LSU Opens 100th Year of Tiger Stadium Hosting Nicholls

LSU (0-1) opens the 100th year of Tiger Stadium on Saturday when the Tigers host Nicholls (0-1) at 6:30 p.m. on Saturday. The game will be streamed on ESPN+ and SEC Network+. It's the first-ever meeting between LSU and Nicholls in football. LSU is coming off a 27-20 setback to USC on Sunday in Las Vegas, while the Colonels dropped a 25-17 decision to Louisiana Tech in their season-opener. LSU enters the game ranked No. 19 in the Coaches Poll and No. 18 in the AP Poll. LSU has won 10 straight games in Tiger Stadium and head coach Brian Kelly is 13-1 in Death Valley. LSU went 7-0 at home in 2023 after posting a 6-1 mark in Tiger Stadium in 2022. LSU is 6-1 under Kelly in games following a loss (3-1 in 2022, 3-0 in 2023). LSU QB Garrett Nussmeier connected on 30-of-39 passes for 308 yards, 2 TDs and an interception against USC becoming only the second player in school history to have 300-plus passing yards in first 2 career starts (395 vs. Wisconsin in 2024 ReliaQuest Bowl). RB John Emery returned from a season-ending injury in 2023 and led the Tigers with 61 yards on 10 carries, which included a 39-yard run in the third quarter. WR Kyren Lacy (7 rec., 94 yards, 1 TD) and TE Mason Taylor (7 rec., 62 yards) led the Tigers in receiving. WR Aaron Anderson scored his first career TD on a 13-yard catch in third quarter that put the Tigers up 17-13. Defensively, LB Harold Perkins led LSU with 9 tackles, while DE Sai'vion Jones had 5 tackles, 2 sacks and forced a fumble.

LSU Coach Brian Kelly: Winningest Active Coach In NCAA Football

Brian Kelly, in his third with the Tigers, has guided LSU to a 20-8 overall mark. He entered 2024 riding a streak of seven straight 10-win seasons. Kelly is the winningest active coach in NCAA football (no matter division) with an on-field record of 304-104-2. After inheriting a roster with only 39 scholarship players, Kelly quickly turned LSU into a 10-win team in his first season in 2022 as the Tigers went 10-4 overall, beat Top 10 teams in Ole Miss and Alabama and won the SEC Western Division. Kelly, the most accomplished hire in LSU football history when he was named to the position in December of 2021, took over the program after 12 years and 113 wins at Notre Dame. His coaching resume includes 12 10-win seasons at the FBS level (7 at Notre Dame, 3 at Cincinnati, 2 at LSU), along with 15 bowl/CFP playoff appearances and 3 National Coach of the Year honors. He won two Division II National Championships at Grand Valley State.

QUICK NOTES

- LSU has won 10 straight games in Tiger Stadium and is 13-1 in games in Death Valley under coach **Brian Kelly**.
- **QB Garrett Nussmeier** has thrown for 300-plus yards in each of his 2 starts – 395 vs. Wisconsin (ReliaQuest Bowl) and 308 vs. USC. He joins Myles Brennan (337 vs. Miss. State, 345 at Vanderbilt) in 2020) as the only players in LSU history to throw for 300-plus yards in their first 2 starts.
- LSU's starting offensive line has combined for 105 career starts at LSU. **LT Will Campbell**, a preseason All-America, leads the way with 27, followed by **RG Miles Frazier** (26), **RT Emery Jones** (25) and **LG Garrett Dellinger** (24). Redshirt freshman **C DJ Chester** (1) made his first career start last week vs. USC.
- **LT Will Campbell** and **LB Harold Perkins** are wearing No. 7 for the Tigers this year. The number 7 is given to the best playmaker on the team who calls Louisiana home. It's also designated for a player who brings up others around him. **Campbell** will continue to wear the No. 66 jersey accompanied by a No. 7 patch.
- **RB Josh Williams** and **LB Greg Penn** are wearing No. 18 in this year. The No. 18 tradition started with QB Matt Mauck in 2003 when he led the Tigers to the national championship that season. It's presented to a team leader who has all of the traits of a champion.
- **LT Will Campbell** and **LB Harold Perkins** have

- been named first-team preseason All-America by the Associated Press and ESPN.com. **Campbell** is a first-teamer on the Walter Camp preseason team, while **Perkins** made the second-team. **RT Emery Jones** is listed as a second-team preseason All-America by ESPN.com.
- With 7 catches vs. USC, **TE Mason Taylor** moved to No. 3 in school history in career receptions by a tight end with 81. **Taylor** has caught a career-best 7 passes in consecutive games – Wisconsin and USC.
- LSU entered the season ranked in the Top 25 for the 23rd time in the past 24 years – a streak that dates back to 2001. The only exception during that span came in 2022, a year that saw the Tigers captured the SEC Western Division title and finish the season ranked as high as No. 15 (Coaches).
- LSU is riding back-to-back 10-win seasons, the first for LSU since going 10-3 in 2018 followed by a 15-0 mark and the national championship in 2019. LSU still reached the 10-win mark in both 2022 and 2023 after opening the season with losses.
- LSU will play 5 games during the month of September for the second straight year, and for just the eighth time in school history. Years in which the Tigers have played 5 games in September include: 2023, 2018, 2017, 2012, 2006, 2000, and 1995).

When Brian Kelly was hired away from Notre Dame in December of 2021, LSU announced at the time that "the search for LSU Football's next championship head coach is over."

The most accomplished hire in program history with 304 career victories, Kelly wasted little time in making his impact felt, leading the Tigers to a 10-win season and the SEC Western Division title in his first year. Despite inheriting a roster with only 39 scholarship players remaining from the 2021 season, Kelly led the Tigers to Top 10 wins over Ole Miss and Alabama along with road victories over Auburn, Florida and Arkansas in his first year with the Tigers.

LSU capped the 2022 season with a resounding 63-7 win over Purdue in the Citrus Bowl completing one of the biggest turnarounds in college football.

Building off of the 2022 season, Kelly again guided the Tigers to a 10-win season capped with a victory over Wisconsin in the ReliaQuest Bowl. In doing so, Kelly joined Miles as the only coaches in LSU history to lead the Tigers to 10-win seasons in their first two years with the program. Kelly has now won at least 10 games for seven straight years, the longest active streak among all FBS coaches.

Behind the play of Heisman Trophy quarterback Jayden Daniels, LSU won seven of its final eight games to finish with a 10-3 record. All three of LSU's losses came to teams either in the CFP Playoffs (Alabama) or playing in a New Year's Six Bowl (Florida State, Ole Miss). LSU's signature win came in a 49-39 victory over Missouri – a team that finished ranked No. 9 in the nation.

In 2023, the Tigers featured the top offense in college football, leading the nation in scoring (45.5) and total yards (543.5). LSU was the only FBS team to rank among the Top 10 in both rushing (No. 10 at 204.5) and passing (338.9) yards per game.

Behind an offensive line that was a finalist for the Joe Moore Award, LSU topped 40-points and the 500-yard mark nine times in 2023. Daniels became only the fifth player in SEC history to account for 50 touchdowns (40 passing, 10 rushing) in a season and he led the nation in total offense with a league record 412.2 yards per game. Daniels also set the FBS record for pass efficiency with a 208.0 rating. For the second straight year, Daniels was the top rushing quarterback in college football with 1,134 yards.

In LSU's November win over Florida, the Tigers racked up 701 total yards – the most ever given up by the Gators – with Daniels setting the SEC record for total yards with 606. In that game, Daniels became the first player in FBS history to rush for 200 yards (234) and pass for 350 yards (376) in a game. A week later, Daniels tied Joe Burrow's LSU record for touchdowns in a game with eight (2 rushing, 6 passing).

Daniels solidified his standing as the Heisman Trophy favorite against Texas A&M when he directed the Tigers to three fourth quarter touchdowns as LSU overcame a 10-point third quarter deficit to beat the Aggies, 42-30. In what was his final game as a Tiger, Daniels accounted for four touchdowns and 355 yards (120 rushing, 235 passing) against Texas A&M.

LSU's 2023 offense ranked No. 2 in program history for points in a season (592), points per game (45.5), total yards (7,065), total yards per game (543.5), passing yards (4,406) and passing yards per game (338.9).

Wide receiver Malik Nabers – a consensus all-American – became LSU's all-time leader in receptions (189) and receiving yards (3,004). Nabers led the nation in receiving yards per game (120.7), catching an SEC-best 89 passes for 1,569 yard and 14 touchdowns. Teammate Brian Thomas Jr. led the nation in receiving TD's with 17. The duo combined for 157 receptions for 2,746 yards and 31 touchdowns making them the most productive tandem in the FBS.

In his first year at LSU, the Tiger offense gave a glimpse into what the 2023 season may hold. After a slow start – LSU completed only eight passes for 30 yards in a win over Auburn on Oct. 1 – the Tigers found their identity beginning with a 45-35 victory over Florida in Gainesville two weeks later.

A week later, Kelly picked up his first Top 10 win at LSU as the Tigers rolled past No. 7 Ole Miss, 45-20, in Tiger Stadium. Following an open date, the Tigers picked up their second consecutive Top 10 win, knocking off No. 6 Alabama, 32-31, in Death Valley.

Down a touchdown after Alabama's first possession in overtime, Daniels scored on a 25-yard run on LSU's first play pulling the Tigers to within 31-30. Instead of kicking the extra-point to send the game into a second overtime, Kelly opted to go for two setting the stage for one of Tiger Stadium's epic moments.

With 102,000 fans on their feet, Daniels found tight end Mason Taylor in the front corner of the endzone for a successful two-point conversion, sending Tiger Stadium into a frenzy.

That call – and that game – are widely considered two of the top moments in the history of Tiger Stadium. The victory over Alabama put LSU in the driver's seat in the SEC Western Division as the Tigers went on to claim a spot in the league's title game with a win over Arkansas in Fayetteville the following week.

Kelly became only the fourth first-year coach in SEC history to lead a team to the league's championship game, joining Les Miles (LSU in 2005), Gus Malzahn (Auburn in 2013) and Jim McElwain (Florida, 2015).

Kelly and Paul Dietzel are the only coaches in LSU history to lose a season-opener and still go on to win 10 games. Kelly has now done it twice – 2022 and 2023 –

while Dietzel did it in 1961.

LSU's 2022 season saw the Tigers rack up some of the top offensive numbers in school history – at the time ranking No. 2 in program record books for total yards (6,344), No. 3 in yards per game (453.1) and total passing yards (3,770). The 2022 set the program mark for rushing touchdowns with 39, breaking the previous record of 37 set in 2013.

Kelly, who has more victories than any active coach in major college football with 304, was named LSU's 34th head football coach on December 1, taking over a program that has won four national championships. He joined the Tigers after 12 seasons at Notre Dame.

In 34 years as a collegiate head coach, Kelly has put together a 304-104-2 overall mark and is the winningest coach in Notre Dame history. He's now won 10 or more games 12 times at the FBS level and he's reached double-digit win 18 times in his 34-year coaching career. He's had teams win nine games on five other occasions.

Other coaching stops for Kelly include 13 seasons at Grand Valley State, three at Central Michigan, four at Cincinnati, and 12 at Notre Dame.

His overall mark of 304-104-2 puts him ahead of North Carolina's Mack Brown (276) on the list of most victories by an active FBS head coach. Only twice during Kelly's 34-year coaching career has he had a team finish below .500.

Kelly is also one of only five active FBS coaches who have guided their programs to multiple undefeated regular seasons since 2009 and he's led teams to a berth in the BCS National Championship Game and to a pair of College Football Playoff appearances. Overall, his teams have appeared in bowl games 15 times.

Prior to taking over at LSU in 2022, Kelly spent 12 years as the head coach at Notre Dame where he became the school's winningest coach with 113 victories, moving past legendary Knute Rockne for the top spot on the list. Kelly left Notre Dame with a 113-40 overall mark and his teams averaged 10 wins a season over his last five years – 54-9 during that span – with Irish.

Kelly surpassed Rockne as the winningest coach in the storied history of Notre Dame when the Irish beat Wisconsin, 41-13, on Sept. 25, 2021 at Soldier Field in Chicago.

During his Notre Dame career, Kelly led the Irish to the 2012 BCS national title game as well as College Football Playoff appearances in 2018 and 2020. He was named National Coach of the Year by numerous outlets in 2012 and 2018. He's the only coach to win the Home Depot Coach of the Year Award more than once, and he's done it three times (2009, 2012, and 2018).

In 12 seasons at Notre Dame, Kelly's teams won at least 10 games seven times, including 2021, as the Irish posted an 11-1 mark and were ranked as high as No. 5 in the nation during his final season in South Bend. Kelly's final five seasons at Notre Dame saw the Irish win at least 10 games each year, including a 12-1 mark in 2018 and 11-2 in 2019.

Individually, Notre Dame players claimed eight consensus All-America honors playing for Kelly, while the Irish had players win nine national awards during that span. Kelly's Notre Dame teams produced 55 NFL Draft picks since 2012, including 10 in the first round.

Academically under Kelly, the Irish had eight players earn the prestigious CoSIDA Academic All-America honor, and three were selected as National Football Foundation Scholar-Athletes. As a team, Notre Dame consistently ranked among the nation's top four in the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate.

Prior to joining the Irish, Kelly transformed Cincinnati into a football powerhouse, winning Big East titles in 2008 and 2009. In three years at Cincinnati, the Bearcats won 34 games and appeared in the Orange and Sugar Bowls.

In 2007, Kelly led Cincinnati to the school's first-ever 10-win season with a 10-3 mark and a win in the PapaJohns.com Bowl. In his final season at Cincinnati, Kelly's team posted a 12-0 regular season mark and earned a berth to the Sugar Bowl.

Kelly's first Division I head coaching position came in 2004 when he took over at Central Michigan. In three years with the Chippewas, Kelly's teams won 19 games, claimed the Mid-American Conference title in 2006 and appeared in a bowl game for the first time in 12 years. The MAC title was the first for Central Michigan since 1994.

Kelly's impact at Central Michigan put the program on a path that saw the school win two more MAC titles over the next three years after his departure.

Prior to Kelly's arrival, Central Michigan had only two 10-win seasons and two bowl appearances since joining the Mid-American Conference in 1975.

Kelly's first head coaching job came at Division II Grand Valley State in 1991, a position he held for 13 years. In 13 years at Grand Valley, Kelly won 19 games, won five straight conference titles and made six Division II playoff appearances. He led the Lakers to back-to-back national titles in 2002 and 2003, going 14-0 and 14-1, respectively. He won 41 games during his final three years in Allendale.

A native of Everett, Mass., Kelly was a four-year letterwinner at linebacker and two-time team captain at Assumption College in Worcester, Mass. He graduated from Assumption in 1983 with a degree in political science.

LSU To Play Nicholls In Home Opener of the 100th Year Anniversary of Tiger Stadium

LSU will face Nicholls for the first time when the teams meet on Saturday at Tiger Stadium. Kickoff is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. CT. The game will serve as the home opener for the 100th year anniversary of Tiger Stadium and will be available to stream on SEC Network + and ESPN+.

100 Years of Tiger Stadium

The first home game of the 2024 season vs. Nicholls marks the start of a year-long celebration of 100 Years in Tiger Stadium, highlighted by stadium upgrades, events, and storytelling initiatives. Tiger Stadium, one of America's most iconic sporting venues, first opened its gates on Thanksgiving Day, November 27, 1924. Since then, the Tigers have won 451 contests in Death Valley, which has been home to three Heisman Trophy winners, four national championship teams, and 12 SEC title-winning squads. The 2024 home schedule features several marquee matchups, including home contests against Ole Miss, Alabama, Oklahoma and UCLA. One of the most legendary stadiums in all of college football, Tiger Stadium has been called "the best place in the world to watch a sporting event" by ESPN and "the pound-for-pound king of noise in college football." Entering its centennial season in 2024, Tiger Stadium has been a cornerstone of LSU Athletics and the Louisiana community for almost a century, hosting numerous NFL superstars, Heisman Trophy winners, and Hall of Famers since its opening in 1924. It serves as a sporting, cultural, and commercial hub for LSU Athletics, which contributes an estimated \$500 million of economic activity for the state of Louisiana annually.

What's New in Tiger Stadium in 2024

Tiger Stadium will feature new video boards, speaker towers, ribbon board and LED lights in 2024 as part of a \$19.8 million upgrade to the facility. Here are some of the highlights new to Tiger Stadium this year:

• New Video Boards and Speaker Towers

Tiger Stadium will feature new video boards in the north endzone and the east and west corners of the south endzone. Featuring the latest in technology, the new video boards will be among the biggest and best in college football and will deliver excellent image clarity to all fans in Tiger Stadium. The screen in the north endzone of Tiger Stadium measures 5,624 square feet, stands 37-foot tall and measures 152-foot in width, more than doubling the size of the previous screen (28-foot x 80-foot; 2,240 square feet). In addition, two new speaker towers will flank the north board with each measuring 19-foot x 37-foot. The south endzone corner boards stand 48-foot tall and measure 67-foot in width and will supplement the main north endzone board.

• Upgraded Ribbon Boards

A total of 11 LED ribbon boards – totaling more than 2,350 linear feet – have been installed on the fascia on the east, west and south sides of Tiger Stadium. The new digital technology will feature animations, graphics and game statistics and will bring constant energy and excitement, adding another layer of enhancements for fan enjoyment in Death Valley. LED lights have also been installed in the Chute – where the Tigers take the field – as well as the field tunnels.

• New LED Lights

Tiger Stadium will also feature new LED lights in 2024 allowing for in-game light shows and other capabilities that will not only enhance the field of play, but will add to the excitement of Death Valley.

LSU vs. the Southland

LSU's all-time record against current members of the Southland Conference stands at 18-0. LSU is 12-0 against Northwestern State and 2-0 against both McNeese and Southeastern Louisiana. LSU last played a team from the Southland Conference in 2021, beating McNeese, 34-7, in Tiger Stadium.

LSU vs. Louisiana Schools

The Tigers bring a 141-25-8 mark all-time against teams from Louisiana going into the Nicholls State game. The Tigers have won 36 straight games against in-state opponents. LSU's last loss to an in-state foe came in 1982 when Tulane posted a 31-28 win over LSU in Tiger Stadium. LSU's record against in-state schools include: 69-22-7 vs. Tulane; 22-0 vs. Louisiana-Lafayette; 19-1 vs. Louisiana Tech; 12-0 vs. Northwestern State; 4-1 vs. Loyola (New Orleans); 4-0 vs. Louisiana-Monroe; 3-1-1 vs. Centenary; 2-0 vs. Louisiana College, Southeastern and McNeese; and 1-0 against both Southern and Grambling. The Nicholls contest will mark the fourth straight year in which LSU has faced a team from Louisiana. LSU beat McNeese (34-7) in 2021, followed by a 65-17 win over Southern in 2022 and a 72-10 victory over Grambling last year.

LSU In Home Openers

Overall, LSU is 103-22-4 in home openers, which includes a 75-20-4 mark in Tiger Stadium. LSU has won 26 of its last 28 home openers dating back to a 35-34 win over Houston in 1996. In that span, the only home opener losses came in a 30-27 OT loss to Tennessee in 2005 and 44-34 loss to Mississippi State in 2020. LSU hasn't lost a "Saturday Night" home opener since dropping a 18-13 decision to Texas A&M in 1994.

LSU's Non-Conference Tiger Stadium Winning Streak Stands at 15 Games

LSU has won 15 straight and 64 of its last 65 games against non-conference opponents in Tiger Stadium. LSU's last loss against a non-conference foe came in 2017 when Troy beat the Tigers, 24-21 on Sept. 30. Prior to that loss, LSU had won 49 straight non-conference games in Tiger Stadium, which ranks as the third-longest streak in college football history, trailing only Harvard (55 from 1890-1895) and Carlisle (54 from 1901-1915). Before the Troy loss in 2017, LSU's last defeat in Tiger Stadium to a non-conference team came in 2000 against UAB. LSU defeated Grambling State, Army, and Georgia State during the 2023 season in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers' non-conference slate at home in 2024 includes Nicholls State, UCLA, and South Alabama.

NOTEBOOK

LSU Is 92-14 vs. Non-Conference Teams Dating Back to 2001

Dating back to the 2001 season when LSU captured its first outright SEC title since 1986, the Tigers have done quite well against non-conference opponents, going 92-14 against non-SEC foes during that span. Of the 92 wins, 21 have come against top-25 teams. Of the 14 losses, only seven have come during the regular season (2002 at Virginia Tech, 2016 vs. Wisconsin at Lambeau Field, 2017 vs. Troy, 2021 at UCLA, 2022 vs. FSU, 2023 vs. FSU, and 2024 vs. USC). The other seven losses came in bowl games (2003 Cotton Bowl vs. Texas; 2005 Capital One Bowl vs. Iowa; 2009 Capital One Bowl vs. Penn State; 2012 Chick-Fil-A Bowl vs. Clemson; 2014 Music City Bowl vs. Notre Dame; 2018 Citrus Bowl vs. Notre Dame; 2022 TaxAct Texas Bowl vs. Kansas State).

Nothing Like A Night Game in Tiger Stadium

There's not a better setting for college football than a night game in Tiger Stadium. It's not only the best atmosphere in college football, but it also creates a huge home field advantage for the Tigers. LSU has won 12 straight night games in Death Valley and since the turn of the century (2000-23), LSU is 107-15 in night games in Tiger Stadium. LSU went 49-5 from 2000-09, 43-7 from 2010-19 and is 15-3 in those games since 2020. Of the 15 losses since the start of the 2000 season, 8 have come to teams ranked in the Top 10 with five of those coming to teams ranked No. 1. LSU has only 2 non-conference losses in night games in Tiger Stadium since 2000 (UAB in 2000; Troy in 2017). Here's a look at LSU's night game record in Tiger Stadium by decade since the first game was played under the lights on Oct. 3, 1931 vs. Spring Hill (won, 35-0).

LSU Is 7-1 After A Loss Under BK

LSU is 7-1 under head coach **Brian Kelly** is games following a loss. The Tigers were 3-1 in those games in 2022 and are 4-0 in 2023. The Tigers have lost back-to-back games only once under **BK**, that coming during the 2022 season when the Tigers dropped a 38-23 decision to Texas A&M in the regular-season finale and then fell to No. 1 Georgia, 50-30, in the SEC Championship Game.

Up Next: LSU Opens SEC Play at South Carolina

Following its game against Nicholls State, LSU opens the conference slate against the Gamecocks on the road inside Williams-Brice Stadium. In the first true road test of the season, LSU heads to Columbia for the first time since 2008 when LSU came away with a 24-17 victory. RB Charles Scott capped off the last win at South Carolina with a 2-yard TD run late in the fourth quarter. The Tigers held the Gamecocks scoreless in the second half. LSU has a record of 19-2-1 against South Carolina.

Nussmeier Surpasses 2,000 Career Passing Yards

Starting **QB Garrett Nussmeier** moved past the 2,000-yard mark for career passing yards last week against USC when he tossed for 308 yards in the 27-20 setback to the Trojans. In 19 career appearances (2 starts), **Nussmeier** has thrown for 2,028 yards and 13 touchdowns. **Nuss** has completed 159-of-258 passes during his LSU career.

Nuss Joins Myles Brennan as Only QBs in LSU History to Top 300-Yard Mark In First 2 Career Starts

LSU **QB Garrett Nussmeier** joined Myles Brennan as the only quarterbacks in school history to throw for 300-plus yards in their first two career starts. **Nussmeier** threw for 308 yards in the season-opener against USC. In last year's ReliaQuest Bowl win over Wisconsin and in the first start of his career, **Nussmeier** passed for 395 yards. Brennan did it in 2020 with 345 yards vs. Mississippi State in the season-opener followed by 337 yards against Vanderbilt in week 2.

Emery Has Big Game in Return from Injury

Sixth-year **RB John Emery** returned from the knee injury that ended his 2023 season in a big way, leading the Tigers with 61 rushing yards on 10 carries. **Emery's** rush of 39 yards midway through the third quarter setup an LSU touchdown that gave the Tigers a 17-13 lead. **Emery** also had a 10-yard run on the drive that gave the Tigers their only lead of the contest. **Emery's** return capped a return to the field from a knee injury suffered against Florida in early November last year. **Emery** is LSU's leading active rusher with 1,123 yards and 14 TDs on 223 carries.

Chester Takes Over at Center

LSU returned 4 members of its offensive line from a year ago with redshirt freshman center **DJ Chester** being the only newcomer of the group. In his first career start, **Chester** played 64 snaps (26 rush, 38 pass) and didn't allow a sack as the Tigers tallied 421 total yards (113 rushing, 308 passing) in the season-opener against Southern Cal.

Sai'vion Jones Has First 2-Sack Game

Senior **DE Sai'vion Jones** had the first 2-sack game of his career in the season-opener against USC. **Jones**, who has 9 career sacks and 11.5 career tackles for loss, had a sack for a 4-yard loss in the second quarter that contributed to the Trojans kicking a field goal. He added a third quarter sack on 3rd-and-5 at the LSU 14-yard line that again forced the Trojans to settle for a field goal. In perhaps his best all-around game at LSU, **Jones** forced a fumble (recovered by USC) and batted down a pass at the line of scrimmage. He finished with 5 total tackles to lead an LSU defense that limited the Trojans to 69 rushing yards and only 3-of-9 on third-down conversions.

Kyren Lacy Likely to Break 1,000 Career Receiving Yards vs. Nicholls

Headed into the matchup vs. Nicholls, **WR Kyren Lacy** is on the precipice of meeting a milestone during his time at LSU. **Lacy**, a three-year member of the program, needs 80 yards to surpass 1,000 career yards and become the 43rd receiver in LSU history to eclipse that number. **Lacy** finished the USC game with 7 catches and 94 yards.

Peyton Todd and Blake Ochsendorf Combine Skill Sets to Replace Jay Bramblett

In 2024, **Peyton Todd** and **Blake Ochsendorf** combine to replace head coach **Brian Kelly's** starter for the last five seasons (3 at Notre Dame, 2 at LSU). **BK** intends to utilize **Todd** and **Ochsendorf's** skill sets carefully, whether it involves **Todd's** ability to flip the field or **Ochsendorf's** knack for rugby-style punting to pin the opponent deep in their own territory. Against USC, both **Todd** and **Ochsendorf** got their shot at punting for the first time in an LSU uniform. **Todd** launched three punts for 114 totals yard with a 40-yard long, while **Ochsendorf** saw the field once and kicked his sole punt 39 yards, pinning the Trojans inside their 20-yard line.

Campbell and Jones Back As O-Line Bookends

Juniors **Will Campbell** and **Emery Jones** form the nation's best offensive tackle tandem as the duo has helped pave the way for some of the most explosive offensive outputs in school history. **Campbell** and **Jones** have 52 combined starts (**Campbell** 27, **Jones** 25) between them. Since joining the Tigers in 2022, **Campbell** and **Jones** have been on the field together for 1,546 snaps. They have started 25 games together with LSU going 18-7 in those games. **Campbell** was listed as a preseason first-team All-America by every major publication, while **Jones** was tabbed second-team by ESPN.com.

NOTEBOOK

LSU To Play 5 Games in September for 8th Time

LSU will play five games in the month of September for just the eighth time in school history when the Tigers kickoff the season on Sunday, Sept. 1 against USC. The years in which LSU has played five games in September include 2023 (3-2), 2018 (5-0), 2017 (3-2), 2012 (5-0), 2006 (4-1), 2000 (3-2), 1995 (3-1-1). Following the USC game, the Tigers have September games against Nicholls (H), South Carolina (A), UCLA (H), and South Alabama (H).

LSU Is 8-3 In Non-Conference Games Under Brian Kelly

LSU is 8-3 against non-conference opponents under third-year head coach **Brian Kelly**. The Tigers' most recent victory versus a program outside the SEC came in the final game of the 2023 season, when they beat Wisconsin, 35-31, in the ReliaQuest Bowl. LSU's other non-SEC wins last year came against Grambling State, Army, and Georgia State, with its only non-conference loss coming against Florida State. USC handed LSU its first loss out of conference since the 2023 season opener vs. FSU. The remainder of LSU's non-conference slate in 2024 includes Nicholls, UCLA, and South Alabama.

LSU Ranked No. 18 in AP Poll, No. 19 In Coaches Poll

LSU enters the home opener vs. Nicholls ranked No. 18 in the AP Poll and No. 19 in the Coaches Poll. The Tigers remained in the Top 25 all season in 2023 and have played 20 consecutive games as a Top 25 team. LSU entered the season ranked in the Top 25 for the 23rd time in 24 years, a streak that dates back to the 2001 season. The only season that LSU didn't start the year ranked in the Top 25 during that span came in 2022 when **Brian Kelly** led an unranked Tigers team to a 10-3 mark and the SEC Western Division title.

Blake Baker Takes Over Defensive Play-Calling; Named Defensive Coordinator on Jan. 5

Blake Baker, who helped Missouri to an 11-win season and a Top 10 national ranking in 2023, enters his first year as LSU's defensive coordinator in 2024. **Baker** previously served as linebackers coach for the Tigers in 2021 before taking the defensive coordinator role at Missouri for two years (2022-23). He brings eight years of defensive coordinator experience to the LSU program. **Baker's** 2023 Missouri defense played a huge role in the Tigers going 11-2 overall and capping the season with a 14-3 win over No. 7 Ohio State in the Cotton Bowl. Missouri's 11 wins were the most for the school in nearly a decade. In the win over Ohio State, Missouri held the Buckeyes without a touchdown for the first time since the 2016 season. As a unit in 2023, Missouri ranked No. 4 in the SEC in scoring defense (20.8 points per game) and No. 5 in the league in both rushing defense (122.8) and total defense (336.1). Missouri led the SEC and ranked No. 4 nationally in fumbles forced (17), and they were No. 11 in the nation in sacks with 39. The Tigers were also among the Top 20 in the nation in fumbles recovered (No. 16 with 10) and tackles for loss (No. 18 with 88). Missouri's 2023 defense featured three players who earned All-SEC honors – defensive end Darius Robinson, linebacker Ty/Ron Hopper and defensive back Kris Abrams-Draine. In his previous season at LSU in 2021, **Baker's** top linebacker was All-America Damone Clark, who became a fifth-round NFL Draft pick and is currently a starter for the Dallas Cowboys. Clark had a breakout season under **Baker** in 2021, ranking No. 2 in the nation in tackles with 135 tackles to go along with 5.5 sacks and 15.5 tackles for loss. Clark was a finalist for the Butkus Award that year.

Joe Sloan Promoted to Offensive Coordinator; Cortez Hankton Named Co-OC

Joe Sloan was named LSU's offensive coordinator, while **Cortez Hankton** will serve as co-offensive coordinator in January 2024. **BK** revealed that **Hankton's** role is implementing and organizing the offense daily while serving as wide receiver coach. **Sloan** and **Hankton** were instrumental in LSU's offensive explosion in 2023, as the Tigers led the nation in scoring offense (45.5), total offense (543.5), and pass efficiency. The Tigers scored 40 or more points nine times, and LSU had nine games in which they reached 500 yards of offense with a season-high of 701 in the win over Florida. LSU was the only FBS team to rank in the Top 10 in both rushing and passing offense, averaging 338.9 yards (No. 3) through the air and 204.5 yards (No. 10) on the ground. They served as co-offensive coordinators for LSU's ReliaQuest Bowl win over Wisconsin. In that game with first-time starter **QB Garrett Nussmeier** at quarterback, the Tigers racked up 492 total yards, including 395 through the air, in the 35-31 victory. **Sloan** and **Hankton** are both in their third year at LSU, as they were among the first hires for **Kelly** when he took over the program in December of 2021.

Brian Kelly's Won At Least 10 Games For Seven Straight Seasons; Nation's Longest Active Streak

LSU coach **Brian Kelly** extended his streak of 10-win seasons to seven seasons against Wisconsin on Jan. 1 by coming away with the 35-31 victory over the Badgers in the ReliaQuest Bowl. The Tigers are 20-8 overall after going 10-3 in **Kelly's** second year at LSU. **Kelly's** streak of at least 10 wins goes back to 2017 at Notre Dame when the Irish were 10-3 overall. He followed that with a 12-1 mark in 2018, 11-2 in 2019, 10-2 in 2020, and 11-1 in 2021. His seven consecutive seasons of at least 10 wins stand as the longest active FBS streak.

LSU's Won 6 Games Under BK After Trailing By Double-Digits In First Half

LSU has come from behind to win 6 games in 2 years under **Brian Kelly** when trailing by double-digits in the first half. LSU did it 3 times in 2022 followed by 3 more in 2023. LSU rang up its 6th win after a double-digit first half deficit in the ReliaQuest Bowl victory over Wisconsin. With **Garrett Nussmeier** making his first start at quarterback, the Tiges trailed 14-0 in the first quarter and 28-14 early in the third quarter before coming back to win, 35-31. Brian Kelly Earned 10 Wins Each In First Two Seasons; 20-8 Through 28 Games

LSU head coach **Brian Kelly** enters the USC game with a 20-8 mark as the Tiger's leader of the football program. **BK** is one of two LSU coaches to earn 10 wins in his first two seasons, joining Les Miles, who went 11-2 in 2005 and 2006. LSU has won at least 10 games 19 times in its history, most recently in 2023, when the Tigers went 10-3 in **Kelly's** second season in Baton Rouge. Twelve of LSU's 18 10-win seasons have come since the Tigers went 10-3 in 2001. **Kelly** joined Mike Archer (10 wins in 1987) and Les Miles (11 wins in 2005) as the only first-year coaches in school history to win 10 games in their initial season with the Tigers. The one difference between the three is that **Kelly** took over a team coming off a losing season (6-7 in 2021), Archer took over a 9-3 squad that won the SEC title in 1986, and Miles took over a 9-3 team from Nick Saban.

BK and Dietzel Only Coaches In LSU History To Lead Tigers to 10 Wins After Dropping Opener

In 2022, **Brian Kelly** joined Paul Dietzel as the only coaches in LSU history to lead their teams to a 10-win season after dropping the season-opener. In 2023, **Kelly** and the Tigers were able to eclipse the 10-win mark for the second straight season after falling in the opener vs. Florida State. LSU lost to the Seminoles, 45-24, in Orlando and then went on to win 10 games, including a victory over Cotton Bowl champion Missouri Tigers. In 1961, fifth-ranked LSU fell to unranked Rice, 16-3, in Houston and then reeled off 10 straight victories to go 10-1 overall and win the SEC title. LSU won its 10th game in the Orange Bowl that year, beating No. 7 Colorado, 25-7.

Brian Kelly's Undeniable Success In Year Three

LSU head coach **Brian Kelly** enters his third season leading the Tigers' football program. Throughout **Kelly's** coaching career, it is well-documented how elite he is at building a program from the top down. In his 34 years as a collegiate head coach, **Kelly** has proven he can quickly take a program to national prominence. After winning two Division II national championships at Grand Valley State, **Kelly** moved into the Division I level at Central Michigan. Since then, **BK** has shown Year Three is when his program-building prowess takes shape. The following is a look at **Kelly's** record in his first two years, followed by his team's accomplishments during his third season as a Division I head coach:

Williams and Emery Enter 6th Year at LSU With 1,000 Career Rushing Yards

RBs Josh Williams and **John Emery** enter their sixth and final season at LSU with 1,000 career rushing yards to their credit. **Emery**, who is back at full strength after a season-ending knee injury against Florida in early November, goes into the Nicholls game with 1,123 yards and 14 TDs on 223 carries. He's also caught 37 passes for 330 yards and 2 TDs. **Williams**, a four-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll and a two-time LSU graduate, has rushed for 1,045 yards and 11 TDs and added another 340 yards and a score on 41 receptions.

NOTEBOOK

Transfer Portal Additions To Watch

LSU landed a handful of players in the transfer portal since the end of last season with several looking to play significant roles for the Tigers in 2024. Here's a look at the transfer portal additions and how they should contribute this year:

0 Zavion Thomas, RS/WR (Mississippi State) – Freshman All-America return specialist at Mississippi State in 2022. Averaged 12.4 yards every time in he touched the ball in 2023. Returned kickoff 94 yards for a TD vs. Texas A&M (2023) and returned a punt 63 yards for a score vs. Georgia (2022). Handles both kickoff and punt returns for the Tigers as well as being part of the rotation at wide receiver.

2 Jardin Gilbert, S (Texas A&M) – LSU's starting safety after spending three years at Texas A&M. A Baton Rouge native who played his high school football on the LSU campus at University High School. Played in 25 games (12 starts) with the Aggies, recording 79 tackles, 2 interceptions and 8 passes defended.

4 CJ Daniels, WR (Liberty) – 1,000-yard receiver in 2023 at Liberty, where he earned second-team All-Conference USA honors for a Flames team that won the league title and played Oregon in the Fiesta Bowl. Joins for his final season after a 4-year career at Liberty with 106 receptions for 1,954 yards and 21 touchdowns. Will likely be one of LSU's most targeted receivers this season.

12 JK Johnson, CB (Ohio State) – actually joined the Tigers in 2023, but suffered a lower leg injury early in preseason camp and missed the entire season. Has positioned himself to be among the players in the rotation at cornerback.

17 Jyaire Brown (Ohio State) – Joined the Tigers in January of 2024 after 2 years at Ohio State, where he appeared in 14 games with 1 start. Native of New Orleans and will see action in the rotation at cornerback.

31 Jay'viar Suggs, DT (Grand Valley State) – the last addition to the LSU roster, joining the Tigers during the summer of 2024 after two productive seasons at Division II powerhouse Grand Valley State. Lends experienced depth to LSU's defensive front.

99 Gio Paez, DT (Wisconsin) – adds experience and depth to the LSU defensive line. Pegged as a starter alongside senior Jacobian Guillory on the defensive front. Tallied 36 tackles in 36 career games (6 starts) in four years with the Badgers. Played against LSU in the ReliaQuest Bowl in January of 2024.

99 Blake Ochsendorf, P (Louisiana Tech) – joined the Tigers during the summer and is in a battle with Peyton Todd for starting punting duties. Earned All-Conference USA honors in 2023 in his lone season at Louisiana Tech. Entering his seventh season of college football having first played at Minnesota State-Moorhead (2018-19), followed by Eastern Michigan (2020-22) and Louisiana Tech (2023).

Williams and Penn Wearing No. 18 in 2024

Senior **RB Josh Williams** and senior **LB Greg Penn** will wear number 18 for LSU in 2024. The players were presented with their new number following practice in Tiger Stadium on Aug. 22.

"The number 18 jersey has great historical significance with our program," **Kelly** told the team at midfield in Tiger Stadium. "Matt Mauck was the first to wear it. He came to this program after playing professional baseball and won a national championship wearing the number 18. He epitomized all the intangibles of a teammate – he had all the things we talk about when it comes to great traits. He passed that number on to another great LSU player in Jacob Hester who led his team to another national championship.

"Throughout the last 25 years the number 18 has been passed down to a player who brings all those traits of a great teammate. Somebody who has given himself up for the team. A guy you can count on, a guy you want next to you when adversity hits, a guy that's going to be there when you need him. That's number 18."

Williams, a two-time LSU graduate and four-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll, told his teammates after being presented with the number 18 jersey, "I've had a long journey, coming here as a walk-on in 2019 and now in my sixth season. Being able to represent LSU with the number 18 jersey means a lot to me. Seeing the number 18s that I have played with over the years and seeing what they meant to the team and what they mean to LSU, I just want to thank coach Kelly and the coaching staff for giving me the opportunity to wear this special number."

Penn was one of the most productive players on LSU's defense last year with 89 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss, 4.0 sacks and an interception that helped the spark the Tigers to a comeback win over Texas A&M.

"He (Greg Penn) kept our defense together last year," **Kelly** said. "We won 10 games last year and he kept our unit together through some difficult times, because he was about LSU football. He was about, when we brought a transfer in at his position, all he did was work harder. He represents all the principles of being a great teammate and a guy you can count on."

Perkins and Campbell Wearing No. 7 in 2024

For the second straight year, **LT Will Campbell** has been awarded the No. 7 jersey. He is joined this year with No. 7 by **LB Harold Perkins**. The No. 7 jersey tradition started with Patrick Peterson in 2008 and has been carried forward since; the significance of the jersey has altered since the arrival of **Brian Kelly** as he wanted it to be worn by the best playmaker who calls Louisiana home. **Campbell** is a native of Monroe, while **Perkins** is from New Orleans. As an offensive lineman, the rules of college football prevent **Campbell** from actually wearing the No. 7 jersey, so instead, his No. 66 jersey will be accompanied by a No. 7 patch.

When presenting the number 7 jersey, **Kelly** told the team, who were all huddled in the middle of the field in Tiger Stadium, "(this number) is about somebody that brings an incredible ability, is from the state and calls the Louisiana his home. This number is about a player that brings up others around him. You can't just be a great player, if it's just about him, the number 7 jersey doesn't work. You have to bring others up around him and that's what these two do. They elevate the play of those around him."

Before **Kelly** presented **Perkins** with his jersey, **Campbell** offered the following about the newest number 7, "he comes to work and sets the tone for us every day on defense. I think he's the most electrifying player in college football and this year's he going to show it."

Perkins, also a first-team preseason All-America, has become a game-wrecker for opposing offenses in his first two seasons with the Tigers, tallying 26 tackles for loss, 13 sacks and being credited with nine forced turnovers. It's what **Perkins** has done during the offseason and in preseason camp that made him a natural selection for number 7.

"He has uplifted the other 10 players on the defensive side of the ball and he's ready to wear this jersey," **Kelly** said.

Outside of Billy Cannon's retired No. 20 jersey, the Nos. 18 and 7 are two of the most iconic LSU football numbers and have been worn by some of the all-time greats in school history.

They do so much for us, and they're so supportive of us, so anytime that we can go and do something to, you know, help other people out, it's awesome."

THIS WEEK IN TIGER STADIUM HISTORY

SEPTEMBER 1, 2001

A then record crowd of 91,782 watches as the Tigers dismantle Tulane, 48-17, in the 2001 season opener. Rohan Davey threw two first half TD passes and Josh Reed catches 6 passes for 135 yards as the Tigers built a 34-10 at halftime lead.

SEPTEMBER 2, 2000

In its first game under Nick Saban, LSU rolled to a 58-0 win over Western Carolina in the season-opener. LSU scored on the third play of the contest when Josh Booty hit Reggie Robinson in stride for an 80-yard TD pass. The Tigers racked up 680 yards of total offense, including 485 through the air, in the win. Rohan Davey finished a perfect 11-of-11 passing for 194 yards and three scores. LSU went on to post an 8-4 record in 2000, which included a victory over 15th-ranked Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl.

SEPTEMBER 3, 1988

LSU stages a stunning "lights out" goal line stand in the South End Zone of Tiger Stadium to preserve a shutout in a 27-0 win over Texas A&M. In the midst of the Aggies' thrust toward the end zone, a bank of lights went dark on the west side of the stadium. LSU's defensive unit was thus nicknamed "The Lights Out Defense."

SEPTEMBER 4, 2004

With ESPN's College GameDay on hand that day, LSU welcomes Oregon State to Tiger Stadium in its first game since winning the 2003 national championship. The Tigers erase an 8-point deficit in final two minutes of regulation and then wins in overtime, 22-21, when Beaver kicker Alexis Serna missed the point-after.

SEPTEMBER 5, 2015

LSU's game against McNeese is canceled just five minutes into the game due to consistent lightning in the area. The game, which kicked off at 6:39 p.m., was delayed at 6:50 p.m. and then finally ruled a no-contest at 10:36 p.m. after nearly a four-hour delay. It's believed to be the first time a game in Tiger Stadium was canceled after play began.

SEPTEMBER 6, 2014

In LSU's debut on the newly-created SEC Network, Anthony Jennings connected with Travin Dural on a 94-yard TD pass in a 56-0 win over Sam Houston State. The Jennings-to-Dural TD pass stands as the longest in school history.

SEPTEMBER 7, 1996

Kevin Faulk ran for an 80-yard TD and returned a punt 78 yards for a score as the Tigers overcame a 34-14 third quarter deficit to beat Houston, 35-34. Faulk rushed for 246 yards and a pair of TDs as the Tigers scored 21 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to win the 1996 season-opener in Tiger Stadium.

SEPTEMBER 7, 2013

Odell Beckham Jr. returned a missed field goal 100 yards for a touchdown – the first time such a feat has been accomplished – in LSU's 56-17 win over UAB. Zach Mettenberger set the then school-record with 5 TD passes.

Late Touchdown Lifts No. 23 USC Past No. 13 LSU, 27-20

USC tailback Woody Marks scored on a 13-yard touchdown run with eight seconds remaining in the game to lift the 23rd-ranked Trojans to a 27-20 win over No. 13 LSU in the season opener for both teams. Marks' TD capped an eight-play, 75-yard march that began with 1:47 left on the clock and broke a 20-20 tie. LSU grabbed a 17-13 lead at the 3:42 mark of the third quarter when Tigers quarterback Garrett Nussmeier connected with wide receiver Aaron Anderson on a 13-yard TD pass. USC regained the lead with 5:44 left in the contest when quarterback Miller Moss hit wide receiver Ja'Kobi Lane with a 28-yard scoring strike. The Tigers responded by moving 61 yards in nine plays, tying the game with a 31-yard field goal by Damian Ramos at the 1:47 mark prior to USC's game-winning drive. Nussmeier completed 30-of-39 passes for 308 yards and two touchdowns, as the Tigers accumulated 421 yards of total offense. Running back John Emery Jr. contributed 10 carries for 61 yards on the ground, including a 39-yard burst. Wide receiver Kyren Lacy posted seven catches for 94 yards, including a 19-yard pass from Nussmeier in the second quarter. Tight end Mason Taylor contributed seven catches for 62 yards for the Tigers. LSU linebacker Harold Perkins Jr. recorded a team-high nine tackles, while linebacker Whit Weeks added six tackles, including 1.5 stops for losses. Defensive end Sa'Vion Jones recorded two sacks from his edge rush position. Moss finished with 378 yards passing for the Trojans, completing 27-of-36 attempts with one TD.
