history and the seventh-straight season with an average of 10,000 or better. A total of over 75,000 Tiger fans showed out to the PMAC across six home meets this year.
- The Tigers home season was highlighted with three consecutive sold-out crowds, the most that LSU has seen in a single season. Fans filled the PMAC for the squad's competitions against Auburn, Alabama and North Carolina as each of those crowds rank in the top-10 largest in program history.
- LSU welcomed their largest crowd of the year in their final home meet against North Carolina last Friday as 13,283 fans showed out for a senior night victory. The crowd was the fourth largest in school history and achieved the program's third consecutive sellout inside the PMAC this year.
- The program continues to grow under head coach Jay Clark's tenure. The LSU gymnastics team started the year in record fashion as the program set a new record of over 8,000 season tickets sold ahead of the 2024 season. The Tigers surpassed last year's record of 7,400 season tickets sold as the program continues to grow each year.

Closed Out The Regular Season

- LSU finished the regular season with an overall record of 12-3, a conference record of 5-2 and an undefeated home record inside the PMAC.
- This year, the Tigers recorded six scores over 198, the second most by any team this year, and earned multiple program best scores.
- LSU set a new program best score on February 2 with their score of 198.475 over No. 7 Arkansas.
- The squad also recorded their highest road score in program history on March 8 at the Podium Challenge with their score of 198.425.

NOTEBOOK

- The Tigers took down nine ranked opponents in 2024.
- There were 11 perfect scores throughout the regular season, with six from Haleigh Bryant, two from Aleah Finnegan, two from Konnor McClain and one from Kiya Johnson.

Program History

- Head Coach Jay Clark enters his fourth season leading the Tigers and 13th season overall as he continues to grow the LSU Gymnastics program. He is joined on staff by Assistant Coaches Garrett Griffith, Ashleigh Gnat and Courtney McCool Griffith. Gnat is in her fourth season with the Tigers while the Griffith duo enters their third season on staff.
- The Tigers climbed their way to the NCAA Championship Final in Fort Worth for the programs ninth appearance in the finals in 2023. The Final Four appearance marked the second time that LSU has advanced to the finals since the format began in 2019 and the first time under Clark's tenure.
- This year, Clark and the Tigers marked the program's 39th straight appearance in the NCAA postseason and 41st overall appearance in the NCAA postseason. With the team advancing out of regionals, LSU marked their 33rd program appearance in the NCAA Championships.
- LSU has a total of 16 individual national titles across 10 gymnasts in program history, including current senior Haleigh Bryant who was named the NCAA vault champion in 2021.
- The Tigers own five SEC Championship titles in program history, claiming their fifth at this year's conference championship in New Orleans on March 23rd. It was five years to the date since had last LSU been crowned SEC Champions in 2019, in the same location at the Smoothie King Center.

Our Emmy Award-Winning Docuseries "The Climb"

- Season two of the Emmy Award-Winning LSU Gymnastics docuseries titled "The Climb" will air nationally on ESPNU and on local affiliates throughout the 2024 season.
- "The Climb" is an exclusive docuseries that follows the LSU Gymnastics program and allows fans to get to know the program on a more personal level.
- The show, which is presented by Baton Rouge Super Chevy Dealers, gives fans behind-the-scenes access to the team like no other. From team meetings to one-on-one interviews with coaches and student-athletes, the docuseries allows viewers to get an inside look at the program and get to know the story behind the team.
- Season one of the all-access docuseries won an award at the 2023 Suncoast Regional Emmys for the category of best sport program post-produced or edited series after following the team through an unforgettable journey to the Final Four in Fort Worth, Texas last season.
- The show – produced by Giovanni Lamonte and LSU Athletics team of creatives at South Stadium Productions – will once again take fans through the 2024 season, as the Tigers embark on a new journey to the championship under head coach Jay Clark.
- Season two of "The Climb" will feature eight episodes throughout the 2024 season that will air nationally on ESPNU and local affiliates, including a regional broadcast on Bally Sports Southwest.
- Viewers can find all full-length episodes from season one and the new season on LSU GOLD, the home of "The Climb" and all LSU sports content.

The Squad

- This year's roster is composed of 22 gymnasts with 11 seniors, four juniors, three sophomores and four freshmen. The Tigers welcomed two transfers this year in Savannah Schoenherr and Jillian Hoffman and four new freshmen as Konnor McClain, Amari Drayton, Kylie Coen and Leah Miller begin their first year in the Purple & Gold.
- Cammy Hall is a sixth-year who is returning this year from injury, while fifth-year seniors Kiya Johnson, Alyona Shchennikova and Kai Rivers all returned for their final year of competition with the Tigers.
- Haleigh Bryant, Sierra Ballard, Chase Brock, Elena Arenas and Olivia Dunne all enter their senior year while Aleah Finnegan, Alexis Jeffrey, Tori Tatum, KJ Johnson begin their junior season.
- Ashley Cowan, Bryce Wilson and Annie Beard enter their second year as Tigers.

Five Tigers Earn WCGA Regular Season All-America Honors

- Haleigh Bryant, Kiya Johnson, Aleah Finnegan, KJ Johnson and Konnor McClain combined for 10 regular season All-America honors in 2024.
- LSU lead the conference in regular season All-America nods this year and tied for second most in the nation.
- This is the 12th year the WCGA has recognized regular-season All-Americans. All-America honors are determined by final individual National Qualifying Scores (NQS) and are awarded to the top 16 finishers on each event. The top eight gymnasts on each event and the all-around receive first-team honors while gymnasts ranked nine through 16 receive second-team honors, with all ties included.
- This year's honors moves LSU's total to 311 total All-America honors in program history, with Bryant now owning the second most career honors by any LSU gymnast. With five All-America honors in 2024, the senior moved her career total to 22 (14 regular season, eight NCAA), second only to Sarah Finnegan and Rheagan Courville with 23.
- Bryant claimed first team All-America honors on every event and the all-around for the first time in the regular season to move her total to 14. Last year, Bryant claimed honors on all but one apparatus.
- The senior showed out week after week during the regular season and finished with the highest NQS in the nation with her 39.810 in the all-around. She ranked the No. 1 gymnast in the country for 10 out of 12 weeks of competition, including top-10 rankings on every event. Bryant owns an NQS of 9.965 on vault, 9.960 on bars, 9.950 on beam and 9.965 on floor.
- Kiya Johnson is another veteran performer in the all-around for the Tigers this year. She finished as the No. 15 gymnast in the nation to claim second team All-America honors in 2024. The fifth-year senior earned first team honors on floor with her fifth place finish in the standings and NQS of 9.970 on the event.
- The Dallas, Texas native, is now a six-time regular season All-American, after achieving All-America recognitions on vault and floor in 2021 and 2022. She owns 10 All-America honors in her career – six WCGA Regular Season, four NCAA.
- This year, Johnson's season high of 39.675 in the all-around came against No. 7 Arkansas. She owns eight scores of 9.900+ on floor with a season high 10.000 against No. 6 Kentucky.
- Finnegan has ranked as one of the top floor performers in the country for five consecutive weeks and finished No. 9 in the standings with her NQS of 9.960. This year marks her second year as an All-American on floor in the regular season and seventh honor in her career (4 WCGA regular season, three NCAA).
- The Lee's Summit, Missouri native has recorded eight scores above 9.900 on floor this year, including back-to-back 10's against No. 12 Auburn and No. 5 Florida.
- KJ Johnson's floor performance this year earned her second team All-America honors, marking the first in her career. The junior finished No.14 in the national standings with an NQS of 9.950 on the event.
- Johnson has had a standout year on floor, earning both All-SEC and All-America honors for the first time in her career. Her career high performance came against No. 9 Alabama on March 1, where she scored a 9.975. She earned that same score on two other occasions this year, at the Podium Challenge and at the SEC Championships to earn her first SEC Individual title.
- Johnson posted eight scores of 9.900 or higher on floor this year and spent four consecutive weeks in the top-20 on the event.
- McClain has garnered multiple awards in her first year as a Tiger. Already an All-SEC and All-Freshman team member, the freshman now owns her first All-America honor on beam.
- With seven scores of 9.90+ on beam, McClain finished as the No. 3 beam performer in the country with her NQS of 9.975. She spent five straight weeks in the top-10 nationally on the event and earned three SEC awards throughout the regular season, including two SEC Specialist of the Week honors and one Freshman of the Week.

Bryant Continues To Shine In Senior Season

- Haleigh Bryant has been nothing short of amazing in her senior campaign with the Tigers. She is not only one of the best gymnasts in the conference, but in the nation. The senior continues to etch her name in the school record books and will finish her career as one of, if not the best, gymnast in LSU history.
- A native of Cornelius, North Carolina, Bryant has already garnered multiple awards in 2024, including most recently being named the SEC Gymnast of the Year for the first time in her career. She is the sixth gymnast in LSU history to earn the award, joining past winners Sarah Finnegan, Rheagan Courville, Susan Jackson, Ashleigh Clare-Kearney and April Burkholder.
- The senior is also one of six finalists for this year's AAI Award, which is often likened to the Heisman Trophy for Women's Gymnastics and is given annually to the top senior gymnast in the country. This prestigious award has become a symbol of excellence in the sport.
- Her performance throughout the regular season this year earned her first team All-America honors on every event and the all-around. With her five All-America honors in 2024, Bryant moved her career total to 22 (14 regular season, eight NCAA), which is second only to Sarah Finnegan and Rheagan Courville in program history with 23.
- She is now a 22 time All-American (6 VT, 4 UB, 3 BB, 4 FX, 5 AA) and four-time All-SEC member.
- She is in her fourth year at LSU after a historical junior season that etched her name into the record books and continues to be one of the top gymnasts in the country in her senior season.
- A few of her accomplishments last season included Honda Award Finalist, Central Region Gymnast of the Year, three-time SEC Gymnast of the week, All-SEC floor honors and nine All-America honors, which marked the most in a single season by an LSU gymnast.
- She went 64 for 64 routines for the Tigers as she competed in the all-around in every meet in 2023 and became the first LSU gymnast to average a 9.900+ across all four events in a season.

NOTEBOOK

- As she garnered multiple honors in her junior season, Bryant picked right back up where she left off this year. She continues to be one of the top competitors in the country as she and the Tigers look for their first national title in 2024.
- Bryant ranked as the No. 1 gymnast in the country nationally for 10 out of 12 weeks of competition in the regular season. She owns an NQS of 39.810 and the highest all-around score in the nation and in school history (39.925).
- Individually, she placed in the top-10 on every event for four straight weeks and ten weeks in the top-25.
- She has recorded nine meets with scores of 9.900 or higher on every event and has been recognized for her performances as SEC Gymnast of the Week six times, the most by any gymnast this year.
- She now owns 11 SEC honors in her career and has remained the top performer in the conference through all 12 weeks of competition in 2024.
- The senior only has three scores lower than 9.900 in 2024.
- Bryant has added eight perfect scores to her resume in 2024. She owns season high's of perfect 10's on every event, as she is the first LSU gymnast to complete both a gym slam (perfect score on every event) and season slam (perfect score on every event in a single season) this year.
- Already the all-time perfect 10 leader in LSU history, Bryant now owns 18 perfect scores in her career (14 VT, 3 UB, 3 FX, 1 BB), placing her at 10th most in NCAA history.
- Bryant will continue to lead the Tigers as the team continues their journey in the NCAA postseason. She has already recorded 31 titles on the year, having won nine on vault, seven on bars, two on beam, four on floor and nine in the all-around to move her career total to 91 (sixth most in LSU history). Her current 33 career vault titles is the second most in program history while her 28 in the all-around is the most by any LSU gymnast in their career.

Bryant Named 2024 AAI Award Winner

- Haleigh Bryant was named the 2024 AAI Award Winner, recognizing her as the top senior gymnast in the nation.
- The AAI Award is given annually and is voted on by NCAA women's gymnastics head coaches throughout the nation. The award, which is sponsored by the American Athletic Inc., is often likened to the Heisman Trophy for Women's Gymnastics and has become a symbol of excellence in the sport, something that Bryant has been nothing short of during her career with the Tigers.
- Bryant was voted this year's winner over the remaining five finalists: Luisa Blanco (Alabama), Audrey Davis (Oklahoma), Maile O'Keefe (Utah), Gabby Wilson (Michigan) and Raena Worley (Kentucky).
- The senior from Cornelius, North Carolina, is the fourth AAI Award winner in program history and joins an elite group of past honorees in Sarah Finnegan (2019), Ashleigh Gnat (2017) and Susan Jackson (2010). LSU has the most AAI winners since 2010 and the most in the Southeastern Conference.
- LSU now shares the top spot for most AAI winners in school history with Michigan, UCLA and Utah. Minnesota, Alabama, Georgia and Oregon State all have three.
- Bryant is a true example of what it means to be a competitor, teammate, and leader. She has already proven to be one of the best gymnasts in LSU and NCAA history as she continues to lead the Tigers in the postseason.
- She enters the NCAA Championships with 31 titles on the year, having won nine on vault, seven on bars, two on beam, four on floor and nine in the all-around to move her career total to 91 (sixth most in LSU history). Her current 33 career vault titles is the second most in program history while her 28 in the all-around is the most by any LSU gymnast in their career.
- Just this year, Bryant's titles on vault, bars and the all-around place in the top-10 for most in a single season by an LSU gymnast.
- Bryant has already garnered multiple awards in 2024 as she adds AAI Award Winner to her resume. She was named the SEC Gymnast of the Year for the first time in her career last month, becoming only the sixth gymnast in LSU history to earn the award.
- She was the first LSU gymnast to achieve both a gym slam (perfect 10 on every event) and season slam (a perfect 10 on every event in a single season) this year, as she owns eight perfect scores this season and 18 in her career, the most by any gymnast in LSU history and the 10th most in the NCAA.
- Bryant was only the 14th gymnast in the NCAA to record a gym slam in

- their career and the 10th gymnast in NCAA history to achieve a season slam.
- Her performance throughout the regular season earned her five first team All-America honors in 2024, moving her career total to 22 (14 regular season, eight NCAA), which is second only to Sarah Finnegan and Rheagan Courville in program history with 23.
- Bryant owns 147 scores of 9.900 or better in her career. 73.50% of her scores are above 9.900 while 95.50% are above 9.8000. This year, she has recorded nine meets with scores of 9.9+ or higher on every event and only has two scores lower than a 9.850. She has achieved perfection eight times this season.
- She made school history on March 8 as she posted a career high 39.925 in the all-around, which is the highest all-around score by any LSU gymnast, the second-best in SEC history and ties for the fourth best in the NCAA.
- In the conference, Bryant was recognized as the SEC Gymnast of the Week six times in 2024, the most by any gymnast this year. She now owns 11 SEC honors in her career and has remained the top performer in the conference through all 12 weeks of competition this year.
- On top of her SEC Gymnast of the Year honors, Bryant claimed two individual titles for her performance at the 2024 SEC Championships on March 23 to mark her fourth straight year as an All-SEC member. She had the highest scores on vault and the all-around at the meet and is now a three-time individual SEC Champion.
- The senior has helped lead her team to back-to-back nationals appearances as the Tigers continue their journey in the postseason at the NCAA Championships this week.
- So far in this postseason, Bryant finished as the top all-arounder in the Fayetteville Regional Final with her score of 39.850. Her night was highlighted with two perfect 10's on vault and bars, marking the first time in school history that a gymnast has earned two perfect scores in the same meet at regionals and the first LSU gymnast to record a perfect 10.000 on bars in the postseason.
- Outside of the gym, she is a two-time Scholastic All-American and three-time SEC Academic Honor Roll member as she pursues her degree in sport administration with an anticipated graduation date of May 2024.
- Now a four time All-SEC member, three time SEC Individual Champion, and two time Central Region Gymnast of the Year, Bryant will continue to shine in her senior year as she looks to lead her team to their first national championship.

Olympic Qualifier Finnegan In Year Three

- Finnegan continues to be a key contributor for the Tigers in 2024 as she competed in the all-around in all but one meet last year. The Lee's Summit, Missouri will represent the Tigers at the 2024 Paris Olympics after booking her Olympic ticket at the 2023 World Championships in Antwerp last October.
- Finnegan earned an all-around score of 51.366 in her world championship debut to become the first active gymnast in school history to become an Olympian and first ever female gymnast from the Philippines to do so. She will continue to prepare for Paris while competing for the Tigers in 2024.
- Finnegan comes off an impressive sophomore year in 2023. The all-arounder set new career high's on all four events last year with perfect scores on vault, beam and floor and a 9.925 on bars and took home 15 career individual titles.
- In only her second season with the Tigers, she earned her first career All-SEC Honors on floor after finishing in the top two at the SEC Championships on floor with her score of 9.950
- In her NCAA Championships debut, she recorded a floor score of 9.9625 in the semifinals to tie the highest score on the event by an LSU gymnast at the championships
- Finnegan finished the 2023 season with six All-America honors (1 UB, 1 BB, 2 FX, 2 AA) and enters her junior season with 15 career individual titles.
- This year, Finnegan has been a mainstay in the vault, beam and floor lineups for the Tigers in 2024.
- She has made one appearance in the all-around this year in the Tigers meet against North Carolina and posted a season high 39.625.
- The junior is one of the top floor performers in the country as she has recorded three perfect scores on floor this year in back-to-back weeks against Auburn and Florida and on day one of the Fayetteville Regional. She now owns seven career perfect 10's with five on floor, one on vault and one on beam.
- Finnegan was crowned the regional champion last night at the Fayetteville Regional after recording her third 10 on floor this year to finish as the top performer on the event. Her perfect score on floor was only the third time an LSU gymnast achieved perfection at a regional.
- She ranked individually on floor for five straight weeks and is currently ninth in the country with her NQS of 9.960.
- Finnegan has tallied eight titles this year with five on floor, one on vault, one on beam and one in the all-around.

Kiya Johnson Amongst Nation's Best

- A native of Dallas, Texas, Johnson officially made her return to the PMAC in the Tigers season opener against Ohio State after suffering a season-ending injury in 2023. The eight-time All-American returns veteran routines to the Tiger's lineups this year.
- Johnson is the 2021 SEC Floor Champion and Special of the Year and owns All-SEC honors
- The all-arounder owns eight perfect scores across three events and a career-high 9.950 on bars
- Johnson scored her fifth perfect on floor this year in a full circle moment against Kentucky, the same team and event that she got injured last year.
- The fifth-year senior owns 47 titles in her career and six this year with four on floor, one on bars and one in the all-around, including an individual SEC floor title.

2024 LSU Gymnastics - Week 14 at NCAA Semifinals

- Johnson placed amongst the top gymnasts in the country for nine consecutive weeks and ranks No. 15 in the all-around with her NQS of 39.570. The fifth-year senior also ranks No. 5 on floor with her NQS of 9.970.
- Her season-high 39.675 performance in the all-around came in the Tigers meet against Arkansas.

McClain and Drayton, The Freshmen Duo

- The freshman duo of Konnor McClain and Amari Drayton continue to shine for the Tigers in their first year.
- A native of Las Vegas, Nevada, McClain has contributed to the bars, beam and floor lineups all year. She already owns perfect scores on bars and beam in her first year as a Tiger, as well as a career high 9.975 on floor.
- McClain made her way into the national individual event rankings on floor and beam throughout the regular season. She ranks No. 3 nationally on beam with her NQS of 9.975 on the event.
- One of the top beam performers in the country, McClain was named an individual SEC Champion at this year's conference championships as well as All-SEC and regular season All-America honors this season. She owns two perfect scores on the event, with one coming at Missouri on January 26 and one at the SEC Championships in New Orleans on March 23rd.
- Drayton, a native of Spring, Texas, has competed on vault in every meet this year and on floor in all but one meet. She owns career highs of 9.975 on vault and 9.925 on floor.
- The Texas native is one of the top performers in the league on both events.
- Both McClain and Drayton have earned SEC honors this year, as McClain has three awards and Drayton one so far.

The Coaching Staff

- The LSU Gymnastics coaching staff claimed NCAA regional awards this year as Jay Clark was named the Region One Head Coach of the Year while his staff earned Region One Assistant Coaches of the Year honors.
- Clark, who served on staff for eight seasons prior to his stint as head coach, was named the third head coach of the Fighting Tigers in 2021. Clark owns over 30 years of NCAA Gymnastics experience and is one of the most respected coaches in the country.
- Assistant coach Ashleigh Gnat is a 17-time All-American, four-time SEC event champion and 2017 NCAA Floor Champion. Gnat is in her fourth season as assistant coach with the Tigers. As the primary beam coach, she brings a wealth of knowledge with her own experience as one of the best gymnasts in school history.
- Garrett Griffeth and Courtney McCool Griffeth enter their third season at LSU as they continue to lead the Tigers to top-10 finishes on vault and floor nationally.

NCAA Regional Coaches of the Year

- The LSU Gymnastics coaching staff is amongst the best in the nation as they continue to lead the Tigers to success in 2024. With top-five finishes nationally on each event, the staff claimed 2024 NCAA Regional Awards, awarded by the Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association (WCGA).
- Jay Clark was named the Region One Head Coach of the Year while his staff earned Region One Assistant Coaches of the Year.
- As the leader of the Tigers, Clark has already led the program to multiple milestones in 2024. In his fourth year as head coach, he won his first SEC Championship title since his tenure began (the fifth in program history) and his first regional title (the 14th in program history).
- He was named the SEC Co-Coach of the Year for the first time in his career in 2024. On top of their first place finish at the SEC Championships, LSU was 5-2 in conference play throughout the regular season and earned nine victories over top-20 opponents.
- The year started with a record breaking number of 8,000 season tickets sold ahead of the 2024 season, surpassing last year's record of 7,400. Over 75,000 Tiger fans showed out to the PMAC across six home meets this year as LSU went undefeated at home (6-0) and finished the regular season No. 1 in attendance thanks to Clark's efforts.
- The regular season was highlighted with three consecutive sold-out crowds, the most that LSU has seen in a single season. The Tigers earned the highest average attendance in the nation with an average attendance of

- 12,590, marking the highest average in school history and the seventh-straight season with an average of 10,000 or better. It was the second time in program history that LSU claimed the top spot in attendance.
- LSU began the NCAA postseason ranked No. 2 nationally with their highest NQS ever recorded by the program. This year marked the first time LSU has surpassed the 198+ mark in NQS in school history, and Clark couldn't do it without the leadership of each of his assistants and their events.
- LSU ranked in the top five nationally for all 12 weeks of regular season competition, including top 5 rankings on all four events for six consecutive weeks. Clark mainly coaches the bars squad, who finished the regular season ranked third in the country and spent 11 weeks ranked in the top five nationally.
- The LSU bars owns an NQS of 49.570, with their season high performance coming in their meet at the ESPN Invitational on the road and again at home against No. 9 Alabama.
- Clark's team of assistant coaches also tabbed regional coaching honors for the first time in their LSU career. Ashleigh Gnat, Garrett Griffeth and Courtney McCool Griffeth were all named the Region One Assistant Coaches of the Year for their efforts this season.
- Clark and his staff have coached five Tigers to individual SEC titles this year and had five gymnasts combine for 10 All-America honors in Bryant, Kiya Johnson, KJ Johnson, Aleah Finnegan and Konnor McClain. LSU led the conference in regular season All-America nods this year and tied for second most in the nation.
- Gnat is in her fourth season with the Tigers and primarily leads the beam squad. This year, the LSU beam squad finished the regular season ranked No. 3 nationally with their NQS of 49.530, which matched the highest recorded NQS in program history on the event.
- The Tigers spent seven straight weeks amongst the nations top five beam squad's under the supervision of Gnat, as well as one of the top beam performers in McClain, who ranks No. 3 in the country.
- LSU's season high on beam came against No. 12 Auburn on February 16 inside the PMAC, where the team recorded a 49.725 on the event. The score matched the highest in program history.
- Griffeth is in his third season with the Tigers as he continues to lead the vault squad to top-five finishes nationally every year. The Tigers finished the regular season ranked No. 2 in the country on vault with their NQS of 49.510 and placed in the top five for all 12 weeks of competition this year. Their current NQS is the highest achieved under Griffeth's leadership thus far.
- The Tigers season high 49.675 performance on the event came in their meet at the Podium Challenge on March 8 that was highlighted by a perfect score from Bryant. The score was the second highest vault score in program history.
- The squads performance at the Podium Challenge on March 8 led them to the highest score by any vault team in the nation and has only been recorded by one other team this year, the top ranked Oklahoma Sooners.
- The LSU floor squad is the best in the nation thanks to the leadership of McCool Griffeth, who is in her third season with the Tigers. This year, she has led the Tigers to their highest ever NQS in not only program history, but in NCAA history.
- The floor squad is the No. 1 team in the nation with an NQS of 49.725, the highest in the nation. LSU earned the top spot in the country on floor on eight separate occasions in 2024 and have ranked in the top five nationally for all 12 weeks of competition this year.
- The Tigers own a season high of 49.775 on floor this year, which they recorded three times against No. 7 Arkansas, No. 5 Florida and No. 9 Alabama. The score matches the program best in LSU history. The Griffeth duo owns multiple coaching awards throughout their career, including 2014 Coaches Association Division II Assistant Coach of the Year, 2017 Midwest Independent Conference Assistant Coach of the Year and 2020 Region Two Assistant Coaches of the Year. This year's regional award marks the first for Assistant Coaches Garrett and Courtney during their career at LSU.

Bryant, Drayton Earn Week One SEC Honors

- The LSU Gymnastics pair of senior Haleigh Bryant and freshman Amari Drayton took home the first SEC awards of the 2024 season, announced by the league on Tuesday afternoon.
- Bryant was named the SEC Gymnast of the Week while freshman Amari Drayton earned Co-Freshman of the Week honors for their performances in the Tigers season opener against No. 14 Ohio State on Friday night.
- A native of Cornelius, North Carolina, Bryant finished as the top all-around gymnast in the country after week one with her score of 39.675. She helped lift the Tigers to a 196.975-196.775 victory over the Buckeyes to secure the squad's first victory of 2024.
- The senior's night was highlighted by her front pike half vault that scored a 9.950, while also posting a 9.875 on bars and a 9.925 on beam and floor for the Tigers. Bryant won the vault and all-around titles on the night to move her career total to 62, which ties her at eighth for most career individual titles in LSU history. Her 24 career vault titles and 20 all-around titles also place her amongst the top-five gymnasts in school history.
- Drayton had an impressive night against the Buckeyes in her collegiate gymnastics debut as she scored a pair of 9.925's on vault and floor.
- The freshman out of Spring, Texas started the night off with a stuck yurchenko one and a half on vault before anchoring on floor, capturing second place on vault and a share of second place on floor in her first competition with the Tigers.

McClain Named SEC Specialist of the Week in Week Two

- Freshman Konnor McClain was named the SEC Specialist of the Week for the first conference award of her career, announced by the league on Tuesday afternoon.
- The honor comes after McClain scored her first career perfect 10 on bars in only her second collegiate routine on the event.
- The freshman's performance on Saturday helped lift the Tigers to a 49.650 in the last rotation, marking the program's highest recorded bars score on the road. LSU finished second at the Sprouts Collegiate Quad Meet, defeating No. 2 Utah and No. 12 UCLA.
- A native of Las Vegas, Nevada, McClain's perfect score earned her the event title at the meet, the first of her career. She currently sits amongst the top-20 bars performers in the nation after week two as she ranks No. 15 on the event.

Bryant Named SEC Gymnast of the Week For Second Time This Year

- Senior Haleigh Bryant continues to be one of the top performers in the country as she was named SEC Gymnast of the Week for the second time this year, announced by the league on Tuesday afternoon. She owns averages of 9.900+ on every event after three weeks of competition.
- Bryant helped lead her team to a 198.125 over No. 6 Kentucky on Friday night, marking the second highest score by any team in the country and the highest score by any SEC team so far this year.
- This past weekend against the Wildcats, Bryant posted scores of 9.900 or better on every event for the second week in a row. After performing a nearly-perfect vault with her score of 9.975 on Friday, Bryant continued her night with a perfect score on bars, followed by a 9.900 on beam and finished the night with a 9.950 on floor.
- Already the all-time 10 leader in school history, Bryant added another perfect score to her resume on bars on Friday night in the PMAC. It was the second in her career on the event, making her only the second LSU gymnast to have multiple perfect scores on the event. She now owns 11 perfect scores in her career.
- Bryant finished the night with a season-high 39.825 against the Wildcats, securing the all-around title as well as the wins on vault and bars. Her three titles on the night moved her total to 65, with 25 on vault, nine on bars and 21 all-around.
- A native of Cornelius, North Carolina, Bryant's 65 career titles currently sits eighth in program history. She is one win away from tying Jeanie Beadle in seventh place for most career individual titles. Her vault title places her fourth in the records while she's fifth in the all-around.

Bryant, McClain Notch Week Five SEC Honors

- Senior Haleigh Bryant and freshman Konnor McClain both individually notched SEC honors this week for their performances on Friday night against No. 7 Arkansas.
- Bryant was named the SEC Gymnast of the Week for the third time this year, the most in the conference through the first five weeks of competition.
- Against Arkansas, Bryant finished as the top performer on the night and recorded her second career perfect score on floor to help lead the Tigers to a program-record finish over the Razorbacks. She took home three victories on vault, floor and the all-around to move her total to 69 titles in her career.
- A native of Cornelius, North Carolina, Bryant continues to show out for the Tigers each week. The senior is the top-ranked gymnast in the country for the third consecutive week with her all-around average of 39.738 and owns top-10 placements on every event.
- McClain builds confidence each week in her already impressive freshman campaign. She competed in three events for the Tigers on Friday night to earn her SEC Co-Freshman of the Week honors and her second conference award this year.
- The freshman earned a spot in the floor rankings at No. 9 this week after competing in the leadoff spot for the first time against the Razorbacks and notched a career-high 9.975 for the Tigers. She also recorded scores of 9.925 on bars and a 9.975 on beam to take home the title.
- A native of Las Vegas, Nevada, McClain moved her career total to three titles after finishing as the top beam performer on Friday.

Bryant Earns Fourth SEC Gymnast of the Week Honor This Year

- Senior Haleigh Bryant was named the SEC Gymnast of the Week for the second straight week, announced by the league on Tuesday afternoon.
- Bryant finished as the top performer in the Tiger's last meet against No. 19 Georgia with her 39.750 in the all-around. The week six award marks her fourth gymnast of the week honor this year and ninth in her career.
- A native of Cornelius, North Carolina, Bryant remains the top gymnast in the country for the fourth consecutive week after her record-setting performance on Friday night. The senior ranks No. 1 in the all-around with her average of 39.740 and owns top-10 placements on every event: third on vault, 10th on bars, fifth on beam and second on floor.
- The senior became the first gymnast in LSU history to complete a gym slam, a perfect score on every event, after notching a 10 on beam against the Bulldogs. The perfect score was her first on the event and 13th overall to extend her lead as the gymnast with the most career 10's in program history.
- In addition to her all-around title, Bryant also took home the titles on vault (9.95), beam (10) and floor (9.95) for her performance in Athens last Friday night. She moved her title totals to 27 on vault, six on beam, seven on floor and 23 in the all-around to tie Sarah Finnegan for the third-most all-around titles in program history.

Finnegan Earns SEC Co-Specialist of the Week Honors

- Aleah Finnegan earned SEC Co-Specialist of the Week honors for her performance against Auburn. The award is the first of her career. She shares the week seven honor with Missouri's Mara Titarsolej.
- A native of Lee's Summit, Missouri, Finnegan competed on vault, beam and floor for the Tigers in their last meet against Auburn.
- The junior started off hot with the highest vault score on the night as her yurchenko 1.5 earned her a 9.50 to take home the title.
- Finnegan posted another strong 9.925 for the Tigers on beam before finishing on floor, where she scored her third career perfect score on the event and fifth in her career.
- Finnegan finished the meet as the top performer on vault and floor against Auburn. She now owns 18 titles in her career and added to her individual event titles with six on floor and two on vault.

Bryant Earns Tenth Career SEC Honor

- Haleigh Bryant was named the SEC Gymnast of the Week for the fifth time this season and 10th time in her career, announced by the league on Tuesday afternoon.
- Bryant owns the most weekly awards in 2024 as she remains the No. 1 gymnast in the SEC and in the nation. The all-arounder has led the conference through all nine weeks of competition so far this year.
- The senior was the top performer in the Tigers last meet and had a season best 39.850 performance to help lead LSU to victory over No. 9 Alabama. Her all-around score on the night was the second best in school history.
- Bryant posted scores of 9.900 or higher on every event last Friday for the sixth time this year, including her third perfect score on floor and 14th in her career. In addition to her perfect score on floor, Bryant also recorded scores of 9.950 on vault, 9.975 on bars and 9.925 on beam against the Crimson Tide. She took home four titles on the night on vault, bars, floor and the all-around to move her career total to 78, which is sixth-most in program history.
- Bryant's titles on the night moved her individual event totals to 28 on vault, 12 on bars, eight on floor and 25 in the all-around. Her career titles in the all-around and on vault currently place her in second and third in LSU history, respectively.
- A native of Cornelius, North Carolina, Bryant continues to be the top performer in the country as she ranks as the No. 1 gymnast in the country for the seventh consecutive week. She improved her NQS to 39.755 after her performance against Alabama.
- Bryant owns an NQS of 9.900 or higher on every event to place her amongst the top-25 performers on every event for the seventh consecutive week. She ranks second on vault, ninth on bars, ninth on beam and sixth on floor entering the tenth week of competition.

Bryant, Schoenherr Earn Week Ten SEC Honors

- Haleigh Bryant and Savannah Schoenherr both picked up SEC awards this week following their performances in the Tigers last meet at the Podium Challenge, announced by the league on Tuesday afternoon.
- Bryant was named the SEC Gymnast of the Week for the sixth time this year and 11th in her career, leading the conference this year. Schoenherr was named the Co-Specialist of the Week for her first honor in the Purple and Gold.
- Bryant had a record performance at the Podium Challenge to help lead her team to their highest road score in program history (198.425) and finish first in the quad meet over No. 14 Auburn, George Washington and Texas Woman's.
- The senior finished the meet with a career high 39.925 in the all-around to mark a new school record. The score is the highest by any gymnast in program history, the second highest in SEC history and matches the fourth-best score in NCAA history.
- Bryant scored back-to-back perfect 10's to start the meet on vault and bars and added scores of 9.950 on beam and 9.975 on floor to her already incredible night. After already achieving a gym slam earlier this year, her perfect score on vault was her first this year to complete a season slam, a perfect score on every event in the same season.
- She is only the 10th gymnast in NCAA history to record perfection on every event in a single season as she now owns six this year and 16 (9 VT, 3 UB, 3 FX, 1 BB) in her career.
- Bryant finished as the top performer on every event at the Podium Challenge to take home all five titles on the night. She shares her floor title with teammate Kiya Johnson, who also posted a 9.975 on the event.
- With her performance at the Podium Challenge, Bryant now owns 84 titles in her career with 30 on vault, 13 on bars, six on beam, nine on floor and 26 in the all-around. Her total career vault titles is the second most in school history while she is tied at the top with Rheagan Courville for most career all-around titles in program history.
- Schoenherr was another senior who shined in the Tigers meet last Friday. The sixth-year senior posted scores of 9.950 on vault and 9.925 on bars to add to LSU's record performance in the River Center. Her score on vault marked a season and career high at LSU.
