3rd Year at LSU · 10th Year as a Head Coach

Basketball Head Coach Matt McMahon has five simple core values that define him and his basketball program at LSU:

Hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy.

Those were some of the first words he said when he stepped to the podium for the first time as the 25th LSU men's basketball head coach on March 22, 2022.

Now after two seasons as head coach at LSU and the improvement shown by the team from year one to year two, the foundation has been laid for further improvement by the Tigers and through the second season in 2023-24, all five of those core values were seen time and time again.

Through long hours of work in the classroom, in the video room, and practice, the hard work and unselfishness was seen. The toughness and accountability were there in when times got tough; and, yes, when LSU defeated back-to-back nationally-ranked teams in the final seconds, there was that joy that all LSU fans could enjoy.

The team learned and played under those five principles and laid a foundation for the LSU Basketball program to move forward on in 2024-25.

As the LSU Basketball program under Coach McMahon enters its third season, the team will mix three top 65 high school recruits, along with a handful of transfers into the mix with another step in the progress of the McMahon program – player development.

Player development is stressed a lot in the Matt McMahon LSU basketball program and that was never more evident than the development of Tyrell Ward and Jalen Reed from their freshman to sophomore years. Most importantly, after another summer and fall of player development, they will be back for their third season with the program.

That bodes well for players like sophomore Mike Williams and the return of Derek Fountain and Daimion Collins who both battled injuries during different points of the 2023-24 campaign.

This past season, as LSU continued to improve, including a seven-win rise in the Southeastern Conference, finishing with a 9-9 record and a post-season tournament appearance in the NIT, the culture of the LSU program and the success that it can have in the future were on full display.

The Tigers won 5-of-their-last-7 regular season conference games starting back-to-back wins over No. 11 South Carolina, 64-63, in Columbia and then a 75-74 win over No. 17 Kentucky in Baton Rouge.

Against the Gamecocks, it was two Jordan Wright free throws with less than five seconds to play that were the game winners after the Tigers rallied from 10 down with eight minutes

to play.

At home against Kentucky, Wright's first shot attempt was blocked. He got the rebound and tossed it to Ward who beat the buzzer for the winning score.

The culture and success were on display during the seven years at Murray State University where Coach McMahon led the Racers to a record of 154-67. He led Murray State to 93 OVC regular-season wins, winning 75 percent of league games.

He has also coached multiple all-Americans and all-league players such as Ja Morant who was named NBA Rookie of the Year in 2020.

The Racers won regular season league titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2022 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2018, 2019 and 2022.

Since the native of Oak Ridge, Tennessee, became the third-youngest rookie among D1 coaches in 2015, McMahon has continued a steady move forward with a reputation for developing talent both as an assistant and head coach. He has become known nationally as an excellent recruiter and he is among the best in the nation in the area of player development and game planning.

In his final season at Murray State in 2021-22, McMahon coached OVC Player of the Year KJ Williams and two other recipients of first-team honors (Tevin Brown, Justice Hill). In addition, McMahon was named the league's Coach of the Year.

McMahon's Racers, in 2021-22, were just the sixth team in league history to go undefeated and the first to do it in an 18-game conference schedule. Murray State then won the two league tournament games to advance to the NCAA Tournament where, as a No. 7 seed, the Racers defeated San Francisco to advance to the round of 32.

The 2021-22 team was one of seven teams to win 30 or more games that season and led the nation in win percentage at 91.2 percent (31-3).

McMahon was the first MSU coach to have three seasons of 25 or more wins and was one of just three Murray State coaches to have four 20-win seasons.

Coach McMahon led the Racers to three-straight OVC regular season titles (2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20) and two consecutive OVC Tournament titles (2017-18, 2018-19).

PRIOR TO MURRAY STATE

Coach McMahon has had success in college basketball since his days as a player at Appalachian State.

Known as an excellent shooter and tough competitor, he played on three Southern Conference regular season title teams in 1998, 1999 and 2000.

He played in 117 career games under coach Buzz Peterson and made 135 three-pointers, graduating in 2000.

His coaching career began immediately at Appalachian State as assistant under Houston Fancher in 2000-01. He would rejoin Peterson's staff as a graduate assistant coach at Tennessee before returning to ASU in 2002 as assistant and later associate head coach, where he stayed until the end of the 2009-10 season.

A year at UNC Wilmington (2010-11) as assistant coach set the stage for his journey to Murray State, starting first as an assistant in the 2011-12 season and then as head coach prior to the 2015-16 season.

Coach McMahon and his wife Mary, a former standout for the Furman women's basketball team, have three children – Maris, Mason and Mabry.

SERIES VS. ULM

The Tigers and Warhawks have met eight previous times since 1991 in the Maravich Center with LSU winning all eight contests. The first one, in Shaquille O'Neal's junior season was the closest one as LSU rallied in the final seconds for a 77-76 victory (Nov. 22, 1991). The team last met on Nov. 9, 2021 with LSU a 101-39 winner.

ULM UPDATE

The Warhawks opened their season on Monday at home against Champion Christian, winning 111-61, in Monroe.
All 13 Warhawks who appeared in the game scored and two ULM players had double doubles -- AD Diedhiou (13 pts-11 rebs) and Renars Sondors (10 pts-14 rebs).
Jerry Ngopot led ULM in scoring with 16 points. Makai Willis posted 15 points, while Jalen Bolden scored 10.
ULM shot 41-of-76 from the field (53.9%) with 10 treys. The Warhawks had 52 points in the paint and 23 points off turnovers.
Coach Keith Richard begins his 15th year at the helm of his alma mater in 2024-25. He was also the head coach at Louisiana Tech for nine years and spent two seasons as an assistant coach at LSU under Trent Johnson where he helped the Tigers to the 2008-09 SEC regular season championship. He is a Baton Rouge native.

WILL REGULAR SEASON OPENER MARK EIGHTH STRAIGHT YEAR A FRESHMAN STARTS FOR LSU

RECAP: The Tigers did what they needed to do in their exhibition game against Loyola, jumping out to a 31-3 lead in the first nine minutes and executing in a way that showed fans what may be part of the plan for the regular season ... A total of 12 Tigers played and all 12 scored, with six in double figures. LSU shot 56.7 percent (39-70) and made 18-of-37 three-pointers (48.6 percent). (Note: the regular season record is 17). More importantly, the Tigers turned the ball over nine times.

Kansas State transfer Cam Carter led LSU with 21 points, hitting five treys, while UT Martin transfer Jordan Sears posted 16 points with four treys. Mike Williams III had 11 points with three treys, while Jalen Reed, Dji Bailey and Curtis Givens III all had 10 points each.

THE SCHEDULE

LSU will play all its non-conference games before league play starts on Jan. 4 and there are some dates to keep an eye upon as the season moves forward.

Some of the highlights include a third straight contest with Kansas State on Nov. 14 in Manhattan, Kansas. This will be the third year of what has turned into a neutral-home-away series for LSU. The teams met in the finals of the Cayman Islands Classic before a contract was signed for a home-and-home series.

LSU's MTE this year is part of the first Greenbrier Tipoff at the famed resort in White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia. LSU will play Pittsburgh in Colonial Hall at the resort on Nov. 22 and then will face either UCF or Wisconsin in the second game on Nov. 24. LSU's home game as part of the event is against Charleston Southern on Nov. 19.

The Tigers will host the SEC/ACC Challenge game this season against the Seminoles of Florida State on Dec. 3. Florida State and LSU last met in a neutral site game in 2018 in Orlando Florida, with Florida State winning, 79-76, in overtime. The teams have not met on a home court since 1959.

LSU will start a neutral-neutral series with SMU on Dec. 14 at the Comerica Center in Frisco, Texas in the Compete 4 Cause Classic. The 3 p.m. game will be followed in the evening with a Texas Legends G-League contest. In the 2025-26 season, the teams will compete again, this time at the Smoothie King Center in New Orleans.

TIGERS WANT BETTER NOVEMBER-DECEMBER

LSU finished strong last season to get to 9-9 in the SEC games, but it was in the first 13 games of the season where LSU stumbled some, losing five times in the month of November and December. So one of the goals of this team this year is to not only get ready for league play, but to play better basketball in the first two months of the season.

LSU had two losses in the Maravich Center a year ago in the first two months, to Nicholls (68-66) and to Kansas State (75-60).

A NOVEMBER 6 OPENER AGAIN

When the Tigers open the season on Nov. 6, it will mark the second straight year, but only the third year in LSU history that they have opened the season as early as Nov. 6.

LSU is 2-0 on Nov. 6, having defeated Mississippi Valley State on this date last year and Southeastern in the 2018 opener.

In regard to Wednesday, the Tigers are 266-192 on Wednesdays in their history in college basketball and 145-51 in the month of November.

OPENING NIGHTS

LSU is 95-21 on opening nights, having won the last 10 opening games. The last loss was in November 2013 when the Tigers lost, 92-90, at UMass.

The Tigers last on-court home loss in the first game of the season dates back to 1986 when LSU lost to TCU in the opening round of the preseason NIT.

RETURNING NUMBERS

LSU returns an average of 35.3 points from a year ago (46.2 percent) of the team's 76.4 points per game average, while the return-

ing rebound average if 42.8 percent (15.3 of 35.7).

TURNOVERS

The exhibition game did give hope about LSU's ability to possibly keep the turnovers down. Last season LSU averaged 13.1 turnovers a game

LSU only had single digit turnovers once a year ago with eight in the home win over Vanderbilt (January 2024) and 10 on four other occasions.

THREE-POINT SHOOTING

It does appear the three-point shot will be a big part of the repertoire for this group of Tigers if you believe what was seen in the exhibition. There are plenty of players that can shoot the long shot and an extra pass or two can lead to an open look from deep.

LSU has made 14 or more seven times since the shot was instituted:

LSU was in double figures from the arc nine times last year, making 256-of-717 (35.7 percent). Opponents made 19 more threes on 104 more attempts. LSU was 143-of-396 (36.1 percent) in SEC games.

FAMILIAR FACES JOIN LSU COACHING STAFF

The LSU coaching staff is back at full strength for 2024-25 after Cody Toppert left before the start of the season to take on the Washington Wizards G-League team head coaching job and Ronnie Hamilton left after the season to join the staff at Louisville.

Joining the Tigers for his second time on the LSU coaching staff as associate head coach is David Patrick, who has served twice as a head coach in his tenure, including the last two seasons as the head coach at Sacramento State.

Known as a top-flight recruiter, Patrick was on the coaching staff of Johnny Jones at LSU from 2012-16.

Also returning as assistant coach is former Tiger player Jalen Courtney-Williams. Courtney-Williams joins the Tigers after three years as a member of the coaching staff at Creighton.

Courtney-Williams played in 61 games at LSU in three seasons (2010-11, '11-12, '12-13) before transferring to Morehead State, where after sitting out a transfer season, played for MSU in 2014-15.

That pair joins returning assistants Casey Long, Tim Kaine and Ronrico White. Jeff Moore remains the director of recruiting and fan favorite Tasmin Mitchell is in his eighth season on the coaching staff as Special Assistant to Head Coach Tasmin Mitchell.

MARAVICH CENTER

LSU was 12-6 a year ago in the 53rd season of play in the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. The Tigers are 338-49 in non-conference games in the building.

The building was originally known as the LSU Assembly Center until 1988 when the building was renamed by government legislation following the untimely death of the star LSU player. The Maravich Center is the fourth oldest continuous basketball arena in the league having hosted its first game in January 1972. Memorial Gym at Vanderbilt opened in 1952, Stegeman Coliseum at UGA in 1964 and Coleman Coliseum at Alabama opened in 1968.

Coach McMahon said that Derek Fountain and Tyrell Ward were not dressed for the game with minor nicks and “precautionary basis.” Both are expected to dress on Wednesday.

AND THE FIRST YEAR GUYS MADE THEIR MARK AS WELL

LSU had four players make what would be their exhibition Maravich Center debut in the game against Loyola – Robert Miller III, Vyctorius Miller, Curtis Givens III, Corey Chest. The first three were freshman signees for the 2024-25 season, while Chest was signed prior to the 2023-24 season and was redshirted.

Robert Miller earned the start at forward, scoring seven points and a team co-best nine rebounds. Vyctorius Miller played 18 minutes off the bench and had nine points, while Givens played 20 minutes with 10 points, hitting two treys.

Chest, a New Orleans native, played his final prep season in 2022-23 at Link Academy in Branson, Missouri where the school won the prep national championship. He played 10 minutes with four points with three rebounds.

SEVEN FORMER TIGERS STARTED ON NBA ROSTERS

Seven former Tiger basketball players were on opening week rosters as the National Basketball Association began its 2024-25 season last week:

- Brooklyn Nets – Ben Simmons, Cam Thomas, Trendon Watford**
- Houston Rockets – Tari Eason**
- Minnesota Timberwolves – Naz Reid**
- Portland Trail Blazers – Duop Reath**
- Toronto Raptors – Garrett Temple**

Reid is one of the most popular players in Minnesota is coming off a season in which he was named the NBA Sixth Man of the Year. Reid was part of the Tigers 2019 Sweet 16 NCAA Tournament team at LSU.

Temple is the veteran of the group and has been a mentor to many of the young Raptors. He is in his 15th season in the league after playing in the Final Four as a freshman in 2006 and winning an SEC regular season title for LSU in his final year of 2009. As of Saturday, he had appeared in 745 NBA games and needs only 14 appearances to pass Brandon Bass for third place in total appearances among LSU NBA stars (748).

Thomas had a breakout season a year ago for the Nets, averaging 22.5 points and 2.9 assists in 66 games. Last year he became the youngest player in NBA history to score 40 points in three straight games. He opened with 36 points on Wednesday night.

Joining him on the NETS are Watford and 2016 National Freshman of the Year Ben Simmons

Watford is in his fourth season in the NBA, joining the Nets last year. Simmons, who has struggled with injuries but seems to be fully recovered from back surgery. This is his seventh year to play in the league.

Eason looks to return from an injury that shortened his season in 2023-24. The 17th pick in the 2022 NBA Draft played a full 82 games in the 2022-23 seasons.

Reath had a different path to the NBA after completing his playing time at LSU in 2018. Reath played overseas before joining the Trail Blazers 2023 Summer League team. He eventually signed a two-way deal with Portland and debuted on Nov. 12, 2023. In February 2024, Portland converted his two-way deal to a standard contract.

TIGERS BACK AT HOME FOR SUNDAY LATE AFTERNOON CONTEST

LSU returns to the Maravich Center on Sunday for a 4 p.m. tilt with Alabama State. The game will be broadcast on the LSU Sports Radio Network (Note: This game in Baton Rouge on 100.7 FM) and streamed on SECN+.

The Tigers the next week will make its first road trip to Kansas State for a game on Nov. 14 in Manhattan, Kansas. That is an ESPN+ streaming broadcast.
