FOUR DOWNS

• The Nicholls State University football team concludes its tour of in-state FBS teams to start the season with the program's first ever trip to Tiger Stadium to take on nationally-ranked LSU under the lights. Both teams are searching for their first win after tough losses in the opening weekend. Kickoff in Tiger Stadium is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. and the game will be broadcast on SEC Network+/ESPN+ and can be listened to on ESPN Radio New Orleans 100.3 FM.

• Nicholls is coming off a 25-17 setback at Louisiana Tech which was the Colonels' 10th straight loss to an FBS program. The defenses took center stage in the wet and rainy conditions as Nicholls came up with five takeaways while LA Tech limited the Colonels to 200 total yards and one offensive touchdown. The units even accounted for the game's first points when LA Tech recorded a safety on the Colonels' first offensive play before Nicholls took its only lead on an interception return by defensive lineman Rasheed Lovelace. The Red and Gray kept it a one-score game until the fourth quarter but a late rally came up short.

• Saturday's matchup with LSU will be the Colonels' fourth meeting with an SEC school. The first came in a winless 2014 under the previous coaching staff and things did not fare well for Nicholls in a 73-7 loss at Arkansas. But just two years later in Tim Rebowe's second season, the Colonels nearly spoiled Kirby Smart's home debut at Georgia in a 26-24 loss to the No. 9 Bulldogs. Nicholls held a 14-13 lead in the third before the Bulldogs scored the next two touchdowns. The Colonels rallied for 10 unanswered but fell short in pulling off the upset. The defense had a memorable performance which included limiting future NFL running back Nick Chubb to 80 yards rushing on 20 carries. A year later in front of 100,000 fans at Texas A&M, Nicholls fell behind 14-0 in the first quarter before shutting out the Aggies in the next two and eventually tying the game at 14-14 early in the fourth. But Texas A&M found the end zone with seven minutes to go and then added a field goal in the final seconds for a 24-14 win.

• Nicholls will be looking for its fifth win over an FBS school since 2000 after claiming victories against Arkansas State ('01), Rice ('07), Western Michigan ('13) and Kansas ('18). The win over the Jayhawks came in overtime, 26-23, in the 2018 opener and sparked the first of two consecutive Southland title runs for the Colonels under Tim Rebowe. But the Colonels have lost eight of the last 10 by at least 20 points with the two exceptions being Saturday's 25-17 loss at Louisiana Tech and a 27-24 setback at Louisiana in 2021.

A WIN OVER LSU WOULD...

... give the Colonels its fifth win over an FBS program, snapping a 10-game skid. The last victory was in 2018 at Kansas.

... be the first FBS win over an in-state school. The Colonels fell to 0-12 since 2000 after their opening loss to Louisiana Tech.

... improve the Colonels' record to 1-3 against SEC schools (73-7 at Arkansas, 2014; 26-24 at No. 9 Georgia, 2016; 24-14 at Texas A&M, 2017).

... be the program's first victory over a nationally-ranked FBS team.

... just be the Tiger's second loss in their last 66 games against nonconference opponents in Tiger Stadium.

... snap the Tigers' 36-game winning streak against Louisiana opponents.

BY THE NUMBERS

2

Redshirt sophomore defensive lineman Rasheed Lovelace recorded his second career interception and returned it 25 yards for a touchdown in the opening quarter at LA Tech. Nicholls totaled two defensive touchdowns in the 2023 championship season.

3

Junior receiver Quincy Brown hauled in his third career touchdown pass as a Colonel as Nicholls made a late rally at LA Tech. Trailing 25-10 with 2:17 remaining, Brown came down with a highlight 27-yard catch in the end zone as he was surrounded by three defenders.

3

Junior linebacker Eli Ennis won SLC Defensive Player of the Week for the third time in his career. Ennis moved to the inside this season and racked up 10 tackles, an interception and a fumble recovery in the opener against LA Tech.

4

Nicholls has four wins over FBS programs since 2000, with the last coming in 2018 with an overtime victory at Kansas. Under Coach Rebowe, the Colonels had close calls at No. 9 Georgia (26-24), Texas A&M (24-14) and Louisiana (27-24), and also fell in overtime to South Alabama (41-40). The other three victories were against Arkansas State ('01), Rice ('07) and Western Michigan ('13).

4

Kylan Dupre sent off a nine punts at LA Tech and had a personal best four inside the 20. The Catholic High product averaged 43.6 yards a punt and had a long of 63.

5

Nicholls registered five takeaways in the opener at LA Tech with three interceptions and two fumble recoveries. The Colonels ranked in the Top 10 in turnovers gained last season as well as eighth in the nation with 16 interceptions.

13

Thirteen members of the 2024 roster have already earned a college degree. Suiing up as college grads are Marquese Albert, Dillion Davis, Markevrick Eddie, Collin Guggenheim, Nathan Hebb, Reed Lambert, Jamison Lindsey, Terry Matthews, Pat McQuaide, Elijah Reames, Evan Roussel, Quinton Sharkey, and Tye Smith-Lindsey.

Nicholls racked up 16 All-Southland selections last year -- the most ever in program history. The Colonels had six first-team honorees and 10 second-team recipients to go along with four superlative winners. The 16 selections edged the 2018 championship team's 15 honorees.

17

Nicholls welcomes back a total of 17 starters on offense and defense from last year's championship squad. Eight are set to return on offense, not including the league's Player of the Year -- Jaylon Spears, who technically didn't start last season. Nine are back on defense including Tyler Morton who was named to the Buck Buchanan Watch List. Kylan Dupre also returns for his third season at punter.

93

The Nicholls roster features 93 Louisiana natives, which is the most of any Division I roster this season. The Colonels have held the distinction for most of Tim Rebowe's career, usually having atleast 90 players from the Pelican State.

After rushing for 79 yards at LA Tech, running back Collin Guggenheim climbed up to No. 3 on the Colonels' all-time rushing list with 2,518 yards. Guggenheim will now have his sights on Josh Son who has 2,658 yards for the No. 2 spot.

ELI BOOKS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Linebacker Eli Ennis was named Southland Conference Defensive Player of the Week following the Colonels' opening game of the 2024 season.

- Ennis led a strong performance by the Colonel defense against FBS Louisiana Tech, totaling 10 tackles to go along with an interception and a fumble recovery -- the firsts of his career.

- His fumble recovery came at the 2-yard line and his pick was the fifth and final takeaway for the Colonels.

- The SLC weekly honor is the third for Ennis in his career, earning the award twice in 2022 as he went on to be named Southland Freshman of the Year.

IN THE POLLS

Nicholls made its return to the national rankings in 2017 after being unranked for nearly a decade. Head Coach Tim Rebowe's squad then had an impressive stretch of being ranked or receiving votes until the '21 campaign. - For the first time since 2021, the Colonels began the season as a ranked program. Despite the loss to LA Tech, the Colonels moved up a spot to No. 22 in the Stats Poll and are No. 25 in the Coaches Poll.

RESCHEDULED

Nicholls and LSU were set to play for the first time ever in the 2020 season but the game ended up being canceled due to the COVID pandemic. LSU canceled its nonconference games that season while the Colonels took part in the FCS Spring season. - Nicholls is the only Division I football program in Louisiana to have never played LSU.

TITLE TOWN

Nicholls is coming off its third Southland championship in the last six years. The Colonels went undefeated in league play for the first time in program history, securing a fourth FCS playoffs appearance under Tim Rebowe who is entering his 10th season at the helm. Nicholls made three consecutive playoff appearances from 2017-19, capped with back-to-back league titles.

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES?

While Nicholls and LSU will be meeting on the gridiron for the first time, the schools are no strangers when it comes to competing against one another in other sports.

- Although LSU has a commanding lead in the all-time series in baseball and men's basketball, the Colonels claimed notable wins recently over the Tigers.

- On April 25, 2023, the Colonel baseball team picked up a thrilling 6-5 win over No. 1 and eventual national champion LSU in Alex Box Stadium. Nicholls broke a 4-4 tie in the ninth with two runs before shortstop Parker Coddou made a game-ending catch for a double play which was the No. 1 play on SportsCenter.

- On Nov. 10, 2023, the men's basketball team gave Tevon Saddler, the youngest coach in college basketball, his first career win with a 68-66 victory. Nicholls led by as much as 24 points in the first half before LSU roared back to take the lead with six minutes remaining. Down 66-65 with 46 seconds to go, Nicholls got the stop it needed before Jamal West Jr. found Jalen White outside the arc for the game-winner with just 1.2 seconds remaining.

A DECADE WITH REBOWE

- In his ninth season, Tim Rebowe led Nicholls to the program's first outright Southland Conference title and third overall during his tenure. The Colonels won all but one league game by double figures, outscoring opponents 33.2 points per game to 16.0 ppg. Nicholls then made its fourth playoff appearance in the last seven years, all coming under Rebowe.

- It was Rebowe's first time winning the Southland Coach of the Year and the first time a Colonels coach won the award since Jay Thomas in 2005. Rebowe was the fourth Nicholls coach to win the honor, joining Thomas, Daryl Daye (2002), and Darren Barbier (1996). Rebowe was an assistant for Barbier in '96. He was also recognized as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, given to the top coach in the FCS.

- After rebuilding the program in his first two campaigns, Rebowe led Nicholls to five consecutive winning seasons, four FCS playoffs appearances and three Southland Conference championships. The Colonels finished with a losing mark in 2022 but claimed a .500 or better Southland record for the seventh straight campaign (3-8, 3-3 SLC).

- The Colonels returned to form by winning the third title in six seasons last year. They've now had eight consecutive seasons of .500 or better in league play and locked up a sixth winning overall campaign under Rebowe.

PROJECTED TO REPEAT

The Colonels received nine first-place votes and 119 total points to take the top spot in the 2024 SLC Preseason Poll. UIW followed closely in second -- with eight first-place votes -- and 113 points. On the preseason all-conference side, Nicholls checked in with 15 selections to lead the way, while Lamar and UIW added 10 selections, respectively. The Colonels placed 12 players on first-team and three on second. First-Team selections on offense were running backs Jaylon Spears, who is the league's reigning Player of the Year, and Collin Guggenheim, offensive lineman Evan Roussel, tight end Lee Negrootta, wide receiver Quincy Brown, and punter Kylan Dupre. Making first team on defense were defensive linemen Rasheed Lovelace, Kershawn Fisher and Joe Mason, linebacker Hayden Shaheen, and defensive backs Tyler Morton and Kendarius Smith. Second-team honorees were quarterback Pat McQuaide, offensive lineman Reed Lambert, and linebacker Eli Ennis.

LOU-WE-SIANA

Nicholls has continued to represent Louisiana year-after-year with homegrown talent and this season is no different as the 2024 roster features 93 players from Louisiana.

- Most come from a 50-mile radius which includes New Orleans, Baton Rouge, and the River Parishes.

- The Colonels have had the most Louisianans in Division I football over the past few seasons.

LAGNIAPPES PART II

SPEARS NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST

In his first season as a featured offensive player, running back Jaylon Spears was named Southland Conference Player of the Year after totaling over 1,300 all-purpose yards and nine touchdowns. Spears averaged an impressive 6.5 yards per carry and 68.5 yards rushing per game, racking up 753 yards on the ground. The New Orleans native rushed for over 100 yards three times, highlighted by back-to-back efforts of 160 and 177 yards in victories over ranked UIW and Lamar. He found the end zone six times for rushing scores, including twice in the home finale win over LU.

- Spears chipped in with 16 receptions for 260 yards with three touchdowns in the passing game as well. A large chunk of the yards came on two of his TD catch-and-runs -- an 88-yarder against SEMO and a 73-yard score in the River Bell Classic win at Southeastern.
- Spears was named to the Walter Payton Award Watch List to start this season, with the award being given to the top player in FCS. He also landed on two preseason All-America teams.
- Spears was the third Nicholls player to earn SLC Player of the Year, joining Sully Laiche (2019) and Chase Fourcade (2018).

MORTON UP FOR DEFENSIVE POY

Safety Tyler Morton posted a breakout season in 2023, earning two All-American honors. For his efforts, he landed on the Buck Buchanan Preseason Watch List, which recognizes the top defensive player in the FCS.

- Morton totaled 63 tackles and had four of the defense's 16 interceptions, ranking eighth in the FCS in interceptions per game, helping the Colonels to the second-most picks in the FCS. He had two games where he was responsible for two turnovers -- two interceptions against HCU and an interception and forced fumble at McNeese. His other interception came in title clinching win over Lamar where he also had three pass breakups.

THE MAN IN THE MIDDLE

Evan Roussel returns for his fifth season as the Colonels' starting center. Roussel started as a true freshman during the Spring 2021 season and has went on to earn All-Southland in all four seasons, including three first-time selections. Roussel has cleared the way for an all-league running back in all four of his campaigns, including two first-teamers last season.

- Roussel was not only a preseason all-league selection but was named to two preseason all-America squads.

PAT IS BACK

Juco transfer Pat McQuaide took the reins at quarterback last season after transferring from Mississippi Gulf Coast where he was an All-South MACCC First Team honoree.

- McQuaide started all 11 games at quarterback in his debut season, earning All-Southland Second Team. He threw for 2,196 yards and 13 touchdowns, ranking second in the SLC with 199.6 yards per game. Along with earning all-league honors, he garnered LSWA Newcomer of the Year.
- McQuaide posted his first 300-yard for the Colonels in the home game against SEMO, throwing for 345 yards with two touchdowns and one interception.
- McQuaide tossed a career high three touchdowns in the win against Lamar, although he finished with a season low 106 yards on 9 of 17. McQuaide did rush for a high of 36 yards on seven carries.
- He saved his best performance for last, throwing for 300 yards on 20-25 with two passing TDs and a rushing touchdown in the River Bell win over Southeastern.

DALMADO TO LB

Former running back Jake Dalmado made the switch to defense in the spring and moved to linebacker.

- In two seasons in the backfield, Dalmado had a solid showing with 131 yards on 22 carries, averaging 6.0 yards per carry.
- Last season on special teams, he totaled five tackles which may have sparked the position change.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

Starting at nose tackle as a redshirt freshman, Ra-sheed Lovelace earned SLC Freshman of the Year honor after totaling 25 tackles with 2.5 for loss and 0.5 sacks. He recorded his first career interception in the win over Lamar and his best game statistically was at Texas A&M-Commerce, where he had six tackles and his half sack. Lovelace was named a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award, which honors the nation's top freshman.

- Lovelace was the sixth Colonel to be named freshman of the year, joining teammate Eli Ennis (2022), Broderick Cole (2004), LeJuan Walker (2001), Josh Son (2000) and Darryl Pounds (1991). Lovelace and Ennis are the first players from the same team to earn the award in back-to-back seasons since McNeese in 2005-06.

MOUNT RUSHMORE

Over the last seven seasons, the Nicholls offense has had 51 100-yard rushing performances by a combined 12 players. Collin Guggenheim leads the current players on the list with (9) 100-yard games, and is followed by Jaylon Spears (3) and Marquese Albert (1).

- While individual recognition is nice, wins are a plenty when it comes to having a 100-yard rusher. Under Tim Rebowe, Nicholls is 37-11 when having at least one player rush for 100 yards. The Colonels are also 16-1 when having at least 300 yards rushing as a team.

BROTHERLY LOVE

The Colonels feature two sets of brothers on the 2024 roster, including freshmen twins Jacob and Josh Johnson. The lineman duo played at Catholic in Baton Rouge before signing on with the Colonels.

- Starting defensive lineman Zack Bernard was joined by his younger brother, Ryan, two seasons ago. The younger Bernard redshirted in 2022 and saw time on the offensive line last season.

THE MANNING CAMP

In the summer of 2024, Nicholls State University hosted the Manning Passing Academy for the 19th consecutive year. The four-day camp, put on by the Manning family - Archie and his sons, Cooper, Eli and Peyton - brought in close to 1,200 high school campers from all over the country. In addition to the Mannings, every year some of the most elite NCAA quarterbacks act as camp counselors. In the 2018 NFL Draft, all five quarterbacks selected in the first round were Manning Camp alums. The 2024 draft featured camp alum, LSU and Heisman winner Jayden Daniels.

COMPLETE 180

The Colonels had one of the most impressive turnarounds in the FCS in the 2010s. From 2011-14, Nicholls won a total of six games, with four being non-Division I, and a 0-12 season in '14 capped the tenure.

- Tim Rebowe was introduced as head coach a day after the '14 finale, which was the program's largest margin of defeat in Southland play in team history (59-point deficit). The loss also extended the Colonels' losing streak to 18 games, but Rebowe led his squad to a win over HCU in Year 1 to end the streak at 23.
- After guiding the Colonels to a winning conference record in 2016 at 5-4, the first since 2005, Nicholls earned an at-large berth in the 2017 FCS playoffs with an 8-3 campaign.
- The Colonels finished the regular season in '18 with another 8-3 record, which included a win over Power 5 Kansas and the program's second SLC title.
- The Colonels went 9-5 in 2019 and another 7-2 mark in conference was good enough for back-to-back Southland championships.

Tim Rebowe is in his 10th season as head coach of the Nicholls State University football team.

In his nine years at the helm, Rebowe has turned the Colonels into

a championship-caliber program by leading Nicholls to three Southland Conference titles and four appearances in the FCS playoffs. The Red and Gray climbed into the rankings in 2017 for the first time in 10 years and were a mainstay in the Top 25 in the following seasons.

In 2023, Rebowe guided Nicholls to an undefeated record in Southland Conference play, its first in school history, en route to the program's third title in the last six years. The Colonels dominated their league slate by winning all but one game by double figures, averaging 33.2 points while allowing just 16.0 per game. Rebowe was named SLC Coach of the Year while Jaylon Spears received Player of the Year.

Saying Rebowe has led Nicholls to new heights would be an understatement. Prior to his arrival in 2015, the Colonels had three postseason appearances all-time and only two winning records in Southland play since joining the league in 1991. Under Rebowe, Nicholls has already more than doubled its playoff appearances and has posted a .500 or better mark in the SLC in the last eight years.

Although Nicholls saw its streak of five straight winning seasons come to an end in 2022, all three victories came in league play as they finished 3-3 in conference. The Colonels knocked off HCU and Texas A&M-Commerce, as well as longtime rival McNeese. Highlighting several true and redshirt freshman who saw the field was linebacker Eli Ennis, who was named Southland Freshman of the Year.

In the fall of 2021, the Colonels ended the season with a 6-5 overall record -- giving the program a winning campaign for the fifth straight season. Nicholls had to deal with adversity right out of the gate as Hurricane Ida displaced the team for two weeks, spending most of that time in Memphis. After playing the season opener, the Colonels rallied and nearly knocked off in-state foe Louisiana, which finished the season nationally ranked in the FBS Top 25. Nicholls was able to keep its winning-record streak alive with another thrilling victory at Southeastern in the River Bell Classic, as the Colonels secured the Bell for the third time in the previous four classics.

Nicholls went 4-3 in the condensed 2021 spring season, fueled by a record-breaking offense. The Colonels scored more than 50 points in three different wins and averaged a school record 48.7 points per game and 521.6 yards of offense. The defense also claimed its second shutout in league play in the last three campaigns, blanking Lamar in the 55-0 conference opener.

With three straight 7-2 records in the Southland from 2017-19, the Colonels won the league championship in '18 and '19 and represented the SLC in the playoffs in all three seasons. Nicholls not only made the postseason, but earned first-round victories in the last two appearances.

Rebowe vowed to build the program by recruiting local talent and has continued to bring in high-caliber players, with the majority coming from within a 100-mile radius of Thibodaux. The 2016 recruiting class was donned by some of the best in the program's history and the group of seniors delivered, leaving Nicholls as the all-time winningest class.

The 2019 season featured a second consecutive nine-win campaign,

highlighted by victories in the de facto championship bout with rival Southeastern Louisiana and another first-round triumph in the FCS playoffs. Following a thrilling 28-27 win over the Lions in the River Bell Classic for the league title, Nicholls hosted a playoff game for the third year in a row and advanced with a victory over North Dakota. But the season came to an end in the next round at No. 1 North Dakota State, which went on to win a third-straight FCS title. With a 9-5 overall record, Nicholls ranked No. 14 in the final FCS polls.

En route to another SLC championship in 2019, the Colonels swept their Louisiana rivals - McNeese, Northwestern State, and Southeastern Louisiana - for the first time since 2005. Rebowe's Colonels also put to rest their final losing streak in conference with a dominating 34-14 win over playoff participant Central Arkansas. The Bears had won the last eight matchups, but only two against Rebowe after the teams did not play in '17 and '18.

Nicholls landed a school-record eight players on the 2019 All-

Southland First Team, including three superlative award winners. Defensive lineman Sully Laiche earned player of the year, while quarterback Chase Fourcade garnered offensive player of the year and P.J. Burkhalter was named top offensive lineman. Laiche was also the first Colonel to be a top 3 finalist for the STATS FCS Buck Buchanan Award, which is given to the best defensive player in the FCS.

After earning an at-large berth into the playoffs in 2017, the Colonels left no doubt in their postseason fate in '18 after winning the Southland championship and receiving the league's automatic berth into the playoffs. Nicholls went 7-2 in league play for the second straight season to claim the program's first title since 2005.

The Colonels hosted a first-round playoff game for the second time in as many years, but this time, Nicholls came away victorious with a 49-30 win over San Diego. A loss in the next round to national runner-up Eastern Washington ended the campaign and Nicholls finished with a 9-4 record. The nine wins were the second most in program history.

Another highlight of 2018 was an overtime victory at FBS Kansas in the season opener. After coming up short against FBS programs Georgia, Texas A&M, and South Alabama, Rebowe's Colonels notched the program's first win over a Power 5 opponent with a 26-23 win over the Jayhawks.

The 2018 Colonels featured 15 All-Southland selections, including the program's first Southland Player of the Year - quarterback Chase Fourcade. Rebowe also received recognition for his outstanding work, being named Louisiana Sports Writers Association co-Coach of the Year, which was his second state honor in three years.

Nicholls not only ranked among the best in the Southland in offense and defense, but the Colonels also posted impressive numbers in the FCS. The Red and Gray ranked 12th in the nation in rushing offense and total offense, and had the 11th-rated rush defense to go along with ranking 21st in points allowed.

With a season-opening win at Kansas and a victory over preseason favorite Sam Houston State in the opening month, Nicholls maintained its preseason Top 25 ranking and reached as high as No. 10 in the polls. The Colonels were ranked in every poll for the season, finishing at No. 14 in both major polls.

Year 3 of Rebowe's tenure saw the program reach new heights. Nicholls finished the regular season with an 8-3 overall record and an all-time best 7-2 mark in the Southland Conference. The team was ranked for the first time since 2007, and the Colonels hosted an FCS playoff game – a first in program history.

Although the Colonels came up short in their postseason game against South Dakota, they finished ranked in the top 25 in both polls. Along with the rankings and playoff game, highlights for the season included the program's most wins since 1996 and the six-game winning streak was the longest in 31 years.

Rebowe's 2017 campaign did not go unnoticed by the national and local media. He was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, which is given to the FCS top head coach, and finished ninth in the voting. He was then recognized as the top coach in the state as the Louisiana Sports Writers Association named him LSWA Coach of the Year.

Rebowe completely changed the culture in his first year, ending a program-record losing streak and led Nicholls to a pair of road victories in Southland play. In 2016, the Colonels recorded their first winning campaign in the SLC since 2005 and finished tied for fourth place. Before Rebowe arrived, Nicholls had finished last in the league for four consecutive seasons.

Despite going 0-2 out of the league in 2016, the Colonels made their presence known early on with impressive showings against FBS opponents. Nicholls shocked the country in the opening weekend by nearly knocking off No. 9 Georgia in a 26-24 decision. Just two weeks later, the Colonels lost a heartbreaker in overtime at South Alabama, 41-40. The Colonels threatened again in '17 to take down an FBS program, Texas A&M, but after tying the game in the fourth quarter Nicholls came up short, 24-14.

A native of Norco, Louisiana, Rebowe was named head football coach on Nov. 21, 2014, becoming the 10th in the program's history. Rebowe, who coached at Louisiana-Lafayette as an assistant for 11 seasons and was a former assistant coach at Nicholls for six years, not only brought a wealth of experience coaching at the collegiate level but has strong ties to the state of Louisiana having coached within the borders his entire career.

Rebowe helped lead the Ragin' Cajun program to four consecutive New Orleans Bowl victories and a conference championship under head coach Mark Hudspeth. During his tenure at ULL, he served as the safeties coach (2004-07, 2011-14) and linebackers coach (2008-10).

In 2014, ULL's defense ranked first in the Sun Belt in rushing yards allowed and red zone defense, while ranking second in points allowed. The defense finished with seven interceptions on the year, including two by cornerback Corey Trim, who was named All-Sun Belt Second Team Defense. Under Rebowe's tutelage in 2013, the Cajuns tied for the conference lead with 14 interceptions. Two years prior, his safeties combined for five interceptions, with three returned for touchdowns.

Rebowe's group had a stellar year in his first season as defensive backs coach in 2004 as the defense ranked 11th in the nation in passing yards allowed. Both of his starting safeties that year, C.C. Brown and Antwain Spann, would go on to the NFL. The following season, the pass defense finished 23rd in the nation in yards allowed.

As a linebackers coach, Rebowe guided the team's leading tackler in all three seasons and also had two players earn All-Sun Belt recognition.

In 1995, Rebowe took his first collegiate job, joining Darren Barbier's staff at Nicholls. From '95-'99, he served as defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator before coaching the receivers in 2000. Rebowe was part of the biggest turnaround in FCS history as the Colonels went 0-11 in '95 before earning a playoff spot the very next season with an 8-4 mark.

Rebowe began his coaching career in 1988 at his alma mater, Destrehan High School. While there, he coached Super Bowl Champion and NFL Hall of Famer Ed Reed.

Following his stint with Nicholls, Rebowe coached the cornerbacks at ULM from 2001-03.

Rebowe earned his bachelor of science in physical education from LSU in 1987. He is married to the former Kim Robichaux, and they have a daughter, Samantha, and a son, Tyler, who graduated from Nicholls in the spring of 2016.
