LSU To Face Baylor In Kinder's Texas Bowl

LSU (8-4, 5-3 SEC) faces Baylor (8-4, 6-3 Big 12) in the Kinder's Texas Bowl on New Year's Eve at NRG Stadium in Houston. Kickoff for the contest is slated for 2:30 p.m. CT on ESPN. It's the first matchup between LSU and Baylor on the gridiron since the 1985 Liberty Bowl (Baylor won 21-7). LSU leads the overall series with the Bears, 8-3. It's the third bowl meeting between the teams as they also met in the 1963 Bluebonnet Bowl in Houston (Baylor won 14-7). LSU is making its third bowl appearance under head coach Brian Kelly and the Tigers are appearing in a bowl game for the 24th time in 25 years with the only exception coming in 2020. LSU enters the game riding a 2-game winning streak with wins over Vanderbilt (24-17) and Oklahoma (37-17) to close out the regular-season. LSU enters the game averaging 29.3 points and 431.9 total yards per game (116.9 rushing, 315.0 passing). The Tigers lead the SEC and rank No. 8 nationally in third-down conversion percentage at 49 percent (86-of-174). Defensively, the Tigers are allowing 23.8 points and 352.5 total yards per game (146.6 rushing, 205.9 passing). Junior QB Garrett Nussmeier ranks No. 2 in the SEC in TD passes (26), passing yards per game (311.3), and total offense (307.8). Nussmeier, who has 13 career starts, has completed 312-of-490 passes for 3,735 yards, 26 TDs and 11 interceptions. LSU's Texas Bowl receiving corps is led by Aaron Anderson (53 rec., 784 yards, 5 TDs) and Zavion Thomas (20 rec., 188 yards, 2 TDs). Freshman All-SEC RB Caden Durham leads the Tigers with 693 yards and 6 TDs. His 693 yards ranks first among all freshmen running backs in the SEC. All-SEC LB Whit Weeks (119 tackles, 10.0 TFL, 3.5 sacks) and Greg Penn (80 tackles) lead the Tiger defense. All-SEC Edge Bradyn Swinson (56 tackles, 8.5 sacks, 13.0 TFL, 12 QB hurries, 2 FF) and DE Sa'vion Jones (36 tackles, 4.5 sacks, 6.5 TFL, 8 QB hurries, 2 FF, 1 FR) have the most impact plays for the Tiger defense.

LSU Coach Brian Kelly: Winningest Active Coach In NCAA Football

Brian Kelly, in his third season with the Tigers, has guided LSU to a 28-11 overall mark. He entered 2024 riding a streak of seven straight 10-win seasons. Kelly is the winningest active coach in NCAA football (no matter division) with an on-field record of 312-108-2. After inheriting a roster with only 39 scholarship players, Kelly quickly turned LSU into a 10-win team in his first season in 2022 as the Tigers went 10-4 overall, beat Top 10 teams in Ole Miss and Alabama and won the SEC Western Division. Kelly, the most accomplished hire in LSU football history when he was named to the position in December of 2021, took over the program after 12 years and 113 wins at Notre Dame. His coaching resume includes 12 10-win seasons at the FBS level (7 at Notre Dame, 3 at Cincinnati, 2 at LSU), along with leading teams to 18 bowl/CFP playoff appearances and 3 National Coach of the Year honors. He won two Division II National Championships at Grand Valley State.

QUICK NOTES

- LSU is making its 56th bowl/post season appearance. The Tigers are 30-24-1 all-time in bowl/post season games, which includes a 2-0 record in the College Football Playoffs.
- LSU will be making its 25th bowl/playoff appearance since the turnaround of the program in 2000. Since 2000, LSU has won 3 national championships, 5 SEC titles and gone 16-8 in bowl/playoff games.
- LSU is appearing in the Texas Bowl for the third time. LSU is 1-1 in the Texas Bowl, beating Texas Tech (56-27) on Dec. 29, 2015 and falling to Kansas State, 42-20, on Jan. 4, 2022.
- LSU QB **Garrett Nussmeier** ranks No. 2 in the SEC and in the Top 10 nationally in passing yards (No. 6 at 3,739), passing yards per game (No. 6 at 311.6), and total offense per game (No. 8 at 307.8). **Nussmeier** is No. 2 in the SEC and ranks No. 13 nationally in passing TDs (26).
- In 13 career starts, **Nussmeier** has thrown for at least 2 TDs 9 times and topped the 300-yard mark 8 times, including 7 in 2024. He's guided LSU to an 9-4 mark as a starter.
- QB **Garrett Nussmeier's** 313 completions (491 att.) leads the SEC and ranks No. 4 in the nation. They also rank No. 2 in school history for a single-season, trailing only Joe Burrow (402 in

2019).

- LSU is 24-2 under **Brian Kelly** when reaching the 30-point mark. LSU is 6-0 this year after going 10-1 in 2023 and 8-1 in 2022 when scoring at least 30 points in a game. LSU has won 13 straight games when scoring at least 30 points.
- LSU leads the SEC and ranks No. 8 in the nation in third-down conversion percentage at 49 percent (86-of-174).
- LSU has won 17 SEC regular-season games in 3 years under **Brian Kelly**, which ranks as the third-highest total in the league during that span, trailing only Georgia (22) and Alabama (19).
- RB **Caden Durham** earned Freshman All-SEC honors and leads the Tigers in rushing with 693 yards and 6 TDs on 127 carries. He's averaging 5.5 yards per carry. His 693 rushing yards were the most by any freshmen in the SEC in 2024.
- LB **Whit Weeks** ranks No. 3 in the SEC in tackles per game (9.9). He recorded double-digit tackles in 5 of LSU's 8 conference games, including a career-best 18 in the win over Ole Miss and 17 vs. Alabama and Oklahoma. His 119 total tackles rank just outside LSU's top 10 list for a single-season.
- LSU remains atop the SEC in sacks allowed with 15.

When Brian Kelly was hired away from Notre Dame in December of 2021, LSU announced at the time that "the search for LSU Football's next championship head coach is over."

The most accomplished hire in program history with 310 career victories, Kelly wasted little time in making his impact felt, leading the Tigers to a 10-win season and the SEC Western Division title in his first year. Despite inheriting a roster with only 39 scholarship players remaining from the 2021 season, Kelly led the Tigers to Top 10 wins over Ole Miss and Alabama along with road victories over Auburn, Florida and Arkansas in his first year with the Tigers.

LSU capped the 2022 season with a resounding 63-7 win over Purdue in the Citrus Bowl completing one of the biggest turnarounds in college football.

Building off of the 2022 season, Kelly again guided the Tigers to a 10-win season capped with a victory over Wisconsin in the ReliaQuest Bowl. In doing so, Kelly joined Miles as the only coaches in LSU history to lead the Tigers to 10-win seasons in their first two years with the program. Kelly has now won at least 10 games for seven straight years, the longest active streak among all FBS coaches.

Behind the play of Heisman Trophy quarterback Jayden Daniels, LSU won seven of its final eight games to finish with a 10-3 record. All three of LSU's losses came to teams either in the CFP Playoffs (Alabama) or playing in a New Year's Six Bowl (Florida State, Ole Miss). LSU's signature win came in a 49-39 victory over Missouri – a team that finished ranked No. 9 in the nation.

In 2023, the Tigers featured the top offense in college football, leading the nation in scoring (45.5) and total yards (543.5). LSU was the only FBS team to rank among the Top 10 in both rushing (No. 10 at 204.5) and passing (338.9) yards per game.

Behind an offensive line that was a finalist for the Joe Moore Award, LSU topped 40-points and the 500-yard mark nine times in 2023. Daniels became only the fifth player in SEC history to account for 50 touchdowns (40 passing, 10 rushing) in a season and he led the nation in total offense with a league record 412.2 yards per game. Daniels also set the FBS record for pass efficiency with a 208.0 rating. For the second straight year, Daniels was the top rushing quarterback in college football with 1,134 yards.

In LSU's November win over Florida, the Tigers racked up 701 total yards – the most ever given up by the Gators – with Daniels setting the SEC record for total yards with 606. In that game, Daniels became the first player in FBS history to rush for 200 yards (234) and pass for 350 yards (376) in a game. A week later, Daniels tied Joe Burrow's LSU record for touchdowns in a game with eight (2 rushing, 6 passing).

Daniels solidified his standing as the Heisman Trophy favorite against Texas A&M when he directed the Tigers to three fourth quarter touchdowns as LSU overcame a 10-point third quarter deficit to beat the Aggies, 42-30. In what was his final game as a Tiger, Daniels accounted for four touchdowns and 355 yards (120 rushing, 235 passing) against Texas A&M.

LSU's 2023 offense ranked No. 2 in program history for points in a season (592), points per game (45.5), total yards (7,065), total yards per game (543.5), passing yards (4,406) and passing yards per game (338.9).

Wide receiver Malik Nabers – a consensus All-American – became LSU's all-time leader in receptions (189) and receiving yards (3,004). Nabers led the nation in receiving yards per game (120.7), catching an SEC-best 89 passes for 1,569 yard and 14 touchdowns. Teammate Brian Thomas Jr. led the nation in receiving TD's with 17. The duo combined for 157 receptions for 2,746 yards and 31 touchdowns making them the most productive tandem in the FBS.

In his first year at LSU, the Tiger offense gave a glimpse into what the 2023 season may hold. After a slow start – LSU completed only eight passes for 80 yards in a win over Auburn on Oct. 1 – the Tigers found their identity beginning with a 45-35 victory over Florida in Gainesville two weeks later.

A week later, Kelly picked up his first Top 10 win at LSU as the Tigers rolled past No. 7 Ole Miss, 45-20, in Tiger Stadium. Following an open date, the Tigers picked up their second consecutive Top 10 win, knocking off No. 6 Alabama, 32-31, in Death Valley.

Down a touchdown after Alabama's first possession in overtime, Daniels scored on a 25-yard run on LSU's first play pulling the Tigers to within 31-30. Instead of kicking the extra-point to send the game into a second overtime, Kelly opted to go for two setting the stage for one of Tiger Stadium's epic moments.

With 102,000 fans on their feet, Daniels found tight end Mason Taylor in the front corner of the endzone for a successful two-point conversion, sending Tiger Stadium into a frenzy.

That call – and that game – are widely considered two of the top moments in the history of Tiger Stadium. The victory over Alabama put LSU in the driver's seat in the SEC Western Division as the Tigers went on to claim a spot in the league's title game with a win over Arkansas in Fayetteville the following week.

Kelly became only the fourth first-year coach in SEC history to lead a team to the league's championship game, joining Les Miles (LSU in 2005), Gus Malzahn (Auburn in 2013) and Jim McElwain (Florida, 2015).

Kelly and Paul Dietzel are the only coaches in LSU history to lose a season-opener and still go on to win 10 games. Kelly has now done it twice – 2022 and 2023 – while Dietzel did it in 1961.

LSU's 2022 season saw the Tigers rack up some of the top offensive numbers in school history – at the time ranking No. 2 in program record books for total yards (6,344), No. 3 in yards per game (453.1) and total passing yards (3,770). The 2022 set the program mark for rushing touchdowns with 39, breaking the previous record of 37 set in 2013.

Kelly, who has more victories than any active coach in major college football with 312, was named LSU's 34th head football coach on December 1, taking over a program that has won four national championships. He joined the Tigers after 12 seasons at Notre Dame.

In 34 years as a collegiate head coach, Kelly has put together a 312-108-2 overall mark and is the winningest coach in Notre Dame history. He's now won 10 or more games 12 times at the FBS level and he's reached double-digit win 18 times in his 34-year coaching career. He's had teams win nine games on five other occasions.

Other coaching stops for Kelly include 13 seasons at Grand Valley State, three at Central Michigan, four at Cincinnati, and 12 at Notre Dame.

His overall mark of 312-108-2 puts him ahead of North Carolina's Mack Brown (282) on the list of most victories by an active FBS head coach. Only twice during Kelly's 34-year coaching career has he had a team finish below .500.

Kelly is also one of only five active FBS coaches who have guided their programs to multiple undefeated regular seasons since 2009 and he's led teams to a berth in the BCS National Championship Game and to a pair of College Football Playoff appearances. Overall, his teams have appeared in bowl games 15 times.

Prior to taking over at LSU in 2022, Kelly spent 12 years as the head coach at Notre Dame where he became the school's winningest coach with 113 victories, moving past legendary Knute Rockne for the top spot on the list. Kelly left Notre Dame with a 113-40 overall mark and his teams averaged 10 wins a season over his last five years – 54-9 during that span – with Irish.

Kelly surpassed Rockne as the winningest coach in the storied history of Notre Dame when the Irish beat Wisconsin, 41-13, on Sept. 25, 2021 at Soldier Field in Chicago.

During his Notre Dame career, Kelly led the Irish to the 2012 BCS national title game as well as College Football Playoff appearances in 2018 and 2020. He was named National Coach of the Year by numerous outlets in 2012 and 2018. He's the only coach to win the Home Depot Coach of the Year Award more than once, and he's done it three times (2009, 2012, and 2018).

In 12 seasons at Notre Dame, Kelly's teams won at least 10 games seven times, including 2021, as the Irish posted an 11-1 mark and were ranked as high as No. 5 in the nation during his final season in South Bend. Kelly's final five seasons at Notre Dame saw the Irish win at least 10 games each year, including a 12-1 mark in 2018 and 11-2 in 2019.

Individually, Notre Dame players claimed eight consensus All-America honors playing for Kelly, while the Irish had players win nine national awards during that span. Kelly's Notre Dame teams produced 55 NFL Draft picks since 2012, including 10 in the first round.

Academically under Kelly, the Irish had eight players earn the prestigious CoSIDA Academic All-America honor, and three were selected as National Football Foundation Scholar-Athletes. As a team, Notre Dame consistently ranked among the nation's top four in the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate.

Prior to joining the Irish, Kelly transformed Cincinnati into a football powerhouse, winning Big East titles in 2008 and 2009. In three years at Cincinnati, the Bearcats won 34 games and appeared in the Orange and Sugar Bowls.

In 2007, Kelly led Cincinnati to the school's first-ever 10-win season with a 10-3 mark and a win in the PapaJohns.com Bowl. In his final season at Cincinnati, Kelly's team posted a 12-0 regular season mark and earned a berth to the Sugar Bowl.

Kelly's first Division I head coaching position came in 2004 when he took over at Central Michigan. In three years with the Chippewas, Kelly's teams won 19 games, claimed the Mid-American Conference title in 2006 and appeared in a bowl game for the first time in 12 years. The MAC title was the first for Central Michigan since 1994.

Kelly's impact at Central Michigan put the program on a path that saw the school win two more MAC titles over the next three years after his departure.

Prior to Kelly's arrival, Central Michigan had only two 10-win seasons and two bowl appearances since joining the Mid-American Conference in 1975.

Kelly's first head coaching job came at Division II Grand Valley State in 1991, a position he held for 13 years. In 13 years at Grand Valley, Kelly won 118 games, won five straight conference titles and made six Division II playoff appearances. He led the Lakers to back-to-back national titles in 2002 and 2003, going 14-0 and 14-1, respectively. He won 41 games during his final three years in Allendale.

A native of Everett, Mass., Kelly was a four-year letterwinner at linebacker and two-time team captain at Assumption College in Worcester, Mass. He graduated from Assumption in 1983 with a degree in political science.

Kelly and his wife Paqui have three children – Patrick, Grace and Kenzel. The Kellys are active in community outreach and have established the Kelly Cares Foundation which has donated nearly \$8 million to support causes related to the fight against breast cancer since its founding in 2008.

LSU Meets Baylor For First Time Since 1985 in Kinder's Texas Bowl on New Year's Eve

LSU, who is coming off two-straight wins to close the 2024 season, is set to face Baylor for the first time since 1985 when it meets the Bears on New Year's Eve in the Kinder's Texas Bowl. The contest will be televised on ESPN and kickoff is scheduled for 2:30 p.m. LSU finished the 2024 regular season with an 8-4 mark overall and a 5-3 record in conference play. The Tigers closed the regular-season with back-to-back wins over Vanderbilt (24-17) and Oklahoma (37-17). Baylor (8-4, 6-3 Big 12) comes into the Texas Bowl off a 45-17 victory against the Kansas Jayhawks and six-straight wins. LSU is 8-3 in the series history with Baylor, including an 0-2 mark in bowl games. Baylor beat LSU, 14-7, in the 1963 Bluebonnet Bowl and then posted a 21-7 victory over the Tigers in the 1985 Liberty Bowl.

LSU vs. Baylor: LSU leads 8-3

LSU and Baylor will meet for the 12th time in series history when both programs play in the Kinder's Texas Bowl on Dec. 31. In a series that dates back to 1907, LSU holds an 8-3 lead in the overall series against the Bears (6-1 in Baton Rouge; 1-0 in Waco; 0-1 in Houston; 0-1 in Memphis; 1-0 in Shreveport). LSU opened with five-straight victories in the series - 4 of which were played in the state of Louisiana. LSU and Baylor have met in a bowl game twice with Baylor holding a 2-0 record in those instances (1963 Bluebonnet Bowl; 1985 Liberty Bowl). Most recently, the Tigers and Bears faced off in the 1985 Liberty Bowl, where Baylor posted a 21-7 victory. In the 2024 contest, LSU will take on former defensive coordinator Dave Aranda, who ran the Tiger defense from 2016-19. Aranda was defensive coordinator for LSU's 2019 national championship team.

LSU's 2-1 in NRG Stadium

LSU brings a 2-1 mark in games played in NRG Stadium into the Baylor contest. The Tigers beat Wisconsin, 28-24, to open the 2014 season at NRG Stadium followed by a 56-27 victory over Texas Tech in the 2015 Texas Bowl. Most recently, LSU dropped a 42-20 decision to Kansas State in 2021 when the Tigers only fielded 38 scholarship players and had WR Jaray Jenkins start at QB. LSU was scheduled to play BYU in the 2017 season-opener at NRG Stadium, however, severe flooding to Houston forced the game to be moved to the Superdome in New Orleans. LSU won that game against BYU, 27-0. Here's a quick look at LSU's NRG Stadium history:

LSU At Home In A Dome

LSU will be making its 47th appearance in a domed stadium against Baylor. The Tigers are 34-12 all-time in games played in a domed stadium, which includes a 2-1 mark in NRG Stadium. LSU's last game in a domed stadium came in the 2024 season opener featuring LSU and USC at Allegiant Stadium in Las Vegas. This is LSU's third appearance in NRG Stadium in Houston at the home of the Texans. The two previous appearances included a 56-27 victory over Texas Tech in 2015 and a 42-20 loss to Kansas State in 2021.

LSU's History at The Texas Bowl: 1-1 Record

LSU will make its third appearance in the Texas Bowl when the Tigers face Baylor on Dec. 31 inside NRG Stadium. LSU's other appearances included matchups against Texas Tech (LSU won, 56-27) and Kansas State (KSU won, 42-20). Against the Red Raiders in 2015, numerous LSU bowl records were set. LSU RB Leonard Fournette led an offensive rushing explosion with 212 yards and an LSU bowl-record tying 4 rushing TDs. He also accounted for 30 points in the game, another LSU bowl record, as he added a 44-yard TD reception. In 2021, when the Tigers returned to Houston for a bowl game with the Wildcats, LSU had only 38 scholarship players available for the game, and WR Jontre Kirklin was the Tigers' starting quarterback, playing the position for the first time since 2016 when he was a senior at Litcher (La.) High School.

LSU's Texas Bowl Recaps
2015

LSU 56, Texas Tech 27

Leonard Fournette tied an NCAA bowl record with five touchdowns as 20th-ranked LSU (9-3) had little trouble in a 56-27 Texas Bowl victory over Texas Tech. LSU set seven team bowl records, including points (56), rushing yards (384) and total yards (638). Fournette rushed for 212 yards, his fourth 200-plus yard game of the season, and exploded for rushing TDs of 2, 43, 4, and 2 yards, while also scoring on a 44-yard reception to earn MVP honors. LSU never trailed in the game as the Tigers scored touchdowns on three of their first five possessions. The Tigers led 14-6 after the first quarter and then 21-13 at halftime. The Red Raiders pulled to within 21-20 on their first possession of the second half, however the Tigers responded with 21 unanswered points in the third quarter to stretch the lead to 42-20 on a 26-yard run by Brandon Harris. Texas Tech, led by QB Patrick Mahomes, added a TD early in the fourth quarter to get within 42-27, but LSU answered with TDs on consecutive possessions to put the game away.

NOTEBOOK

2021

Kansas State 42, LSU 20

LSU, with only 38 scholarship players available for the game, and wide receiver Jontre Kirklin playing quarterback, dropped a 42-20 decision to Kansas State in the 2021 Texas Bowl. LSU capped its season with a 6-7 mark, the first losing record for the Tigers since going 3-8 in 1999. Offensive line coach **Brad Davis** served as LSU interim head coach for the game. Kirklin, playing quarterback for the first time since 2016 when he was a senior at Litcher (La.) High School, completed 7-of-11 passes for 138 yards and 3 TDs. He added 61 rushing yards on 11 carries. Kansas State raced out to a 21-0 lead and led 21-7 at halftime. The Wildcats stretched the lead to 42-7 before LSU got fourth quarter TDs from Malik Nabers on a 15-yard pass from Kirklin and **Chris Hilton**, on the final play of the game on an 81-yard reception from Kirklin.

Current LSU offensive line coach **Brad Davis** served as the interim coach for the Tigers in the 2021 Texas Bowl, managing a team with only 38 scholarship players available for the game against Kansas State.

LSU vs. the Big 12

LSU is 37-9-1 against current members of the Big 12 conference. The Tigers have played all but one current member of the Big 12 with Kansas the only member of the league LSU has yet to play in football. LSU has played Baylor more times (11) than any other Big 12 team, while its 8 victories over the Bears stand as the most against any program from that conference. LSU To Appear In A Bowl Game For 56th Time

LSU will make its 56th bowl appearance when the Tigers take on Baylor in the Texas Bowl. LSU is 30-24-1 all-time in bowl games, which includes a 2-0 mark in the College Football Playoffs. Dating back to the 2000 season, LSU has appeared in a bowl game every year with the exception of 2020. Last year, LSU's **QB Garrett Nussmeier** led the Tigers to a 35-31 victory over Wisconsin in the ReliaQuest Bowl.

LSU Is 95-14 vs. Non-Conference Teams Dating Back to 2001

Dating back to the 2001 season when LSU captured its first outright SEC title since 1986, the Tigers have done quite well against non-conference opponents, going 95-14 against non-SEC foes during that span. Of the 95 wins, 21 have come against top-25 teams. Of the 14 losses, only seven have come during the regular season (2002 at Virginia Tech, 2016 vs. Wisconsin at Lambeau Field, 2017 vs. Troy, 2021 at UCLA, 2022 vs. FSU, 2023 vs. FSU, and 2024 vs. USC). The other seven losses came in bowl games (2003 Cotton Bowl vs. Texas; 2005 Capital One Bowl vs. Iowa; 2009 Capital One Bowl vs. Penn State; 2012 Chick-Fil-A Bowl vs. Clemson; 2014 Music City Bowl vs. Notre Dame; 2018 Citrus Bowl vs. Notre Dame; 2022 TaxAct Texas Bowl vs. Kansas State).

LSU Is 11-3 In Non-Conference Games Under Brian Kelly

LSU is 11-3 against non-conference opponents under third-year head coach **Brian Kelly**. The Tigers' most recent victory versus a program outside the SEC came against South Alabama when LSU won 42-10 inside Tiger Stadium on Sept. 28. LSU's non-SEC wins last year came against Grambling State, Army, Georgia State, and Wisconsin with its only non-conference loss coming against Florida State. LSU's non-conference slate in 2024 concludes with Baylor in the Texas Bowl. LSU is 3-1 this season against non-conference opponents with its only loss coming in the season opener vs. USC.

Nuss Most Prolific First-Year Starting QB in LSU History

LSU junior **Garrett Nussmeier** is the most prolific first-year starting quarterback in school history. In his first full season as LSU's starting quarterback, **Nussmeier** has completed 313-of-491 passes for 3,739 yards, 26 TDs and 11 interceptions. He's also accounted for 3,694 yards of total offense. **Nussmeier's** numbers are the best for any first-year starting quarterback in school history. Aaron Anderson Runs Back 4th 100-Yard Kickoff Return in LSU History; First KOR TD Since 2020

In the regular-season finale, with LSU trailing 14-10 following an Oklahoma TD in the 2Q, **WR Aaron Anderson** returned the ensuing kickoff 100 yards to the house. **Anderson** gave LSU the 17-14 lead, sparking the LSU crowd and sideline after **QB Garrett Nussmeier** was knocked out of the game with an injury that he later came back from to win the game, 37-17. The 100-yard kickoff return for a TD was the first for LSU since Trey Palmer returned one 93 yards for the score against South Carolina in 2020. It was the fourth 100-yard KOR by LSU in the SEC era and second in Tiger Stadium (first by Eric Martin vs. Kentucky on Oct. 17, 1981). The return from **Anderson** was the 4th KOR TD in Tiger Stadium by any player. Here is a look at the LSU players with a 100-yard kickoff return in program history:

Campbell Earns Consensus All-America Honors

Offensive tackle **Will Campbell** became LSU's 41st Consensus All-America as he picked up first-team All-America honors from four organizations – AP, Football Writers, AFCA, and Walter Camp. Sporting News was the only organization that didn't have **Campbell** on its first-team – he was second-team. **Campbell** also became the first offensive lineman to earn Consensus All-America for the Tigers since Ben Wilkerson in 2004. Other consensus All-America offensive linemen in program history include Alan Faneca in 1997, Nacho Albergamo in 1987, Roy Winston in 1961, and Sid Fournet in 1954. A three-year starter at left tackle for the Tigers, **Campbell** capped his LSU career with two first-team All-SEC honors and second-team all-conference recognition as a true freshman in 2022. He earned Freshman All-America honors in 2022 and was named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll last year. **Campbell** started all 38 games in which he appeared during his career at LSU, playing every offensive snap in 22 of 25 SEC games during that span. He played a total of 2,554 offensive snaps during his career, the most of any player during that span.

Campbell, Weeks Lead Seven Tigers on Coaches' All-SEC Football Teams

Offensive tackle **Will Campbell** and linebacker **Whit Weeks** highlighted a group of seven LSU players named to the Coaches' All-SEC Team. **Campbell**, a junior from Monroe, and **Weeks**, a sophomore from Watkinsville, Ga., were both selected to the first team. It's the second-straight year **Campbell** has been named first-team All-SEC by the league coaches, and the first honor for **Weeks**, a two-time SEC Defensive Player of the Week in 2024. **Campbell** earned second-team All-SEC honors from the coaches as a true freshman in 2022 and was a first-team selection last year when the Tiger offensive line was a finalist for the Joe Moore Award. **Campbell** becomes the first LSU offensive lineman to earn first-team All-SEC honors in back-to-back years since Will Clapp in 2016-17. **Weeks**, in his first season as a starter for the Tigers, led the team and ranked No. 3 in the conference in tackles with 119. He added 10 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks and six quarterback hurries. **Weeks** had a career-best 18 tackles in the overtime win over Ole Miss and followed that with 17 tackles against both Alabama and Oklahoma. In all, **Weeks** had six games with double-digit tackles in 2024, five coming against SEC opponents. Right tackle **Emery Jones Jr.**, edge rusher **Bradyn Swinson** and kickoff specialist **Aeron Burrell** earned second-team All-SEC honors as selected by the league head coaches, while tight end **Mason Taylor** and return specialist **Zavion Thomas** were named third-team. **Jones**, a starter in all 12 games this year, earned second-team honors for the second consecutive year. **Swinson** had a breakout year with 8.5 sacks and 13 tackles for loss, while **Burrell**, a true freshman, was nearly perfect on kickoffs as 62 of his 66 kickoffs went for touchbacks. **Taylor** capped his LSU career as the most productive tight end in program history with 129 receptions for 1,308 yards and six touchdowns. As a junior, **Taylor** caught 55 passes for 546 yards and a pair of scores. In his first season with the Tigers, **Thomas** ranked among the league leaders in kickoff returns, averaging 23.9 yards on 20 returns. He added 49 yards on 13 punt returns and caught 20 passes for 188 yards and two TDs.

Cody Carlson, the Baylor quarterback, tossed scoring passes of 5 and 15 yards to lead the Bears to a 21-7 win. The Tigers' only score came on a Liberty Bowl-record 79-yard punt return by Norman Jefferson. Baylor overcame the 7-0 deficit to lead 10-7 at the half. Baylor increased its lead to 13-7 in the third quarter on a 35-yard field goal. With Baylor clinging to a 13-7 edge, Carlson, who alternated with Tom Muecke at quarterback for the Bears, capped a 62-yard fourth-quarter march with a 15-yard scoring strike to the split end John Simpson. Carlson then found Matt Clark alone in the end zone with a two-point conversion pass as the Bears took command, 21-7.

Series Notes: LSU will meet Baylor for the 12th time in program history in Baton Rouge. The Tigers lead the series 8-3 with all 2 matchups coming in the during bowl season (1963 Bluebonnet Bowl; 1985 Liberty Bowl) Brian Kelly is meeting Baylor for the first time in his coaching career.

Will Campbell Named Co-Winner of SEC's Jacobs Blocking Award

LSU junior left tackle **Will Campbell** was named the co-winner of the SEC's Jacobs Blocking Trophy, the league office announced in early December. The Jacobs Blocking Trophy is presented to the top offensive lineman in the SEC. **Campbell** shared the honor with Texas offensive lineman Kelvin Banks. **Campbell**, who has twice been named first-team All-SEC, becomes the seventh LSU player to win the honor and the first since La'el Collins in 2014. The Jacobs Blocking Trophy has been presented since 1935. LSU's past-winner list also includes Alan Faneca in 1997, who later went on to become a Pro Football Hall of Famer. **Campbell** started all 12 games for the Tigers, serving as the catalyst for an LSU offensive line that led the SEC in sacks allowed with 15. Twice this year **Campbell** earned offensive lineman of the week honors. He was named the Outland Award National Lineman of the Week for his performance in the win over UCLA. He was named SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week for his play in LSU's win over Vanderbilt in late November. He played every offensive snap in 11 of LSU's 12 games, including seven of LSU's eight league games.

Football Welcomes Elite Freshman Class at Start of Early Signing Period

LSU added 23 players to its football roster for the 2025 season as the Tigers signed one of the nation's top recruiting classes. LSU's signing class was ranked as high as No. 6 nationally by Rivals.com. The other three recruiting services – On3, ESPN and 247Sports – tabbed the Tiger class at No. 8. **Kelly's** fourth signing class at LSU featured 10 of the top 20 rated players in the state of Louisiana, including the No. 1 ranked player in running back **Harlem Berry**. The class featured the No. 1 rated player in the states of Arkansas (**OL Carius Curne**), Florida (**CB DJ Pickett**) and Indiana (**EDGE Damien Shanklin**). **Pickett** from Zephyrhills High School in Florida is widely considered the No. 1 cornerback prospect in the Class of 2025. He's ranked as the 10th-best overall prospect nationally. **Berry**, from St. Martin's Episcopal School in Metairie, is the nation's top-rated running back, while offensive tackle **Solomon Thomas** is rated as the No. 1 interior offensive lineman nationally. All three players earned 5-stars in the On3 composite rankings. Of the 10 in-state signees for the Tigers, five were rated among the top 10 in the state and eight were among the top 15 players in Louisiana. The class includes 14 players on the defensive side of the ball, including four defensive tackles and four linebackers, along with nine on offense. LSU signed four offensive linemen which included 5-star offensive tackle Thomas and 4-stars **Curne** and **Tyler Miller**. LSU also added a pair of legacy Tigers in offensive lineman **Brett Bordelon** and tight end **JD LaFleur**. **Bordelon** joins his brother **Bo** on the Tiger roster and is the son of Ben Bordelon, who started 31 games for the Tigers in the 1990s. **LaFleur** is the son of David LaFleur, an All-America at LSU 1996 and a first-round draft pick of the Dallas Cowboys. Another member of the **Weeks** family joined the LSU roster as well as **Zach Weeks**, the younger brother of **West** and **Whit**, will play for the Tigers in 2025. It's the first time since 1995 that LSU's roster will feature three brothers. That year, the Hill's – Chris, Greg and Melvin – all played for the Tigers.

Nuss Becomes The 9th LSU QB With 5,000 Career Passing Yards

With 332 passing yards against Vanderbilt, LSU QB **Garrett Nussmeier** became the ninth Tiger quarterback to throw for 5,000 career passing yards. **Nussmeier**, who has appeared in 30 games throughout his four seasons at LSU, is in the midst of his first season as the Tigers' starting QB. **Nussmeier** has thrown for 5,459 yards and accounted for 37 TDs during his time at LSU. He's gone 442-for-710, completing 62.3 percent of his passes. **Nussmeier's** 5,459 passing yards ranks ninth behind Zach Mettenberger, who threw for 5,783 from 2011-2013. Through 12 games in 2024, **Nussmeier** has completed 313 passes on 491 attempts for 3,739 yards and 26 scores. He is averaging 311.6 yards through the air. LSU's 24-2 Under BK When Scoring 30-Points Or More

LSU is 24-2 under **Brian Kelly** when reaching the 30-point mark. LSU is 6-0 this year when hitting the 30-point mark after going 10-1 in 2023 and 8-1 in 2022. LSU's only two losses under **BK** when scoring 30 points came against Ole Miss in 2023 (55-49) and Georgia in the 2022 SEC Championship Game (50-30). LSU has won 13 straight games when scoring at least 30 points.

Zavion Thomas Gives LSU Boost In Return Game; Leads SEC in Kickoff Return Yardage

LSU return specialist **Zavion Thomas** has given the Tigers a boost in the return game as he leads the SEC in kickoff return yardage with 478 on 20 returns. **Thomas**, a transfer from Mississippi State, is averaging 23.9 yards per return. He returned a kickoff 51 yards vs. Nicholls in game 2 and then had a 50-yard return against Alabama. **Thomas** also serves as LSU's punt returner – he's returned 13 punts for 49 yards. On offense, **Thomas** has 20 receptions for 188 yards and 2 TDs and he's rushed 8 times for 74 yards. **Thomas** ranks fourth for the Tigers in all-purpose yards with 789 (61 attempts) and an average of 65.8 per game. **Thomas** is averaging 12.9 yards every time he touches the ball.

Mubenga Got First Career Start vs. Alabama; Started Fourth-Straight Against Oklahoma

Paul Mubenga, a redshirt freshman from Buford, Ga., got his first career start vs. Alabama. **Mubenga** started at left guard in place of an injured **Garrett Dellinger** (ankle). **Mubenga** has appeared in 9 games this year with four starts against Alabama, Florida, Vanderbilt, and Oklahoma. He saw action on 49 snaps against Texas A&M, 70 snaps against Alabama, 69 snaps against Vanderbilt, and 64 against Oklahoma. He played a career-high 93 snaps vs. Florida.

NOTEBOOK

Last Time Out: LSU 37, Oklahoma 17

Garrett Nussmeier passed for three touchdowns, and **Aaron Anderson** scored on a 100-yard kickoff return, as LSU recorded a 37-17 win over Oklahoma in Tiger Stadium. LSU improved to 8-4 (5-3 SEC) on the season, while Oklahoma dropped to 6-6 (2-6 SEC) as the Sooners were defeated in their first-ever visit to Death Valley. **Nussmeier** completed 22-of-31 passes for 277 yards and three TDs as the Tigers rolled up 395 yards in total offense. Two of **Nussmeier's** scoring strikes went to wide receiver **Chris Hilton Jr.**, covering 40 and 45 yards. Oklahoma led, 14-10, at the 7:22 mark of the second quarter when **Anderson** returned a Sooners kickoff 100 yards down the East sideline for a go-ahead touchdown. The play marked just the third TD kickoff return by an LSU player in Tiger Stadium since 1981. Oklahoma tied the game at 17-17, but **Nussmeier** directed a six-play, 66-yard drive that culminated in a 40-yard TD pass to **Hilton Jr.**, giving LSU a 24-17 advantage 45 seconds before halftime. The Tigers moved 88 yards in nine plays in the third quarter, capping the march with **Hilton Jr.'s** 45-yard reception from **Nussmeier**, increasing the lead to 31-17. The LSU defense, which blanked Oklahoma in the second half, limited the Sooners to 277 yards in total offense. Linebacker **Whit Weeks** logged 17 tackles, 1.0 sack, one forced fumble and one QB hurry, and linebacker **Davhon Keys** contributed 10 tackles and 1.0 sack.

LSU Leads SEC and Ranked No. 8 In FBS In Third-Down Conversions

LSU enters the Baylor game leading the SEC and ranked No. 8 nationally in third-down conversion rate at 49.4 percent. Through 12 games, LSU has converted 86-of-174 third-downs this year, which includes 61-of-128 (47.7 pct.) in SEC games and 25-of-46 against non-conference opponents. The Tigers have been good on third-downs in Tiger Stadium, converting 46-of-92 (50 pct.) opportunities as compared to 40-of-82 (48.8 pct.) in road/neutral site games. Last year, LSU ranked No. 2 in the nation in red zone offense, converting 71-of-129 opportunities for 55 percent.

LSU's Allowed 15 Sacks All Year – Leads SEC

LSU goes into the Baylor game having allowed only 15 sacks all year on 562 drop backs by LSU quarterbacks. LSU surrendered 2 sacks in a game three times – vs. South Carolina, at Texas A&M, and vs. Alabama. Florida recorded 6 sacks in game 10 of the season. Dating back to last year's ReliaQuest Bowl victory over Wisconsin, LSU hasn't allowed a sack in 8 of its last 13 games. LSU's offensive line has allowed a pressure percentage – QB pressures allowed on pass blocking attempts as defined by PFF – of 15.7 percent. The following is a look at LSU's offensive line pass blocking statistics per PFF through 12 games:

Durham Has Helped Spark the LSU Running Game; Leads All SEC Freshman In Rush Yards

True freshman **RB Caden Durham** has provided a spark in the LSU running game, adding a dimension that was lost with the season-ending injury to **John Emery** (knee in practice the week of Nicholls game). **Durham** leads the Tigers in rushing with 693 yards and 6 TDs on 127 carries. He's averaging 5.5 yards a carry. He's also caught 27 passes for 257 yards and 2 scores. He's the only player in college football with a rush for 80+ yards (86 vs. South Alabama) and a reception for 70+ yards (71 vs. South Alabama). **Durham** has topped the 100-yard mark twice this year – 128 and 1 TD vs. South Alabama; 101 and 3 TDs vs. Arkansas). In his first extensive action, **Durham** rushed for 98 yards and a pair of TDs on just 11 carries in the road win over South Carolina.

Here's a quick look at some of Durham's 2024 notables:

- 50-yard run in 2Q vs. Oklahoma - owns 3 out of 4 most explosive plays for LSU this season
- 45-yard run in 1Q vs. Alabama – longest rush against Crimson Tide this year
- His 5.68 yards per carry ranks No. 4 in the SEC among running backs with at least 50 carries.
- Ranks No. 1 in the SEC in rushing yards (555) by a freshman.
- With 101 yards and 3 TDs vs. Arkansas, became first LSU true freshman to rush for 100 yards and rush for 3 TDs in a game since Kevin Faulk did it vs. North Texas (19 att.-160 yards-3 TDs) in 1995.
- First LSU true freshman to rush for 3 TDs in a SEC game since Jeremy Hill did it vs. Ole Miss in 2012.
- First LSU true freshman to score 3 TDs in a game since Kayshon Boutte caught 3 TDs passes vs. Ole Miss in 2020.

NOTEBOOK

Nuss Ranks In Top 10 in Several Passing Categories

Junior **QB Garrett Nussmeier** enters the Baylor game ranked No. 2 in the SEC and ranked No. 13 in the nation in passing TDs with 26. He's also No. 6 nationally in passing yards per game (311.6), No. 6 in passing yards (3,739) and No. 4 in completions (313). In 12 games, **Nussmeier** has completed 313-of-491 passes for 3,739 yards, 26 TDs and 11 interceptions. He's had 2 400-yard game (409 vs. South Alabama, 405 vs. Texas A&M) and 5 300-yard games (304 vs. Southern Cal, 302 vs. Nicholls, 352 vs. UCLA, 337 vs. Ole Miss, 332 vs. Vanderbilt).

Aaron Anderson Providing Big-Plays In Passing Game

Aaron Anderson has provided some much-needed big plays in the LSU passing game as the sophomore has accounted for 53 receptions for 784 yards and 5 TDs in 12 games. **Anderson** scored on a 28-yard reception in the endzone against Florida and a 76-yard reception from **Garrett Nussmeier** against Texas A&M. His biggest catch came in the win over Ole Miss when he hauled in a 23-yard TD pass on fourth-and-5 with 27 seconds left in the win over the Rebels. The reception sent the game into overtime where the Tigers won, 29-26. Of **Anderson's** 53 receptions, 36 have resulted in a first down. He's also been credited with 386 yards after-the-catch, which included 81 against Texas A&M.

Durham Only Player in College Football with 70-Yard Reception and 80-Yard Rush

True freshman **RB Caden Durham** remains the only player in college football this season with a rush of 80-plus yards and a reception of 70-plus yards. **Durham** accomplished the feat in the same game – and on consecutive offensive plays – against South Alabama. On the opening play of the game, **Durham** took a swing pass and scampered 71 yards for a touchdown. On LSU's next offensive possession – and on the first play of the drive – **Durham** took a handoff and raced 86 yards to the South Alabama 1-yard line.

Whit Weeks – LSU's 2024 Version of the Honey Badger

It's been 13 years since LSU do-it-all defensive back Tyrann Mathieu earned the nickname "Honey Badger" for his defensive tenacity. Sophomore **LB Whit Weeks'** play has brought back memories of Mathieu with his playmaking ability. Against Arkansas, **Weeks** tallied 10 tackles, had a sack for a 10-yard loss and made a Mathieu-like interception where he batted a ball into the air, caught it and fell just short of the endzone. LSU scored on the following play, one that LSU coach **Brian Kelly** called a "backbreaker," to put the Tigers up 24-10 late in the third quarter. **Weeks** has emerged as LSU's top playmaker on defense as he ranks No. 3 in the SEC in tackles (119). He's recorded double-digit tackles in 6 games this year (at South Carolina, South Alabama, Ole Miss, at Arkansas, vs. Alabama, vs. Oklahoma). He was also credited with a sack in 3 consecutive games (South Alabama, Ole Miss, at Arkansas) and accounted for a turnover in back-to-back games (forced fumble vs. Ole Miss; interception vs. Arkansas). **Weeks'** play has helped transform the Tiger defense this year. Through 12 games, **Weeks** has 119 tackles, 10 tackles for loss (-32), 3.5 sacks (-22), an interception, 3 PBUs, 6 QB hurries and 2 forced fumbles.

Mason Taylor Only Tight End In LSU History with 100 Receptions and 1,000 Receiving Yards

Junior **Mason Taylor** continues to re-write the LSU record books for a player at his position as he's the only tight end in program history with 100 receptions and 1,000 receiving yards. **Taylor**, who caught the game-winning 2-point conversion in overtime in LSU's 32-31 win over Alabama in 2022 as a true freshman, has caught 129 passes for 1,308 yards and 6 TDs in his 38-game LSU career. **Taylor** currently ranks No. 2 on the team in receptions (55) and he's third in total yards (546). Of his 55 receptions this year, 37 have resulted in a first down. For his career, 72 of **Taylor's** 129 receptions have resulted in a first down. **Taylor** has caught at least 1 pass in 37 of his 38 career appearances.

Damian Ramos Converts 4 Crucial FGs vs. Arkansas

PK Damian Ramos – the SEC Special Teams Player of the Week vs. Arkansas – set a career-best with 4 field goals (on 4 attempts) in the win over Arkansas. **Ramos** had a 48-yard field goal in the 2Q, pushing the LSU advantage to 13-0. He opened the game with a 33-yard field goal on LSU's second possession, stretching the margin to 10-0. **Ramos** kicked a 33-yard field goal late in the second quarter and then hit a 47-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter, making it a three-score game at 27-10. Against Oklahoma, **Ramos** added four points-after-touchdown, running his streak to 125 without a miss, which is the longest streak in school history (previous: Cade York, 118). **Ramos** made 2 45-plus yard field goals in Gainesville and enters the Oklahoma game riding a streak of 7-straight successful field goals. This year, **Ramos** is 22-of-27 on field goals and 36-of-36 on PATs. Ramos is 11-of-14 on field goals in road/neutral site games this year. on the road (including neutral sites) this year.

Williams Has Over 1,000 Career Rushing Yards

RB Josh Williams entered his sixth and final season at LSU with 1,000 career rushing yards to his credit. The former walk-on who was a member of LSU's national championship team in 2019, has rushed for 1,452 yards and 16 TDs on 305 carries in his 6-year career with the Tigers. He's also caught 69 passes for 586 yards and 1 TD. **Williams** is a four-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll and a two-time LSU graduate.

Trey'Dez Green Making Impact Felt At WR

True freshman **Trey'Dez Green** – who signed with the Tigers as one of the most sought-after tight ends in the country last year – continues to be an offensive threat for the Tigers, only at wide receiver now. Standing 6-foot-7, **Green** creates obvious mismatches in the passing game for the Tiger, and in an effort to get the best 11 players on the field, he has shifted most of his time to the wide receiver position (although he still can play tight end when called upon). Against Arkansas, **Green** played a season-high 42 snaps, catching 1 pass for 8-yards on a third-and-4 situation that extended an LSU drive. He also hauled in a pass from **Garrett Nussmeier** on a 2-point conversion, extending the LSU lead to 24-10. Against Texas A&M, **Green** caught 2 passes for 13 yards. In 12 games, **Green** has caught 7 passes for 48 yards and 2 TDs.

The Defensive Improvement Under DC Blake Baker

Under LSU **DC Blake Baker**, LSU has seen markedly improved play on the defensive side of the ball compared to the 2023 season. The LSU defense led by **LB Whit Weeks** in tackles (119), and **Bradyn Swinson** in sacks (8.5) and TFLs (13), ranks 57th nationally in scoring defense (23.8), 24th in sacks (33), and 37th in red zone defense (79.4%). LSU's Captured 12 SEC Player of the Week Honors in 2024

LSU has captured 12 SEC Player of the Week honors in 2024. Most recently, **LB Whit Weeks**, **WR Aaron Anderson**, and **DT Dominick McKinley** each earned honors from the league office for their performances against Oklahoma. **Will Campbell** earned SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week for his performance against the Commodores. **PK Damian Ramos** and **OT Emery Jones** earned SEC Player of the Week honors for their performance in the 34-10 win over Arkansas in Fayetteville. **Ramos** was named the SEC Special Teams Player of the Week, while **Jones** earned SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week honors. It's the first conference player of the week honors for both players this year. **Ramos**, who also earned the game ball from the coaching staff following the victory, set a career-high with four field goals in the victory. He became the first LSU kicker to convert four field goals in a game since Cade York did it against Auburn in 2021. **Jones** turned in the best performance among all LSU offensive lineman against the Razorbacks, helping the Tigers score on all but one possession in the 34-10 victory. On eight possessions against Arkansas, the Tigers scored three touchdowns and kicked four field goals. LSU didn't allow a sack for the sixth time this year. The Tigers have surrendered only four sacks all season, third fewest in the nation. As a unit, LSU tallied 393 total yards, including 158 on the ground with true freshman running back **Caden Durham** leading the way with 101 yards and three touchdowns on 21 carries. LSU averaged 4.3 yards a carry against an Arkansas defense that was ranked fifth in the SEC in rush defense. Up 27-10, LSU used an 8-minute, 22-second drive in the fourth quarter, running the ball on 11 of its 14 plays, capped with a 1-yard TD run by **Durham** to put the game away.

LSU's 17 SEC Victories Since Start of 2022 Season Ranks No. 3 in League

LSU picked up its 17th SEC victory since the start of the 2022 season against Oklahoma on Nov. 30. The 17 wins rank as the third-highest total in the SEC during that span, trailing only Georgia (23) and Alabama (20). LSU went 6-2 in both 2022 and 2023 and posted a 5-3 mark in 2024.

Bradyn Swinson Records Third Multi-Sack Game vs. Ole Miss; Has 8.5 Sacks in 2024

DE Bradyn Swinson finished the Vanderbilt game with a half sack to increase his sack total to 8.5. **Swinson** had his third multi-sack game of the season against Ole Miss with 2 sacks to go along with a career-best 8 tackles. Of his 8 tackles, 2.5 went for losses totaling 11 yards. **Swinson** also batted down 2 passes and added a pair of QB hurries. As a unit, LSU's defense sacked Ole Miss QB Jaxson Dart 6 times. In LSU's road win over South Carolina, **Swinson** recorded 3 sacks and a week later against UCLA, he tallied 2 sacks in the win over the Bruins. Through 12 games, **Swinson** has 56 tackles, 13 TFLs and 8.5 sacks. His 8.5 sacks rank No. 5 in the SEC and No. 20 in the FBS.

Whit Weeks Tallies 18 Tackles In Win Over Ole Miss; Records 17 Against Alabama

LB Whit Weeks put together one of the best all-around defensive efforts in Tiger Stadium history in the win over Ole Miss, recording a career-high 18 tackles to go along with a sack, 2 tackles for loss and a forced fumble in the overtime win. **Weeks** had another impressive performance against Alabama recording 17 tackles, a half-TFL, and 1 PBU. The 18 tackles were the most for an LSU player since Damone Clark had 20 tackles against Ole Miss in 2021. The 18 tackles rank No. 12 on LSU's all-time single-game list. The school record for tackles is 21 held by Al Richardson (vs. South Carolina, 1982) and Charles Smith (vs. Houston, 1999).

Nuss Has Passed for 300+ in 7 Of 11 Career Starts

With 332 passing yards against Vanderbilt, junior **QB Garrett Nussmeier** has topped the 300-yard passing mark for the eighth time of his brief career as a starter. Against the Commodores, **Nussmeier** completed 28-of-37 passes for 332 yards with 1 TD. LSU is 1-1 when **Nussmeier** passes for 400-plus yards and 6-2 when he passes for 300-plus yards.

Nuss Off To One of the Best Starts for a QB in LSU History

Junior **Garrett Nussmeier** is off to one of fastest starts for a quarterback in LSU history, passing for 3,739 yards and 26 TDs in 12 games. He's accounted for 29 total TDs as he rushed for 3 scores total (2 in South Alabama, 1 in Texas A&M). Here's how **Nuss'** 12-game start to the season compares with the two other most prolific passers in LSU history – Heisman Trophy winners Joe Burrow (2019) and Jayden Daniels (2023).

Nuss Has Directed 5 90-Plus Yard Scoring Drives This Year

QB Garrett Nussmeier has engineered 5 scoring drives of 90-plus yards this year. The first 2 came on consecutive possessions in the second half in the win over UCLA and the third coming in the second half in the victory over South Alabama. **Nuss** led LSU on a 4th 90-plus yard drive against Texas A&M (90 yards). Against Vanderbilt, **Nussmeier** led LSU on an 8-play, 90 yard drive to tie the game at 7 vs. the Commodores. The back-to-back 90-yard scoring drives against UCLA marked the first time LSU has accomplished such a feat since the 2003 season when the Tigers did it in the second quarter in a 33-7 win over South Carolina (97 and 91 yards). LSU Scores 2 TDs in Under 3 Plays vs. South Alabama

LSU RB Caden Durham got the LSU offense off to a fast start against the Jaguars by taking the opening pass from **QB Garrett Nussmeier** 71 yards for a touchdown. It was the first time LSU scored on the first play from scrimmage since Dalton Hilliard scored on a 16-yard run against Ole Miss on Oct. 30, 1982 after the Rebels fumbled the opening kickoff. On LSU's second possession against South Alabama, **Durham** ripped off an 86-yard run to the Jaguar 1-yard. **Nussmeier** scored on the following play, giving the Tigers 2 TDs in 3 offensive plays to start the game against South Alabama. The two scores within three plays marked the first time LSU accomplished the feat since Oct. 11, 1997, when LSU scored on consecutive 1-play drives - a 40-yard TD run from Herb Tyler and a 7-yard TD run from Tommy Banks that followed an interception by the Tiger defense.

Double-Trouble at Linebacker with Whit Weeks and Penn

In its first game without All-SEC linebacker **Harold Perkins**, the Tigers got a combined 25 tackles and 3.0 tackles for loss from **Greg Penn** and **Whit Weeks** in the win over South Alabama. **Penn** registered a career-best 14 tackles, while **Weeks** had 11 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and combined for a sack. **Penn** added a half-tackle for loss and recorded a pair of QB hurries in the win over South Alabama. **Weeks** came up big in the third quarter, when he stopped South Alabama QB Gio Lopez at the goal line on fourth-down with a jarring hit (knocked Lopez' helmet off) - a defensive stop the resulted in a 99-yard TD drive by the Tiger offense that put the game out of reach at 42-10. Through 12 games, **Weeks** (119 tackles) and **Penn** (80) are LSU's top two tacklers. In the duo's second outing without **Perkins**, they combined for 27 tackles, 1.5 sacks and 2.5 TFL in the win over Ole Miss. **Weeks** led the Tigers with 18 tackles, while **Penn** had 9 as LSU limited the Rebels to only 3 second half/overtime field goals in the 29-26 victory. **Weeks** and **Penn** led the way once again vs. Arkansas combined for 16 tackles, 1 sack, 1 TFL, 1 forced fumble, 1 PBU, 1 INT, and 2 QBHs.

True Freshman Making An Impact on LSU Defense

RB Caden Durham isn't the only true freshman making an impact for the Tigers as LSU has 6 rookies play significant snaps on the defensive side of the ball. LSU started 5 true freshmen on defense - **S Dashawn Spears**, **CB PJ Woodland**, **DT Ahmad Breaux**, **LB Davhon Keys**, and **DE Gabriel Reliford**. Here's a look at some of the highlights from LSU true freshman on the defensive side of the ball through 12 games:

10 Dashawn Spears (S): started 3 games in 12 appearances, 23 total tackles and 1 PBU

93 Ahmad Breaux (DT): starts vs. UCLA and South Alabama; TFL 3-yard loss vs. South Alabama; 2 tackles vs. Ole Miss; 1 tackle vs. Arkansas; 3 tackles against Texas A&M; 1 tackle and QBH vs. Florida; 1 tackle vs. Vanderbilt; 1 tackle vs. Oklahoma and half-a-TFL

Zavion Thomas – A Game-Changer in Return Game

Zavion Thomas has become a game-changer in the return game – both punts and kickoffs – for the Tigers so far this season. **Thomas**, a native of New Orleans who joined the Tigers after 2 years at Mississippi State – has returned 20 kickoffs for 478 yards, including a season-long 51-yarder vs. South Alabama and a 50-yarder vs. Alabama. He has returned 13 punts for 49 yards with a long of 15 yards against Southern Cal in the opener.

Transfer Portal Additions Making An Impact

LSU landed a handful of players in the transfer portal since the end of last season with several making an impact in their first year with the Tigers. Here's a look at the transfer portal additions and how they have contributed this year:

0 Zavion Thomas, RS/WR (Mississippi State) – Freshman All-America return specialist at Mississippi State in 2022. Averaged 12.4 yards every time in he touched the ball in 2023. Returned kickoff 94 yards for a TD vs. Texas A&M (2023) and returned a punt 63 yards for a score vs. Georgia (2022). Handles both kickoff and punt returns for the Tigers as well as being part of the rotation at wide receiver.

2024: 13 PR for 49 yards (3.8); 20 KOR for 478 yards (23.9); 51-yard return vs. South Alabama; 50-yard return vs. Alabama; 20 receptions for 188 yards and 2 TDs; TDs vs. Nicholls and UCLA

2 Jardin Gilbert, S (Texas A&M) – LSU's starting safety after spending three years at Texas A&M. A Baton Rouge native who played his high school football on the LSU campus at University High School. Played in 25 games (12 starts) with the Aggies, recording 79 tackles, 2 interceptions and 8 passes defended.

2024: 12 GP/8 GS; starter in last 7 games at; 48 tackles, 1 interception (vs. UCLA); half sack for -3 yards; 3 PBUs, 1 FF, 1 FR

99 Gio Paez, DT (Wisconsin) – adds experience and depth to the LSU defensive line. Pegged as a starter alongside senior Jacobian Guillory on the defensive front. Tallied 36 tackles in 36 career games (6 starts) in four years with the Badgers. Played against LSU in the ReliaQuest Bowl in January of 2024.

2024: 12 GP/12 GS; key part of LSU's defensive line; 19 tackles, 2.5 TFL, 1 sack, 1 PBU, 3 QBH

99 Blake Ochsendorf, P (Louisiana Tech) – joined the Tigers during the summer and is in a battle with Peyton Todd for starting punting duties. Earned All-Conference USA honors in 2023 in his lone season at Louisiana Tech. Entering his seventh season of college football having first played at Minnesota State-Moorhead (2018-19), followed by Eastern Michigan (2020-22) and Louisiana Tech (2023).

2024: LSU's short-yardage punter; Aussie style kicker; 12 punts for 40.2 avg; 7 of 12 punts downed inside the 20-yard line.

Brian Kelly Earned 10 Wins Each In First Two Seasons; 28-11 Through 39 Games

LSU head coach **Brian Kelly** enters the Arkansas game with a 28-11 mark as the Tiger's leader of the football program. **BK** is one of two LSU coaches to earn 10 wins in his first two seasons, joining Les Miles, who went 11-2 in 2005 and 2006. LSU has won at least 10 games 19 times in its history, most recently in 2023, when the Tigers went 10-3 in **Kelly's** second season in Baton Rouge. Twelve of LSU's 18 10-win seasons have come since the Tigers went 10-3 in 2001. **Kelly** joined Mike Archer (10 wins in 1987) and Les Miles (11 wins in 2005) as the only first-year coaches in school history to win 10 games in their initial season with the Tigers. The one difference between the three is that **Kelly** took over a team coming off a losing season (6-7 in 2021), Archer took over a 9-3 squad that won the SEC title in 1986, and Miles took over a 9-3 team from Nick Saban.

Josh Williams Named Semifinalist for Campbell Trophy

LSU senior running back **Josh Williams** has been selected as a semifinalist for the 2024 William V. Campbell Trophy, the National Football Foundation & College Football Hall of Fame announced. It's the second consecutive year **Williams** – now in his sixth season with the Tigers - has been named a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy. The William V. Campbell Trophy is presented annually to college football's premier student-athlete. A record 203 players were nominated for this year's award. Former Tiger Rudy Niswanger won the award in 2005. In addition to Niswanger, LSU has had seven players earn the National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Award. The list includes Robert Dugas, 1978; James Britt, 1982; Nacho Albergamo, 1987; Sol Graves, 1990; Chad Kessler, 1997; Bradie James, 2002; and Rodney Reed, 2003. **Williams** earned his undergraduate degree from LSU in marketing, graduating with a 3.4 grade point average. He followed that with a Master's in business administration in December of 2023. **Williams** has been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll times and is also a member of the NFF Hampshire Honor Society as well as LSU's Omicron Delta Kappa Honor Society. He currently has rushed for 440 yards and 5 TDs. He's averaging 4.1 yards per carry. He scored the game-winning touchdown in LSU's comeback win over South Carolina on Sept. 14. Prior to the season, **Williams** was awarded the No. 18 jersey, which is worn by a player who demonstrates all of the traits of an all-around outstanding LSU football player.

Following each win dating back to the beginning of head coach **Brian Kelly's** tenure in 2022, he and the staff present the "game ball" to a player who had the biggest impact on the win. **WRs Aaron Anderson** and **Chris Hilton** earned game balls after their performances against Oklahoma. **Anderson** returned a kickoff 100-yards - the fourth in program history, while **Hilton** caught two TD passes. **RB Josh Williams** earned the latest game ball from **BK** after his performance against Vanderbilt (91 rushing yards, 2 rushing TDs, 61 receiving yards). **PK Damian Ramos** converted 4 FGs and accounted for 14 points in the 34-10 victory over Arkansas, earning the game ball. **CB Zy Alexander** was awarded the game ball for his performance against Ole Miss, which included an INT in the endzone. **LB Greg Penn III** was handed the third game ball of the season for his 14-tackle performance in the South Alabama game, where **Penn** recorded a half TFL and 2 quarterback hurries. **QB Garrett Nussmeier** earned the second game ball of the season vs. UCLA after throwing for 300-plus yards, 3 TDs and no INTs. **Nuss**' 352 passing yards mark the fourth out of five starts he has surpassed 300 yards through the air. **RB Caden Durham** received the first game ball of the 2024 season after his breakout performance against South Carolina on the road. **Durham**, the native of Oklahoma City, sparked the Tiger offense with a 26-yard TD run in the second quarter. Ju'Juan Johnson Shifts to Running Back

True freshman **Ju'Juan Johnson** made the move from secondary to running back the week of the Nicholls game due to **John Emery's** season-ending injury. In just 3 days, **Johnson** learned enough of the playbook to see action against Nicholls, scoring his first collegiate TD on a 4-yard pass from **Garrett Nussmeier**. **Johnson** finished the game with 3 receptions for 16 yards. **Johnson** enjoyed one of the best careers in Louisiana prep history, setting the state's all-time mark for total offense with 14,451 total yards and 171 total touchdowns accounted for as a quarterback at Lafayette Christian.

11 Freshmen (7 True, 4 Redshirts) Have Earned Starts This Year

LSU has started 12 freshmen (7 true, 4 redshirts) through the season's first 12 weeks. **DE Gabriel Reliford** and **LB Davhon Keys** both earned starts against Florida. Redshirt freshman **Paul Mubenga** earned the first start of his career, replacing an injured **Garrett Dellinger** at LG against Alabama, and played 70 snaps. **WR Trey'Dez Green**, who typically plays at the TE position, earned his first start at LSU at the wide receiver position against Arkansas and recorded 1 catch for 8 yards and a 2-point PAT reception. Against South Alabama, **RB Caden Durham** flanked **Garrett Nussmeier** to begin the game and finished with 128 rushing yards on 7 attempts and caught 3 passes for 89 yards. Against UCLA, **DT Ahmad Breaux** earned his first LSU start and recorded 1 tackle. Against South Carolina, **S Dashawn Spears** started for the first time in his opening season and recorded 2 tackles. Against Nicholls, true freshman **CB PJ Woodland** earned his first collegiate start and responded with 4 tackles, 1 TFL (-2), a forced fumble, and a fumble recovery. He was joined in the lineup against Nicholls by a duo of redshirt freshmen in **C DJ Chester**, **LG Tyree Adams**. **Chester** has started in all 5 games at center, while **Adams** started in place of injured senior **Garrett Dellinger**. In the season-opener against USC, RS-Freshman **Kyle Parker** started at wide receiver for the Tigers.

Blake Baker Takes Over Defensive Play-Calling; Named Defensive Coordinator on Jan. 5

Blake Baker, who helped Missouri to an 11-win season and a Top 10 national ranking in 2023, enters his first year as LSU's defensive coordinator in 2024. **Baker** previously served as linebackers coach for the Tigers in 2021 before taking the defensive coordinator role at Missouri for two years (2022-23). He brings eight years of defensive coordinator experience to the LSU program. **Baker's** 2023 Missouri defense played a huge role in the Tigers going 11-2 overall and capping the season with a 14-3 win over No. 7 Ohio State in the Cotton Bowl. Missouri's 11 wins were the most for the school in nearly a decade. In the win over Ohio State, Missouri held the Buckeyes without a touchdown for the first time since the 2016 season. As a unit in 2023, Missouri ranked No. 4 in the SEC in scoring defense (20.8 points per game) and No. 5 in the league in both rushing defense (122.8) and total defense (336.1). Missouri led the SEC and ranked No. 4 nationally in fumbles forced (17), and they were No. 11 in the nation in sacks with 39. The Tigers were also among the Top 20 in the nation in fumbles recovered (No. 16 with 10) and tackles for loss (No. 18 with 88). Missouri's 2023 defense featured three players who earned All-SEC honors – defensive end Darius Robinson, linebacker Ty'Ron Hopper and defensive back Kris Abrams-Draine. In his previous season at LSU in 2021, **Baker's** top linebacker was All-America Damone Clark, who became a fifth-round NFL Draft pick and is currently a starter for the Dallas Cowboys. Clark had a breakout season under **Baker** in 2021, ranking No. 2 in the nation in tackles with 135 tackles to go along with 5.5 sacks and 15.5 tackles for loss. Clark was a finalist for the Butkus Award that year.

Joe Sloan Promoted to Offensive Coordinator; Cortez Hankton Named Co-OC

Joe Sloan was named LSU's offensive coordinator, while **Cortez Hankton** will serve as co-offensive coordinator in January 2024. **BK** revealed that **Hankton's** role is implementing and organizing the offense daily while serving as wide receiver coach. **Sloan** and **Hankton** were instrumental in LSU's offensive explosion in 2023, as the Tigers led the nation in scoring offense (45.5), total offense (543.5), and pass efficiency. The Tigers scored 40 or more points nine times, and LSU had nine games in which they reached 500 yards of offense with a season-high of 701 in the win over Florida. LSU was the only FBS team to rank in the Top 10 in both rushing and passing offense, averaging 338.9 yards (No. 3) through the air and 204.5 yards (No. 10) on the ground. They served as co-offensive coordinators for LSU's ReliaQuest Bowl win over Wisconsin. In that game with first-time starter **QB Garrett Nussmeier** at quarterback, the Tigers racked up 492 total yards, including 395 through the air, in the 35-31 victory. **Sloan** and **Hankton** are both in their third year at LSU, as they were among the first hires for **Kelly** when he took over the program in December of 2021.

NOTEBOOK

Williams and Penn Wearing No. 18 in 2024

Senior **RB Josh Williams** and senior **LB Greg Penn** will wear number 18 for LSU in 2024. The players were presented with their new number following practice in Tiger Stadium on Aug. 22.

"The number 18 jersey has great historical significance with our program," **Kelly** told the team at midfield in Tiger Stadium. "Matt Mauck was the first to wear it. He came to this program after playing professional baseball and won a national championship wearing the number 18. He epitomized all the intangibles of a teammate – he had all the things we talk about when it comes to great traits. He passed that number on to another great LSU player in Jacob Hester who led his team to another national championship. Throughout the last 25 years the number 18 has been passed down to a player who brings all those traits of a great teammate. Somebody who has given himself up for the team. A guy you can count on, a guy you want next to you when adversity hits, a guy that's going to be there when you need him. That's number 18."

Williams, a two-time LSU graduate and four-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll, told his teammates after being presented with the number 18 jersey, "I've had a long journey, coming here as a walk-on in 2019 and now in my sixth season. Being able to represent LSU with the number 18 jersey means a lot to me. Seeing the number 18s that I have played with over the years and seeing what they meant to the team and what they mean to LSU, I just want to thank coach Kelly and the coaching staff for giving me the opportunity to wear this special number."

Penn was one of the most productive players on LSU's defense last year with 89 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss, 4.0 sacks and an interception that helped the spark the Tigers to a comeback win over Texas A&M.

"He (Greg Penn) kept our defense together last year," **Kelly** said. "We won 10 games last year and he kept our unit together through some difficult times, because he was about LSU football. He was about, when we brought a transfer in at his position, all he did was work harder. He represents all the principles of being a great teammate and a guy you can count on."

Perkins and Campbell Wearing No. 7 in 2024

For the second straight year, **LT Will Campbell** has been awarded the No. 7 jersey. He is joined this year with No. 7 by **LB Harold Perkins**. The No. 7 jersey tradition started with Patrick Peterson in 2008 and has been carried forward since; the significance of the jersey has altered since the arrival of **Brian Kelly** as he wanted it to be worn by the best playmaker who calls Louisiana home. **Campbell** is a native of Monroe, while **Perkins** is from New Orleans. As an offensive lineman, the rules of college football prevent **Campbell** from actually wearing the No. 7 jersey, so instead, his No. 66 jersey will be accompanied by a No. 7 patch.

When presenting the number 7 jersey, **Kelly** told the team, who were all huddled in the middle of the field in Tiger Stadium, "(this number) is about somebody that brings an incredible ability, is from the state and calls the Louisiana his home. This number is about a player that brings up others around him. You can't just be a great player, if it's just about him, the number 7 jersey doesn't work. You have to bring others up around him and that's what these two do. They elevate the play of those around him."

Before **Kelly** presented **Perkins** with his jersey, **Campbell** offered the following about the newest number 7, "he comes to work and sets the tone for us every day on defense. I think he's the most electrifying player in college football and this year's he going to show it."

Perkins, also a first-team preseason All-America, has become a game-wrecker for opposing offenses in his first two seasons with the Tigers, tallying 26 tackles for loss, 13 sacks and being credited with nine forced turnovers. It's what **Perkins** has done during the offseason and in preseason camp that made him a natural selection for number 7.

"He has uplifted the other 10 players on the defensive side of the ball and he's ready to wear this jersey," **Kelly** said.

Outside of Billy Cannon's retired No. 20 jersey, the Nos. 18 and 7 are two of the most iconic LSU football numbers and have been worn by some of the all-time greats in school history.

Late Touchdown Lifts No. 23 USC Past No. 13 LSU, 27-20

USC tailback Woody Marks scored on a 13-yard touchdown run with eight seconds remaining in the game to lift the 23rd-ranked Trojans to a 27-20 win over No. 13 LSU in the season opener for both teams. Marks' TD capped an eight-play, 75-yard march that began with 1:47 left on the clock and broke a 20-20 tie. LSU grabbed a 17-13 lead at the 3:42 mark of the third quarter when Tigers quarterback Garrett Nussmeier connected with wide receiver Aaron Anderson on a 13-yard TD pass. USC regained the lead with 5:44 left in the contest when quarterback Miller Moss hit wide receiver Ja'Kobi Lane with a 28-yard scoring strike. The Tigers responded by moving 61 yards in nine plays, tying the game with a 31-yard field goal by Damian Ramos at the 1:47 mark prior to USC's game-winning drive. Nussmeier completed 30-of-39 passes for 308 yards and two touchdowns, as the Tigers accumulated 421 yards of total offense. Running back John Emery Jr. contributed 10 carries for 61 yards on the ground, including a 39-yard burst. Wide receiver Kyren Lacy posted seven catches for 94 yards, including a 19-yard pass from Nussmeier in the second quarter. Tight end Mason Taylor contributed seven catches for 62 yards for the Tigers. LSU linebacker Harold Perkins Jr. recorded a team-high nine tackles, while linebacker Whit Weeks added six tackles, including 1.5 stops for losses. Defensive end Sa'vion Jones recorded two sacks from his edge rush position. Moss finished with 378 yards passing for the Trojans, completing 27-of-36 attempts with one TD.

Football Pulls Away from Nicholls in Home Opener, 44-21

LSU quarterback Garrett Nussmeier fired six touchdown passes, and the Tigers scored 21 unanswered points in the third quarter to post a 44-21 victory over Nicholls in Death Valley. LSU improved to 1-1 on the season, while Nicholls dropped to 0-2 in the schools' first-ever meeting on the gridiron. The Tigers' home opener kicked off the 100-year anniversary season of iconic Tiger Stadium, which played host to its first game in 1924. Nussmeier completed 27-of-37 passes for 302 yards and six touchdowns, joining Joe Burrow and Jayden Daniels as the only LSU quarterbacks to throw for six TDs in a single game. Wide receiver Kyren Lacy caught three of Nussmeier's TD strikes and finished with five catches for 65 yards. LSU led, 23-14, at halftime, but the Colonels closed the gap to 23-21 at the 13:52 mark of the third quarter when running back Collin Guggenheim took a direct snap from center and raced 67 yards to the end zone. Nussmeier responded by driving the Tigers 72 yards in 11 plays, with the march culminating in a six-yard TD strike to Lacy. After LSU cornerback PJ Woodland forced and recovered a fumble on Nicholls' next possession, Nussmeier moved the Tigers 41 yards in five plays, capping the drive with a seven-yard scoring pass to Lacy. The Tigers' defense then forced a three-and-out, and Nussmeier again directed a touchdown drive, connecting with wide receiver Zavion Thomas on a four-yard scoring pass at the 1:09 mark of the third period to finish a seven-play, 45-yard march.

Football Erases 17-Point Deficit to Beat South Carolina, 36-33

LSU running back Josh Williams scored on a two-yard TD burst with 1:12 remaining in the game, lifting the 16th-ranked Tigers to a 36-33 win over South Carolina. LSU, which trailed 17-0 in the second quarter, matched its second-largest comeback in a road victory. LSU improved to 2-1 on the season, 1-0 in the SEC, while South Carolina dropped to 2-1 overall and 1-1 in conference play in the schools' first meeting in Columbia since 2008. LSU, which last lost to South Carolina in 1994, extended its winning streak over the Gamecocks to eight games. Trailing 33-29, the LSU defense forced a punt deep in South Carolina territory with 3:46 left in the contest. Quarterback Garrett Nussmeier then directed the Tigers on an eight-play, 55-yard march that culminated in Williams' go-ahead score. The Gamecocks moved to the LSU 31-yard line in the game's final minute, but placekicker Alex Herrera missed a 49-yard field goal attempt as time expired. Nussmeier completed 24-of-40 passes for 285 yards and two touchdowns, while true freshman running back Caden Durham enjoyed a fantastic SEC debut, rushing for 98 yards and two TDs on 11 carries. LSU wide receiver Aaron Anderson caught five passes for 96 yards, and Mason Taylor established the school career record for receptions by a tight end (91), as he had six catches for 58 yards and one touchdown. Defensive end Bradyn Swinson sparked the Tigers' defense with three sacks, and linebacker Whit Weeks recorded a team-high 11 tackles.

Football Scores 17 Unanswered in Second Half to Beat UCLA, 34-17

Quarterback Garrett Nussmeier passed for 352 yards and three touchdowns, and the LSU defense blanked UCLA in the second half as the 16th-ranked Tigers posted a 34-17 victory over the Bruins. LSU improved to 3-1 on the season with its third straight win, while UCLA dropped to 1-2 in its first visit to Death Valley. The teams were tied, 17-17, at halftime but Nussmeier engineered back-to-back touchdowns drives of 90+ yards in the second half to give the Tigers a 31-17 lead. He completed 32-of-44 attempts on the day, connecting with nine different receivers. LSU moved 96 yards in 14 plays in the third quarter, with the march culminating in a two-yard TD burst by running back Josh Williams. Nussmeier then directed an 11-play, 92-yard drive that was capped by his 35-yard touchdown pass to running back Caden Durham, giving LSU a 31-17 advantage with 11:15 remaining in the contest. LSU safety Jardin Gilbert intercepted UCLA quarterback Ethan Garbers on the Bruins' next possession, setting up a 32-yard field goal by Damian Ramos that increased the Tigers' lead to 34-17 with 5:48 left in the game. The Tigers' defense pressured Garbers throughout the afternoon, producing five sacks, including two by defensive end Bradyn Swinson, who also recorded one forced fumble and one QB hurry. UCLA produced 12 first downs and 206 yards of total offense in the first half; however, in the second half, the LSU defense allowed just five first downs and 89 total yards.

Football Dominates South Alabama in Complete Win, 42-10

No. 14 LSU bolted to a 21-0 lead in the first quarter as the Tigers overwhelmed South Alabama, 42-10, in Death Valley. LSU improved to 4-1 on the season with its fourth straight win, while South Alabama dropped to 2-2 in the first meeting between the schools on the gridiron. The Tigers scored on the game's first play from scrimmage as quarterback Garrett Nussmeier connected with running back Caden Durham on a 71-yard TD pass. After a South Alabama punt, Durham on LSU's next play from scrimmage dashed 86 yards to the Jaguars' one-yard line, where Nussmeier burrowed into the end zone to give the Tigers a 14-0 lead at the 10:47 mark of the first quarter. LSU on its next possession moved 79 yards in 11 plays, culminating the drive with Durham's eight-yard TD burst to increase the first-quarter lead to 21-0. Nussmeier's five-yard TD dash and his 21-yard scoring strike to wide receiver Aaron Anderson increased the margin to 35-3 at halftime. In the second half, Nussmeier engineered a 99-yard touchdown march that ended on running back Josh Williams' four-yard rush, providing the Tigers with a 42-10 advantage with 14:08 left in the contest. Nussmeier completed 26-of-39 passes for a career-best 409 yards and two touchdowns, while Durham rushed for a career-high 128 yards and one TD. The LSU defense limited the potent South Alabama offense to just 10 points as linebacker Greg Penn III logged 14 tackles, and linebacker Whit Weeks added 11 stops, including 2.5 tackles for loss.

Tiger Stadium Comes Alive in Thrilling OT Win Over Ole Miss, 29-26

Quarterback Garrett Nussmeier fired a 25-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Kyren Lacy on LSU's first offensive play in overtime, lifting the 13th-ranked Tigers to a 29-26 win over No. 9 Ole Miss. LSU improved to 5-1 (2-0 SEC) on the season with its fifth straight win, while Ole Miss dropped to 5-2 (1-2 SEC) as the Rebels lost for the eighth straight time in Tiger Stadium. Placekicker Caden Davis nailed a 57-yard field goal to complete the Rebels' overtime possession and give Ole Miss a 26-23 lead, but on LSU's first offensive snap of the OT period, Nussmeier connected with Lacy in the corner of the South end zone for the game-winning score. With LSU trailing 23-16 late in the fourth quarter, Nussmeier directed the Tigers on a game-tying 13-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by a 23-yard TD pass to wide receiver Aaron Anderson with just 27 seconds remaining in the game. The scoring play was LSU's second fourth-down conversion of the march, as Nussmeier had earlier hit tight end Mason Taylor with 14-yard strike on fourth-and-six from the Tigers' 29-yard line. Nussmeier completed 22-of-51 passes in the contest for 337 yards and three touchdowns, and Lacy logged five receptions for 111 yards and the final touchdown. The LSU defense sacked Ole Miss quarterback Jaxson Dart six times, including 2.0 by end Bradyn Swinson and 1.5 by safety Major Burns. Linebacker Whit Weeks posted a career-high 18 tackles, including 1.0 sack, 2.0 tackles for loss, one forced fumble and one quarterback hurry.

Football Powers Past Arkansas, 34-10, to Keep Golden Boot							
Freshman running back Caden Durham rushed for 101 yards and three touchdowns, and Damian Ramos kicked a career-high four field goals as No. 8 LSU posted a 34-10 victory over Arkansas in the annual "Battle for the Golden Boot." LSU improved to 6-1 (3-0 SEC) on the season with its sixth straight win, while Arkansas dropped to 4-3 (2-2 SEC) as the Razorbacks lost to the Tigers for the third straight year and the eighth time in the last nine meetings. Durham carried 21 times for 101 yards and three scores, including a 22-yard TD burst that gave LSU a 7-0 lead it would not relinquish at the 10:21 mark of the first quarter. Ramos nailed field goals covering 33, 48, 33 and 47 yards and has connected on 12-of-14 attempts this season. Leading 16-10 in the third quarter, the Tigers seized control of the game when linebacker Whit Weeks tipped and intercepted a pass by Arkansas quarterback Taylen Green and returned it to the Razorbacks' two-yard line. Durham scored on the next play, and after LSU quarterback Garrett Nussmeier completed a two-point conversion pass to wide receiver Trey'Dez Green, the Tigers held a 24-10 advantage at the 4:52 mark of the third period. Weeks led the LSU defensive effort with 10 tackles, 1.0 sack, one interception, one pass break-up and one quarterback hurry. The Tigers limited Arkansas to just 38 yards rushing and 278 yards in total offense.

No. 14 Texas A&M Surges in Second Half to Beat No. 8 LSU, 38-23						
No. 14 Texas A&M overcame a 17-7 halftime deficit and posted a 38-23 win over eighth-ranked LSU, marking the Aggies' fourth straight win over the Tigers at Kyle Field. Texas A&M improved to 7-1 (5-0 SEC) on the season with its seventh consecutive win, while LSU dropped to 6-2 (3-1 SEC) as the Tigers' win streak ended at six games. Texas A&M quarterback Marcel Reed rushed for 62 yards and three touchdowns to lead the comeback, as the Aggies scored 17 second-half points off of LSU turnovers. LSU quarterback Garrett Nussmeier threw for 405 yards, including a 76-yard TD strike to wide receiver Aaron Anderson in the second quarter. Anderson finished with three receptions for 126 yards and one score, while wide receiver Kyren Lacy caught five passes for 106 yards. Nussmeier completed passes to nine different LSU receivers over the course of the game. The LSU defense recorded 4.0 sacks and 5.0 tackles for loss, and safety Sage Ryan forced a first-quarter fumble that led to a Tiger touchdown. Defensive end Bradyn Swinson logged a team-high seven tackles, including 1.0 sack and 2.0 tackles for loss. Linebacker Greg Penn III, cornerback Zy Alexander and defensive lineman Jay Vian Suggs each contributed 1.0 sack on the night.

Milroe's 4 Rushing TDs Leads No. 11 Alabama Past No. 15 LSU, 42-13

Quarterback Jalen Milroe rushed for 185 yards and four touchdowns to lead No. 11 Alabama to a 42-13 win over No. 15 LSU in Tiger Stadium. Alabama improved to 7-2 (4-2 SEC) on the season, while LSU dropped to 6-3 (3-2 SEC) as the Tigers' home win streak ended at 14 games. The loss marked LSU's first in Tiger Stadium since October 8, 2022, when the Tigers were defeated by Tennessee. Milroe scored on runs covering 39, 10, 19 and 72 yards, and he completed 12 of 18 passes for 109 yards. The Crimson Tide never trailed in the game and found paydirt on its opening possession, moving 75 yards in eight plays and taking a 7-0 lead on Milroe's 39-yard dash. Milroe capped his performance with a 72-yard TD sprint early in the fourth quarter that gave Alabama a 35-6 lead. The Alabama defense forced three turnovers, two of which led to Crimson Tide touchdowns. LSU quarterback Garrett Nussmeier completed 27 of 42 passes for 239 yards and a 12-yard TD connection wide receiver Kyren Lacy. Wide receiver Zavion Thomas was an all-purpose threat for the Tigers, posting 169 total yards – 143 yards on kickoff returns, 11 yards on a pass reception and 18 yards rushing. Linebacker Whit Weeks paced the Tigers' defense with 17 total tackles, and he recorded 0.5 tackle for loss and one pass break-up. Damian Ramos was 2-for-2 in field goal attempts, booting three-pointers from 23 and 43 yards.

Lagway, Florida Rally Past No. 22 LSU, 27-16

Running back Jadan Baugh dashed 55 yards for a touchdown with 3:48 left in the game to give Florida a two-score lead, and the Gators posted a 27-16 win over No. 22 LSU in "The Swamp." Florida improved to 5-5 (3-4 SEC) on the season, while LSU dropped to 6-4 (3-3 SEC) as the Gators ended a five-game losing streak in their all-time series with the Tigers. LSU overcame deficits of 7-0 and 10-7 in the first half, tying the game at 10-10 just before halftime when Damian Ramos connected on a career-long 50-yard field goal. Ramos' 45-yard three pointer at the 5:54 mark of the third quarter gave the Tigers a 13-10 lead, but Florida tied the contest when Trey Smack drilled a 55-yard field goal with 3:07 remaining in the period. Florida forced an LSU turnover at the Tigers' 45-yard line early in the fourth quarter and quickly converted the takeaway into points when Ja'Kobi Jackson's one-yard TD burst capped a three-play drive. Ramos' 38-yard field goal with 5:18 remaining in the contest narrowed Florida's lead to 20-16, but Baugh's TD on the Gators' subsequent possession sealed the win. LSU quarterback Garrett Nussmeier completed 27-of-47 passes for 260 yards and fired a 28-yard TD pass to wide receiver Aaron Anderson in the second quarter. Caden Durham rushed 21 times for 95 yards and Josh Williams added 69 yards on 13 carries.

Football Efficient in All Phases to Defeat Vanderbilt, 24-17

LSU running back Josh Williams rushed for 91 yards and two touchdowns as the Tigers recorded a 24-17 win over Vanderbilt in Death Valley. LSU improved to 7-4 (4-3 SEC) on the season, while Vanderbilt dropped to 6-5 (3-4 SEC) as the Commodores lost for the 10th straight time in their all-time series with the Tigers. Vanderbilt scored on its first play from scrimmage when quarterback Diego Pavia hit wide receiver Quincy Skinner Jr. with a 63-yard touchdown pass, but LSU responded with an eight-play, 90-yard drive that was culminated by Williams' 20-yard TD burst. The Tigers grabbed a 14-7 lead 51 seconds before halftime when Williams scored on a 21-yard dash that capped a nine-play, 80-yard march. The Commodores narrowed the gap to 14-10 with a third-quarter field goal, but LSU extended its advantage to 21-10 at the 3:32 mark of the period when quarterback Garrett Nussmeier connected with wide receiver Kyren Lacy on a 12-yard TD strike. A 28-yard field goal by Damian Ramos pushed the Tigers' lead to 24-10 with 10:41 left in the game. The LSU defense limited the Commodores to 308 total yards and allowed just 2-of-10 third-down conversions. Meanwhile, Nussmeier passed for 332 yards and led an LSU offense that was 8-for-13 in third-down conversions and accumulated 471 total yards.

Nussmeier Leads LSU Past Oklahoma in Regular-Season Finale, 37-17

Garrett Nussmeier passed for three touchdowns, and Aaron Anderson scored on 100-yard kickoff return, as LSU recorded a 37-17 win over Oklahoma in Tiger Stadium. LSU improved to 8-4 (5-3 SEC) on the season, while Oklahoma dropped to 6-6 (2-6 SEC) as the Sooners were defeated in their first-ever visit to Death Valley. Nussmeier completed 22-of-31 passes for 277 yards and three TDs as the Tigers rolled up 395 yards in total offense. Two of Nussmeier's scoring strikes went to wide receiver Chris Hilton Jr., covering 40 and 45 yards. Oklahoma led, 14-10, at the 7:22 mark of the second quarter when Anderson returned a Sooners kickoff 100 yards down the East sideline for a go-ahead touchdown. The play marked just the third TD kickoff return by an LSU player in Tiger Stadium since 1981. Oklahoma tied the game at 17-17, but Nussmeier directed a six-play, 66-yard drive that culminated in a 40-yard TD pass to Hilton Jr., giving LSU a 24-17 advantage 45 seconds before halftime. The Tigers moved 88 yards in nine plays in the third quarter, capping the march with Hilton Jr.'s 45-yard reception from Nussmeier, increasing the lead to 31-17. The LSU defense, which blanked Oklahoma in the second half, limited the Sooners to 277 yards in total offense. Linebacker Whit Weeks logged 17 tackles, 1.0 sack, one forced fumble and one QB hurry, and linebacker Davhon Keys contributed 10 tackles and 1.0 sack.
